## Sixth Five-Year Plan - 1978-83

### Introduction

The 6th Five-Year Plan covers the period from 1978-79 to 1982-83. The priorities in Education in this plan are :-

1. Universalization of Elementary Education
2. Adult Education
3. Vocationalization of Education


In other fields of education, no expansion is envisaged. In general, in secondary, collegiate and university education, the emphasis is on consolidation of facilities and raising the quality of higher education. In the field of technical education the existing intake capacities have been adjudged to be adequate to meet the manpower requirements for the coming 10 years. Therefore, instead of providing for new engineering/technological colleges or polytechnics the emphasis is at consolidation of existing facilities, diversification of courses and qualitative improvement of education.

II. According to the directives received, the plan provisions are to arise for the coming 4 years at the rate of 15% annually, taking the allocation for the year 1978-79 as the base. But the minimum needs programme is an exception to this. The total allocations on the various items of the minimum needs programme have been fixed down by the Planning Commission. In the Education Department we have concerned with the following items under the M.N.P. :-

(N.B. It may be noted here that the above allocation on nutrition comprises allocations for that purpose in the education as also in the social welfare budget).

III. It has not been possible for the State Government to restrict the calculations for the 6th Five-Year Plan on the basis of an estimated growth rate of 15% per annum. The following table shows the outlays proposed in this draft 6th Five-Year Plan. For comparison the utilised figures for the Fifth Plan are also given :-

From the above, it is apparent that, while preparing the actual plan, it has not been possible to restrict figures strictly to target figures on the basis of an estimated growth rate of 15% per annum. The reasons are briefly mentioned below:-

- 1). In the field of special education the proposed allocation for surpasses the estimated figures. This is because of the large outlay on the National Adult Education Programme. Though a target of Rs.897.00 lakhs has been fixed for Adult Education by the Planning Commission, the State Govt. has already sent to the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, Govt. of India, at the instance of the last a comprehensive programme for Adult Education for the 6th Plan-period and the estimated expenditure on literacy programme (Adult Education), according to that scheme is Rs.32,04.04 lakhs.
- 2). In the field of Sports & Physical Education the proposed outlay exceeds the target figures because the estimated cost of the Stadium at Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Calcutta), is likely to be about Rs. 20,00.00 lakhs.
- 3). Under the head 'General' comes the expenditure on libraries. In West Bengal we envisage setting up of two District Libraries, two Sub-District/Town Libraries, 21 Rural Libraries and one text-book libraries. This has pushed proposed outlay.
- 4). In the field of technical education the allocations for last 5 plans are as follows:-

The figures show that after the 3rd plan the allocation in technical education in West Bengal was drastically reduced. The allocation in the 4th plan was less than 30% of that in the 3rd plan. As a result of this, technical education in this State suffered serious setback after the 3rd plan. Even with uttar passing any expansion, a very modest estimate based on the recommendations of the various Committees set up by the AICT/Govt. of India/State Govt. for diversification at the polytechnic level and consolidation at higher level as also vocationalisation at the JTG level, the outlay comes to Rs. 31,32.55 lakhs.

V. There is directive that no new university is to be set up. The University at Midnapore was approved, before this ban, in consideration of local needs and also the necessity to relieve the pressure on the Calcutta University. We may consider this as an ongoing scheme. In fact, in the plan budget for the year 1978-79 a sum of Rs.10,00 lakhs was allocated for this purpose. Similarly, there is a directive that fresh liability in respect of any institution is not to be accepted. But the take over of the Ganga Industrial School and Welfare Home, Darjeeling, decided upon long before this ban and action towards its take-over has substantially progressed. In view of the position, we may treat this also as an ongoing scheme.

VI. The following is a statement showing new items introduced in the plan as well as those, in which the proposed expansion is of a major deserving special mention.

#### A. Primary Education

- 1). Additional enrolment of 16.56 lakhs - Boys 5.79 lakhs and girls 10.77 lakhs.
- 2). Establishment of 7200 new primary schools.
- 3). Establishment of 10,000 non-rural education centres for children at primary stage.
- 4). Construction of 40 Ashram type hostels for S/C and S/T students.
- 5). Distribution of slates and exercise books to 50 lakhs of students in rural areas.

#### B. Secondary Education

- 1). Attendance scholarship and school uniform to students of economically handicapped students.
- 2). Setting up of Ashram-type Jr. High Schools.
- 3). Construction of quarters for teachers in tribal and backward areas.

#### C. Special

- 1). Development of training institutions for the handicapped.
- 2). Publication of Rabindra Rachanabali(Works of Tagore).
- 3). Establishment of 1,53,398 new adult education centres in accordance with National Adult Education Programme.
- 4). Construction of new site buildings for Education Directorate and District Headquarters.

UNIVERSALISATION OF PRIMARY EDUCATION IN CLASSES  
I - V DRAFT OF 6TH FIVE YEAR PLAN

Detailed Notes on different schemes are given below :-

Universalisation of Primary Education - Setting up of new Primary Schools and appointment of new teachers for a target of additional enrolment of 16.56 lakhs of children to attain a coverage of 100% of the child population of the age-group 6-11 years by the end of 1982-83.

At the end of the 5th Plan (1977-78), 59.93 lakhs of children (boys - 37.66 lakhs and girls - 22.27 lakhs) out of the total population of 71.06 lakhs (boys - 36.02 lakhs and girls - 35.04 lakhs) of the age group 6-11 years are expected to have been covered by primary education in classes I - V. By this enrolment, 84% of the children (boys - 104% and girls 64%) of the age-group 6-11 years have been brought under facilities of primary education by 1977-78. During the 6th Plan, it is proposed to enrol 16.56 lakhs of additional children of the age-group 6-11 years. By enrolling these children, it is expected that 100% of the children of this age-group will be given schooling facilities in classes I - V by the end of 1982-83. The percentage of boys and girls to be covered by the end of the 6th Plan will be 110 and 90 respectively. Out of the additional children of 16.56 lakhs to be enrolled, the enrolment of boys and girls will be 5.79 lakhs and 10.77 lakhs respectively. Again out of these 16.56 lakhs of children, 11.56 lakhs (boys - 3.59 lakhs and girls 7.97 lakhs) lakhs of children will be brought under formal education and the remaining 51 lakhs (boys - 2.20 lakhs and 2.80 lakhs) (mainly belonging to age-group 9-11 years) under non-formal (part-time) education. This 93.15% of children will be covered under formal education and 6.85% under non-formal education.

a) Formal Education : It is proposed to start 7,200 new primary schools (rural - 6,000 and urban - 1,200) to enrol 7.20 lakhs of additional children while another 1.60 lakhs of children will be enrolled in the existing schools with cost and another 2.76 lakhs of children without cost. The number of schools to be set up each year, number of teachers to be appointed and additional enrolment envisaged in each year of the 6th Plan under formal education are given below :-

Schools-less villages and teacher pupil ratio.						

The number of villages in West Bengal (also as included in the Survey Report) is 38,074 while there are 37,714 schools in rural areas. Usually, most of the villages should have been covered under primary education. But during the last few years new primary schools have been sanctioned in rural areas on population basis, resulting the establishment of schools in some Districts far excess than the number of villages in districts while in some other districts there are lesser number of schools. The names of later kind of districts with their number of villages and schools are shown below :..

Since, villages having larger population require more schools, the districts other than those mentioned above, have schools in excess of the no. of villages there. The State Government shall endeavour to cover the school-less villages with facilities of education as early as possible but the policy of setting up new schools in villages having larger population will also have to be continued, so as to reach the target of universalisation in the long run. Hence, the estimated number of 6,000 new primary schools. The number of primary teachers is about 1,45,000, while the enrolment of students at the primary stage is 59.93 lakhs on 31.3.78. The teacher-pupil ratio works out to 1:41. However, since a large number of students in class V is reading in Secondary Schools, the teacher-pupil ratio ~~works out~~ in primary schools may be taken as 1:40 or 1:39. We have proposed to enrol additional 2.76 lakhs of children during the 6th Plan without any cost for these enrolment, no additional teachers will be necessary.

Since it has been proposed to enrol additional 8.80 lakhs of students at the primary stage with cost, with 22,000 teachers the teacher-pupil ratio will work out to 1 : 40 as at present.

Calculation of the above teacher-cost has been made @ Rs.325/- per teacher. Non-teacher cost has been calculated @ Rs.15%. The non-teacher cost includes contingency, furniture, house-rent (where necessary) etc.

#### (b) Contingency :

The primary schools set up upto 3rd plan in rural areas are given a monthly contingency of Rs.15/-. But all the primary schools set up from the 4th plan and all the urban primary schools receive a monthly contingency Rs.25/-. In order to make uniformity in the contingency grant of the rural primary schools set up upto the 3rd Plan i.e. @ Rs.25/- per month an expenditure of Rs.36 lakhs will be necessary. A provision of Rs.36 lakhs may be made in each year of the 6th Plan from 1979-80.

#### (c) Furniture & equipment

Primary Schools require grant for purchase of furniture, equipment and instructional materials. A provision of Rs.15 lakhs may be made @ Rs.500 for 3000 schools in the year 1978-79 and 8000 schools in the year 1979-80, 1980-81 & 1981-82, a sum of Rs.120 lakhs will be necessary.

(d) Out of the total quota of teachers sanctioned during the fifth plan, about 3000 teachers could not be appointed for various reasons. These teachers will be appointed during the 6th plan. A provision of rupees 134.55 lakhs being the salary of the teachers may be made in the budget of each year beginning from 1979-80. Total amount required will be Rupees 538.02 lakhs.

#### (e) Appointment of school mothers

It is proposed that one school mother be appointed for the teaching of the students of infant class to be attached to each school in the rural areas, as far as possible in a phased manner. 10,000 teachers will be appointed in each year beginning from 1980-81. The yearwise cost has been calculated as follows :-

#### (f) Sports facilities

The existing primary schools have no sports facilities. It is proposed that each school should have some sports facilities attracting students. A small grant of Rs.25/- p.m. be given to each school from 1980-81. The cost will be as follows :-

(g) Jeep for each Board

To cope with the increased work load of the District School Boards, it is difficult for the District School Boards to run on without jeep. The work of feeding programme has been entrusted to the District School Boards. The number of Schools is on the increase. Besides non-formal education for primary children is going to be introduced. Hence it is proposed that one additional jeep be provided to each District School Board. The cost has been estimated at Rs.40,000 for each jeep. The yearwise expenditure will be as follows :-

b. Non-formal Education It is proposed to give non-formal (Part-time) education to students of the age group 9-11 years who either drop out without completing education in Class IV & V., or cannot be educated in schools set-up under formal education system. About 5.00 lakhs of children will be covered under the scheme. The no. of children to be covered under this system and cost each year are indicated below :-

The cost has been calculated on the basis of (a) salary of two Instructors @ Rs.100/- per month each and (b) contingencies @ Rs.10/- per month per Centre and furniture, equipment, kits @ Rs.60/- per annum per Centre i.e. @ Rs.2,580/- per annum per Centre.

Pending formulation of a model syllabus to be followed in the non-formal Centres and preparation of reading materials including text books, the present syllabus of primary Education may be followed in these Centres with suitable abridgement or modification to meet the needs of these children belonging to the age group 9-11 years.

Syllabus for Class I & II should be taught in one year in condensed form and syllabus for Class III & IV may be taught in two years. Hence the Course will be for three years. After completing the course students will be able to get them admitted in Class V of High Schools.

## 2. Incentives

### (a) Text Books.

At present, all children of classes I - V of recognised primary schools are supplied with text-books free of cost.

In the 6th Plan, provision has to be made for supply of books to additional children to be brought to school. The cost (yearwise) along with additional enrolment is indicated below :

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N.B.-No. of books to be printed will be less than the enrolment figure since old books will be used in some cases as far as practicable.

Besides, it is proposed to supply text books to existing students in Hindi and Urdu from 1978-79 for the first time, total cost for five years has been calculated at Rs.25 lakhs @ Rs. 5 lakhs per year. Total cost for 5 years under Text Books will be Rs.125 lakhs.

### (b) Distribution of Schools Dress to Girl students

The scale of expenditure for distribution of free school dress to girl students in rural areas is Rs.10 per girl student per annum.

At present school dress is distributed to all tribal girl students, 50% of the S/c. girl students and 7-8% of other girl students. In the first year of the 6th Plan (1978-79) it is proposed to cover.

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100% of S/C girl students and 10% of other girl students under the scheme. The additional cost during 1978-79 has been worked out at Rs.14,67,000/- in the following manner :-

With effect from 1979-80, it is proposed to increase per capi cost from Rs.10/- to Rs.15/- so that one half pant/pantie along with one frock be given to each girl student reading in primary schools in rural areas belonging to 100% of SC & ST students and 20% of other girls. On the basis of existing enrolment in 1978-79, the additional cost in 1979-80 will be Rs.67,92,000/- as shown below :-

The cost during 1979-80 will be increased to Rs.76.17 lakhs if additional students enrolled are covered. If all the girl students in rural areas are covered during 1980-81, the cost will come to Rs.1,281.42 lakhs during the 6th Plan as shown below :-

Upto the end of 1977-78, we have sanctioned a total number 1.25 lakhs Attendance Scholarships for girl students in rural areas @ Rs.12/- per student per annum involving a total expenditure of 1.25 lakhs per annum. During 1978-79, it has been proposed to grant Attendance Scholarship in the following manner, involving an additional expenditure of Rs.10.56 lakhs in the Plan Budget for 1978-79 :-

Total cost during 1978-79 is Rs.25.56 lakhs.

With effect from 1979-80 it is proposed to increase the per capita cost of scholarship from Rs.1/- per month to Rs.2/- per month. Besides, it is proposed to grant scholarship to 100% of ST and SC girl students and 20% other girl students. The cost for 1979-80 on the basis of existing enrolment in 1978-79 will be Rs.159.60 lakhs, for 6,65,000 students. Additional cost during the next year (1979-80) will be the above Rs.159.60 lakhs minus the existing cost upto 1977-78 i.e., Rs.15 lakhs or Rs.144.60 lakhs and Rs.157.80 lakhs on the basis of additional coverage.

If all girl students in rural areas are covered during 1980-81 and the rate is increased from Rs.2 to Rs.3/- per student per month, the cost will be as follows :-

(ii) Ashram Type Hostels This is a new scheme. Ashram Type Hostels are proposed to be set up in Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste areas during 1978-79 for first time. These hostels are to be located as near as possible or attached to existing primary schools. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students will be accommodated free of cost in these schools. Financial implication including building, furniture etc. is estimated at Rs.1.00 lakhs (Rs.1.00 lakh per hostel). Similarly in the remaining four years of the 6th Plan 40 such Hostels are to be set up @ 10 hostels per year. Cost (including maintenance cost) of these hostels per year is indicated below :-

It is proposed to admit not more than 30 students in each hostel.

In addition to the above incentives, enrolment of students can further be possible by (1) multiple entry system and (2) discontinuation of detention at the primary level. Students in non-formal classes may also be allowed to sit for the scholarship examination on voluntary basis.

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Distribution of slates and exercise books to students

It is proposed to supply slate to students of classes I to V and exercise books to other students at a cost of Re. 1/- per head per year. About 50 lakhs students in rural areas will be benefited. The cost from the year 1979-80 onwards will be Rs. 50/- lakhs per annum.

Scheme for tribal areas      Besides the incentive scheme as mentioned before, special quota of schools and teachers will be kept earmarked for the tribal areas specially for Sub-Divisional (I.T.D.P.) areas during the 6th Plan. At the end of 1977-78, enrolment of tribal students will be 62.24% (Boys - 77.68% and girls 26.12%) total enrolment figure being 2.09 lakhs (Boys - 1,58,000 and girls - 51,000) against the child population of 3.97 lakhs. It is proposed to enrol additional 1.00 lakh tribal students (boys - 50,000 and girls - 50,000) during the 6th Plan. Anticipated child population (belonging to Scheduled Tribe) at the end of 6th Plan being 4.17 lakhs (boys - 2.9 lakhs and girls - 2.02 lakhs), percentage of coverage of tribal students at the end of the 6th Plan will be 73.63 (boys - 96% and girls - 50%). The number of schools to be set up and number of teachers to be appointed exclusively for the I.T.D.P. area are shown below :-

Details of the Tribal Sub-Plan are enclosed in a separate file. In addition, a scheme for expansion of primary education in other areas is also enclosed.

The system of granting recognition to schools set up with private initiative has been done away with. Consequently, all the schools to be set up in rural areas are to be sanctioned building grant amount which so that the schools can function smoothly. It is also proposed to sanction grants to existing schools in both urban and rural areas. Amount of grants required towards construction of buildings in rural areas is indicated below :-

## 2. Training Programme :

There are 48 Junior Basic Training Institutions in this State. The present intake - capacity in those Institutions is about 6,000. A large number of untrained candidates has been appointed as primary teachers during the last few years. These Institutions are not sufficient to cater to the needs of the teacher trainees. Moreover, untrained teachers are being appointed even now in about 40% of the new posts. Hence opening of more Junior Basic Training Institutions is a necessity. However, there are some Primary Training Schools in this State and a few of them have already been converted into Junior Basic Training Institutions. It is proposed to convert all such Institutions into Junior Basic Training Institutes for imparting training to 1000 trainees. Further, most of the existing Junior Basic Training Institutes were constructed long ago, and need through repairs. Some of them need electrification, boundary wall etc. Again, the stipend of the trainees is required to be enhanced from Rs.40/- per month per head to Rs.50/- per month per head during the 6th Plan. Hence, it is proposed that a total provision of 66.40 lakhs may be made under this head. Year-wise break up is given below :-

At present, 52% of the teachers in primary schools are untrained. In the training institutes, 70% of the seats are kept reserved for deputed teachers and the remaining 30% for freshers. Since appointment of organiser teachers (who are untrained) has been stopped now, teachers are to be appointed from approved panels in the following manner :-

- (a) In new schools - 60% of the posts by trained and 40% by untrained candidates
- (b) In existing schools -
  - (i) Owing to increase in enrolment - 100% by trained candidates.
  - (ii) Owing to normal vacancies (death, resignation etc.) - 50% by trained and 50% by untrained candidates.

Appointment of untrained candidates has been restricted, though not stopped. It is necessary that intake capacity will be increased by opening new Junior Basic Training Institutes for untrained candidates.

Secondary Education upto Class VI has been made free with effect from the 1st January, 1978. The amount is required for reimbursement of tuition fees for boys reading in Classes V & VI in Secondary Schools. This expenditure will be a committed item from 1978-79.

#### 8. Free education for boys reading in Classes VII & VIII

It has been decided that education upto Class VIII (VII-VIII) will be made free from the 1st January, 1979. A provision of Rs.1781.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for reimbursement of tuition fees for boys reading in Classes VII & VIII in 6th Plan period.

9. Provision for Scholarships, free studentship, etc.

A total provision of Rs.5.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head during the 6th Five Year Plan for expansion of the scheme of reimbursement of tuition fees for children of teaching and non-teaching staff of Secondary Schools.

10. UNICEF Programme for Science Education in Schools (Classes VI - VIII)

A provision of Rs.24.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for expansion of the scheme during the 6th Five Year Plan. The scheme aims at improvement of Science education at the elementary level through new and imaginative approach to teaching physical and life sciences and is for preparation of text materials, teachers' guide books, development of science kits/equipment and for experimentation and also for evaluation of effectiveness of new methods of science teaching.

12. Provision for short course training of Secondary School teachers in life science and appointment of teachers in optional subjects.

A total provision of Rs.110.40 lakhs has been proposed under this head during the 6th Five Year Plan for payment of recurring grant as contingencies @ Rs.200/- p.m. to each High School/High Madrasah and non-recurring grant for purchase of equipment for teaching in life science @ Rs.2,500/- per institution.

A total provision of Rs.5.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head during the 6th Five Year Plan for development of the Institution of English at Calcutta and the Science Institute at Burdwan.

A provision of Rs.10.00 lakhs has been proposed for the scheme under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan period for providing tiffin to girl students of Government Schools for girls in the districts of Purulia, Nadia, Cooch Behar, Jalpaiguri, Midnapore and Calcutta.

**24. District Advisory Committee in Secondary Education**

A provision of Rs.2.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for meeting the extra expenditure of these committees in connection with the expansion programme in Secondary Education.

**25. Development of West Bengal Board of Secondary Education**

The provision of Rs.1.00 lakh under this head is meant for development of West Bengal Board of Secondary Education.

**26. Provision for teachers' training (MNP)**

A total provision of Rs.97.60 lakhs has been proposed for this scheme for the 6th Five Year Plan for the development of teachers' training in Elementary Education. The provision is for meeting expenditure on stipend to trainees and for expansion of, or addition to existing Training Institutes (including cost of furniture).

**27. Provision for twin quarters for teachers of Secondary Schools in Tribal and Backward areas (M.N.P.)**

A total provision of Rs.14.00 lakhs has been proposed for this scheme for the 6th Five Year Plan for Teachers' twin quarters including water connection and sanitary latrines @ Rs.35,000/- per twin quarter.

## Special Education

### 1. Literacy Programme (N.N.P.)

A total provision of Rs. 3204.04 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan for establishment and maintenance of 1,53,393 new centres for adult education during the 6th Five Year Plan. The scheme for literacy programme has been formulated in accordance with Govt. of India directives and forwarded to the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare separately.

### 2. Provision of books and reading materials for neo-literates (N.N.P.)

A total provision of Rs. 12.00, lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan to meet expenditure in connection with books and reading materials for neo-literates.

### 3. Non-formal Education Programme for youths in the age group 15-25 (N.N.P.)

A total provision of Rs. 270.28 lakhs has been proposed under the head for the 6th Five Year Plan for meeting expenditure under non-formal programme.

### 4. Development of Regional language

A total provision of Rs. 25.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan. The provision is meant for granting financial assistance in special cases towards re-printing of books, fresh printing of books and memorial prizes.

### 5. Publication of Bengali literature including classics.

A total provision of Rs. 20.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan. The provision is meant for publication of books containing writings of eminent Bengalee writers.

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6. Improvement and development of Madrasah Education.

A total provision of Rs. 25.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the sixth Five Year Plan. The provision is meant for accommodating additional charges for building grants and for purchase of furniture, equipments etc. for Senior Madrasahs.

7. Promotion of Urdu

A total provision of Rs. 25.00 lakhs has been suggested under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan for promotion of Urdu in this State.

9. Development of Training Institutions for the handicapped

A total provision of Rs. 35.00 lakhs has been proposed for this scheme for the 6th Five Year Plan. The provision meant for :-

- a) Development of Lighthouse for the Blind in Calcutta
- b) Setting up of a Training Centre for female teachers of the blind
- c) Setting up of a Training Centre for adult deaf.

10. Construction of an additional storey over the annexe building attached to the Calcutta Madrasah for accommodation of the office of the West Bengal Madrasah Education Board.

A total provision of Rs. 7.50 lakhs has been proposed for this scheme for the 6th Five Year Plan for construction of an additional storey over the annexebuilding attached to the Calcutta Madrasah for accommodation of the office of the West Bengal Madrasah Education Board.

A total provision of Rs. 2072.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan. This provision is meant for meeting expenditure towards purchase of equipment, furniture etc. of the Universities of this State as well as construction of buildings of these Universities.

### 3. Establishment of a new University at Midnapore.

A total provision of Rs. 200.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan. This provision is meant for establishment of a new University at Midnapore.

### 4. Development of Presidency College, Calcutta

A total provision of Rs. 86.49 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan towards meeting expenditure for purchase of equipment, furniture etc. and also for construction of building of the Presidency College, Calcutta.

### 5. Development of Darjeeling Government College.

It has been decided to introduce geography (Pass & Hon's) in the Darjeeling Govt. College from the current session. No new decision has also been taken to open Higher Secondary (XI-XII) Courses in the Morning/Day/Evening in almost all Government Colleges from the current session with an intake capacity of 300 students in each College. Additional teaching and non-teaching staff will be required for smooth running of these classes. Additional accommodation will be required for these new courses. So in order to meet the expenditure in connection with the above schemes a total provision of Rs. 109.95 lakhs (including Capital cost of Rs. 47.71 lakhs) has been proposed for Darjeeling Govt. College for the 6th Five Year Plan.

### 6. Development of Hooghly Mohsin College, Hooghly.

A total provision of Rs. 158.10 lakhs (including capital cost of Rs. 47.71 lakhs) has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan towards meeting expenditure in connection with introduction of Higher Secondary Course and also for purchase of equipment, furniture, books etc. for the Hooghly Mohsin College.

### 3. Improvement of Sports and Games.

A total provision of Rs. 150.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan for granting financial assistance to the different sports organisations in the State for participating in various competitions and for organising tournaments and inter-state championships.

### 4. Campus Work, Stadium, Playgroung etc.

A total provision of Rs. 300.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan for granting financial assistance, in an accepted pattern, towards construction of stadia, Swimming Pool, Manasa and for development of play grounds etc. in all the districts.

#### 4. Development of Cultural Halls.

A total provision of Rs. 50.00 lakhs has been proposed under this head for the 6th Five Year Plan. The provision is meant for acquisition, development and construction of :-

- a) Swami Vivekananda's ancestral house at Calcutta (Acquisition and setting up of a museum).
- b) Sarat Sadan at Howrah (Construction)
- c) Rabindra Bhavan, Darjeeling (Development)



### TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The following statement shows allocations on technical education in three States in the various plan periods (figures in lakhs of rupees) :-

These figures indicate that from First to the Third Plan the outlay on technical education increased steadily. After that there was a serious decline in the outlay in West Bengal; the allocation in West Bengal in the 4th Plan was less than 30% of that in the Third Plan; that in the fifth Plan was less than that in the Second Plan. The figures for Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu indicate that in those States technical education received due importance in all the plans.

In West Bengal technical education is at present in bad shape. A mere 15% growth rate, taking the outlay for the year 1973-79 as the base, would be to perpetuate the present plight of technical education West Bengal. Therefore, for the 5th Plan we have not restricted ourselves to a mere 15% annual rise. A very modest estimate has been made for improving technical education West Bengal with main emphasis on consolidation at the diploma, degree and P G levels and diversification at the diploma level as also vocationalisation at the School level. For major developments at the degree and P G levels the Department of Science and Technology of the Government of India and the C S I R will be approached for necessary support.

#### B. Junior Technical Schools

The Junior Technical Schools lie in a state of total neglect with very little of the facilities which such institutions are supposed to have. The plan provides for consolidation of technical education at the certificate (Junior diploma) level and also introduction of vocational course, vocationalisation being a priority item in the 6th Plan. The estimated expenditure for the 6th Plan period are as follows :-

for consolidation Rs.5.00 lakhs x20 = Rs. 100.00 lakhs

for vocationalisation

Rs.2.00 lakhs x 20= Rs. 40.00 lakhs

Rs. 140.00 lakhs

### 3. Development of School of Printing Technology, Calcutta.

As for the Regional Institute of Printing Technology, there is a proposal for developing it as an advanced centre. If this is approved by Government of India, the State will have to share the expenditure. This has been provided for in the plan.

We have earmarked Rs. 10.00 lakhs for consolidation and Rs. 50.00 lakhs for State share of development of advanced centre, the total of the two being Rs. 60.00 lakhs.

### 4. Polytechnics - Diploma Course

As for polytechnics we shall complete the taking over of all the 23 sponsored polytechnics. In preparing the plan we have taken note of the fact that there has been very little input since the 3rd Plan. Most of the polytechnics need buildings. Very few polytechnics have workshops, laboratories and libraries worth the name. Two polytechnics (Contai and Raigunj) approved by the State Government in the 3rd plan not actually started functioning as yet owing to the stoppage of fund flow, even though Rs. 33.00 lakhs (Rs. 23.00 lakhs for Contai and Rs. 15.00 lakhs for Raiganj) have been spent on buildings. The condition of the Darjeeling Polytechnic (Kurseong) is only marginally better and this polytechnic started functioning with a nominal intake of 60 per annum in a dilapidated hired buildings and students have to run down to Jalpaiguri (a distance of 60 miles) for practical classes.

The Government have decided to shift the Belur and Belgharia Polytechnics from their present sites in the Mission complexes. This will cost almost the same amount as that for setting up of two new polytechnics.

Diversification of diploma courses could not so far be taken up for lack of resources. In the 6th plan we have kept provision for diversification by the introduction of the following courses with a very good demand and an excellent scope of employment :- Metallurgy, Pharmacy, Secretariat Practice, Interior Decorations, Timber Technology and Automobile Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Instrumentation, Ship Repair and Maintenance, Fisheries Technology, Leather and Footwear Technology.

The polytechnics at Jhargram and Kurseong have specific importance because of their location in a tribal and a hill area respectively.

The Kanyapur and the Asansol Polytechnics are likely to be adopted by Coal India Limited for the training of technicians for employment in coal mines.

Diploma and advanced diploma courses in paints and varnishes are in great demand. But this issue may be taken by the Commerce and Industries Department which runs a post F.Sc. course in paints and varnishes.

### 5. Development of Engineering Colleges

For the Government Engineering Colleges the plan for the coming five years is based on the Review Committee (1972) recommendations. The plan is concerned mostly with consolidation, but also with diversification to a limited extent :-

(a) At the degree level tea technology will be introduced, by way of diversification, under the Mechanical Engineering Department at Jalpaiguri Government Engineering College. Considering the fact that about 500 tea gardens in North Bengal at present depend on the Tea Training Centre at Telli, Assam, the inclusion of tea technology in the curriculum at Jalpaiguri will go a long way to meet local employment needs.

(b) At the P G level the following new courses are envisaged for Bengal Engineering College (in addition to consolidation of existing P G Courses in Traffic and Transportation Engineering under Civil Engineering and Town Regional Planning under Architecture) :-

- i) Industrial Engg. and Operations Research (under Mechanical Engineering)
- ii) Thermal Power Engineering (under Mechanical Engineering)
- iii) Power Systems Engineering (under Electrical Engineering)
- iv) Communication Systems Engineering (under Electrical Engineering)
- v) Heat Treatment Technology (under Metallurgy).

We have, however, not provided any fund for these courses as the entire expenditure of P G Courses is to be borne by the Government of India.

The total expenditure for development and consolidation of the engineering colleges comes to Rs. 511.50 lakhs. Details are given below :-

6,7,8 Development of Colleges of Textile & 9. Technology, Barhampore and Serampore, that of Leather Technology, Calcutta and Ceramic Technology, Calcutta.

The four technological colleges were taken over by the Commerce and Industries Department in 1968. The inputs being totally insufficient, those colleges are running a crippled existence without suitable laboratory, library and workshop facilities.

In respect of these four colleges the plan is based on recommendations of Expert Committees appointed by the A I C T E/Govt. of India/State Govt.

For its proper growth the College of Leather Technology ought to be shifted from its present location to a suitable site (we suggest the 2.75 acres of land on Jessor Road originally earmarked for a Junior Technical School). The present premises may be utilised for a diploma course in leather and footwear technology, for which there is a great demand. For the College some assistance from the F A O may be available. (A Scheme for Rs.25.00 lakhs of F A O assistance is being pursued by the Govt. of India

Industry-oriented (full-time) P G courses are envisaged for all the technological colleges but no fund has been provided in the plan for this purpose as P G courses are fully financed by Govt. of India.

The total 6th plan expenditure on the development of these colleges will be Rs.326.30 lakhs as detailed below

As for the Regional Engineering College, Durgapur, the plan reflects only the State share of the extra recurrent expenditure which comes to Rs.25.00 lakhs.

12. Scholarships for Students of Engineering Colleges, Technological Colleges, Polytechnics etc.

Scholarships at the polytechnic level was first included in the plan budget in 1978-79, in which year the provision was Rs.1.00 lakh. This provision will be expanded and total of Rs.25.00 lakhs have been earmarked for expenditure in the 6th plan period. In addition, a sum of Rs.-15.00 lakhs have been provided for residency and fellowships in accordance with the recommendations of the A I C T E in the matter of industry- institution interaction.

13. Strengthening of Technical Education Services.

It is absolutely essential that three new cells are created in the Directorate for the following functions :-

- Man-power Estimation
- Planning and Quality Improvement
- Performance Evaluation (Monitoring, Inspection)

The Planning and Quality Improvement Cell ought to be under the charge of a Joint Director and the other two Cells under Deputy Directors. The post of a Joint Director is to be created (as in Bihar).

The State Council of Technical Education will be physically separated from the Directorate. We shall aim at developing the S C T E into a statutory body.
