

INTRODUCING THE DISTRICT

The district of Malda lies between 24°40'20" and 25°32'08" North Latitudes and 87°45'50" and 88°28'10" East Longitudes. It is bounded on the north by the Purnea district of Bihar and the West Dinajpur district, on the east by the Rajsahi district of Bangladesh, on the south by the Murshidabad district, and on the west by the Murshidabad, Santal Pargana and Purnea districts. The area of the district is 3,713 sq. km. The density of population is 434 per sq. km. according to 1971 Census.

The district has only one sub-division with its headquarters at English Bazar. It has ten police stations, namely, English Bazar, Kaliachak, Malda, Habibpur, Ratua, Manikchak, Kharba, Harishchandrapur, Gajol and Bamangola.

There are two towns in the district, namely, English Bazar and old Malda. English Bazar is populraly known as Malda and the town Malda of the early days is now known as old Malda.

The total number of mouzas in the district is 1,794 of which 183 are uninhabited.

The district has an oppresive summer and profuse rains with humid atmosphere all through the year. Generally the temperature rises from the beginning of March. The day temperature teaches a maximum in April-May. The monsoon breaks normally in the middle of June. January is the coldest month in the year. The average annual rainfall in the district is nearly 1540.3 millimetres and the maximum rainfall is experienced in between July & September. On an average there are 67 rainy days in a year in the district.

Two important rivers, the Ganges and the Mahananda flow through the district of Malda.

The population of the district is, according to 1971 Census, 1612657 out of which 827,706 are males and 784,951 are females. The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population constitute 16.48 and 8.11 per cent respectively of the total population.

Out of the total population of the district 17.6 per cent are literate according to 1971 Census. The percentages of literacy among males and females are 25.4 and 9.3 respectively.

Majority of the people of Malda depend on agriculture as their principal source of livelihood. The principal crops in the district are paddy, jute, kalai, khesari, barley, wheat, mustard, etc. Mango cultivation is an important occupation in the district. The 'Fazli' of Malda is a favourite variety of mango extensively grown here.

The most important industries of Malda is silk.

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Mention may be made of the places of interest in the district.

GOUR—The city of Gour, a deserted capital of Bengal lies along the English Bazar-Sibganj Road, 16 kilometres southwest of English Bazar. Almost the whole of the site is now cultivated land under field and orchard crops, with scattered villages. The evidence of earlier Hindu and Muslim rules is found in the ruins of the city.

PANDUA—The city of Pandua, an old capital of Bengal lies about 10 kilometres north of old Malda along the Dinajpur Road. The railway station and the steamer ghat from which it is most easily reached are both in old Malda. The site of Pandua was till recently covered with heavy jungles. Most of the jungle has now been cleared of. Traces of earlier Hindu and Muslim rules are visible in the ruins of the city.

CHAPTER-I

RAINFALL AND CLIMATE

Monthly normal rainfall in the district varies from 2 millimetres in the month of December to 329 millimetres in the month of August.

In 1975 the maximum rainfall was recorded in the month of July while in 1976 the month of August experienced the heaviest rainfall.

Tables 1.3 and 1.4 reveal the monthly temperature of Malda centre.

CHAPTER-II

AREA AND POPULATION

Malda district having an area of 3713 sq. Km. and population of 1612657 (as per 1971 Census) is ranked 11th and 13th respectively in area and population among all the districts of the Statue. In the decade 1961-71 growth of population amounted to 32 per cent. Ninety six per cent of the total population of the district live in villages as against the State average of 75 per cent. In 1961, 339 persons were occupying one square Kilometre of area on an average in the district. The 1971 Census revealed that the number of persons occupying one Square Kilometre of area on an average has increased to 434., though the density in the district is much below the State average (504)

In the rural areas of Malda there were 951 females per one thousand males as per Census 1971, while in the urban areas there were 896 females per one thousand males.

In 1971, the child population (age-group 0-14) constituted 47.1 per cent of the total population as against 45.7 per cent (Table 2.5) in 1961.

Data relating to economic activity of the prople are presented in table 2.7 & 2.8. Eighty two per cent of the total working force of the district are engaged in agricultural activities The working force participation ratio was found to be 94 and 6 for makes and females respectively. The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population account for 16.47 per cent and 8.10 per cent respectively of the total population of the district of Malda (Table 2.9). The high Concentration of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population was found in the police Stations of Gajole and Habibpur.

CHAPTER-III

VITAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Vital and public health statistics have been dealt with in this Chapter.

The data on live-births, deaths, still-births and infant deaths are presented in table 3. 1. While the rates of live-births per 1000 mid-year population were found to be 5.6 and 6.6 in the years 1975 and 1976 respectively, the rates of deaths were 3.7 and 2.8 in the two years respectively. The crude rate of natural increase was thus found to be 1.9 and 3.8 in the two years respectively.

While the heavy toll of human lives have been shown under other causes, amongst the specific causes of death in the district, dysentery is reported to be the principal disease, taking a comparatively heavy toll of human lives.

Information about medical and family planning facilities available in the district is given in tables 3.3 and 3.4

The district had one medical institution per 20413 population and 54 hospitals beds per lakh of population in 1976. (Calculation based on 1971 population).

CHAPTER---IV

EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL STATISTICS

This Chapter presents data on educational and cultur^{al} statistics

In 1971-72 the total number of educational institutio¹⁸ (General) including schools and colleges in the district we^{re} 1467 and the total number of students attending the education^{al} institutions were 179035 (Excluding Colleges). Four years lat⁷, in 1975-76 the number of institutions and students increas² appreciably, the corresponding figures being 1757 and 2167².

The number of teachers in different types of education^{al} institutions in the district in the years from 1971-72 to 1975-⁷⁶ are presented in table 4.3

Number of primary schools including junior basic, pre-p^{ri-} mary and pre-basic schools and their scholars for the years 19⁶⁵ and from 1970 to 1976 in the district are given in table 4.4

Table 4.5 gives the percentage of literates to the total p^{0} pulation in the district. In 1971, 17.6 percent of the total p^{0} pulation of the district was literate, which was much belc^{JW} the State average of 33.0% Urban literacy in the district (58.5⁽²⁾). was, however, a little higher, than that of the State as ^a whole (55.9%) Information on libraries, reading rooms and adult education centres as well as cinema-houses and talkies in the district is given in tables 4. 6 and 4. 7

CHAPTER—V AGRICULTURE

Malda is predominantly an agricultural district with 1544631 of its population living in rural areas and 22.2 percent depending directly on agriculture and allied occupations for their subsistence. Amongst the working population about 45.6 per cent are cultivators, 33.9 per cent, agricultural labourers, and the remaining 20.5 per cent, belong to other categories.

This chapter presents data on some important aspects of agriculture such as land utilisation, area under and production of principal crops, forests, area irrigated and consumption of fertiliser.

Table 5.1 gives the distribution of total area of the district according to land-use for the years 1966-67 to 1970-71. Area under and production of principal crops of the district for the years 1971-72 to 1975-76 are shown in tables 5.2 and 5.3.

In 1975-76 the forests covered an area of 1372 hectares of the district of which 162 hectares were under reserved forests and 450 hectares under protected forest.

The data relating to area irrigated by sources upto 1975-76 are presented in table 5.5. Figure relating to fertilisers consumed has been presented in table 5.6.

CO-OPERATIVE

Table 7.1 gives information on progress of co-operative movements in the district during the years from 1971-72 to 1975-76.

In 1971-72 the member of Credit Societies in the district was 522 with a membership of 35720, the corresponding figures being 447 and 35722 for 1972-73, 431 and 31722 for 1973-74, 433 and 49514 for 1974-75 and 436 and 85605 for 1975-76. CHAPTER-VIII

INDUSTRY

Available statistics on number of registered working factories, small industrial establishments (unregistered), electrification of towns and villages as well as output and investment of selected industries in the district are presented in this chapter.

The number of registered working factorles in the district was 7 in 1974 and remained as same in the year 1975 to 1976.

The number of small industrial establishments employing 5-9 persons and using power and 5-19 persons without power and having investment in plant and machinery not exceeding Rs. 7.5 lakh in urban areas in the district was 56 against the State total of 7613 in the year 1971-72. Amongst the industries. tobacco manufacturing is by far the most important, constituting about 23.2 percent of the total industries in the district.

Information on the number of towns and villages electrified in the district is available in table 8.3. Out of 2 towns and 1611 inhabited villages, 2 and 606 respectively are electrified. (as on 31.3.76).

In table 8.4 has been furnished information on registered working factories employing 50 or more workers with the aid of power and 100 or more workers without the aid of power. It has been found that no such foctory was in existence in the district of Malda during the years from 1961 to 1963 and in 1968.

CHAPTER-IX

EMPLOYMENT AND LABOUR

This chapter presents data on the number of workers in registered and unregistered factories, coelmines, tea plantations, registered shops and establishments and State Govt. offices in the district.

The total number of workers employed per day in the registered factories located in the district was 543 in 1970 the corresponding figures being 586 for 1971, 264 for 1972, 260 for 1973, 270 for 1974, 273 for 1975, 291 for 1976.

The largest employment is found in textile industry, the average number of persons working per day being 179 in 1976.

CHAPTER-XII

TRANSPORT COMMUNICATION

Available data on transport and communication in the district have been presented in this chapter.

Information about roads maintained by P. W. D and local bodies in the district is given in table 12.1. The district has a total road length of 577.7 kilometres excepting those maintained by municipalities and Zilla Parishad. The road length maintained by the municipalities is 87.10 kilometres (in 1975-76). Of the total roads maintained by P. W. D. 67.30 km. are National Highways. 16.00 km. State Highways and 237.60 km. other district roads.

The number of different types of motor vehicles plying on road in the district is available in table 12.4 in all there are 915 vehicles in the district in 1976.

There are 238 post offices in the district without any separate telegraph office, and it has 18 Post and Telegraph (combined) offices in the district.
