IMPORTANT CONSTITUTIONAL AND LEGAL PROVISIONS FOR WOMEN IN INDIA

The principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles. The Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. Within the framework of a democratic polity, our laws, development policies, plans and programmes have aimed at women's advancement in different spheres. India has also ratified various international conventions and human rights instruments committing to secure equal rights of women. Key among them is the ratification of the Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) in 1993.

I. CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS

The Constitution of India not only grants equality to women but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women for neutralizing the cumulative socio economic, education and political disadvantages faced by them. Fundamental Rights, among others, ensure equality before the law and equal protection of law; prohibits discrimination against any citizen on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth, and guarantee equality of opportunity to all citizens in matters relating to employment. Articles 14, 15 (1), 15(3), 16, 39(a), 39(d), 39(A) and 42,46,47,51 (A) (e), 243 D(3), 243 D (4), 243 T (3) and 243 T (4) of the Constitution are of specific importance in this regard.

Constitutional Privileges

- i) Equality before law for women (Article 14)
- ii) The State not to discriminate against any citizen on grounds only of religion, race, caste, sex, place of birth or any of them (Article 15(i))
- iii) The State to make any special provision in favour of women and children (Article 15(3))
- iv) Equality of opportunity for all citizens in matters relating to employment or appointment to any office under the State (Article 16)
- v) The State to direct its policy towards securing for men and women equality the right to an adequate means of livelihood (Article 39(a)); and equal pay for equal work for both men and women (Article 39(d))
- vi) To promote justice, on a basis of equal opportunity and to provide free legal aid by suitable legislation or scheme or in any other way to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities (Article 39 A)

- vii) The State to make provision for securing just and humane conditions of work and for maternity relief (Article 42)
- viii) The State to promote with special care the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people and to protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitation (Article 46)
- ix) The State to raise the level of nutrition and the standard of living of its people (Article 47)
- x) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India and to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women (Article 51(A)(e))
- xi) Not less than one-third (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes) of the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in every Panchayat to be reserved for women and such seats to be allotted by rotation to different constituencies in a Panchayat (Article 243 D(3))
- xii) Not less than one-third of the total number of offices of Chairpersons in the Panchayats at each level to be reserved for women (Article243 D(4))
- xiii) Not less than one-third (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes) of the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in every Municipality to be reserved for women and such seats to be allotted by rotation to different constituencies in a Municipality (Article 243 T(3))
- xiv) Reservation of offices of Chairpersons in Municipalities for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and women in such manner as the legislature of a State may by law provide (Article 243 T(4))

II. LEGAL PROVISIONS

Legal Rights

To uphold the Constitutional mandate, the State has enacted various legislative measures intended to ensue equal rights, to counter social discrimination and various forms of violence and atrocities and to provide support services especially to working women.

Although women may be victims of any of the crimes such as 'Murder', 'Robbery', 'Cheating' etc., the crimes, which are directed specially against women, are characterised as 'Crime against Women'. These are broadly classified under two categories.

- 1) The Crimes Identified Under the India Penal Code (IPC)
 - i) Rape (Sec. 376 IPC)
 - ii) Kidnapping & Abduction for different purpose (Sec. 363-373)
 - iii) Homicide for Dowry, Dowry Deaths or their attempts (Sec. 302/304-B IPC)
 - iv) Torture, both mental and physical (Sec. 498-A IPC)
 - v) Molestation (Sec. 354 IPC)
 - vi) Sexual Harassment (Sec. 509 IPC)
 - vii) Importation of girls (up to 21 years of age)
- 2) The Crimes identified under the Special Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of law affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some acts which have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests are:

- xi) The Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1976
- xii) The Equal Remuneration Act, 1976
- xiii) The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006
- xiv) The Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 1983
- xv) The Factories (Amendment) Act, 1986
- xvi) Indecent Representation of Women (Prohibition) Act, 1986
- xvii) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987
- xviii) The Protection of Women from Domestic violence Act, 2005
- 3) Some Important Acts
 - The Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994

III. SPECIAL INITIATIVES FOR WOMEN

i) National Commission for Women

In January 1992, the Government set-up this statutory body with a specific mandate to study and mother all matters relating to the constitutional and legal safeguards provided for women, review the existing legislation to suggest amendments wherever necessary, etc.,

ii) Reservation for Women in Local Self-Government

The 73rd Constitutional Amendment Acts passed in 1992 by Parliament ensure one-third of the total seats for women in all elected offices in local bodies whether in rural areas or urban areas.

iii) The National Plan of Action for the Girl Child (1991-2000)

The plan of Action is to ensure survival, protection and development of the girl child with the ultimate objective of building up a better future for the girl child.

iv) National Policy for the Empowerment of Women, 2001

The Development of Women & Child Development in the Ministry of Human Resource Development has prepared a "National Policy for the Empowerment of Women" in the year 2001. The goal of this policy is to bring about the advancement development and empowerment of women.

v) Hindu Succession (Amendment) Act, 2005

The Hindu Succession (Amendment) Act is to remove gender discriminatory provisions in the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 and gives the following rights to daughters under Section 6:

The daughter of a coparcener shall by birth become a coparcener in her own right in the same manner as the son;

The daughter has the same rights in the coparcenaries property as she would have had if she had been a son;

The daughter shall be subject to the same liability in the said coparcenaries property as that of a son; and any reference to an Hindu Mitakshara coparceners shall be deemed to include a reference to a daughter of a coparcener;

The daughter is allotted the same share as is allotted to a son;

The share of the pre-deceased son or a pre-deceased daughter shall be allotted to the surviving child of such pre-deceased son or of such pre-deceased daughter;

The share of the pre-deceased child of a pre-deceased son or of a predeceased daughter shall be allotted to the child of such pre-deceased child of the pre-deceased son or a pre-deceased daughter;

vi) The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005

This is an Act to provide for more effective protection of the rights of women guaranteed under the Constitution who are victims of violence of any kind occurring within the family and for matter connected therewith or incidental thereto.

vii) The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (PREVENTION, PROHIBITION and REDRESSAL) Act, 2013

An act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redress of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. It is applicable and enacted whereas sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under article 14 and 15 of the constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to safe environment free from sexual harassment.

viii) The criminal law (amendment) Bill, 2013:

This legislation is the result of protest against Delhi rape case also known as Nirbhaya case. This legislation provides amendment in Indian penal code, Code of Criminal Procedure and Indian evidence act on laws related to sexual offences. This bill introduces and amended offences like acid attack, act with intent to disrobe a women, voyeurism, stalking & sexual harassment into the Indian penal code.

ix) Women's Reservation Bill (The Constitution 108th Amendment Bill):

It proposes to amend the Constitution of India to reserve one third of all seats in the Lok Sabha, and in all state legislative assemblies for women. The Rajya Sabha passed the bill but the Lok Sabha has not yet voted on the bill. This will be helpful in increasing the political participation of women.

ANDHRA PRADESH WOMEN'S COMMISSION

The Government of Andhra Pradesh constituted a commission to be known as the Andhra Pradesh Women's Commission under the Andhra Pradesh Women's Commission Act No.9 of 1998 and published in the Gazette No.11, Dt: 09.03.1998. The Commission consists of a Chairperson and not more than six other women members residing in the state to be nominated by the Government on whom one shall belong to the Scheduled Castes and one from the Scheduled Tribes and one from the Backward Classes and one from the Minorities Communities. The Government may, in consultation with the Commission, appoint a woman as Director for making investigations for the purposes of this Act and to carry out such directives given to her by the Commission besides the functions conferred on her by this Act.

Functions of the Commission:

- (1) The Commission shall perform all or any of the following functions namely:-
- (i) inquire into any unfair practice, take decision thereon and recommend to the Government the action to be taken in that matter;
- (ii) cause investigations to be made by the Director on issues of importance concerning women and issues concerning unfair practice and to report thereon to the Government on the corrective measures to be taken;
- (iii) submit to the Government annual reports on:-
 - (a) the lacunae, inadequacies, or shortcoming in the laws in force which effect the constitutional right to equality and fair treatment of women and also on the remedial legislative measures to be taken to meet the situation;
 - (b) the monitoring of the working of laws in force concerning women with a view to identifying the areas where the enforcement of laws is not adequately effective or has not been streamlined and recommending executive or legislative measures to be taken;
 - (c) monitoring the recruitments made to the State Public Services and State Public Undertakings and promotions within the said services and scrutinizing the rules and regulations governing such recruitments and promotions with a view to reporting to guarantee equal opportunity to women in the matter of such recruitments and promotions;
- (iv) (a) inspect or cause to be inspected, by the Director or any officer of the Commission authorized by the Commission in that behalf, prisons, police stations, lock-ups, subjails, rescue homes or other places of custody where

women are kept as prisoners or otherwise, or shelters for women or other places run by the Government or any of its agencies including agencies receiving aid from the Government for the purpose of offering rescue or shelter to women, or hostels intended for women or girls run by any person and such other places wherein unfair practice to women is complained of and cause further inquiries to be made about the treatment that women and girls are subjected to at such places and to report to the Government for taking remedial action:-

- (b) In cases where the Commission is of the view that any public servant has been grossly negligent or grossly indifferent in regard to the discharge of his duties in relation to the protection of the interests of women, recommend to the concerned disciplinary authority to initiate disciplinary action;
- (v) Recommend to Government, the welfare measures to be adopted and implemented by the Government with a view to ameliorating the conditions of women;
- (vi) formulate a comprehensive and affirmative scheme for securing equal opportunities to women and devise a programme for implementing such scheme which shall be forwarded to the Government for approval thereof with or without modifications, implement the same;
- (vii) empower the Director to recommend to the appropriate authority or take prosecution proceedings in respect of offences committed against women under any statue providing for penalty for violation of the provisions of such statute;
- (viii) maintain comprehensive Data Bank relating to the social, economic and political conditions of women including comparative study, updating the same from time to time making available such data for use in actions for indication of the rights of women;
- (ix) Recommend to Government to initiate legislation for removal of discrimination in the case of inheritance, guardianship, adoption and divorce or for matters relating to the safeguarding of the dignity of women and the honour of motherhood;
- (x) Call for special studies or investigations into specific problems or situations arising out of discrimination and atrocities against women and identify the constraints so to recommend strategies for their removal;
- (xi) Participate and advise on the planning process of socio-economic development of women;

- (xii) Fund litigation involving issues affecting a large body of women;
- (xiii) Make periodical reports to the Government on any matter pertaining to women and in particular various difficulties under which women toil;
- (xiv) undertake promotional and educational research so as to suggest ways of ensuring due representation of women in all spheres and identify factors responsible for impeding their advancement, such as, lack of access to housing and basic services inadequate support services and technologies for, reducing drudgery and occupational health hazards and for increasing their productivity;
- (xv) Any other matter which may be referred to it by the Government.
- (2) The Government shall cause the recommendations of Commission under sub-section (1) to be laid before the Legislative Assembly during its next session along with a memorandum of action taken or proposed to be taken on the said recommendations and the reasons for the non-acceptance, if any, of any of such recommendations and cause of action to be taken thereon by the authority concerned within two months from the date of laying such recommendations.

Inquiry into unfair practices.

- (1) The Commission shall inquire into any unfair practice:-
 - (a) on receiving a written a written complaint from any woman alleging that she
 has been subjected to any unfair practice or on a similar complaint from her
 mother or father or sister or brother or from any women's organizations;
 - (b) On its own knowledge or information;
 - (c) On any request from the Government.
- (2) Where the complaint has been made under clause (a) of sub-section (1), the Commission may, before the issue of any process to the person complained against, cause a preliminary investigation to be made by the Director in such manner as it may deem fit, for the purpose of satisfying itself that the complaint requires to be enquired into.
- (3) Where the person against whom the complaint has been made, appears and shows cause or fails to appear on the day appointed for that purpose, the Commission may proceed to inquire into the matter in the complaint and take a decision thereon and if the Commission finds that there is unfair practice, it shall

recommend to the Government the action to be taken thereon or to initiate prosecution.

(4) The Government shall, within two months from the date of receipt of the recommendation of the Commission under sub-section (3) take a decision thereon and intimate the same to the Commission.

Explanation:- For the purpose of this section, person includes a firm, company, corporation or any public undertaking, association of persons or the Government and its agencies including agencies receiving aid from the Government.

Initiation of Prosecution

- (1) The Commission, after inquiry, inspection or as the case may be the investigation under the provisions of this Act, is satisfied that a person has committed any criminal offence may recommend to the State Government or the appropriate authority, as the case may be, to institute legal proceedings or prosecution in the matter and may also recommend to the State Government or the appropriate authority, to appoint a counsel or a special public prosecutor for the conduct of any such legal proceedings or prosecution; and the State Government may, having regard to the nature of the case and on being satisfied that it is necessary, in its opinion, to appoint a counsel or special public prosecutor, do so.
- (2) The State Government or the appropriate authority, as the case may be, shall communicate in writing to the Commission, from time to time, the progress of any such legal proceeding or prosecution filed on the recommendation of the Commission.
- (3) The State Government or the appropriate authority shall not apply for withdrawal of any such case or proceedings instituted under sub-section (1), without the prior consultation, in writing, with the Commission.

IMPORTANT G.Os ISSUED FOR PROTECTION OF THE WOMEN IN STATE:

Constitution of District Level Committee to review the cases of atrocities on Women:

As per G.O.Ms.No.36, Dated: 20-05-1998 of Women Development, Child Welfare & Disabled Welfare Department, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have constituted the District Level Committee under the Chairperson ship of District Collector to review the cases of atrocities of Women.

Measures to Eliminate Discrimination against Women in the field of Employment - Guidelines and Norms:

As per G.O.Ms.No.27, Dt: 21.04.1999 of Women Development, Child Welfare & Disabled Welfare Department, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have made certain recommendations for the elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women for its adoption and enforcement for safeguarding the constitution of India providers for "Gender equality" and the "Right to Life and Liberty".

Policy for Combating Trafficking of Women and Children for Commercial Sexual Exploitation:

It is the duty of the State to protect and restore the dignity of child victims of Trafficking. For that it is implementing G.O.Ms.No.1, Dt: 03.01.2003 of Women Development, Child Welfare & Disabled Welfare Department against Girls Trafficking and Sexual Exploitation in Andhra Pradesh. The Government have decided to constitute District-Level Committees under the Chairmanship of District Collector and a Staff Level Coordination Committee under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary to Government to take up vigorous Campaigns against Trafficking as well as implement the various measures envisaged for the rehabilitation of the victims of Trafficking.

Initiation of Domestic Violence Act 2005 & Rules 2006 (Central Act No. 43 of 2005):

The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act-2005 and Rules 2006 has come in to effect in Andhra Pradesh from 25th October, 2006 which offers various reliefs to victims of Domestic Violence like Protection Orders, Residence Order, Maintenance Order and Custody of Children.

The Govt. of Andhra Pradesh took a proactive role to facilitate implementation of the act in a true spirit, by designating 104 Protection Officers, 72 Service Providers and putting in place DV cells in 23 districts with necessary staff to offer counselling and assistance to women who approach these units.

Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961:

The Govt. of India enacted the "Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961" with a view to discourage the traditional system of giving Dowry which is the root cause for victimisation of women. As per the provisions under Central Act, the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh have framed Rules for implementing of dowry Prohibition Act in state vide G.O.Ms. No. 72, Dt: 17.11.1998 and appointed Revenue Divisional Officers/sub-Collectors as dowry Prohibition Officers exercising the powers conferred by section 10 of the DPA 1961.

Prevention of sexual Harassment of the women at work places:

As per the guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Govt. Of Andhra Pradesh have issued Orders vide G.O.Ms.No.27WD, CW & DW, Dt: 21.04.1999 for constitution of complaint committees in each Government Department to prevent sexual harassment of the working Women.

The Home Department, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh is identified as the Nodal Agency as per the orders of General Administration (Service Welfare) Department vide Cir. Memo. No.11124/SWI/8A2/2003-8, Dt: 25.08.2008 and G.O.Ms.No.391, GA&SW Dept., Dt: 25.08.2005.

National Mission for Empowerment of Women:

The Govt. of India has introduced "National Mission for Empowerment of Women". Under this the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh has issued notification constituting "State Mission Authority" under the Chairmanship of the Chief Minister vide G.O.Ms.No.32, WCD & SC (JJ) Dept., Dt:09.11.2012.

Accordingly establishment of "State Resource Centre for Women" to take up the activities for Socio economic Empowerment of Women is under process.

Relief to victims of Atrocities:

The Govt. of India launched a new Scheme for providing Restorative Justice to the victims of rape (affected women), to provide financial assistance as well as support services such as Counselling, Shelter, Medical and Legal aid to the aggrieved women.

The Department of Women Development and Child Welfare, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh has been providing financial relief to the victims of atrocities i.e., Rape, Gang Rape, Dowry Death, Kidnap, Trafficking, Acid Attack, Hacked or Throat Slit etc., vide G.O.Ms.No.28, Dt: 04.07.2003 & 13.06.2011 and G.O.Ms.No.13, dt:21.04.2006.

An amount of Rs. 20,000/- is being paid to rescued victims of Trafficking as immediate financial relief vide G.O.Ms.No.28, WCD & SC (WP) dept., Dt:15.10.2012.

Vide G.O.Ms.No.1, Dt: 03.01.2003 a comprehensive policy for combating trafficking of Women and Children for commercial sexual exploitation was issued. The G.O provides for constitution of committees at the District level to prevent trafficking and rehabilitation of victims of human trafficking.

8 Ujjawala/Swadhar Homes are being run in the state under Ujjawala scheme for prevention of trafficking, rescue, rehabilitation and repatriation of rescued victims of trafficking.

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has reserved 70% of seats in "Women's Technical Training Institute, Hyderabad" to orphans and semi orphans residing the homes of Women Development and Child Welfare Department.



POPULATION


Andhra Pradesh accounts for 4.10% of India population with 495.77 lakhs persons as per 2011 census by consisting of 247.47 lakhs female and 248.30 lakhs of male population. The ratio of female and male population for the state is 49.92 and 50.08 respectively as per 2011 Census. Female population is increased from 137.11 lakhs in 1971 census to 247.47 lakhs in 2011 Census. Vizianagaram district stood first for both Gender ratio and percentage of female population, with 1,019 females for 1,000 males and having 50.46% of female population to total population for 2011 census.

The Gender ratio is increased from 981 during 1971 census to 997 as per 2011 census.




Rural and Urban Population:

State rural population as per 2011 census is 349.67 lakhs with 174.28 lakhs of females and 175.38 lakhs of males. Gender ratio is increased from 2001 census to 2011 census by increasing from 983 to 994. Visakhapatnam district stood first for both Gender ratio and female population with 1,025 females for 1,000 males and having 50.63% of female population to total population in rural area for 2011 census.

State urban population as per 2011 census is 146.10 lakhs with 73.18 lakhs of females and 72.92 lakhs of males. Gender ratio is increased from 983 for 2001 census to 1004 for 2011 census. Vizianagaram district stood first for both Gender ratio and female population with 1,037 females for 1,000 males and having 50.90% of female population to total population in urban area for 2011 census




Decadal growth rate of female population:

Acceleration of decadal growth rate is slow down from 11.89 during 1991-2001 to 9.21 during 2001-2011 period. Female decadal growth rate is also slow down from 12.74 during 1991-2001 to 9.97 during 2001-2011. It is observed that Vizianagaram district stood first in Gender ratio with 1,019 females per 1,000 males in 2011 census. A remarkable achievement is identified during 2011 census that 6 districts have more than 1,000 females to 1,000 males.






Disabled population:



CHAPTER - II

HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE

Women's health is a necessary and effective approach to strengthening health systems overall – action that will benefit everyone. Improving women's health matters to women, to their families, communities and societies at large. Broader strategies, such as poverty reduction, increased access to literacy, training and education, and increased opportunities for women to participate in economic activities, will also contribute to making sustainable progress in women's health.

Proper nutrition is a key determinant of health, both in child hood and beyond. The nutritional status of girls is particularly important due to their future potential reproductive role and the intergenerational repercussions of poor female nutrition. Preventing child abuse and neglect and ensuring a supportive environment in early childhood will help children to achieve optimal physical, social and emotional development.

More collaboration is needed to develop supportive structures, incentives and accountability mechanisms for improving women's health.

Crude Birth Rates:

District Level Household Survey, 2012-13:

The reproductive and Child Health interventions that are being implemented by the Government of India are expected to provide quality services and achieve multiple objectives. In view of these objectives district being the basic nucleus of administration, it was necessary to

generate district level data on the utilization of services provided by government health facilities, other than service statistics. Therefore it was decided to undertake a Rapid household Survey (DLHS) in all the districts of the country in two phases.

The main objective of the Survey was to estimate the service coverage of the following:

- 1. Ante Natal Care and Immunization services
- 2. Extent of safe deliveries
- 3. Contraceptive prevalence
- 4. Unmet need for family planning
- 5. Awareness about RTI/STI and HIV/AIDS
- 6. Utilization of government health services and users satisfaction.

As per District level Household Survey, 2012-13, percentage of Institutional delivery in United Andhra Pradesh is 88.5 and home delivery is 10.7. In Institutional delivery, West Godavari district stood first with 97.8% followed by Krishna district with 96.9%. In Andhra Pradesh, percentage of home delivery, Kurnool district stood first with 23.5 followed by Visakhapatnam with 18.8.

In United Andhra Pradesh, Mean age at marriage for boys is 24.3 and for girls is 19.8. In family planning methods, percentage of female sterilization is 67.6 and male sterilization is 1.2.

National Family Health Survey, 2015-16:

National Family Health Survey-4 has two specific objectives:

- a) To provide essential data on health and family welfare needed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and other agencies for policy and programme purposes and
- b) To provide information on important emerging health and family welfare issues.

Therefore, NFHS-4, will provide estimates of the levels of fertility, infant and child mortality and other family welfare and health indicators by background characteristics at the national and state levels and Measure trends in family welfare and health indicators over time at the national and state levels. Provide information on several other emerging

issues including- Prenatal mortality, adolescent reproductive health, high risk sexual behavior, safe injections, tuberculosis and malaria. The HIV prevalence estimates from the survey will be used to calibrate the estimates that are based on surveillance data.

As per National Family Health Survey, 2015-16, percentage of Institutional births is 91.6 and percentage of anemic women who are in 15-49 years age group is 52.9. In Andhra Pradesh, percentage of full immunization children is 65.3 and percentage of anemic children who are in 6-35 months age is 58.6.

CHAPTER-III

EDUCATION

Education is very essential for development of the country and eradication of poverty. Though Andhra Pradesh stands at a good position in higher education, it is lagging behind in primary education. The government is taking all the measures to improve primary education by creating best infrastructure in the state. The state seeks to achieve the target of 100 percent literacy rate by 2019. With a view to provide quality education to all sections of the society the state government has increased the budget allocation to education sector from 10% to 16%.

LITERATES AND LITERACY RATE:


Female Literates in Andhra Pradesh was increased from 38.15 lakhs in 1961 Census to 133.10 lakhs in 2011 Census. Whereas it shows a rapid growth in total Female Literates from 1991 Census to 2011 Census. Number of Female Illiterates has decreased from 1.21 lakhs in 2001 Census to 1.14 lakhs in 2011 Census.

Percentage of Literates of Female Population in the Age group of 15-49 years for United Andhra Pradesh is 65.0 against 71.0 for India as per Sample Registration System Statistical Report, 2013.

Regarding Female Literacy Rate, Andhra Pradesh stood 22nd place in India. Kerala state stands first with 92.07 Female Literacy Rate among 29 States. In Andhra Pradesh, Female Literacy Rate is increased from 34.92 in 1991 Census to 59.96 in 2011 Census against 39.29 in 1991 Census to 64.64 in 2011 Census in India. Decade wise Male literacy Rate is increased for Andhra Pradesh from 56.53 to 74.77 from 1991 Census to 2011 Census.






Literacy rate in Andhra Pradesh

Enrolment of Girls in schools, 2014-15:

The State has developed a number of strategies and interventions to facilitate bringing more number of out-of-school children to school. Andhra Pradesh State Government has launched, <u>Badi Pilustondi</u> Program starts from 25 July to 2 August 2014. During this program government has been trying to eradicate the illiteracy and join the children in school who are away from the studies and steps to implement to provide quality education to children. In this program, teachers and students will perform meetings in villages and initiate the drop out children to join in the school.

The main aim of "Badi Pilustondi" is to ensure enrollment of all children in the age group of 6-14 years in the school. Many efforts have taken in this regard, but still some children remain out of school. In the out of school children some are 'never enrolled' and Enrolled but dropped out. Due to lack of awareness and poverty some children are also involved in hazardous occupations and some children dropped out due to migration of families.

Objectives:


- a) To ensure 100% enrolment of all eligible children in schools
- b) To ensure that no child in the age group of 6-14 years is left out of school.
- c) To bring back all drop out children to school.
- d) To ensure that no child work as labourer i.e. to implement "Child Labour Prohibition and Regulation Act, 1986" under earnest spirit.
- e) To involve various stake holder like local bodies, NGOs, SHGs and officials in this endeavour.
- f) To improve infrastructural facilities and provide good ambience in the school.
- g) To implement and monitor this programme, District level committee and state level committee are formed.

During the year 2014-15, Enrolment of Girls in Primary Schools is 13.16 lakhs, Primary with Upper Primary Schools is 6.13 lakhs, Primary with Upper Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary schools is 0.74 lakhs, Upper Primary with Secondary and Higher Secondary Schools is 0.35 lakhs, Primary with Upper Primary and Secondary schools is 2.16 lakhs and Upper Primary with Secondary Schools is 13.05 lakhs in Andhra Pradesh.

Gross Enrolment Ratio, 2014-15:

Gross Enrolment Ratios for Classes I-V, Classes VI- VIII and Classes IX-X for Girls in Andhra Pradesh during 2015-16 are 88.86, 80.19 and 74.82 respectively. Gross enrolment ratio has decreased in all classes during 2014-15.

Dropout Rates:


Andhra Pradesh is known for high drop-out rates of school going children among Indian s tates. Fictitious enrolment is one of t he factors responsible. The state introduced the non-detention system in 1971 under which children are promoted to the next higher class each year irrespective of their progress assessed through any formal test. In recent years, after the implementation of mid-day meals scheme, school enrolment has greatly increased as every child whose name is registered is eligible for benefits from the scheme. But, man y children are not regular in attend ing school. In the late 1990s the sta te began special enrolment drives in the name of 'chaduvulapanduga' recently "Badi Pilustondi".

The drop-out rate in the state has declined steadily over the years. According to the data of the Department of School Education

(AP), at primary school level, the drop-out rate was 24.73 p er cent in 2005-06 which had gradually declined to 4.60 per cent in 2014-15. Dropout Rates for Girls in Classes I-V, I-VIII and I-X during 2 014-15 in Andhra Pradesh is 4.30, 16.59 and 25.93 against 4.60, 15.74 and 25.23 of Total Dropout Rates.

The number Female Teachers in Primary Schools is 0.55 lakhs, Primary with Upper Prim ary Schools is 0.32 lakhs, Primary w ith Upper Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary schools is 0.02 lakhs, Upper Primary with Sec ondary and Higher Secondary School is 0.01 lakhs, Primary with Upper Primary and Secondary schools is 0.07 lakhs and Upper Primary with Secondary Schools is 0.42 lakhs during the year 2014-15 in Andhra Pradesh.

Junior Colleges:

The number of Girl Students and Women Lecturer s during 2014-15 in Andhra Pradesh in Junior Colleges is 0.81 lakhs and 0.01 lakhs against 1.72 lakhs of Total Students and 0.03 lakhs of Total Lecturers.

Degree Colleges:

In Andhra Pradesh, the number of Women Students and Women Lecturers in Degree Colleges during 2014-15 (Govt. and Private-aided) is 0.94 lakhs and 0.03 lakhs against 2.25 lakhs of Total Students and 0.07 lakhs of Total Lecturers. Total No. of Degree colleges (Government +Pvt. Aided) for women in Andhra Pradesh during the year 2014-15 are 37 with 34,199 students and 1140 teachers.

Government Hostels:

Total number of Girls Government Hostels for Scheduled Castes and total Girls Students in Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15 are 433 and 39,387 against 1,259 Total Hostels and 1,04,556 Total Students. Out of 39,387 girl students, 5,201 students are in West Godavari District and 4,525 students are in Krishna District.

Total number of Government girls Hostels for Scheduled Tribe during the year 2014-15 in Andhra Pradesh is 55 with 6,644 girls against 197 total hostels and 21,830 Total Students. Number of Ashram Schools for Scheduled Tribe girls during the year 2014-15 in Andhra Pradesh is 130 with 45,064 Girl Students against 361 total hostels and 94,155 Total Students.

Total number of Government B.C. Welfare pre matric hostels for girls in Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15 is 206 with 22,176 students against 897 Total Hostels and 89,353 Total Students. Total number of Government B.C. Welfare post matric hostels for girls in Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15 is 172 with 14,602 students against 349 Total Hostels and 31,050 Total Students.

Female Graduate and Post Graduates:

The percentage of Female Graduates to Total Graduates for Andhra Pradesh is increased from 27.4 in 2001 census to 33.75% in 2011 Census.

During the year 2014-15 in Andhra Pradesh, number of women graduates is 78,997 and Percentage of Women graduates to total graduates is 41.73%. In Women graduates, West Godavari stood first with 49.54% followed by Krishna District with 48.36%. Number of post graduates is 5,916 and percentage of women post graduates to total post graduates is 54.09%. In post graduates, Nellore District stood first with 74.00% followed by Visakhapatnam district with 60.67%.


ECONOMY AND EMPLOYMENT



Percentages of Women Registrations to total Registrations, Women Placements to total placements and Women Live Register to Total Live Register for Andhra Pradesh for the year 2014 are 27.35, 40.58 and 27.80 respectively.

Guntur District stood first with 29.08% of Women Employment in Total Employment. In Public sector, West Godavari District stood first with 34.95% women employment followed by Guntur District 28.50%. 

CHAPTER - V

WOMEN 'S PARTICIPATION IN DECISION MAKING


The empowerment and autonomy of women and the improvement of women's social, economic and political status is essential for the achievement of both transparent and accountable government and administration and sustainable development in all areas of life. Achieving the goal of equal participation of women and men in decision making will provide a balance that more accurately reflects the composition of society and is needed in order to strengthen democracy and promote its proper functioning.

Equality in political decision making performs a leverage function without which it is highly unlikely that a real integration of the equality dimension in government policy making is feasible. In this respect, women's equal participation in political life plays a pivotal role in the general process of the advancement of women. Women's equal participation in decision making is not only a demand for simple justice or democracy but can also be seen as a necessary condition for women's interests to be taken into account. Without the active participation of women and the incorporation of women's perspective at all levels of decision making, the goals of equality, development and peace cannot be achieved. Equality in decision making is essential to the empowerment of women.

Women's participation in Politics:

In 2014 general elections for State Legislative Assembly, total no. of women voters has increased from 94.22 lakhs in 1962 to 184.64 lakhs in 2014. The percentage of women voters to total voters is 50.28% in 2014 general elections to state legislative assembly in United Andhra Pradesh. The Percentage of women electors voted in elections has increased from 59.81% in 1962 to 78.06% in 2014.

In Andhra Pradesh, out of 175 MLAs, 18 female members were elected as MLAs in 2014 General Elections. No of female contestants in various general elections to the State Legislative Assembly in United Andhra Pradesh has increased from 24 in 1962 to 180 in 2014. In 2014 general elections, out of 25 Lok Sabha Constituencies, only 2 female candidates were elected as Member of Parliament in Andhra Pradesh. Only 18 women MLAs and 2 women MPs were elected in 2014 general Elections in Andhra Pradesh. The number of women Contestants has increased from 9th to 16th general elections in United Andhra Pradesh.

The total no. of voters in Andhra Pradesh is 3,67,18,421 and Percentage of female voters voted in 16th General Elections in Andhra Pradesh is 78.05%.

Participation in Courts:

In High Court, there are only two female judges, out of 36 judges in United Andhra Pradesh during 2014.

In 2014, out of 211 District Judges in the State, female District Judges are only 33. Percentage of female District Judges to total Judges in Andhra Pradesh for the year 2014 is 15.64%. The number of women District judges has increased from 19 in 2009 to 33 in 2014.

In Supreme Court, out of 30 judges, 2 female judges and in High courts out of 609 judges, 58 are female judges in India.


Female headed households:

In rural Andhra Pradesh total households are 90,65,358 in which female headed households are 14,01,545. The Percentage of female headed households to the total household is 15.46. Out of 13 districts, Percentage of female headed households, Srikakulam district stood first with 18.41 followed by Visakhapatnam district with 17.28.

In urban area of Andhra Pradesh, total households are 36,53,618, in which female Headed households are 5,07,747. Percentage of District wise number of female headed households in Urban Andhra Pradesh as per 2011 census to the total households is 13.90. Out of 13 districts, Percentage of female headed households, Srikakulam district stood first with 16.96 followed by Vizianagaram district with 15.79%.

The total households in Andhra Pradesh as per 2011 Census are 1,27,18,976 in which Female Headed Households are 19,09,292. Percentage of District wise number of female headed households in Andhra Pradesh to the total households is 15.01. Out of 13 districts, Percentage of female headed households, Srikakulam district stood first with 18.18 followed by Vizianagaram with 15.85.





CHAPTER - VI

CRIMES, CONVICTIONS AND POLICE FORCE

Violence against women in Andhra Pradesh is very old social issue which has taken its root deeply to the social norms and economic dependence. The cases of violence against women is increasing day by day and becoming too broad. It is going very complex and deeply rooted in the Indian Society even after increasing education level of the people.


Women generally face various kinds of crime like dowry death, sexual harassment, cheating, murder, girl child abuse, robbery, etc. Violence against women which counted as crimes under the Indian Penal Code are rape, kidnapping and abduction, torture physically and mentally, dowry deaths, wife battering, sexual harassment, molestation, importation of girls etc. Rape, murder, abduction, kidnapping cases is criminal violence against women however dowry deaths, sexual abuse, wife battering, maltreatment at home or offices are the causes of domestic violence against women.

Some of the social violence cases against women are eve-teasing and forcing wife or daughter-in-law for the female infanticide etc. All the violence against women is affecting the large section of the society. Violence against women happens because of inefficient legal justice system, weak rules of law and male dominated social and political structures. It is creating pressure and heavy responsibility over the shoulders of social workers.

In Andhra Pradesh, total number of Crimes registered against Women for year 2014 is 13,549. Crimes registered against women in have increased from 9,693 in 2007 to 13,549 in 2014.

In Andhra Pradesh, no. of Crimes registered against women, in harassment cases are high with 5,607 cases followed by outraging of modesty with 4,093 cases in 2014.



Women arrested under IPC:

Total number of persons arrested under IPC in the state during 2014 is 1,66,211 in which 10,905 women were arrested in Andhra Pradesh. No. of women arrested in all crimes has increased from 10,283 in 2011 to 10,905 in 2014. Out of 10,905 Women arrested under IPC in Andhra

Pradesh for the year 2014, 4,895 women arrested were in the ag e group of 30-45 years followed by 3, 308 in the age group of 18-30 years.


Women arrested under S pecial and Local Laws:

In Andhra Pradesh, 634 women were arrested under Special and Local Laws during the year 2014. Out of 634 women, 226 w omen were arrested under Immoral T raffic Act and 40 were under Dowry Prohibition Act (370) in Andhra Prad esh. As per age group wise, 300 w omen were arrested under the age gr oup of 30-45 years followed by 144 in the age group of 45-60 years for the year 2014.

Rape case victims:

The number of Rape case victims registered in Andhra P radesh has increased from 444 in 200 5 to 946 in 2014. In 946 rape cases, 20 victims are below 10 years age group followed by 38 and 198 victims in the age groups of 10-14 years and 14 -18 years respectively. No. of rape victims cases has increased from 444 in 2005 to 946 in 2014. In 201 4, 40% of rape case victims are in the age group of 30-50 years.




Suicides and Accidental female deaths:

In Andhra Pradesh, Suicides and accidental deaths has increased from 11,678 in 2005 to 21,968 in 2014. Out of 21,968 deaths, 4,891 (22%) were female deaths.

Causes of Suicide deaths:

In female Suicide deaths during 2014, illness caused female suicide deaths were 575, followed by 395 family problems caused suicide deaths. In 1887 female suicide cases, 1,072 female were housewives and 1,213 were married women.

Women strength in Police Force:

During the year 2014-15, actual strength of armed (Reserved) APSP Battalions officers in Andhra Pradesh is 79 in which female officers' strength is nil. Actual strength of ordinary (Civil) Officers in A.P. is 867, in which female officers strength is 26 only.

The total strength of Ordinary (Civil) Police Force in Andhra Pradesh in 33,411 during the year 2014-15 in which female strength is 2,044 (6.12%). Out of 2,044 Ordinary (civil) Police women strength, 13 women are in the cadre of Inspector and 2,018 (98.73%) women are in the rank of Sub Inspectors to Police constable. The total strength of home guards is 11,822 in which female strength is 1,227 (10.38%).

Convicts:

During the year 2014, out of 142 Women convicts, 89 women were in the age group of 21-40 years followed by 44 in the age group of 40-65 years. Total No. of under trails is 5,318 in which female prisoners are 221.

Out of 221 female remand prisoners, remand period Up to 1 month are 144 during the year 2014 in Andhra Pradesh.

Total No. of Juvenile in conflict with Law committed to Children Homes/Special Homes in Andhra Pradesh for the year 2014 is 687, in which girls' number is 105.

Total number of Prisoners according to lock-up report for year 2014 in Andhra Pradesh is 7,964 in which strength of women prisoners is 363. Out of these women prisoners, 140 women are in Central Prisons and 81 are in Special prisons.

Education, Employment and Marital Status of Women Prisoners:

Particulars of Education, Employment and Marital Status of Women Prisoners in Andhra Pradesh for the year 2014 are illustrated. Out of 363 women prisoners, in Education, 121 (33.3%) women are illiterates, in Employment, 222 (61.16%) women are employed and in Marital Status 224 (61.71%) women are married during the year 2014.



CHAPTER- VII

WOMEN AND CHILD WELFARE SCHEMES IMPLEMENTING BY THE WOMEN AND CHILD WELFAFRE DEPARTMENT

To enhance the status of women in society and to ensure that she is given an equal opportunity to develop to her full potential, the department is implementing various schemes and programmes for the holistic development, empowerment and protection of women including those meant for her health, education and nutrition care.

The Government is implementing various programmes and schemes for education, nutrition and health care for the women viz., Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahyog Yojana (IGMSY) etc. For empowering women and to improve the status of women, AP Women Cooperative Development Corporation has established Durgabai Mahila Sishu Vikasa Kendrams (DMSVk) which imparts vocational trainings to the needy women.

Integrated Child Development Schemes:

ICDS scheme is the single largest centrally sponsored integrated programme of Child Development Scheme. The main objective of this programme is to cater to the needs of development of children in the age group of 3-6 years. Pre-school education aims at ensuring holistic development of children and provision of a learning environment to children conducive for promotion of social, emotional, cognitive and aesthetic development of the child. Pre-school activities strengthen the child to get ready for primary school education with required skills to perform better in school entry and also improve regular attendance in schools.

Integrated Child Protection Scheme:

The Integrated Child Protection Scheme provides preventive, statutory, care and rehabilitation services to vulnerable children, children of socially excluded groups like migrant families, families living in extreme poverty, SCs, STs & OBCs families affected by discrimination, minorities, children infected and/ or affected by HIV/AIDS, orphans, child drug abusers, children of substance abusers, child beggars, trafficked or sexually exploited children, children of prisoners street & working children. 2578 Child Protection Committees were trained for identification and enumeration of working children for rescuing and rehabilitating the child labour through benefits of various schemes implemented by different Government departments.

Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahayog Yojana Scheme (IGMSY):

Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahayog Yojana Scheme is a centrally sponsored Conditional Cash Transfer Scheme and is being implemented in the selected District of West Godavari. To improve the health and nutrition status of Pregnant and Lactating (P&L) women and their young infants.

- To improve appropriate practices, care and service utilization during pregnancy, safe delivery and lactation.
- ii) To encourage women to follow (optimal) Infant and Young child Feeding (IYCF) practices including early and exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months.
- iii) To contribute better enabling environment by providing cash incentives for improved health and nutrition to pregnant and lactating women.

Maa Inti Mahalakshmi (Bangarutalli):

It was launched on 1 May 2013 by Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Sri Kiran Kumar Reddy. The supporting legislation AP Bangarutalli Girl Child Promotion and Empowerment Act, 2013 was passed on 19 June 2013 in Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly. 2,58,187 persons were benefitted under this programme now called Maa Inti Mahalakshmi.

Objectives of the Scheme:

- To enchance the social status of the girl child
- ii) To delay age of marriage
- iii) To ensure registration of birth and immunization
- iv) Enrolment for better nutrition and improving the girl's educational standards

Prevention & Rescue of Child Labour:

Convergence meetings were conducted at District level for eradication of Child Labour periodically and awareness created on child labour laws and elimination of child labour. Rescued children are provided temporary shelter in Observation Homes, Special Homes, Children Homes and Shelter homes and they are reintegrated with their families and either enrolled in educational institutions or provided skill development training.

DCPU staff participates in preventing child marriages in districts and about 275 child marriages were stopped from April 2015 to September 2015. Rs. 157.67 Lakh was released to all district for providing sponsorship and foster care for mentally challenged, HIV infected children and orphan children.

Anna Amrutha Hastam:

The "Anna Amrutha Hastam Programme" – One full Meal to pregnant and Lactating Women was introduced during 2014-15 in 104 ICDS Projects in the State. The one full meal consists of rice, dal with leafy vegetables/Sambar, vegetables, egg and 200ml milk for a minimum of 25 days in a month. Along with the meal, Iron Folic Acid tablet is to be administered. Under this programme 310928 pregnant/lactating women are benefited upto October, 2015.

IDA Assisted ISSNIP:

International Development Association (World Bank)assisted ICDS systems strengthening and Nutrition Improvement Project (ISSNIP) is being implemented in 10 Districts of Andhra Pradesh at an estimated cost of Rs.242.37 Crore in the cost sharing of 90:10 between the GOI and the State Government for a peiod of 7 years from the date of effectiveness of the project i.e. 26th January, 2012 (2012-13) to 31st October, 2019 (2019-20).

The Project has four components viz.,

- 1. Institutional and System strengthening,
- 2. Community Mobilization and Behaviour Change Communication
- 3. Piloting Convergent Nutrition Actions & Project Management, Technical Assistance and Monitoring & Evaluation under Phase I.

197 ICDS Projects and 43,616 Anganwadi Centres in the 10 selected districts viz., Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Vishakapatnam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Prakasam, YSR Kadapa, Kurnool, Ananthapuram and Chittoor are covered under ISSNIP. An amount of Rs.5.61 crore was incurred expenditure so far.

Girl Child Protection Scheme:

The Girls Child Protection Scheme came into force in April, 2005 and aims to prevent gender discrimination by empowering and protecting the rights of Girls Child through direct investment from Government. BPL families having single girl child of 0-3 years of age or two girl children of whom the age of the second girl child is not more than 3 years as on 01-04-2005 are eligible for coverage under the scheme. Under this scheme 631781 beneficiaries are benefitted sofar.

Women Institutions

Institutions are being run for women under the schemes viz., Service homes, State homes, Rescue Homes, Working Women hostel, Old age Home and Collegiate Girls.

Service Homes:

These homes have sanctioned capacity of 50 to 150 women and 25 to 60 children. The main aim of the scheme is to provide rehabilitation to socially and economically deprived categories of women in the age group of 18-45 years. They are provided free food, shelter and clothing and allowed stay for period of 3 years. During this period the inmates are given formal education and necessary skill training in various trades to establish their self employment units.

In Andhra Pradesh, 3 service homes with 105 present strength against 405 sanctioned strength are functioning for women during 2014-15.

State Homes:

These homes are meant for women discharged from Correctional Institutions and Women in distress. They are provided free food, shelter and clothing and allowed to stay for a period of 3 years. During their stay formal education and employment oriented training is imparted. Most of the candidates are referred by the Police Department under various cases like Child marriage, rape, kidnapping etc. In Andhra Pradesh, 2 state homes with 68 present strength against 200 sanctioned strength is functioning for women during 2014-15.

Rescue Homes:

The Rescue home was sanctioned under SITA Act (Suppression of Immoral Act) to accommodate women who are rescued by the police and are facing trial in the court and are given shelter during the trial period. During their stay, they are provided free shelter, food clothing, medical care and training in skill development. In Andhra Pradesh there are no rescue homes so far.

Old age Homes for Women:

These homes provide peaceful and comfortable living for the old destitute women of above 60 years of age with food, shelter and clothing. Sanctioned strength of these homes is 30 each. Women above 60 years are given free shelter, food and clothing for their entire life span. In Andhra Pradesh, out of 13 districts, home for aged women institution is functioning in Chittoor district only with 20 present strength against 30 sanctioned strength.

Homes for Collegiate Girls:

There are 4 homes functioning in the state at Vizianagaram, Tanuku, Guntur and Tirupati. The intake capacity of these homes ranges from 30-60. The inmates of children homes in the age group of 15 to 20 years who have passed 10th class are given admission to persue their higher studies, and allowed to stay for a maximum period of 5 years. During this period they are provided free shelter, food, books and clothing.

Working Women's Hostels:

There are 11 working women hostels functioning in the State. These hostels are self reliant and managed on co-operative basis and provide food, shelter and other facilities including security to the middle class working women on payment of the charges prescribed by the Government. The sanction strength of Working Women's hostels vary from 45 to 80 inmates.

Swadhar Scheme:

Swadhar aims at covering the primary needs of shelter, food, clothing and care besides emotional support, counseling and a package for rehabilitation and reintegration specifically for the women and girls rescued from trafficking. The Home strength is ranging from 50-200 beneficiaries. Presently 8 homes are implementing the sheme in Andhra Pradesh.

Anganwadi Centres:

Anganwadi is a government sponsored child care and mother care development programmes in India at village level. It caters to children in the 0-6 age group. They were started by the Indian government in 1975 as part of the Integrated Child Development Services.

The basic services provided under ICDS are mentioned under three headings like nutrition, health and pre-school education. Nutrition services include supplementary feeding, growth monitoring and nutrition and health counseling. Health services include immunization, basic health care and referral services. Pre-school education involves various stimulation and learning activities at the Anganwadi.

There are 55,607 anganwadi centres with 35.97 lakhs of 0-6 years children are functioning under 257 projects in 13 districts of Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15. Totally 55,607 anganwadi teachers and 48,770 ayas (helpers) are working in the State.



CHAPTER-VIII

MISCELLANEOUS

According to Census of Land Holdings 2010-11, total land holdings in Andhra Pradesh are 76, 21,118 in which the women holdings are 21,53,195 (28.25%). East Godavari district stood first with 2, 53,646 women holdings and followed by Guntur with 2, 18,821 and least in Visakhapatnam district with 96,055. Percentage of women holdings to total Marginal, small, semi-medium, medium and large holdings are 30.78%, 25.30%, 21.65%, 17.96% and 15.72% respectively. Size class wise number of female holdings is given below.


In Andhra Pradesh, as per 2010-11 Census of land holdings Scheduled caste total land holdings are 7,13,038 in which women holdings are 2,22,867 (31.26%). SPS Nellore district stood first with 28,279 women holdings and least in Visakhapatnam district with 2,856 holdings. In all sizes of Scheduled caste holdings, the highest 32.85% of holdings are Marginal holdings followed by small holdings with 26.41%.


Scheduled Tribe women holdings are 1,00,912 (26.07%) out of 3,87,053 scheduled Tribe holdings in Andhra Pradesh during 2010-11 Census of Land Holdings. Visakhapatnam district stood first with 15,661 women holdings and least in Krishna district with 3,396 holdings. In all sizes of Scheduled Tribe holdings, the highest 29.24% of holdings are marginal holdings followed by small holdings with 24.39%.

In Andhra Pradesh, as per 2010-11 Census of land holdings other social group total land holdings are 65,16,141 in which women holdings are 18,29,416 (28.08%). East Godavari district stood first with 2,19,015 women holdings and least in Visakhapatnam district with 77,538 holdings. In large holdings, Ananthapuram district stood first with 791 women holdings.

<u>Mahatma</u> <u>Gandhi</u> <u>National</u> <u>Rural</u> <u>Employment</u> <u>Guarantee</u> Scheme:-

For providing employment in rural areas Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme was launched in 200 select districts on 2-2-2006. Presently Mahatma Gandhi NREGA is being implemented in all the notified rural areas of the country.

The Ministry of Rural Development is the nodal Ministry for the implementation of Mahatma Gandhi NREGA. It is responsible for ensuring timely and adequate resource support to the states and to the Central Council. A house hold is the basic unit for providing employment. All adult member of a household whose names appear on the job card may demand employment subject to an overall ceiling of 100 days in a financial year per house hold. Key Stake holders are:-wage seekers, Gram Sabha, PRIs specially the Gram Panchayats, Programme Officer at the block level, District programme Coordinator, State Governments and Ministry of Rural Development.

Works which are permissible under Mahatma Gandhi NREGA are Water conservation and water harvesting, Drought proofing Irrigation canals including micro and minor irrigation works provision of irrigation facility, horticulture plantation and land development facilities, renovation of traditional water bodies including desilting of tanks, flood

control and protection works including drainage in water logged areas, and rural connectivity to provide all weather access.

Under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Schme, the number of Female working in Andhra Pradesh during the year 2014-15 is 30,18,626 (35.59%) against 84,82,431 female work force registered.

Self Help Groups:-

The government of Andhra Pradesh is committed to social and economic empowerment of women. It has adopted micro credit as a tool to attain the same and had taken the SHG-Bank Linkage program as a mass movement since 1998-99 onwards in the state to achieve the goal. Various training and capacity building programs have been conducted on production, packing marketing, micro credit and utilization of loans etc., to women SHGs. The State Government has taken several initiatives to extend financial support to these groups. The Nationalized banks, Regional Rural Banks & Co-operative Banks are coming forward to issue loans to SHGs with lower rate of interest.

The SHG women have actively participated in fairs, melas or exhibitions organized at state, national and international level and are able to market their products through internet. Well-known companies viz., Hindustan Lever Limited, Food World& Apna Bazaar have come forward to tie up with the SHGs and market their products.

The number of Self Help Groups (SHG) in Andhra Pradesh up to 2014-15 is 6, 79, 932. East Godavari district stood first in number of SHGs and Group members. Out of 6,79,932 Self Help Groups, Bank credit provided self help groups are 1,88,831 (27.72%) in Andhra Pradesh up to 2014-15.

Andhra Pradesh State Housing Corporation Limited:

Andhra Pradesh State Housing Corporation Limited aims to bring dignity to each and every BPL family for assisting them both financially and technically for construction of permanent (Pucca) houses.

In this scheme, total number of houses completed in the State during 2014-15 is 29,342 in which the share of women in rural, urban and total are 21,825 (87.13%), 4,152 (96.74%) and 25,977 (88.53%) respectively.

Pensions:-

The Government of Andhra Pradesh is committed to secure dignified life to all the poor and vulnerable, particularly the old and infirm and to support their minimum needs to bring happiness in their lives. In pursuit of this overarching goal, inspite of the challenging financial conditions, orders were issued vide G.O.Ms.No. 113 Dated: 19.06.2014 enhancing the NTR Bharosa Pension amount from Rs.200/- to Rs.1000/- per month to Old Age, Widow, Weavers, Toddy Tappers and AIDS patients and from Rs.500/- to Rs.1000/- per month to People With Disabilities (PWD) having 40% to 79% degree of disability and Rs.1500/- per month for PWDs having 80% and above degree of disability, and that the above enhanced scale of pension came into effect from 2nd October, 2014 onwards.

Number of Widow Pensions in the state during the year 2014-15 is 13,47,816 in which East Godavari district is placed first with 1,48,305 Widow Pensions. 21,40,442 Old Aged Pensions(OAPs) were distributed in Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15 in which the share of women in OAPs is 10,28,599. The total number of disabled Pensions distributed in the state is 5,41,822 during 2014-15 out of these 2,17,982 disabled Pensions were distributed to women. 76,738 Weavers Pensions were distributed in Andhra Pradesh during 2014-15 in which the share of women in Weavers Pensions is 27,733.



GLOSSARY

Gender Ratio: Number of Females per 1,000 Males.

Density of Population: Number of Persons per sq. Kms.

Growth rate: Percentage of increase in reference period over previous annual period.

Ever Married Women: A women who has been married at least once in their lives although their current marital status may not be married.

Children Ever Born: Children ever born comprise information on the number of children born alive and should include all children born alive during the lifetime of the woman concerned up to the census date.

Migrant: A person who has moved from one politically defined area to another similar area. Thus a person who moves out from one village or town to another villager or town is termed as a migrant provided his/her movement is not of purely temporary nature on account of casual leave, visits, tours, etc.,

Household: A group of persons who normally live together and take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so.

Birth Rate: Number of Births per 1,000 population.

Infant Mortality Rate: Number of infant deaths during the year per 1,000 Live Births during the year.

Crude Birth Rate: Number of live births during the year per 1,000 population (mid year).

Crude Death Rate: Number of deaths during the year per 1,000 population (mid year).

Age-specific Fertility Rate: Number of live births in a particular age group per 1,000 female population of the same age group (mid year).

General Fertility Rate: Number of live births in a year per 1,000 female population in the age-group (15-49) years.

Literate: A person aged 7 years and above who can both read and write with understanding in any one language.

Literacy Rate: Percentage of literates in the total population excluding 0-6 years (age 7 years and above).

Gross Enrolment Ratio: It is defined as the percentage of enrolment in classes' I-V, VI-VIII and IX-X to the estimated children of 6-10, 11-12 and 13-15 years respectively.

(Contd.)

Drop-out Rate: It is defined as percentage of the number of children to total enrolment dropping out of the educational system in a particular year.

Main Workers: Those workers who had worked for the major part of the reference period (i.e. 6 months or more).

Marginal Worker: Those workers who had not worked for the major part of the reference period (i.e. less than 6 months).

Non-Workers: A person who is not engaged in any gainful activity.

Work Participation Rate: It is defined as the percentage of total workers (main and marginal) to total population.

Persons employed: The number of persons include the members of the household and other unpaid workers engaged along with the number of workers hired from outside for all the activities of the enterprise.

Non Hired Workers: Number of unpaid workers engaged in the activity of an enterprise.

Operational Holding: All land which is used wholly or partly for agricultural production and is operated as one technical unit by one person alone or with others without regard to the title legal form size or location.
