NUMBER OF VILLAGES ELECTRIFIED

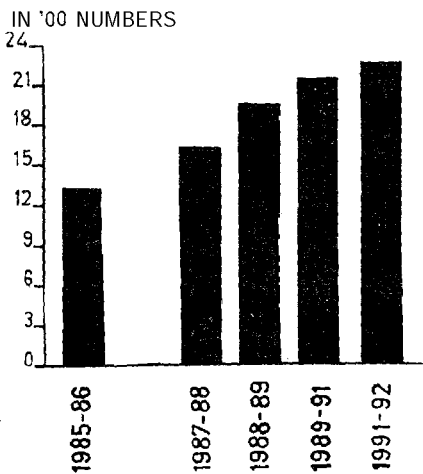

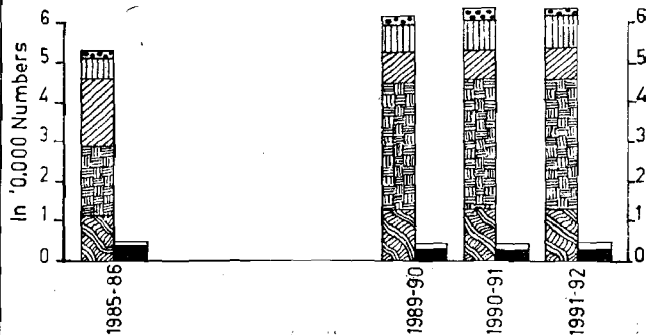

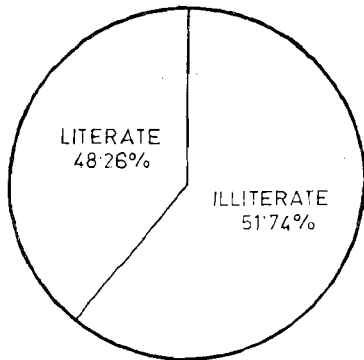

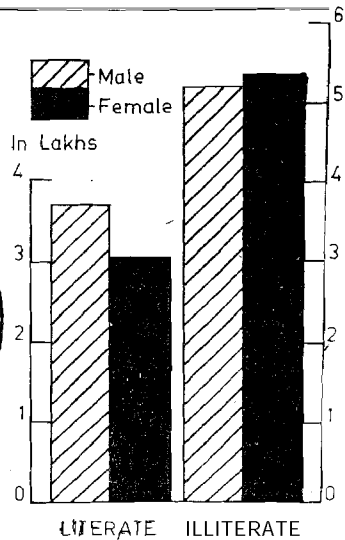
