Foreword

Information provided by the All-India Educational Surveys, conducted by the NCERT, have been widely utilised for the formulation of policies for educational development. Their strongest point is that they have all been census surveys, and not just based on samples.

The Fourth All-India Educational Survey was conducted with 30 September, 1978 as the date of reference. The findings of this Survey were utilised in the formulation of the National Policy on Education (1986).

The Fifth All-India Educational Survey, which provides data as on 30 September, 1986, is comparatively more comprehensive than the Fourth Survey. In this survey three questionnaires, namely Village Information Form, Urban Information Form and School Information Form were canvassed. Through the first two of these forms, data were collected from *all* the villages and *all* the urban areas on the availability of schooling facilities. Data have also been collected regarding the existing facilities for pre-primary education, non-formal education and adult education. Through the School Information Form, data were collected from all the schools on students, teachers, buildings, facilities, equipment, etc. As in the previous surveys, the data were first compiled at the block/tehsil level, on the basis of which the district level tables were prepared. Next, the preparation of the State level tables was done from district tables. Finally at the NCERT, national tables of the survey were prepared from the State Tables.

The survey data are likely to be of immediate use in the formulation of the Eighth Five Year Plan for Educational Development. The information collected will also be found handy for micro-planning exercises at the block and district levels. Above all, the data will be found to be helpful in the *implementation* of National Policy on Education (1986).

As the preparation of the main report of the Fifth All-India Educational Survey is likely to take some time, this preliminary report, containing a few important tables, is being brought out for the benefit of various users of the survey data.

I must express my profound thanks to the State Departments of Education for their cooperation and help in this venture, and more specifically to the State Survey Officers and other survey staff for having accomplished the arduous task of collecting and compiling an enormous amount of data.

The project was launched and implemented under the leadership of Prof. A.B.L. Srivastava, Prof. H.S. Srivastava, and Prof. K.N. Hiriyanniah. Prof. Hiriyanniah, undoubtedly made the most significant contribution along with Mr. S.M. Bhargava, Dr. C.L. Kaul and other members of the faculty. The responsibility of preparing this report was, however, shouldered by Prof. A.B.L. Srivastava and Shri S.M. Bhargava and they deserve our appreciation for their commendable contribution.

I am confident that the vital information contained in this document will be found to be of use to educational planners and administrators and to other users of the survey data.

Introduction

There has been tremendous growth in educational facilities at all levels of education during the last 40 years of Independence. The growth in enrolment and schooling facilities at the primary and post-primary stages of education was the result of the concerted Government effort to implement the Directive Principles of the Constitution to provide free and compulsory education to all the children up to the age of 14. The expansion at other stages was a consequence of the growing public demand for education in all sections of the society. For proper planning of schooling facilities at the grassroot level, and for ensuring a balanced growth in all areas, rural and urban, it was felt that the educational statistics collected annually by the Government were not adequate. In order to meet the need for additional data which could be provided expeditiously, it became necessary to have All-India Educational (AIE) Survey, which was conducted by the then Ministry of Education and Social Welfare in 1957, and after that the Second, Third and Fourth AIE Surveys were conducted by National Council of Educational Research and Training in 1965, 1973 and 1978, respectively.

The First AIE Survey conducted in 1957 had the limited objective of enumerating all the rural habitations with and without educational facilities, particularly at the elementary stage. On the basis of the survey, recommendations were made for planning and location of new schools. The Second AIE Survey conducted in 1965 had wider scope and objectives as compared to the First Survey. Its main aim was not only to assess how far the recommendations of the First Survey were implemented, but also to provide information for the planning of new educational institutions. The Third AIE Survey, conducted in 1973, was much more comprehensive in scope. The

survey covered all levels and types of education ranging from pre-primary to higher education, as well as educational administration, vocational and technical education and cultural statistics. While the responsibility for the survey in School Education and allied areas was assigned to the National Council of Educational Research and Training, the responsibility for other areas was entrusted to other specialised agencies like the University Grants Commission (for higher education), Institute of Applied Manpower Research (for technical and vocational education) and National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (for educational administration). The Fourth AIE (1978) was taken up as a mini-survey confined only to school education. This survey provided data on schooling facilities in rural areas as well as on buildings, furniture, equipment, etc. in the different types of schools.

The need for another AIE Survey was felt in 1986 when the National Policy on Education was being formulated. Consequently, the Fifth AIE Survey was undertaken with 30 September, 1986 as the date of reference. Like the previous surveys, the main purpose was to take stock of the conditions obtaining in schools and the facilities available for regular school education, non-formal education and adult education in rural and urban areas. This survey particularly aimed at providing the data-base for implementation of various programmes for improvement of the quality of education, such as Operation Blackboard. The specific objectives of this survey were as follows :

- i. To assess the present position of educational facilities at various school stages, in respect of coverage of school-going population; the distance to be covered by a child to reach the school; enrolment in general, and

- of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe children and girls in particular.
- ii. To assess the availability of physical facilities like school buildings, playgrounds, drinking water within the school, furniture, facilities for medical check-up, and other equipment, incentive schemes and the number of beneficiaries.
- iii. To assess the position of inputs like blackboards and chalks, libraries, laboratories, textbook banks, etc.
- iv. To know about the academic and professional qualifications of working teachers with special reference to the teaching of science and mathematics, and to determine attrition rates in the teaching profession.
- v. To prepare block maps showing habitations, existing educational facilities, and proposed provision of facilities in a planned manner over a period of time.

To fulfil these objectives three questionnaires, viz. Village Information Form, Urban Information Form and School Information Form, were developed to collect the relevant data. Specifically, the following items were covered through these questionnaires in the survey.

- a. Enumeration of every distinct habitation.
- b. Enumeration of every primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary / senior secondary school / intermediate / pre-university / junior college.
- c. Habitats with and without educational facilities for primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stages.
- d. In case of habitations without schooling facilities for these stages, the distance at which these facilities are available and also habitations under various population slabs.
- e. Schooling facilities for various school stages in habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Castes.
- f. Schooling facilities for various school stages in habitations predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes.
- g. Proportion of Scheduled Caste population in villages and schooling facilities available there.

- h. Proportion of Scheduled Tribe population in villages and schooling facilities in them.
- i. Age-wise enrolment of pupils at various school stages (classwise).
- j. Agewise enrolment of pupils belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.
- k. Qualifications of teachers (stage-wise) working in schools.
- l. Academic inputs available in the schools relevant to various stages of education.
- m. Mobility of teachers during a specific period.
- n. Qualifications of teachers teaching science and teachers having science qualifications.
- o. Availability of vocational courses and the vocational courses provided in these schools at +2 stage.
- p. Workshop facilities and on-the-job training.
- q. Qualifications of teachers teaching mathematics at the secondary and higher secondary stages.

The survey was organised by the National Council of Educational Research and Training with the help and cooperation of Education Departments of different States and Union Territories. The required data was collected from *all* the villages, *all* the urban areas, and *all* the recognised schools in the country. The Department of Measurement, Evaluation, Survey and Data Processing in the NCERT was responsible for developing the questionnaires, providing guidance and training to the staff appointed for the survey work in different States and Union Territories, and helping them in checking and tabulating the data at the block, district and State levels. Finally, the State tables, received from the different States and Union Territories, were used for compiling the national tables of the survey.

It is hoped that the survey data will be used for educational planning not only at the national level, but also at the State and district levels. The data will be particularly helpful in formulation of the Eighth Five Year Plan and in planning and implementation of the projects for improvement of educational facilities envisaged in NPE-1986 and Programme of Action based on it. The survey data should also help the States in decentralised educational planning at the district and block levels, which would include school mapping.

It will take some time before the main report of

the survey is ready. In order to provide the important statistics obtained from the survey, it was decided to bring out this preliminary report for the benefit of educational Planners, Administrators and other users of the survey data. This report contains State-wise demographic information, information on educational facilities in rural areas, number of institutions at the primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stages, number of children enrolled in schools in different classes, quality of school buildings, number

of teachers and availability of certain other facilities in schools. Information on the students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes has also been reported separately. In respect of teachers, information has been provided on the proportion of female teachers and teachers belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Wherever possible comparison has been made with the data of the Fourth All-India Educational Survey (1978).

Main Findings

2.1 DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

Table-1 gives the number of districts, blocks /Taluks/ Tehsils, villages, rural habitations and urban areas. The table also gives statewise population according to 1981 census and the estimated population of the states and the country as on 30.9.86. The total estimated population of the country was 784069 thousand including 593520 thousand (75.70%) in the rural areas. The percentage increase for the period 1981-86 worked out to be 17.86%. The population in the rural areas was estimated at the habitation level and then aggregated to get rural population of the blocks, districts and States. The population in urban areas was estimated on the basis of the latest estimates available and using the population growth rate of the state for the decade 1971-81. There were 578682 inhabited villages having 979065 habitations. On an average there were 1.69 habitations per inhabited village.

2.2 SCHOOLS

Tables 2 to 7 and 31, 32 and 33 are related to schools.

2.2.1 The number of recognised educational institutions (up to the higher secondary stage) in the country was 735785 including 634719 (86.26%) in the rural areas as against 634144 in 1978. There has been an increase of 16.03% in institutions over the period 1978-86. The corresponding increase in the rural areas has been 13.98%. Of the 735785 institutions, 631394 (85.81%) had primary stage classes, 187026 (25.42%) upper primary stage classes, 66952 (9.10%) secondary stage classes and 15498 (2.11%) had the higher secondary stage classes.

2.2.2 Among the total 735785 schools, there were 529392 (71.95%) primary schools, 138687 (18.85%) upper primary schools, 52208 (7.09%) secondary schools and 15498 (2.11%) higher secondary schools. Of these, 475938 (89.90%) primary schools, 112836 (81.36%) upper primary schools, 38720 (74.16%) secondary schools and 7225 (46.62%) higher secondary schools were located in rural areas.

2.2.3 Of the 529392 primary schools, 219837 (41.53%) were government schools, 251699 (47.54%) local body schools, 44701 (8.44%) private aided schools and 13155 (2.49%) private unaided schools. In most of the States the majority of the primary schools were government or local body schools. However, 52.70% primary schools in Andhra Pradesh and 58.84% in Kerala were private aided schools. Of the 138687 upper primary schools 59650 (43.01%), 42568 (30.69%), 24827 (17.90%) and 11642 (8.40%) schools were government, local body, private aided and private unaided schools respectively. As in the case of primary schools, majority (73.70%) of the upper primary schools were either run by the government or by the local bodies. However, more than 50% upper primary schools in the states of Kerala (65.77%), Meghalaya (85.56%), Mizoram (72.14%), Orissa (90.13%) and in West Bengal (99.74%) were private aided schools. Only 6158 (35.52%) upper primary schools in Uttar Pradesh were private unaided. Of the 52208 secondary schools, 19452 (37.26%) were government schools, 3248 (6.22%) local body schools, 22901 (43.86%) private aided and 6607 (12.66%) private unaided schools. More than 50% secondary schools in the States of Goa (84.51%), Gujarat (91.85%), Kerala (57.09%), Maharashtra (60.15%), Meghalaya (89.58%), Mizoram (81.88%), Orissa

(60.23%), Uttar Pradesh (65.07%) and West Bengal (97.95%) were private aided schools. In most of the remaining States and Union Territories the schools run by the government out-numbered the number of schools run by other managements.

Of the 15498 higher secondary schools 6001 (38.72%) schools were government schools, 460 (2.97%) local body schools, 8114 (52.35%) private aided and 923 (5.96%) private unaided schools. Further, 16 (69.57%) in Goa, 1096 (88.24%) schools in Gujarat, 1146 (82.92%) in Maharashtra, 2 (100.0%) in Meghalaya, 2770 (82.12%) in Uttar Pradesh and 1088 (93.63%) in West Bengal were private aided schools. In most of the other States and Union Territories, the schools run by the government were 50% or more.

2.2.4 The number of primary schools increased by 11.54%, upper primary schools by 23.38%, secondary schools by 42.35% and higher secondary schools by 48.60% over the period 1978-86. The increase for the total number of schools was 16.03% during the fore-said period.

2.2.5 Of the 15498 higher secondary schools, 13245 (85.46%) offered Arts, 10608 (68.45%) offered Science, 5585 (36.04%) offered Commerce, 1003 (6.47%) offered Agriculture, 990 (6.39%) offered Technical Courses and 1667 (10.76%) offered Home science. 94 schools had computer science.

2.2.6 1706 (11.01%) higher secondary schools offered vocational courses at +2 stage and the enrolment in these courses was 126571.

2.2.7 As regards facilities for teaching physical education/Yoga, 13513 (2.55%) primary schools, 16869 (12.16%) upper primary schools, 36312 (69.55%) secondary schools and 12503 (80.67%) higher secondary schools had teachers exclusively for physical education/Yoga.

2.3 EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

Tables 12 to 17 give information about educational facilities in the rural areas.

2.3.1 Primary Stage

Out of total habitations, 502806 (51.36%) habitations covering 80.34% rural population had primary schools/sections. The corresponding percentages at the time of the Fourth Survey (1978) were

46.80 and 78.53 respectively. 94.60% rural population was served by primary sections located either within the habitation or up to a walking distance of 1 Km. as against 92.82% population in 1978. The States of Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Haryana, Nagaland, Punjab and Union Territories of Chandigarh, Delhi, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry have attained almost universal provision of educational facilities for primary stage. The percentage of rural population served by primary schools/sections was less than 90% in respect of the States of Arunachal Pradesh (73.35%), Himachal Pradesh (76.64%), Meghalaya (89.22%), Sikkim (83.10%), Tripura (84.11%), Uttar Pradesh (88.56%) and Union Territories of A & N Islands (83.02%) and Dadra & Nagar Haveli (85.19%).

The Country had 530176 (54.15%) habitations with population 300 or more. Of these, 76.98% had the facility for primary stage within the habitation of residence and 94.01% had the facility either within the habitation of residence or within a walking distance of 1 Km.

2.3.2 Upper Primary Stage

Only 129710 (13.25%) habitations covering 36.98% rural population had upper primary schools/sections within the habitation of residence. The corresponding percentages for the Fourth Survey (1978) were 10.74% and 33.47% respectively. 85.39% rural population had the facility for upper primary stage either within the habitation of residence or within a walking distance of 3 Km. as against 78.83% population in 1978.

Among States, Andhra Pradesh (97.28%), Goa (91.79%), Gujarat (94.43%), Haryana (93.12%), Kerala (96.22%) and Punjab (92.49%) had more than 90% rural population served within 3 Km. The Union Territories of Chandigarh (100.0%), Daman & Diu (99.44%), Delhi (98.60%), Lakshadweep (99.16%) and Pondicherry (96.48%) belonged to this category. Among the States Arunachal Pradesh (42.19%), Himachal Pradesh (76.04%), Madhya Pradesh (69.58%), Meghalaya (64.99%), Nagaland (66.41%), Rajasthan (77.00%) and Sikkim (76.20%) had less than 80% population served within 3 Km. Among Union Territories, A & N Islands (73.57%) and Dadra & Nagar Haveli (65.33%) belonged to this category.

There were 358996 (36.67%) habitations with population 500 or more. Of these, 29.93% were served by schools/sections for Upper Primary stage within the habitation of residence and 84.45% habitations

had the facility either within the habitation or within a walking distance of 3 Km.

2.4 ENROLMENT

Tables 18 to 29 are related to enrolment in schools.

2.4.1 The enrolment in classes I-V was 86683289 including 66797907 (77.06%) enrolment in rural areas. Enrolment of girls in classes I-V was 35676643 (41.16%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 26.36%.

Enrolment in classes VI-VIII was 27200656 including 9642537 (35.45%) girls. The corresponding enrolment for the rural areas was 17795293 (65.42%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 51.46%.

The total enrolment and enrolment in rural areas for classes IX-X were 11474962 and 6488568 (56.55%) respectively. There were 3642267 (31.74%) girls in these classes. The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 63.03%.

The total enrolment in classes XI-XII was 3440863 including 1056592 (30.71%) girls. The corresponding enrolment in rural areas was 1345589 (39.11%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 87.66%.

2.4.2 Enrolment of Scheduled Castes was 15039683 in classes I-V, 4064405 in classes VI-VIII, 1539301 in classes IX-X and 394023 in classes XI-XII. The S.C. enrolment in classes I-V, VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII was 17.35%, 14.94%, 13.41%, and 11.45% of the corresponding total enrolments. The enrolment of Scheduled Tribes was 6995848 in classes I-V, 1377992 in classes VI-VIII, 492708 in classes IX-X and 92533 in classes XI-XII. These enrolments were 8.07%, 5.07%, 4.29% and 2.69% of the corresponding total enrolments.

2.4.3 Gross Enrolment Ratio for classes I-V (6-11 years) was 93.63 as against 81.65 in 1978. These ratios for boys and girls were 106.42 and 79.89 respectively. The Gross Enrolment Ratio for classes VI-VIII (11-14 years) was 48.51 as against 37.94 in 1978. These ratios for boys and girls were 60.61 and 35.57 respectively.

2.4.4 Enrolment in class VIII as percentage of enrolment in class I at the national level was 31.11. These percentages for States and Union Territories

ranged from 82.08 for Goa to 15.88 for Andhra Pradesh.

2.5 TEACHERS

Tables 34, 35 and 36 give information about teachers in schools.

2.5.1 There were 3692751 teachers in schools as against 2940337 in 1978. There has been an increase in number of teachers to the tune of 25.59%.

Of the 3692751 teachers, 1530145 (41.44%) were in primary schools, 1011049 (27.38%) in upper primary schools, 725935 (19.66%) in secondary schools and 425622 (11.52%) in higher secondary schools. 28.76% teachers in primary schools, 33.27% in upper primary schools, 31.65% in secondary schools and 27.65% in higher secondary schools were women teachers. The corresponding percentages for S.C. teachers were 11.22, 8.60, 5.84 and 4.82 respectively and for S.T. teachers were 5.99, 4.61, 2.51 and 1.32 respectively.

2.5.2 Of the 3692751 teachers in schools, 1865503 (50.52%) were working at the primary stage, 921612 (24.96%) at the upper primary stage, 682204 (18.47%) at the secondary stage and 223432 (6.05%) at the higher secondary stage. Women teachers constituted 30.56%, 32.18%, 28.12% and 29.33% of teachers working at primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stages respectively. 86.66% teachers at the primary stage, 87.33% at the upper primary stage, 90.23% at the secondary stage and 88.55% at the higher secondary stage were trained.

2.5.3 The pupil-teacher ratio for the primary stage at the national level was 44. Among the States and Union Territories it ranged from as low as 15 in Sikkim to as high as 61 in Gujarat. The pupil-teacher ratios for the upper primary stage, the secondary stage and the higher secondary stage were 29, 21 and 15 respectively.

2.5.4 Among the primary schools, 148033 (27.96%) were single-teacher schools and 171389 (32.38%) were two-teacher schools. In the States of Arunachal Pradesh (55.25%), Jammu & Kashmir (58.67%), Karnataka (62.33%), Meghalaya (53.33%), Rajasthan (54.63%) and in Union Territory of Dadra & Nagar Haveli (66.94%), the single teacher schools constituted more than 50% of the primary schools.

2.6 FACILITIES

Tables 8 to 11 and Table 30 give information about the facilities and ancillary services available and incentive schemes operative in schools.

2.6.1 Among the primary schools, 71495 (13.50%) were without building, that is, they were run in thatched huts, tents or in open space. Of the rest, 385120 (72.75%) primary schools had pucca or partly

pucca buildings. Among upper primary schools 121707 (87.76%) had pucca or partly pucca buildings and 11280 (8.13%) schools had Kachcha buildings.

2.6.2 Further among the primary schools, 40732 (7.69%), 200077 (37.79%), and 134551 (25.42%) had zero instructional room, one instructional room and two instructional rooms respectively. In case of upper primary schools, 3192 schools had no instructional room and 24909 had one or two instructional rooms.

2.4 ENROLMENT

Tables 18 to 29 are related to enrolment in schools.

2.4.1 The enrolment in classes I-V was 86683289 including 66797907 (77.06%) enrolment in rural areas. Enrolment of girls in classes I-V was 35676643 (41.16%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 26.36%.

Enrolment in classes VI-VIII was 27200656 including 9642537 (35.45%) girls. The corresponding enrolment for the rural areas was 17795293 (65.42%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 51.46%.

The total enrolment and enrolment in rural areas for classes IX-X were 11474962 and 6488568 (56.55%) respectively. There were 3642267 (31.74%) girls in these classes. The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 63.03%.

The total enrolment in classes XI-XII was 3440863 including 1056592 (30.71%) girls. The corresponding enrolment in rural areas was 1345589 (39.11%). The percentage increase in enrolment over the period 1978-86 was 87.66%.

2.4.2 Enrolment of Scheduled Castes was 15039683 in classes I-V, 4064405 in classes VI-VIII, 1539301 in classes IX-X and 394023 in classes XI-XII. The S.C. enrolment in classes I-V, VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII was 17.35%, 14.94%, 13.41%, and 11.45% of the corresponding total enrolments. The enrolment of Scheduled Tribes was 6995848 in classes I-V, 1377992 in classes VI-VIII, 492708 in classes IX-X and 92533 in classes XI-XII. These enrolments were 8.07%, 5.07%, 4.29% and 2.69% of the corresponding total enrolments.

2.4.3 Gross Enrolment Ratio for classes I-V (6-11 years) was 93.63 as against 81.65 in 1978. These ratios for boys and girls were 106.42 and 79.89 respectively. The Gross Enrolment Ratio for classes VI-VIII (11-14 years) was 48.51 as against 37.94 in 1978. These ratios for boys and girls were 60.61 and 35.57 respectively.

2.4.4 Enrolment in class VIII as percentage of enrolment in class I at the national level was 31.11. These percentages for States and Union Territories

ranged from 82.08 for Goa to 15.88 for Andhra Pradesh.

2.5 TEACHERS

Tables 34, 35 and 36 give information about teachers in schools.

2.5.1 There were 3692751 teachers in schools as against 2940337 in 1978. There has been an increase in number of teachers to the tune of 25.59%.

Of the 3692751 teachers, 1530145 (41.44%) were in primary schools, 1011049 (27.38%) in upper primary schools, 725935 (19.66%) in secondary schools and 425622 (11.52%) in higher secondary schools. 28.76% teachers in primary schools, 33.27% in upper primary schools, 31.65% in secondary schools and 27.65% in higher secondary schools were women teachers. The corresponding percentages for S.C. teachers were 11.22, 8.60, 5.84 and 4.82 respectively and for S.T. teachers were 5.99, 4.61, 2.51 and 1.32 respectively.

2.5.2 Of the 3692751 teachers in schools, 1865503 (50.52%) were working at the primary stage, 921612 (24.96%) at the upper primary stage, 682204 (18.47%) at the secondary stage and 223432 (6.05%) at the higher secondary stage. Women teachers constituted 30.56%, 32.18%, 28.12% and 29.33% of teachers working at primary, upper primary, secondary and higher secondary stages respectively. 86.66% teachers at the primary stage, 87.33% at the upper primary stage, 90.23% at the secondary stage and 88.55% at the higher secondary stage were trained.
