Executive Summary: 2014-2015

The Executive Summary of the UGC Annual Report 2014-2015 encapsulates not only the activities of the UGC to achieve its mandatory objectives but also physical targets achieved under its various schemes / programmes and the expenditure entailed on the same, besides the statistical growth in the higher education sector.

1. Introduction

- The UGC functions through various Bureaus and Cells. The reports of various activities of these cells during the year under reporting are reproduced below.
- As many as 16,648 applications and 1,199 appeals under Right to Information Act, 2005 had been received and disposed off by CPIOs/Appellate Authorities of UGC during 2014-15 and ₹95,850/- were collected as RTI fee and ₹46,259/- as additional fee.
- The Pay Scale Cell, which is entrusted with the responsibility of co-ordinating the work of Pay Review Committee for teachers and resolving matters relating to pay scales and service conditions of teachers in Universities and Colleges, had got circulated the regulations regarding minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff and appointment of UGC Observers to oversee the process of selection/promotion of Readers to Professors. No UGC observer was appointed to oversee the selection process for promotion from the post of Reader to the post of Professor under CAS.
- The SC/ST/OBC Cell of the UGC has been monitoring the effective implementation of the Reservation Policy for SC/ST/OBC in admissions and appointments to Teaching and Non Teaching posts in the University System.
- The Minority Cell, which was set up in 2008, deals with the issues related to Minorities such as according Deemed University status and providing affiliation to Minorities institutions, etc. The Cell is strengthened by employing Group 'A' and Group 'B' officers for discharging the functions of the Cell.
- The Vigilance Cell of UGC received as many as 310 complaints from CVC (15), MHRD (11), CBI (29) and others (255) (various Universities & Colleges and other agencies) during the reporting year and the complaints of sensitive nature were placed before the Enquiry Committee and action was initiated according to the recommendations of the Committee.
- The UGC had been impleaded in as many as 1369 cases filed in various courts of India during 2014-15 and an expenditure of ₹208.05 lakhs was incurred on the bills of advocates as compared to ₹269.38 lakhs in the previous year.
- The Desk-Parliament had received as many as 756 Parliament Questions during 2014-15 as compared to 505 in the previous year. The number of starred questions was 63 out of which 8 questions had been under assurance and the rest had been disposed off.
- The Cell against Malpractices which deals with the menace of existence and mushrooming of Fake Universities and degrees has identified a total of 21 institutions and initiated action on them. In addition to these 21 Fake Universities there are two more institutes, *viz*. (1) Bhartiya Shiksha Parishad, Lucknow, and (2) Indian Institute of Planning and Management (IIPM), which are not recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC ACT, 1956. The UGC filed an FIR against IIPM. The number of institutions varies with addition/deletion of the names of certain institutions based on the concrete actions of the UGC. The UGC issued public notices/ press releases for awareness of public/students in newspapers at the beginning of academic session cautioning the aspiring students not to seek admission in fake institutions.
- No complaint was received by the Cell against Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place from any woman official of the UGC during the reporting year.
- The Anti-Ragging Cell, which was set up in 2008, is responsible for eradicating the menace of ragging from higher educational institutions. All higher educational institutions have been asked to follow the UGC regulations in regard to ragging. A nation-wide 24X7 toll-free anti-ragging help line 1800-180-5522 has been established with call centre facilities in 12 languages. An anti-ragging web portal has been developed.

During the reporting year (2014-2015), 211 complaints were received from various colleges/universities and the institutions concerned were asked to take action on the complaints and send the action taken report to the UGC. In 181 cases, action taken was reported by Institutions, however, in the remaining 30 cases action taken reports are awaited.

• The Publication Bureau incurred an expenditure of ₹31.90 lakhs on Publication/ Printing during the reporting year.

- Out of the plan grants (₹4178.46 crores) released during 2014-15, 57.25% had gone to Central Universities, 2.63% to Deemed to be Universities, 12.33% to state universities and 5.72% to Colleges of State Universities, 1.15% to colleges of Central Universities, 3.15% to Inter University Centres, 13.85% to Regional Centres, 3.85% to Misc./Non Univ. Inst., 3.24% to on line payment for Fellowships & Scholarships, 0.06% to Estt. and 0.05% to Distance Education Bureau.
- Out of the total Non-Plan grant (₹5536.09 crores) released during 2014-15, 63.26% had gone to Central Universities, 28.45% to colleges of Delhi, Banaras Hindu University and other central Universities, 4.53% to Deemed to be Universities, 2.56% to State Universities, 0.87% to Inter University Institutions / Centres, 0.04% to State Universities Colleges, 1.43% to Administrative Charges (Head Office & Regional Offices)
- The Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) for evolving uniform cadre structure and rationalization of pay scales, duties, qualifications of the posts of non-teaching staff (central and UGC maintained Deemed universities only) who are not covered under the pay Review Committee for teaching staff, had finalized its reports in respect of all 24 cadres in 2011-12. The reports approved by the Commission were sent to MHRD for its concurrence. The MHRD vide its letter dated 07.05.2014 approved some of the recommendations of JCRC report which have been communicated to all Central Universities/UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities for implementation. The approved guidelines regarding implementation of ACP scheme in centrally funded institutions have also been circulated.
- Having come into being on 28th December, 1953, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has completed 61 years of its existence with its mandate for the co-ordination and determination of standards in Universities. It has, thus, covered 61 milestones of its journey for qualitative improvement of higher education in the country.

UGC: Major Decisions during the Year

• In discharge of its cardinal function of coordinating and maintaining standards of higher education, and for realization of the goals of the XII Plan, the UGC has taken several measures during the Third Year of the XII Plan (2014-2015).

- The Commission ratified and approved the continuation of Colleges under Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)/CE which get 'A' grade re-accreditation from NAAC within one year after discontinuation under the scheme.
- The Commission ratified and approved the University Grants Commission's Annual Report 2012-2013 (English & Hindi) for placing before the Parliament through MHRD.
- The Commission approved the matter of 8 Deemed to be Universities to utilize portion of Internal Receipts of 2013-14 to meet the deficit on Non-Salary expenditure under Non-Plan.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of 300 Raman Fellowships for Post-Doctoral research in United States for the year 2014.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of grants for the proposals on UGC-UKIERI (UK India Education and Research Initiative) Thematic Partnership for the year 2013-2014.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of Joint Research Projects, 2014 under India New Zealand Education Council (INZEC).
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding under the 'Project-based Personnel Exchange' Programme.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding for visit to South Asia Institute, Heidelberg.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding under "Exchange of Scientists Programme".
- The Commission noted and approved the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India, and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU), Norway, signed on 14th February, 2014 in New Delhi.
- The Commission took note of the pending audit paras of the last several years and instructed that the UGC Secretariat should promptly send replies to the pending paras.
- The Commission decided that Institutions Deemed to be Universities which have been conferred that status for 25 years or more, and have a valid NAAC Grade A accreditation and have also been given 'A' Grade by the Tandon Committee may be permitted relaxation to the provisions of clause 5.2 of the UGC Institutions Deemed to be University Regulations, 2010 to the extent that the sponsoring Society/Trust/Company of such an Institution can also appoint the President/Trustee/Promoter of the sponsoring Society/Trust/Company or his/her close relative as its Chancellor, provided that such a person is an eminent educationist or a distinguished public figure. The existing Regulations are being amended accordingly.
- The Commission approved the Scheme for Creation and Management of 'Reserve Fund' through Internal Receipts for Universities and Colleges maintained by the UGC.
- The Commission decided that a Committee be constituted consisting of 2 Commission members, representatives
 from Central/State Universities, and a representative from Ministry of HRD to develop guidelines for norm
 based funding by the UGC to Universities/colleges by aligning them with the norms under the RUSA.
- The Commission considered the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 21st January, 2014 on the 44 Category-'C' Institutions Deemed to be Universities, along with the Interlocutory directive dated 5th May, 2014 and resolved, as the time for submission of the Report to the Ministry is 31st July, 2014,to constitute a Sub-Committee to undertake assessment of the 41 Category 'C' Institutions Deemed to be Universities within the stipulated time.
- The Commission decided that the present UGC Regulations on Technical Education be kept on hold till the final outcome of the decision of the Supreme Court.
- The Commission resolved to advise the University of Delhi under Section 12(d) of the UGC Act, 1956, to review/reconsider the continuation of the FYUP.
- The Commission approved the Guidelines for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) during XII Plan Period (2012-2017).

- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines of Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences (Including Languages).
- The Commission approved the creation of 300 faculty positions under the UGC Faculty Recharge Programme and also decided that a proposal should also be prepared by the UGC for inclusion of social sciences under the Faculty Recharge Programme.
- The Commission approved the 25 posts under the XII Plan for strengthening NAAC headquarters.
- The Commission approved the recommendations of the report of the Committee constituted to review the performance of the Inter-University Centres (IUCs) and decided to constitute the Implementation Monitoring Committee.
- The Commission approved the XII plan Guidelines of Special Scholarship Scheme for North Eastern Region with the observation that the parental income be reduced from the proposed ₹6 lakh per annum to ₹4.5 lakh per annum. It also decided that the Scheme be launched from academic year 2014-15 onwards.
- The Commission approved the recommendations of the 7th Meeting of Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges held on 03.06.2014 for grant of 33 Fresh and 12 Extension cases of autonomous status to the colleges and consider the approval of the revised guidelines on Autonomous Colleges.
- The Commission noted and approved that sanction order in respect of financial assistance to colleges should be utilized within the time period specified under the GFR.
- The Commission approved the proposal to allow extension of time for completion of projects approved during the XI Plan, and allow institutions to utilize the unspent amount, out of the allocation made during the XI Plan for such projects, during the XII plan period for completion of the projects.
- The Commission approved of the Notification with the observations that the provisions for Undergraduate programmes should also be extended to Postgraduate programmes and that no animal from any species shall be dissected either by teachers or students for any purposes at these levels.
- The Commission approved the XII plan Guidelines for Post Doctoral Fellowship to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Candidates.
- The Commission approved the amendments in the Guidelines for Centres with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas (CPEPA) for XII Plan Period (2012-2017).
- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines prepared by the Expert Committee for establishment of Hindi Department and promotion of Hindi in Central/State/Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding outsourcing of NET to the Central Board
 of Secondary Education (CBSE) and also resolved to constitute a Committee to coordinate with the CBSE
 on all matters relating to pre-conduct and post-conduct activities of the NET, UGC-NET to continue with
 the existing pattern of NET; however, a sub-committee may be constituted to look into the feasibility of the
 recommendations of the Committee.
- The Commission approved the "Guidelines for the Scheme of Granting Special Heritage Status to Universities and Colleges" during XII Plan (2012 2017).
- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines "Regional Centre for Knowledge Enhancement and Capacity Building" (RCKECB) & "Human Resource Development Centres" (HRDCs)with the observation that "Regional Centre for Knowledge Enhancement and Capacity Building" (RCKECB) should be renamed as 'Regional Centre for Capacity Building' (RCCB), and also resolved that the minimum number of participants in the Refresher/Orientation Courses to be 30 (Thirty).
- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding inclusion of "Transgender" as "Third Gender" under various Scholarship/Fellowships schemes of UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the report of the Sub-Committee constituted by the Commission to undertake assessment of the 41Category 'C' Institutions Deemed to be Universities and resolved that the report of the Sub-Committee be forwarded to the MHRD for further necessary action at their level.

- The Commission considered the modifications in the UGC (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2012 and after due deliberations, resolved to approve the proposed amendments.
- The Commission considered and approved the draft of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2014.
- The Commission considered and approved the modifications in UGC's 12B Rules and application formats.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines for General Development Assistance (GDA) for Central Universities, Institutions Deemed to be Universities and State Universities.
- The Commission considered and resolved to initiate the action on feasibility of formulating New Schemes and/or Expending/Strengthening Existing Schemes in respect of Ideas/points mentioned in PMO's communication.
- The Commission considered and approved the fresh proposals pending for approval of programmes under Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode.
- The Commission considered and approved the Expert Committee's Report on National Initiative for Fostering Social Responsibility in Higher Education and Guidelines for Establishment of Centre for Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Universities during XII Plan (2012 2017).
- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding the inclusion of Establishment of Diaspora Chair in Goa University in the Guidelines for the UGC Chairs in Universities during XII Plan (2012-2017).
- The Commission considered and approved the XII plan Guidelines of Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Scholarship for Research in Social Sciences and decided that it may be treated on a par with other fellowships awarded for pursing Ph.D. program.
- The Commission considered and approved payment of Pension & Family Pension to the UGC Research Scientists directly to the Pensioner's by the Finance Division, UGC, as done in case of UGC Pensioners/family pensioners cases.
- The Commission considered and approved the review of the Guidelines for the UGC Chairs in Universities during XII Plan (2012-17) and amendment with regard to remuneration provided to Chair Professors.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines of the schemes 'Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges' & 'Capacity Building of Women Managers in Higher Education'.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII plan Guidelines for Swachh Bharat-Swasth Bharat Scheme of the UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the Report of the Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University), New Delhi, to establish off-campus centre at Agartala (Tripura).
- The Commission considered the report of the Expert Committee constituted to examine the funds required for 'Centre for Policy Research in Higher Education' established by the National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NUEPA) (Deemed to be University), New Delhi, and after due deliberation resolved to approve the proposal with the condition that the progress of the Centre be reviewed on an annual basis and that the Centre will undertake projects, on priority, which would be referred to it by the Commission from time to time
- The Commission considered the observations of the Sub-Committee of the Commission and approved their recommendations with regard to approval of institutions under sections 2(f), 12B and compliance under Section 13 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission after due deliberations approved the guidelines for the Choice Based Credit System. Further, the Commission resolved that before these guidelines are communicated to the Universities for adoption / adaptation, they may be vetted by a Committee headed by the Commission Member Shri Patanjali (Patu) G. Keswani.
- The Commission considered and approved the inclusion of a Chair in the name of Lakshminath Bezbaroa and Sri Aurobindo in the existing guidelines for UGC Chair in Universities during Twelth Plan.

- Based on the concurrence received from majority of the Members, the Commission approved the setting up of IUC-TE at Varanasi with a budgetary requirement of ₹56 crore (Non-recurring) and ₹8.32 crore (Recurring) per annum. MoA of the IUC was also approved for the purpose of registration under Societies Registration Act, 1860, or under the relevant Act of the State Government in whose jurisdiction the institution is located.
- The Commission considered and approved the draft amendment of "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 3rd Amendment, 2014, and also resolved that since the Raghavan Committee is working for several years it may be requested to look into the issue in its entirety and suggest a way forward.
- The Commission considered and approved the proposal to retain the internal receipts with the Central Universities to cover up the short-fall of non-salary component under Non-Plan Grant till the appropriate allocation is made by MHRD under non-salary components to meet the short-fall under non-salary expenditure (Non-Plan) and also resolved that the internal receipts may also be got audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India.
- The Commission considered and approved the status quo strategy for continuation of recognition to Universities/ Institutions offering programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode for the academic session 2015-16.
- The Commission decided to give relaxation for releasing the grant under Plan and Non-Plan Scheme of Colleges to all Universities / Colleges to apply for NAAC accreditation upto 31st December, 2015.
- The Commission considered and approved the amendment in the clause 7.3.0 of UGC Regulations, 2010 regarding composition of Selection-cum-Search Committee for deemed to be Universities for selection of Vice-Chancellor.
- The Commission considered and approved of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on "Universities with Potential for Excellence" (UPE) held on 17.11.2014.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines for the scheme 'Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India'.
- The Commission considered and approved the collaboration of Bhasha with M. S. University of Baroda for promotion of indigenous languages and resolved that the funding should be given only to M.S University of Baroda.
- The Commission considered and approved the Amendments in the Guidelines for Knowledge Upgradation Centers for Skilled Human Action and Learning (KAUSHAL).
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Revised) Guidelines for Community Colleges.
- The Commission considered and approved the guidelines for Curricular Aspects, Assessment Criteria, and Credit System in Skill based Vocational Courses under NSQF.
- The Commission considered and approved that extension will be given for a period of one year for the Centres of Nano-Science, Nano-Technology/Bio-Medical, Nano-Technology of University of Mumbai, University of Calcutta and University of Madras respectively which were allocated Special Grant of ₹100 crore each for celebration of 150 years of their existence.
- The Commission noted and approved the amendment to the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations,2010 by removing the phrase 'the senior most Dean or if there is no Dean' from clause 6.2 (3) of the said Regulations.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Specification of Degrees to be notified as the First Amendment in UGC Notification dated 5th July, 2014.
- The Commission considered and examined the report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted by the Commission to physically inspect 7 Institutions Deemed to be Universities which had filed Interlocutory

- Applications before Hon'ble Supreme Court. The Commission observed number of deficiencies in these Institutions deemed to be Universities inspected by the Committee.
- The Commission considered and approved that the Report of Gurukul Kangri Vishwavidyalaya, Haridwar, be sent to the MHRD and to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Furnishing of Information by Universities) Regulations, 2015.
- The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines for ensuring Safety of Students on Excursion/Study Tours.
- The Commission considered and approved the Cadre Recruitment Rules of NAAC.
- The Commission considered and approved the transfer and release of ₹20 crores to INFLIBNET (an IUC of UGC) on the recommendations of the Standing Committee constituted for the production of e-Content Courseware on PG Subjects.
- The Commission considered and approved and also decided to set up a sub-committee to decide on parameters and guidelines for conferment of Potential for Excellence Status for Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Gender Sensitization, Prevention and Prohibition of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students and Redressal of Grievances in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015.
- The Commission considered and approved the guidelines for empanelment of Adjunct Faculty in universities and colleges.
- The Commission considered the revised pattern of assistance for release of grant for construction of Women Hostesl for Central, State and Deemed Universities during the XII Plan period and decided to release 40% as the first installment followed by 40% as second installment and 20% as the final installment.
- The Commission while taking a serious view of the procedure followed in issuing earlier grants and setting up of EMMRC and National Institute of Social Work and Social Sciences (NISWASS) reiterated its earlier decision taken in its meeting held on 11th March,2013 and in addition the Commission also took cognizance of the two enquiry committees which were set up to enquire into the irregularities of the Institute and decided that the EMMRC and NISWASS be closed down with immediate effect.

2. Growth of Higher Education System: Some Statistics

- The Commission is empowered under Section 12 (h) of the UGC Act to collect information on all such matters relating to University education in India and other countries as it thinks fit.
- In order to get timely and quality data in the education sector, which is having implications for human development, the Ministry of Human Resource Development initiated an All India Survey of Higher Education to build a database and to assess the overall picture of Higher Education in the country.
- A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of National Informatics Centre (NIC) for collection and compilation of the data. All the institutions need to register on the portal for accessing the portal and uploading the data. From 2014-15 the Information and Statistics Bureau of UGC has stopped collecting data directly from the Universities. Compilation and estimation of data at the All India level is being made through the portal http://aishe.gov.in and this enabled us to shift to paperless exercise.
- At the time of Independence of India, there were only 20 Universities and 500 Colleges in the country with 2.1 lakhs students in higher education. The numbers now have increased 40 times in the case of the Universities, 82 times in the case of Colleges and the students enrolment has gone up to over 127 times in the formal system of higher education in comparison to the figures at the time of independence.
- As on 31.03.2015, the number of Universities had gone up to 711 (46 Central, 329 State, 205 State Private, 128 Deemed to be Universities, three Institutions established under State Legislation) and 40760 colleges in the

Higher Education sector. So far as the number of universities in states is concerned, Rajasthan tops the list with 68 universities, followed by Uttar Pradesh (64), Tamil Nadu (52), etc. It is observed from the list that there is uneven establishment of universities in the states.

- During the reporting year 2014-2015, 18 State Public and 30 State Private Universities were included in the UGC list of universities and 6 universities were declared fit to receive central assistance under 12B of the UGC Act.
- As many as 1147 new colleges were established in various states during 2014-2015, thus taking the total number of colleges from 39613 in 2013-14 to 40760 in 2014-2015.
- At the end of the financial year 2014-2015, the total number of colleges recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, was 9940. The maximum number of colleges recognized so far under Section 2(f) is in the State of Uttar Pradesh (2000), followed by Maharashtra (1266), Karnataka (848), Gujarat (521), etc.
- During the academic session 2014-2015, the total enrolment in all courses and levels in regular stream was 265.85 lakhs including 124.76 lakhs women students, constituting 46.93%. The maximum number of students had been enrolled in the state of Uttar Pradesh (43.97 lakhs), followed by Maharashtra (28.60 lakhs), Tamil Nadu (24.01 lakhs), Rajasthan (16.24 lakhs), etc.
- The student enrolment in terms of percentages at various levels had been observed as UG (88.26%), PG (11.09%), Research (0.67%), Diploma/Certificate (1.57%) and Integrated (0.41%).
- About 88.37% of all the under-graduate students and 71.09% of all post-graduate students were in the affiliated colleges while the remaining were in university departments and their constituent colleges.
- Out of the total enrolment of students (265.85 lakhs), 37.41% students were in the faculty of Arts, followed by Science 17.59% and Commerce/Management 16.39%, thus constituting 71% enrolment in just three faculties, while the remaining 29.00% enrolment were in professional faculties. This uneven distribution is an indicator demanding a policy change.
- The strength of the teaching faculty in universities and colleges has gone up to 12.61 lakhs as compared to 10.49 lakhs teachers in the previous year. Out of 12.61 lakh teachers, 84.66% teachers were in colleges and the remaining 15.34% in universities.
- The number of research degree Ph.D. awarded during 2013-14 was 22849. Out of this, the Faculty of Arts had the highest number with 7480 Ph.D. Degrees, followed by the Faculty of Science with 7018 Ph.D. Degrees. These two faculties together accounted for 63.45% of the total number.
- The number of women students enrolled per hundred men students enrolled at all levels was 88 in the reporting year 2014-2015.
- In terms of percentages, the women enrolment has been the highest in Lakshdweep (71.17%), followed by Goa (60.06%). In absolute numbers, UP had been on the top with 21.73 lakhs women enrolment, followed by Maharashtra (13.01 lakhs), Tamil Nadu (12.32 lakhs), etc.
- The women enrolment had been the highest in the faculty of Arts (41.70%), followed by Science (18.60%) and Commerce (15.73%), constituting 76.03% in the three faculties, while the remaining 23.97% in all the professional faculties. The maximum percentage of women enrolment in professional faculties had been in the faculty of Engineering/Technology (9.88%).
- Growth of higher education since 1950-51 in terms of degree awarding universities/institutions registered 24.7 fold increase, number of colleges had 58 fold increase, student enrolment had 67 fold increase and teacher strength had 52 fold increase as observed in 2014-15.

3. Development (Plan) and Maintenance (Non-Plan) Assistance to Universities

General Development Grants are being provided to the Central, State and Deemed Universities for their overall
development covering aspects like enhancing access, ensuring equity, imparting relevant education, improving
quality, making the administration effective, enhancing facilities for students, augmenting research facilities
and other plans of universities. Maintenance Grants are also being provided to a limited number of universities

to meet their recurring expenditure on salaries of both teaching and non-teaching employees, maintenance of labs, libraries, buildings and also for obligatory payments such as taxes, telephone & electricity bills, postage, etc. The Central and a few Deemed Universities are being paid both Plan and Non-plan grants whereas the State Universities are being paid only Plan grant.

- During 2014-15, the number of Central Universities including South Asian University was 46. Out of these, six universities namely, (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai (iv) South Asian University, New Delhi (v) Nalanda University, Bihar and (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Uttar Pradesh are not funded by the UGC. During 2014-15, only 39 Central Universities had been assisted by providing Plan and Non-plan grants.
- General Development Grant amounting to ₹1835.67 crore was provided to 39 Central Universities during 2014-15. Maintenance grant amounting to ₹3527.45 crores had been paid to 24 central universities and one medical college during the reporting year.
- An amount of ₹1019.39 Lakhs was released to Aligarh Muslim University, Jamia Millia Islamia, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Dr. B R Ambedkar University, Jamia Hamdard (Deemed University) for setting up Residential Coaching Academies for Minorities/SCs/STs and Women.
- An amount of ₹20.00 lakh was released to Maulana Azad National Urdu University for Maulana Abdul Kalam Azad Chair and ₹25.00 Lakhs released to Baba Sahab Bhim Rao Ambedkar University for establishment of Ambedkar Chair.
- An amount of ₹1.80 lakh was released to Central University of Punjab under the scheme of Special Honorarium to the Teachers who are fellows of at least two of the four specified Academies during the XI Plan.
- A Grant of ₹4060.94 lakhs was released to Central Universities for implementation of OBC reservation policy.
- A One-time additional grant of ₹21788.50 lakh was provided to 7 Central Universities for Infrastructure Development.
- An amount of ₹25.00 crore was released for implementation of the recommendations of the Sachar Committee.
- The Union HRD Minister Smt. Simrti Z. Irani graced the two-day retreat of Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities held at Chandigarh on 12-13 September, 2014. Highlight of the retreat are:
 - A Group was constituted for developing a framework for the National Ranking System.
 - The Council of Industry-Higher Education Collaboration (CIHEC) is being operationalized.
 - 100 Centres of skilling excellence called Knowledge Acquisition and Upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood (KAUSHAL) Centres will be established.
 - A Working Group was constituted to frame the Guidelines on the following:
 - Common admissions, common curricula, students' mobility, Faculty Mobility, National System of Credit Transfer.
 - Global initiative for Academic Network (GIAN)
 - Digital India initiative of SWAYM (Study Web of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) through the MOOC's platform
 - National Eligibility has been launched to ensure Wi-Fi enabled Higher Education.
 - Campus connect program.
- A two day conference of Vice-Chancellors (VCs) of Central Universities (CUs) was held at Rashtrapati Bhawan on 4-5 February, 2015. The VCs adopted a detailed set of recommendations on five agenda items of the conference, namely (1) Steps to create an eco-system for research and innovation (2) Capacity development of faculty, alumni participation and use of technology (3) deepening engagement of Central Universities with Community (4) Creating international and national networks for quality education and (5) adoption of Choice Based Credit System.

- The UGC has sanctioned for expansion and strengthening of teacher education in 19 Central Universities for which approval was given for various teaching and non-teaching posts and during XII Plan an amount of ₹110.00 crore was also sanctioned and released to these Central Universities, out of which an amount of ₹35.00 crore was released during 2013-2014. At present 36 Central Universities have schools/departments of education offering various pre services and other teacher education programmes.
- The UGC has conveyed its approval for establishment of Centres for Endangered Languages to the following 9 Central Universities: Tezpur University, Rajiv Gandhi University, Sikkim University, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Central University of Jharkhand, Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya, Central University of Karnataka, Central University of Kerala and Visva Bharati.
- The UGC will provide financial assistance of ₹5.00 lakh to each University for establishment and strengthening of Internal Quality Assurance Cells (IQACs) in them.
- The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres or any other units therein, by whatever name called, shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its schemes without their having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December,2015.
- Out of 39 Central Universities, 13 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation. 9 Central Universities have obtained the accreditation earlier, but accreditation period is over and applied for reaccreditation. 11 Central Universities have applied first time for accreditation, 6 Central Universities have yet to apply for accreditation.
- The UGC has framed guidelines for Establishment of Centres of Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Universities during the XII Plan Period.
- The UGC has formulated a scheme of granting special Heritage Status to Universities which have completed 100 years of their existence and are entitled for assistance with a one time lampsum grant of ₹10.00 crore during the XII Plan.
- As on 31st March, 2015, there were 534 State and State Private Universities set up under laws enacted by the legislatures of various states. But the UGC has made budgetary allocation of ₹2069.95 Crores for Plan (Development) Grants to only 156 State Universities, excluding agricultural and medical universities. During the XII Plan, eligible 156 State Universities had been provided Development Grant Assistance of ₹827.98 crores.
- During the XIIth Plan 137 State Universities are assisted with ₹2195.67 lakhs under coaching scheme for SCs/STs/OBCs (Non Creamy Layer)/Minorities.
- During the XIIth Plan 116 State Universities are assisted with ₹60.75 lakhs under the scheme of Equal Opportunity Cell.
- The UGC has introduced a new scheme "Swachh Bharat Swasth Bharat" during 2014-15. The Universities shall utilise the General Development grant for this purpose which has been already allocated to the State Universities.
- During the financial year 2014-15 an amount of ₹40,03,93,965/- has been sanctioned to State Universities under General Development Assistance Scheme.
- An amount of ₹33,59,95,600/- was sanctioned to University of Kashmir, Srinagar, towards Establishment of various campuses of the University .
- An amount of ₹20,00,00,000/- was sanctioned to Calcutta University towards special grant on the occasion of 150 years of its establishment for the purpose of Research in Nano-Science & Nano-Technology.
- An amount of ₹15,71,07,242/- was sanctioned to Anna University towards Non-plan Maintenance grant under Specific Programme for approved P.G. Courses.
- An amount of ₹2,00,00,000/- was sanctioned to Mumbai University, Mumbai towards 102nd Indian Science Congress.

- An amount of ₹1,31,83,97,040/- was sanctioned to Panjab University, Chandigarh, towards Non-Plan grant.
- As on 31.03. 2015, there had been 128 Deemed Universities. Out of these 128, the UGC has been providing Plan grants to 18 Deemed Universities and both Development & Maintenance grants to 10 Deemed universities.
- The UGC has released an amount of ₹ 5445.04 lakh to Deemed to be Universities during the year 2014-15 under the General Development Assistance Scheme.
- An amount of ₹24792.94 lakh has been released during the year 2014-15 under the Non-Plan Grant (Maintenance Grant) to 10 Deemed Universities.

4. Development (Plan) and Maintenance (Non-Plan) Assistance to Colleges

- The focus of Development Assistance to colleges has been on supporting the teaching learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure. Emphasis has been on the expansion and consolidation of facilities in the existing institutions, improvement of standards through modernization, rationalization and diversification of UG courses especially to relate them to career opportunities. Setting up new colleges in educationally backward areas where adequate facilities do not exist is also one of the priorities of the Commission.
- As on 31st March, 2015, there were 40760 colleges in the country. Out of these, only 9940 colleges are recognized up to 31-03-2015 under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, constituting 24% of the total number of colleges. Out of 9940 only 8201 are eligible to receive grants from the UGC under Section 12B of the UGC Act. All the schemes/programmes relating to the college sector are being implemented through the UGC Regional Offices located at Hyderabad, Pune, Bhopal, Kolkata, Guwahati, Delhi and Bangalore.
- During 2014-15, as many as 5371 eligible colleges were assisted to the extent of ₹609.90 crores under the College General Development scheme of XII Plan.
- During the year 2014-15, the UGC Regional Offices released a grant of ₹104.22 crore to 430 beneficiaries (colleges) under the scheme of construction of Women's Hostesl.
- During the year 2014-15, the Regional offices released agrant of ₹33.02 crore under the scheme of Autonomous Colleges to 171 beneficiaries (colleges).
- During the year 2014-15, the Regional Offices released a grant of ₹44.29 crore in Sciences and ₹31 crore in Humanities under the Scheme of Minor Research Project for Teachers to 2375 Teachers in Sciences & 2785 Teachers in Humanities.
- During the year 2014-15, the Regional Offices had approved as many as 2455 proposals for organizing Seminars/ Symposia/Workshops, etc., and had released ₹21.58 crores to the eligible colleges.
- During the year 2014-15, the Regional offices released a grant of ₹34.31 crore to 1473 beneficiaries (Teachers) under the scheme of Faculty Development Programme.
- The UGC has taken a policy decision to direct all colleges to establish Internal Quality Assurance Cell for which it has decided to provide ₹3.00 lakh as seed money to each college to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of IQAC. During the year 2014-15, the Regional Offices released a grant of ₹8.81 crore to 321 beneficiaries (Colleges) under this Scheme.
- During the year 2014-15, the Regional Offices released a grant of ₹65.49 crore to 352 beneficiaries (Colleges) under the scheme of Sports Infrastructure & Equipment in colleges.
- During the year 2014-15, Regional Offices released a Grant of ₹126.56 Crores under Committed Liabilities (old UGC Schemes) to 1404 beneficiaries Colleges
- During the year 2014-15, UGC released a total grant of ₹1458.83 crores to the 53 colleges of Delhi University and an amount of ₹31.49 crores to the 4 constituent colleges of Banaras Hindu University as maintenance grant
- Financial assistance of ₹170.95 Lakh was provided to 64 colleges of Delhi University towards General Development, Women's Hostels, Sports Infrastructure, construction of Building and Seminar/Conference/Workshop.

Executive Summary

5. Quality and Excellence

- In order to achieve excellence in teaching and research, the UGC has been assisting 15 identified universities for granting the status of 'University with Potential for Excellence' (UPE). During 2014-15, no grant was released.
- During IX Plan, the Commission approved 12 Centres with Potential for Excellence in Particular Area (CPEPA) in various universities in 2002 with an objective to encourage and facilitate the chosen departments to work together and jointly launch new innovative academic research programmes. These Centres started functioning during the X Plan only. During XI Plan 12 Centres were also selected under CPEPA Scheme. Out of 24 Centres, 21 Centres were functioning during 2014-2015 under the Scheme. All the Centres had been reviewed and recommended for continuation.
- To achieve excellence mainly in teaching and to initiate a research culture in colleges, the UGC has initiated a Scheme "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE). Presently 172 colleges are enjoying the CPE status and 14 colleges are enjoying the "College of Excellence" (CE) status. During 2014-15, an amount of ₹51,93,50,000/- was released to colleges under this Scheme.
- The Commission during the year 2001 introduced a New Scheme "Establishment of New Centres/Institutes of Excellence" in studies and research on various inter-disciplinary areas. At present only one centre on National Studies in Sri Guru Granth Sahib at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, is running. An amount of ₹4.00 crore was released to the Centre during 2013-14. During XII Plan period the Scheme has been discontinued.
- The university departments of Science including Bio-Science, Engineering and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences are being supported financially under the Scheme of Special Assistance Programme (SAP) for achieving excellence in research and for improving the quality of post-graduate teaching programme. During 2014-15, the number of SAP supported departments stood at 863 as compared to 919 in the previous year. During 2014-15, the departments at various levels were financially assisted to the extent of ₹ 31.26 Crores.
- To provide academic freedom for potential colleges which are recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, the UGC has been conferring autonomous status on them. Up to 31.03.2015, autonomous status had been given to 487 colleges spread over 92 universities of 24 states. During the reporting year, the UGC Regional Offices released grants to the extent of ₹ 33.02 crores to 171 Autonomous Colleges.
- A comprehensive programme for professional development of teachers through Human Resource Development Centres (HRDC) & Regional Centre of Capacity Building (RCCB), (Academic Staff Colleges ASC) had been carried out in different disciplines. During the year 2014-15 a grant of ₹ 46.87 crores had also been released to these Centres functioning in various universities.
- Towards the promotion of Hindi Language, the Rajbhasha Cell of the UGC had organized Essay, Noting & Drafting and Hindi Typing competitions for its employees, conducted workshops/Hindi Pakhwara and celebrated Hindi Divas during the reporting year. During the year 2014-15, the Commission sanctioned grants to 26 Central/State/Deemed Universities for establishment/upgradation of Departments of Hindi.
- Bilateral Exchange programmes connected with Higher Education field have been in operation with 33 countries and 09 other academic collaboration programmes with different countries. An expenditure of ₹ 46.19 crore was incurred for various programmes during the year.
- The UGC offered Raman Fellowships for Post-Doctoral Research in USA with the aim to provide excellent opportunity to young Indian researchers and teachers. During the year 2014-15, 144 candidates were awarded these fellowships.
- The Association of Commonwealth Universities, United Kingdom, offered 10 Commonwealth Medical Fellowship awards to enable promising faculty members in Universities and medical colleges in India to do research work.
- The UGC invited applications from Indian students to pursue Graduate, Post-Graduate & Doctoral Studies in Hungary. Selection will be done by the Hungarian Scholarship Board.
- For Exchange of Scientists Programme with Germany, four candidates were selected during 2014.

- Under Project based Personal Exchange Programme (PPP) workedout by the UGC and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), three candidates were selected during 2014.
- The UGC recommended two candidates for South Asian Institute, Heidelberg Fellowship award during 2014.
- During 2014, one Indian scholar was provided financial assistance under the scheme of Travel Grant to teachers to visit foreign countries for collection of material for research.
- Under the UK India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) Thematic Partnership, 10 joint research proposals received from Universities were approved during the year 2014-15.
- During 2014-15, four Joint Research proposals have been approved under the Indo US 21st Century knowledge initiative for strengthening Educational partnership between India and the United States of America.
- Under Indo-New Zealand Joint Research Projects, 7 Projects were approved during the year 2014.
- Under Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme, the UGC and Israel Science Foundation (ISF) invited proposals for Joint –Research Project and approved 21 projects in the year 2014.
- The Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing higher education links between India and Norway. A MoU on cooperation in higher education and on the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU) was signed on February 14, 2014. Under the INCP 13 projects were selected in the year 2014.
- Australia-India-Educational Council (AIEC) awarded one project on student mobility to Jammia Millia Islamia University, New Delhi.
- During the year 2014, 55 beneficiaries got the Joint Research Projects (consolidated).
- The UGC conducts a National Test (NET) twice a year for eligibility for Assistant Professorship and Junior Research Fellowship to ensure minimum standards for entrants in teaching and research. UGC NET held in December, 2014, was outsourced to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE). The NET examination is being conducted in 79 subjects at 89 Centres spread across the country. On 29th June, 2014 and 28th Dec., 2014 UGC NET, 5.39 lakh and 6.20 lakh candidates appeared for eligibility for Assistant Professor and out of these candidates 30,229 (5.61%) and 35,731 (5.76%) qualified respectively. 3.71 lakh and 4.23 lakh candidates appeared for Junior Research Fellowship and out of these candidates 4795 (1.29%) and 3702 (0.88%) qualified respectively. The CSIR, on behalf of the UGC, has been conducting NET in five Science subjects. In June 2014 and December 2014 Joint CSIR–UGC NET, 1200 and 781 candidates qualified for the UGC-JRF and 2793 and 2097 candidates qualified for lectureship only. An expenditure of ₹ 16.25crores was incurred on conducting the UGC NET and on all ancillary activities of the NET Bureau.
- The Commission has also granted accreditation to states/group of states for conducting State Eligibility Test (SET). The candidates who have cleared the State Eligibility Test (SET) for lectureship prior to 1st June, 2002, are exempted from appearing in the NET Examination. For SET examinations scheduled in or after June, 2002, the qualified candidates are eligible to apply for the post of lecturer/Assistant Professor only in the Universities/ Colleges situated in the State from where they have cleared their SET Examination.
- In the year 2014-15, the States of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh (jointly), Gujarat, Karnataka, North Eastern States, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and West Bengal had conducted SET examinations successfully. The expenditure for conducting SET is borne by the respective states.
- Under Travel Grant Scheme, 744 college teachers/librarians and 8 Vice-Chancellors had availed this facility for presenting their research papers in International Conferences during the reporting year. The financial assistance is paid for their foreign travel, registration fee, residence allowance, etc. The permanent teachers/ librarians once in three years and Vice Chancellors, Commission Members and UGC Officers once in two years can avail this facility. An amount of ₹ 9.00 crores had been paid to the beneficiaries during the reporting year.
- Seven Inter-University Centres (IUCs) set up as autonomous centres under Section 12(ccc) of the UGC Act are functioning in Indian Universities System to provide common facilities, services, and programmes to universities and research institutions, etc. by offering expertise in each field and providing access to the state-

- of-the–art equipment and excellent library facilities. During the reporting year, the UGC had paid an amount of ₹63.84 crores under Plan and ₹89.48 crores under Non-Plan to the six Inter-University Centres.
- The UGC has established 4 National Facility Centres in selected Universities and assisted them regularly. During the XII Plan the UGC released a grant of ₹3.15 crore to these Centres.

6. Promotion of Research

- The main objective of the scheme of "Research Projects for Teachers" is to promote excellence in research in higher education by supporting research programmes of University/College teachers in various disciplines. The emphasis is on such areas that cut across disciplines and subjects such as Health, Gerontology, Environment, Nano-technology, Biotechnology, Stress Management, WTO and its impact on economy, etc. and other areas as would be identified by subject experts. The maximum ceilings for Major Research Projects in Science and Humanities including Engg./Tech./Medical/Pharmacy/Agriculture & Social Sciences including languages, Arts and Law etc are ₹20.00 lakhs and ₹15.00 lakhs respectively. Even retired teachers upto the age of 70 may undertake research projects. During the year 2014-15, 603 Major Research Projects in Science & Engineering including Pharmacy & Medical, 414 Major Research Projects in Humanities, Social Science & Languages have been recommended. A grant of ₹31.31 crore and ₹16.39 crores respectivelywas released.
- The scheme of Research Awards is for permanent teachers of eligible Universities and Institutions to do fulltime independent research for two years in their respective area of specialization without undertaking any research guidance. Teachers who are doctorates and are under 45 years of age are considered for the award. The selection of awardees is made for 100 slots in alternative years for all disciplines. An expenditure of ₹15.48 crores had been incurred towards payment to the awardees during 2014-15.
- To attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin, who may be working abroad, in order to promote high quality research, the scheme of Research Scientists was initiated and implemented in 1983. At present, 67 Research Scientists are working in various institutions. During 2014-2015, an expenditure of ₹10.10 crores had been incurred towards the salary and contingencies of these Research Scientists.
- The objective of Post Doctoral Fellowship for SC/ST scheme is to provide fellowships to SC/ST candidates for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. The SC/ST candidates who have obtained a doctoral degree, have published research work to their credit and have already shown evidence of independent research work are eligible. The fellowship is for five years. The revised rate of fellowship amount is ₹38,800/- p.m. for first 2 years and ₹46,500 p.m. third year onwards with contingency amount of ₹50,000/- p.a. An expenditure of ₹11.63 crores had been incurred towards payment to the selected 100 SC/ST Post-doctoral fellows against 100 slots during the reporting year.
- For the unemployed women, holding Ph.D. degrees and intending to pursue post-doctoral research on full-time basis, the UGC has been providing 100 fellowships per annum with the fellowship amount of ₹38,800/- p.m. for fresh candidates, and ₹46,500/- p.m. after 2 years and contingency amount of ₹50,000/- p.a. for five years. During the reporting year, an expenditure of ₹20.67. crores had been incurred towards payment to the women fellows.
- A new Scheme viz. Dr.S. Radha Krishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship for Women in Humanities & Social Sciences including languages provides an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Indian Universities & Colleges. The total number of slots available under the Scheme are 100 per year. The fellowship amount is ₹38,800/- p.m. for first 2 years, ₹46,500/- after 2nd year and with contingency amount of ₹50,000/- p.a. 180 candidates have been selected during 2014-15. An amount of ₹2.17 crore had been disbursed.
- A new scheme of Post-Doctoral Fellowship named after Dr. D.S.Kothari has been implemented for the Science Stream. Till date 1588 candidates have been awarded and 875 PDFs are in position. During 2014-15, an amount of ₹26.93 crores had been released to the fellows working in various institutions.
- With a view to providing opportunity for continuance of research contributions in Basic Science Research by talented Science and Technology teachers who are nearing superannuation in state universities, the UGC started a new scheme called UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship. Teachers who are at the level of Professors/Associate

- Professors in Science & Technology in departments of universities are eligible. The fellowship carries an amount of ₹46,500/- p.m. which is exclusive of pension and/or other retirement benefits. During 2014-15, an amount of ₹3.74 crores was released to 59 BSR Faculty Fellows:
- The Emeritus Fellowship Scheme is for providing an opportunity to superannuated teachers upto the age of 70 years, of all recognized Universities to pursue active research in their respective field of specialization. The number of slots available under the scheme is 100 for Science streams and 100 for Humanities & Social Sciences every alternative year at any given time basis. The honorarium for Fellow is ₹31,000/- p.m. for two years with contingency amount of ₹50,000/- p.a. During 2014-15, an expenditure of ₹4.67 crores had been incurred towards payment to the Emeritus Fellows.
- Under the scheme of Junior Research Fellowships (Indian Nationals) Fellowships have been provided to the candidates who qualify UGC NET conducted by either UGC or CSIR. The JRF carries the fellowship amount of ₹25,000/- p.m. for first two years and ₹28,000/- p.m. for the remaining period with annual contingency amounts.
- On the basis of evaluation of proposals by the Expert Committee, UGC select 20 Foreign Nationals for Junior Research Fellowship such as Students & Teachers from Developing Countries of Asia / Africa & Latin America who wants to pursue M.Phil/ Ph.D in Indian Universities . Fellowship will be given for a period of 4 years.
- In the year under Report an expenditure of ₹433.00 crores was incurred under the JRF/RA for Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences.
- To minimize the social disparities in Higher Education, the UGC provides 2667 Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowships to SC/ST candidates every year (2000 for SC and 667 for ST) to undertake advanced studies and Research leading to M.Phil/Ph.D. degrees. The pattern of fellowship is the same as for JRF. During 2014-2015, an expenditure of ₹149.58 crores for SC fellows and ₹46.61 crores for ST Fellows had been incurred under the scheme.
- The objective of Maulana Azad National Fellowship is to provide integrated 5 year fellowships in the form of financial assistance to students from minority communities as notified by the Central Government, to pursue higher studies such as M.Phil and Ph.D. The number of slots available to students is 756 every year. The rate of fellowship will be on a par with the other UGC fellowships. During 2014-15, 756 candidates were selected from different states and an expenditure of ₹65.21 crores had been incurred.
- The UGC has been entrusted with the implementation of the Scheme of Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship for students with Disabilities by Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment since 2012 to provide opportunities to students with disabilities for pursuing higher education leading to degrees such as M.Phil and Ph.D. The Fellowship amount is on a par with other JRF Schemes. During the year 2014-15, 300 slots were allotted. Payment to the scholars is made by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Disability Affairs, Government of India, New Delhi.
- The UGC has been entrusted with the implementation of the scheme of National Fellowship for students of Other Backward Classes (OBC) since 2014. There are 300 slots for award of Fellowships every year for all subjects. The Fellowship amount is on a par with other UGC Fellowships. The Scheme is funded by Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi.
- Keeping Swami Vivekananda's ideas on women, and to achieve and promote girls' education, the UGC has introduced Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship for research in Social Sciences during 2014-15. The Fellowship amount is ₹ 12,400 p.m. for first two years and ₹15,500/- p.m. for next two years. 65 candidates have been selected during 2014-15. An amount of ₹1.50 crore has been released to Canara Bank for making payment in favour of selected candidates ₹4.46 lakh has been disbursed.
- The "Research Fellowships in Sciences for Meritorious Students" scheme has been implemented with an aim to provide opportunities to meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in Sciences. The candidates who are registered for Ph.D. in Science subjects in Universities with Potential for Excellence/Centres with Potential for Excellence/Centres of Advanced Studies and Departments

of Special Assistance identified by the UGC are eligible. The tenure of the Fellowship is initially for two years and it can be extended to three more years based on the evaluation of work done by the Fellow. The financial assistance initially is to the extent of ₹21,700/- p.m. as Fellowship amount and ₹12,000/-p.a. as contingency for the first two years. In case of the extension it shall be ₹24,800/- p.m. for the next three years and contingency amount of ₹25,000/- per annum. Up to the end of 2014-15, 9300 Research Fellowships had been allocated to SAP/Non-SAP Departments and 8145 JRFs are in position. During 2014-15, a total grant of ₹75.65 crores had been released.

- A new scheme viz. Post-graduate Scholarships for SC/ST Students in Professional Courses has been implemented keeping in view the social background of the candidates from deprived sections of the society and to provide them an opportunity to undertake post-graduate level studies. The number of slots is 1000 per year.
- The purpose of the scheme of PG studies named "Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child" is to promote girls' education by providing support through scholarships to such girls who happen to be the only child in their families and also providing an incentive for the parents to observe small family norms. Girls who have taken admission in Master's degree programme in any recognized university or a PG College are eligible. The duration of scholarship is for a period of two years with the scholarship amount of ₹ 3,100/- p.m. (for 10 months a year). All eligible students will get the scholarship. As many as 3192 girls had been selected for the academic session 2014-16 and an expenditure of ₹8.46 crores had been incurred towards payment to scholarship holders during 2014-15.
- To help the graduate students pursue PG studies in higher educational institutions, the UGC has been providing PG Scholarships for GATE qualified students of M.E./M.Tech./M.Pharm. programmmes with Scholarship amount of ₹12,000/- p.m. (60% above in all Semesters) and a contingency grant of ₹5,000/- p.a. An expenditure of ₹17.42 crore incurred during the year 2014-15.
- With an objective to promote and nurture talented students to pursue PG education, the scheme of PG Merit Scholarship for university Rank Holders at undergraduate level is implemented from 2005-06 onwards. The awardees under the scheme can pursue their PG subjects (professional courses are not covered) in any area of specialization as also in any institution of higher learning in the country. The first and second rank holders in general courses and only first rank holders in Honours Courses are eligible for the scholarship. The duration of scholarship is two years with scholarship amount of ₹3100/- p.m. (for 10 months a year). 976 candidates had been selected and an expenditure of ₹2.87 crores had been incurred under the scheme during 2014-15.
- To promote Higher Education in North Eastern Region (NER) the UGC has decided to launch "Ishan Uday" Special Scholarship Scheme for North Eastern Region from academic session 2014-15. The rate of scholarship is ₹5,400/- p.m. for General Degree Courses & ₹7,800/- for Technical and Professional Degree courses with effect from 01.12.2014. 10,000 candidates are selected under the Scheme. The process of payment is made directly by Canara Bank as per agreement (MoU) made between UGC & Canara Bank
- During the XII Plan the UGC has introduced a Scheme to provide financial assistance to Medal Winners in National Games or participants in recognized international sporting events and elite sportspersons who are studying in Universities/Colleges for full-time regular courses. An amount of ₹40.00 lakh has been reimbursed during 2014-15 to the 70 beneficiaries under the Scheme.
- Based on the recommendations of the Empowered Committee for Basic Scientific Research in Indian Universities the following Schemes are being implemented by the UGC:
- To strengthen high quality research in Science-related disciplines at internationally competitive levels and to promote innovative teaching in universities through induction of fresh talent in an academic faculty, a Faculty Recharage Programme is initiated. Under it, 200 positions are to be induced initially in the ratio 80:80:40 (Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors). It is open to fresh as well as in-service teachers. Initially, the tenure is for a period of five years and it can go upto the age of superannuation, subject to review every five years. For this purpose, a Cell had been established in Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, and a National Coordinator had been appointed to initiate the process of selection of teachers. At present 163 faculties have been selected out of which 77 are in position. During 2014-15, ₹6.92 crores were released in respect of salaries and start up grant to 72 selectees from various Universities/Colleges.

- As many as 10 departments were approved by the Empowered Committee for the establishment of Network Research Centres under the BSR programme, ₹7.61 crore had been released For two departments during 2014-15.
- Under the scheme Start-up Grant for newly recruited faculty, all teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor with Ph.D degree and a minimum of two research publications in approved/cited journals are eligible to receive financial support. 425 newly appointed faculty members have benefitted. An amount of ₹25.48 crores was released during the year 2014-15 under the Scheme.
- UGC provides a 'One-Time Grant to Teachers' under BSR Programme to pursue their research in their specialized areas. A teacher who has at least two years of service before the date of superannuation, a minimum of 15 Ph.D.s produced during the service period and at least five Ph.Ds during the last five years, and who has completed at least five sponsored research projects funded by National/International funding agencies, is eligible for support under the Scheme. A teacher is provided ₹7.00 lakhs for his/her research work. During 2014-15, an amount of ₹2.18 crores had been released to 33 teachers who are pursuing their research in various universities/institutions.
- During 2014-15, a total grant of ₹9.30 crores had been provided to eligible colleges/university departments for strengthening infrastructure required for the component of research at PG level in Sciences.

7. Gender and Social Equity

- The objective of the scheme of Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges and Capacity Building & Women Managers in Higher Education is to strengthen and sustain the Women Studies Centres in universities by establishing them as statutory departments in the university system, as also to facilitate their own capacity to network with other constituents such that they are mutually reinforcing as well as synergizing one another and also to increase the participation of Women in Higher Education Management for better gender balance. The thrust is to develop field projects for action, research, evaluation and enhancement of knowledge and partnership across boundaries of caste/class/religion, community and occupation and to involve many more people and many more organizations in the network as well as to ensure that the focus and the quality of this newly emerging discipline is maintained. Up to 31.03.2015, as many as 153 Women Study Centres had been established and functioning in the university system. 205 Sensitization/Awareness/Motivation (SAM), 22 training of Trainers (ToT), 13 Management Skill Enhancement Module (MSEM) & 5 Refresher workshops have been organized by various Universities and Centres. Grant of ₹ 9.54 crores has been released during the year 2014-15.
- To support research on the issue of Social Exclusion and Inclusion, which has theoretical as well as policy importance, the UGC has established teaching-cum-research centres in Universities called Centres for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusion Policy. As on 31.03.2015, as many as 35 Centres are functioning in 35 universities. UGC released a grant of ₹777.00 lakh under the Scheme during 2014-15.
- The Commission has been providing financial assistance to universities for the establishment of SC/ST Cells to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy for SC/ST in admissions, recruitment of both teaching & non-teaching staff, etc. in universities. Revised Guidelines of the Scheme for XII Plan are under the consideration of the Commission.
- The SC/ST Cell of the UGC monitors the effective implementation of the Reservation Policy for SC, ST and PWD candidates in admissions, and teaching and non-teaching posts in universities and colleges. A Standing Committee on SC/ST has been constituted to oversee the effective implementation of the reservation policy in universities and colleges.
- The UGC provides financial assistance for conducting special classes outside the regular time table to enable students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/Minority Communities who need remedial/NET-SET Examination/Entry into Service Coaching to come to the required level. A grant of ₹2195.67 lakh was released to 137 State Universities during XII Plan period under Coaching Scheme for SCs/STs/OBC (Non-Creamy Layer)/Minorities . The UGC constituted an expert committee to study the impact of such coaching schemes

- To make Colleges and Universities more responsive to the needs and constraints of the disadvantaged social groups, the UGC had planned to establish Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) in them. A grant of ₹60.75 lakh was released to 116 Universities during XII Plan.
- With an aim of not ignoring persons with disabilities in the Higher Education System and with an objective to develop courses for special teachers and counselors and also to provide facilities in various forms for the differently abled persons, the UGC had been implementing two schemes viz. Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE) and Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN). These schemes are now looked after by a separate cell in the UGC and grants are being released by the Cell.

8. Relevant and Value Based Education

- The objective of the programme of Career Orientation to Education is to introduce career and market oriented, skill enhancing add-on courses that have utility for job, self-employment and empowerment of the students. Under this programme, the UGC has been assisting eligible institutions to the tune of ₹ 7.00 lakhs per course for Humanities and Commerce and ₹ 10.00 lakhs per course for Science Streams as one-time seed money for five years towards purchase of books and journals, lab and other equipment, remuneration to guest faculty, etc. The Colleges/ Universities are required to opt for need based three courses only. 522 Colleges/Universities were approved for financial assistance for approved courses in the month of February,2013, 353 Colleges/ Universities have been provided funds during 2014-15. A total grant ₹ 28.32 crore was released during 2014-15.
- To promote holistic understanding of the areas outside India with its cultural, social, economic and strategic specificities and to provide critical input to the policy makers particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests, the UGC has been identifying universities from time to time for establishing Area Study Centres. As on 31.03.2015, 8 Centres were working (for the period 01.04.2011 to 31.04.2016) and 40 centres were working (for the period 01.04.2014 to 31.03.2019) under the Area Studies Programme.
- To acquaint teachers and students with the thoughts and ideas of great social thinkers of India, there are 404 Study Centres established in various Universities/Colleges. A total grant of ₹ 6.98 crores were released during 2014-15.
- For introduction of an under-graduate degree, post-graduate degree, diploma and certificate courses as well as for holding seminars, symposia and workshops on Human Rights and Duties Education and for spreading awareness among the teachers, students and public, the UGC has been providing financial assistance to various Universities and Colleges under Human Rights Education Scheme. 244 Universities/Colleges have benefitted during 2014-15 under the scheme. During the XIIth Plan 2012-17 (2014-15) ₹4.43 crore was released.

9. Integration of Information and Communication Technologies

- As part of E-Governance, E-Office has been implemented in the UGC to create paperless environment as regards
 receipt and movement of files, etc. During the year under report, a training programme has been organized for
 UGC officials upto the level of Joint Secretary. NIC is developing web based online applications for the XII
 Plan Schemes of the UGC.
- For developing courseware e-content in post-graduate subjects across all disciplines, the UGC has constituted a Standing Committee to prepare blueprints and to observe the entire operation of the scheme. The task of development of e-content has been entrusted to INFLIBNET. The e-content so developed would be available in open access through a Learning Management System (LMS) set up at INFLIBNET Centre as well as through Sakshat Portal. The total cost incurred in the project during 2014-15 is ₹9.08 crores.
- The UGC has taken mapping of the Universities in reference to (a) Universities connected with Digital Fibre (b) Universities having LAN (c) Universities having Wi-Fi facility. 636 Universities responded and it was found that (i) 89% of universities are connected with Optical Fibre (ii) 92% of universities have LAN and (iii) 85% of universities haveWi-Fi facility.

• The UGC's Information & Statistics Bureau is using the portal (http://aishe.gov.in) developed by NIC for Collection & Compilation of Statistical Data of Students Enrolment, Teaching Staff, etc.

10. New Initiatives

- The UGC has launched the scheme of Community Colleges on Pilot basis during the year 2013-14. The main objective of the scheme is to offer low cost, high quality education locally which encompasses both traditional skill development as well as traditional course work, thereby providing opportunities to the learner to move directly to employment sector or to move to the Higher Education sector. 157 Community Colleges were approved under the scheme during 2014-15 (16 in Universities &141 in colleges). An amount of ₹35.89 crores was released during the year 2014-15.
- The UGC has launched a scheme on skill development based higher education as a part of College/University education leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc) Degree with multiple entry and exit option such as Diploma/Advance Diploma under the NSQF. 127 Universities & Colleges (20 Universities + 107 Colleges) have been approved under the Scheme and grant of ₹80.64 crores was released during the year 2014-15.
- The Ministry of Human Resource Development vide its order dated 29th Dec,2012 issued directives under section 20(1) of the UGC Act, 1956 with regard to regulation, maintenance of standards and according recognition in respect of Distance Education Programmes conducted by institutions of higher education. The UGC has taken several steps on these directions. During the year 2014-15, 157 Universities/Institutions were recognized to offer programmes through Distance Education mode and an amount of ₹1557.50 lakh was released to 7 State Open Universities as Development Grant.
- CBCS is the part of the numerous measures taken by UGC to enhance academic standards and quality in higher education through innovation and improvements in curriculum, teaching-learning process, examination and evaluation system. Under CBCS, universities are requested to shift from numerical marking system, which is followed presently in Universities, to grading system of evaluation.

Chapter 1

Introduction

1.1 Legend

The University Grants Commission (UGC) came into existence on 28th December, 1953 and became a statutory body of Government of India by an Act of Parliament in 1956, for the coordination, determination, and maintenance of standards of university education.

- As per the Section 18 of the UGC Act, the Commission shall prepare once every year an Annual Report giving a true and full account of its activities during the year, and copies thereof shall be forwarded to the Central Government and the Government shall cause the same to be laid before both Houses of Parliament.
- The Commission consists of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and ten members (Secretary-Education, Secretary-Expenditure, 8 other members) appointed/nominated by the Government of India. The Secretary, UGC, headed the Commission's Secretariat with 557 working staff including 89 Group 'A' and 251 Group 'B' officers and 206 Group 'C' officials. Out of working staff strength, 28.01 % are women, 18.67 % Scheduled Caste, 4.67 % Scheduled Tribe employees.
- The UGC has decentralized its functioning by opening **seven** Regional Offices in the country since 1994, in a phased manner, for easy access and speedy release of grants and implementation of various schemes/programmes relating to college sector.
- The main objective of the Twelfth Plan (2012-2017) of UGC is to expand enrolment in higher education with quality, inclusiveness and relevance with academic reforms. The target of 30% Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) is set for XII Plan and it is being achieved by adopting the dual strategy of increasing the number of educational institutions and enhancing the intake capacity of the existing institutions.

1.1(a) Role and Organization of UGC

The University Grants Commission which came into existence on 28th December, 1953 became a statutory body of Government of India by an Act of Parliament in 1956. Section 12 of the UGC Act provides that the Commission shall, in consultation with the universities concerned, take all such steps as it may think fit for the promotion and coordination of university education and for the determination and maintenance of standards of teaching, examination and research.

The UGC serves as a vital link between the Union and State Governments and the institutions of higher learning. In addition to its role of giving grants to universities and colleges, the University Grants Commission also advises Central and State Governments on the measures necessary for the improvement of university education. It also frames regulations such as those on the minimum standards of instruction and qualifications of teachers.

In order to accomplish the multi-dimensional objectives of higher education and in discharge of its cardinal function of coordinating and maintaining standards of higher education, the UGC has, over the years, evolved and implemented a wide variety of programmes for realization of the goals of higher education.

Organisational Structure

The Commission consists of the Chairman, Vice Chairman and ten other members appointed by the Central Government. The Chairman is selected from amongst persons who are not officers of the Central Government or of any State Government. Of the ten members, two are selected from among the officers of Central Government to represent the Government. Not less than four, selected from amongst persons who, at the time they are selected, shall be teachers in the Universities.

The remaining members are selected from amongst the following persons:

- 1. Who have knowledge of, or experience in agriculture, commerce, forestry or industry;
- 2. Who are members of the engineering, legal, medical or any other learned profession; or
- 3. Who are Vice Chancellors of Universities or who, not being teachers of Universities, are in the opinion of the Central Government, educationists of repute or have obtained high academic distinctions.







1.2 About the Twelfth Plan

Higher education is the chief instrument for ensuring the upward mobility of the people and the advancement of the country. The Indian higher education system is being supported by assistance under each Plan. The University Grants Commission sponsored a number of studies on various dimensions of higher education in the country in order to develop necessary information base as a source material to prepare a report on approach and strategy for the Twelfth Plan. The studies are related to Expansion, Inclusiveness, Quality and Finance. The information generated by these studies has been used for preparation of perspective of the XII Plan and the findings have helped in shaping its goals and objectives.

The main objective of the XII Plan is to expand enrolment in higher education with inclusiveness, quality and relevant education along with necessary academic reforms in the university/college system. Thus, the main focus has been on expansion and access to higher education through increasing institutional capacity and enhancement of intake capacity, promotion of inclusive education through equal access to various groups in higher education, undertaking academic and governance reforms, etc.

A target of 30 % Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) by 2017 from 15 % in 2012 was set for the XII Plan. The fifteen per cent net increase was sought to be achieved through a dual strategy that includes increasing the number of educational institutions and enhancing the intake capacity of the existing institutions.

The main objectives of the XII Plan are as follows:-

- a) To help increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) from the level of about 15 % to 30 % by the end of XII Plan;
- b) Expansion of educational capacity in terms of number of universities, colleges and other institutions to meet the target of 30 % GER;
- c) To increase the enrolment ratio in districts that suffer from less access to higher education;
- d) To increase the enrolment of educationally backward groups and enhance inclusiveness;
- e) To promote quality and excellence;
- f) To promote relevant education;
- g) To promote the use of information and communication technology and focusing on other related issues;
- h) To undertake reforms in admission, examination and evaluation systems in the universities and colleges;
- i) To improve the work efficiency of the UGC through computerization in its internal working and inter-connectivity with educational institutions, including the improvement in human resources in the UGC;
- j) To improve the data base and research capabilities in order to strengthen the education policies and programs on sound basis and to create a proper institutional set up.

The Commission in its meeting held on 10.05.2013 has approved the allocation of ₹19800 crore. The Plan Allocation for UGC has been divided into six broad sectors as given below:

The following schemes have been grouped with other schemes:

- 2. Capacity Building of Women Managers- grouped with Women Study Centres;
- 3. Promotion of Yoga Education- grouped with Promotion of Sports;

- 4. ENCORE- grouped with GDA;
- 5. Instrumentation Maintenance Facilities- grouped with GDA;
- 6. Development of sports infrastructure and equipment in universities and colleges- grouped with Promotion of Sports;
- 7. Appointment/honorarium of Guest/Part-time teachers-grouped with GDA.

The expenditure incurred/to be incurred towards the above seven schemes shall be met from the Head of those schemes with which these have been grouped.

The Commission has also decided to continue or launch the following new schemes during the XII Plan:

- (i) Medal Winners
- (ii) Incentives for Resource Mobilization

1.3 Special Cells Functioning in the UGC

(a) Right to Information Act (RIA) Cell

The University Grants Commission is an autonomous body under MHRD and provides information to the applicants under Right to Information Act, 2005. The RIA cell receives the applications/appeals and forwards them to different Central Public Information Officers (CPIOs)/ Appellate Authorities who have the relevant information.

- There are 24 Appellate Authorities and 39 CPIOs in the office of the UGC, including the main office, branch offices and Regional offices.
- All the Bureau Heads in the UGC are designated as Appellate Authorities under RTI and the Deputy Secretaries/ Under Secretaries/Education Officers in the bureau under them are designated as Central Public Information Officers.
- The RTI applications / appeals from the applicants and notices/ decisions from Central Information Commission, etc. are centrally received in the name of Central Public Information Officer (CPIO) at the main office and forwarded to the CPIOs concerned who have the requisite information.
- A copy of the RTI application/appeal/notice/decision is retained in the RIA cell for record.
- The data of quarterly/ annual report of number of RTI applications/ appeals/fee, etc. is prepared by RIA Cell and uploaded on the CIC portal and on UGC website.
- The RTI applications/appeals received at Regional Offices are being dealt directly by the respective Central Public Information Officers/ Appellate Authorities.
- The record of the RTI fee collected from the applicants is also maintained by the RIA Cell.
- The list of Central Public Information Officers/ Appellate Authorities is placed on the UGC website.

During the year 2014-15, UGC received and disposed of 16,648 RTI applications and 1,199 Appeals. The RTI fee collected was ₹95,850 /-and the additional fee ₹46,259/- during the year 2014-15.

(b) Pay Scale Cell

The Pay Scale Cell, set up in 1984, is entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating the work of Pay Review Committees set up from time to time. It interacts with the National Level Organizations of teachers and also the MHRD in matters relating to Pay Scales, Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) advance increments for M.Phil/Ph.D. degree holders, Refresher Courses/Orientation Courses, Counting of Past Service & other Misc. queries in Universities and Colleges. The Pay Scale Section also deals with policy matters relating to Minimum qualifications, Age of Superannuation & other service conditions of teachers and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges.

Evaluation/Assessment Reports/Papers for promotion from Reader to Professor under Career Advancement Scheme for the period 2014-15.

The UGC has been monitoring the Selection Process for promotion from Reader to the post of Professor under CAS in all recognized Universities. During the reporting year i.e. 2014-15, **no UGC observer** was appointed to oversee the Selection Process for promotion from the post of Reader to the post of Professor under CAS. However, the reports/papers/publications/evaluation – assessment reports in respect of the candidates concerned who were interviewed

by the Selection Committee were sent by the Universities/Colleges to the Commission and the same are assessed by the Bureau. Further, the UGC has framed UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2010 which came into effect from 30.06.2010. There is no provision for nomination of UGC observer as per these Regulations, 2010.

(c) SC/ST/OBC Cell

The SC/ST/OBC Cell of UGC monitors the effective implementation of the Reservation Policy for SC, ST& OBC candidates in admissions, and teaching and non-teaching posts in universities and colleges. The UGC constituteda Standing Committee to oversee the effective implementation of the reservation policy in universities and colleges. The Committee consists of academic experts, former Vice-Chancellors and distinguished persons in the field of higher education. The Standing Committee and Sub-Standing Committee meet from time to time and monitor the status of reservations and the backlog in vacancies in universities and colleges.

As per the directions of the Government of India, the UGC has been striving for the implementation of reservation policy for other backward classes (OBCs) in teaching, non-teaching and in admissions. Instructions have been issued to implement 27% reservation for OBCs in all the grant-in-aid institutions funded by the Central Government, except minority Intuitions under Article 3(1) of the Constitution of India. A Standing Committee has also been constituted by the UGC for the welfare of Other Backward Classes to assess and monitor the implementation of the reservation policy for OBCs in appointments and admissions in universities, colleges and other institutions of higher education.

The cell collects information from Central, State and Deemed universities under section 12B of the UGC Act on backlog vacancies and the action taken by the universities to fill up these posts. The information collected is forwarded to the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

(d) Minorities Cell

The Minorities Cell of the UGC deals with the issues relating to minorities, like giving the status of Deemed Universities to Minorities Institutions, providing affiliation to Minorities Institutions with the Universities and dealing with other minorities – related issues.

The Standing Committee for Welfare of Minorities regularly monitors and reviews the ongoing schemes for welfare of Minorities. The Standing Committee holds its meeting once or twice in a year, as per the direction of the Government of India, and the meeting of the Sub-Committee for the Welfare of Minorities constituted is held from time to time. The Committee recommended the inclusion of Sub-Component to enhance the number of schemes for welfare of Minorities.

(e) Vigilance Cell

The University Grants Commission has set up a Vigilance Cell in accordance with the instructions of the Government of India to keep a close watch on official work so that it does not indulge in acts of corruption. The Cell, generally, is headed by an officer of Joint Secretary rank or above on the recommendation of the Chairman, UGC, which is duly vetted by the Central Vigilance Commission. The Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO) is mainly responsible for the prevention and detection of corruption cases in the UGC, Universities / Colleges and to take legal action wherever necessary. The CVO is to further ensure the following:

- o maintainance of proper surveillance on officers of doubtful integrity;
- o prompt observance of Conduct Rules relating to integrity covering (i) statement of assets and acquisitions (ii) gifts (iii) relatives employed in private firms or doing private business (iv) benami transactions;
- o locating sensitive spots, regular and surprise inspections of such spots and proper scrutiny of personnel who are posted in sensitive posts;
- o introduction of preventive measures for bringing transparency and simplicity in the process of allocation and disbursement of grants to universities and colleges.

The UGC observed the Vigilance awareness week from 27th October, 2014 to 1st November, 2014 by administering the pledge, displaying banners and posters and distributing pamphlets, etc. during the period under report.

During 2014-15, the Vigilance Cell received complaints from CVC (15), MHRD (11), CBI (29) and various Universities / Colleges and other agencies(255). The complaints received against Universities and Colleges have been forwarded to the bureau concerned of the UGC for taking necessary action. The Complaints of sensitive nature had been placed before the Standing Committee on Vigilance (SCV) appointed by Chairman, UGC. The Cell initiates action according to the recommendations of SCV/Vigilance Enquiry Committee.

On the recommendation of SCV, Enquiry Committees were constituted in some cases by the Chairman, UGC to look into the complaints regarding misuse of UGC funds. On the basis of the findings of Enquiry Committee and recommendation of SCV the release of further UGC grant to three colleges were stopped till further orders during the year under report.

As on 31.12.2014 there are 40 complaints pending for disposal. Out of 40 cases 4 cases are against UGC employees and rest of them are against University / Colleges employees.

(f) Legal Cell

The Legal Cell was established in 1989 in the UGC main Office. The Legal Cell deals with Court Cases in Supreme Court of Court of India, various High Courts, District Courts, Tribunals/ Forums / Commissions, etc.


Presently, most of the running cases are regarding pay scales, qualifications, age of superannuation, selection of teaching and non-teaching staff in the Universities and Colleges, admission in Professional Courses, UGC NET examination and Establishment of different Institutions / Fake Institutions, etc. Some cases are regarding Administrative matters of UGC staff also.

A panel of Advocates in different courts including Supreme Court of India has been prepared with the approval of Competent Authority and assigned the task of defending the cases on behalf of UGC.

Detailed below are the year wise number of cases involved and the expenditure incurred on them (2012-13 to 2014-15).

(h) Cell against Malpractices

The Cell against Malpractices, established on 30 May, 1996, deals with matters relating to the existence/ functioning of fake or unrecognized universities/ institutions in the country which are awarding degrees in contravention of the UGC Act, 1956. These are not established institutions under a State Act or a Central Act or a Provincial Act or an Institution specially empowered to confer or grant degrees. Therefore, the fake Universities/ Institutions are not recognized under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956.

- 1. The basic objective of the Cell is to collect information through print media and other sources and bring it to the notice of the commission and to identify fake universities on the basis of complaints received from public/students/parents and include the name of fake universities in the list of fake universities maintained by the LIGC
- 2. For awareness of public/students the UGC every year publishes Public Notice on fake universities as well as unrecognized status of IIPM in the leading daily newspapers in Hindi & English language and warn them not to seek admission in such fake universities. These are also posted on the UGC website: www.ugc.ac.in.
- 3. The UGC requests the Chief Secretaries/Education Secretaries/Principal Secretaries of all States/U.T for taking action against fake universities functioning in their jurisdiction.

Presently, there are 21 fake Universities/Institutions on the list of fake Universities maintained by the UGC. The Statewise list of 21 Fake Universities is available at UGC website.

Action taken by the UGC during 2014-15

In addition to 21 fake Universities, there are two more institutes which are not recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Therefore, these two institutes are not empowered to confer degrees. The names of these two institutes are as below:-

- **A. Bhartiya Shiksha Parishad, Lucknow, UP.** In the year 2011 the UGC placed the name of BSP in the footnote of the list of fake universities.
- B. Indian Institute of Planning and Management (IIPM).

The Delhi High Court passed final judgment against IIPM on 26/09/2014 in WP(C) No. 5937/2010 titled B. Mahesh Vs. GOI & others. The court also restrained IIPM and its management with immediate effect from using the words

MBA, BBA, Management Courses, Management School, Business School or B-School in relation to the courses offered by IIPM. The Court disposed off the case on 31/10/2014. On the basis of the final judgement of Delhi High Court passed against IIPM, the UGC filed FIR against IIPM.

(i) Cell against "Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place"

To look into the grievances of women employees at work place, the Cell against "Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place" is headed by a Joint Secretary, UGC. In the period of report there were no instances of any complaint.

(j) Anti-Ragging Cell

In pursuance to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 8.5.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2009), the University Grants Commission has framed "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009" notified on 17th June, 2009 which are in force. The UGC has informed all Universities that the Regulations are mandatory.

The Commission has made it mandatory for all institutions to incorporate in their prospectus the directions of the Government regarding prohibition and consequences of ragging. The Commission has included a specific condition in the Sanction Letter in respect of any financial assistance or grants-in-aid to any institution under any of the general or special schemes of the Commission that the institution has complied with the anti-ragging measures. The UGC reminds all Universities every year before the start of the academic session through public notices, website and letters to Universities to ensure strict compliance of anti-ragging measures. The UGC has issued a circular to all universities dated 04.08.2014 for constitution of various Committees and compliance of UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 and also sent a letter to the Vice-Chancellors dated 28.04.2014 & 04.08.2014 regarding menace of ragging in higher education and requested to display hoardings, distribute pamphlets etc. The UGC has also published a public notice on 18.07.2014 on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions in the leading newspapers. All the above circulars & public notice have been displayed on the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.ac.in

A video film on anti-ragging developed by Consortium for Educational Communications (CEC) has been uploaded on the UGC website and all universities/institutions which come under the purview of UGC have been asked to give wide publicity amongst students, staff, other stakeholders and colleges under their jurisdiction. As per the second amendment to the UGC Anti-ragging Regulations published on 29.03.2014 in the Gazette of India, the UGC has made it mandatory for all students/parents to submit filled anti-ragging related online undertaking to the institutions at the time of admission and every academic year.

A nationwide toll free anti-ragging helpline 1800-180-5522 has been established which can be accessed by students in distress owing to ragging related incidents. The helpline has been established with call centre facilities in 12 languages, viz. English, Hindi and regional languages (Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Kannada, Punjabi, Marathi, Oriya, Assamese, Gujarati and Bengali), for helping victims of ragging besides facilitating effective action in respect of such incidents. The Helpline directly receives complaints from the complainant/victim of ragging. The same is forwarded by the help-line to the respective institutions and the local administration (SHO & SP) for taking necessary corrective action. The Anti-Ragging Cell in the UGC office coordinates the various anti-ragging measures. All complaints regarding alleged ragging incidents received in the Cell are being promptly attended to and action taken report is sought from the institutions concerned. In cases of delayed response, repeated reminders are made and when no action taken is reported, punitive action is being initiated.

During 2014-15, the UGC received 211 alleged ragging complaints. The UGC has brought these complaints to the notice of respective institutions and vigorously followed up with them through reminders and show-cause notices to take urgent and immediate action in this regard. 181 complaints were closed during 2014-15 at the level of the UGC. In the remaining 30 cases action taken report is awaited and in case no response is received, relevant punitive action shall be initiated as per the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging, 2009.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court vide Civil Appeal No. 887 of 2009 in its judgment dated 8.5.2009 had constituted a Committee comprising of psychiatrists/mental health specialists, etc. to ascertain the psychological impact of ragging on students and recommend urgent and mandatory mental health measures to be implemented in Schools, Colleges and all educational and vocational institutions, so as to avoid the occurrence of ragging.

The UGC has approved a proposal of the Committee constituted by Hon'ble Supreme Court to conduct Psycho Social Study of Ragging in selected educational institutions in India. An amount of ₹49.12 Lakh has been approved and ₹24,56,000/- & ₹10,00,000/- has been released for this purpose on 5.10.2012 & 28.03.2014. The report of the Committee was to be submitted by 31.07.2015. The UGC has given extension to Monitoring Agency i.e. Aman Satya Kachroo Trust, Gurgaon from 2nd January, 2015 to 1st July, 2015.

The 4th meeting of the Inter Council Committee & Coordination Group was held on 17.12.2014. It was decided in the meeting to request the Universities/Institutions to strictly follow the Anti Ragging Regulations made by the UGC and other Regulatory authorities and emphasized the use of Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) in other Regulatory Bodies for quick disposal of the complaints.

The following are the Committees constituted by the Chairman UGC:

- i. Committee for Selection of New Anti Ragging Helpline.
- ii. Committee for selection of Monitoring Agency

The Commission in its meeting held on 22.12.2014 has approved the draft 3rd Amendment in the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions regarding inclusion of the cases of Ethnic & Racial discrimination in the institutions of higher education and sent to Dr. R. K. Raghvan Committee for their suggestion.

1.4 Publications



Graph 1.5(a): General Budget for the year 2014-15



Graph 1.5(b): Grants received during 2014-15 under Plan & Non Plan (General) Budget Head



Graph 1.5(c): Grant received during 2014-15 (General and unspent Balance 2013-14)



Graph 1.5(d): Plan Grant (₹ in crore) released to Institutions during 2014-15



Graph 1.5(e): Non-Plan Grant Released to Institutions during 2014-15





Graph 1.5(f) :Sector-wise Plan Grant Released during 2014-15 (₹ in Lakhs)









Graph 1.5(h)(i): State-wise Plan^{##} Grant (₹ in Lakhs) released to Universities / Colleges/Others during 2014-15

1.6 Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) for Central and Deemed to be Universities

At the behest of the MHRD, the UGC set up a Joint Cadre Review Committee (JCRC) on uniform staffing pattern of the non-teaching staff of Central Universities, the UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and the Delhi Colleges. The objective of the JCRC is to recommend complete framework of uniform service conditions for the non-teaching staff (Group A, B & C) of these institutions.

The UGC has submitted the report of the JCRC to the MHRD in three phases after consideration and approval of the Commission as under:

- 1. Report on Library Services Cadre was submitted vide letter No.F.23-1/2005(JCRC) dated 18th January, 2008.
- 2. The report on 15 identified services/cadre structures, i.e. (i) Administrative/ Ministerial Services, (ii) Secretariat Services, (iii) Transport Services, (iv) Guest House/Hostel/Canteen Services, (v) School Teachers, (vi) Security Services, (vii) Sanitation Services, (viii) Official Language Cell, (ix) Photography/Reprography Services, (x) Music Services, (xi) Sports/Games Services, (xii) Horticulture /Garden Services, (xiii) Agricultural/Veterinary Services, (xiv) Religious Services and (xv) Research/Statistical Services, was forwarded vide letter No.F.6-7/97(JCRC) dated XII June, 2009.
- 3. The report on 8 services/cadre structures i.e. (i) Press & Publication Services, (ii) Museum/Archives Services, (iii) Technical /Laboratory Services, (iv) Engineering Services, (v) Workshop services, (vi) University Science Instrumentation Centre, (vii) Health and Medical Services and (viii) Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Services was forwarded to the MHRD vide letter No.F.6-7/97(JCRC) dated 23rd September, 2010.

MHRD vide its letter dated 07.05.2014 approved some of the recommendations of JCRC report which have been communicated to all Central Universities/ UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities, vide UGC letter dated 01.10.2014. On other aspects where no recommendations have been made, concurrence is being sought from MHRD.

Implementation of ACP/MACP schemes in Centrally Funded Institutions

In order to bring uniformity in the implementation of the ACP Scheme in Central Universities, UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and Delhi Colleges, the UGC has constituted a Standing Committee. It was decided that Universities may implement the ACP Scheme on their own on the basis of the guidelines developed by the Committee after taking into consideration the observations/recommendations of the Standing Committee on the ACP Scheme with regard to individual cases considered by the Committee in the past, in respect of its non-teaching employees. After getting the approval of the MHRD, the UGC conveyed the approval vide its letter dated 9th July, 2010 for the extension of the MACP to Central Universities, UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and Delhi Colleges to its non-teaching employees.

A number of queries seeking clarification on implementation of ACP/MACP scheme in respect of non-teaching employees of Central Universities/ UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities are being resolved by the JCRC cell on a day to day basis.

Implementation of 6th Central Pay Commission's Recommendations

Pursuant to the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development vide O.M.No.2-1/2008-U.I(A) dated 6th October, 2008 extending 6th Central Pay Commission recommendation to the Quasi-Government Organizations, Autonomous Organizations and Statutory Bodies set-up and funded/ controlled by Central Government, the UGC sent a proposal for the revision of scale of pay in respect of non-teaching staff of Central Universities, UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and Delhi Colleges vide letter No.F.20-1/2008(JCRC) dated 3rd December, 2009 for approval. The matter is under consideration of the MHRD. JCRC Section is meanwhile resolving the queries relating to the non-teaching staff in implementation of 6th CPC in Central Universities/ UGC maintained Deemed to be Universities and also actively pursuing the matter with MHRD for approval. The matter regarding grant of Grade Pay of ₹4800/- in PB-2 to Section Officers/ Private Secretaries of UGC and Central Universities, UGC maintained

Deemed to be Universities and Delhi Colleges has been taken up with MHRD for approval.

1.7 Major Decisions during the Year

- The Commission ratified and approved the continuation of Colleges under Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)/College of Excellence (CE) which get 'A' grade re-accreditation from NAAC within one year after discontinuation under the scheme.
- The Commission ratified and approved the University Grants Commission's Annual Report 2012-2013 (English & Hindi) for placing before the Parliament through MHRD.
- The Commission approved the matter of 8 Deemed to be Universities to utilize portion of Internal Receipts of 2013-14 to meet the deficit on Non-Salary expenditure under Non-Plan.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of 300 Raman Fellowships for Post-Doctoral research in United States for the year 2014.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of grants for the proposals on UGC-UK India Education and Research Initiative UKIERI Thematic Partnership for the year 2013-2014.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of Joint Research Projects, 2014 under India New Zealand Education Council (INZEC).
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding under the 'Project-based Personnel Exchange'
 Programme.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding for visit to South Asia Institute, Heidelberg.
- The Commission noted and approved the award of funding under "Exchange of Scientists Programme".
- The Commission noted and approved the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India, and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU), Norway signed on 14th February, 2014 in New Delhi.
- The Commission took note of the number of pending audit paras of the last several years and instructed the UGC Secretariat to promptly send replies to the pending paras.
- The Commission decided that Institutions Deemed to be Universities which have been conferred that status for 25 years or more, and have a valid NAAC Grade A accreditation and have also been given 'A' Grade by the Tandon Committee may be permitted relaxation to the provisions of clause 5.2 of the UGC Institutions Deemed to be University Regulations, 2010 to the extent that the sponsoring Society/Trust/Company of such an Institution can also appoint the President/Trustee/ Promoter of the sponsoring Society/Trust/Company or his/her close relative as its Chancellor provided that such a person is an eminent educationist or a distinguished public figure. The existing Regulations may be amended accordingly.
- The Commission approved the Scheme for Creation and Management of 'Reserve Fund' through Internal Receipts for Universities and Colleges maintained by the UGC.
- The Commission decided that a Committee be constituted consisting of 2 Commission members, representatives from Central/State Universities, and a representative from Ministry of HRD to develop guidelines for norm based funding by the UGC to Universities/colleges by aligning them with the norms under the RUSA.
- The Commission considered the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 21st January, 2014 on the 44 Category-C Institutions Deemed to be Universities, along with the interlocutory directive dated 5th May, 2014 and resolved as under: Since the time for submission of the Report to the Ministry is 31st July, 2014 the Commission resolved to constitute a Sub-Committee to undertake assessment of the 41 Category 'C' Institutions Deemed to be Universities within the stipulated time consisting of the following Members:
 - 1. Prof. Devraj, Vice-Chairman, UGC Chairman
 - 2. Prof. Sanjay Dhande, Member, UGC Member

- 3. Prof. V.S. Chauhan, Member, UGC Member
- 4. Mrs. Amita Shamra, Additional Secretary Member (As nominee of MHRD)

The Commission resolved, all these Deemed to be Universities shall appear before the Sub-Committee to make a video presentation of their institution and to respond to any queries. The Commission further resolved that after assessing the presentation of each Deemed to be University, the proceedings of the Sub-Committee should be speaking in nature and reasons for arriving at the conclusion on the status of each Institution Deemed to be University should be duly recorded. The Commission also resolved that the proceedings of the Sub-Committee should also be videographed. Dr. M.M. Ansari and Dr. D.N. Reddy, Members of the Commission, recorded their dissent on the Resolution.

- The Commission approved the Report alongwith the Guidelines for Promotion of Research Integrity and Prevention of Plaglarism in Higher Educational Institutions other than the proposal of providing motivational funds to the institutions. It was decided that a UGC Regulation on the subject needs to be formulated urgently. It was decided to constitute a Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Sanjay Dhande to draft appropriate Regulations on the subject.
- The Commission decided that the present UGC Regulations on Technical Education be kept on hold till the final outcome of the decision of the Supreme Court.
- The Commission resolved to advise the University of Delhi under Section 12(d) of the UGC Act, 1956, to review/reconsider the continuation of the FYUP.
- The Commission approved the Guidelines for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) during XII Plan Period (2012-2017).
- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines of Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences (Including Languages).
- The Commission approved the creation of 300 faculty positions under the UGC Faculty Recharge Programme and also decided that a proposal should also be prepared by the UGC for inclusion of social sciences under the Faculty Recharge Programme.
- The Commission approved 25 posts under the XII Plan for strengthening NAAC headquarters.
- The Commission approved the recommendations of the report of the Committee constituted to review the performance of the Inter-University Centres (IUCs) and decided to constitute the Implementation Monitoring Committee.
- The Commission approved the XII plan Guidelines of Special Scholarship Scheme for North Eastern Region with the observation that the parental income be reduced from the proposed ₹6 lakh per annum to ₹4.5 lakh per annum. It also decided that the Scheme be launched from academic year 2014-15 onwards.
- The Commission approved the recommendations of the 7th Meeting of Standing Committee on Autonomous Colleges held on 03.06.2014 for grant of 33 Fresh and 12 Extension cases of autonomous status to the colleges and consider the approval of the revised guidelines on Autonomous Colleges.
- The Commission noted and approved that sanction order in respect of financial assistance to colleges should be utilized within the time period specified under the GFR. Further, the conditions precedent to release of grant should be explicitly mentioned in the sanction order, so that the time within which funds need to be utilized are adhered to by the colleges, and further that the UGC should release funds well in time so that the colleges have sufficient time to utilize the same within the financial year in which grants are released.
- The Commission approved the proposal to allow extension of time for completion of projects approved during the XI Plan, and allow institutions to utilize the unspent amount, out of the allocation made during the XI Plan for such projects, during the XII plan period for completion of the projects.

- The Commission approved the Notification with the observations that the provisions for Undergraduate programmes should also be extended to Postgraduate programmes and that no animal from any species shall be dissected either by teachers or students for any purpose at these levels.
- The Commission approved the XII plan Guidelines for Post Doctoral Fellowship to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Candidates.
- The Commission approved the amendments in the Guidelines for Centres with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas (CPEPA) for XII Plan Period (2012-2017).
- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines prepared by the Expert Committee for establishment of Hindi Department and promotion of Hindi in Central/State/Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding outsourcing of NET to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and also resolved to constitute a Committee to co-ordinate with the CBSE on all matters relating to Pre conduct & Post conduct activities of NET. UGC-NET to continue with the existing pattern of NET, however a subcommittee may be constituted to look into the feasibility of the recommendations of the committee..
- The Commission approved the "Guidelines for the Scheme of Granting Special Heritage Status to Universities and Colleges" during XII Plan (2012 2017)
- The Commission approved the XII Plan Guidelines "Regional Centre for Knowledge Enhancement and Capacity Building" (RCKECB) & "Human Resource Development Centres" (HRDCs) with the observation that "Regional Centre for Knowledge Enhancement and Capacity Building" (RCKECB) should be renamed as 'Regional Centre for Capacity Building' (RCCB), and also resolved that the minimum number of participants in the Refresher/Orientation Courses to be 30 (Thirty).
- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding inclusion of "Transgender" as "Third Gender" under various Scholarship/Fellowships schemes of UGC.
- The Commission considered and approved the report of the Sub-Committee constituted by the Commission to undertake assessment of the 41Category 'C' Institutions Deemed to be Universities and resolved that the report of the Sub-Committee be forwarded by Vice-Chairman, UGC, to the MHRD for further necessary action at their level.
- The Commission considered the modifications in the UGC (Promotion and Maintenance of Standards of Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2012 and after due deliberations resolved to approve the proposed amendment in the Regulations except a minor modification in clause 5 (c) which will be read as under:
 - "The application, complete in all respects, shall be placed before the Commission for approval. If approved, the Commission will convey its approval within two months".
- The Commission considered and approved the draft of the UGC (Minimum standards and procedure for award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degrees) Regulations, 2014.
- The Commission considered and approved the modifications in UGC's 12B Rules and application formats.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines for General Development Assistance (GDA) for Central Universities, Institutions Deemed to be Universities and State Universities.
- The Commission considered and resolved to initiate the action on feasibility of formulating New Schemes and/or Expending/Strengthening Existing Schemes in respect of Ideas/points mentioned in PMO's communication.
- The Commission considered and approved the fresh proposals pending for approval of programmes under Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode.
- The Commission considered and approved the Expert Committee's Report on National Initiative for Fostering Social Responsibility in Higher Education and Guidelines for Establishment of Centre for Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Universities during XII Plan (2012 2017).

- The Commission considered and approved the matter regarding the inclusion of Establishment of Diaspora Chair in Goa University in the Guidelines for the UGC Chairs in Universities during XII Plan (2012-2017).
- The Commission considered and approved the XII plan Guidelines of Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Scholarship for Research in Social Sciences and that it may also be made on a par with other fellowships awarded for pursing Ph.D. program.
- The Commission considered and approved payment of Pension & Family Pension to the UGC Research Scientists directly to the Pensioner's by the Finance Division, UGC, as done in case of UGC Pensioners/family pensioners cases.
- The Commission considered and approved the review of the Guidelines for the UGC Chairs in Universities during XII Plan (2012-17) and amendment with regard to remuneration provided to Chair Professors.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines of the schemes 'Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges' & 'Capacity Building of Women Managers in Higher Education'.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII plan Guidelines for Swachh Bharat-Swasth Bharat Scheme of the UGC
- The Commission considered and approved the Report of the Expert Committee constituted to assess the proposal of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University), New Delhi, to establish off-campus centre at Agartala (Tripura).
- The Commission considered the report of the Expert Committee constituted to examine the funds required for 'Centre for Policy Research in Higher Education' established by the National University of Educational Planning and Administration (NUEPA) (Deemed to be University), New Delhi, and after due deliberation resolved to approve the proposal with the condition that the progress of the Centre be reviewed on an annual basis and that the Centre will undertake projects, on priority, which would be referred to it by the Commission from time to time.
- The Commission considered the observations of the Sub-Committee of the Commission and approved its recommendations with regard to approval of institutions under sections 2(f), 12B and compliance under Section 13 of the UGC Act, 1956.
- The Commission after due deliberations approved the guidelines for the Choice Based Credit System. Further, the Commission resolved that before these guidelines are communicated to the Universities for adoption / adaptation they may be vetted by a Committee headed by the Commission Member Shri Patanjali (Patu) G. Keswani.
- The Commission considered and approved the inclusion of a Chair in the name of Lakshminath Bezbaroa and Sri Aurobindo in the existing guidelines for UGC Chair in Universities during Twelth Plan.
- Based on the concurrence received from majority of the Members, the Commission approved the setting up of IUC-TE at Varanasi with a budgetary requirement of ₹56 crore (Non-recurring) and ₹8.32 crore (Recurring) per annum. MoA of the IUC was also approved for the purpose of registration under Societies Registration Act, 1860, or under the relevant Act of the State Government in whose jurisdiction the institution is located.
- The Commission considered and approved the draft amendment of "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 3rd Amendment, 2014, and also resolved that since the Raghavan Committee is working for several years it may be requested to look into the issue in its entirety and suggest a way forward.
- The Commission considered and approved of the proposal to retain the internal receipts with the Central Universities to cover up the short-fall of non-salary component under Non-Plan Grant till the appropriate allocation is made by MHRD under non-salary components to meet the short-fall under non-salary expenditure (Non-Plan) and also resolved that the internal receipts may also be got audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India.
- The Commission considered and approved the status quo strategy for continuation of recognition to Universities/ Institutions offering programmes through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode for the academic session 2015-16.

- The Commission decided to give relaxation for releasing the grant under Plan and Non-Plan Scheme of Colleges to all Universities / Colleges to apply for NAAC accreditation upto 31st December, 2015.
- The Commission considered and approved the amendment in the clause 7.3.0 of UGC Regulations, 2010 regarding composition of Selection-cum-Search Committee for deemed to be Universities for selection of Vice-Chancellor.
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Standing Committee on "Universities with Potential for Excellence" (UPE) held on 17.11.2014.
- The Commission considered and approved the XII Plan Guidelines of the scheme 'Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India'.
- The Commission considered and approved the collaboration of Bhasha with M. S. University of Baroda for promotion of indigenous languages and resolved that the funding should be given only to M.S University of Baroda.
- The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines for Knowledge Upgradation Centers for Skilled Human Action and Learning (KAUSHAL)
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Revised) Guidelines for Community Colleges.
- The Commission considered and approved the guidelines for Curricular Aspects, Assessment Criteria, and Credit System in Skill based Vocational Courses under NSQF.
- The Commission considered and approved that extension will be given for a period of one year for the Centres of Nano-Science, Nano-Technology/Bio-Medical, Nano-Technology of University of Mumbai, University of Calcutta and University of Madras respectively which were allocated Special Grant of ₹100 crore each for celebration of 150 years of their existence.
- The Commission noted and approved the amendment to the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations,2010, by removing the phrase 'the senior most Dean or if there is no Dean' from the clause of 6.2 (3) of the said Regulations.
 - After incorporating the amendments, clause 6.2 (3) of the Regulations would read as *under*:
 - "In case of the office of the Vice-Chancellor becoming vacant due to death, resignation or otherwise and in case of his/her absence due to illness or any other cause, the Pro-vice-Chancellor, and in his/her absence, the senior most Professor shall perform the duties of the Vice-Chancellor, until a new Vice-Chancellor is appointed, or the existing Vice-Chancellor resumes duties, as the case may be".
- The Commission considered and approved the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Specification of Degrees to be notified as the First Amendment in UGC Notification dated 5th July,2014.
- The Commission considered and examined the report of the UGC Expert Committee constituted by the Commission to physically inspect 7 Institutions Deemed to be Universities which had filed Interlocutory Applications before Hon'ble Supreme Court. The Commission observed the number of deficiencies in these Institutions Deemed to be Universities inspected by the Committee. The Commission also noted the observations of Joint Secretary (Higher Education), MHRD. The Commission noted that despite the lapse of several years these institutions have not yet rectified their shortcomings. The Commission after due deliberations resolved that the Reports of the Expert Committee should be examined by the Bureau in order to identify the major deficiencies which shall subsequently be communicated to the MHRD, the seven Institutions Deemed to be Universities and also to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
 - After detailed deliberations, the Commission decided to give them a final opportunity to rectify their deficiencies within a maximum period of one year and submit the compliance report to the UGC within this period, failing which recommendation will be made to the MHRD for denotification of Deemed to be University status.
- The Commission considered and approved that the Report of Gurukul Kangri Vishwavidyalaya, Haridwar, be sent to the MHRD and to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Furnishing of Information by Universities) Regulations, 2015.

- The Commission considered and approved the Guidelines for ensuring Safety of Students on Excursion/Study Tours
- The Commission considered and approved the Cadre Recruitment Rules of NAAC.
- The Commission considered and approved the transfer and release of ₹20 crores to INFLIBNET (an IUC of UGC) on the recommendations of the Standing Committee constituted for the production of e-Content Courseware on PG Subjects.
- The Commission considered and approved and also decided to set up a sub-committee to decide on parameters and guidelines for conferment of Potential for Excellence Status for Deemed to be Universities.
- The Commission considered and approved the UGC (Gender Sensitization, Prevention and Prohibition of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students and Redressal of Grievances in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015.
- The Commission considered and approved the guidelines for empanelment of Adjunct Faculty in universities and colleges.
- The Commission considered the revised pattern of assistance for release of grant for construction of Women Hostel for Central, State and Deemed Universities during the XII Plan period and decided to release 40% as the first installment followed by 40% as second installment and 20% as the final installment.
- The Commission while taking a serious view of the procedure followed in issuing earlier grants and setting up of EMMRC in National Institute of Social Work and Social Sciences (NISWASS) reiterated its earlier decision taken in its meeting held on 11th March,2013 wherein the Commission had resolved:

"that the NISWASS be asked to submit the Utilization Certificates of the grants already given to it and that no further grants of any kind be given to NISWASS". In addition, the Commission also took cognizance of the two Enquiry Committees which were set up to enquire into the irregularities of the Institute, one headed by Shri S. Sathyam, IAS (Retd.) former Secretary, Government of India, set up by the UGC in August, 2012 and the another one headed by Shri M. Gopalakrishnan, IAS (Retd.) set up by the MHRD in November, 2013 for examining the irregularities committed by the Institute.

Having regard to the above, the Commission decided that the EMMRC in NISWASS be closed down with immediate effect and assets so acquired there be taken over by the Central University of Orissa.

Reports and suggestions

- Prof. Sanjay Dhande requested the Chairman, UGC, that the Commission should hold discussion on important policy matters concerning higher education; the Commission members may also propose Agenda items for discussion during the Commission meetings. The Chairman, UGC, clarified that Commission members do propose Agenda Items and the same are taken up for discussion. After discussion it was agreed that in the next meeting the Commission would discuss important policy matters, including developing a pathway and a long term Action Plan (501st Meeting).
- Smt. Anjuly Chhib Duggal stated and suggested modification regarding utilization of internal receipts and creation of Reserve Funds in Central Universities, which includes the following:
 - (a) The UGC may draw a list of items of expenditure which can be incurred out of non-Plan non-salary funds; and
 - (b) The UGC may prepare a list of sources from which internal receipts can be generated by the Universities.
- The MHRD vide its Order dated 30th July, 2014 constituted a 4 Member UGC Review Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. Hari Gautam, Former Chairman of UGC. The Chairman, UGC, informed that the Committee had its meeting on 5th and 6th September, 2014 wherein Secretary UGC made a presentation on the role and functions and major initiatives undertaken by the UGC in the recent past.
- Consultative Meeting of Vice–Chancellors of Central and State Universities and State Education Secretaries on 'Reforms in Teacher Education was held on 15th September, 2014 in which the morning session was chaired by

- the Hon'ble HRM, Smt. Smriti Irani. The Chairman, UGC, briefed the Commission of the Agenda discussed in the consultative meeting and its outcome.
- The MHRD and the UGC had jointly convened the meeting of the Vice-Chancellors of all the Central Universities on December 4, 2014 at Vigyan Bhawan. The Chairman, UGC, informed that the purpose of this meeting was to make necessary preparations for the Review Meeting to be taken by the Visitor in February, 2015. The Chairman also informed that all the Central Universities have been advised to switch over to Choice Based Credit System from the ensuing academic session.

Chapter 2

Growth of Higher Education System

The Commission is empowered under Section 12(h) and under Section 12(i) of the UGC Act, 1956 to collect information on all such matters relating to University education in India and other countries as it thinks fit, and to require a University to furnish it with such information as may be needed relating to the financial position of the University or the studies in the various branches of learning undertaken in that University, together with all the rules and regulations relating to the standards of teaching and examination in that University with respect to each of such branches of learning.

In order to get timely and quality data in the education sector, which has implications for human development, the Ministry of Human Resource Development initiated an All India Survey of Higher Education to build a database and to assess the overall picture of Higher Education in the country.

A core team of officers from MHRD and UGC were involved in providing technical support, which includes preparation of Data Capture Format (DCF), providing training in workshops, assisting National Informatics Centre (NIC) in software development, etc. Nodal officers have also been appointed in each state to coordinate the survey work.

A dedicated portal (http://aishe.gov.in) has been developed with the help of National Informatics Centre (NIC) for collection and compilation of the data. All the institutions need to register on the portal for accessing the portal and uploading the data. The UGC Information and Statistics Bureau from 2014-15 has stopped collecting data directly from the Universities. Compilation and estimation of Data at All India level is being made through portal http://aishe.gov.in and this made us to shift to paperless exercise.

At the time of independence, there were only 20 universities and 500 colleges in the country with 2.1 lakh students in the higher education system. But, after independence, there has been a phenomenal growth in all these numbers. Now, it is a recorded fact that there is an increase of 40 times in the number of Degree awarding Universities/ Institutes, 82 times increase in the number of colleges, and the students enrolment has gone up to over 127 times in the formal system of higher education as compared to the figures of Independent Year of India. The phenomenal increase in enrolment of this order would not have been possible without the growth in the number of institutions of higher learning, both universities and colleges in particular, and increase in intake capacity of courses. The increase in numbers of institutions and enrolment indicate that the target of 30% Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) set for the end of XII Plan (2017) will be achieved.

2.1 Institutions

At the end of XI Plan (31.03.2012), there were 573 Universities (43 Central, 129 Deemed and 397 State Universities (State/Public 286 and 111 Private) and 4 Institutions established under Special State Legislature Acts and 35,539 Colleges in the Country. During the year 2014-15 there were 711 Universities and university level institutions (Listed by UGC) (46 Central, 128 Deemed, 329 State Public, 205 State Private and 3 Institutions under Special State Legislature Act) (Appendix: I) and 40760 Colleges, thus registering an increase of 24% in the number of Universities and 14.69% increase in colleges during the 3rd year of XII plan in comparison to the figures at the end of XI plan.

During the reporting year 2014-2015, **1** Central University, **30** State Private Universities and **18** State Universities were included in the UGC list of universities and **6** universities were declared fit to receive central assistance under section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. Detailed information on State Universities, State Private Universities, Deemed Universities and Institutions established under State legislature and is also available on UGC website.

Graph: 2.1(a) Type-wise number of Universities as on 31.03.2015






So far as the number of Universities in States is concerned, Rajasthan (68) and Uttar Pradesh (64) top the list followed by Tamil Nadu (52), etc. and also it can be observed from the Table 2.1(b) that there is uneven establishment of Universities in States.

However, the increase in the number of Colleges is varied amongst States as observed from the Table 2.1(c). Relatively speaking and in comparison to the absolute figures, the state of Uttar Pradesh accounted for the highest increase with 2048 colleges, followed by Madhya Pradesh (1131), Maharashtra (716), Karnataka (546) for the last 5 Years. The number of Colleges as on 31.03.2015 stood at 40760.


As many as 1,147 new colleges had been established during 2014-15, thus taking the total number of colleges to 40,760 in 2014-15 as against 39,613 colleges in 2013-14, registering an increase of almost 2.90%



2.2 Students Enrolment

During the academic year 2014-15, there had been 265.85** lakhs (provisional) students enrolled in various courses at all levels in universities/colleges and other institutions of higher education as compared to the unrevised figure of 237.65 lakhs in the previous year, registering an increase of 11.87** per cent. The trend of students' enrolment at the macro level in the last two decades is given in **Table 2.2(a)**.





Out of 265.85 lakhs students, 124.76 lakhs are women students, constituting 46.93 percent. The comparative trend of total students enrolment and enrolment of women students, among states, during 2014-15 is indicated in **Table 2.2(b)**. The enrolment of students, in terms of absolute numbers, had been the highest in the state of Uttar Pradesh (43.96 lakhs), followed by Maharashtra (28.60 lakhs), Tamil Nadu (24.01 lakhs) and West Bengal (15.90 lakhs), etc.



2.2(c) Level-wise Students Enrolment

The enrolment position in the academic year 2014-15 reveals that the majority of students in the higher education system had been enrolled for a variety of courses at the under-graduate level. The students at this level constitute provisionally 86.26% of the total number of students in colleges and universities put together. The percentage of students enrolled for Master's level courses (PG) had been 11.09% while a very small proportion i.e. 0.67% of the total number of students have enrolled for research. Similarly, only 1.57% of the total number of students have enrolled in Diploma/Certificate courses.

As regards the distribution of students' enrolment between universities and affiliated colleges, the largest number of students in the higher education system is enrolled in affiliated colleges. About 88.37% of all the under-graduate students and 71.09% of all the post-graduate students have enrolled in the affiliated colleges, while the remaining is in the universities and their constituent colleges. In contrast, 73.56% of the total research students had been in the universities. However, the fact that the majority of the total number of students are enrolled in the affiliated colleges where the foundations of higher education are being laid demands focus and greater financing to the college sector, particularly with reference to promotion of relevance, access and equity, quality and excellence, etc.





2.2(d): Faculty-wise Students Enrolment

The distribution of students, across various faculties, during the academic year 2014-15 was as under:

Out of the total enrolment of students (265.85 lakhs), 37.41% students had been in the faculty of Arts, followed by 17.59% in Science and 16.39% in Commerce/ Management. Thus, 71% of the total enrolment had been in the three faculties of Arts, Sciences and Commerce / Management, while the remaining 29% had been in the professional faculties, the highest percentage being in Engineering/Technology (16.27%), followed by Education(Teacher Training) (4.57%) and Medical courses (4.02%), etc. In a country like India, where Agriculture and allied occupations are the main occupations, the enrolment in Agricultural Courses had been just 0.78 percent and in Veterinary Science, it is a miniscule of 0.11 percent. Thus, it is evident from the faculty-wise distribution of enrolment that the ratio of professional to non-professional enrolment has been almost 1:3 and hence there is a need for an appropriate policy change which may rationalize and reduce the disparity and increase the need to focus on vocationalisation of education.



2.3 Faculty Strength

In the academic year 2014-2015, the total number of teachers in universities and colleges was 12.61 lakhs as compared to 10.49 lakhs teachers in the previous year .There are approximately 39.20% women teachers in universities and colleges (**Table 2.3(c)**). Out of the 12.61 lakh teachers, 84.66% teachers were in Colleges and the remaining 15.34% in University Departments / University Colleges: **Table 2.3(b)** & **Table 2.3(a)**.

Graph 2.3(a): Level-wise Teaching Staff: University Teaching Departments / University Colleges: 2014-15





Graph 2.3(b): Level-wise Teaching Staff: Affiliated Colleges: 2014-15





2.4 Research Degrees

The number of research degrees (Ph.Ds) awarded by various universities increased from 20,275 in 2012-2013 to 22849 in 2013-2014, thus registering an increase of 12.70%. Out of the total number of Ph.Ds awarded in 2013-2014, the Faculty of Arts had the highest number with 7480 degrees, followed by the Faculty of Science with 7018 degrees. These two faculties together accounted for 63.45 per cent of the total number of Ph.D. degrees awarded. 2098 degrees were awarded in the Faculty of Commerce/Management. In professional faculties, the Faculty of Engineering & Technology had topped with as many as 2533 Ph.D. degrees, followed by Agriculture with 871 degrees, followed by Education faculty with 825 degrees, Medicine faculty with 819 degrees, others with 737 degrees, etc. It is observed that there is an increasing trend in academic research in terms of number of research degrees awarded by the Universities during 2013-2014 (Table 2.4(a)) as compared to the figures for the year 2012-2013.



2.5 Growth in Enrolment of Women in Higher Education


There had been a phenomenal growth in the number of women students enrolled in higher education since independence. The women enrolment which was less than 10 per cent of the total enrolment on the eve of Independence had risen to 46.93 per cent in the academic year 2014-2015.

The pace of growth has been particularly faster in the last two decades. As the data in **Table 2.5(a)** show, the number of women enrolled per hundred men registered more than five times in 2014-2015 as compared to 1950-1951.

2.6 Distribution of Women Enrolment by State and Faculty

During 2014-15, Table 2.2 (b) distribution of women enrolment by state shows among the states and UTs, Lakshadweep had the highest percentage (71.17%), followed by Goa with 60.06% in terms of women enrolment as a percentage of total enrolment of the state. There are 23 states/UTs which had higher enrolment of women than the national percentage of 46.93%. In the rest of the states, the percentage of women enrolled had been less than the national average, with Rajasthan recording the lowest women enrolment of 39.0% only. In absolute numbers, Uttar Pradesh State had been on the top in enrolling women students (21.73 lakhs), followed by Maharashtra (13.01 lakhs) and Tamil Nadu (12.32 lakhs), etc.

Table 2.6(a) shows that the women enrolment in the faculty of Arts had been 41.70% of total women enrolment, followed by the faculty of Science (18.60%), the faculty of Commerce/Management (15.73%), etc., constituting 76.03% in these three non-professional faculties. The professional faculties constitutes 23.97% of total women enrolment.

2.7 Women Colleges

From the following Table 2.7, it can be found that as many as 240 women colleges have so far been established during two years of the XII Plan as compared to the figure at the end of XI Plan (4266). As on 31.03.2014, there were 4506 colleges exclusively for women.(data available upto 31.03.2014).



2.8 Condensed Statistics on Growth of Higher Education

Growth of higher education since 1950-51 in terms of degree awarding Universities/Institutions registered 24.7 fold increase, number of colleges had 58 fold increase, Student Enrolment had 67 fold increase and Teacher's strength had 52 fold increase as observed during 2014-15.

Chapter

Development (Plan) and Maintenance (Non-Plan) Assistance to Universities

3.1 Assistance to Universities

The University Grants Commission has been providing grants to Central and Deemed to be Universities, both under Plan (Development) and Non-Plan (Maintenance) Schemes/ Programmes while assistance to State Universities is being made available only under Plan (Development) Schemes/Programmes. General Plan Development Grant to Universities is being made available during XII Plan on the basis of the outlays determined and communicated to the Universities. The outlays shall be in operation for the period from 1St April, 2012 to 31St March, 2017.

Under the General Plan Development Assistance, the UGC assists each eligible University for the overall development covering different aspects, namely, enhancing access, ensuring equity, imparting relevant education, improving quality and excellence, making their University administration more effective, providing more Faculty Improvement Programmes, enhancing facilities for students, augmenting research facilities and other plans of the University.

In order to fulfill these objectives, the financial assistance to meet the requirements of the University in terms of infrastructure, staff, equipment, books & journals, library, etc. can be provided by the UGC under the General Plan Development Assistance during the XII Plan period.

3.1(a) Central Universities

The University Grants Commission (UGC) provides both Development (Plan) and Maintenance (Non-Plan) assistance to Central Universities under various schemes/programmes.

As on 31st March, 2015, there are 46 Central Universities, out of which 6 Universities namely (i) Central Agricultural University, Imphal, Manipur (ii) Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi (iii) Indian Maritime University, Chennai (iv) South Asian University, New Delhi (v) Nalanda University, Bihar and (vi) Rajiv Gandhi National Aviation University, Uttar Pradesh are not funded by the UGC. Therefore, 40 Central Universities are being provided Plan (Development Grant) and other specific schemes of UGC. 24 Old Central Universities including 3 newly converted Central Universities & One Medical College are receiving Maintenance Grant from the UGC. During the year 2014-15, one new Central University in the name of Mahatma Gandhi Central University has been established by Government of India notifying amendment in First Schedule to the Principal Act, 2009 on 17th December, 2014 for renaming of 'Central University of Bihar as 'Central University of South Bihar with its jurisdiction in the territory in the South of the River Ganges in the State of Bihar and establishment of one more Central University in Bihar in the name of 'Mahatma Gandhi Central University' with its jurisdiction in the territory in North of the River Ganges in the State of Bihar. However, the new Central University will be operationalised after the appointment of first Vice-Chancellor by the Government of India. The names of the Central Universities are given below:-

3.1 (a) Plan Grant

(i) General Development Grant

Plan grant is given for the development of 39 Central Universities including Medical Colleges and the Hospitals attached to them. Besides, there is one Medical College, namely, University College of Medical Science, which is also fully funded by the UGC. The objective of development assistance is not only to improve and consolidate the existing infrastructure in the university, but also to develop excellence in certain identified areas. During the XII Plan, General Development Assistance to universities is being provided in the form of Plan Block Grant. For universities, it will include construction/renovation of building (including renovation of heritage buildings), campus development, staff, books & journals, laboratory, equipment and infrastructure, annual maintenance contracts, innovative research activities, university industry linkages, extension activities, cultural activities, development of ICT, health care, student amenities including hostels, Non-NET Fellowships to students, Travel Grant, Conferences / Seminars / Symposia / Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor / Visiting Fellow, Establishment of Career & Counselling Cell, Day Care Centres, basic facilities for women, Faculty Development Programmes, etc.

The concept of Merged Schemes introduced during the XI Plan has been done away with and no separate grant under the Merged Schemes is being provided during the XII Plan.

The following schemes which were earlier part of Merged Schemes are now implemented independently by a dedicated cell of the UGC and separate grant provided by UGC under these schemes.

- (i) Equal Opportunity Cell
- (ii) Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority community students
- (iii) Coaching for NET for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority community students
- (iv) Coaching Classes for entry into services for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority students.
- (v) Scheme for persons with disabilities.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell and construction of Women Hostels are also being implemented as independent scheme in all Central Universities.

The scheme called ENCORE which was initiated during XI Plan is now a part of XII Plan General Development Assistance. No separate funding will be provided for this scheme.

UGC has also provided the funds for the following purposes:-

(ii) Implementation of Sachar Committee

Justice Sachar Committee Report has made several recommendations regarding the Education Sector. To formulate a Plan of Action on the findings of the Report, a High Level Committee was constituted by the MHRD. The Fatmi Committee Report has been accepted by the Hon'ble HRM for implementation of the recommendations contained therein.

As regards Central Universities, namely, Aligarh Muslim University and Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad, the Fatmi Committee has made certain specific recommendations.

During the year 2014-2015, UGC has released an amount of ₹25.00 crores for implementation of the recommendations of the Sachar Committee.

(iii) Coaching Scheme for Residential Coaching Academies for Minorities/SCs/STs and Women

As the scheme of UGC for remedial coaching and entry into services have not created the desired impact, 'Residential Coaching Academies' for Minorities/SCs/STs and Women were set up at Aligarh Muslim University, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Jamia Hamdard, Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow and Jamia Millia Islamia.


The objective of the Residential Coaching Academy for Minorities/ SCs/STs and Women is to provide equal opportunities to all section of society for equitable growth which entails affirmative action for Minorities, SCs/STs and women by providing Coaching programme to the student, with Hostel facilities with free of cost/nominal fee, without tuition fee for the above category for entry into Central/State Government, private sector jobs and entry into IITs/Medical colleges.

During the year 2014-2015, the UGC released an amount of ₹20.00 lakhs to Maulana Azad National Urdu University for Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Chair and ₹25.00 lakhs to Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University for establishment of Ambedkar Chair. In addition to this,the UGC has approved one Chair in the name of Swami Vivekanand in Central University of Jammu.

(v) Special honorarium of ₹15000/-p.m.to the Teachers who are fellows of at least two of the four specified science academies during XI Plan period.

The UGC has initiated the scheme for special honorarium of ₹15,000/- p.m. to the teachers who have been awarded Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar award or who are fellow of at least two of the following four Academies identified by the UGC:

- 1. National Academy of Science, Allahabad
- 2. Indian Science Academy, Bangalore
- 3. Indian National Science Academy, New Delhi
- 4. Indian National Science Academy of Engg., New Delhi

A teacher can avail only one of the honorariums and not more than one, i.e. either from the CSIR as Bhatnagar Awardee or from the UGC Scheme.

An amount of ₹1.80 lakh was released to Central University of Punjab during 2014-2015 under the Scheme.

(vi) Establishment of Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers:

The UGC is providing funds to the Central Universities, namely, Aligarh Muslim University, Maulana Azad National Urdu University and Jamia Millia Islamia for establishment of Centre for Professional Development of Urdu Medium Teachers. 





Meta University Concept

During the XII Plan, the UGC initiated a concept of Meta University: The main purpose of the Meta University is to share learning resources by different Universities by using latest technologies available in order to enable students to benefit from learning resources available in different institutions. Meta Universities represent 2nd Generation Universities, free from physical boundary conditions and able to operate in virtual space, taking advantage of the innovation and flexibility possible in such domains.

During the financial year 2014-2015, no grant was released under the Scheme.

Mobilising external sources of funding

In order to revive our tradition to support higher education, and to encourage the participation of society in the development of universities, the UGC initiated a Scheme during XI Plan entitled "Incentives for External Resource Mobilization". This scheme is also continued during the XII Plan.

The contribution of the UGC will be upto the extent of 25 per cent of the contribution received by the University for a particular year, subject to a maximum of ₹ 50.00 lakh per annum.

During the financial year 2014-15, no grant was released under the scheme.

Capacity expansion to provide reservation for OBCs in admission

The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006, envisaging reservation of 27% of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty for the OBCs (excluding "creamy layer"), apart from 15% for the SCs and 7.5% for the STs, in Central Educational Institutions (CEIs) established, maintained or aided by the Central Government, other than those exempted under the Act, requires them to increase the annual permitted strength for the academic session 2006-07 by 54% over a maximum period of 3 years commencing from the academic session 2008-09, with a view to ensuring that the number of unreserved seats available to the OBCs as also to the SCs and the STs for each academic session are commensurate with the increase in the permitted strength for that session.

A grant of ₹ 4060.94 lakhs (₹ 444.00 lakh to Tezpur University, ₹1100.00 lakh for Manipur University and ₹2516.94 lakh to Colleges affiliated to University of Allahabad) was released to Central Universities during 2014-2015 for implementation of OBC reservation policy.

Strengthening /Setting up of Schools of Education in Central Universities

The UGC has been impressing upon the Central Universities and other Universities to establish Department of Education and conduct programmes for preparation of school teachers and Teacher Educators. In the wake of the Right to Education Act, 2009 and the various recommendations contained in the report of Justice Verma Commission on Teacher Education (2012), the Government of India requested the UGC to take urgent steps for expanding institutional support to teacher education in the University system and also to bring various qualitative improvements thereof. One such aspect in entailing such initiative was to establish School of Education in Central Universities of the country. With this objective, the UGC sent a communication to all the Central Universities for establishing Schools of Education within them and take up various activities relating to teacher education other than pre-service teacher education. These included curriculum research, policy and educational development, learning and pedagogic studies, assessment and evaluation, professional development of teacher educators, etc. A related issue on which the Central Universities were requested to work was for reforming the curricula of the various teacher education programmes in the light of the recommendations of the National Curriculum Framework on Teacher Education (NCFTE), 2009.

The UGC has sanctioned for expansion and strengthening of teacher education in Central Universities for which approval was given for various teaching and non-teaching posts. The UGC has also invigorated the initiative for reforms in the curricula of the teacher education courses, requesting Academic Staff Colleges to provide refresher and orientation training programmes for teacher educators, to strengthen post-graduate programmes in the teacher education departments and to run integrated teacher education programmes.

As a result of the above efforts, at present 36 Central Universities have Schools/Departments of Education offering various teacher education programmes and they have also intensified their efforts for providing other related programmes of teacher education.

During the year 2014-2015, no grant was released under the Scheme.

Establishment of Centres for Indigenous and Endangered Languages

During the XII Plan, the UGC has decided to initiate establishment of Centres for Indigenous and Endangered Languages in Central Universities for preservation and promotion of endangered Languages. The UGC constituted an Expert Committee to prepare a report and finalise the Guidelines for the Scheme. The Commission in its meeting held on 17.12.2012 approved the report of the Expert Committee of the said Scheme.

The UGC has conveyed its approval for establishment of Centre for Endangered Languages to the following 9 Central Universities:-

- 1. Tezpur University, Assam
- 2. Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh
- 3. Sikkim University, Sikkim
- 4. Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, M.P.
- 5. Central University of Jharkhand, Jharkhand
- 6. Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya, Chhattisgarh
- 7. Central University of Karnataka, Karnataka
- 8. Central University of Kerala, Kerala
- 9. Visva Bharati, West Bengal

During the financial year 2014-15, no grant was released under the scheme.

Internal Quality Assurance Cells (IQACs) in Central Universities

All Universities which are under section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act will be eligible to receive the financial support for establishing and strengthening of the IQACs in them. In order to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of the IQAC during the XII plan, the UGC will provide financial assistance of ₹5.00 lakhs (to be released in two instalments of 90% and 10% of the total assistance) to each University. The expenditure can be incurred on following items:-

Construction of Women's Hostel in Universities

With a view to providing hostels and other infrastructure facilities to achieve the goal of enhancing the status of women and harness the potential available for the development of the society at large, as also to bring about gender equity and equal representation of women, the UGC is implementing the Scheme of construction of Women Hostels in Universities.

Under this Scheme, the following financial assistance is being provided:-

Mandatory accrediation by NAAC of each Central University

Assessment and accreditation in the higher education, through transparent and informed external reviewprocess, are the effective means of quality assurance in higher education to provide a common frame of reference for students and others to obtain credible information on academic quality across institutions, thereby assisting student mobility across institutions, domestic as well as international.

Assessment is undertaken prior to the commencement of academic programmes in an Institution. Accreditation is undertaken after an institution completes certain number of years of existence (6yrs.)/passing out of specified number of batches (two batches), whichever is earlier.

The UGC has also decided that no Higher Educational Institution or its Faculties, Schools, Departments, Centres or any other units therein, by whatever name called, **shall be eligible for applying or receiving financial assistance** from the Commission from 1st April, 2016 onwards, under any of its Schemes without having undergone assessment and accreditation on or before 31st December, 2015.

Out of 39 Central Universities, 13 Central Universities have obtained the NAAC accreditation. 9 Central Universities have obtained the accreditation earlier, but accreditation period is over and have applied for reaccreditation. 11 Central Universities have applied first time for accreditation. 6 Central Universities have yet to apply for accreditation.

Two Days Retreat of Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities at Chandigarh

The Union HRD Minister Smt. Smriti Irani graced the two-day retreat of Vice Chancellors of Central Universities held at Chandigarh on 12-13 September 2014.

Highlights of the retreat are:

All the Central Universities were requested to complete their NAAC accreditation or reaccreditation (as the case may be) as per the time frame given by the UGC.

A working Group comprising Vice-Chancellors of English and Foreign Languages University, University of Delhi, Central University of Gujarat and Jawaharlal Nehru University was constituted for developing a framework for the National Ranking System.

Skill India Initiative

Council of Industry - Higher Education Collaboration (CIHEC) is being operationalized to identify initiatives to promote research, mobilize resources, develop market ready manpower and enhance employability. The Council will collaborate with Placement Cells of Central Universities for identification of the emerging areas as per the requirement of the neighbouring industries to make the students employment ready. The CIHEC will also help train counsellors at all Placement Cells for better counseling and placements. Each University should establish a Placement Cell (if not already established) for all disciplines (not restricted to Science and Professional disciplines only). Every Placement Cell will have counselors who should give in-house training for skill development and coordinate placements.

100 Centres of Skilling Excellence, called **Knowledge Acquisition and Upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livlihood (KAUSHAL) Centres** will be established for skill development in one year. These Centres will coordinate the entire skill development efforts of higher educational institutions. Enhanced funding shall be provided by the UGC.

The working Group comprising of Vice-Chancellor of Central University of Kerala, Central University of Jharkhand, BBAU, Tripura University and Pondicherry University, University of Delhi and Central University of Gujarat was constituted to frame the guidelines on the following:

- (i) Common admissions
- (ii) Common curriculum
- (iii) Student mobility
- (iv) Faculty mobility
- (v) National System of Credit Transfer

Under the **GIAN** (**Global Initiative for Academic Networks**), the Universities will provide a list of eminent scholars, researchers of the University (within a month) both from within the country and outside, whom they would like to invite in their universities as guest speakers/scholars in residence, etc.

Diginal India Initiative

The Vice Chancellors (VCs) were requested to encourage the faculty in Central Universities to offer free online courses to citizens under the Digital India initiative of **SWAYAM** (**Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds**) through the Mass Open Online Courses (MOOCs) platform created by the MHRD through IIT Mumbai.

- National E-Library has been envisaged as an online portal that will democratize access to knowledge by ensuring that quality contents are available in a digital format to all citizens. It will become operational in the academic year 2015 and the CUs should actively participate in it.
- Campus Connect Program has been launched to ensure Wi-Fi enabled higher educational institutions. All CUs were requested to ensure that their campuses/constituent colleges become fully Wi-Fi enabled as soon as possible.
- Each Central University will display on its website, all relevant information including profile of teachers, calendar of activities of the university, academic calendar, names of members of all statutory bodies alongwith their tenure, research output, information on budget, vacancy, tenure of Registrar, Finance Officer, etc.
- 40 great personalities of India would be identified. All universities were requested to locate the schools/colleges/ universities which had the proud privilege of teaching by these great personalities and take action to develop/ improve the facilities and infrastructure in these institutions.

The Union Human Resource Development Minister also exhorted all VCs to ensure prevention of sexual harassment of students and staff at all costs. All Central Universities should ensure proper facilities and infrastructure for disabled students.

Two Days Conference of Vice-Chancellors of Central Universities at Rashtrapati Bhawan on 4-5th February, 2015

- A two-day Conference of Vice Chancellors (VCs) of Central Universities (CUs) concluded on February 5, 2015 at Rashtrapati Bhavan.
- The VCs adopted a detailed set of recommendations on the five agenda items of the conference, namely (1) steps to create an eco-system for research and innovation; (2) capacity development of faculty, alumni participation and use of technology; (3) deepening engagement of Central Universities with community; (4) creating international and national networks for quality education and (5) adoption of Choice Based Credit System. The recommendations included:
- Choice Based Credit System must be implemented from the academic year 2015-16 in all CUs.
- Each CU will set up a Community Development Cell which will identify at least 5 villages in its vicinity for adoption as model villages by the university.
- A blended Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) strategy must be adopted.
- CUs must recommend amendment of statutes, to enable induction of alumni in governing bodies, to the Ministry of HRD.
- Selection of teaching staff must be completed within six months of appointment of Visitor's nominees.
- All activities towards NAAC accreditation must be completed within 6 months.
- Database of alumni must be established by CUs.
- Each CU must nominate a nodal officer to feed the university's needs and activities and share good practices and experiences on to the CU VC's Discussion Page on the University of Hyderabad website.
- Nodal officers for international rankings must be appointed within next 30 days in each CU.
- Proposals to the UGC for creation of Centres of Excellence must be sent within next 60 days.
- CUs which are yet to establish Innovation clubs must do so.
- CUs which are yet to set up Inspired Teachers' Network, must do so.
- Industry-interface cells in CUs must be completed within next 3 months.
- Addressing the concluding session, the President told the Vice Chancellors that they must act as "gurus" and guide scholars and students to achieve the highest standards of academic brilliance. They should feel empowered and use the administrative and moral authority vested in them to make these universities "islands" radiating excellence in their spheres of influence.
- The President invited one Inspired Teacher from each Central University to experience and be part of the Rashtrapati Bhavan community for a week under a new programme on the model of the Artists In-Residence and Innovation Scholars In-Residence programme. He also requested Central Universities to send representatives to participate in the one week long "Festival of Innovation" (FOIN) proposed to be held in Rashtrapati Bhavan in March, 2015.
- The President called on MHRD, UGC and the VCs to implement the recommendations of the conference in a time bound manner and said the Minister of HRD will take a meeting in June, 2015 to review achievement of deliverables.
- The concluding session was attended by Union Minister of Human Resource Development, Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani.

Establishment of Centre for Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Universities

The XII Plan aims to promote greater social responsibility for higher education in the country, as per the recommendations of the Steering Committee on Technical and Higher Education in the country. While many institutions have already been involved in programs like the NSS, they are largely designed to 'help' the community. The new approach to community engagements being recommended by the expert committee set up by the Planning Commission emphasizes mutually beneficial and respectful partnerships between communities, civil society and institutions of higher education in the country.

Outreach/extension activities in the university system generally do not attract priority. Thus most of the higher educational institutions remain disconnected with the society at large. It is important, therefore, to more clearly and forcefully mandate that the core purposes of 'community engagement' by institutions of higher education is to serve mutually agreed interests of both communities and institutions. The UGC has recently framed Guidelines for Establishment of Centres of Fostering Social Responsibility and Community Engagement in Universities during the XII Plan period. The objectives of the Scheme, inter-alia include (i) providing roadmap of community / university engagement plans of the university (ii) promoting community / university partnership to develop knowledge for including the lives of people and to encourage participatory research (iii) working in alliance based organization in the planning and execution of projects (iv) designing and developing pedagogy relevant to the learning needs of the community and (v) creating neighbourhood networks of educational institutions including schools and providing policy suggestions and technical assistance in the matter of fostering social responsibility and community engagement.

Granting Special Heritage Status to Universities and Colleges during the XII Plan

During the XII Plan, the UGC formulated a Scheme of granting Special Heritage Status to Universities. Under this Scheme, institutions which have completed 100 years of their existence are entitled for assistance with a one time lump sum grant of ₹10.00 crore during XII Plan.

During the financial year 2014-15, the UGC has not received any proposal under the Scheme from Central Universities.

3.1(b) State Universities

3.1(b1) Plan Grant

General Development Assistantance to State Universities

The UGC provides General Development Assistance to all eligible State Universities which are recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, within the framework of norms and broad outlays specified by the UGC in order to facilitate the procurement of such infrastructural facilities which are not normally made available to them from the State Government or other bodies supporting them.

- The XII Plan General Development Assistance to universities will be provided in the form of Plan Block Grant. For State Universities, it will include construction/renovation of buildings (including renovation of heritage buildings), campus development, staff, books & journals, laboratory equipment and infrastructure, annual maintenance contracts, innovative research activities, university industry linkages, extension activities, cultural activities, development of ICT, health care, student amenities including hostels, Travel Grant / Conferences/ Seminars/Symposia /Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor/Visiting Fellow and Establishment of Career & Counselling Cell, Day Care Centres, Basic Facilities for Women and Faculty Development Programme, etc.
- The Concept of Merged Scheme Introduced during the XI Plan has been done away with and no separate grant under the Merged Scheme will be provided during the XII Plan.
- The Scheme called ENCORE which was initated during XI Plan will now be a part of XII Plan General Development Assistance. No Separate funds will be perovided for this Scheme.
- The erstwhile Scheme of XI Plan, i.e. Human Rights and Duties Education, is also covered under the XII Plan General Development Assistance Scheme. No separate funding will be provided for this scheme.
- Appointment/Honorarium of guest, part-time teachers now will be a part of XII Plan General Development Assistance Scheme.
- Establishment of Rajiv Gandhi Chairs in Universities may be continued during the XII Plan as establishment of Chairs in Universities.
- An independent scheme of Internal Quality Assurance Cell and construction of Women Hostels will be implemented in all State Universities and now will not be a part of the Merged Scheme and shall be continued as separate schemes.
- The scheme of special Honorarium to teachers who are fellows of at least two of the four science academies identified by UGC will be continued during the XII Plan as a separate Scheme.



3.1(c1) Plan Grant

I. General Development Grant

Plan grant is given for the development of 18 identified institutions deemed to be universities. The objective of development assistance is not only to improve and consolidate the existing infrastructure in the universities, but also to develop excellence in certain identified areas. During the XII Plan, General Development Assistance to universities is being provided in the form of Plan Block Grant. For Universities, it will include Construction/ Renovation of Buildings (including renovation of Heritage Buildings), Campus Development, Staff, Books & Journals, Laboratory, Equipment and Infrastructure, Annual Maintenance Contracts, Innovative Research Activities, University - Industry Linkages, Extension Activities, Cultural Activities, Development of ICT, Health Care, Student Amenities including hostels, Non-NET Fellowship to Students, Travel Grant, Conference/ Seminars/ Symposia/ Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professors/ Visiting Fellows and Establishment of Career & Counseling Cell, Day Care Centre, Facilities for Women and Faculty Development Programme, etc.

The concept of Merged Scheme introduced during the XI Plan has been done away with and no separate grant under the Merged Scheme is being provided during the XII Plan.

The following Schemes which were earlier part of the Merged Scheme are now implemented independently by a dedicated cell of the UGC and separate grant provided by the UGC under these Schemes.

(i) Equal Opportunity Cell

- (ii) Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority Community Students
- (iii) Coaching for NET for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority Community Students
- (iv) Coaching Classes for entry into services for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority Community Students.
- (v) Scheme for Persons with Disabilities.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell and construction of Women Hostels are also being implemented as independent Scheme in all identified institutions deemed to be universities.

The Scheme called ENCORE which was initiated during XI Plan is now a part of the XII Plan General Development Assistance. No separate funding will be provided for this Scheme.

UGC has released an amount of ₹5445.04 lakh to 14 identified institutions deemed to be universities during the year 2014-15 under XII Plan General Development Assistance. Details of sanction of grants during the year 2014-15 are given in Table 3.1(C1).

The UGC is providing Non-Plan grant to 10 identified institutions deemed to be universities. Out of these 10 institutions deemed to be universities, 8 institutions deemed to be universities are receiving 100% Non-Plan grant towards salaries and allowances, retirement benefits and non-salary. The components under non-salary are: consumables, electricity charges, water charges, property tax, house tax, contingencies, maintenance/ repairs of buildings and other expenses. Budget estimates / revised budget estimates of 8 identified institutions deemed to be universities are decided on the basis of discussion with the Registrar and the Finance Officer of these Universities.



Chapter 4.

Development (Plan) and Maintenance (Non-Plan) Assistance to Colleges

4.1 Thrust of Twelfth Plan for the Development of Colleges

Development of Colleges, which are responsible in a major way for undergraduate education and to a great extent even for postgraduate education, is an important factor in Indian higher education system from the point of view of maintenance of proper standards, ensuring optimum utilization of facilities, promoting innovation and change, linking education to emerging career patterns, access, equalization of educational opportunities for the weaker sections of society, particularly the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and those belonging to the educationally backward areas. The focus of development assistance to the colleges is on supporting the teaching-learning process by upgrading basic infrastructure like library, laboratory, connectivity, etc. However, the emphasis is on the expansion and consolidation of facilities in the existing institutions, improvement of standards through modernization, rationalization and diversification of under-graduate courses especially by relating them to career opportunities.

The XII Plan lays special emphasis, among others, on increasing the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) from 15 % to 30%. For this, colleges have to play a very crucial role by expanding enrolement significantly, at the same time not losing sight of quality control and consolidation.

4.2 Colleges Recognized by UGC for Financial Assistance

As on 31st March, 2015 there are nearly 40,760 colleges in the country. Out of them, only 9,940 colleges are recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956. Out of the 9,940 recognized colleges 8,201 colleges are eligible to receive Central Assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

4.3 Grants to Colleges by the UGC Regional Offices

The UGC decentralized its functioning by opening seven Regional Offices in the country since 1994 in a phased manner for easy access and speedy release of grants and implementation of various schemes/ programmes relating to colleges. Later on, one of the UGC Regional Offices, viz. Northern Regional Office (NRO), Ghaziabad, was converted into "Northern Region Colleges Bureau" and shifted from Ghaziabad to Delhi at 35, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi w. e. f. 25.09.2001. Grants to the eligible Colleges all over the country are disbursed by these Regional Offices/Bureau under the following schemes/programmes as per guidelines:-

- 1. General Development Assistance to Colleges
- 2. Construction of Women's Hostel for Colleges
- 3. Autonomous Colleges (Release of Grants only)
- 4. Minor Research Projects for College Minor Research Projects for College Teachers-Humanities, Social Sciences and Sciences.
- 5. Seminar/Symposia/Conference for Colleges
- 6. Faculty Development Programme for Colleges (Award of Teacher Fellowships to college teachers for doing M.Phil / Ph.D).
- 7. Internal Quality Assurance Cell for Colleges
- 8. Development of Sports Infrastructure & Equipments in Colleges
- 9. Committed Liabilities (old UGC Schemes)

Eligibility Criteria

The UGC provides grant to the eligible colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, for the above mentioned schemes. The Self Financing Colleges having 12B Status are eligible only for Teacher/Student centric schemes.

4.4 Schemes-wise Release of Grants by the Regional Offices

4.4 (a) General Development Assistance to Colleges (XII plan)

The UGC provides assistance to colleges which are recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, for the development of Undergraduate/Postgraduate Colleges which fulfil the eligibility conditions as prescribed in the XII Plan guidelines. Under the scheme, financial assistance is provided to the colleges for strengthening basic infrastructure and meet their basic needs like books and journals (including Book Banks), scientific equipments, campus development, teaching aids which are needed for proper instruction, extension/renovation of existing building and construction of new buildings, extension activities, facilities for women, etc.



Graph 4.4(a1): State-wise XII Plan Grant Released (₹ In Crore) and Number of Beneficiary Colleges





4.4 (b) Construction of Women's Hostel for Colleges

With a view to providing hostels and other infrastructure facilities in the colleges to achieve the goal of enhancing the enrolment of women, the Commission had introduced a special Scheme for the Construction of Women's Hostel during the year 1995-96. The Colleges which come within the purview of the UGC and are fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, are eligible to receive financial assistance under this Scheme. The financial assistance from the UGC under the Scheme is on 100% basis subject to the ceiling given below:



Graph 4.4(b): Grant Released by the Regional Offices under the scheme of Construction of Women Hostels & Number of Beneficiaries during XII Plan




4.4 (c) Autonomous Colleges

Graph 4.4 (c): Grant Released (₹ in Crore) to Autonomous Colleges (Beneficiaries) during XII Plan (2014-15)




4.4 (d) Minor Research Projects for Teachers of Colleges

Graph 4.4(d): Grant Released by Regional Offices under the scheme Minor Research Project for Teachers of Colleges during XII Plan




4.4 (e) Seminars/Symposia/Conferences for Colleges

4.4 (f) Faculty Development Programme for Colleges


The Programme aims at enhancing the academic and intellectual environment in the Institutions by providing faculty members with enough opportunities to pursue research and also to participate in seminars/conferences/ workshops. Participation in such programmes would enable faculty members to update their research and pedagogical skills. The objective of the Scheme of Faculty Improvement Programme are:-

- 1. To provide an opportunity to the teachers of the Colleges to pursue their academic/research activities leading to the award of M.Phil/Ph.D. Degree.
- 2. To provide an opportunity to the teachers to present papers in academic conferences/seminars or participate in workshops and exchange of knowledge and ideas.
- 3. To provide opportunity to Young Faculty Members to spend a short period (not less than two weeks and not more than two months) at institutions of their choice for a better academic exposure.

4.4 (g) Internal Quality Assurance Cell for Colleges

To monitor standards of the higher educational institutions the UGC has established the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as an autonomous body, under Section 12(ccc) of its Act in September, 1994. Recognizing the importance of such institutional internal quality system, the UGC has taken a policy decision to direct all colleges to establish Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for which it has decided to provide ₹3.00 lakhs as seed money to each college to meet the establishment and strengthening expenditure of IQAC. The scheme was introduced for colleges during 2014-15 (XII Plan).

All Colleges which are under section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act will be eligible to receive the financial support for establishing and strengthening of the IQACs in them. It shall be mandatory for every college to get accredited by the Accreditation Agency, after passing out of two batches or six years, whichever is earlier.



4.4 (h) Development of Sports Infrastructure & Equipment in Colleges

Keeping the above objective in view, the scheme is designed to offer:



While the students would get an opportunity to avail themselves of such sports facilities, this Scheme specially aims to serve the first generation students both in urban and rural areas.
- (b) opportunities to students, depending upon their level of 'attainment' in a particular sport, to participate in more advanced level of sport in the same or related area through the availability of better equipment and infrastructure.
- (c) infrastructure, where already available is intended to be improved/strengthened. Colleges will be assisted in creation of such standard infrastructure and non-expendable equipment facilities so as to facilitate the conduct of such activities for their students.



4.5 Grants to Delhi Colleges and Constituent Colleges of Banaras Hindu University

UGC provides financial assistance to 53 Colleges affiliated to Delhi University and 4 Colleges which come under the privileges of BHU under Non-Plan and 64 Colleges affiliated to Delhi University Under Plan (53 College + 11 College of Delhi Administration). In addition to this grants are also provided grants to Delhi Colleges/Delhi based Medical Colleges for Seminars/Conferences/Workshops at National/International/State level.

Out of 53 Colleges, the UGC provides 95% maintenance grant to 36 Colleges and 100% to 17 Colleges (8 Evening Colleges + 9 University Maintained Colleges). Out of these 36 Colleges, 16 Colleges get 5% management share of maintenance grant from Delhi Administration and 20 Colleges get from their respective Trusts/Society.

These 53 Delhi Colleges meet salary, pension and non-salary expenditure out of the maintenance grants received from the UGC. To determine the budget of each College, annual meetings are held with the principals of the Colleges.



Graph 4.5(a1): Non-Plan Grant (Maintenance) (₹ in Lakhs) Released to Delhi Colleges during 2014-15



Graph 4.5(b): Plan Grant (₹ in Lakhs) Released to Delhi Colleges during 2014-15



Quality and Excellence

The University Grants Commission in pursuit of excellence in teaching and research in the Institutions of higher education has been providing substantial support to selected universities and colleges through various Schemes like University with Potential for Excellence (UPE), Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE) and Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Area (CPEPA) with a view to enabling them to reach the world class level and serve as benchmark for other institutions in the country.

The UGC has introduced these Schemes during the IX plan period which are still continued during the XII Plan period also. The main objectives of these Schemes are:

- To strengthen the academic and physical infrastructure for achieving excellence in teaching, research and outreach programmes
- To promote flexible and effective governance
- To enhance the quality of the learning and teaching process at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels with the help of a flexible credit based modular system, and the whole range of innovations currently accepted globally
- To promote academic programmes relevant to the socio-economic needs of the nation
- To improve undergraduate education in colleges by the interfacing of the PG programmes
- To promote networking with other Centres/departments and laboratories in the country
- To achieve excellence in education, training and research to face the challenges of globalization.

5.1 Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE)

The University Grants Commission introduced this Scheme during the IX Plan period to identify few universities which had potential to achieve excellence in teaching and research activities. This initiative is being continued during the XII Plan period in order to identify a few more universities which have the potential to achieve excellence not only in teaching and research, but also in all related functions that could contribute to a holistic development of the university.

Under the Scheme UPE so far 15 universities have been selected and 10 more universities are to be selected during the XII Plan period. The UGC intends to identify some universities from among the existing UPEs which have already achieved excellence and innovation in teaching and research to a considerable extent and completed first/second phase under the Scheme and designate them as University of Excellence(UoE). During the XII Plan 03 such universities which have completed their first/ second phase of Universities with Potential for Excellence will be considered for up gradation to University of Excellence (UoE) status for their outstanding performance/achievements.

Guidelines of eligibility credentials during XII Plan, Tenure, Quantum of Assistance regarding selection of universities for the conferment of the UPE/UOE status is available on UGC website at http://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/1952943_XII-Plan-Guidelines-For-UPE-and-UoE-Revised.pdf.

Monitoring of the UPE Scheme

Under the Scheme, a Mid-Term Monitoring Committee is constituted by the Chairperson, UGC, to assess the progress of the University. The University will be invited to make a presentation before the Committee at the UGC Headquarters after two years of implementation of UPE/UoE status. The Committee will submit a report in respect of each university. The report of all the universities will be placed before the Standing Committee and subsequently before the Commission for continuation/discontinuation, as the case may be.

In the last year of UPE/UoE phase, a Final Review Committee, constituted by the Chairperson, UGC, shall visit each of the universities selected under the Scheme to review the performance and achievements of the university in the light of the objectives of the Scheme. This Committee will also recommend next phase of UPE/UoE to the university concerned for consideration of the Standing Committee under the Scheme. However, any university will enjoy the status of UPE/UoE for a maximum of three phases under the Scheme.

During the year 2014-15, the UGC has invited fresh proposals under the UPE Scheme from the eligible universities. A total of 35 proposals were received in the UGC office, out of which the following 7 State Universities were shortlisted and were called for presentation before the Standing Committee:-

- (i) Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak (Haryana)
- (ii) Mangalore University, Mangalore (Karnataka)
- (iii) Devi AhilyaVishwavidyalaya, Indore (MP)
- (iv) Bharathiar University, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu)

- (v) Alagappa University, Karaikudi, Alagappa (Tamil Nadu)
- (vi) Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirapalli (Tamil Nadu)
- (vii) Anna University, Chennai (Tamil Nadu).

Out of above 7 State universities only one university i.e. Anna University has been requested to submit its revised proposal for UPE Status.

The Commission in its meeting held on 3rd February, 2015 has decided to frame separate guidelines with nomenclature in respect of Deemed to be Universities/State Private Universities for awarding UPE/CPEPA Status.

During the financial year 2014-15 no grant was released under the "University with Potential for Excellence" (UPE) Scheme due to paucity of funds though the Mid-Term evaluation of three universities was done which is mandatory for releasing further grant.

5.2 Centre with Potential for Excellence in a Particular Areas (CPEPA)

The University Grants Commission introduced the Scheme "Centre with Potential for Excellence in Particular Areas" (CPEPA) during the IX Plan period in order to promote quality and excellence and inter-disciplinary approach in teaching and research activities. The Commission has decided to continue this Scheme during the XII Plan also. The broad objective of this Scheme is to encourage and facilitate the chosen departments at the selected universities to work together by associating their faculty members to cooperate and collaborate in their programmes and activities on a regular basis, by cutting across departmental and/or discipline barriers in the emerging, frontier or cutting edge subject areas of regional, national and/or international importance. One of the objective of this Scheme is to gradually prepare the universities for UPE status.

The work of these Centers is evaluated by the Mid-Term Monitoring Committee and the Final Review Committee.

21 Centres from different universities are being supported under this Scheme. The details are given here under:

During the year 2014-15, the UGC has invited fresh proposals under the CPEPA Scheme from the eligible universities. A total of 118 proposals have been received and were placed before the Standing Committee. The Standing Committee has constituted a Sub-Committee to shortlist the proposals for further consideration.

5.3 Colleges with Potential for Excellence (CPE)

The UGC has introduced the CPE Scheme during the **X Plan.** Under this Scheme, the colleges are financially supported to improve their academic infrastructure, adopt innovations in teaching, learning and evaluation and to introduce a flexible approach in the selection of courses at the degree level. A CPE college acts as a role model for other colleges in their area of operation. The objective of the Scheme is to help selected colleges to achieve excellence mainly in teaching activity and initiate a research culture in such colleges. The Commission has decided to continue this Scheme

during the XII Plan period also with an additional component of College of Excellence (CE) during the second and third phase of the Scheme.

- (I) Ceiling of financial assistance during XII Plan is as under
- 1. The grant up to ₹150.00 lakhs under the Scheme will be provided for each college during the XII Plan period. The Expert Committee will clearly specify the quantum of grant item-wise and under recurring and non-recurring category.
- 2. The colleges selected for second phase and onwards of CPE will be eligible for a maximum grant of ₹150.00 lakhs.
- 3. The colleges selected for the CE status will be eligible for a maximum grant of ₹200.00 lakhs.
- 4. The financial assistance under the Scheme is for up-gradation and updating of the departments for their further development towards excellence, and will not be utilized for construction of buildings.
- 5. 50% of the grants may be spent for the development of the best performing departments as these have evidently proved their potential for pursuit of excellence. The rest 50% may be spent on the general development of the other departments and common facilities of the college.

The financial assistance will be spent only on aided departments.

(I) Release of Grant by the UGC

The UGC will release 100% Non-recurring Grant and 20% Recurring Grant of the total allocation in the beginning itself. Thereafter, 20% of the Recurring Grant will be released on annual basis subject to the receipt of the UC of the previous installment of the Recurring Grant. However, the Non-recurring Grant should be utilized within a period of 18 months from the release of the grant and UC should be submitted to this effect.

Once the final allocation of grant has been made by the UGC, re-appropriation up to 5% of the total allocation is permissible with proper justification at college level under intimation to the UGC. In no case, re-appropriation will be made for more than 5% of the total allocation.

Eligibility/Pre-requisites

The colleges fulfilling the following criteria will be eligible for consideration under the Scheme:

- 1. The college should be minimum 10 years old.
- 2. The college should have been recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act.
- 3. The college has to be an accredited one by NAAC, with a minimum of 'B' Grade, at the time of applying for the first phase of CPE status.
- 4. Among the accredited colleges, preference will be given to Autonomous Colleges.
- 5. If a college is a composite college, it should take immediate steps to delink the plus-2 courses from the college. Prior to the interface meeting with the Expert Committee, it has to confirm in writing that the de-linking will be affected with the next academic session, if CPE status is awarded to the college. 1st instalment of grant under the Scheme will be released to the college only after such a de-linking has been affected.
- 6. It will be desirable that the teachers of the college selected under CPE/CE are not transferred during the implementation of the Scheme so as to maintain continuity in implementing the Scheme.
- 7. Preference will be given to those colleges where, other things being equal, the Principal is a regular appointee and has a long tenure.

Agricultural, Medical, Dental, Nursing and Pharmacy colleges are not eligible to be considered under this Scheme.

During the year 2014-15, **137** colleges have been reviewed by the Expert (Monitoring) Committee in the UGC office and fresh proposals has also been invited through public notice on UGC website on 21st January, 2015 and in response the UGC has received a number of proposals from different Universities which will be placed before the Standing Committee.

Presently 172 Colleges are enjoying the CPE status and 14 Colleges are enjoying the CE status as on date.

During 2014-2015, an amount of ₹51,93,50,000/-was released to the colleges under this Scheme.

5.4 Establishment of New Centres/Institutes

Keeping in view the changing economic scenario in terms of liberalization, globalization and greater demand for quality products from Higher Education System to meet the newly emerging needs, the Commission, during the year 2001, had introduced a New Scheme, viz., "Establishment of new Centers/ Institutes of excellence" in studies and research on various inter–disciplinary areas in Sciences and Humanities within the University system.

During 2001–2002 and 2009-10, the Commission had approved the proposals of following Centres in the universities for financial support for establishment of Centres/Institutes within the University system.

The progress of these Centers has been reviewed with the help of Review Committees so as to take a decision regarding their continuation or otherwise during the XI Plan period.

At present only one Centre is running i.e. Centre on National Studies in Sri Guru Granth Sahib at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. An amount of ₹4.00 crore was released to the Centre during 2013-2014.

During the XII Plan period this Scheme has been discontinued.

5.5 Special Assistance Programme (SAP)

The SAP scheme was initiated in 1963 by University Grants Commission keeping in view the recommendations of the Education Commission to facilitate the selected number of University departments having some potential in research and teaching. The programme is intended to encourage the pursuit of excellence and teamwork in advanced teaching and research to accelerate the realization of international standards in specific fields. The first such programme was initially started as the "Centre of Advanced Study (CAS)" in 1963. Some of these Centres also received recognition and financial support from UNDP/UNESCO. The "Department of Special Assistance (DSA)" and "Departmental Research Support (DRS)" programmes were started in the Departments during 1972 and 1977 respectively to create feeder departments for CAS.



5.6 Autonomous Colleges

The 1964-66 Education Commission pointed out that exercise of academic freedom by teachers is a crucial requirement to the development of the intellectual climate of our country. Unless such a climate prevails, it is difficult to achieve excellence in our higher education system. As students, teachers and management are co-partners in raising the quality of higher Education, it is imperative that they share a major responsibility and hence the Education Commission (1964-66) recommended Autonomy to the colleges. College autonomy, in essence, is the instrument for promoting academic Excellence.

Financial assistance to Autonomous Colleges

The MHRD/Ministry of Defence/UGC conduced a workshop during March 2013 for introduction of NCC as an elective subject with credit points in selected educational institutions (Autonomous Colleges) from the academic year 2013-2014.

It was decided to provide incentive to those autonomous colleges which will introduce NCC as an elective subject with credit points.



Release of Grants:

Autonomy grant as admissible to the autonomous colleges is being released by the Regional Offices concerned of the UGC which are located at Hyderabad, Poona, Bhopal, Calcutta, Guwahati, Bangalore and at Delhi.

During the year 2014-15, Regional Offices released the Grant of ₹ 33.02 crore under the scheme of Autonomous colleges to 171 Beneficiaries colleges

In order to effectively implement and ensure smooth functioning of the Scheme, the UGC reviews and revises the guidelines from time to time, based on the feedback received.

The Commission revised the guidelines for granting extension of Autonomous Status to Autonomous College w.e.f. 27th Feb 2014 which reads as under:-

Those Autonomous Colleges that have been successfully reviewed for the last 3 times (18 years) and have maintained continuously a NAAC score of minimum B Grade (with CGP of 2.5) shall be exempted from the mandatory Committee visit required for extension of Autonomous College status. These colleges shall furnish the relevant information (as per format) for extension of the Autonomous College status once they fulfill the above criteria and extension will be considered automatically by the Commission.

All Autonomous Colleges should also be required to upload information on their website regarding courses offered, faculty, availability of infrastructure, admission details etc.

The UGC received 63 proposals from the Colleges / Universities throughout the country for the conferment of Fresh/Extension Autonomous Status, for the year 2014-2015. The Expert Committees were constituted by the Chairman, UGC, to visit these colleges for considering their proposals for providing fresh/extension of Autonomous Status.

During the year 2014-2015, fresh Autonomous Status was provided to 33 colleges, whereas extension of autonomous status was provided to 19 colleges.

5.7 Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) and Regional Centre of Capacity Building (RCCB) (Previously Academic Staff Colleges (ASCs))

Academic Staff Colleges have now been renamed as Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) & Regional Centre of Capacity Building (RCCB). The main aim of the scheme is to maintain high standards of teaching in Universities and Colleges.

- Grants paid during the financial year 2014-15: ₹46,87,23,848/-
- Upto 31.3.2015 grants were considered according to the provision of the XIth Plan Guidelines.
- Course/programme schedule for the year 2015-16 has been allocated through an interface Meeting with Director-HRDCs & one Co-ordinator nominated by the Chairman, UGC.
- XIIth plan Guidelines have now come into existence and also available on UGC website from 01.02.2015.
- A few HRDCs are proposed to be upgraded as RCCB with enhanced grants/funds under the scheme.

Other highlights of the XII Plan Guidelines

- c) Additional charge of Director-HRDC raised to ₹10,000/-and Deputy Director of ₹5,000/-
- d) Participant registration fees raised from ₹500/- to ₹1000/- (non-refundable)
- e) Honorarium to course coordinator of ₹6,000/-
- f) TA/DA and honorarium to Resource persons/visiting faculty for ₹1500/-per person per session of 90 minutes, subject to a maximum of ₹6,000/- per course. Other conditions will be the same annexure-wise as per the XIIth Plan Guidelines.

5.8 Promotion of Rajbhasha (Hindi)

In the year 1963 the Central Government had declared Hindi as the official working language of the Union of India and directed all the Departments to setup a 'Rajbhasha Cell' in order to promote the use of Hindi in official work. In compliance of the Rajbhasha Act, the University Grants Commission initially setup a Rajbhasha Cell which was later on during 1992 converted into a fullfledged Section.

In the UGC, attempts are being made to perform work through Rajbhasha Hindi as much as possible. For the documents being issued under the Rajbhasha Act, 1963 (Clause 3) (General orders, Memorandum, Decisions,

Notifications. Rules, Agreements, Tender Notices, Parliament Questions, etc.), there are orders to issue these circulars bilingually.

During the reporting year, 3 meetings of Rajbhasha Implementation Committee were held on 29-09-2014, 30-12-2014, and 24-03-2015 respectively. One staff member was nominated for Hindi short hand and 36 staff members had been nominated for Hindi Typing.

For the promotion of Hindi, four workshops were organized in the UGC office on 24-04-2014, 11-09-2014, 12-11-2014 and 27-02-2015 respectively.

The materials received from various Sections of UGC were translated into Hindi by the Rajbhasha Section, such as: Annual Report 2013-14, Annual Accounts 2013-14, Administrative Tender information, Specification of Degrees, Delegation of Powers to Officers of UGC, Guidelines, Information regarding Right to Information, XII Plan Guidelines for Development of Sports Infrastructure in Universities, Amendments in the guidelines for appointment of teachers in Universities, Administrative office orders, memorandums, transfers, posting, retirements, office orders for maintaining discipline, demi-official letters and advertisements and circulars, and translation of XII Five year Plan Guidelines.

During the year 2014-15, different competitions for the officers/staff members of the UGC were conducted, such as:-Essay writing, Debates, Hindi typing and noting and Hindi typing on Computer . In these competitions, for the 1st, 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} positions, competitors were given ₹2,500/- ₹2,000/- and ₹1,500/- and for other winners consolation money of ₹1,000/- were given as prize money.

During the period September 1-14, Hindi fortnight was organized and on XII September 2014 Hindi Divas was celebrated. A total amount of ₹2,76,872/- had been incurred for organizing Hindi Divas and for distribution of prizes. The Town Official Language Implementation Committee (Delhi Central) first meeting for the year 2014-15 was held on 21-08-2014 and on 19-03-2015 the Joint Secretary (Rajbhasha), UGC, participated.

For the Town Official Language Implementation Committee membership for the year 2014-15, a contribution of ₹5,100/- was made by the UGC.

The Commission has prepared guidelines for the approved grant-receiving Central/State/Deemed universities for the establishment and upgradation of Hindi Departments which can be accessed on the UGC website at http://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/2836102_Final-guidelines-for-Hindi-Department.pdf. The Commission has approved the etablishment and upgradation of Hindi Departments in 26 UGC grants-receiving Central/State/Deemed Universities. Under these guidelines provisions have been made for payment of grants for construction of buildings, purchase of appliances, for renovation and modernization of the building. Rajbhasha Implementation Committee had been constituted to make assessment of the work being done in Hindi and its implementation. For the establishment of Hindi Departments in Universities and for their upgradation, an Expert Committee had been constituted and for assessment of the work being performed in Central Universities, the UGC has constituted an Inspection Committee.

5.9 Bilateral Cultural and Educational Exchange Programmes


The University Grants Commission, on behalf of the Government of India, has been implementing various collaborative academic programmes between India and foreign countries.

The UGC has been running Joint Research Programmes with countries like USA, UK, Israel, Norway and New Zealand, and has also facilitated Indian scholars to realize their research potential through fellowship and research programmes, such as Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in USA, Project-based Personnel Exchange Programme and Exchange of Scientists Programme with Germany.

5.9 (a) Fellowships, Scholarships and Exchange of Scholars

5.9(a)(i) Raman Fellowships for Post-doctoral Research in USA

The University Grants Commission has offered these fellowships with the aim to provide excellent opportunity to young Indian researchers and teachers of all disciplines to have international collaborative research training in advance techniques and technologies in emerging fields, thereby furthering their research capacity and ability to contribute to higher education with global perspective and forging long-term relationships with distinguished experts in USA. During the year 2014-15, 144 candidates were awarded these fellowships.

5.9(a)(ii) Commonwealth Medical Fellowships

During 2014, The Association of Commonwealth Universities, United Kingdom, offered 10 Commonwealth Medical Fellowship Awards to enable promising faculty members in Universities & Medical Colleges in India to do research work at the Universities/Institutions in the United Kingdom. The University Grants Commission had worked as a nominating agency for these fellowships.

5.9 (a) (iii) Stipendium Hungaricum Program

As per the provisions mentioned in the Indo-Hungarian Educational Exchange Programme, signed between the Ministry of Human Capacities of Hungary and the Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Republic of India on 19th November, 2014, the UGC invited applications from Indian students to pursue graduate, post-graduate and doctoral studies in Hungary. The final selection of students for the Scholarship programme will be done by the Hungarian Scholarship Board, and the UGC has worked as a nominating agency for the same.

5.9 (a) (iv) Exchange of Scientists Programme with Germany

This programme supports the exchange of 10 scientists in Humanities and Social Sciences. The duration of the exchange should not be less than two weeks and not more than four weeks. During this period, upto four host institutes can be visited. Each side bears the travel costs of their guest scientists. In 2014, four candidates were selected.

5.9(a)(v) Project Based Personal Exchange Programme (PPP)

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) in New Delhi have worked out a programme designed to intensify the scientific cooperation through funding of scholars who would participate in cooperative research projects primarily in the fields of Humanities and Social Sciences. Priority is given to young Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral scientists and scholars. In 2014, **three** candidates were selected.

5.9(a)(vi) South Asian Institute, Heidelberg Fellowship

The South Asia Institute offers an annual award of two Fellowships to Indian Scientists to work at the South Asian Institute in Heidelberg. **Two** candidates were recommended for the year 2014.

5.9(a)(vii) Travel Grant to Teachers to Visit Foreign Countries under Collection of Source Material Scheme

The Commission provides travel grant on 100% basis to enable the University/College teachers to collect source material for research work. The assistance is given to such scholars who have received an assurance for maintenance at least for a period of two months from a recognized university/institute abroad. During 2014, 1 Indian scholar had been provided financial assistance under this Scheme.

5.9 (b) JOINT RESEARCH PROPOSALS

5.9 (b) (i) UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships

The UK India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) was started in April, 2006, with the aim of enhancing educational link between the two countries.

In recognition of the substantial achievements and building on the success of this initiative, the Programme was extended till 2016.

The University Grants Commission (UGC), on behalf of Indian universities and institutions of higher learning and supported by the Ministry of Human Resource Development and the **British Council (BC)** through the UKIERI Secretariat based in New Delhi are the implementing agencies.

UGC-UKIERI Thematic Partnerships are intended to be between institution-based research teams in UK and India of proven research ability. Under Thematic Partnerships, **10** Joint Research Proposals have been approved in the year 2014-15.

5.9 (b) (ii) Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative

Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative was announced in 2009 as an affirmation of the commitment to build an enhanced India – United States strategic partnership in education. As a part of its implementation, the UGC announced an open competition under Indo-US 21st Century Knowledge Initiative and invited proposals for **Joint Research** from the institutions recognized under Section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act and Institutions of National Importance in the following areas:

- Energy study,
- Sustainable Development,
- Climate Change,
- Environmental Studies,
- Education and Educational Reforms,
- Community Development and Innovation

In 2014, the UGC received 18 proposals for Joint Research Projects, out of which 4 proposals have been recommended by the Indo-US Joint Working Group.

5.9(b)(iii) Indo-New Zealand Joint Research Projects

Under the auspices of India-New Zealand Education Council, the University Grants Commission, India, and Education New Zealand invite applications from Indian and New Zealand academics seeking funding for Joint Research Projects. These Projects can be in any discipline but must focus on one or more of the following themes:

- Food security (including agriculture), history, social justice and social change
- Community development and innovation
- Creative and culture industries, tourism and the new leisure economy
- Health
- Environment and sustainability (including climate change and energy studies)
- Indian Diaspora in the South Pacific and the Antipodes
- India New Zealand trade relations and India's foreign policy in the Asia-Pacific

- Information Security
- Urban Planning and Development, urban-rural land use and related issues.

In the year 2014, 7 projects were approved under the programme.

5.9 (b) (iv) Indo-Israel Joint Research Programme

The Joint Research Programme aims to encourage research cooperation between Israeli and Indian scientists.

The programme is activated through an agreement of cooperation between the University Grant Commission (UGC) and the Israel Science Foundation (ISF), and is funded by the Indian and Israeli governments, through the two funding agencies, each funding its own scientists according to their respective regulations. The programme is open to all disciplines. The UGC and the Israel Science Foundation (ISF) invited proposals for Joint Research Projects and approved 21 Projects in the year 2014.

5.9(b)(v) Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme (INCP)

Indo-Norwegian Cooperation Programme in Higher Education and Research (INCP) is a new initiative that aims at enhancing higher education links between India and Norway. The programme is based on the MoU on Cooperation in Higher Education between India and Norway, signed on February 14, 2014, and on the Agreement on Academic Cooperation between the University Grants Commission (UGC), India, and the Norwegian Centre for International Cooperation in Education (SIU).

INCP is jointly financed through matching grants by the Indian Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA). UGC, India, and SIU, Norway, are the implementing agencies for this Programme.

INCP includes the establishment and administration of a portfolio of new projects aimed at furthering cooperation between higher educational institutions in India and Norway for the period from January 1, 2015 to December 12, 2017.

Eligibility: Public funded Institutions recognized under Sections 2 (f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, which are fit to receive development grants, and Institutions of National Importance funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development are eligible to apply.

Broad subject areas: Collaboration may be established in any academic discipline, but must deal with any of the following priority areas:

- Energy, especially clean energy
- Climate change, including ocean and arctic/polar research
- Health, especially public health
- Information technology, especially information security
- Urban planning and development
- Environment
- Biotechnology and the medical sciences
- Global development
- Development economics
- Marine sciences
- Management studies, especially in relation to innovation
- Social Sciences, Humanities and the Arts
- Geohazards
- Teacher education

Under INCP, UGC and SIU invited applications for Joint Research Projects, and selected 13 projects in the year 2014.


5.9(b) (vi) Australia-India Educational Council (AIEC)

Australia-India Education Council was established in 2011, focusing on four strands i.e. higher education and research, skills, quality assurance and recognition, and student mobility. Under the ambit of AIEC, **one project** has been awarded on **student mobility** to Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.

5.10 National Education Testing: Development of Human Resource for Teaching and Research

The University Grants Commission conducts a national level test, viz. National Eligibility Test(NET) to determine eligibility for Assistant Professorship and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research in several subjects of Humanities (including Indian and some foreign languages), Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences. The Test is conducted twice every year in the months of June and December in 79 subjects (excluding Paper-I) through 89 coordinating institutions spread across the country. Four new coordinating institutions were also engaged in this academic year to facilitate ease of access for the candidates.

The University Grants Commission started conducting the NET, specifically known as UGC-NET for award of Junior Research Fellowships in 1984 to ensure greater comparability as well as higher degree of validity and reliability in the field of research. Subsequently, as a consequence of National Education Policy adopted in 1986 and the recommendations of the Mehrotra Committee for the pay scales of the University/College teachers, this examination was also used as an instrument for declaring the candidates eligible for Assistant Professor in Indian universities/colleges from the year 1989 onwards. Earlier the UGC was holding this Test in Sciences as well as in Social Sciences including Humanities and languages. At the same time, the CSIR was also conducting a Test in the core science subjects. In order to avoid duplication of efforts in science subjects, the UGC intervened and entered into an understanding with the CSIR to select candidates for the UGC as well. Since then, the UGC has been conducting UGC-NETin Humanities and Social Sciences, Computer Science and Applications, Electronic Science, Forensic Science and Environmental Sciences, whereas the CSIR is conducting it in 5 core science subjects, viz., Chemical Sciences; Earth, Atmospheric, Ocean and

Planetary Sciences; Life Sciences; Mathematical Sciences and Physical Sciences under the Joint CSIR-UGC NET, also in the months of June and December.

Candidates who desire to pursue research and avail of fellowship from the UGC, can opt to appear for Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) either under the UGC-NET or under the Joint CSIR-UGC NET. The candidates with higher merit who qualify for JRF, can pursue research in the UGC recognized universities and institutions. They are also eligible for being considered for the post of Assistant Professor in the universities and colleges. An upward of 3200 JRFs is awarded by the UGC under each UGC-NET and around 1200 JRFs (subject to overall performance of candidates) through each Joint CSIR-UGC NET. Fellowship is available for a maximum period of five years.

Performance in NET

5.10(a): UGC-NET

In the UGC-NET held in June 2014, 4795 candidates were declared eligible for Junior Research Fellowship, while in the UGC-NET held in December 2014, which was outsourced to Central Board of Secondary Education, 3702 candidates have been declared eligible for Junior Research Fellowship.

A brief overview of candidates registered, appeared and qualified for eligibility for Assistant Professorship and Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in UGC-NET is presented in Table 5.10(a).

Graph 5.10(a): Performance in UGC NET (2014): Number of Candidates Registered, Appeared & Passed





During the year 2014-2015, an expenditure of ₹16,25,49,504/- was incurred on conducting the UGC-NET and on all ancillary activities of the NET Bureau. This excludes the expenditure incurred on payment of salaries to the regular employees of the UGC posted in the NET Bureau.

5.10(c) Concessions/Relaxation provided to the under-priviliged categories

i) In Fee

In conformity with the policy of Government of India, the University Grants Commission has been giving considerable concession in fee for applying in UGC-NET to all under-privileged sections of the society. While the fee for candidates belonging to the General category is ₹450/-, it is only ₹225/- for OBC candidates as per the Central Government list who are not covered under the creamy layer. The candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes and the persons with disability (PWD) are required to pay a nominal fee of ₹110/- only.

ii) In Age for JRF

The upper age limit for the General category in order to appear in JRF is 28 years. A relaxation of up to 5 years is provided to the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer)/PWD categories and to women applicants.

iii) In Eligibility Conditions for NET

1.	General Candidates	55% mark in Master's Degree (without rounding off)
2.	OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/PWD/SC/ST Candidates	50% mark in Master's Degree (without rounding off)

iv) In Qualifying Criteria for NET

The candidates are required to obtain the following minimum marks separately in Paper-II, Paper-II and Paper-III to be considered for final preparation of result as presented in Table 5.10 (c) (i):-

As is apparent, the minimum required marks for OBC, SC, ST and PWD categories in NET are lower than that for the General category. Even while compiling the result for Junior Research Fellowship (JRF), this principle is kept under consideration and it is ensured that the subject-wise final qualifying cut-offs for the under-privileged categories are lower than that for the General category.

5.10(d): Initiatives to promote transparency

The University Grants Commission, in its constant endeavour to promote transparency, undertook various measures to make the examination and evaluation process more interactive and less prone to subjectivity. These measures are outlined in the following paragraphs:

- (a) Paper-III, which was descriptive in nature till Dec. 2011 UGC-NET, was converted to objective mode from June 2012 UGC-NET onwards. This ensures parity in evaluation and obviates any possibility of subjectivity in assessing the scripts.
- (b) The candidates were not allowed to carry away the question papers with them till UGC-NET held in December 2011. In consonance with its policy of openness, the UGC took a decision to permit candidates to take away the question papers from June 2012 UGC-NET onwards.
- (c) The UGC modified its OMR Sheet in order to accommodate a carbonless copy of sheet with it. The candidates can take the carbonless copies of OMR sheets with them from June 2012 UGC-NET onwards.
- (d) Since June 2012 UGC-NET, the answer-keys of all the question papers are in public domain as they are uploaded on the UGC website. The candidates, having access to answer keys, question papers and carbonless copies of their OMR sheets, are enabled to check their answers. Online feedback is invited from candidates for more than a week regarding any discrepancies in the questions or any incorrect answers after uploading the answer keys and question papers. The feedback received from the candidates is re-examined by the Expert Committees and answer keys get updated accordingly. The result is prepared on the basis of updated answer keys.
- (e) In a first, the University Grants Commission has taken a landmark decision that the candidates having any grievances with regard to answer key(s) even after declaration of result of UGC-NET, could send a written request to the Head, UGC-NET Bureau, South Campus, University of Delhi, Benito Juarez Marg, New Delhi-110021, supporting their stand with standard books / literature along with a demand draft of ₹ 5000/- in favour of Secretary, UGC, within one month from the date of declaration of result. This unique practice was commenced from June, 2013 UGC-NET. Since the UGC had modified the structure (descriptive to objective) of Paper-III from June 2012 UGC-NET onwards, the candidates with similar grievances in June 2012 and December 2012 examinations were also provided this opportunity to file their grievances.

The request(s) so received were placed before the Expert Committee(s) for examination of grievances. The respective committees for subjects concerned examined the grievances of the candidates and, wherever required, updated the answer keys. Accordingly, the UGC has processed the data in the light of changed key(s) and qualified the additional candidates for JRF and/or eligibility for Assistant Professor as per already approved cut-off percentage for the subjects concerned. The result of previously qualified candidates for JRF and/or eligibility for Assistant Professor remained

unchanged. The subject-wise cum category-wise qualifying cut-offs for JRF and eligibility for Assistant Professor already approved for the above mentioned three UGC-NET remained unaltered.

This practice has been continued for June 2014 UGC-NET and CBSE has been requested to follow the same.

5.10(e): Recognition of UGC-NET Qualified Candidates in Public Sector

The UGC-NET has come to be recognized as an authentic source of talent pool in the last few years; being viewed with prestige among public sector undertakings of the Government of India. The University Grants Commission has been formally approached by a few premier government bodies, namely:

- i) Indian Oil Corporation Limited
- ii) Oil and Natural Gas Commission (ONGC) &
- iii) Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) to utilize the data of UGC-NET scores for recruiting its officers in some disciplines. The UGC has already conveyed its willingness to share its data in this regard.

5.10(f): State Eligibility Test (SET)

In accordance with the mandate of the Government of India through its notification dated 22-07-1988, the UGC, on the request of State Governments, proposed to have State Level Eligibility Test (SLET), now known as **State Eligibility Test (SET)** duly accredited by the UGC for a fixed term. The pattern of SET is same as that of NET conducted by the UGC.

In response to the proposal of some states/group of states to conduct SET, the University Grants Commission grants accreditation to them for conducting SET for Lectureship Eligibility only after examining their proposals. The performance of SET agencies is reviewed periodically by the UGC with the help of experts and their accreditation is renewed for a fixed period. The Head of UGC-NET Bureau is the permanent member of the Steering and Moderation Committees of the SET agencies, which are constituted to exercise overall supervision in conducting the tests and declaration of results.

The candidates who have cleared the State Eligibility Test (SET), accredited by UGC for Lectureship prior to 1st June 2002, are exempted from appearing in the NET. For SET scheduled in or after June 2002, the qualified candidates shall be eligible to apply for the post of Lecturer/Assistant Professor only in the universities/colleges situated in the state from where they have cleared their SET. However, such candidates are also eligible to apply for NET, if they so desire.

- vi) Uttarakhand
- vii) West Bengal

In addition, the following states / group of states received accreditation from the UGC to conduct further State Eligibility Tests:

- i) Maharashtra & Goa
- ii) Jammu & Kashmir

The State of Himachal Pradesh, which had the UGC accreditation to conduct SET, did not conduct it this year.

The expenditure for conducting SET is borne by the respective SET agencies.

5.11 Travel Grant


The Travel Grant scheme is for providing financial assistance to permanent teachers and librarians of colleges and vice-chancellors of state universities, deemed to be universities and central universities, recognised under section 2(f) and 12 B of the UGC Act. The objective of the Scheme is to encourage the college teachers to present research papers at international conferences conducted by foreign educational institutions abroad and to study the working mechanism of higher education in those countries. In addition, this facility is available to the permanent teachers of Institutions of National Importance with a cap of 10% of the total approved cases in a year. The Commission members and the UGC Officers at the level of Education Officer/Under Secretary and above are also eligible to apply under this Scheme. The maximum age limit for College Teachers/College Librarians/UGC Officers is up to the age of superannuation and for Vice-Chancellors and Commission Members while they are still in position.

The permanent Teachers and Librarians of the Colleges enlisted under Section 2 (f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, are being provided with 100% grant for travel, registration fee, per diem allowance and visa fee, etc. once in a period of three years. Whereas, the Vice-chancellors of State Universities, deemed to be Universities and Central Universities recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act,1956, Commission Members, UGC Officers and SC/ST/OBC (non creamy layer) College Teachers will be provided financial assistance on 100% basis once in a period of two years. Applications for assistance under the UGC Travel Grant Scheme are to be submitted two months prior to the commencement of the Conference alongwith research paper to be presented and acceptance letter from the organizers of the Conference.

Proposals received under the said Scheme are evaluated by the Travel Grant Committee constituted by the Chairman, UGC, and the recommendations given by the subject Experts are being considered by the Commission.

5.12 Inter University Centres (IUCs)

The University Grants Commission has been establishing Inter University Centres (IUCs) since 1984 under Section 12(ccc) of the UGC Act, 1956. The Inter University Centres are autonomous bodies within the University system to provide centrally the state-of-the-art equipment and facilities, which are not generally available at many Universities due to cost factor, for the benefit of researchers working in different Universities. So far, the UGC has established 8 Centres mainly in the field of Science, Technology& Education. The Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC), New Delhi, (formerly Nuclear Science Centre) was the 1st such Centre established in 1984 in New Delhi. The main objectives for establishing these Inter University Centres are:-

- to provide common advanced centralized facilities/services for Universities which are not able to invest heavy investments in infrastructure and other inputs;
- to play a vital role in offering the best expertise in each field to teachers and researchers across the country;
- to provide access for the research community and teaching faculty to the state-of-the-art equipment and excellent library facilities which are comparable to International standards.

The UGC is also instrumental in producing more than a thousand educational films and programmes through various Educational Multimedia Centres established in selected Universities and colleges in the country under the guidance and co-ordination of Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), New Delhi. The 1st countrywide classroom (CWCR) programme was telecasted on the National Network on 15th August, 1984.



Highlights of various Inter University Centres

5.12(i): Inter University Accelerator Centre-New Delhi

The major activities of the Centre are research and development in the area of Accelerator Physics, Nuclear Physics, Materials Science, Atomic Physics, Radiation Biology and allied areas.

The year 2014-15 has seen expansion of activities of the Centre in several directions. Currently the user base consists of faculties and students from 69 universities, 41 colleges and 44 national laboratories. The pelletron accelerator maintained an uptime of 96% with 53.10% time utilized for conducting experiments.

The target groups are the Ph.D. students and Faculty of Universities and Colleges through-out the country. Presently, the facilities of IUAC, New Delhi, are being utilized by the 83 Universities, 54 Colleges & 63 National Laboratories. In addition 100 Ph.Ds had been produced by the Centre and many high quality research papers has been published in international journals.

5.12(ii): IUCAA, Pune

It was set up by the UGC in 1988 as an autonomous centre of excellence to help initiate, nurture and grow teaching, research and development activities in Astronomy and Astrophysics in the university sector.

The basic objectives and target of the Centre are (1) Basic Research, (2) Advanced Research workshops & schools, (3) Visitors and Associates Programmes, (4) Refresher courses and M. Sc.- Ph.D. Prog., (5) Helping Nucleation of A & A in Universities, (6) Interaction with GMRT, (7) Guest Observer Programme, (8) Science Popularization.

During 2010-11, there were about 700 visitors, including foreigners, teachers & students from various Universities / Colleges across the country who used the facilities of IUCAA, Pune. Apart from this 76 Visiting Associates of 50 Indian Colleges/Universities are also enjoying the benefit of Center under Associate-ship Programme.

5.12(iii): UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research, Indore

The main objectives of the IUC DAE are (i) to provide all the possible support to the students & teachers from the Universities & Institutions of higher learning for making use of the major research facilities of the deptt. of Atomic Energy, (ii) to initiate celebrative research programme between the University researches and the DAE Scientists, (iii) to provide facilities for basic research in the fields of materials science, Nuclear physics, condensed matter physics and other related fields.

The teachers and Ph.D. Students from various universities situated in different parts of the country are using the DAE facilities and in-house facilities under short-term or long-terms (3 years) collaborative research scheme. Currently, the DAE facilities are being utilized by 300 universities/institutions across the country.

5.12(iv): INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar

This Centre was created to provide networking of various libraries in the Universities and Colleges in the country. The purpose was to establish and promote communication facilities & to improve the transfer of information from one institution to another. The basic idea of this Centre was that it would provide free access to books and journals

available in a particular library to other users in the country. In view of the fact that the cost of journals and books have been increasing day by day, it was not possible for every University and College to subscribe and buy the books. It has certainly made the users conscious of the fact that they should utilize such facilities in order to carry out their academic activities. It seems that the Centre is yet to meet its objectives, which was set forth when it was established.

Digital Repository in Universities and Colleges

The UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium was formaly launched in December, 2003, by Honorable Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the then President of India, soon after providing the Internet Connectivity to the Universities in the year 2003 under the UGC-Infonet programme. The Consortium proved to be a recipe for University Libraries that have been discontinuing subscription of scholarly journals because of 'serial crises' which refers to exponential and continuing increase in subscription cost of scholarly journals. The crises is a result of rise in cost of journals much faster than the rate of inflation, increase in the number of journals and the paucity of funds available to the libraries.

The benefit of subscription to e-resources could also be extended to the Colleges, to begin with the Colleges for Potential with Excellence (CPE) and Autonomous Colleges. The Consortium also plans to launch its 'Associate Membership Programme' wherein Private Universities and other research organizations would be welcomed to join the Consortium for selected e-resources.

The Centre provides unified online catalogue of books, theses and journals available in major university libraries in India.

The Centre developed state- of-the art Integrated Library Management Sortware.

The Centre provides access to electronic journals and electronic books to eligible colleges.

Shodhganga

Online submission of doctoral theses and dissertations by research scholars in an open access digital repository is made possible.

5.12(v): CEC/Media Centres

To produce quality programmes indigenously and on sustained basis for countrywide classroom (CWCR), the UGC set up Media Centres in premier Universities of India. The academicians working in various departments of universities and scientists in laboratories were invited to share their knowledge with the nation on the Indian Television Network from 6 Media Centres in the beginning. Their number has now grown to 22. The programme production facilities are in the form of Educational Media Research Centres (EMRCs) located in various parts of the country.

To undertake the challenging activities relating to countrywide classroom (CWCR) and use of electronic media in higher education the UGC established the Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) on May 26, 1993 under the UGC Act 12(ccc). CEC, as an Inter University Centre, has the responsibility to coordinate various activities including production of programmes, research, monitoring of telecast, quality control and other related matters with

Media Centres, UGC and Doordarshan as well as for overall management related to the broadcast of educational programmes.

5.12 (vi): National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC)

The National Assessment Accreditation Council, Bangalore, was established in 1994 by the UGC as an Inter University Centre for accreditation and assessment of Universities and Colleges. The UGC has made the Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC mandatory. The NAAC has so far evaluated 853 Higher Education Institutions (806 Colleges and 47 Universites) were assessed and accredited during the reported period, thus bringing the total to 5947 HEIs accredited by the NAAC.

Vision

To make quality the defining element of higher education in India through a combination of self and external quality, evaluation, promotion and sustenance initiatives.

Mission

- to arrange for periodic assessment and accreditation of Institutions of Higher Education or Units thereof or specific academic programmes or projects;
- ii) to stimulate the academic environment for promotion of quality of teaching, learning and research in Higher education institutions;
- iii) to encourage self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations in higher education;
- iv) to undertake quality related research studies, consultancy and training programme; and
- v) to collaborate with other stakeholders of higher education for quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance.



and students for proper use and maintenance of Instruments, for conducting advance study programmes such as workshops, seminars for teachers, research workers from Universities, National Laboratory and Industries, etc. The Centre is being funded by the UGC on 100% basis from Plan to Plan

5.13 (ii): MST Radar Centre, Tirupati

The MST Radar Centre was established by the UGC to create scientific awareness about the potential of the Radar facility for advanced research in middle atmosphere dynamics and to attract bright and young researchers to make use of the MST Radar facilities. The UGC-SVU Centre for Radar Applications was established in the Deptartment of Physics, SriVenketeshwaraUniversity, Tirupati. The UGC-SVU Centre serves as a common platform for the University system in India for the exchange of scientific knowledge at the Centre. It is accessible to scientists and researchers from the Indian Universities working in the area of atmospheric science, especially with reference to MST Radar related studies.

5.13 (iii): Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla

The Indian Institute of Advanced Study (IIAS), Shimla, is an Institution established by "The Indian Institute of Advanced Study Society", Registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The Institute aims at promoting creative thought in areas of deep human significance, and provides an environment suitable for academic research in Humanities and Social Sciences.

To provide facilities, including financial assistance, for advanced study to teachers and other scholars for specified period is one of the important objectives of the Institute. Another objective is to organize meetings, lectures, symposia and conferences.

The Inter University Centre for Humanities and Social Sciences has been functioning in the Indian Institute of Advanced s Study, Shimla, since in 1991. The University Grants Commission and the Indian Institute of Advanced Study mutually agreed that collaboration between the two will be of immense benefit to promote academic interaction and growth for humanities and social sciences.

- 2. to bridge the gap between needy industries and laboratory research;
- 3. to cater to the needs of various institutions in India with regard to requirements of special crystal for research, etc.

Promotion of Research

6.1 Research Projects for Teachers: Major and Minor

Since early seventies, the UGC has been providing financial assistance to the permanent/regular, working/retired teachers in the universities and colleges for undertaking research in their chosen area(s).

Major Research Projects for Teachers

Research keeps the inquisitive minds vibrant and knowledge updated. The teacher working in the field of Higher Education has to perform three basic duties - Teaching, Research and Extension. Thus, the universities and colleges equipped with labs, libraries and other essential facilities are major training grounds for the Researchers. Since past early seventies the UGC has been providing financial assistance for the Research Proposals of the permanent/ regular, working/retired teachers in the Universities and Colleges which are enlisted under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. The Major Research Projects scheme enables them to carry out intensive and in-depth research studies in specific subject areas with their regular job or after superannuation. Research Project may be undertaken by an individual teacher or a group of teachers or by a department as a whole. It can also be undertaken by a retired teacher up to the age of 70, provided, the age at the time of applying is not more than 67 years. Priority is given to interdisciplinary research and inter-institutional collaborative research.


On receipt of online proposals, the same are screened & accessed by a Subject Expert Committee. The screened proposals are evaluated by the Subject Expert Committee through an interface discussion with the teacher concerned to find out the merit & viability of the proposals. The emphasis is on supporting such areas that cut across disciplines and subjects like Health, Gerontology, Environment, Bio- Technology, Stress Management, WTO & its impact on Economy, History of Science, Asian Philosophy, Defense and Strategic, Studies which include national security affairs, insurance and banking and many other areas as would be identified by subject experts.

The assistance is limited to ₹15.00 lakhs for Major Research Projects in Humanities and Social Sciences and ₹20.00 lakhs for Major Research Projects in Sciences including Engineering & Technology, Medicine, Pharmacy & Agriculture, etc.

The assistance provided for a Major Research Project includes funding for Equipment, Books and Journals, Chemicals, Contingencies, Travel & Field work, Hiring Technical Services, Fellowship to Research Personnel and other items needed for the project.

The duration of a Major Research Project is Three Years. Detailed guidelines of the scheme can be accessed on the UGC website. During the year 2014-15, 1017 new projects were recommended and the Mid-Term Evaluation was also done for 1473 ongoing projects of 2013, out of which the progress of 44 projects was not found satisfactory.

6.2 Research Awards / Research Scientist

6.2(i) Research Awards

The main objective of the Scheme is to provide an opportunity to permanent teachers of universities/institutions having doctorate degree to pursue research in their area(s) of specialization without undertaking any research guidance for a period of two years, extendable by one year on the recommendation of the expert committee in exceptional cases.

This award is given to only those lecturers, senior lecturers, selection-grade lecturers and professors who are under 45 years of age at the time of submission of their application. The age is relaxable by 5 years in the case of women, SC/ST, OBC (non-creamy layer), physically handicapped teachers. A teacher is eligible to avail of the Research Award only once. Selections are made for 100 slots in alternate years for all the disciplines of Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology based on the recommendations of an Expert Committee constituted by the UGC.

The pattern of financial assistance available is as under:

- Full Salary of the awardee with admissible allowances except CPF/GPF contribution.
- Research grant to meet expenditure on books and journals, chemicals and equipment, for the entire period as under:

Humanities & Social Sciences - ₹2.00 lakhs

Sciences/Engineering & Technology - ₹3.00 lakhs

Applications are invited through on line mode every alternate year. Applications received under this Scheme are scrutinized by the Screening Committee. Later, the shortlisted candidates are called for interview before the Selection Committee constituted by the UGC. The selection for the Award is based on the recommendations of an Expert Committee. An expenditure of ₹15.48 Crore was incurred during the reporting year 2014-15.

6.2(ii) Research Scientist

The Scheme of Research Scientists was originally initiated in 1983 to attract meritorious scientists of Indian origin, who may be working abroad, with a view to promoting high quality research in Science, Engineering/Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences at three levels:

- 1. Research Scientist 'A' (Lecturer)
- 2. Research Scientist 'B' (Reader)
- 3. Research Scientist 'C' (Professor)

At present, 67 Research Scientists are working in various institutions though this Scheme has been discarded. The Commission in its 503rdmeeting has taken a decision to consider payment of Pension & Family Pension to the UGC Research Scientists directly to the Pensioners by the Finance Division, UGC, as was done in the case of UGC Pensioners/family pensioners. An expenditure of ₹10.10 Crore was incurred during the reporting year 2014-15.

6.3 Post Doctoral Fellowships

6.3(i) Post-Doctoral Fellowships for SC/ST

The objective of the fellowship scheme is to provide fellowships to SC/ST candidates, who have obtained a doctorate degree and have published research work to their credit, for doing advanced research in their chosen areas. For this purpose, the UGC has been providing 100 slots every year for them.

6.3(ii) Post Doctoral Fellowship for Women

The objective of the Scheme is to provide an opportunity to the unemployed women having Ph.D. degree, who intend to pursue post-doctoral research. At present, there are 100 slots per annum.

The candidates having a doctorate degree in the relevant subject and 55% marks at UG level and 60% marks at PG level in case of general/open category and 50% marks at UG level and 55% marks at PG level for reserved categories (SC/ST/OBC/PH) candidates are eligible for the fellowship. The upper age limit is 55 years for general category candidates and 60 years for SC/ST/OBC/PH candidates.

The tenure of the award is five years with no provision for further extension. Fellowship under this Scheme has been revised w.e.f. 01.12.2014. The pattern of financial assistance is same as given under 6.3(i).

Applications are invited through on line mode every year. Applications received under this Scheme is scrutinized by the Screening Committee. Later, the shortlisted candidates are called for interview before the Selection Committee constituted by the UGC. Selection under this Scheme is based on the recommendations of an Expert Committee. An expenditure of ₹ 20.67 Crore was incurred during the reporting year 2014-15.

6.3(iii) Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Post- Doctoral Fellowship in Humanities & Social Sciences, including languages

The objective of the Scheme is to provide an opportunity to carry out advanced studies and research in Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages, in Indian Universities and Colleges recognized under section 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956, and in Institutes of National Importance established by the Central/State Government. The total no. of slots available under this Scheme is 200 per year.

The candidates having doctorate degree in the relevant subject, 55% marks at UG level and 60% marks at PG level in case of general/open category and 50% marks at UG level and 55% marks at PG level for reserved categories (SC/ST/OBC/PH candidates) are eligible for the fellowship. The fellowship is open for full- time research work to young researchers below 35 years of age. (Relaxation of 5 years for SC/ST/OBC/PH/Women candidates).

The tenure of the award is three years with no provision for further extension. The pattern of financial assistance is same as given under 6.3(i).

Applications are invited through on line mode every year. Applications received under this Scheme are scrutinized by the Screening Committee. Later, the shortlisted candidates are called for interview before the Selection Committee constituted by the UGC. Selection under this Scheme is based on the recommendations of an Expert Committee. 180 candidates have been selected during 2014-15. An amount of ₹12.00 crore has been released to Canara Bank for making payment in favour of selected candidates. So far an expenditure of ₹2.17 crore has been disbursed upto May, 2015, as reported by Canara Bank.

6.3(iv) Dr. D.S. Kothari Post Doctoral Fellowship

Under this Scheme financial assistance is provided to pursue Post-doctoral research in Basic Sciences / Medical / Engineering and Technology. The selections are made through-out the year. There is a designated website for applying for the fellowship *ugcdskpdf.unipune.ac.in*. The selection process is completed within 6-weeks of the receipt of individual application. The candidates who have either received a Ph. D degree or submitted their Ph. D thesis are eligible to apply. Till date 1588 candidates have been awarded the fellowship and 875 PDFs are in position. Since January 2013 the fellowship disbursing is through the Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) scheme (where the fellowship is transferred directly to the beneficiaries' bank account).

6.3(v) UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship

With a view to providing an opportunity for continuance of research contributions in Basic Science Research by talented Science and Technology teachers who are nearing superannuation in State Universities , the UGC has started a Scheme called, "UGC-BSR Faculty Fellowship". The main objective of the Scheme is to facilitate talented teachers in Science & Technology who are at the verge of superannuation to continue their productive research for an additional period of three years after superannuation and to play a research mentorship role for young researchers and Ph.D. students.

Financial Assistance

- The fellowship carries an amount of ₹46,500/- p.m. (w.e.f. 01.12.2014) which is exclusive of the pension and / or other retirement benefits.
- A contingency grant of ₹3.00 lakhs p.a. out of which a sum ₹50,000/- may be utilized by the research scholars.
- The awardee is to execute an undertaking to UGC along with the University for joining the fellowship and to abide by the norms and guidelines of the UGC pertaining to this fellowship from time to time and send the biannual progress reports.

An amount of ₹3.74 crores was released to 59 BSR Faculty Fellows

6.3(vi) Emeritus Fellowship

The main objective of the Scheme is to provide an opportunity to superannuated teachers of all recognized universities and colleges under the UGC Act, to pursue active research in their respective field of specialization.

The target group is highly qualified and experienced, superannuated or likely to be superannuated within six months, teachers of recognized institutions. The eligibility for this fellowship is based on the quality of research and published work contributed by the teachers in his or her service career. The awardee can work with a well defined time bound action plan upto the age of 70 years or upto two years (non-extendable), whichever is earlier. The number of slots available under this Scheme are 200 (100 for science stream and 100 for humanities) at any one given time basis. The fellowship under this Scheme has been revised w.e.f. 01.12.2014. The pattern of fellowship is as under:

Honorarium : ₹31,000/- p.m. for two years (non extendable)

Contingency grant (non-lapsable): ₹50,000 p.a.

The contingency grant may be utilized for secretarial assistance, travel within the country connected with the research project, stationery, postage, consumables, books and journals and equipments. Foreign visit is also allowed in connection with the approved research work of the awardee limited to once in a year with the prior approval/no objection of the institution where the project work is being undertaken alongwith that of UGC. This is further subject to no financial liability on the part of the UGC. The Emeritus Fellows would be entitled to such other privileges including medical facilities as are available to the university faculty members, except housing.

Applications under Emeritus Fellowship are invited through on line mode and Fellowship is awarded on the basis of recommendation of the Expert Committee constituted by the Commission for this purpose. For the selection, preference is given to Women/SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy-layer)/Physically Handicapped and Minorities. 6.4(i) JRF for Indian Nationals

Award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences

To provide an opportunity to the scholars to undertake advanced studies and research leading to M.Phil/Ph.D. Degrees in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages, the University Grants Commission provides JRF to

the candidates who qualify National Eligibility Testing (NET/JRF) of the UGC and the UGC-CSIR. The total tenure of fellowship is for five years. With effect from 01.12.2014 the rate of JRF / SRF fellowship has been enhanced from ₹16,000/- to ₹25,000/- and ₹18,000/- to ₹28,000/- respectively. The other terms and conditions remain the same as per the XII plan Guidelines. The pattern of the fellowship is as under:-



6.4(iii) Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowships for SC/ST Candidates

The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment and Ministry of Tribal Affairs have entrusted and funded the UGC for implementation of the Scheme of Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowships for SC and ST candidates by providing 2667 slots per year, i.e., 2000 for SC category and 667 for ST category. The number of slots for SC has been increased from 1333 to 2000 since 01 April, 2010.

The main objective is to minimize the social disparities in the field of Higher Education. The Central Government through the UGC provides 2667 Research Fellowships for SC/ST candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to M.Phill / Ph.D. Degrees in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences, including languages, and Engineering & Technology. The tenure of the fellowship is for five years.

The pattern of financial assistance for RGNF-SC/ST candidates is the same w.e..f. 01.12.2014 as given under 6.4(i).



6.4(iv) Maulana Azad National Fellowships for Minority Students

The objective of the Scheme is to provide integrated five year fellowships in the form of financial assistance to students from minority communities, as notified by the Central Government, to pursue higher studies such as M.Phil and Ph.D.

The Scheme will cover all Universities/Institutions recognized by the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) & Section 3 of the UGC Act. The fellowship holders under this Scheme will be known as MOMA scholars. The number of slots available under the fellowship Scheme is 756 every year. 



6.4(v) Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship for Students with Disabilities

The UGC has been entrusted the Scheme of **Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship for Students with Disabilities** by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Disability Affairs, Govt. of India, New Delhi, since 2012 to increase opportunities to students with disabilities for pursuing higher education leading to degrees such as M. Phil. and Ph.D. The Scheme took effect from 1st April 2012. The Scheme caters to the requirements of the students with disabilities for pursuing research degrees in universities, research institutions and scientific institutions in India. There are 200 slots for every year for all the subjects, out of which there is a provision of reservation of 15% for Scheduled Castes and 7½% for Scheduled Tribes for award of fellowships respectively under the Scheme. Graph 6.4(v): Year-wise number of Candidates selected under the scheme of Rajiv Gandhi National








6.4(vi) National Fellowship for Students of Other Backward Classes (OBC)

The UGC has been implementing the Scheme of National Fellowship (NF) for Other Backward Classes (OBC) as entrusted & funded by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, New Delhi since 2014. The Scheme is open to candidates who belong to Other Backward Classes (OBC) and wish to pursue higher studies such as regular and full- time M.Phil. and Ph.D degrees in Sciences, Humanities, Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology. There are 300 slots for award of fellowship every year for all the subjects for consideration of applications received through On-line submission from research scholars belonging to the OBC category. There is a provision of 3% reservation for slots for consideration of award of fellowship to research scholars from disabled category who belongs to OBC category. 

6.4(vii) Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship for Research in Social Sciences

Keeping Swami Vivekananda's ideas of women education and to achieve and promote girls' education, the UGC has introduced Swami Vivekananda Single Girl Child Fellowship for Research in Social Sciences during 2014-15 with an aim to compensate direct costs of higher education especially for such girls who happen to be the only girl child in the family.

The girl students upto the age of 40 years and who have taken admission in regular, full-time Ph. D programmes in Social Sciences in Universities/Institutes and also happen to be the only girl child in the family may apply for this fellowship. The number of slots for this fellowship is 300 per year against the advertisement. The selection is made by the Expert Committee as per the procedure of the Commission.

The financial assistance available under the Scheme is as follows:

- ₹ 12,400/- p.m. for first two years
- ₹ 15,500/- p.m. for third and fourth year (Extendable for fifth year in exceptional circumstances)

65 candidates have been selected during 2014-15. An amount of ₹ 1.50 crore has been released to Canara Bank for making payment in favour of selected candidates. So far an expenditure of ₹ 4.46 lakh has been disbursed upto May, 2015 as reported by Canara Bank.

6.4(viii) BSR Fellowship (RFSMS)

The Research Fellowship in Sciences for Meritorious Students (RFSMS) BSR Fellowship Scheme of the UGC is open to candidates who are selected for registering in the Ph.D. programme of the university through a procedure outlined already in the UGC notification by a regular admission procedure. The objective of the BSR Scheme is to provide opportunities to meritorious candidates to undertake advanced studies and research leading to Ph.D. degrees in sciences.

The candidates are selected for registering in the Ph.D. programme of the university through the procedure outlined above in Universities with Potential for Excellence/Centres with Potential for Excellence / Centres of Advance Studies and Department of Special Assistance identified by UGC. The registration for Ph.D. may follow after the admissions. Till date 9300 fellowships have been allocated to SAP/Non-SAP departments and 8145 JRFs are in position. Since December 2013, the fellowship is being disbursed through the Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) scheme(where the fellowship is transferred directly to the beneficiaries' bank account).



6.5(ii) Indira Gandhi Post-Graduate Scholarship Scheme for Single Girl Child

The Govt. of India has taken various steps to uplift the status of women by implementing various schemes/ programmes including free education for girls, declaration of elementary education as a basic human right of every child. The Indira Gandhi Post-graduate Scholarship for Single Girl Child Scheme is one such Scheme, with an aim to compensate direct cost of girl education at all levels, especially for such girls who happened to be the only girl child in the families.

The objectives of the Scheme are to support Post-graduate education of single girl child in non-professional courses and to recognize the value of observance of small family norms.

The Scheme was started with the postgraduate academic session 2005-07. Only single girl child of her parents and who has taken admission in regular, full- time first year Masters degree course (Non-professional course) in any recognized university or a postgraduate college is eligible for the scholarship. The scholarship is available for the full duration of the course. Girl students upto the age of 30 years at the time of admission in PG courses are eligible. All eligible girl children will get the scholarship. There is no cap restriction on the number of scholarships.

It is expected of the institutions where the students had taken admission in the first year PG course that no tuition fees will be charged by the institute from the girl students to pursue PG degree course in Universities/ Colleges/Institutions covered under sections 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act. Graph 6.5(ii): PG Academic Session wise number of Girls benefitted - Indira Gandhi Post -Graduate Scholarship for Single Girl Child






6.5(iii) P.G. Scholarship for GATE Qualified Students of M.E/M. Tech/M. Pharma

The University Grants Commission is implementing the Scheme of PG scholarship for GATE/GPAT Qualified M.E/M. Tech/M.Pharm courses and integrated dual degree programme. The objective of the Scheme is to help and attract young talented graduate students to pursue technical education at Post Graduate level in Higher Educational Institutions.

6.5(iv) Post-graduate Merit Scholarships for University Rank Holders at Undergraduate level

For India to emerge as a powerful nation there is an urgent need to attract young and talented boys and girls to Post-Graduate education by way of providing them good incentives in the form of scholarships. The UGC, therefore, initiated and implemented a Post-graduate Merit Scholarship for University Rank Holders at Undergraduate level to build up academic excellence at Post-graduate level across the colleges and universities in the country.

The first and second rank holders at Under-graduate level and admitted in any Post-graduate course are eligible for this scholarship.

The total number of scholarships in the first academic year would be 3000. The duration of the scholarship will be two years only. The tenure of the scholarship will not be extendable beyond two years under any circumstances.









Scheme-wise Number of Beneficiaries: 2014-15




6.7 Incentivisation of Teachers, Subject/Discipline based Associations for Organisation of various Academic & Research Activities.

6.8 Free Education for Sports Medal Winners/Participants of National/ International Events

Free Education for Sports Medal Winners/Participants of National/ International Events has been introduced under XII Plan in the UGC. The objective of the Scheme is to provide financial assistance to the medal winners in national games or participants in recognized international sporting events recognized by World University Service, International Olympic Committee and Olympic Committee of Asia (OCA)\ elite sports persons who are studying in Universities/ Colleges leading to all the full-time regular courses, including PG Diploma and other professional courses.

The financial assistance on reimbursement basis is given to the universities/colleges/institutions of national importance on the basis of the details received individually depending upon the eligibility of the students as per the UGC guidelines. The university will be responsible for submitting all relevant documents duly attested and verified as per the proforma prescribed by the UGC. So far, an expenditure of ₹ 40.00 lakh has been reimbursed during 2014-15 to the 70 beneficiaries under the Scheme.

6.9 Basic Scientific Research in Universities

The M/HRD had set up a Task Force for rejuvenation of Basic Scientific Research in Indian Universities under the Chairmanship of Prof. M.M. Sharma, former Director, UICT, Mumbai. The M/HRD constituted the First Empowered Committee in May, 2005 under the Chairmanship of Prof. M.M. Sharma, former Director, UICT, Mumbai for implementation of recommendations of the Task Force. The Committee worked for almost 8 years till March, 2014. Subsequently, The Second Empowered Committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Dr. Anil Sahasrabudhe, in November, 2014 for implementation of recommendations of the Task Force.

Based on the recommendations of the Task Force the following Schemes are being implemented by the UGC under the guidance of Empowered Committee.

6.(1) Faculty Recharge Programme (FRP)

Operation Faculty Recharge was launched in the year 2011, under which 1000 faculty positions have been created and to be filled at national level through global advertisement. A Cell has been created in JNU for implementation of this Scheme with Prof. R.P. Gandhi as National Co-ordinator and Prof. Sudesh Nangia as Associate Co-ordinator of the Cell. At present **163** faculties, i.e. Professors / Assistant Professors / Associate Professors have been selected, out of which 77 are in position.

The tenure of appointment of faculties i.e. Professor / Associate Professor / Assistant Professor is 5 years, following a peer review. 'Faculty Recharge' positions can, in principle, be carried through to superannuation (at 65 years). There is provision for mid-term evaluation during each of the five year tenures.

Financial Assistance

Salary: The UGC-faculty receives emoluments on a par with those of the Central University faculty.

Additional Grants:

Faculty positions carry a start-up grant of ₹7.00 Lakhs for research.

During the year i.e. 2014-2015 so far ₹6.92 crores was released in respect of Salaries and Start- up Grant to 72 Selectees from various Universities/Institutions.

6.10 Networking Research Centres: Summer-Winter School

The Networking Research Centers are established with the following objectives:

- 1. Research, training and skills development of the faculty and research scholars through periodic discussion, workshop and summer / winter schools.
- 2. Capacity building by adopting faculty and departments for augmenting their research skills and to mentor them.
- 3. Hosting and facilitating researchers from other institutes / universities to carryout key experiments.
- 4. Augmentation of information resource facility of the department to provide quality research information to other institutes / researchers.
- 5. Enhancement and building state- of- the- art in-house research infrastructure and other research facilities in the department.

The following **10** departments were approved by the Empowered Committee for the establishment of Networking Research Centres under the BSR Programme.

During the XII plan i.e. 2014-2015 so far ₹7.61 crores was released for Two Departments.

6.11 Start- up Grant for Newly Recruited Faculty

Under this Scheme, all teachers who are newly appointed at the level of Assistant Professor with Ph.D. degree with minimum two research publications in approved/cited journals are eligible to receive financial support. The Assistant Professor should apply within a period of six months from the date of joining the post in the Department/University against permanent post in the faculties of Basic Science, Engineering and Technology following the specified procedure of the university.

An amount of ₹25.48 Crores was released to 425 newly appointed faculty members for various Universities / Institutions.

6.12 One- Time Grant to Teachers under BSR Programme

Under this One – Time Grant Scheme, ₹7.00 lakh is provided for a teacher to do research. The grant could be utilized for minor equipment, chemicals, contingency and field work.

The purpose of providing one-time grant to teachers is to pursue their research in their specialized areas. The minimum eligibility criteria is as given below:-

- At least two years service should be there before the date of superannuation.
- A minimum of 15 Ph.Ds produced during the service period on the date of application and at least 5 Ph.Ds during the last five years.

- Should have successfully completed at least five sponsored research projects funded by the National / International funding agencies and / or industries with details of quantum of funds received.
- Details of research projects and Ph.D candidates currently handling.
- A one page justification for requesting "One- Time Grant" from the UGC with specific plan for utilizing the grant.

An amount of ₹2.18 crores was released to 33 teachers who are pursuing their research in various Indian Universities / Institutions.

6.13 Development Grant for Strengthening of Infrastructure in College and University Science Departments

To promote excellence in research, development grant for strengthening infrastructure in terms of power supply, water supply, safety equipments, working tables in labs and other infrastructure required for research at PG level in Sciences, Bio-Sciences, Agricultural Sciences and Engineering Sciences has been provided to college and university departments.



Gender and Social Equity

7.1 Development of Women's Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges & Capacity Building of Women Managers in Higher Education

The objective of the Scheme of Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges and Capacity Building of Women Managers in Higher Education is to strengthen and sustain the Women Studies Centres in universities by establishing them as statutory departments in the university system, as also to facilitate their own capacity to network with other constituents such that they are mutually reinforcing as well as synergizing one another and also to increase the participation of Women in Higher Education Management for better gender balance. The thrust is to develop field projects for action, research, evaluation and enhancement of knowledge and partnership across boundaries of caste/class/religion, community and occupations and to involve many more people and many more organizations in the network as well as to ensure the focus, and the quality of this newly emerging discipline is maintained

The UGC has approved the guidelines of the Scheme which are available on the UGC website at http://www.ugc.ac.in/pdfnews/8004557_WS-Guidelines_XII-Plan_Revised-Final.pdf

Up to 31.03.2015, as many as 153 Women Study Centres had been established and are functioning in the Higher Education System.

Under the Scheme of Capacity Building & Women Managers in Higher Education, 205 Sensitization/Awareness/ Motivation (SAM), 22 training of Trainers (ToT), 13 Management Skill Enhancement Module (MSEM) & 5 Refresher workshop have been organized by various Universities and Centres during the XII Plan.

Grants of ₹27.00 Crore had been released under the Scheme of Development of Women Studies in Indian Universities during the XII Plan till 3.03.2015. Out of it, Grant of ₹9.54 Crore has been released during 2014-15.

7.2 Establishment of Centres in Universities for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy

Social exclusion not only generates tension, violence and disruption, but also perpetuates inequality and deprivation in Society. In India, certain communities such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and religious minorities experience systemic exclusion in the matter of taking advantages of development. Social exclusion is a complex and multidimensional concept having social, cultural, political and economic ramifications. The consequences of macroeconomic policies such as poverty, unemployment and involuntary migration exclude the victims from economic, cultural, and political activities. The primary space where 'exclusion' can be studied, understood, and first transcended, are our universities, which can and must act as a beacon for society. The UGC has therefore decided to support research on the issue of social exclusion, which has theoretical as well as policy importance. The idea is to establish a number of teaching –cum-research Centers in Universities to pursue these themes. The UGC provides financial assistance on 100% basis to the selected universities for proper functioning of the Centres for recurring & non-recurring items as per guidelines.

Since the inception of this Scheme, the UGC has established 35 Centres in different universities.

UGC released Grant of ₹ 777.00 Lakh to the Centres during 2014-15

7.3 Establishment of Special Cells for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

To safeguard the interests of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes - the most deprived groups of the Indian Society, the constitution provides reservation in various services under Central and State Governments.

The main objective is not to just provide jobs to increase their representation in services, but to improve their social & educational status, so that they can have their rightful place in the main-stream of the society. As per the constitutional provisions, the reservation for Scheduled Castes is 15% and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes at the national level and the reservation in States is provided depending on their population in the State concerned.

The Commission introduced the Scheme of Establishment of SC/ST Cells in Universities in the year 1983.

The Revised guidelines of the above Scheme for the XIIth Plan are under consideration of the Commission.

7.4 Standing Committee on SC/ST.

The SC/ST Cell of the UGC monitors the effective implementation of the Reservation Policy for SC, ST and PWD candidates in admissions, and teaching and non-teaching posts in universities and colleges. A Standing Committee on SC/ST has been constituted to oversee the effective implementation of the reservation policy in universities and colleges. The Committee is represented by academic experts, former Vice-Chancellors and distinguished persons in the field of higher education. The Standing Committee meets from time to time and monitors the status of reservations and the backlog in vacancies in universities and colleges. The meeting of the Standing Committee is organized once in year. In the meeting, the main focus is on the evaluation of reservation policy based on statistical data in respect of admission, teaching and non-teaching staff and other related matters. The last meeting of the Standing Committee was held on 25-11-2014.

7.5 Coaching Schemes for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy Layer)/ Minorities.

7.5(a) Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) & Minorities Community Students

Remedial Coaching is to be organized at undergraduate/post-graduate level in order to improve & strengthen knowledge, academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects.

7.5(b) Coaching for NET/SET for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) & Minority Community Students

The main objective of the Scheme is to prepare SC/ST/OBC candidates and candidates from Minority communities for appearing in the NET or the SET exam.

7.5(c) Coaching Classes for entry in services for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) & Minority Community Students

The basic objective of the coaching Scheme is to prepare students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and Minority communities to get gainful employment in Group 'A', 'B' or 'C' Central services, State services or equivalent positions in the private sector.

Financial assistance for each of the above schemes is as under:

Ceiling of the grant for university:

Non-Recurring ₹5.00 lakh (One time) Recurring ₹7.00 per annum

Ceiling of the grant for college:


Non-Recurring ₹5.00 lakh (One time) (₹3.50 lakhs (one time) for NET/SET Coaching)

Recurring ₹2.00 per annum (₹1.50 per annum for NET/SET coaching)

Tenure: 5 years

During the XII Plan period so far 137 State Universities have been assisted under Coaching Scheme for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) / & Minority Community Students. Grant of ₹2195.67 Lakhs under the scheme has been released during XII Plan.

7.6 Committee to Study the Impact of the Coaching Schemes for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy Layer) / Minorities.

An Expert Committee has been constituted to study the Impact of coaching schemes related to SC, ST and OBC (non creamy layer) and Minorities. Two meetings of the Expert Committee were held on 12th November, 2014 and 21st January, 2015.

7.7 Equal Opportunity Cells in Universities/Colleges

To make Colleges and Universities more responsive to the needs and constraints of the disadvantaged social groups, the UGC had planned to establish Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) in Colleges and Universities to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programmes for these groups and to provide guidance and counseling in academic, financial, social and other matters. A one- time grant of ₹2.00 Lakhs will be provided for establishing the office of the EOC. The details of the grant paid during 2012-13 are as given below.

Eligibility

Financial assistance under the Scheme is available to such universities and colleges which come within the purview of Section 2(f) and fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

Ceiling of the grant for University



7.8 Facilities for Persons With Disabilities

The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including persons with disabilities. In the recent years, there have been vast and positive changes in the perception of the society towards persons with disabilities. It has been realized that a majority of persons with disabilities can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures.

The Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995, indicates that differently abled persons should have access to education at all levels. In higher education sector, the University Grants Commission has been supporting universities and colleges in the country and involving them in special education activities to empower differently abled persons.

The UGC, from time to time, has been conveying to the Universities and Deemed Universities, the policy decisions, including reservations in admissions and employment, of the Government of India pertaining to the persons with disabilities. In addition, the decisions taken and the guidelines framed at the level of the Commission in this regard have also been circulated to all universities for implementation. The Commission had also circulated the Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, to the universities requesting them to strictly follow the provisions contained therein.

Besides, the UGC is also implementing plan schemes for the benefit of persons with disabilities. The Chairman, UGC, has constituted a committee for monitoring the effective implementation of the reservation policy for Persons with Disabilities in employment and admission in Universities/ Colleges.

A meeting of the committee had been held on 29st April 2014.

7.8(i) Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN)

Objectives

The HEPSN Scheme is basically meant for creating an environment at the higher education institutions to enrich higher education learning experiences for differently-abled persons. Creating awareness about the capabilities of

differently-abled persons, construction aimed at improving accessibility, purchase of equipment to enrich learning, etc., are the broad categories of assistance under this Scheme.

Eligibility

Financial assistance under the Scheme is available to such universities and colleges which come within the purview of section 2(f) and fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

Ceiling of the grant for University

Component I ₹1.18 lakh per annum Component II ₹10.00 lakh per Plan Component III ₹8.00 lakh per Plan

Ceiling of the grant for College

Component I ₹98,000/- per annum Component II ₹5.00 lakh per Plan Component III ₹1.50 lakh per Plan

Tenure: 5 years

7.8(ii) Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE)

The Teacher Preparation in Special Education (TEPSE) Scheme is meant for assisting Departments of Education to launch special education teacher's preparation programmes to prepare special teachers to teach children with disabilities in both special and inclusive settings. The Scheme provides financial assistance to offer B.Ed. and M.Ed. Degree courses with specialization in one of the disability areas.

Objectives

The specific objective of the TEPSE Scheme is to encourage Universities to start M.Ed. special education courses to prepare teacher educators to serve in higher education institutions offering special education teacher preparation courses.

Eligibility

Higher education institutes offering special education course at B.Ed. and or M.Ed. level are given assistance under the following conditions:

- 1. The university department should have the approval of the Rehabilitation Council of India for starting the specific teachers preparation course in special education.
- 2. The university should have a model school where differently abled children are admitted. In the absence of its own model school, the university should produce in writing the acceptance of a special/integrated school in the vicinity to function as a model school.
- 3. The university should have a minimum of five years of experience in running B.Ed. level teacher preparation courses.
- 4. The university should have constituted an expert committee involving faculty members from the university, experts in the field and differently-abled persons themselves. The committee should meet at least once a year to review the activities related to the scheme(s) concerned.
- 5. University applying for the Scheme should have been approved by the UGC under section 2(f) & 12B.

Financial Assistance

₹2.00 Lakhfor B.Ed special education or M.Ed special education courses only (Plan period) ₹4.00 lakh to run both B.Ed and M.Ed special education courses only (Plan period).

Tenure – 5 years

7.8(iii) Financial Assistance to Visually Challenged Teachers

Objectives

The Scheme has been formulated to help visually challenged permanent teachers to pursue teaching and research with the help of a Reader and by using teaching and learning aids by way of providing Reader's Allowance and funds for purchase of Braille books, recorded materials, etc. The objective of the scheme is to provide facility to help visually challenged permanent teachers to achieve self- dependence by using various aids for teaching, learning and research. Allowance to visually challenged permanent teachers will be ₹18000/- p.a.

Eligibility

Financial assistance under the Scheme is available to such universities and colleges which come within the purview of Section 2(f) and fit to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956.

Ceiling of the grant for University/College

₹36,000/- per annum

Relevant and Value Based Education

8.1 Introduction of Career Oriented Courses in Universities and Colleges

The vocationalisation programme at the undergraduate level initiated during the Eighth Plan year (1994-95) has since been redesigned in 2003-04 under a modified Scheme of Career Orientation to Education/ Career Oriented Programme/ Career Oriented Courses.

The objective of the Scheme is to ensure that the graduates who pass out after completing these courses have knowledge, skills and aptitude for gainful employment in the wage sector in general, and self employment in particular, so as to reduce the pressure on institutions of higher learning for Master's Degree programmes. These courses run parallel to the conventional B.A., B.Com and B.Sc. degree programmes. The courses offered are in the form of Certificate/Diploma/ Advance Diploma which students may opt parallel to their conventional B.A. / B.Com/ B.Sc. degrees programmes.

The courses offered are inter-disciplinary in nature. The students shall have the freedom to diversify into various fields, not necessarily related to their core discipline, e.g. a science student could side by side pursue a course in Event Management, and a student of Arts background has the option to pursue a course in Science Journalism, etc.

Tenure : The UGC provides financial assistance to the universities/colleges for approved add-on-course:

- (a) One- time seed money to the tune of ₹7 Lakhs per course for five years in the Humanities and Commerce stream.
- (b) One- time seed money to the tune of ₹10 Lakhs per course for five years in the science stream.

Recently the UGC has decided that the Scheme of Carrier Oriented Courses in respect of colleges would be implemented by the respective regional offices, while in respect of Universities they would be implemented by COC bureau of the UGC.

522 Colleges/Universities were selected for financial assistance for approved courses in the month of Feb, 2013, under the Scheme of Career Oriented Courses, 353 Colleges/Universities have been provided funds during 2014-15.

Grants Paid during the XII Plan 2012-17 (2014-15)

A total grant of ₹ 28.32 crores was paid during the year 2014-15.

8.2 Area Study Centers in Universities

Introduction

The Commission started Area Studies Programme in 1963 in different universities. In the last five decades it has evolved with all its strengths and limitations. In the context of post-cold war when globalization is setting the agenda of international affairs and defining the terms of international relations, the Programme requires fresh thinking in its academic thrust, approach and organizational format.

The major objectives of the Area Studies Programme are as follows: -

- a. to promote holistic understanding of the area with its cultural, social, economic and strategic specificities;
- b. to promote alternative paradigm of area studies from the perspective of post colonial societies;
- c. to contribute towards Indian perspectives of the region and issues;
- d. to provide critical inputs to the policy makers, particularly in India's economic, strategic and political interests;

- e. to bring knowledge of regions of the world to the core of intellectual disciplines;
- f. To conduct research to promote inter-regional comparative perspective.

As on 31-3-2015, 8 Centres were working (for the period 01.04.2011 to 31.04.2016) and 40 Centres were working (for the period 01.04.2014 to 31.03.2019) under the Area Studies Programme.

During the XII Plan period the UGC has released an amount of ₹4.10 Crore (01.04.2012 to 31.03.2013) and ₹6.82 crore (01.04.2013 to 31.03.2015) under the Area Studies Programme.

8.3 Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India

India has produced great thinkers and social leaders who, by their revolutionary and path breaking thoughts and actions, have left a lasting impact not only on India, but on the world as a whole. They have developed indigenous ideas and have provided cultural and ethical identity to India. There is a great need to acquaint the teachers and students with their thinking and work and to involve them in studies, research and field work based extension service programmes of constructive work. The Scheme of Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India (Special Studies) was initiated by the UGC in the year 1983 and continued in the XII Plan also.

Objective(s) and salient features

Under this Scheme, assistance is provided by the UGC to set up Centres for Special Studies in universities/ colleges/ institutions for conducting programmes in order to acquaint teachers and students with thoughts and ideas of great thinkers and social leaders/reformers.


Ceiling of UGC grant: Grant to ₹7,50,000/- as Recurring grant, upto ₹3,00,000/- as Non-Recurring grant (once at the time of establishment of the Centre)

There are 404 Studies Centres established in various universities/colleges under the Scheme 'Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India'. This Scheme is for all beneficiaries (universities, colleges, teachers, students, women, SC /ST, etc.).

8.4 Human Rights Education (HRE)

(i) Human Rights and Duties

Although every right entails a duty, there has been a feeling in certain quarters that while rights education is promoted, the question of duties has not been adequately addressed. In a society which emphasized on duties for centuries, rights education comes as a correction of historical distortions. The violation of rights could be corrected only when the privileged persons are reminded of their duties towards the marginalized sections, and marginalized sections are gradually empowered through rights education. HRE at these levels would extend to such areas as gender equity, caste and community relations, majority-minority conflicts, 'forward-backward' dilemma and North-South power relations. In short, all power relations have to be humanized and democratized through restructuring of rights and duties.

(ii) Human Rights and Values

HRE will also focus on value education:

- (a) One of the objectives is to create awareness and commitment to values where the individualistic self interest is properly reconciled with the collective and common good.
- (b) There has to be a debate on universal values and relativistic values that are culturally determined. The search for universal values assumes added importance in a globalizing but fragmented world.
- (c) The Values like pluralism, respect for all religions, scientific temper, open mind, public reasoning, all of which have been part of Indian traditions for long, will have to be sustained and promoted.
- (iii) Human Rights and Human Development

Rights are not only standards, but also claims of the citizens on the allocation of resources of the society. Indian Economy is growing at a fast pace, but the economic disparities are also growing. It is necessary to recognize that development needs and equity concerns should go hand in hand. Any level of material development will not lead to human happiness unless it values human life and provides the conditions for fuller realization of the human potential. Human being is both a subject and an object of development. The State has an obligation in the promotion and enforcement of the rights and has to envision rights approach to development. No doubt these obligations, when they are carried out, will lead to balanced human development. HRE will include all these components.

The following activities are supported by the UGC under the Scheme:

- (a) Research
- (b) Teaching
- (c) Organization of Seminars/Workshops/Conferences, etc.

A one-time grant of ₹10.00 lakh will be provided to take up these activities in following proportion:-

- i) Research: 25% of the ceiling.
- ii) Teaching: 25% of the ceiling.
- iii) Organization of Seminars/Workshops/Conferences, etc: 50% of the ceiling.

The Commission in its meeting held on 10th May, 2013 decided that the Scheme of Human Rights Education may be grouped with GDA. Accordingly, all old proposals, where the first installment of the grant has been released, may be continued to be processed by the HRE Section.

The old cases of IX, X & XI Plan period approved and sanctioned will be assisted by the UGC for the remaining period and for settling the accounts accordingly. As such, the Committed Liabilities (Old UGC Schemes) will be continued for the same.

244 Universities/Colleges have benefitted under the Scheme.

Grant Paid during the XIIth Plan 2012-17 (2014-15) : ₹ 4.43 crore.

Integration of Information and Communication Technologies

9.1 E-Governance

The UGC has initiated the implementation of the e-governance project through a centralized initiative to realize the objective of inter-operability of various e-governance applications for a decentralized implementation model. The Project of e-Governance was awarded to National Informatics Centre (NIC) during the year 2013.

e-Office implementation: During the year under report several training programmes have been organized for the UGC officials upto the level of Joint Secretary for smooth implementation and usage of e-office. A few Master trainers have been identified and trained so that they may impart training to others at all levels and facilitate day-to-day issues in future.

Web-based application for UGC Schemes

UGC has been inviting online applications for its various schemes since 2011. Presently there are 23 UGC schemes having on line application forms. The e-Scholarship-Fellowship Award Registration Tracking System (e-SARTS) has twenty one on line applications for various scholarship/fellowship schemes of UGC and can be accessed at http://www.ugc.ac.in/ugc schemes/.

The NIC is developing web based online application forms for the other XII Plan Schemes of the UGC. User manuals which give step-by-step instructions on the usage of the application has also been developed for the two Schemes of General Development Assistance, Scheme to Central, State and Deemed Universities and Development of Women's StudiesCentres in Indian Universities and Colleges. 9.2 Production of courseware E-content for postgraduate subjects

e-PGPathshala: The National Mission on Education through information Communication Technology (NME-ICT) is envisaged as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme to leverage the potential of ICT, in teaching and learning process for the benefit of all the learners in Higher Education Institutions at any-time anywhere mode.

The Project "Production of Courseware e-Content for Post Graduate Subjects" was awarded to the UGC as nodal agency by NME-ICT-MHRD in the year 2011 for development of e-content at PG level in 77 subjects. Total Cost of Project received by the UGC from MHRD is ₹84 crore.

The objective of the Scheme is to provide high quality e-content for PG programmes offered in Indian universities for the benefit of the teachers and students. This will address disparities of various kinds like rich/poor, urban/rural, cast and religion based disparities, geographical disparities, regional disparities, etc. The e-contents can be viewed by the students to supplement their class room teaching or as a standalone method of leaning various topics taught at the PG level. The e-contents will also be beneficial to teachers as they can improve upon their teaching after viewing the quality e-contents available on the UGC website under e-PG Pathasalaprogramme.

The content being developed is of high quality, curriculum-based, interactive, in different subjects across all disciplines of social sciences, arts, fine arts and humanities, natural & mathematical sciences, linguistics and languages under this initiative named e-PG Pathshala. The Learning Management System for e-PG Pathshala (http://epgp.inflibnet.ac.in/) is available in open access and hosted on INFLIBNET server as well as accessible through Sakshat Portal.

So far 70 subjects have been identified under the programme and 1500 modules have been uploaded in the e-PG Pathashala website. More than 5000 modules are under process of uploading and so far about 2.5 lakhs visitors have visited the e-PG Pathashala website which was launched in March, 2014.

Total cost incurred in the Project during 2014-15 is ₹9,08,45,336/-.

9.3 Digital India Initiative-Mapping of Degree awarding Universities/Institutions



Chapter 10

New Initiatives

10.1 Community Colleges

Community Colleges Scheme (CC)

The University Grants Commission launched the Scheme of Community Colleges on pilot basis during the year 2013-14 on a reference from the MHRD. The Community College model, by and large, will be accessible to a large number of individuals of the community, offer low cost and high quality education locally, that encompasses both vocational skills development as well as traditional coursework, thereby providing opportunities to the learners to move directly to the employment sector or move into the higher education sector. It offers a flexible and open education system which also caters to community-based life-long learning needs. It has a synergistic relationship between the community, community college and the job market.

Later on, the UGC revised the guidelines of the Scheme and adopted it as one of its independent schemes. The Scheme is meant both for the universities and colleges. However, it has been decided that the Scheme will be implemented in the existing universities and colleges receiving General Development Assistance from the UGC.

The main objectives of the Scheme are:

- to make higher education relevant to the learner and the community;
- to integrate relevant skills into the higher education system;
- to provide skill based education to students currently pursuing higher education but actually interested in entering the workforce at the earliest opportunity;
- to provide employable and certifiable skills with necessary general education to Senior Secondary School passouts not willing to join existing higher education system;
- to provide for up-gradation and certification of traditional / acquired skills of the learners irrespective of their age;
- to provide opportunities for community-based life-long learning by offering courses of general interest to the community for personal development and interest;
- to provide opportunity to move to higher education in future; and
- to offer bridge courses to certificate holders of general / vocational education, so as to bring them on a par with appropriate NVEQF level.

Target / Eligibility

Colleges and universities recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act, 1956, and receiving General Development Assistance are eligible for implementing the Scheme of CC.

The CC should not be a part of university department. It applies to both State and Central Universities. However, if it is established by the university, it should be a separate entity. In order to make education relevant and to create 'industry fit' skilled workforce, the CCs will have to be in constant dialogue with the industry, so that they remain updated on the requirements of the workforce for the local economy. These colleges should also preserve and promote the cultural heritage of the locality, be it art, craft, handicraft, music, architecture or any such thing, through appropriately designed curriculum with proper assurance of employment including self-employment and entrepreneurship development.

CC, in consultation with the local partner industry, will develop the curriculum under the overall guidance of the Board of Studies and Board of Management in case of colleges. However, universities may follow their prevailing practice in this regard. While doing so, they may work towards aligning the curriculum with the National Occupational

Standards being developed by the respective Sector Skill Councils. This would promote national and global mobility of the learners, as well as higher acceptability by the industry for employment purposes. CCs will also work towards aligning the course architecture and curriculum design with NVEQF / NSQF.

There is a provision for scholarship of ₹ 1,000/- p.m. per student for the learners studying under this Scheme. There is a target to train 7500 learners and to support 100 new Community Colleges every year to increase the employability of students considerably as industry partner involved in framing of curricula, training and assessment of the learners. The students completing the courses will meet the requirements of industry.



10.2 B.Voc. Degree Programme (B.Voc.)

The UGC is implementing another important Scheme for skill development i.e Bachelor of Vocation Degree Programme. It has been a long felt necessity to align higher education with the emerging needs of the economy so as to ensure that the graduates of higher education system have adequate knowledge and skills for employment and entrepreneurship. The Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of the decision of Cabinet Committee on Skill Development, in its meeting held on 19th December, 2013, issued a Notification for National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) which supersedes NVEQF. This would enable the graduates completing B.Voc.degree to make a meaningful participation in accelerating India's economy by gaining appropriate employment, becoming entrepreneurs and creating appropriate knowledge.

Objectives

- To provide judicious mix of skills relating to a profession and appropriate content of General Education.
- To ensure that the students have adequate knowledge and skills, so that they are work ready at each exit point of the programme.
- To provide flexibility to the students by means of pre-defined entry and multiple exit points.
- To integrate NSQF within the undergraduate level of higher education in order to enhance employability of the
 graduates and meet industry requirements. Such graduates, apart from meeting the needs of local and national
 industry, are also expected to be equipped to become part of the global workforce.
- To provide vertical mobility to students coming out of 10+2 with vocational subjects.

10.3 Distance Education

10.3(i) Distance Education Bureau

The Ministry of Human Resource Development, vide its Order dated 29th December, 2012, issued directions under Section 20(1) of the UGC Act, 1956, with regard to regulation, maintenance of standards and according recognition in respect of Distance Education Programmes conducted by institutions of higher education. The directions inter alia contained the following:

- (i) The UGC shall act as a regulator in respect of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) programmes and universities/institutions need to seek recognition/permission from the UGC for conducting such programmes.
- (ii) The UGC will develop Regulations for maintenance of norms and standards in Open and Distance Learning (ODL) programmes in accordance with the recommendations of the Madhav Menon Committee Report (December, 2011).
- (iii) The UGC will create necessary physical infrastructure and manpower to discharge the regulatory functions, and for the purpose utilise the staff of erstwhile Distance Education Council (DEC) in consultation with IGNOU.
- (iv) The UGC shall as soon as DEC is dissolved, start performing the functions as the regulator of ODL programmes.

In pursuance of this, the DEC was dissolved by IGNOU vide a Notification dated 4th May, 2013, and the functions of DEC were taken over the UGC vide its Order dated 31st May, 2013. Since the UGC was in the process of framing new regulations for maintaining standards in ODL system, the UGC vide its Notification dated 17th June, 2013 notified for the adoption of the 'Guidelines of DEC on Minimum Requirements for Recognition of ODL institutions'.

With the repatriation of staff of DEC, IGNOU, the entire functions of DEC were taken over by the UGC during 2014-15. The functional record was also shifted from IGNOU campus to branch office of the UGC at 35 Feroz Shah Road, New Delhi. The work relating to distance education is being managed by Distance Education Bureau (DEB) of the UGC by hiring consultants and by re-adjustment of some regular staff of UGC.

Based on the recommendations of an Expert Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. N.R. Madhava Menon, the UGC is in the process of framing the new ODL Regulations in consultation with the MHRD for regulating and maintaining the standards in the field of open and distance learning.

Pending finalisation of new ODL Regulations, the UGC decided to continue the recognition of the Universities/Institutions during the year 2014-15 in respect of those Universities/Institutions only which had the recognition during the year 2013-14.

A list containing the names of Universities/Institutions that were recognised to offer programmes through distance mode during the year 2014-15 is given below in Table 10.3(a).





10.4 Choice Based Credit System

The introduction of CBCS is the part of the numerous measures taken by UGC to enhance academic standards and quality in higher education through innovation and improvements in curriculum, teaching-learning process, examination and evaluation systems.

Under CBCS, universities are requested to shift from numerical marking system, which is followed presently in universities, to grading system of evaluation.

This will facilitate student mobility across institutuions within and across countires and also enable potential employers to assess the performance of students. To bring in the desired uniformity, in grading system and method for computing

the cumulative grade point average (CGPA) based on the performance of students in the examinations, the UGC has formulated detailed guidelines. Further, under CBCS, HEIs would move form the conventional annual system to semester system. The semester system accelerates the teaching-learning process and enables vertical and horizontal mobility in learning. The credit based semester system provides flexibility in designing curriculum and assigning crdits based on the course content and hours of teaching.

UGC has developed minimum curriculum for different courses of under graduate programs like B.A., B.Com and B.Sc (Pass and Hons.) under the CBCS as it entails restructuring the syllabi in the form of a module. The curricula, which have been prepared with help of academic expertise available across the country, have been placed on UGC website for the benefit of different stakeholders.
