MEGHALAYA AT A GLANCE

Physical Features :-

Meghalaya is the 21st State of India. It was carved out of the Assam State. It first emerged as an Autonomous State within Assam on the 2nd April, 1970 and then as a full-fledged State with effect from the 21st January, 1972.

It is bounded on the north by the districts of Kamrup, Goalpara and Karbi Anglong of Assam State, on the west by Bangla Desh and on the east by the districts of Cachar and North Cachar Hills also of the State of Assam.

Meghalaya lies between 25°47′N to 26°10′N latitude and 89°45′E to 92°47′E longitude.
