

PREFACE

Since its establishment as an advisory body in 1945, and subsequently as a statutory body by an act of parliament in 1987, All India Council for Technical Education has been performing efficiently to meet its objectives of overall development of technical education in the country, qualitative betterment of technical education, quantitative progression and constant maintaining of fair standard and effective norms.

Its landmark achievement was in 10th January 2010, when AICTE realized e-governance and on line submission of applications for the approval of institutions across the nation. To further its progress, it also implemented online submissions for variations in sanctioned intake, extension of approval of existing institutions and closure of institutions, system of approval and so on. Transparency, efficiency and promptness in administration are the fruitful outcomes of the e-governance.

E-governance, since 2010, also put an end to certain incongruities in the system like inordinate delays and unfair practices of the past. It attained a massive shift from primitive methods of the past which were lacking in robust practices and procedures. E-governance brought about not only transparency in administration but also accountability and flexibility in all its governance. The transformation was from a mere transaction level to a perfect process driven system based on rules and also subject to scrutiny and RTI complaints. The system is effortless, scalable, retrievable, secure and robust. It has earned the credibility and faith of stake holders. This secure web based system is utilized not only for various online applications and approvals but also the subsequent follow up' of the applications by the applicants. This system has furnished a reporting and analytical tool for AICTE. By constantly sending automated notification via email and providing online grievance reddressal mechanism, it has further enhanced the stake holder confidence.

To foster the cause of transparency and accountability with its stake holders, AICTE is also currently implementing the workflow, accounts, electronic record, digitalization of records, security systems, legal case and tracking of applications; mail serving and video conferencing across the regions of India. Unfair practices in the past inordinate delays, manual processing of maintaining applications and other primitive methods were eliminated by the introduction of e-governance. It is replaced by absolute transparency in all levels, reduction in cost of operations, higher productivity and a better control due to enhanced reporting. For instance, report generation earlier was difficult due to the absence of single comprehensive online database of colleges.

Previously, during the year under report, a lot of meetings were conducted: (i) Seven meetings of the council (ii) nine meetings of executive committee (iii) ten meetings of All India Board of Studies and (iv) Sixty meetings of the Regional committees were conducted.

Towards augmenting the quality and standards of technical education, the council equipped its faculty development programmes under various schemes such as Quality Improvement Programme, Career Award for young teachers, Emeritus Fellowship, Seminar Grant, Travel grant, Staff Development Programme, National Doctoral Fellowship, AICTE, INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship and so on. The council also implemented Research and Institutional Development schemes such as MODROBS, Research Promotion Scheme etc AICTE - INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship (DVP), Research Park (RP), Innovation Promotion Scheme (IPS), AICTE - INAE -TRF (Teacher Research Fellowship), AICTE - INAE -TG (Travel Grant to Students), SWSS-Summer-Winter School Scheme. Employability



Enhancement Training Programme (EETP) and Hostel for SC/ST Students for providing enhanced facilities and improved quality of technical education.

Innumerable benefits resulted from e-governance. Before the advent of e- governance in AICTE experts were chosen by 'pick and chose' method to scrutinize applications and visit colleges. Now the system follows an unbiased and organized 'random choice' method which would not leave to any kind of malpractice. Electronic modes of payment not only brought revenue but also saved much time and effort.

The success of e-governance can be noticed from its rapid processing of about 12000 applications of existing institutions and more than 1000 applications of new institutions every year in no time. Another statistics points out that more than 17000 applications are received by RIFD Bureau.

AICTE is the brand ambassador for Technical Education in the Country. This web based system assisted-AICTE enhancing its image as a facilitator and a model regulator in the Indian education system as it examines all necessary details of a college such as a infrastructure, land survey details, funding, welfare of students and institutes etc. AICTE stands as a symbol of genuine educational regulator of the Country., who is also an enabler and a facilitator.

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



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Chapter 1

Introduction

1.1 PREAMBLE

All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) was set-up in November 1945 as a national level Apex Advisory Body to conduct survey on the facilities on technical education and to promote development in the country in a coordinated and integrated manner.

The Government of India (Ministry of Human Resource Development) constituted a National Working Group to look into the role of AICTE in the context of proliferation of technical institutions, maintenance of standards and other related matters. The Working Group recommended that AICTE be vested with the necessary statutory authority for making it more effective, which would consequently require restructuring and strengthening with necessary infrastructure and operating mechanisms.

Pursuant to the above recommendations of the National Working Group, the AICTE Bill was introduced in both the Houses of Parliament and passed as the AICTE Act No. 52 of 1987. The Act came into force w.e.f. March 28, 1988. The statutory All India Council for Technical Education was established on May 12, 1988 with a view for proper planning and coordinated development of technical education system throughout the country, the promotion of qualitative improvement of such education in relation to planned quantitative growth and the regulation and proper maintenance of norms and standards in the technical education system and for matters connected therewith.

The purview of AICTE covers programmes of technical education including training and research in Engineering & Technology, Architecture & Town Planning, Management, Pharmacy, Applied Arts and Crafts, Hotel Management and Catering Technology etc. at different levels.

1.2 THE ORGANIZATION

In accordance with the provisions of the AICTE Act (1987), for the first five years after its inception in 1988, the Minister for Human Resource Development, Government of India was the Chairman of the Council. The first full time Chairman was appointed on July 2, 1993 and the Council was re-constituted in March 1994 with a term of three years. The Executive Committee was re-constituted on July 7, 1994 and All India Boards of Studies and Advisory Boards were constituted in 1994-95. Regional Offices of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, located at Kolkata, Chennai, Kanpur and Mumbai were transferred to AICTE and the staff working at these offices were also deputed to the Council on foreign service terms w.e.f. October 1, 1995. These offices functioned as secretariats of Regional Committees in the four regions (East, South, North and West). Three



new Regional Committees in southwest, central and northwest regions with their secretariats located at Bangalore, Bhopal and Chandigarh respectively were also established on July 27, 1994. One more Regional Committee in South-Central region with its Secretariat at Hyderabad was notified on March 8, 2007. In addition to the Regional Offices, camp offices are also functioning in Guwahati and Thiruvananthapuram. The AICTE Trivandrum office was formally inaugurated on 09-02-2013 by Sri Oommen Chandy, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerla. The names of the States/UTs falling under the jurisdiction of the eight Regional Committees are given in APPENDIX-1.1.

The AICTE has its Headquarters in New Delhi and is presently housed in a building leased from the NDMC in the Chanderlok Building, Janpath, New Delhi. Also two bureaus of the Council are housed in its own building having a covered area of 988 sq. mtr. at IV floor, East Tower, NBCC Place, Pragati Vihar, New Delhi. Due to lack of office space in Chanderlok Building, space measuring 11420.30 sq. ft in the Seventh floor in Mayur Bhawan in Shankar Market by NDMC have been leased, and renovated to house PC Bureau, RIFD Bureau, Distance Education Cell, IBA Cell, J.K. Scholarship Cell, etc.

The AICTE comprises of various Bureaus, namely, Approval Bureau, Planning and Co-ordination (PC) Bureau, University Bureau (UB), Administration (Admin) Bureau, Finance (Fin) Bureau, Research Institution and Faculty Development (RIFD) Bureau and Academic (Acad.) Bureau. Different Cells like Internal Audit, Anti-Ragging, Public Grievance, Information Facilitating Cell, CMAT & GPAT Cell, NVEQF Cell, Complaint Cell, RTI Cell, IBA Cell, J.K. Scholarship Cell, Distance Education Cell, Vigilance Cell, Legal Cell and e-Governance Cells have also been constituted by the AICTE. Each Bureau/Cell is headed by an Adviser/Director, who is assisted by technical and other staffs. The multidisciplinary technical staff is taken either on deputation or on contract from various Government Departments, academic institutions, etc. Computers are appropriately provided to each bureau for work. These computers are networked through LAN for retrieval and exchange of information. Cleaning and maintenance, security, transport and hospitality are provided by agencies outsourced for the purpose.

1.3 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

MEETINGS OF STATUTORY BODIES OF AICTE

Statutory bodies, during the year under report met, Council 7 times, Executive Committee 9 times, All India Board of Studies 10 times, and Regional Committee 60 times to deliberate the significance of Technical Education in the country.

ADMISSION TEST

i. COMMON MANAGEMENT ADMISSION TEST (CMAT)

Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) was conducted by AICTE in 2012-13 also, to cater the needs of students aspiring management courses. A total of 1,77,217 students have taken this entrance test.

ii. COMPUTER BASED ONLINE GRADUATE PHARMACY APTITUDE TEST (GPAT)

Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) was conducted for the first time as a Computer based online test. Students qualified in GPAT are eligible for a scholarship of Rs.8000/- p.m. to undergo M.Pharm Course.



VARIOUS WORKSHOPS ORGANISED/CONDUCTED BY AICTE

i. FEED BACK ON THE APPROVAL PROCESS

The council organized workshops at different (23) locations for imparting an insight on the approval process 2013-14 and to familiarise the stakeholders of the systems with the modifications in terminology, procedures and steps related to the filling, uploading and submitting of the respective applications. The workshops are also aimed at receiving feedback on the Approval Process and in clarifying queries from institutions related to all matters pertaining to approvals.

ii. NATIONAL VOCATIONAL EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK (NVEQF)

The council organized three workshops to sensitize various stakeholders about the scheme of NVEQF at Punjab, Chandigarh & Mumbai

iii. COMMUNITY COLLEGES SCHEME

The council organized two workshops at New Delhi introducing the Community Colleges Scheme in the Country.

iv. TECHNICAL HINDI WORKSHOP IN AICTE

A Technical Hindi Workshop was organized in AICTE HQ on 09th October, 2012 to its officers and employees for better implementation of official language in day to day work of AICTE.

GRANTS RECEIVED FROM MHRD FOR VARIOUS SCHEME

AICTE received Rs. 40,000 lakhs as grants-in-aid from the Ministry of Human Resource Development during the financial year 2012-13 for implementation of various schemes.

RESEARCH AND INSTITUIONAL DEVELOPMENT

MODERNIZATION AND REMOVAL OF OBSOLESCENCE (MODROBS)

During the period 2012-13 the Council received a total number of 4000 proposals under MODROB and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 534 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 5364.94 Lakhs.

RESEARCH PROMOTION SCHEME (RPS)

During the period 2012-13 the Council received a total number of 2890 proposals under RPS and based on the recommendations of the expert committee a total of 267 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 3234.66 Lakhs.

iii. NATIONAL COORDINATED PROJECT (NCP)

During the period 2012-13 the Council received total number of 30 proposals under NCP and based on the recommendations of the expert committee a total of 04 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs.73.72 Lakhs.



STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (QIP)

During the year 2012-13, under QIP, AICTE has sanctioned and released Rs.585.78 Lakhs.

ii. CARREER AWARDS FOR YOUNG TEACHERS (CAYT)

Proposals under CAYT, based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 12 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs.29.84 Lakhs.

iii. EMERITUS FELLOWSHIPS (EF)

Proposals under Emeritus Fellowships based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 12 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to a sum of Rs.36.49 Lakhs.

iv. SEMINAR GRANT

Proposals under Seminar Grant Scheme based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 103 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs.72.65 Lakhs.

v. TRAVEL GRANT

During the period 2012-13, 25 faculty members of different Technical Institutes were offered financial support of Rs. 15.65 lakhs.

vi. STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAME (SDP)

329 proposals for conducting Staff Development Programmes were approved for an amount of Rs. 890.56 Lakhs during the period 2012-13

vii. NATIONAL DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP (NDF)

32 proposals were recommended by the expert committee and a Grant of Rs. 86.12 lakhs were released to various institutions in different installments under National Doctoral Fellowship during the period 2012-13

INDUSTRY INSTITUTE INTERATION

SCHEME OF INDUSTRY INSTITUE PARTNERSHIP CELL (IIPC)

The Council has provided financial assistance to establish 03 new cells and an amount of Rs.21.15 Lakhs was released under the IIPC scheme.

ii. ENTERPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (EDC)

30 new Entrepreneurship Development Cells were given financial aid of Rs.93.41 lakhs under the Entrepreneurship Development Cell scheme.

SC/ST HOSTEL SCHEME

A new scheme for the construction of hostel for SC/ST Students studying in Govt. /Govt. aided engineering



colleges was started this year. Under the scheme, an amount of Rs. 2 crores is provided by the council per institution. Based on the recommendation of the expert committee, 41 proposals duly recommended for construction of SC/ST hostels and released a sum of Rs.4090 lakhs under SC/ST hostel scheme as the first installment.

POST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Post graduate scholarship (PG) aims to provide financial assistance to M. Tech/ M. Pharm students having a valid GATE/GPAT score card. The limit of funding is Rs. 8000/- per month per student. A total of about 11500 students were provided with this scholarship and the amount of expenditure is Rs. 11564 Lakhs in the financial year 2012-13.

Chapter 2

Statutory Bodies

2.1 STATUTORY BODIES

Boards and Committees of the AICTE, the Executive Committee, ten All India Boards of Studies, eight Regional Committees are all of statutory nature.

The Council is a 51-member body and has a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman and a Member Secretary with tenure appointments. The Council includes amongst others, representatives of various Departments of the Government of India, the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha, Govt. of States and Union Territories, representatives from the Statutory Boards and Committees of the Council, Professional Bodies and organizations in the fields of concerned areas of technical education and research and also organizations in the field of industry and commerce, etc. The AICTE Act empowers the Council to take all such steps as it may think fit for ensuring coordinated and integrated development of technical education. The powers and functions assigned to the Council are given in APPENDIX-2.1. The Council performs its functions in consultation with State Governments, Universities, State Boards of Technical Education, Professional Bodies and experts etc.

The Executive Committee is a 21-member body constituted by the Council and discharges such functions as may be assigned to it by the Council. The Executive Committee is chaired by the Chairman of the Council and includes Vice-Chairman of the Council; Secretary to the Government of India; two Chairmen of the Regional Committees of the Council; three Chairmen of the All India Boards of Studies of the Council; one member of the Council representing the Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India; four members of the Council representing States/UTs; four members with expertise and distinction in areas relevant to technical education; Chairman of the University Grants Commission; Director of the Institute of Applied Manpower Research and Director General of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research. The Member-Secretary of AICTE is also the Member-Secretary of the Executive Committee.

The All India Boards of Studies advise the Executive Committee on academic matters falling in their areas of concern including norms & standards, model curricula, model facilities and structure of courses etc. The areas of concern, constitution, functions and powers of the Boards of Studies are such as may be provided by the Council through appropriate Regulations. Initially, the AICTE Act provided for the establishment of five Boards of Studies. Later, four more Boards of Studies were added by the Council and subsequently one more Board has been added. Boards of Studies have 10-15 members each and are headed by subject experts of eminence. The Council is assisted by eight statutory Regional Committees covering different geographical regions. These Committees advise and assist the Council in all aspects of planning, promoting and regulating technical education within their respective regions. Each Regional Committee has 15-20 members, headed by an engineer/technologist of eminence.



2.2 THE COUNCIL

Under the provision of Clause 3(4) of the AICTE Act (52 of 1987), the Council was reconstituted on May 20, 2011. The composition of the present Council is given in APPENDIX-2.2.

2.3 THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause 12(1) of the AICTE Act, 1987, the AICTE had reconstituted the Executive Committee on May 20, 2011 for a period of three years. The composition of the Executive Committee is given in APPENDIX-2.3.

2.4 ALL INDIA BOARDS OF STUDIES

The all India board of studies advice the Executive Committee on academic matters falling in their respective areas of concern including norms and standards, model curricula, model facilities and structure of courses, academic facilities and any other academic matter arising from time to time.

In Pursuance of the powers conferred under Clauses 13(1) and 13(2) of the AICTE Act, the All India Board of Studies were re-constituted by the council in December 2012. Nominations of the Chairman and the Members of the Boards were made for a term of three years. During the period under report, the council had ten statutory All India Boards advising the Council in their areas of specialization. The names of the Chairman of the various Boards are listed below:

2.5 REGIONAL COMMITTEES

According to Clause 14(3) of the AICTE Act, each Regional Committee advises and assists the Council on all aspects of planning, promoting and regulating technical education within their regions.

In pursuance of Clauses 14(1) and 14(2) of the AICTE Act, Regional Committees were constituted by the Council at Kolkata, Chennai, Kanpur and Mumbai on April 18, 1990 and subsequently three more Regional Committees were set up at Bangalore, Bhopal and Chandigarh in the year 1994. One Regional committee was also set up at Hyderabad on March 8, 2007.

Each Regional Committee has 15 to 20 members from industry, technical institutions, universities, State/Central government organizations and professional bodies/ societies working in the area of technical education. With its mission on planned and coordinated development of Technical Education in the Country by ensuring world-class standards of Institutions through accreditation, transparent governance and accountability in approach towards society, the activities related to Approval Process 2013-14 by the All India Council for Technical Education was commenced on 30th September 2012. "Access to Quality" and "Education to All" were the slogans for the year 2013-14 to give more impetus to quality in technical education and to be the best in the world.

AICTE had put forth several initiatives during the last three years to bring about changes in the Approval Process by introducing greater transparency and accountability through the e-governance. The activities for academic year 2013-14 were emphasised to put in place simplified procedures and greater ease in the approval process.

The Approval Process Handbook is published and released by AICTE every year with an aim to provide comprehensive information on the fair and rational system of administration as well as other necessary information on the processes and Institutions under the aegis of the AICTE. The modifications in procedure, regulations and mandates are updated in the Approval Process Handbooks so as to cater to the needs of qualitative upgradation in the Technical Education fraternity so as to emerge as the best of its kind in the World.

The role of AICTE as a regulator had geared up to weed out the Institutions not fulfilling the norms and standards. The e-governance procedures at AICTE brought about transparency, accountability and flexibility integrating the entire approval process. The Online submission of application for sanction of new institutions, extension of approval for existing institutions, addition of new programs, increase in intake of existing approved programmes and closure of institutions has already resulted in a much efficient system of administration which promoted prompt and timely disposal of the same. This unique system is of high ease for use, scalable, retrievable, secured and of course robust and has resulted in an overall increase in credibility and transparency. The Web based system with secured online access provided to all approved institutions acts as the channel for submitting applications online pertaining to various approvals and then the subsequent tracking of the same. The last date for receiving online applications related to all approvals was on 12th February 2013. An extension of 8 days was also provided for those institutions who failed to submit the applications in time, by levying a fine.




Plate 3.2: AICTE Approval Process Workshop at NSIT, Delhi on 18th October 2012

As per the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, AICTE had to complete all its activities pertaining to the Approval Process 2013-14 by 30th April, 2013. By adhering to this, the bureau had planned its activities well in advance and emerged successful in the effective completion of the process by the above mentioned date.



3.5 COMMON MANAGEMENT ADMISSION TEST (CMAT)-2013

National level common Management Admission test was launched by AICTE in 2012-2013. Its objective is to lessen the burden of students attending multiple examinations. This Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) facilitated the Institutions to select meritorious students for admission in all management centers approved and AICTE during the year 2012-13. This good initiative was taken to redress the issue of physical, mental and financial stress imposed on students by taking a number of entrance examinations conducted by various institutes across the country. This single window examination system was based on the timely judgment by Supreme Court.

The CMAT is conducted twice in a year that is in September /October or in February every year. Though students can appear in both the tests, the better of the two scores will be considered for admission. For 2013-14 session of admission first test was conducted between 27th Sep 2012 and 1st October 2012. A total number of 60811 students registered out of which 47139 students paid the fees and 42823 appeared the tests which were conducted in 54 cities with 67 centers for five days. The results were declared on 17th October 2012 and merit list was posted on AICTE CMAT website.

The second test for academic year 2013-14 was conducted from 21st Feb to 25th Feb 2013. A total number of 1,54,800 students registered out of which 1,34,394 students paid the fees 1,17,437 appeared the tests which were conducted in 62 cities with 114 centers. The results were declared on 13th March 2013 and the merit list was posted on AICTE CMAT website.

The maximum marks score was 400. All India merit list was displayed to facilitate them joining in post graduate management programmes and in diploma level courses for 2012-2013. This has also encouraged the state governments to allot students in respective institutions through their strategies of choice. On the advice of the state governments AICTE decided to conduct a supplementary on line CMAT examination exclusive for absentees. The registration portal was opened to apply for the students who could not appear in the earlier CMAT examination till 10th March.

3.6 COMPUTER BASED ONLINE GRADUATE PHARMACY APTITUDE TEST-2013

Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test(GPAT), an all India Examination was launched by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi with effect from the academic year 2011-12 for admission to Master's Programme in Pharmacy (M.Pharm) and for the award of post graduate and doctoral fellowships.

The first GPAT examination (GPAT-2010) and the subsequent ones for 2011 and 2012 were conducted in 'paper pencil' mode by AICTE in association with M.S. University of Baroda. Considering the success of online CMAT, AICTE decided to conduct Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) from 2013. The online registration window for GPAT-2013 was opened on March 08, 2013. The test was conducted online in 57 cities from 16th May to 18th May, 2013 and scores awarded used for admission in the post graduate pharmacy programs at national level for the year 2013-14.



3.7 DEEMED-TO-BE / DENOVO DEEMED-TO-BE- / PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES

Universities, deemed universities and other universities established by state legislature and which impart technical education are required to comply with the norms and standards prescribed by AICTE every now and then.

In pursuance of the UGC letters for conferment of deemed to be university status to the institutions in the light of Ministry of Human Resources Development notification no. F. no. 2-1 / 2006U.3(A), dated 5th April 2006 and as per provisions contained in section 20(1) of the AICTE Act, a visiting team was sent by AICTE for on the spot assessment of these institutions, as per directives of the MHRD letter "AICTE will nominate a representative on the inspection committee of the UGC; the person so nominated by the AICTE may; in addition, head a team of the AICTE on the same day and such other person would not be part of the UGC's team but merely to assist the nominee of the AICTE on the UGC committee. The nominee of the AICTE on the committee could give his or her report to the chairman AICTE in the Performa prescribed by the AICTE and also on any additional point required by the UGC; which should be forwarded by the AICTE to the UGC. UGC Committee would incorporate the comments of the AICTE in its report before the Commission so that the Commission could take appropriate decision in the matter before making any recommendation to the MHRD. It has been felt that the arrangement would serve the purpose of a de facto joint inspection while at the same time satisfying the requirements of the AICTE act regarding its own inspection. Such an arrangement would ensure that the comments of the AICTE's nominee reflect adequately the comments of the Council and are not merely the individual perceptions of the nominee. This would also satisfy the directions given vide this Ministry's orders of the 5th April 2006, wherein consultation with statutory councils has been mandated before the UGC forwarded its recommendations to the Central Government".

In view of the above direction of MHRD and on the request of UGC during the year 2012-2013, AICTE has nominated a representative to be a part of the UGC team on 3 cases along with a panel of Experts to assist the AICTE nominee to assess the physical and academic infrastructure for conferment of Deemed-to-be/ Denovo Deemed-to-be/ Private Universities status and for reviewing the physical and academic infrastructure and performance of the existing Deemed / Private Universities. The visit to the following 3 Universities has been conducted in the year under report and reports forwarded to UGC.

- 1. National Institute of Food Technology Entrepreneurship and Management (NIFTEM), Kundli, Sonepet District, Haryana.
- GITAM Off-Campus, Nagadenahalli to Devanahalli Road, Kasaba Hobli, Konagatia Post, Doddaballapur Taluk, Bangalore Rural District, Karnataka.
- 3. Amity University, Block-J2, Ground Floor, Amity University Campus, Sector-125, Noida.

3.8 UNAPPROVED INSTITUTIONS

All India Council for Technical Education was established by an Act of Parliament (Act 52 of 1987) with a function to grant approval for establishment of new technical institutions, introduction of new courses etc. Regulations have also been notified by the Council with a provision that no technical institution shall conduct technical education programmes in Engineering & Technology, Management & Catering Technology, and Applied Arts & Crafts in India or with any Foreign Universities or in collaboration, without obtaining prior mandatory approval from AICTE. These regulations also have a provision for taking action against unapproved technical institutions.



Further that any Institution offering Technical regulations without approval of the Council; shall be termed as unapproved if:

- It is started without prior approval by the Council
- It is working in temporary location / at location not approved by the Council.
- It is declared as "Unapproved" by the Council.

The institutions conducting unapproved courses have been directed from time to time through Public Notices and individual letters by intimation to the concerned state government to seek AICTE approval for conduct of technical education programmes or to close down.

Further if any Technical Institution, which has already been started without following AICTE approval procedure, and wishes to submit an application, such a proposal shall be considered as 'New Technical Institution'. For that purpose, they shall apply as per the provisions of 'Chapter 1' of Approval Process Handbook.

Removal of the institution name from the list of unapproved institutions can be done after being examined by a hearing committee and their recommendations.

The Council maintains a list of unapproved Institutions, based on the information received from various sources and the Council also publishes the list of names of such institutes, for the benefit of general public in its website from time to time. A list of 312 unapproved institutions, as on 31st March 2013, running technical education programs / courses without prior approval of AICTE, has been published on the AICTE website.

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Chapter 4

Research and Institutional Development

4.1 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Clauses 10(c) and 10(d) of the AICTE Act, strongly promotes innovation and research and encourages development and novel technologies. It also supports in generating, adopting and following innovative technologies to meet the developmental requirements as well as educational improvement across the nation.

To cater to these objectives the council operates under three schemes: (i) Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS) (ii) Research Promotion Scheme (RPS) and (iii) Nationally Coordinated Projects (NCP).

During the year under study, a total number of 750 Projects were approved for financial support under MODROBS and RPS schemes and the council sanctioned a sum of Rs.8673.34 lakhs in total

The council is also regularly monitoring the sanctioned projects by constantly reviewing the progress and utilization of grants.

4.2 SCHEMES TO SUPPORT RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Council operates the following Schemes for supporting Research and Institutional Development:

- i) Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS)
- ii) Research Promotion Scheme (RPS)

4.2.1 Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS)

The main objective of the Scheme of Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence is to provide financial support to institutions to equip their laboratories with modern equipment/infrastructure facilities, keeping in view rapid advancements in technology. Institutions were provided funds for replacement of obsolete equipment with modern, state-of-the-art equipment to ensure quality of educational process. Funding for this scheme is limited to Rs. 20 lakhs.

MODROBS: After an initial scrutiny at the Bureau level, the proposals are evaluated by a duly constituted expert committee. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council approves grant-in-aid under the scheme.

During the period 2012-13, the Council received 4000 proposals under Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS) scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by the expert



committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 534 were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 5364.94 Lakhs for the financial year 2012-2013.

The distribution of projects sanctioned under MODROB scheme during 2012-13 based on the Zone wise is shown in Fig. 4.1. State-wise distribution of projects sanctioned is given in Fig. 4.2 respectively.




Fig: 4.1 Region wise Distribution of Grant under MODROBS during 2012-13.




Fig: 4.2 State wise distribution of grantunder MODROBS during 2012-13.

4.2.2 Research Promotion Scheme (RPS)

RPS aims to create research ambience by promoting research in technical disciplines and innovations in established and emerging technologies. Research and development activities are considered as an essential component of higher education because of their role in creating new knowledge and insight and imparting excitement and dynamism to the educational process, as well as make them need based in view of the national requirements.



The objective of this scheme is to create and update the general research capabilities of the faculty members of the various Technical Institutes. Institutions are provided funds for this scheme limited to Rs. 25 lakhs.

Research Promotion Scheme (RPS):

During the period 2012-13, the Council received 2890 proposals under Research Promotion Scheme (RPS). These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by the expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 267 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs.3234.66Lakhs.

The distribution of projects sanctioned during the year based on the Region-wise is shown in Fig.4.3 Institution-wise distribution of projects and state-wise distribution of projects sanctioned are given in Fig. 4.4. State-wise distribution of projects sanctioned under the scheme of RPS during 2012-13 is given in Fig.4.5 respectively.




Fig: 4.3 Region wise Distribution of Grant (in %) under RPS during 2012-13.




Fig: 4.4 Institutional category wise Distribution of Grant under RPS during 2012-13.






Fig: 4.5 State wise Distribution of Grant under RPS during 2012-13.

AICTE invites project proposals under the above schemes and provides information through an advertisement and its official website.

4.2.3 Nationally Coordinated Project (NCP)

The Nationally Coordinated Project Scheme aims to plan, co-ordinate and execute integrated R&D programmes, involving collaboration between several institutions, Industry and user organizations at national level for societal development programmes.

More specifically, the research ventures that may be considered within Nationally Coordinated Project Scheme include the following:

- 1. The research should be carried out at a national level institution in coordination with participating institutions having proven track record and sufficient expertise in the proposed area.
- The lead institution must choose a person of eminence having relevant knowledge and expertise in the proposed area of research as the chief coordinator of the project.
- The project should have financial participation from the participating industry (if any) to the extent possible.

The All India Council for Technical Education supports two categories of Nationally Coordinated Projects for Technical Education.

- Catering to important issues of national importance.
- ii Catering to technical education development.

The funding limit is Rs.50 lakhs in 3 installments under this scheme.

During the year 2012-13, the Council received 30 proposals under NCP. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 04 proposals were recommended for funding for 3 years. Total Grant released in 2012-13 is Rs.73.72 Lakhs.

Chapter 5

Staff Development Programme

5.1. AICTE-INAE (INDIAN NATIONAL ACADEMY OF ENGINEERING) DISTINGUISHED VISITING PROFESSORSHIP SCHEME

AICTE-INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship Scheme is jointly executed by AICTE and Indian National Academy Engineering (INAE). The scheme envisages promotion of Industry-Institute Interaction by facilitating the dissemination of knowledge through the expertise of experienced and knowledgeable person from industry to integrate rich industrial experience with technical education. The scheme has received very enthusiastic response from industry and engineering institution over the years.

The Distinguished Visiting Professor contributes by delivering series of lectures on the state of the art of the industry, industrial ambiance and problems etc. A Distinguished Visiting Professor further help in the project work of the students by way of identifying, guiding and evaluating the projects. The project guidance done is either at the host institution or at the industry under the supervision of Distinguished Visiting Professors and the local faculty. Further, the Distinguished Visiting Professors are also expected through their interaction with academic staff to act as a catalyst, towards an integrated approach and in curriculum development.

5.2 QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (QIP)

With the objective of upgrading the expertise, qualification and capabilities of the faculty members of degree level technical institutions, the Government of India launched the Quality Improvement Programme (QIP) in 1970, which is now being implemented and monitored by the Council. Since 2001, QIP has also been extended to the teachers in approved polytechnic. During the year 2012-13, under the scheme, AICTE has sanctioned and released Rs.585.78 Lakhs to various centers. Approved QIP centers in India are listed in **Appindex-5.1**, **5.2 & 5.3**. The major activities under QIP include:

(a) Master's and Doctoral Degree Programmes

Under this scheme, faculty members of AICTE approved institutions are given an opportunity to upgrade their qualifications. Certain selected institutions offer Master's and Doctoral Programmes to faculty members selected under these programmes. Participating faculty members are paid scholarships and contingency grant by the Council.



(b) Short Term Programme

In order to upgrade the knowledge and skills to teachers working in different institutions in the country, AICTE provides financial assistance for organizing Short-Term Training Programmes (STTP) in emerging areas of Engineering & Technology and other disciplines through major QIP centers.

(c) Curriculum Development

The major QIP Centers are provided assistance to conduct workshops for curriculum development. This leads to Model Curriculum Development, which are used as base documents by many institutions.

5.3 CAREER AWARDS FOR YOUNG TEACHERS (CAYT)

The purpose of CAYT Scheme is to identify young talented teachers who have established competence in their area of specialization and promote their professional growth by enabling them to devote major component of their time in research and study. The award is for a period of two years and this period is to be devoted to work on a specified project with a teaching load of a maximum of six hours per week in parent institution.

Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 12 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 29.84 Lakhs for the financial year 2012-13.




Fig. 5.1 State wise Distribution of Grant under CAYT during 2012-13.

The distribution of projects sanctioned during the year based on the State-wise distribution is shown in Fig.5.1

5.4 EMERITUS FELLOWSHIP

The Scheme of Emeritus Fellowship was launched during the year 1994-95. The main objective of the scheme is to utilize the services of meritorious and experienced superannuated professors in technical institutions for institutional development of existing and new emerging institutes, in research and development etc.

The funding is limited to Rs.6.00 lakhs per year with four installments (once in six months) up to two years for superannuated professors/ scientists of reputed Institutes. During the year 2012-13, two meetings were held for EF and 12 proposals were recommended for financial assistance. The grant amounting toRs.36.49 Lakhs has been released.



5.5 SEMINAR GRANT

The Scheme of Seminar Grant is designed to promote high standards in technical education by extending opportunities to academicians and working professionals by providing a forum for sharing their knowledge, experiences, innovations and inventions. The scheme provides financial assistance to AICTE approved institutions for organizing Symposia/ Conferences/ Seminars / Workshops at national and international levels in various fields of technical education.

During the year 2012-13, based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 103 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs.72.65 Lakhs. The region-wise and State wise distribution of these are given in Figures 5.2-5.3 respectively. During the year, an amount of Rs. 72.65 lakhs was released to various institutions under the Seminar Grant Scheme.




Fig: 5.2 Region wise Distribution of Proposals under SEMINAR GRANT during 2012-13




Fig: 5.3 State wise Distribution of Proposals under SEMINAR GRANT during 2012 13



5.6 TRAVEL GRANT

The Scheme of Travel Grant extends financial assistance to enable full time regular faculty from AICTE approved technical institutions for interaction at international level in Conference/Seminars/Symposia etc. The assistance provided on reimbursement basis, of actual expenses or Rs. 1.00 lac whichever is less as incurred towards airfare, registration fee and per diem allowance.

During the year 2012-13, 25 faculty members of different Technical Institutes were offered financial support to attend international workshops/conferences/symposium. The region-wise and state-wise distributions of these grants are given in Figures 5.4 to 5.5.




Fig: 5.4 Region wise Distribution of Proposals under TRAVEL GRANT during 2012-13




Fig 5.5 State wise Distribution of Proposals in percentage under TRAVEL GRANT during 2012-13



5.7 STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (SDP)

The Scheme is intended to provide opportunities for young teachers employed in AICTE approved technical education institutions for their induction-training and up gradation of their knowledge and skills towards effective teaching and delivery of knowledge to the students. The programme is proposed to cover areas such as Technology Policy, Industrial Policy, new concepts to keep pace with the changing technology, educational technology, and communication skills etc.

During the Year 2012-13, 329 proposals for conducting Staff Development Programmes were approved for an amount of Rs.890.56Lakhs under the scheme. The region-wise and state-wise distribution of the Staff Development Programmes is given in Figure 5.6 to 5.7.




Fig: 5.6 Region wise Distribution of Proposals (Numbers) under STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME during 2012-13




Fig 5.7 State wise Distribution of Proposals under STAFF

5.8 NATIONAL DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP (NDF)

The scheme of National Doctoral Fellowship was launched during the year 2003-04. The main objective of the scheme is to attract highly qualified and motivated candidates to pursue doctoral degree and offer themselves for teaching positions in technical education system. The scheme also provided research support to bright young candidates for pursing exciting and innovative research in the field of technical education. The National Doctoral Fellowship (NDF) Scheme is discontinued from year 2010-11, though the candidates selected during the previous years for three year financial grant were continued for the same.

During the year 2012-13, 32 proposals recommended by the Expert Committee and Grant of Rs.86.12 Lakhs was released to various institutions in different installments under NDF scheme.

Chapter 6

Industry Institute Interaction

6.1 GENERAL

The Council acts as a promoter to create an effective association between technical education system and other related structures like industry and research community. To nurture the above purpose, the council operates under the following schemes: (i) Industry Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC) (ii) Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) and (iii) National Facilities in Engineering and Technology with Industrial Collaboration (NAFETIC). The Council during the year under study has sanctioned an amount of Rs115.56 lakhs rupees under the above citied scheme.

6.2 SCHEME OF INDUSTRY INSTITUTE PARTNERSHIP CELL (IIPC)

The Scheme of Industry Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC) is operated by the Council to promote Industry Institute Interaction, that is, between technical institutions and industries. The main objective of this scheme is to establish Institute-Industry Partnership Cells in AICTE approved technical institutes/technical departments of Universities, which will act as liaison centers between industries and various departments of the institutes for mutually beneficial activities. To start with, in the first year, the Council provides financial assistance up to a maximum of Rs.5 lakhs as one time non-recurring grant and Rs. 10 lakhs as recurring grant to create Industry Institute Partnership Cells in selected technical institutes. It is envisaged that after 2 years these Cells will be self-supporting.

The major objectives of IIPC scheme are:

- Maintenance, coordination and promotion of consultancy services.
- Establishment of proper links, coordination with departments, agencies and taking necessary action for promotion of consultancy services.
- Encourage internship programme/student's fellowship programmes.
- Organize Industry Study Tour Programmes (ISTP) and liaison with concerned industries/ industrialists.
- Signing of MOU on behalf of the Institution.
- Generate funds from industry/other agencies for maintenance and development of the cell.
- Assist Industries in obtaining tax incentives from GOI by supporting R&D programmes in the Institution.



- Maintain and distribute funds obtained from consultancy services, assist weak departments in the institutes/ universities from the funds generated through consultancy for strengthening of the University/Institute/Department.
- Invite experts from industry to participate in curriculum development and training from time to time
 in consultation with the Department/Institute/University.

During the period 2012-13, the Council received 65 proposals under IIPC scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council has provided financial assistance to establish 03 new cells and an amount of Rs.21.15 Lakhs was released under the scheme. List of IIPC is appended in APPENDIX-6.1.

6.3 ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL (EDC)

This Scheme was launched with a view to encourage students in AICTE approved Polytechnics and Degree Technical institutions to consider self-employment as a career option, provide training in entrepreneurship through modular courses and increase the relevance of management particularly in the non-corporate and under-managed sectors.

The objectives of the Scheme are as follows:

- To create an environment for self-employment and entrepreneurship development through formal and non-formal programmes.
- To introduce the concept of entrepreneurship in curricula at diploma and degree levels.
- To develop management personnel at appropriate levels for the non-corporate and un-organized sectors like education, rural development, small-scale industry etc.
- To utilize the infrastructure facilities and technically trained manpower for development of noncorporate and unorganized sectors.
- 5. To promote employment opportunities.

With a view to fulfill the above needs, Entrepreneurship Development Cells have been established by AICTE in various institutions and universities. The activities that are visualized at the EDCs include Entrepreneurship Development/ Awareness Programmes, Continuing Education, Skill Development Programmes, Quality Assistance, Support Facility for Entrepreneurship as a career option, Curricula Input on establishment of an enterprise & its management, Solutions for small business management & entrepreneurs and training & retraining of entrepreneurs.




Fig. 6.1 Region wise Distribution of Grant (in %) under ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL during 2012-13




Fig. 6.2 State wise Distribution of Grant under ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL during 2012-13

During the period 2012-13, the Council received 240 proposals under EDC scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 30 new Entrepreneurship Development Cells were given financial aid of Rs.93.40 lakhs under the EDC scheme. Region wise, Institution wise& State wise Distribution of Grant under ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL (EDC) during 2012-13 is given in Fig. 6.1, 6.2, respectively. List of EDC is appended in APPENDIX-6.2.

6.4 OTHER GRANTS RELEASE DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2012-13

6.4.1 Hostel for SC/ST students




Fig. 6.3 Region wise Distribution of Grant under SC/ST hostels scheme during 2012-13

During the financial period 2012-13, the Council received proposals under SC/ST hostel scheme. These proposals are evaluated as per the approvel procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 41 proposals were duly recommended for construction of SC/ST hostels. RIFD Bureau has released Rs.4090 Lakhs under the SC/ST hostels scheme in the year 2012-13. The Region wise distribution of grant under the SC/ST hostels scheme is shown in Fig. 6.3.

6.4.2 Indian National Digital Library in Engineering Sciences and Technology (INDEST)

During the financial period 2012-13, the Council received proposal under INDEST schemes. This proposal was evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 1 new INDEST was given financial aid of Rs.239.38 lakhs

6.4.3 Post Graduate Scholarship (PG)

Post graduate scholarship (PG) aims to provide financial assistance to M. Tech/ M Pharma students with valid GATE/GPAT score card. The limit of funding is Rs. 8000/- per month per student. During the financial year 2012-13, 515 proposals were sectioned and grant amounting Rs. 11564 Lakhs has been released.

The grant released by the RIFD Bureau under different schemes during the financial year 2012-13, excluding the online payment under PG grant has been summarized in Table. 6.4.

Chapter 7

Vocational Education

7.1 NATIONAL VOCATIONAL EDUCATION QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK (NVEQF) FOR ENGINEERING AND POLYTECHNIC COLLEGES

All India Council for Technical Education launched the NVEQF Programme on 8^{th} October 2011 for development of skilled manpower for diversified sector through short term, structured job oriented courses through existing AICTE approved polytechnics and degree level institutions.

The council invited online applications for registration for Skill Knowledge Provider (SKP) and Institutions under NVEQF as per the specializations given as APPENDIX-7.1, and processed the registration of all eligible Institutes and Skill Knowledge Providers. The names of all such Institutes and SKP's were uploaded on AICTE web portal for the information of stakeholders.

For session 2012-2013 AICTE has issued letter of registration, which is as follows:-

7.2 Community College Scheme

AICTE has launched a scheme of approving Community Colleges to be started in AICTE approved polytechnics and other colleges in India. Such colleges will impart five levels of training with 1000 hours of learning of vocational and general education at each level. There is no predefined entry level qualification for admission to such community colleges. At the fifth level, the student may be awarded Community Skill Diploma.

8.2 USE OF HINDI IN THE ACTIVITIES OF AICTE

8.2.1 Meetings Of Official Language Implementation Committee

For proper compliance of Official Language Act, 1963, Official Language Rules, 1976 and propagation of the progressive use of Hindi in the Council, an Official Language Implementation Committee has been set up in the Council headed by the Member Secretary to assess the progressive use of Hindi and to comply the orders issued by Ministry of Human Resources Development and Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs from time to time. Two meetings for the purpose were held on 18 July, 2012 and 05 October, 2012.

8.2.2 'Takniki Pathyapustak Puraskar Yojana' (TPPY) Scheme

To achieve the goals of planned and co-ordinated development of technical education and to implement the provisions of the Official Language policy of the Government of India, All India Council for Technical Education, has introduced 'TAKNIKI PATHYAPUSTAK PURASKAR YOJANA' with a view to provide state of the art knowledge of Engineering and Technology in Hindi Language. The scheme encourages to write standard technical textbooks in Hindi to facilitate class-room instructions in Hindi language in Hindi speaking states. This scheme has turned out to be very popular and has succeeded in its objectives.

For the year 2011 Scheme, total 27 entries were received which is to be evaluated by a subject ecxpert committee of AICTE.



Powers and Functions of the Council (Extracted from AICTE Act, 1987)

It shall be the duty of the Council to take all such steps as it may think fit for ensuring coordinated and integrated development of technical and management education and maintenance of standards and for the purposes of performing its functions under AICTE Act, the Council may:

- (a) undertake survey in the various fields of technical education, collect data on all related matters and make forecast of the needed growth and development in technical education;
- (b) coordinate the development of technical education in the country at all levels;
- (c) allocate and disburse out of the Fund of the Council such grants, on such terms and conditions as it may think fit to;
 - i) Technical institutions, and
 - ii) Universities imparting technical education in coordination with the Commission;
- (d) promote innovations, research and development in established and new technologies, generation, adoption and adaptation of new technologies to meet developmental requirements and for over-all improvement of educational processes;
- (e) formulate schemes for promoting technical education for women, handicapped and weaker sections of the society;
- (f) Promote an effective link between technical education system and other relevant systems including research and development organizations, industry and the community;
- (g) evolve suitable performance appraisal systems for Technical Institutions and Universities imparting technical education, incorporating norms and mechanisms for enforcing accountability;
- (h) formulate schemes for the initial and in service training of teachers and identify institutions or centres and set up new centres for offering staff development programmes including continuing education of teachers;
- (i) lay down norms and standards for courses, curricula, physical and instructional facilities, staff pattern, staff qualifications, quality instructions, assessment and examinations;
- fix norms and guidelines for charging tuition and other fees;
- (k) grant approval for starting new technical institutions and for introduction of new courses or programmes in consultation with the agencies concerned;



- (I) advise the Central Government in respect of grant of charter to any professional body or institution in the field of technical education conferring powers, rights and privileges on it for the promotion of such profession in its field including conduct of examinations and awarding of membership certificates;
- (m) lay down norms for granting autonomy to technical institutions;
- (n) take all necessary steps to prevent commercialization of technical education;
- (o) provide guidelines for admission of students to Technical Institutions and Universities imparting technical education;
- (p) inspect or cause to inspect any Technical Institution;
- (q) withhold or discontinue grants in respect of courses, programmes to such technical institutions which fail to comply with the directions given by the Council within the stipulated period of time and take such other steps as may be necessary for ensuring compliance of the directions of the Council;
- (r) take steps to strengthen the existing organizations, and to set up new organizations to ensure effective discharge of the Council's responsibilities and to create positions of professional, technical and supporting staff based on requirements;
- (s) declare technical institutions at various levels and types offering courses in technical education fit to receive grants;
- (t) advise the Commission for declaring any institution imparting technical education as a Deemed University;
- (u) set up a National Board of Accreditation to periodically conduct evaluation of technical institutions or programmes on the basis of guidelines, norms and standards specified by it and to make recommendations to it, or to the Council, or to the Commission or to other bodies, regarding recognition or de-recognition of the institution or the programmes and
- (v) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed.

Inspection:

- For the purposes of ascertaining the financial needs of technical institution or a University or its standards of teaching, examination and research, the council may cause an inspection of any department or departments of such technical institution or University to be made in such manner as may be prescribed and by such person or persons as it may direct.
- 2. The Council shall communicate to the technical institution or University the date on which any inspection under sub-section (1) is to be made and the technical institution or University shall be entitled to be associated with the inspection in such manner as may be prescribed.
- 3. The Council shall communicate to the technical institution or the University, its views in regard to the results of any such inspection and may, after ascertaining the opinion of that technical institution or University, recommend to that institution or University the action to be taken as a result of such inspection.
- 4. All communications to a technical institution or University under this section shall be made to the executive authority thereof and the executive authority of the technical institution or University shall report to the Council the action, if any, which is proposed to be taken for the purposes of implementing any such recommendation as is referred to in sub-section (3).

SCHEDULE-24

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Accounts

- a) Separate set of accounts are maintained by the Council in respect of Plan, Non-Plan and CPF activities.
- b) Except in case of Grants-in-aid (accounted for on cash basis), the Council adopts Hybrid System of Accounting.

2. Grants-in-Aid

Grants are recognized on receipt basis & taken to credit of Income & Expenditure account except to the extent of expenditure of capital nature incurred (which amount is credited directly to the capital fund). Any Non monetary grant received free is reflected at nominal amount of Re.1/-

3. Fixed assets and Depreciations

- a) Fixed Assets are carried in the books at cost. In view of the fact that making/ determination of profit is not the motive behind the activities of the Council, no adjustment is made on account of Depreciation.
- b) On periodical, physical verification the obsolete and non-usable assets are identified and cost thereof written off by debit to the capital fund account.
- c) Receipts, if any, on the sale of these assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts'.

4. Specific Expenses/ Payments

a) Printing & Stationary

The amount spent for printing of publications, is treated as expenditure as and when incurred. No adjustments are made in accounts for the closing stocks, as the value is not determinable.

b) Telephone Deposit

Deposit for telephone and allied facilities is written off during the year of installation/commissioning and charges/ expenditure bills are accounted for at the net value after adjustment, if any, for initial deposit, by the concerned department.

5. Interest on All Deposits/ Investments is accounted for on cash basis.

6. Employees Salaries/Benefits

- a) Central Government Employees service rules are by and large, made applicable to the employees of the Council.
- b) Retirement benefits are accounted for on cash basis, as per system prevailing in case of Central Government Employees.
- c) The Council maintains a separate Notified Provident Fund account for its employees.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

- 1. Grant received from Government, based on budget approved by the Parliament, constitute main source of receipts/ income of the Council. Though the grants received (after the adjustment of expenditure of capital nature) are taken to income and expenditure account, the effective income of the Council is nil in the light of restrictions that without sanction of Government, the unspent balance of Grants can not be carried over from one financial year to another. Thus this does not attract any Income tax liability.
- Surplus funds under Plan and Non-Plan head are kept temporarily with Schedule Bank in special flexible saving cum fixed deposit account with higher net interest earnings. No restrictions exist on utilization of amount at any point of time.
- 3. Expenditure on Establishment, Printing and Stationary and Telephone deposits have been given the accounting treatment as per accounting policy.
- The cost of publication as on 31.03.2012 and 31.03.2013 was Rs.12,25,150/- and Rs12, 25,150/-
- 5. The project for implementation of E-Governance was awarded to L & T Infotech Ltd. from Plan Fund for during the F/Y 2009-10 for implementation of E-Governance for AICTE approval process. An amount of Rs. 2,30,99,981/- towards cost of E-Governance has been capitalized during the year 2012-2013.
- 6. An advance of Rs. 49,12,,58,000/- has been paid to CCE (R & D Central, D R D O) up to 31.03.2013, as Advance for construction of AICTE H.O. building at J.N.U. Campus.

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- An advance of Rs.15, 00,000/- has been paid to NWRO, Chandigarh for renovation of office building, which has been completed but the amount has been shown as advance since its adjustment is under process.
- 8. An amount of Rs.185,08,50,886.45/- was received as processing fees in ICICI Bank and Rs. 22, 01, 46,975/- was received as Application fees of C-MAT in SBI through e-banking and e-receipts facility under the policy of e-governance and as per gazette AICTE regulations for approval process and the same has been shown as fees received through e-governance online system in Non Plan Fund as on 31.03.2013.
- 9. Rs. 400, 00, 00,000/- being Grant in Aid sanctioned by the Ministry of H.R.D.in F.Y. 2012-13,
- 10. Fixed Deposit has been shown as part of closing balances of Bank in Receipts & Payments Account.
- 11. Advances made and shown as recoverable are adjusted to final head of account/recovered on receipt of Final bill/receipt from the concern party/department.
- 12. From the Financial Year 2011-12, the council has started taking Interest Free security deposit course wise from New approved Institutes, which has been earmarked and invested in Fixed Deposit Receipts.
- 13. From the Financial Year 2011-12 the Council has conducted Common Management Aptitude
 Test (CMAT) and has collected Fee for Registration and Appearing in Entrance Examination.
 The same has been deposited in separate Bank Account, CMAT-SBI A/c and CMAT-ICICI A/c.
- 14. An Advance of Rs 4,70,36,805/- has been paid to EDCIL for providing manpower to Council, which is yet to be adjusted, shown as advance as on 31.03.2013.
- 15. Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever considered necessary.



AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR
2012-13





Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for the year ended 31st March 2013

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Council for Technical Education (Council) as at 31st March 2013, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that day under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 19 of the AICTE Act, 1987. These financial statements include the accounts of eight regional offices of AICTE. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any are reported through inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit also includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the base of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - ii. The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the common format of accounts as prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.
 - iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the AICTE in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
 - iv. We further report that:



COMMENTS ON ACCOUNTS

A. Balance Sheet

A.I Liability

A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule-7) Rs.183.40 crore

The above does not include liabilities for expenses payable of Rs.20.69 lakh (salary Rs.17.45 lakh and security charges Rs. 3.24 lakh) resulting in understatement of Liabilities & overstatement of Corpus Fund by Rs. 20.69 lakh.

A.2 Assets

A.2.1. Fixed Assets (Schedule-VIII) - Rs.25.87 crore

- (i) The above neither include land acquired free of cost by the Council in various location i.e. 05 acres from JNU, New Delhi, 4074 Sq. mtrs. in Kanpur, 02 acres in Bhopal and 50 cents (0.5 acre) in Trivandrum nor any disclosure has been made in the Notes on Accounts. In the accounts, value of land and building has not been shown distinctly.
- (ii) No depreciation had been provided on fixed assets as per Accounting Standards 6 resulting in overstatement of Fixed Assets and understatement of Expenditure.
- (iii) The payment of Rs.43.09 lakh to M/s L&T Infotech Ltd towards cost of additional work on e-governance project was booked in the account as revenue expenditure under 'Other Administrative Expenditure' resulting in understatement of Fixed Assets and overstatement of Expenditure by the same amount.
- (iv) The above includes assets of Rs.8.88 crore under the head Software Development (E Governance), out of which Rs.61.55 lakh pertains to the cost of maintenance for the year 2012-13. This has resulted in overstatement of Fixed Assets and Corpus/Capital Fund both by like amount.

A.2.2 Current Assets Loan & Advances (Schedule 11) – Rs. 214.11 Crore.

The Council had paid total advance of Rs.4.70 crore (Deposit & Advances) to EDCIL upto 31.3.2013 i.e. from February 2010 to March 2013 for disbursement of salary/OTA, honorarium, etc. on quarterly basis. EDCIL furnished UC's for the period 2009-10 to 2011-12 amounting to Rs.3.11 crore which was not adjusted. This has resulted in overstatement of Advances and understatement Expenditure by like amount.

B. Notes on accounts and accounting policies

B.1 As per the Common Format of Accounts prescribed for Central Autonomous Bodies (CABs) the Council has to maintain its accounts on accrual basis, however as stated in Significant Accounting Policy No.1, the Council is maintaining its accounts on cash basis in the case of grant in aid and had adopted Hybrid system of accounting. It is a combination of the Cash Basis Accounting and Accrual Basis Accounting. This reflects non-conformity with the Common Format of Accounts as prescribed by Ministry of Finance.



B.2 As per the Principal Accounting Policy No.6 (b) the retirement benefits are accounted for on cash basis which is contravention of Accounting Standard 15 and Common Format of Accounts.

C. Grant in aid

The Council received grants in aid of Rs. 400.00 crore under Plan including Rs. 40.00 crore for NER. Out of this grant, Council received Rs. 130.00 crore in the month of March 2013. It had own plan receipts of Rs. 13.89 crore. Out of total amount or Rs.413.89 crore, it utilized Rs. 387.83 crore leaving a balance of Rs. 26.06 crore.

D. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Chairman, All India Council for Technical Education through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action .

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - a. In so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the All India Council for Technical Education as at 31st March 2013; and
 - b. In so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on the date.

The physical verification of stationery and consumable has been conducted upto 2012-13.

 As per accounts, no payments over six months in respect of statutory dues were outstanding as on 31.3.2013
