



PREFACE

Since its establishment as an advisory body in 1945, and subsequently as a statutory body by an act of parliament in 1987, All India Council for Technical Education has been performing efficiently to meet its objectives – overall development of technical education system, qualitative betterment of technical education, quantitative progression and constant maintaining of fair standard and excellent norms.

Its landmark achievement was on 10th January 2010, when AICTE realized e-governance and on line submission of application for the approval of institutions across the nation. To further its progress, it also implemented online submissions for variations in sanctioned intake, extension of approval of existing institutions and closure of institutions, system of approval and so on. Transparency, efficiency and promptness in administration are the fruitful outcome of the e-governance.

E-governance, since 2010, also put an end to certain incongruities in the system like inordinate delays and unfair practices of the past. It attained a massive shift from primitive methods of the past which were lacking in robust practices and procedures. E-governance brought about not only transparency in administration but also accountability and flexibility in all its governance. The transformation was from a mere transaction level to a perfect process driven system based on rules and also subject to scrutiny and RTI complaints. The system is effortless, scalable, retrievable, secure and robust. It has earned the credibility and trust. This secure web based system is utilized not only for various online applications and approvals but also the subsequent 'follow up' of the applications by the applicants. This system has furnished a reporting and analytical tool for AICTE. By automated notifications via email and providing online grievance reddressal mechanism, it has further enhanced the stake holders confidence.

To foster the cause of transparency and accountability with its stake holders, AICTE is also currently implementing the workflow, accounts, electronic record, digitalization of records, security systems, and legal case tracking of applications; mail serving and video conferencing across the regions of India. Inordinate delays, manual processing of maintaining applications and other primitive methods were eliminated by the introduction of egovernance. It is well replaced by absolute transparency at all levels, reduction in cost of operations, higher productivity and a better control due to enhanced reporting. For instance, report generation earlier was difficult due to the absence of single comprehensive online database of colleges.

Previously, during the year under report, a number of meetings were conducted. In all (i) five meetings of the council (ii) five meetings of executive committee (iii) twelve meetings of All India Board of Studies and (iv) forty-one meetings of the Regional committees were conducted.

Towards augmenting the quality and standards of technical education, the council equipped its faculty development programmes under various schemes such as Quality Improvement Programme, Career Award for young teachers, Emeritus Fellowship, Seminar Grant, Travel grant, Staff Development Programme, National Doctoral Fellowship, AICTE, INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship and so on. The council also implemented Research and Institutional Development schemes such as MODROBS, Research Promotion Scheme etc AICTE – INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship (DVP), Research Park (RP), Innovation Promotion Scheme (TPS), AICTE – INAE –TRF (Teacher Research Fellowship), AICTE – INAE –TG (Travel Grant to Students), SWSS-Summer-Winter School Scheme. Employability Enhancement Training Programme (EETP) and Hostel for SC/ST Students for providing enhanced facilities and improved quality of technical education.



To reduce the burden of students in attending to multiple examinations, AICTE has conducted Common Management Admission Test (CMATE 2013-14) and Computer Based on line Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT 2013-14).

Finally the success of e-governance can be noticed from its rapid processing of same 10500 applications of existing institutions and more than 500 applications of new institutions in time. More than 10000 applications for grants were processed by the Quality & proposals Bureau.

AICTE is the brand ambassador for Technical Education in the Country. This web based system assisted AICTE enhancing its image as a facilitator and a model regulator in the Indian education system as it examines all necessary details of a college such as a infrastructure, land survey details, funding, welfare of students and institutes etc. Today AICTE stands as a symbol of credible educational regulator of the Country.

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

Chapter 1

Introduction

1.1 PREAMBLE

All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) was set-up in November 1945 as a national level Apex Advisory Body to conduct survey on the facilities on technical education and to promote development in the country in a coordinated and integrated manner.

The Government of India (Ministry of Human Resource Development) constituted a National Working Group to look into the role of AICTE in the context of proliferation of technical institutions, maintenance of standards and other related matters. The Working Group recommended that AICTE be vested with the necessary statutory authority for making it more effective, which would consequently require restructuring and strengthening with necessary infrastructure and operating mechanisms.

Pursuant to the above recommendations of the National Working Group, the AICTE Bill was introduced in both the Houses of Parliament and passed as the AICTE Act No. 52 of 1987. The Act came into force w.e.f. March 28, 1988. The statutory All India Council for Technical Education was established on May 12, 1988 with a view for proper planning and coordinated development of technical education system throughout the country, the promotion of qualitative improvement of such education in relation to planned quantitative growth and the regulation and proper maintenance of norms and standards in the technical education system and for matters connected therewith.

The purview of AICTE covers programmes of technical education including training and research in Engineering & Technology, Architecture & Town Planning, Management, Pharmacy, Applied Arts and Crafts, Hotel Management and Catering Technology etc. at different levels.

1.2 THE ORGANIZATION

In accordance with the provisions of the AICTE Act (1987), for the first five years after its inception in 1988, the Minister for Human Resource Development, Government of India was the Chairman of the Council. The first full time Chairman was appointed on July 2, 1993 and the Council was re-constituted in March 1994 with a term of three years. The Executive Committee was re-constituted on July 7, 1994 and All India Boards of Studies and Advisory Boards were constituted in 1994-95. Regional Offices of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, located at Kolkata, Chennai, Kanpur and Mumbai were transferred to AICTE and the staff working at these offices were also deputed to the Council on foreign service terms w.e.f. October 1, 1995. These offices functioned as secretariats of Regional Committees in the four regions (East, South, North and West). Three new Regional Committees in southwest, central and northwest regions with their secretariats located at Bangalore, Bhopal and Chandigarh respectively were also established on July 27, 1994. One more Regional Committee in South-Central region with its Secretariat at



Hyderabad was notified on March 8, 2007. In addition to the Regional Offices, camp offices are also functioning in Guwahati and Thiruvananthapuram. The AICTE Trivandrum office was formally inaugurated on 09-02-2013 by Sri Oommen Chandy, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerla. The names of the States/UTs falling under the jurisdiction of the eight Regional Committees are given in **APPENDIX-1.1**.

The AICTE has its Headquarters in New Delhi and is presently housed in a building leased from the NDMC in the Chanderlok Building, Janpath, New Delhi. One bureau of the Council is housed in its own building having a covered area of 988 sq. mtr. at IV floor, East Tower, NBCC Place, Pragati Vihar, New Delhi. Due to lack of office space in Chanderlok Building, space measuring 11420.30 sq. ft in the Seventh floor in Mayur Bhawan in Shankar Market by NDMC have been leased, and renovated to house PC Bureau, RIFD Bureau, Distance Education Cell, IBA Cell, J.K. Scholarship Cell, etc.

The AICTE comprises of various Bureaus, namely, Approval Bureau, Planning and Co-ordination (PC) Bureau, University Bureau (UB), Administration (Admin) Bureau, Finance (Fin) Bureau, Research Institution and Faculty Development (RIFD) Bureau and Academic (Acad.) Bureau. Different Cells like Internal Audit, Anti-Ragging, Public Grievance, Information Facilitating Cell, CMAT & GPAT Cell, NVEQF Cell, Complaint Cell, RTI Cell, IBA Cell, J.K. Scholarship Cell, Distance Education Cell, Vigilance Cell, Legal Cell and e-Governance Cells have also been constituted by the AICTE. Each Bureau/Cell is headed by an Adviser/Director, who is assisted by technical and other staffs. The multidisciplinary technical staff is taken either on deputation or on contract from various Government Departments, academic institutions, etc. Computers are appropriately provided to each bureau for work. These computers are networked through LAN for retrieval and exchange of information. Cleaning and maintenance, security, transport and hospitality are provided by agencies outsourced for the purpose.

1.3 HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

1.3.1 MEETINGS OF STATUTORY BODIES OF AICTE

The Statutory bodies, of the AICTE met periodically during the year under report i.e., the Council 5 times, the Executive Committee 5 times, All India Board of Studies 12 times, and the Regional Committees 41 times to deliberate on the significance of Technical Education in the country.

1.3.2 ADMISSION TEST

COMMON MANAGEMENT ADMISSION TEST (CMAT)

An Additional test for admission under management stream for the academic year 2013-14 was conducted from 19th May to 22nd May 2013. For this test 52720 candidates registered and 45157 students appeared in the test conducted at 78 Centers in 61 cities across the country. The result was declared and merit list was posted on website on 1st June, 2013.

For admission to academic session 2014-15 the first test has been conducted from 26th September, 2013 to 30th September, 2013. The test was conducted at 61 cities on five days for 70,658 paid registered students. The result was declared on 20th October, 2013



The second test was conducted from 20th February, 2014 to 24th February, 2014. For this test 1,02,688 registered paid candidates appeared in the test conducted at 62 cities at 94 centres on five days. The result was declared on 14th March, 2014.

ii. COMPUTER BASED ONLINE GRADUATE PHARMACY APTITUDE TEST (GPAT)

The test was conducted online in 57 cities in two shifts from 16th May to 18th May, 2013. In all 25,962 candidates appeared in the online Test. The result was declared on 31.05.2013 for admission in the post graduate pharmacy programs at national level for year 2013-14.

The GPAT-2014 examination for admission for academic session 2014-15 was also conducted on 25th & 26th February, 2014. For this test 30522 students got registered out of which 25186 appeared in the test which was conducted in 58 cities at 71 centers for two days. The result was declared on 15th March, 2014 and merit list was posted on AICTE GPAT website.

The qualifying scores for General and OBC candidates were 125 and that for SC, ST and PD candidates were 100 by giving relaxation of 5%. The GPAT 2013 exam score will be valid for one year from the date of announcement of the result for admission in PG programme. The Scorecard is valid only for one year for the purpose of obtaining scholarship in M. Pharmacy course.

III. DEEMED-TO-BE / DENOVO DEEMED-TO-BE-/ PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES

On the request of UGC during the year 2013-14, AICTE has nominated a representative to be a part of the UGC team with a panel of Experts to assist the AICTE nominee to assess the physical and academic infrastructure for conferment of Deemed-to-be /Denovo Deemed-to-be-/ Private Universities status and for reviewing the physical and academic infrastructure and performance of the existing Deemed/ Private Universities. The visit to 17 universities has been conducted during 2013-14 and recommendations of Council along with Visit Reports have also been forwarded to UGC:

iv. UNAPPROVED INSTITUTIONS

The Council maintains a list of unapproved Institutions based on the information received from various sources and publishes for the benefit of general public on its website from time to time. A list of 327 unapproved institutions in the field of technology and other areas as on 31st March 2014 running technical education programs/ courses in Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Hotel Management, MCA etc., without prior approval of AICTE has been published on AICTE website. A list of 116 unapproved institutions running technical education programs/ courses in Architecture without prior approval of AICTE as on 31st March 2014 has been published on AICTE website.

1.3.3 VARIOUS WORKSHOPS ORGANISED/CONDUCTED BY AICTE

NATIONAL VOCATION EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK (NVEQF)

The Council organized various workshops/presentations at AICTE HQs as well as at Regional Offices during the year 2013-14 to sensitize various stakeholders about the scheme of NVEQF.



ii. COMMUNITY COLLEGES SCHEME

The Council has so far brought 72 Community Colleges under the ambit of NVEQF scheme. Certain other Polytechnics/Institutes are in the process of bringing the same under Community College Scheme.

iii. TECHNICAL HINDI WORKSHOP IN AICTE

Hindi Workshop was organized in AICTE HQ on 11th March, 2014 to its officers and employees in order to remove their hesitation to work in Hindi.

IV. WORKSHOPS TO SENSITIZE FOR COMBATING SEXUAL CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

As per directions of MHRD, AICTE conducted several workshops highlighting the role of the Society, its stakeholder's institutions and women. In this endeavor, AICTE during the reporting period conducted workshops at various places.

Principals, faculty and students of the respective States participated actively in these workshops, who were also informed about the constitutional and judiciary provisions, Acts and latest amendments in the acts for safeguarding the fundamental rights of Women. The safety measures which can be adopted to tackle crime against women were briefed viz., Teaching value System, Training to girls in self-defense, Gender sensitization workshops, Organizing awareness programs, appointing a Counselor on 15-20 students, periodic interaction with parents, decent dressing in colleges, proper surveillance in the institutional premises and constitution of complaints and grievance committees as per provisions of the Act.

1.3.4 GRANTS RECEIVED FROM MHRD FOR VARIOUS SCHEME

i. NEQIP SCHEME 2013-2016

In tandem with the Government Policy priorities for the focused development of North-Eastern Region and as contemplated in the Five Year Plan, a new scheme "AICTE - North East Quality Improvement Programme (AICTE-NEQIP)" with budget outlay of 180 crores has been launched in year 2013-14 for AICTE approved technical institutions of NER. The scheme provides financial assistance as grant-in-aid for improving quality of education in selected institutions of North Eastern Region for a period of 3 years by strengthening institutions for improving infrastructure, faculty competence, quality of teaching, research & consultancy and to improve learning outcomes and employability of students.

The AICTE approved government/ government aided Polytechnics and Degree engineering institutes & AICTE approved university departments fulfilling the eligibility criterion were sanctioned financial assistance to the tune of Rs 7 Cr for degree and Rs 5 Cr for polytechnic institutions. 7 institutions at degree level and 16 institutions at diploma level were sanctioned during the plan period under this scheme. A sum of Rs. 94.25 crores will be provided in a phased manner over three years to the sanctioned institutes out of which Rs. 31.42 crore has been released for the financial year 2013-14.



1.3.5 RESEARCH AND INSTITUIONAL DEVELOPMENT

MODERNIZATION AND REMOVAL OF OBSOLESCENCE (MODROBS)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 926 proposals under MODROB and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 270 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 2888.99 Lakhs.

ii. RESEARCH PROMOTION SCHEME (RPS)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received total number of 563 proposals under RPS and based on the recommendations of the expert committee a total of 162 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 1746.53 Lakhs.

iii. NATIONAL COORDINATED PROJECT (NCP)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received total number of 19 proposals under NCP. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, no proposals were considered.

1.3.6 STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

GENERAL FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

There are several schemes for faculty development, namely, Quality Improvement Programme (QIP), Career Award for Young Teachers (CAYT), Emeritus Fellowship, Visiting Professorship, Seminar Grant, Travel Grant, Staff Development Programme, National Doctoral Fellowship, AICTE-INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship and financial assistance to Professional Societies/Bodies. Under the Quality Improvement Programme (QIP), faculty members of degree level institutions are given opportunity to upgrade their qualifications to Master's and Ph.D levels. Under the scheme QIP (Poly), polytechnic teachers can pursue Master's degree programmes. Courseware Development and other short term training programmes are also conducted under the QIP scheme. In the Emeritus Fellowship scheme, superannuated faculty members are supported for two years to continue research through grant of fellowships and contingency grants. Under the scheme of Visiting Professorship, reputed academicians and technologists provide required expertise to AICTE approved institutions. Financial assistance is provided to regular faculty through schemes of Career Award for Young Teachers, Travel Grant and Seminar Grant. The Staff Development Programmes help new teachers to further enhance teaching skills. Professional Societies/Bodies are also provided non-recurring grants for various purposes. The scheme of AICTE-INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship jointly initiated by the AICTE and the Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE) helps institutions avail expertise from experienced professionals from industry. The number of programmes/activities supported as well as fellowships awarded under various schemes of Faculty Development during the year 2013-14 is given in Table 1.3.6

i. VISITING PROFESSORSHIP

The maximum tenure for the Visiting Professor is two years. Eminent scholars, superannuated professors and scientists from institutions of national repute are considered for appointment as Visiting Professors for AICTE approved Govt. and Govt. Aided Departments. The limit of funding is Rs.3,000 per day, for a maximum period of 12 -16 days per year and one professor per institution, maximum 3 months in a semester, open only for Govt./Govt. aided Institutes.

ii. QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (QIP)

During the year 2013-14, under QIP, AICTE has sanctioned and released Rs.1420.00 Lakhs.

iii. CARREER AWARDS FOR YOUNG TEACHERS (CAYT)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 152 proposals under CAYT and based on the recommendations of the expert committee a total of 28 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 76.24 Lakhs.

iv. EMERITUS FELLOWSHIPS (EF)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 32 proposals under Emeritus Fellowships based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 02 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to a sum of Rs.18.80 Lakhs.

v. SEMINAR GRANT

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 1826 proposals under Seminar Grant Scheme and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 449 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to sum of Rs. 674.71 Lakhs.



vi. TRAVELGRANT

During the period 2013-14, 05 faculty members of different Technical Institutes were offered financial support of Rs. 5.75 lakhs.

vii. STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAME (SDP)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 1168 proposals for conducting Staff Development Programmes and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 122 proposals were approved for an amount of Rs. 662.05 Lakhs.

viii. NATIONAL DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP (NDF)

During the year 2013-14, no proposal was recommended by the Expert Committee under National Doctoral Fellowship Scheme.

1.3.7 INDUSTRY INSTITUTE INTERATION

SCHEME OF INDUSTRY INSTITUE PARTNERSHIP CELL (IIPC)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 308 proposals under IIPC Scheme and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council has provided financial assistance to establish 43 new cells and sanctioned an amount of Rs.369.45 Lakhs.

ii. ENTERPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (EDC)

During the period 2013-14 the Council received a total number of 405 proposals under EDC Scheme and based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council has provided 57 new Entrepreneurship Development Cells were given financial aid of Rs.250.75 lakhs.

1.3.8 OTHER GRANTS RELEASE DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2013-14

i. SC/ST HOSTEL SCHEME

Based on the recommendation of the expert committee, 20 proposals duly recommended for construction of SC/ST hostels and released a sum of Rs. 4000 lakhs under SC/ST hostel scheme.

ii. INDIAN NATIONAL DIGITAL LIBRARY IN ENGINEERING SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY (INDEST)

Proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 1 new INDEST was given financial aid of Rs.100.75 lakhs.

iii. POST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Post graduate scholarship (PG) aims to provide financial assistance to M. Tech/ M. Pharm students having a valid GATE/GPAT score card. The limit of funding is Rs. 8000/- per month per student.

Chapter 2

STATUTORY BODIES

2.1 STATUTORY BODIES

The Boards and Committees of the AICTE, the Executive Committee, ten All India Boards of Studies, eight Regional Committees are all of statutory nature.

The Council is a 51-member body and has a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman and a Member Secretary with tenure appointments. The Council includes amongst others, representatives of various Departments of the Government of India, the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha, Govt. of States and Union Territories, representatives from the Statutory Boards and Committees of the Council, Professional Bodies and organizations in the fields of concerned areas of technical education and research and also organizations in the field of industry and commerce, etc. The AICTE Act empowers the Council to take all such steps as it may think fit for ensuring coordinated and integrated development of technical education. The powers and functions assigned to the Council are given in APPENDIX-2.1. The Council performs its functions in consultation with State Governments, Universities, State Boards of Technical Education, Professional Bodies and experts etc.

The Executive Committee is a 21-member body constituted by the Council and discharges such functions as may be assigned to it by the Council. The Executive Committee is chaired by the Chairman of the Council and includes Vice-Chairman of the Council; Secretary to the Government of India; two Chairmen of the Regional Committees of the Council; three Chairmen of the All India Boards of Studies of the Council; one member of the Council representing the Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India; four members of the Council representing States/UTs; four members with expertise and distinction in areas relevant to technical education; Chairman of the University Grants Commission; Director of the Institute of Applied Manpower Research and Director General of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research. The Member-Secretary of AICTE is also the Member-Secretary of the Executive Committee.

The All India Boards of Studies advise the Executive Committee on academic matters falling in their areas of concern including norms & standards, model curricula, model facilities and structure of courses etc. The areas of concern, constitution, functions and powers of the Boards of Studies are such as may be provided by the Council through appropriate Regulations. Initially, the AICTE Act provided for the establishment of five Boards of Studies. Later, four more Boards of Studies were added by the Council and subsequently one more Board has been added. Boards of Studies have 10-15 members each and are headed by subject experts of eminence. The Council is assisted by eight statutory Regional Committees covering different geographical regions. These Committees advise and assist the Council in all aspects of planning, promoting and regulating technical education within their respective regions. Each Regional Committee has 15-20 members, headed by an engineer/technologist of eminence.



2.2 THE COUNCIL

Under the provision of Clause 3(4) of the AICTE Act (52 of 1987), the Council was reconstituted on May 20, 2011 for a period of three years. The composition of the Council is given in **Appendix 2.2**.

2.3 THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause 12(1) of the AICTE Act, 1987, the AICTE had reconstituted the Executive Committee on May 20, 2011 for a period of three years. The composition of the Executive Committee is given in **Appendix 2.3**.

2.4 ALL INDIA BOARDS OF STUDIES

The All India Board of Studies advise the Executive Committee on academic matters falling in their respective area of concern including norms and standards, model curricula, model facilities and structure of courses, academic facilities and any other academic matter from time to time.

In pursuance of the powers conferred under Clauses 13(1) and 13(2) of the AICTE Act, the All India Board of Studies were re-constituted by the Council for a term of 3 years. During the period under report, one introductory meeting (for the Chairmen of reconstituted All India Boards of Studies), 12 meetings of All India Boards of Studies and 5 meetings of sub-committees/task force were held for advising the Council in their areas of specialization.

2.5 REGIONAL COMMITTEES

According to Clause 14(3) of the AICTE Act, each Regional Committee advises and assists the Council on all aspects of planning, promoting and regulating technical education within their regions.

In pursuance of Clauses 14(1) and 14(2) of the AICTE Act, Regional Committees were constituted by the Council at Kolkata, Chennai, Kanpur and Mumbai on April 18, 1990 and subsequently three more Regional Committees were set up at Bangalore, Bhopal and Chandigarh in the year 1994. One Regional committee was also set up at Hyderabad on March 8, 2007.

Each Regional Committee has 15 to 20 members from industry, technical institutions, universities, State/ Central government organizations and professional bodies/ societies working in the area of technical education. The South-Central Regional Committee was re constituted on September 24, 2013 whereas all other Regional Committees were constituted in May, 2011 for a period of three years. Chapter 3

APPROVAL OF INSTITUTIONS

3.1 GROWTH OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION: NEW APPROVALS ACCORDED

In accordance with the functions assigned to it under clause (10k) of the AICTE act, the council grants approvals for starting new technical Institutions and for inducing new courses or programmes in already approved institutions. All approvals are accorded in consultation with respective State Governments and affiliating universities. The data on the number of institutions to which new approvals were given to run technical programmes during 2013-2014 is summarized below in **Table 3.1**:

3.5 FOREIGN UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION

In supercession of the Regulations Notified by the Council vide Notification No. F. 37-3/ Legal (vi) 2003, dated 03rd April 2003 and in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 23 read with Clause (b), Clause (f), Clause (g) and Clause (n), (o), (p) of Section 10 of the AICTE Act, 1987, the Council made regulations for regulating entry and operation of Foreign Universities/Institutions imparting technical education in India. This Regulation known as 'AICTE Regulations for Entry and Operation of Foreign Universities in India imparting technical education, 2005' were formulated primarily to check and avoid illegal entry of unscrupulous persons using/misusing the name of Foreign University/Institution for unlawful gains. To safeguard the interest of all stakeholders, a public notice was issued in all



leading newspapers on 5th May, 2005 directing the foreign universities operating in India to comply with the above regulations. Communications were sent to all India institutions collaborating with foreign universities/ institutions based on media advertisement, directing them to comply with regulations 2005. These regulations were notified in the extraordinary gazette of India on the 25th May, 2005.

During the period under report, the following new institution has been accorded registration by AICTE for conducting programmes in collaboration with foreign university/institution:

3.6 COMMON MANAGEMENT ADMISSION TEST (CMAT)-2013-14

AICTE in its mission to reduce the burden of students in attending to multiple examinations launched the national level Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) in 2012 for facilitating institutions to select suitable students for admission in all management programs approved by AICTE. The initiative was taken to address the issue



of physical, mental and financial stress being imposed on the students through number of entrance examinations being followed by the institutions for admission into all Management Programmes in AICTE approved institutions based on the relevant judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

Further, AICTE decided to conduct CMAT examination twice a year preferably first test in the month of September/ October and second test in the month of February. For admission for academic session 2013-14 the first test was conducted in September, 2012 and second test was conducted in February, 2013. It was informed that students can appear in both the test however, better of the two scores will be used for admission.

On the special request of few state governments, AICTE conducted an additional CMAT examination in May 2013 for admission for the academic year 2013-2014 in order to facilitate those candidates who could not appear in the earlier CMAT due to late notification issued by State Governments. The candidates, who have already appeared in both the CMAT held in September, 2012 and February, 2013 were not allowed to appear in this test. The Additional test for academic year 2013-14 was conducted from 19th May to 22nd May 2013. For this test 52720 candidates registered and 45157 students appeared in the test conducted in 61 cities at 78 centers. The result was declared and merit list was posted on website on 1st June, 2013.

For admission for academic session 2014-15 the first test has been conducted from 26th September, 2013 to 30th September, 2013. The test was conducted at 61 cities on five days for 70,658 paid registered students. The result was declared on 20th October, 2013 and merit list was posted on AICTE CMAT website.

The second test was conducted from 20th February, 2014 to 24th February, 2014. For this test 1,02,688 registered paid candidates appeared in the test conducted at 62 cities at 94 centres on five days. The result was declared on 14th March, 2014 and merit list was posted on AICTE CMAT website.

The scores were awarded from maximum marks of 400. The All India merit list with rank and score secured were displayed for the purpose of effecting admission in the post graduate management programs both at Degree & Diploma level for year 2013-14. The detailed merit list and access to the result was also provided to the admission authorities of respective State Governments for allotting the students through central counseling or otherwise as per their notified admission procedure.

3.7 COMPUTER BASED ONLINE GRADUATE PHARMACY APTITUDE TEST - 2013-14

Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) an all India Examination was launched by All India Council for Technical Education, New Delhi with effect from academic year 2011-12 for admission in Master's Programme in Pharmacy (M. Pharm) and for award of post graduate and doctoral fellowships.

The first GPAT examination i.e. GPAT-2010 and the subsequent one for 2011 and 2012 was conducted in paper pencil mode by AICTE in association with M. S. University of Baroda. AICTE has been conducting computer based online common management admission test (CMAT) as entrance test for admission into post graduate management programmes since 2012. Considering the success of online CMAT, AICTE decided to conduct Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) also online from 2013.

The online registration window for GPAT-2013 was opened on March 08, 2013. The test was conducted online in 57 cities in two shifts from 16th May to 18th May, 2013. In all 25,962 candidates appeared in the online Test. The result



was declared on 31.05.2013 for admission in the post graduate pharmacy programs at national level for year 2013-14.

The GPAT-2014 examination for admission for academic session 2014-15 was also conducted on 25th & 26th February, 2014. For this test 30522 students got registered out of which 25186 appeared in the test which was conducted in 58 cities at 71 centers for two days. The result was declared on 15th March, 2014 and merit list was posted on AICTE GPAT website.

The qualifying scores for General and OBC candidates were 125 and that for SC, ST and PD candidates were 100 by giving relaxation of 5%. The GPAT 2013 exam score will be valid for one year from the date of announcement of the result for admission in PG programme. The Scorecard is valid only for one year for the purpose of obtaining scholarship in M. Pharmacy course. After completing M. Pharm Degree, if someone is interested in getting registered for Ph.D. degree and availing National Doctoral Fellowship (NDF) the validity of the GPAT scorecard shall be for three years. Only Qualified candidates would be eligible for applying for AICTE PG and NDF scholarships. Award of scholarship is subject to AICTE rules and regulations. The State Governments were required to register for accessing detailed merit list and scores of qualified students for academic year 2014-15.

3.8 DEEMED-TO-BE/DENOVO DEEMED-TO-BE-/ PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES

Universities including Private universities established by the State Legislations do not require prior approval from AICTE for starting faculties/courses. However, universities, deemed universities including the universities established by the State Legislature imparting technical education are required to comply with the norms and standards prescribed by AICTE from time to time.

AICTE has received few requests from the UGC and state governments for deputing a nominee of AICTE on the UGC/state Committee constituted for visits conducted for on the spot assessment of the physical and academic Infrastructure facilities and to advice UGC/state governments for granting recognition to such universities.

AICTE has received the directions from **MHRD vide letter no F-I-31/2006 TS II** dated 7.03.2007 and subsequent clarifications issued through ref. no 1-31/2006- TS.II dated 26.5.2011 in connection with composition of the team and modalities of the joint inspections of UGC and AICTE for deemed universities.

As per directives of the MHRD "AICTE will nominate a representative on the inspection committee of UGC; the person so nominated by the AICTE may; in addition, Head a team of the AICTE on the same day and such other person would not be part of the UGCs team but merely to assist the nominee of the AICTE on the UGC committee. The nominee of the AICTE on the UGC committee could give his or her report to the Chairman AICTE in the Proforma prescribed by the AICTE and also on any additional point required by the UGC; which should then be forwarded by the AICTE to the UGC. UGCs Committee would incorporate the comments of the AICTE in its report before the Commission so that the Commission could take appropriate decision in the matter before making any recommendations to MHRD. It has been felt that the above arrangement would serve the purpose of a defacto joint inspection while at the same time satisfying the requirements of the AICTE act regarding its own inspection. Such an arrangement would also ensure that the comments of the AICTE's nominee reflect adequately the comments of the Council and are not merely the individual perceptions of the nominee. This would also satisfy the directions given vide this Ministry's orders of the 5th April, 2006, wherein consultation with statutory Councils has been mandated before the UGC forwards its recommendations to the Central Government"



Further, MHRD has issued directions through O. M. ref. no 1-31/2006-TS.II dated 9th May, 2013 with respect to process of the joint inspections of deemed universities as also the Private Universities. MHRD in this letter has emphasized that the process so followed for Deemed Universities will also be followed for the Private Universities. MHRD has also felt the need for joint inspection for Deemed / Private Universities jointly by AICTE and UGC on the same day and has directed AICTE to communicate the name of its nominee on the inspection committee of UGC in advance along with other members of AICTE team which should accompany the AICTE nominee merely to assist the AICTE nominee on the inspection committee of UGC.

In view of the above direction of MHRD and on the request of UGC during the year 2013-14, AICTE has nominated a representative to be part of the UGC team with a panel of Experts to assist the AICTE nominee to assess the physical and academic infrastructure for conferment of Deemed-to-be /Denovo Deemed-to-be-/ Private Universities status and for reviewing the physical and academic infrastructure and performance of the existing Deemed/ Private Universities. The visit to the following 17 universities has been conducted during 2013-14 and recommendations of Council along with Visit Reports have been forwarded to UGC:

3.9 UNAPPROVED INSTITUTIONS

All India Council for Technical Education has been established by an Act of Parliament (Act 52 of 1987) with a function among others to grant approval for establishment of new technical institutions, introduction of new courses etc. Regulations have also been notified by the Council with a provision that no technical institution shall conduct technical education programmes in Engineering & Technology, Management, Computer Application, Architecture & Town Planning, Pharmacy, Hotel Management & Catering Technology, Applied Arts and Crafts in India with or without Foreign University Collaboration without obtaining prior mandatory approval from AICTE. These regulations also have a provision for taking action against such unapproved technical institutions.



Provided further that any Institution offering Technical Program without approval of the Council, shall be termed as unapproved if

- It is started without prior approval by the Council
- It is working in temporary location / at location not approved by the Council
- It is declared as "Unapproved" by the Council

The institutions conducting unapproved courses have been directed from time to time through Public Notices and individual letters under intimation to concerned state government to seek AICTE approval for conduct of technical education programmes or to close down.

Provided further that any Technical Institution, which has already started without following AICTE approval procedure, wishes to submit an application / proposal shall be considered as new Technical Institution. For such purpose, they shall apply as per the provisions of Chapter I of Approval Process Handbook.

Its legal date of starting will be from the date of issue of the Letter of Approval. Students, who are admitted prior to approval by the Council, will not have any right for re-admission and will have to fulfill all the requirements for admission as prescribed by the competent admission authority.

The representation submitted by the institutions in response to the AICTE letters furnishing clarification and justification for removal of their name from the list of unapproved institution are being examined by a Hearing Committee and based on recommendations of this committee the names of suitable/eligible institution are being removed from the list.

The Council maintains a list of unapproved Institutions based on the information received from various sources and publishes for the benefit of general public on its website from time to time. A list of 327 unapproved institutions in the field of technology and other areas as on 31st March 2014 running technical education programs/ courses in Engineering, Pharmacy, Management, Hotel Management, MCA etc., without prior approval of AICTE has been published on AICTE website. A list of 116 unapproved institutions running technical education programs/ courses in Architecture without prior approval of AICTE as on 31st March 2014 has been published on AICTE website.

3.10 NEQIP SCHEME 2013-2016

In tandem with the Government Policy priorities for the focused development of North-Eastern Region and as contemplated in the Five Year Plan, a new scheme "AICTE - North East Quality Improvement Programme (AICTE-NEQIP)" with budget outlay of 180 crores has been launched in year 2013-14 for AICTE approved technical institutions of NER. The scheme provides financial assistance as grant-in-aid for improving quality of education in selected institutions of North Eastern Region for a period of 3 years by strengthening institutions for improving infrastructure, faculty competence, quality of teaching, research & consultancy and to improve learning outcomes and employability of students.

The AICTE approved government/government aided Polytechnics and Degree engineering institutes & AICTE approved university departments fulfilling the eligibility criterion were sanctioned financial assistance to the tune of Rs 7 Cr for degree and Rs 5 Cr for polytechnic institutions. 7 institutions at degree level and 16 institutions at diploma level were sanctioned during the plan period under the scheme. A total sum of Rs. 94.25 crores will be provided in a



phased manner over the three years to the sanctioned institutes out of which Rs. 31.42 crore has been released for the financial year 2013-14.

3.11 WORKSHOPS TO SENSITIZE FOR COMBATING SEXUAL CRIMES AGAINST WOMEN

As per directions of MHRD for ensuring time bound implementation of various measures to tackle the menace of Sexual Crime against Women, AICTE was required to take action to sensitize the management and teachers of the institutions of technical education in the administrative control and to work out a road map of action for the guidance of colleges and other institutions, which may include items holding of conferences, seminars, conducting work shop, class for self defense, research studies etc.

AICTE conducted several workshops highlighting the role of the Society, its stakeholder's institutions and women. In this endeavor, AICTE during the reporting period conducted - workshops at the following places:

Principals, faculty and students of the respective State actively participated in these workshops, were informed about the constitutional and judiciary provisions, Acts and latest amendments in the acts for safeguarding the fundamental rights of Women. The safety measures which can be adopted to tackle the crime against women were briefed viz. Teaching value System, Training to girls in self-defense, Gender sensitization workshops, Organizing awareness programs, appointing a Counselor on 15-20 students, periodic interaction with parents, decent dressing in colleges, proper surveillance in the institutional premises and constitution of complaints and grievance committees as per provisions of the Act.

Chapter 4

RESEARCH AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

4.1 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Through Clauses 10(C) and 10 (d) of the AICTE Act, the Council promotes innovations and research and development in established and new technologies, generation, adoption and adaptation of new technologies, to meet developmental requirements of the country and for the overall improvement of educational process.

Towards these ends, the Council operates three schemes, namely, Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS), Research Promotion Scheme (RPS) and Nationally Coordinated Projects (NCP). A total of 270 and 162 Proposals were approved for financial support under MODROBS and RPS schemes respectively, during the year 2013-14 amounting to Rs. 4635.52 lakhs.

The projects thus sanctioned under the above research schemes are reviewed each year in monitoring meetings to ensure effective implementation of projects and proper utilization of grants.

4.2 SCHEMES TO SUPPORT RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Council operates the following Schemes for supporting Research and Institutional Development:

- i) Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS)
- ii) Research Promotion Scheme (RPS)

Implementation of MODROBS and RPS Schemes

AICTE invites project proposals under the above schemes and provides information through an advertisement and through its official website.

4.2.1 Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS)

The main objective of the Scheme of Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence is to provide financial support to institutions to equip their laboratories with modern equipment/infrastructure facilities, keeping in view rapid advancements in technology. Institutions were provided funds for replacement of obsolete equipment with modern, state-of-the-art equipment to ensure quality of educational process. Funding for this scheme is limited to Rs. 20 lakhs.

MODROBS: After an initial scrutiny at the Bureau level, the proposals are evaluated by a duly constituted expert committee. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council approves grant-in-aid under the scheme.



During the period 2013-14, the Council received 926 proposals under Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence (MODROBS) scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by the expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 270 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 2888.99 Lakhs for the financial year 2013-2014.

The distribution of projects sanctioned under MODROB scheme during 2013-14 based on the Zone wise is shown in Table 4.1 & Fig. 4.1. State-wise distribution of projects sanctioned is given in Table 4.2 & Fig. 4.2 respectively.

Fig: 4.1 Region wise Distribution of Grant under MODROBS during 2013-14.






Fig: 4.2 State wise distribution of grant under MODROBS during 2013-14.

4.2.2 Research Promotion Scheme (RPS)

RPS aims to create research ambience by promoting research in technical disciplines and innovations in established and emerging technologies. Research and development activities are considered as an essential component of higher education because of their role in creating new knowledge and insight and imparting excitement and dynamism to the educational process, as well as make them need based in view of the national requirements. The objective of this scheme is to create and update the general research capabilities of the faculty members of the various Technical Institutes. Institutions are provided funds for this scheme limited to Rs. 25 lakhs.

Research Promotion Scheme (RPS):

During the period 2013-14, the Council received 563 proposals under Research Promotion Scheme (RPS). These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by the expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 162 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 1746.53 Lakhs.



Fig: 4.3 Region wise Distribution of Grant (%) under RPS during 2013-14.








Fig: 4.5 State wise Distribution of Grant under RPS during 2013-14.

4.2.3 Nationally Coordinated Project (NCP)

The Nationally Coordinated Project Scheme aims to plan, co-ordinate and execute integrated R&D programmes, involving collaboration between several institutions, Industry and user organizations at national level for societal development programmes.

More specifically, the research ventures that may be considered within Nationally Coordinated Project Scheme include the following:

- 1. The research should be carried out at a national level institution in coordination with participating institutions having proven track record and sufficient expertise in the proposed area.
- 2. The lead institution must choose a person of eminence having relevant knowledge and expertise in the proposed area of research as the chief coordinator of the project.
- 3. The project should have financial participation from the participating industry (if any) to the extent possible.

The All India Council for Technical Education supports two categories of Nationally Coordinated Projects for Technical Education.

- i. Catering to important issues of national importance.
- ii Catering to technical education development.

The funding limit is Rs. 50 lakhs in 3 installments under this scheme.

During the year 2013-14, the Council received 19 proposals under NCP. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, no proposals were recommended.

Chapter 5

STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

5.1. AICTE-INAE (INDIAN NATIONAL ACADEMY OF ENGINEERING) DISTINGUISHED VISITING PROFESSORSHIP SCHEME

AICTE-INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship Scheme is jointly executed through AICTE- Indian National Academy Engineering (INAE). The scheme envisages promotion of Industry-Institute Interaction by facilitating the dissemination of knowledge through the expertise of experienced and knowledgeable person from industry to integrate rich industrial experience with technical education. The scheme has received very enthusiastic response from industry and engineering institution over the years.

The AICTE-INAE Distinguished Visiting Professorship Scheme is being executed by INAE by way of signing an MoU between INAE and AICTE.

The Distinguished Visiting Professor contributes by delivering series of lectures on the state of the art of the industry, industrial ambiance and problems etc. A Distinguished Visiting Professor further help in the project work of the students by way of identifying, guiding and evaluating the projects. The project guidance done is either at the host institution or at the industry under the supervision of Distinguished Visiting Professors and the local faculty. Further, the Distinguished Visiting Professors are also expected through their interaction with academic staff to act as a catalyst, towards an integrated approach and in curriculum development.

5.2 QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMME (QIP)

With the objective of upgrading the expertise, qualification and capabilities of the faculty members of degree level technical institutions, the Government of India launched the Quality Improvement Programme (QIP) in 1970, which is now being implemented and monitored by the Council. Since 2001, QIP has also been extended to the teachers in approved polytechnics. During the year 2013-14, under QIP-Non Plan, AICTE has sanctioned and released Rs.1420.00 Lakhs for 33 centers. Approved QIP centers in India are listed in Appendix - 5.1, 5.2, 5.3. The major activities under QIP include:

(a) Master's and Doctoral Degree Programmes

Under this scheme, faculty members of AICTE approved institutions are given an opportunity to upgrade their qualifications. Certain selected institutions offer Master's and Doctoral Programmes to faculty members selected under these programmes. Participating faculty members are paid scholarships and contingency grant by the Council during 2013-14.

(b) Short Term Programme

In order to upgrade the knowledge and skills to teachers working in different institutions in the country,



AICTE provides financial assistance for organizing short-term training programmes (STTP) in emerging areas of Engineering & Technology and other disciplines through major QIP centers.

(c) Curriculum Development

The major QIP Centers are provided assistance to conduct workshops for curriculum development. This leads to Model Curriculum Development, which are used as base documents by many institutions.

5.3 CAREER AWARDS FOR YOUNG TEACHERS (CAYT)




Fig. 5.1 State wise Distribution of Grant under CAYT during 2013-14.

The purpose of CAYT Scheme is to identify young talented teachers who have established competence in their area of specialization and promote their professional growth by enabling them to devote major component of their time in research and study. This award is for a period of two years and this period is to be devoted to work on a specified project with a teaching load of a maximum of six hours per week in parent institution. During the period 2013-14, the Council received 152 applications under this scheme. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 28 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 76.24 Lakhs for the financial year 2013-14. The distribution of projects sanctioned during the year based on the Region-wise is shown in Table 5.1 and State-wise distribution are shown in Fig. 5.1.

5.4 EMERITUS FELLOWSHIP

The Scheme of Emeritus Fellowship was launched during the year 1994-95. The main objective of the scheme is to utilize the services of meritorious and experienced superannuated professors in technical institutions for institutional development of existing and new emerging institutes, in research and development etc.

The funding is limited up to Rs.6.00 lakhs per year and Rs. 50,000/- (contingency per year) with four installments (once in six months) up to two years for superannuated professors/ scientists of reputed Institutes. During the year 2013-14, 32 proposals were received, two meetings were held for EF and 02 proposals were recommended for financial assistance. The grant amounting to Rs. 18.80 Lakhs has been sanctioned.

5.5 SEMINAR GRANT

The Scheme of Seminar Grant is designed to promote high standards in technical education by extending opportunities to academicians and working professionals by providing a forum for sharing their knowledge, experiences, innovations and inventions. This scheme provides financial assistance to AICTE approved institutions for organizing Symposia/Conferences/Seminars/ Workshops at national and international levels in various fields of technical education.

During the year 2013-14, 1826 proposals were received. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, a total of 449 proposals were approved for financial assistance amounting to Rs. 674.71Lakhs. The regionwise and State wise distribution of these are given in Table 5.2-5.3 and Figures 5.2-5.3 respectively. During the year, an amount of Rs. 442.55 lakhs was released to various institutions under the Seminar Grant Scheme, including partial grant from the previous year.




Fig: 5.2 Region wise Distribution of Proposals under Seminar Grant during 2013-14




Fig: 5.3 State wise Distribution of Proposals under Seminar Grant during 2013-14



5.6 TRAVELGRANT

The Scheme of Travel Grant extends financial assistance to enable full time regular faculty from AICTE approved technical institutions for interaction at international level in Conference/Seminars/Symposia etc. The assistance provided on reimbursement basis, of actual expenses or Rs. 1.00 Lakhs whichever is less as incurred towards airfare, registration fee and per diem allowance.

During the year 2013-14, 73 proposals were received and 05 faculty members of different Technical Institutes were offered financial support to attend international workshops/conferences/symposium amounting to Rs. 5.75 Lakhs. The region-wise and state-wise distributions of these grants are given in Table 5.4.

5.7 STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (SDP)

The Scheme is intended to provide opportunities for young teachers employed in AICTE approved technical education institutions for their induction-training and up gradation of their knowledge and skills towards effective teaching and delivery of knowledge to the students. This programme is proposed to cover areas such as Technology Policy, Industrial Policy, new concepts to keep pace with the changing technology, educational technology, and communication skills etc.

During the Year 2013-14, 1168 proposals were received and 122 were recommended by expert committee for conducting Staff Development Programmes amounting to Rs. 662.05 Lakhs. The region-wise and state-wise distribution of the Staff Development Programmes are given in Table 5.5 to 5.6 and Figure 5.4 to 5.5.




Fig: 5.4 Region wise Distribution of Proposals under Staff Development Programme during 2013-14





Fig 5.5 State wise Distribution of Proposals under Staff Development Programme during 2013-14




Fig. 5.6 Institutional category wise distribution of grant under Staff Development Programme during 2013-14.



5.8 NATIONAL DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP (NDF)

The scheme of National Doctoral Fellowship was launched during the year 2003-04. The main objective of the scheme is to attract highly qualified and motivated candidates to pursue doctoral degree and offer themselves for teaching positions in technical education system. The scheme also provided research support to bright young candidates for pursing exciting and innovative research in the field of technical education. The National Doctoral Fellowship (NDF) Scheme is discontinued from year 2010-11, though the candidates selected during the previous years for three year financial grant were continued for the same.

During the year 2013-14, no proposal was recommended by the Expert Committee under NDF scheme.

5.9 VISITING PROFESSORSHIP

The main objective of this scheme is to supplement and provide expertise to teaching and research in those areas in which the host institution does not have expertise. The maximum tenure for the Visiting Professor is two year. Eminent scholars, superannuated professors and scientists from institution of national repute are considered for appointment as Visiting Professors for AICTE approved Govt. and Govt. Aided Departments. The limit of funding is Rs.3,000 per day, Max 12 -16 days per year and one professor per institution, maximum 3 months in a semester, open only to Govt./Govt. aided Institutes.

Chapter 6

INDUSTRY INSTITUTE INTERACTION

6.1 GENERAL

Under clauses 10 (C) and (f) of the AICTE Act, the Council promotes effective link between technical education system and other relevant systems, including industry and research community. For the purpose, the Council operates various schemes, viz, Industry Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC), Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) and National Facilities in Engineering and Technology with Industrial Collaboration (NAFETIC). The Council has provided financial assistance to 100 cells and an amount of Rs. 620.2 Lakhs was sanctioned under the scheme during the year 2013-14.

6.2 SCHEME OF INDUSTRY INSTITUTE PARTNERSHIP CELL (IIPC)

The Scheme of Industry Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC) is operated by the Council to promote Industry Institute Interaction, that is, between technical institutions and industries. The main objective of this scheme is to establish Institute-Industry Partnership Cells in AICTE approved technical institutes/technical departments of Universities, which will act as liaison centers between industries and various departments of the institutes for mutually beneficial activities. To start with, in the first year, the Council provides financial assistance up to a maximum of Rs.5 lakhs as onetime non-recurring grant and Rs. 10 lakhs as recurring grant to create Industry Institute Partnership Cells in selected technical institutes. It is envisaged that after 2 years these Cells will be self-supporting.

The major objectives of IIPC scheme are:

- Maintenance, coordination and promotion of consultancy services.
- Establishment of proper links, coordination with departments, agencies and taking necessary action for promotion of consultancy services.
- Encourage internship programme/student's fellowship programmes.
- Organize Industry Study Tour Programmes (ISTP) and liaison with concerned industries/industrialists.
- Signing of MOU on behalf of the Institution.
- Generate funds from industry/other agencies for maintenance and development of the cell.
- Assist Industries in obtaining tax incentives from GOI by supporting R&D programmes in the Institution.
- Maintain and distribute funds obtained from consultancy services, assist weak departments in the institutes/universities from the funds generated through consultancy for strengthening of the University/ Institute/Department.
- Invite experts from industry to participate in curriculum development and training from time to time in consultation with the Department/Institute/University.



During the period 2013-14, the Council received 308 proposals under IIPC scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, the Council has provided financial assistance to establish 43 new cells and an amount of Rs.369.45 Lakhs was sanctioned under the scheme. List of IIPC is appended in **Appendix - 6.1.**

6.3 ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL (EDC)

This Scheme was launched with a view to encourage students in AICTE approved Polytechnics and Degree Level Technical institutions to consider self-employment as a career option, provide training in entrepreneurship through modular courses and increase the relevance of management particularly in the non-corporate and under-managed sectors.

The objectives of the Scheme are as follows:

- 1. To create an environment for self-employment and entrepreneurship development through formal and non-formal programmes.
- 2. To introduce the concept of entrepreneurship in curricula at diploma and degree levels.
- 3. To develop management personnel at appropriate levels for the non-corporate and un-organized sectors like education, rural development, small-scale industry etc.
- 4. To utilize the infrastructure facilities and technically trained manpower for development of non-corporate and unorganized sectors.
- 5. To promote employment opportunities.

With a view to fulfill the above needs, Entrepreneurship Development Cells have been established by AICTE in various institutions and universities. The activities that are visualized at the EDCs include Entrepreneurship Development/ Awareness Programmes, Continuing Education, Skill Development Programmes, Quality Assistance, Support Facility for Entrepreneurship as a career option, Curricula Input on establishment of an enterprise & its management, Solutions for small business management & entrepreneurs and training & retraining of entrepreneurs.




Fig. 6.1 Region wise Distribution of Grant under Entrepreneurship Development Cell during 2013-14




Fig. 6.2 Institutional wise (Number) Distribution of Grant under Entrepreneurship Development Cell during 2013-14




Fig. 6.3 State wise Distribution of Grant under Entrepreneurship Development Cell during 2013-14

During the period 2013-14, the Council received 405 proposals under EDC scheme. These proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 57 new Entrepreneurship Development Cells were given financial aid of Rs.250.75 lakhs under the EDC scheme.Region wise, Institution wise& State wise Distribution of Grant under Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) during 2013-14 is given in Table 6.1, 6.2, 6.3& Fig. 6.1, 6.2, 6.3 respectively. List of EDC is appended in Appendix - 6.2.

6.4 OTHER GRANTS RELEASED DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2013-14




Fig. 6.4 Region wise Distribution of Grant under SC/ST hostels scheme during 2013-14

6.4.2 INDIAN NATIONAL DIGITAL LIBRARY IN ENGINEERING SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY (INDEST)

This proposals were evaluated as per the approved procedure by expert committee duly constituted by the Council. Based on the recommendations of the expert committee, 1 new INDEST was given financial aid of Rs.100.75 lakhs

6.4.3 POST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP (PG)

Post graduate scholarship (PG) aims to provide financial assistance to M. Tech/ M Pharm students with valid GET/GPAT score card. The limit of funding is Rs. 8000/- per month per student. During the financial year 2013-14, Grant was released to passed out students as well as under DBT.

Chapter 7

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

7.1 NATIONAL VOCATIONAL EDUCATION QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK (NVEQF) FOR ENGINEERING AND POLYTECHNIC COLLEGES

After the launch of National Vocational Education Qualification Framework (NVEQF) Scheme in October 2011, a number of initiatives have been taken to formally integrate vocational education with the current conventional educational streams across school and higher education to provide an opportunity and incentive to students to explore a large universe of opportunities. NVEQF allows cross mobility of students and their absorption in Industry with certain skills gained over a fixed period of time that enable them to acquire formal degree and higher skill so that they occupy higher level jobs in the Industry.

Apart from the above, the following initiatives were also taken up by the Council during the year 2013-14:

Assimilation of NVEQF with the recently NSQF:

After the notification by the Ministry of Finance vide No. 8/6/2013-Ivt dated 27th December, 2013 the Council is in the process of aligning its existing programmes under NVEQF with the provisions of NSQF. However AICTE will continue to adopt the contents under the existing NVEQF programmes developed by them under NSQF till Nos are put in place. As and when Nos come in force, AICTE will align their syllabi/programme with Nos. AICTE will issue necessary corrigendum to NVEQF Regulation, 2012 (as notified vide notification No. F. No. 37-3/Legal/AICTE/2012 dated 04th December 2012) and the relevant Approval Process Handbook Vocational Education and Community College Course(s) and Skill Knowledge Provider under NVEQF 2013-14.

Target for Skilling:

Under Community College Scheme under Pilot Project (AICTE Scheme of equipment Grant-in-aid) physical target of 1410 has been achieved during 2013-14.

Under Employability Enhancement Training Programme (EETP) under AICTE target of 15,000 has been achieved during 2013-14.



Setting up of Sector Skill Council Education:

Committee is being constituted to give its recommendations on setting up of Sector Skill Council Education.

AICTE signed MoU with various agencies:

Apart from signing the MoUs with TISS, IL&FS and BSNL during the previous years, another MoU was signed during 2013-14 with National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (NIELIT), formerly DOEACC Society. 8.2 USE OF HINDI IN THE ACTIVITIES OF AICTE

8.2.1 MEETINGS OF OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE

Chapter 9

FINANCE

9.1 Finance

The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) receives grants-in-aid from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India towards implementation of its programmes and activities. During the Financial Year 2013-2014, AICTE received grants to the tune of Rs.37000.00 Lakhs for AICTE Schemes Rs. 12423.44 Lakhs for J & K Scholarship Scheme from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and Rs. 30000.00 Lakhs from UGC for PG Scholarship under the Plan Head and Rs. Ni. under Non-Plan head from the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The unspent balance of the previous year, i.e. 2012-13 was Rs.6163.78 Lakhs and 83619.56 Lakhs for Plan and Non-Plan respectively. The Scheme / head wise details of expenditure fir financial Year 2013-14 are given in Chapter 9 of the Annual Report.

9.2 ALLOCATION

9.2.1 Plan Allocation

The grants released by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) during the financial year 2013-14 was 49423.44 Lakhs for AICTE Schemes & J K Scholarship Scheme. The grants released by University Grant Commission (UGC) during the Financial Year 2013-14 was Rs.30000.00 Lakhs for PG Scholarship. An amount of Rs. 3163.78 Lakhs was the unspent balance of the previous year and the miscellaneous receipts during the Financial Year 2013-14 amounted to Rs.1104.43 Lakhs.

9.2.2 Non-Plan Allocation

An Amount of Rs. Nil was received from MHRD as Non-Plan Grants during the Financial Year 2013-14 for AICTE Schemes. There was Rs.83619.56 Lakhs as unspent balance of the previous Financial Year (2012-13) and miscellaneous receipts amounted to Rs.22203.49 Lakhs during the Financial Year 2013-14.

APPENDIX 2.1

POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL (Extracted from AICTE Act, 1987)

It shall be the duty of the Council to take all such steps as it may think fit for ensuring coordinated and integrated development of technical and management education and maintenance of standards and for the purposes of performing its functions under AICTE Act, the Council may:

- (a) undertake survey in the various fields of technical education, collect data on all related matters and make forecast of the needed growth and development in technical education;
- (b) coordinate the development of technical education in the country at all levels;
- (c) allocate and disburse out of the Fund of the Council such grants, on such terms and conditions as it may thinkfit to;
 - i) Technical institutions, and
 - ii) Universities imparting technical education in coordination with the Commission;
- (d) promote innovations, research and development in established and new technologies, generation, adoption and adaptation of new technologies to meet developmental requirements and for over-all improvement of educational processes;
- formulate schemes for promoting technical education for women, handicapped and weaker sections of the society;
- (f) Promote an effective link between technical education system and other relevant systems including research and development organizations, industry and the community;
- (g) evolve suitable performance appraisal systems for Technical Institutions and Universities imparting technical education, incorporating norms and mechanisms for enforcing accountability;
- (h) formulate schemes for the initial and in service training of teachers and identify institutions or centres and set up new centres for offering staff development programmes including continuing education of teachers;
- (i) lay down norms and standards for courses, curricula, physical and instructional facilities, staff pattern, staff qualifications, quality instructions, assessment and examinations;
- (j) fix norms and guidelines for charging tuition and other fees;
- (k) grant approval for starting new technical institutions and for introduction of new courses or programmes in consultation with the agencies concerned;
- (I) advise the Central Government in respect of grant of charter to any professional body or institution in the field of technical education conferring powers, rights and privileges on it for the promotion of such profession in its field including conduct of examinations and awarding of membership certificates;



- (m) lay down norms for granting autonomy to technical institutions;
- (n) take all necessary steps to prevent commercialization of technical education;
- (o) provide guidelines for admission of students to Technical Institutions and Universities imparting technical education;
- (p) inspect or cause to inspect any Technical Institution;
- (q) withhold or discontinue grants in respect of courses, programmes to such technical institutions which fail to comply with the directions given by the Council within the stipulated period of time and take such other steps as may be necessary for ensuring compliance of the directions of the Council;
- (r) take steps to strengthen the existing organizations, and to set up new organizations to ensure effective discharge of the Council's responsibilities and to create positions of professional, technical and supporting staff based on requirements;
- (s) declare technical institutions at various levels and types offering courses in technical education fit to receive grants;
- (t) advise the Commission for declaring any institution imparting technical education as a Deemed University;
- (u) set up a National Board of Accreditation to periodically conduct evaluation of technical institutions or programmes on the basis of guidelines, norms and standards specified by it and to make recommendations to it, or to the Council, or to the Commission or to other bodies, regarding recognition or de-recognition of the institution or the programmes and
- (v) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed.

Inspection:

- For the purposes of ascertaining the financial needs of technical institution or a University or its standards
 of teaching, examination and research, the council may cause an inspection of any department or
 departments of such technical institution or University to be made in such manner as may be prescribed
 and by such person or persons as it may direct.
- 2. The Council shall communicate to the technical institution or University the date on which any inspection under sub-section (1) is to be made and the technical institution or University shall be entitled to be associated with the inspection in such manner as may be prescribed.
- 3. The Council shall communicate to the technical institution or the University, its views in regard to the results of any such inspection and may, after ascertaining the opinion of that technical institution or University, recommend to that institution or University the action to be taken as a result of such inspection.
- 4. All communications to a technical institution or University under this section shall be made to the executive authority thereof and the executive authority of the technical institution or University shall report to the Council the action, if any, which is proposed to be taken for the purposes of implementing any such recommendation as is referred to in sub-section (3).

Fixed assets and Depreciations

- Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation. Fixed assets received by the AICTE without consideration has been capitalized in the financial statement at a nominal value i.e. Rs. one.
- On periodical physical verification, the obsolete and non-usable assets are identified and cost thereof written off by debit to the capital fund account. q
- Receipts, if any, on the sale of these assets is taken as income under the head 'Misc Receipts.

AUDIT REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2013-2014





Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for the year ended 31 March 2014

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Council for Technical Education (Council) as at 31 March 2014, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that day under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Audited General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 19 of the AICTE Act, 1987. These financial statements include the accounts of 8 regional offices of AICTE. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practice, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

- We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format of Accounts as prescribed by the Government of India, Ministry of Finance.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Council in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

A.I Liabilities

A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule-7) Rs.207.30 crore

The above does not include liabilities for expenses payable of Rs.14.51 lakh on account of DA arrears from January 204 to March 2014. This has resulted into understatement of Liabilities and consequently overstatement of Corpus Fund by the same amount.



Grant in aid

The Council received grants in aid of Rs. 794.23 crore under Plan including Rs. 55.50 crore for NER. Out of this grant, Council received Rs. 355.50 crore in the month of March 2014. It had own plan receipts of Rs. 11.04 crore (Refund of unspent grant Rs.7.56 crore, Receipts of Deposits & Advances – Rs.0.15 crore and interest income Rs.3.33 crore). Out of total amount or Rs.805.27 crore, it utilized Rs. 497.54 crore (Plan Rs.442.04 crore and NER Rs.55.50 crore) leaving a balance of Rs. 307.73 crore.

- C. Management Letter: Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Chairman, All India Council for Technical Education through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.
 - v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
 - vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said financial statements, read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
 - a) In so far as they relate to the Balance Sheet of the state of affairs of the All India Council for Technical Education as at 31 March 2014; and
 - b) In so far as they relate to the Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on the date.
