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1 Introduction

1.1 Prelude

As an outcome of the ideas contained in the National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986 and Programme of Action (POA), 1992, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was established in 16th September, 1994 as a creative idea to give positive thrust in the direction of quality enhancement of the Indian Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). It is highly motivating to know that NAAC has almost become synonymous with quality in higher education in India. NAAC has touched every stakeholder to higher education in one way or the other, either directly or indirectly. 'Quality' has become the buzzword on the academic campuses today and it is a matter of great satisfaction for those visionaries who made space for NAAC, worked day-in and day-out to realize the vision with which NAAC was brought into existence. It is not only the time for euphoria for all the people connected with NAAC in one way or the other but also time for introspection, innovation and improvement.

It is irrefutable that the pace of growth in the higher education sector in India is inimitable in terms of the number of Universities, Colleges, students, teachers, courses, aspirations of the stakeholders and the sheer volume of the 'unreached'. Further it is unassailable that the mere improvement in the numbers does not ensure the creation of the necessary 'resource pool' that is expected of the higher education system in India. It is a welcome feature that the system is evolving, expanding, fine-tuning, and attempts to 'perne in a gyre' to match the satisfaction of the stakeholders.



In a country where the landscape of higher education is extremely mosaic while it continuously tries to evolve and bring in complexities into the system, it is a dynamic world and every process that is developed either to make value addition to this system or to evaluate this system should be dynamic, relevant and customized. At a time when altogether unexpected and novel changes take place to cater to the stakeholder satisfaction in the Indian higher education system, it is imminent that highly dynamic systems have to be evolved for measuring quality.

It is highly important that quality assurance and sustenance activities need constant monitoring and motivation for the furtherance of the operations. As there are indications/reports that the academic is prone to inertia and indifference can creep in to the system (Harway & Williams, 2012), it is necessary that the processes are repeated and the in-house mechanisms are devised to keep the system ever awake. With this in mind, the NAAC conceptualized the concept of Internal Quality Assurance Cells (IQAC) and it is mandatory for accredited HEIs.

During the post accreditation period, IQAC of an institution was envisioned with specific goals. It has to guide and monitor not only the sustenance but also enhancement of quality related process. The important objective of this is to internalize quality assurance process in all dimensions of the institution, both at the policy and implementation levels. The Re-accreditation needs to look at the process and practices that the institutions have developed for such monitoring and motivation, but the process of accreditation should not be merely repetitive or ritualistic.

It is exciting to know that NAAC enters and exhilarating phase as Higher Education Institutions come knocking at the doors of NAAC as they enter the third cycle of assessment and accreditation. Through its consistent and conscious efforts NAAC has assumed the role of a 'quality facilitator' in spite of extreme hardship. It is a reality that the stakeholders of higher education understand the importance of self-assessment and accept the peer evaluation by NAAC. Lot of thinking had to go in to developing the processes and told that would be acceptable, relevant and purpose serving.



As NAAC begins the third cycle of accreditation, the very process of accreditation and re-accreditation should be exciting both for the institution and the assessors. Accreditation status is no doubt necessary for value addition to the existence of an institution but it should also motivate the stakeholders to continuously improve the systems for quality enhancement. It is also true that the institutions have to really strive hard to sustain the accreditation status for many years to come. In a highly volatile system, where diversities and complexities dominate, it becomes inevitable that time-sensitive strategies are developed to attain, sustain and enhance quality in all the components of an academic institution.

Accreditation status should without question give rise to healthy competition among HEIs, and the innovations that these institutions make should become part of the national treasure and now any evaluation mechanism should focus on the abilities of an institution to demonstrate leadership in any self-defined area. During the third cycle of accreditation the HEIs that have achieved a benchmark should guide other non-accredited institutions to get the benefit of the practices and processes already experimented upon. They should give a proof of their social responsibility and the ability to share and care. The accredited institutions should be beacons of light.

NAAC has made a tremendous impact on Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) which is evident from the number of quality assurance seminars and workshops that have been conducted in the year 2012-2013 in order to achieve its objectives. Hitherto, the NAAC has conducted awareness programs in almost all States and this has triggered many regional level and district level activities.

The success of NAAC is measured by the number of **Colleges 5119** and **Universities 175** assessed and accredited as on 31st March, 2013.

The process of accreditation has created a tremendous momentum among the academia on issues pertaining to quality and this has largely been due to the partnership between NAAC and the State governments. As per the guidelines and suggestions of NAAC, **all the 28 States**, have **established State Level Quality Assurance Cells (QACs) and State Level Quality Assurance Coordination Committees (SLQACCs)** at the State Level. In case of National



Capital Territory and 6 union Territories i.e., NCT of Delhi, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, Lakshadweep, and Pondicherry, the colleges are minimal, hence the Directorate/ Commissionerate of Higher Education of the respective UTs take care. NAAC has sponsored and participated in many seminars, conferences and workshops in order to achieve its mandate.

NAAC is the member of the International Network Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education (INQAAHE) and a founder-member of Asia-Pacific Quality Network (APQN).

1.2 NAAC : Objectives

The objectives of NAAC is to assess and accredit institutions of higher learning, universities and colleges or one or more of their units, i.e., departments, schools, institutions, programmes, etc

The main objectives of assessment and accreditation are to:

- a) grade institutions of higher education and their programmes;
- b) stimulate the academic environment and quality of teaching and research in these institutions;
- c) help institutions realise their academic objectives;
- d) promote necessary changes, innovations and reforms in all aspects of the institutions working for the above purpose;
- e) encourage innovations, self evaluation and accountability in higher education.

In order to meet its mandate NAAC will:

- a) Review periodically and revise and update as and when considered necessary in the light of experience gained the techniques and modalities of assessment;
- b) Communicate the results of assessment and grading to the concerned institution in a form and manner appropriate for corrective action, rectification and self improvement;
- c) Help and encourage the institutions in developing their own procedures, techniques and modalities for self evaluation;

- d) Initiate research studies, in planning and evaluation of educational institutions, programmes etc.;
- e) Ensure an optimised use of resources and the achievement of the identified goals of institutions of higher learning;
- f) NAAC may collaborate with institutions, Indian and foreign, engaged in work of a similar nature and may also undertake on request assessment and accreditation of institutions of higher education, abroad.

1.3 Structure of NAAC

The NAAC functions through its General Council (GC) and Executive Committee (EC) where educational administrators, policy makers and senior academicians from a cross-section of Indian higher education system are represented. The Chairperson of the UGC is the President of the GC of the NAAC, the Chairperson of the EC is an eminent academician nominated by the President of GC (NAAC). The Director is the academic and administrative head of NAAC, and is the member-secretary of both the GC and the EC. In addition to the statutory bodies that steer its policies and core staff to support its activities, NAAC is advised by the advisory and consultative committees constituted from time to time.

3 Academic Activities

3.1 Introduction

The prime agenda of NAAC is to assess and accredit Institutions of Higher Learning. During the year 2012-2013, NAAC has assessed and accredited 879 HEIs which include 505 Colleges for Accreditation; 325 Colleges for Re-Accreditation; 35 College for 3rd Cycle; and 7 Universities for Accreditation; 6 Universities for Re-Accreditation and 1 university for 3rd cycle (kindly see annexure 7.4).

NAAC is in constant collaboration with the State Governments by establishing Quality Assurance Cell (QAC) and State Level Quality Assurance Coordination Committee (SLQACC) in each State. All **28 States** have established QAC and NAAC is supporting this endeavour. This Cell not only focuses on the preparation of the Colleges to undergo the processes of assessment and accreditation, but also conducts many post accreditation quality sustenance and quality enhancement programmes. Many quality improvement, programmes have been organized jointly by NAAC and QAC of States for Colleges.

The vision, mission and core objectives of the NAAC as stated are Quality Assurance in Higher Education. Assessment and Accreditation is the tool in reaching these objectives. NAAC academic activities may be viewed at two levels one is the Awareness programmes on Assessment and Accreditation and the other is the Post Accreditation Programmes. The awareness / promotional programmes explains the policy, direction and guidelines of MHRD, UGC and NAAC for the process of Assessment and Accreditation. The post accreditation programmes on quality sustenance and quality enhancement are by means of sharing of Best Practices and preparing an Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) by the functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in each accredited College and University. From the XI plan onwards

NAAC propagates creation and establishment of IQAC in all HEIs, especially for those HEIs who volunteers to the process of A&A for the first time through Institutional Eligibility for Quality Assessment (IEQA).

A programme or an activity may be a seminar, conference, workshop, symposium at the local, state, regional, national or international level. These activities are organized by NAAC in collaboration with the State Governments, QACs, UGC-Academic Staff Colleges, Universities, or Colleges. Some of the activities are conducted by NAAC at the Headquarters itself (kindly see section 3.2). In addition to this, NAAC also sponsor's many academic activities in the form of seminars, workshops, conferences, etc to accredited Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). Either a NAAC staff or NAAC representative is present as a resource person in most of the programmes across the country. NAAC also constantly review its mechanisms, procedures and methodology. In addition to this, NAAC brings out quality publications in collaboration with International agencies, research projects funded external agencies and NAAC academic staff participate in these activities.

NAAC is regularly represented by its academic staff to International and National Quality Assurance Agencies for sharing and exchange of practices (kindly see section 3.7 and annexure 7.3).

A select brief of the academic activities across the country during the period 2010-2011 is given below in the chronological order region-wise (kindly see section 3.2 to 3.6).

3.2 Programmes at Headquarters

5th ACCREDITATION AWARD CEREMONY

The “NAAC Accreditation Award Ceremony”, fifth in the series was organized on Sunday, 16th September, 2012 at NAAC's National Headquarters, Nagarbhavi, Bangalore.

The programme commenced with Dr. Jagannath Patil, Deputy Adviser, NAAC and Convener of the Award Ceremony, welcoming the huge gathering of academia, delegates and distinguished guests. Prof. Ved Prakash, Chairman, (Acting) University Grants Commission (UGC) and Executive Committee, Chairman, NAAC was the Chief Guest, Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC and members of Executive Committee, General Council and Finance Committee, NAAC graced the occasion.



Around 500 delegates from State Universities, Deemed Universities and Colleges comprising Vice-Chancellors, Principals & educational administrators participated in the award function.

Prof. Ved Prakash in his key-note address stressed upon a wide gamut of issue related to quality of assurance in Higher Education and the intrinsic role played by NAAC in enhancing quality assurance standards. He congratulated the accredited institutions for their leadership and courage to take up institutional assessment. He was of the view that the accredited institutions should propagate the quality culture and motivate other institutions to go in for assessment by NAAC.

Noting that a large number of students from marginalised sections of society would join colleges for degree courses, he said that enrolment for PG courses and research programmes need to be improved to overcome shortage of teachers. There was a need to transform existing centres of learning into knowledge centres to provide quality education. Apart from creating more access to higher education, he said that the UG will focus on directing students to appropriate programmes.

Prof. Ved Prakash was of the view that accreditation helps an institution to identify its strengths and weaknesses, challenges and opportunities. “An order will be issued soon to make accreditation mandatory for all Universities and Colleges coming under the UGC. The rule to make accreditation mandatory will soon be vetted by the Human Resource Development Ministry”, he said.

Speaking on the occasion, Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC explained in detail the processes involved in the assessment and accreditation mechanism. He called upon the newly accredited institutions not to rest on the laurels, but to strive hard to maintain the momentum of quality. “The NAAC only takes a analytical view and gives the report. But it is for the individual institution to treat various maladies bogging the system perpetually. Any system resting on the laurels of the NAAC grade might become defunct as it comes of age. The only solution is to take up quality baton forward as an unending mission of institutions”, he opined.

Prof. Ved Prakash and Prof. H. A. Ranganath presented the accreditation awards to the heads of various institutions. Dr. Jagannath Patil, Dr. Ganesh Hegde, Dr. Sujata Shanbhag and Mr. Wahidul Hasan, the officials of NAAC briefed the delegates on post accreditation quality sustenance measures to be adopted by institutions. The event is the ongoing efforts by NAAC in bringing together NAAC accredited institutions from across the country on one platform. The



event will also bring into focus post accreditation measures to be undertaken or adopted by newly accredited institutions of NAAC.

6th ACCREDITATION AWARD CEREMONY

The 'NAAC Accreditation Award Ceremony' -sixth in the series was organized on 24th March, 2013 at Jnana Jyothi Auditorium, Central College Campus, Bangalore University, Bangalore. Prof. Ved Prakash, Chairman, University Grants Commission and President, General Council, NAAC was the Chief Guest and presented the Accreditation Awards to the heads of accredited institutions. Prof. Dinesh Singh, Chairman, Executive Committee, NAAC presided over the function. Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC and members of the Executive Committee and General Council graced the occasion.

Since 2009, NAAC has started off with the practice of conducting Accreditation Award Ceremony in which the heads of accredited institutions come and receive the Accreditation Certificates and get an opportunity to interact on various issues concerning quality in HEIs.

Dr. Jagannath Patil, Deputy Adviser, NAAC was Convener of the Ceremony in association with the staff of NAAC. The team spirit and quality culture of the NAAC employees made the event successful. The event also brought into play issues regarding post-accreditation to be adopted by newly accredited Institutions.

The sixth edition of the Award Ceremony, one of its kind for any Higher Education Accreditation Agency in the Country, evinced participation from Universities and Colleges which were accredited after July, 2012. Around 700 delegates from State Universities, Deemed Universities and Colleges comprising Vice-Chancellors, Principals and Educational Administrators participated in the Ceremony and received Institution's Accreditation Certificates from NAAC.

As a National Quality Assurance Agency, the NAAC has been addressing quality concerns of one of the world's largest education systems. So far, NAAC has assessed and accredited more than 174 Universities and 5054 Colleges (as on January, 2013).The 6th NAAC Accreditation Award Ceremony was a step in the right direction to associate all stakeholders of higher education in the quality enhancement process and rededicate to the commitment of NAAC's vision and task of 'Ensuring Quality through Quality Assessment'.



In his thought provoking address as a Chief Guest , Prof. Ved Prakash, Chairman, University Grants Commission, highlighted the existence of a dilemma in Higher Education system in India, firstly the dilemma of a shortage of quality institutions and secondly the shortage of talented faculty which is to the extent of 30% - 35%. He also brought to the fore the dilemma of underutilization and mis-utilization of resources. He emphasized on the need to set standards of excellence in Teaching-learning, Research-innovations and Engagement. He went on to explain the existence of regional imbalances in Higher Education in the country. He expressed his displeasure over the lower participation rate of students belonging to different marginalized sections of the society, which is less than half of the national average. He advised the leaders of Institutions to encourage students belonging to marginalized sections of the society to pursue higher education in the right direction.

Prof. Ved Prakash expressed displeasure over the practice of separating Law Education, Engineering and Medical Education from Universities. He also threw light on the role of philanthropy in higher education to accommodate the aspirations of the less privileged students.

Prof. Dinesh Singh, Chairman, Executive Committee, NAAC spoke on the importance of education in the life and development of a nation. He emphasised that education is the process which allows the individual to listen and understand his/her inner voice. He advised NAAC to play a proactive role in building education that aims at building people.

Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC stressed on the need to have a networking of Higher Education Institutions. He vociferously pushed the idea of dissemination of healthy practices among accredited institutions. He asked institutions to replicate the models by suitably modifying them to suit the individual institutions. Customized models of successful healthy practices is the way forward for accredited institutions, Dr. Ranganath said Prof. Ranganath further opined that accredited institutions should sustain quality and should monitor quality of the processes and practices on a day to day basis. 'Accreditation is just one step towards Quality measurement and actualization, but accreditation should not be the 'be-all and end-all' aim of institutions, he opined.

Prof. Ved Prakash, Prof. Dinesh Singh and Dr. H. A. Ranganath presented the accreditation certificates to the heads of various institutions.



Prior to certificate distribution, Dr. Jagannath Patil, Dr. Ganesh Hegde, Dr. Sujata Shanbhag and Mr. Wahidul Hasan briefed the delegates on post accreditation quality sustenance measures to be adopted by institutions in an interactive session.

NAAC has organized one day Free Health Check-up Camp for its employees at its office to create health awareness among its staff on 18th February, 2013. Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC inaugurated the camp and all the staff members utilized the facility.

NAAC and IEEE

The meeting of NAAC and IEEE (Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) was convened on 10th December, 2012 at NAAC Headquarters, Bangalore. The President and CEO of IEEE Dr. Peter W. Staecker; Prof. Mike Lightner, Vice President of IEEE Educational Activities; Dr. Burdt Dicht, Member, IEEE; Dr. Harish and Ms. Meghamala representing Educational Initiatives, IEEE India, Bangalore took part in the meeting along with senior Indian Academics from different parts of the country. Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC welcomed the gathering and spoke on Context Setting Backdrop. Dr. M. S. Shyamasundar, Deputy Adviser from NAAC made a presentation which unveiled the road traversed together by NAAC and IEEE and an overview of Higher Education in India and the role played by NAAC in Quality benchmarking, sustenance and enhancement. Prof. Mike Lightner, initiated the discussion on various aspects for the mutual cooperation and benefit between NAAC and IEEE. He informed the participants that IEEE is interested to link with Indian counterparts especially in the area of professional development. He also expressed to facilitate training of NAAC staff by ABET agreed and staff exchange programme. It was strongly felt by both the organization that face to face interaction with the staff will give a better perspective of the processes and thus the NAAC for staff exchange.

Series of Assessors' Interaction Meetings (AIM) at NAAC

The Assessors' Interaction Meeting was held during June 13 and 14, 2012 at NAAC, Bangalore. Prof. H. A. Ranganath, Director, NAAC welcomed the participants from across the country after the formal registration formality of the assessors. Shri Mohandas Pai, Chairman, MEMG



International India Ltd. Bangalore; Prof. Mariamma Varghese, former VC, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai and Prof. P.S. Zacharias, Former VC, Goa University, Goa were invited as Resource Persons for the programme in addition to the in-house resource persons. The resource persons were involved in handling the technical sessions during the programme.

The participants were divided into seven groups to facilitate role-plays. All the participants were given an imaginary Self-study Report – 'IPL College; IPL City, Bharatkhand, Special characters were introduced like 'Prof. Tendulkar, Dr. Dhoni, and Dr. Chris Gayle respectively as Principal, Vice Principal, and steering Committee Co-ordinator, to make the task more interesting with active involvement of the participants, Based on the SSR, all the participants were stepped into the characters during simulation and role play exercises.

The participants with assigned role play, completed the task given by sharing their experiences and presented their findings. During the Mock Exit meeting, the imaginary characters were introduced on the stage.

The programme was co-ordinated by Dr. M. S. Shyamasundar, Deputy Adviser, NAAC.

AIM held on 22 and 23 June, 2012

The Assessors' Interaction Meeting was held during 22 and 23 June, 2012 at NAAC, Bangalore. The AIM is one of the major activity of NAAC to strengthen the evaluation process besides bridging the gap of inter team variance that may occur during the actual visit.

In his introductory remarks, Prof. Ranganath, Director, NAAC stressed upon the role of quality assessors and the nuances involved in the entire gamut of assessment and accreditation process. Prof. Ranganath likened the role of an assessor to that of a diagnostic, wherein the expert / peer, assesses an Institution's strength and weakness based on time –tested parameters and gives an assessment report.

Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai, former VC, IGNOU and former Director, NAAC delved on matters concerning faculty development and empowerment and the subsequent impact on quality enhancement. He called upon the academic faculty to augment their skill sets and focus more on research and community oriented work.

Prof. Bharat B. Chattoo, former Vice Chancellor, Sri Mata Vaishno Devi University, Jammu, spoke on Challenges and Opportunities of an assessor. He touched upon the multi-fold role played by an assessor and gave valid tips to undertake an objective, systematic and methodical assessment exercise.



Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Latha Pillai, Adviser, NAAC elaborated on the issues and problems faced by assessors in the process of accreditation. She gave an indepth talk on various intricacies involved in the new methodology of assessment and called upon the assessors to look into evidence based information for any recommendation-qualitative or quantitative-inferred from self study reports and subsequent interactions with the faculty.

Dr. Ganesh Hegde, Assistant Adviser spoke on Report Writing and Grading. “Qualitative part of the Peer Team Report should be based on the factual information. The report should match the grade with the contents of the report. Judgement made should be clear and stand firmly on criteria of validation and needs to be based on evidence”, Dr. Hegde said.

The programme was attended by 55 persons across India comprising Vice Chancellors, Professors and Principals from 19 states. The participants were divided into eight groups for facilitating role play and simulation. All the participants were given an imaginary Self-study Report called Bangalore College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Nagarbhavi, II stage, Bangalore. Based on the SSR, all the participants were induced to do the role of management, faculty, students and alumni during the simulation and role play exercises. The meeting concluded with sharing of experiences and presentation by groups. The Mock Exit Meeting on the Assessors' Interaction Meet was conducted by Prof. Bharat Chattoo. The programme was co-ordinated by Dr. Ganesh Hegde.

“Project on “Programme Accreditation”

As per the philosophy of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) the process of Assessment and Accreditation (A & A) is absolutely voluntary for Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). NAAC has been creating a good deal of awareness about the advantages of A & A among various stakeholders. After realizing the advantages of A & A, some of the State Governments and their policy makers have taken momentous initiatives and made A&A mandatory in their states. Apart from State Governments and policy makers, some of the universities also have taken initiatives and came forward for the process of A & A. NAAC has decided to take up only Institutional Accreditation (IA) initially, to prioritise the assessment efforts. The IA is an evaluation of the entire institution, including all its programmes, sites and methods of delivery. Accordingly NAAC has accredited around 5000 HEIs spread all over the country in its journey of accreditation for the last sixteen years. Though IA process is going on well, there are some obstacles which are being detrimental in this journey - IA can't give accurate picture of the programmes of all departments in the university; Projection of various



programmes available in departments may lose the focus; and comparison of performance of programmes among various Universities across the country is not possible. So keeping this effect in mind and to give the stakeholders a good and refined accreditation process, NAAC is taking an initiative for accrediting particular specialized programmes of a particular University in order to overcome the obstacles of the IA. NAAC is planning to implement PA, which is also within NAAC's jurisdiction, in view of many requests received and necessity to adopt to situational contexts. PA can overcome all the above mentioned obstacles and it has advantages over the IA. It is considered even today in many countries that IA could be a pre-requisite for Programme Accreditation (PA). PA is the performance evaluation of an individual programme in the department concerned from an accredited university. The main focus of the PA is to compare and contrast efficacy of a particular programme in different HEIs. This comparison may be helpful not only for the students but also for their parents to take radical decisions with respect to admissions to various programmes in different parts of the country. It also helps policy makers and the regulatory bodies to take some of the pivotal decisions. The macro level challenge for IA and PA is to accredit a large number of HEIs with different shades of diversity and complexity in the country, which is a gigantic task. PA facilitates campus placement/ recruitment, qualification enrichment of faculty and obtaining more and more research projects from funding agencies. Nonetheless PA also faces certain challenges - accrediting the total number of programmes in all the Universities in the country; contextualization of the instrument to Indian context; inclusion of relevant indicators in the instrument; availability of right kind of experts at a right time and assessors' training / orientation are some of the challenges. Prestige of an institution would be at risk, when a particular programme is not accredited. NAAC is operating a project on Programme Accreditation and during the project period, a few goals have been identified as challenges in the travesty towards PA. Our goals are - to expand development and use of evidence of student learning outcomes as well as evidence of institution and programme performance in accreditation review in order that this evidence play an increasingly influential role in judgments about academic quality and accreditation status; to expand information to the public about the findings of accreditation review as this information is developed by accrediting organizations, institutions and programs etc. While the challenges are - Preparation of Programme Accreditation manual itself; including appropriate performance indicators in the manual; capturing relevant information suitable to diversity of programs; availability of right kind of resource persons at right time. The primary methods adopted in the project are - Creation of



Programme Accreditation instrument that will become a focal point for inputs on various aspects to different kinds of stake holders; Identification of performance indicators and dissemination plan need to developed to assure quality of various programmes by providing an evaluative frame work. In order to make the project to be more realistic, necessary measures and quality initiatives have been taken by using NAAC's draft manual for departmental accreditation as a base and collected quality indicators from different sources (internet, programme accreditation instruments from various quality assurance organizations from different parts of the world, eminent scholars etc). Recently NAAC had signed MOU with IEEE (Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) an US based world's largest professional association with more than 400,000 members in 160 countries. Inputs from national and international experts had been collected during the joint workshop conducted by NAAC and IEEE, about IA and PA. Since IEEE is a body which is doing PA for the specialized programmes, NAAC is planning to emulate their model depending upon the local context. Based on the available inputs, project has come out with a draft instrument on programme accreditation. Nonetheless, favorable inputs from the academic peers and eminent scholars would be solicited to fine-tune the instrument and this draft would be placed before the National Consultative Committee. After getting the inputs from the meeting, project shall come out with a manual for programme accreditation and thereafter pilot study would be conducted in some of the HEIs in various parts of the country, before finally implementing the actual process, based on the fine-tuned inputs. The Principal Investigator of the project on Programme Accreditation at NAAC is Dr. M.S. Shyamasundar, Deputy Advisor and assisted by Mr. K.S. Bharat, Project Assistant.

NAAC Launched Revised Manual and Methodology from April – 2012

NAAC has launched its revised Manual and Methodology for Assessment and Accreditation starting April 2012. The present system will be replaced by a system that makes space for the new dimensions and trends in the changing higher education system. Higher Education in India has witnessed many changes, both at the policy and structural level and NAAC is conscious of its role in the changing landscape of higher education. The focus of NAAC in its revised methodology would be to steer institutions to reflection on processes and output, whereas since its inception, NAAC laid emphasis on input factors and efforts to create the necessary physical and mental infrastructure to foster quality. Quality sustenance measures would form the corner stone for the next cycle of A & A process.

Dr. R. K. Chaturvedi, Additional Secretary, U.P. State Higher Education Council welcomed the guests and made an exposition on the purpose of the Workshop. U.P State Higher Education Council's Annual Report for the year 2011-12 was released by the dignitaries on the occasion.

Shri T. Venkatesh in his address provided the information about the priorities of Govt. of U.P regarding higher education. He said that Assessment and Accreditation of Higher Education Institutions by NAAC is one of the topmost priorities of the Government. He also informed about the accreditation status of Higher Education Institutions in U.P. He informed the delegates that only 272 Higher Education Institutions including State Universities were accredited by NAAC, whereas 324 colleges have submitted LOI and 149 colleges have submitted SSR to NAAC. He further informed that the state government aimed at submitted at least 400 institutions to accreditation process by NAAC in the year 2012-13 with a view to improve and sustain quality among Higher Education Institutions. He voted for the accreditation of every HEI in U.P at the earliest.

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Dr. M. S. Shyamasundar, in his keynote address, unveiled details regarding the vision and mission of NAAC, the process involved in Assessment and Accreditation, and the benefits of the Accreditation process. He opined that NAAC is not a onetime affair, but the whole idea of quality achievement, sustenance and enhancement takes off with the process of Assessment and Accreditation. He emphasized that quality in higher education is more important than the quantity of higher education institutions, how quality can be enhanced and then sustained. He further enlightened the delegates on the technicalities involved in NAAC criteria and assigning weightages with reference to Universities, Autonomous Colleges and Affiliated Colleges. He emphasized on the space available for the Government of U.P and State Higher Education Department in strengthening the process of Quality rating and enhancement.

Prof. Balraj Chauhan, Vice Chancellor, Dr. R.M.L. National Law University Lucknow, spoke on the importance of quality assessment and lauded the efforts made by NAAC in the process of A&A. He went on to inform the delegates that Colleges would not be able access any kind of funding from the UGC in the absence of Assessment and Accreditation. He voted for attitudinal change among stakeholders towards third party evaluation. Smt. Anita Mishra bemoaned the growth in terms of number of institutions and the absence of quality culture among institutions. She expressed strong sense of commitment that the Government U.P had for qualitative improvement of higher educational institutions. Issues and queries on LOI, IEQA, SSR, preparation and the peer team visit were discussed in the open-house. The workshop was attended by stakeholders of higher education from Universities, IQAC Coordinators, Principals of accredited and not-accredited colleges besides other stakeholders of higher education. Future Plan 2013-14

The External Quality Assurance (EQA) Agency, NAAC has been continuously fine-tuning its Assessment and Accreditation methodologies along with local, regional and global changes in higher education scenario. This helps in reaching out to HEIs and wider acceptance of the methodology. The methodology of NAAC has stood the test of time for last 19 years, mainly because it has remained dynamic and responsive to the stakeholder feedback.

As required by a vibrant quality assurance agency, the NAAC has been **continuously fine-tuning its Assessment and Accreditation methodologies** to reach out to the target institutions, to achieve notable recognition and wider acceptance. **The methodology has been fine-tuned from time to time considering the prevailing higher education scenario and feedback from stakeholders.**

The vision and mission envisaged in the Memorandum of Association would continue with the primary function of Assessment and Accreditation of Institutions/ Departments/ Programmes; appropriate instruments of accreditation and fine tuning them; professional development of collegiums of assessors; in-house analysis of self-study Report; coordinating the 'on-site visit' for effective completion.

NAAC continuously upgrades the existing ICT / e-infrastructure in the NAAC office in order to meet its mandate. NAAC extensively uses ICT in most of its academic, administrative and financial endeavor. As a step moving towards online Assessment and Accreditation process, NAAC has already introduced LOI and IEQA processes online. This online process has been continuously updated and upgraded.

In order to support the prime agenda of Assessment and Accreditation by NAAC, NAAC shall be looking into an high-end online enabled process of Assessment and Accreditation through the National Informatics Centre (NIC), Government of India (GOI) – for which the project is already ongoing. This is the second major future plan.



NAAC has taken an initiative to digitize the existing the Self-Study Reports (SSRs), Peer Team Reports, etc for archiving, cross-referencing and retrieving purposes. The corollary will be submission of reports also in digital format. This huge amount of data on higher education will help plethora of research activities at NAAC, which will result as inputs to policies.

In the beginning of the XII plan NAAC has revised its Manuals and grade calculation with effect from 1st April, 2012. As a strategy more focus would be on interaction / briefing the assessors on the revised methodology to have Collegiums of assessors. Promotion of 'in house' Research on Quality Assurance would be strengthened.

NAAC has accredited 175 Universities and 5119 Colleges in the Country as on 31st March, 2013. Based on the experience of last 15-16 years of its operations and keeping in view of the future expectations of stakeholders, the NAAC has developed Roadmap for XII plan.

The NAAC plans to focus on the following activities:

1. Developing e-assessment and accreditation
2. Assessment and Accreditation of all higher Education institutions of the Country, in a phased manner.
3. Promotion of Internal Quality Assurance Systems in HEIs.
4. Dissemination of Best Practices amongst HEIs.
5. Development of pool of trained quality assurance professionals
6. Promotion of 'in house' Research on Quality Assurance
7. Capacity Building of NAAC
8. Digitization of Library and SSRs

1. Development of a New Assessment and Accreditation Methodology

Based on extensive discussions with all the stakeholders of higher education, the NAAC has developed and implemented a new assessment and accreditation methodology with effect from 1st April, 2012. The main objectives of this new methodology are:

- ⇒ To ensure continuous/need-based improvements in the instruments of assessment and accreditation
- ⇒ To fine tune the methodology in practice

- ⇒ To enhance the credibility and reliability of the assessment process and outcome.
- ⇒ To enable NAAC to conduct assessment of large number of institutions effectively.

2. Assessment and Accreditation of large number of Higher Education Institutions

As on 31st March, 2013, NAAC has assessed 175 university level institutions and 5119 colleges. NAAC has earned the distinction of having covered the highest number of institutions by any Quality Assurance Agency in the World. It is increasingly realized by the stakeholders that NAAC assessment contributes greatly to quality improvement. In spite of this, large numbers of institutions of the country are yet to be assessed and accredited.

A two-step approach has been introduced for the Assessment and Accreditation of Affiliated and Constituent colleges from 1st April, 2012, which are seeking assessment and accreditation for the first time:

Step 1: Determination of the Institutional Eligibility for Quality Assessment (IEQA) and

Step 2: Assessment and Accreditation of institutions which have earned their IEQA status.

The New Methodology focuses on:

- ⇒ Fine-tuning of Criteria, Key Aspects and Assessment Indicators as guidelines/probes for assessment.
- ⇒ Provision for Key Aspect-wise differential weightages for effective measurement of Key Aspect-wise and Criterion-wise quality profile of the institution.
- ⇒ Changing the grading pattern from the earlier nine-point scale to the new three letter grades viz. “A”, “B”, and “C” for accredited institutions and “D” for those which are not accredited.
- ⇒ Modification in the institutional overall scoring from the earlier percentage to the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) system on a four-point scale
- ⇒ Finetuning and development of format for Peer Team Report, to elicit focused and evaluative judgments on the institutional quality.

It is expected that by the two-step approach of assessment of Affiliated/Constituent Colleges, and with the support of National Regulatory Agencies and State Higher Education Departments, all the higher education institutions of the country can be assessed during the XII Plan period in a phased manner. To address the onerous task of assessment of large number of



HEIs, NAAC would like to support and Network with State Level Quality Assurance Cells, College Development Councils of Universities, besides making strong attempts at capacity building and additional human resource at NAAC headquarter.

2.1 Pre-Accreditation strategies

NAAC undertakes a number of promotional activities which includes Publications on Quality Assurance, Support for Seminars/Workshops/Conferences, Best Practices dissemination, Awareness programmes, Guidance for the preparation of Self Study Reports etc., As on 31st March 2012, 28 states have established the State Level Quality Assurance Cells (SLQAC) to promote assessment. During the XII plan NAAC would like to conduct many more awareness programmes throughout the Country, particularly in rural and semi-urban areas and also would like to encourage few more states to establish the SLQAC.

2.2 Post -Accreditation Strategies

NAAC has been active in post-accreditation quality sustenance activities for accredited Universities and Colleges. In States where a critical mass of institutions are assessed, State-wise Analysis of Accreditation Reports have been initiated for policy initiatives as well as systemic action by the institutions, resulting in appropriate action plans for the State. Such reports have been already published for the eleven States of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Haryana, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan and North Eastern regions. The State-wise Analysis of Accreditation Reports of Gujarat is in final stage. During the XII plan NAAC would like to take up at least Eight more states for State-wise Analysis.

3. Promotion of Internal Quality Assurance System

The NAAC envisages ushering in continuous quality in HEIs through a combination of internal and external quality assurance practices. NAAC strongly believes that ultimately, efficient internal systems of quality assurance alone can sustain the quality of any institution. NAAC proposes that every accredited institution establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. It has developed detailed guidelines and action points for the functioning of Institutional Internal Quality Assurance Cells. As on date, more than 55 percent of accredited institutions have established IQACs.

All accredited institutions should send Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR) to NAAC on the implementation of the quality initiatives undertaken by the institution through the IQAC at

the end of the Academic Year. During the XII Plan, every HEI (accredited or otherwise) will be motivated by NAAC, to initiate mechanism for internal quality assurance systems.

4. Dissemination of Best Practices

The NAAC has brought out series of publications on Best Practices, with the hope that institutions can learn and benefit from each others' success stories, strategies and experiences. In the context of India's institutional diversity, institutions may have to emulate the best practices of other institutions, contextualize them to their individual situation and add value to their existing practices. NAAC advocates sharing of best practices as an important approach to quality improvement. NAAC has brought out **six** publications under the Best Practices series on Internal Quality Assurance Cell Activities, Community Engagement, Library and Information Services, Evaluation of Students, Students Feedback and Participation, Curricular Aspects. During the XII Plan, NAAC would like to bring out at least **six (6)** more publication under this category.

4.1 Publications

Dissemination of information is an integral part of creating the quality culture among individuals and institutions. NAAC regularly prepares documents/ guidelines dealing with Assessment and Accreditation, and also need-based literature on Quality Assurance and Quality Promotion, Proceedings of Workshops and Seminars, Assessors Handbook, Guidelines on Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Student Charter, Best Practices Series, Teacher Education Tool Kit, and other related documents have been published. During the XII plan NAAC would like to bring out at least **fifty new publications** apart from revising the Manual and Guidelines for Assessment and Accreditation.

Quarterly newsletter "NAAC News" is regularly published would be more informative on quality related subjects. The "NAAC News" would be made richer in terms of Content during the plan period. It is proposed to bring out a Yearly Research Journal on "Quality Assurance" to give a platform for the Accredited Institutions to share their views, practices.

5. Development of trained quality assurance professionals

The assessors play a vital and important role in the assessment of institutional quality. It is a judgemental activity which demands and necessitates sharp skills of evaluation and greater objectivity in measurement. Professional skill-based selection of assessors is essential to ensure credibility to the NAAC process and operations. Therefore, NAAC will focus on developing a



collegium's of trained quality assurance professionals, to attain greater stakeholder confidence and acceptability of the NAAC's Accreditation outcomes. The assessor's category will be consisting of Present and Former Vice Chancellors, Professors with high academic achievements and Accredited Institutions Principals.

6. Promotion of 'in house' Research on Quality Assurance

Focused research on quality assurance contributes to the better understanding of complex and diverse realities of higher education. Under its Quality Assurance Resource Centre, NAAC would like to strengthen Research Unit to undertake focused research on quality assurance and related areas of study with respect to the different states higher education status. Research unit along with the Publications Unit would be able to focus on Quality Assurance as a Research, Development Activity of NAAC.

7. Capacity Building of NAAC

To undertake newer tasks as stated above, it is necessary to re-engineer the organisational structure of NAAC. It should be strengthened with more autonomy, additional core academic and professional staff and state-of-the art use of ICT to take up the new responsibilities. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) campus is comprises of uniquely designed building that sits on a sprawling campus spread across five acres at the Nagarabhavi, opposite to the National Law School of India, in the Bangalore University, Jnanabharati campus. An open national architectural design competition, as per the norms of the Council of Architects, was held for selecting the best architectural surrounding of the campus. The new building is spacious, architecturally designed and environment-friendly. The NAAC has shifted to its new building in August 2006. The new campus has priorities set out for working towards having a carbon neutral, eco-friendly environment aimed at energy conservation and rain water harvesting. The building is designed with unique features so that sun light permeates into the building through the roof and thus dependency on electric light is minimized. Emphasis on lush green environment, ecological balance and great care on the conservation of ecological resources creates an enchanting experience and vibrant ambience at campus.

NAAC could envisage the above said plans with the help of the MHRD; the UGC; Prof. Ved Prakash, Chairman, UGC and President of the General Council of NAAC; members of the GC, EC, FC, AC, other NAAC committees, all staff of NAAC; and the academia who have contributed significantly to the development of NAAC.

8. Capacity Building Programmes for NAAC Staff

NAAC will organize a Training programme for its academic as well as support staff for the Career Development, Office Management, Financial Management, and personality development etc. in the office for capacity Building. It may be further strengthened by inviting professionals in the field of education, technology and any other field for the benefit of the employees.

9. Promoting Industry-Institution Interactions: Collaborating with industry strengthens the education sector.

NAAC is working to strengthen its collaboration with National level agencies like with CII, QCI, FICCI and other state level chamber of commerce for interaction and invite Universities and Colleges which are interested for the dialogue. A one to one platform may be created and can have interactions. National Meeting SLQAC /State – Govt. /Director Higher Education /Dean CDC would be conducted at NAAC.

10. Support to State Quality Assurance Cell & IQACs in Colleges/Universities:

NAAC will extend its financial support to State Level Quality Assurance Cell for organizing seminar /workshop and other related issues on Assessment and Accreditation. It is proposed to extend its support in the XII plan also. Further NAAC may request UGC to release the funds to IQACs in the Colleges and Universities for effective post accreditation support on quality enhancement. ICT enabled services and E-governance: Information and Communication technology would help institutions for overall improvements in the governance at all levels. E-governance on all activities of NAAC, Bio-metric, Management Information System for data base management would lead to the public disclosure policy in a better manner. These data bases and e-governance would NAAC to put all its activities on NAAC website.







SCHEDULE 13

ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2013.

A. Statement on Significant Accounting Policies :

1. The Financial Statement of Council is prepared under historical cost convention except as otherwise stated.
2. Accreditation Reimbursement expenses (including Honorarium Reimbursement Expenses to unaided institutions) payable and Academic Staff College reimbursement expenses payable as at the end of the year in respect of which bills are yet to be received as on date of yearly finalization of accounts, are accounted on the basis of average of expenses in respect of bills received and paid.
3. Fixed Assets (including assets acquired out of UGC grants) are stated at cost. Cost comprises of purchase price and attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.
4. Foreign journals and periodicals for academic use are treated as fixed assets and the yearly subscription cost in respect thereof, till the balance sheet date is capitalized and the surplus is treated as prepaid.
5. Depreciation is not provided on assets in view of the university grants commission's (UGC) letter no. F.Misc./IA/2004-05 dated 27th August 2004.
6. Grants from UGC are accounted on cash basis.
7. Revenue grants from UGC under the head (i) Capital grants for other assets which is towards academic and accreditation expenses and (ii) Non-plan Grants which is towards establishment & other administration expenses are accounted under Capital fund.





8. Interest on Fixed Deposits is treated as part of revenue grants and the same is accounted under Capital fund.
9. Accreditations Assessment fee and Appeal Fees for Accreditation Reassessment are recognized as revenue only on the declaration of results by the Executive Committee.
10. Interest on Fixed Deposits is recognized as revenue on accrual basis.
11. Guest room charges and interest on staff loan are accounted on cash basis.
12. Leave Encashment and Gratuity to employees is accounted on cash basis.
13. Other revenues and expenses are accounted on accrual basis.

B. Notes to Accounts :

1. National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) is an autonomous body established under the UGC Act with the objective of providing a forum that will encourage excellence in institutions of higher education, by providing a mechanism for the self-assessment in such institutions and assessment and accreditation by NAAC. For this purpose UGC, with approved budgets relating to both revenue and Capital releases Grants to meet the above objects.
2. As the Revenue grant Rs 6,27,86,000/- from UGC and interest income Rs 2,37,77,711/- on fixed deposits, are taken to the Capital fund, the excess of expenditure over income as per the Income & Expenditure Account is in excess to the extent of the sum total of both.
3. Accreditation reimbursement expenses payable, Honorarium reimbursement expenses payable to unaided institutions and Academic Staff College reimbursement expenses payable as at the end of the year, in respect of which bills are yet to be received which is accounted on the basis of the average of expenses in respect of bills received and paid, are at Rs 3,97,50,000/-, Rs 85,32,000/- and Rs 13,75,000/- respectively.
4. Grant received from UGC towards acquiring capital assets is not reduced from the cost of fixed assets.
5. Depreciation is not provided on fixed assets.
6. The provisions of Chapter V of Finance Act, 1994 (Service Tax) have been amended by Finance act 2012, with effect from 1st July 2012. The council got service tax registration only on 11th March 2013 and has been paying service tax with effect from the date of registration.
7. Investment in fixed Deposits with the bank, are not ear-marked and categorized into (i) Deposits out of plan grants i.e. , (a) Capital grants for capital assets and (b) Capital grants for other assets which is towards academic and accreditation expenses, (ii) deposits out of non-





plan grants which is towards establishment and other administrative expenses, (iii) deposits out of advances received towards accreditation etc., and (iv) deposits out of internal accruals.

8. No liability for payment of Leave Encashment & Gratuity to employees is made as the Council follows cash basis of accounting in respect of the same.
9. NAAC maintains separate bank accounts & book of accounts in respect of employees & employer contribution to provident fund. The balances as at the year end have been merged with NAAC's Accounts.
10. Amounts are rounded off to the nearest rupee.
11. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever required.
