6. SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

An outlay of Rs. 6199 was provided for this sector in the year 1978-79. An outlay of Rs. 7370-00 lakhs has been proposed for the socia' and community services for the Annual Plan 1979-80. The sectoral and sub-sectoral break-up is as under:—

6.1. GENERAL EDUCATION

6.1.1.1. An outlay of Rs. 900.00 lakhs is proposed for General Education for the year 1979-80. From the above outlay an amount of Rs. 22.00 lakhs is earmarked for Tribal Area Sub-plan In addition an amount of Rs. 15.00 lakhs is expected to flow from special central assistance for the Tribal Area Jub-Plan. The broad break-up of the proposed outlay of Rs. 900.00 lakhs is as under:

6.1.1.2. The highest priority is assigned to (1) Elementary Education and (2) Audlt Education which are classified as Minimum Needs Programme. These two programmes account for Rs. 575.00 lakes of the proposed outlay.

6.1.2. Elementary Education (MNP):

6.1.2.1. According to the norms of the Minimum Needs Programme as fixed by the Government of India, it is necessary to cover 100% children in the age group 6-14 by 1987-88 and to achieve 90% coverage by the end of 1978-83. In Gujarat, at the end of 1977-78 the number of children enrolled in the age group 6-11 (Class-I to V) was 39.71 lakhs representing 99% of total population of that age gruop of whom enrolment of boys were 23.73 lakhs representing 115% and enrolement of girlswas 15.98 alakhs representing 82% of the respective population of the said age group. In the age grou 11 to 14 (Class VI to VIII) the enrolment was 10.51 lakhs representing 45% of the poputation in the age group of whom enrolement of boys was 6.75 lakhs representing 56% and girls 3.76 lakhs representing 34% of the respective population of the age group. Over-11 enrolement for the entrie age group 6 to 14 at the end of 1977-78 was 50.22 lakhs representing 80% of the population. In view of the progress already achieved and to avoid stagnation it is envisaged to achieve an enrolement of 110% in the age group of 6 to 11 (Class-I to IV) and enrolement of

- 85% in the age group 11 to 14 (C.ass-VI to VIII) representing 101% of the entire agre group 6 to 14 (Class-I to VIII) by the end of the plan 1978-83.
- 6.1.2.2. By the end of the year 1978-79, 102.66% of the children in the age group 6-11 and 46.86% of the children in the age group 11-14 will be covered. These percentages are expected to rise to 104.10 and 56.78 in the respective age groups by the end of the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.2.3. More emphasis is laid on the enrolement of children in the Tribal and Backward areas by providing incentives for attending schools by the way of free supply of text books and uniforms for regular attendance. An amount of Rs. 20.00 lakhs has been provided for this programme. There will be 40,000 beneficiaries for school uniforms and nearly 2 lakhs free sets of Text Books will be supplied in tribal areas.
- 6.1.2.4. To man the additional enrolement, 2500 additional teachers will be required during the year 1979-80, out of which 550 teachers will be appointed in tribal areas. A provision of Rs. 294.37 alkhs has been made for this programme.
- 6.1.2.5. Special stress will be laid on the opening new schools in the villages having more than 200 population. Almost all such villages around which do not have school within a walking distance will be covered under this programme by the end of 1982-83. It is proposed to cover 208 villages during 1979-80. A scheme would also be undertaken to upgrade the primary schools to go upto Standard VIIth so that structural imbalances can be reduced and facilities of higher studies can be made available to all parts of the State. This is particularly relevant to the strategy of development in the tribal areas.
- 6.1.2.6. The question of deciding on minimum hours of schooling that are actally necessary will also be considered so that fuller utilisation of services of existig primary teachers is achieved and the need for appointing additional teachers is also reduced to the minimum. Therefore, the question of reducing the school hours for the primary school children espacially for the Standards I to III will be ensidered. The spare time that will become available to the teachers will be used for the educational activities including adult literacy programme.
- 6.1.2.7. A provision has also been made in the Plan of 1979-80 for physical improvement of schools in the field of priary Education. The most Primary need is a provision of class rooms. According to the tenative survey carried out recently, out of 22.870,

- schools 4,593 were without school buildings. In addition, there were a number of schools which require additional rooms becauses of the increased enrolment. As per the present polocy Government provides for 40% of the cost in respect of the class-rooms in non-triabal areas and 70% of the cost in the tribal The balance will be provided through local The strategy of the State Government is to funds. fulfil not only the requirement of the schools which are now in the rented premises but also the requirement of additional class rooms in as many cases as possible, especially when public contribution is forth coming to meet the cost of the buildings. It is targetted to construct 715 class. rooms in tribal areas and 150 Class rooms in Non tribal area. An amount of Rs. 56 lakhs has been provided in the Programme for the year 1979-80. Under C.S.P. for tribal area 75 class rooms at Rs. 10000 lakhs ammounting to Rs. 7.50 lakhs will be provided.
- 6.1.2.8. Animportant aspect of the strategy is to see that in the tribal areas, the teachers' quarters are built alongwith the sanction of the teachers. An amount of Rs. 7 lakhs has been provided for the construction of 100 teachers quarters.
- 6.1.2.9. The single teachers shools remain closed when the teacher is absent. This weekers the Elementary Education System. It is therefore, desirable that there should be no single teacher shool For the conversion of such schools having IV standers and above 150 teachers including 50 teachers intribal areas has been proposed. A sum of Rs. 6.00 lakhs has been proposed for the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.2.10. Specific emphasis has been laid down on qualititative improvement of primary education during the Plan 1978-83. Schools will be encouraged to come forward with innovative programmes.
- 6.1.2.11. Under the schme of improvement of Science Education, kits have been provided to all primary schools with standards I--IV. During the year 1979-80, it is proposed to supply kits to the schools having Std. V for which an amount of Rs. 4.00 lakhs has been proposed.
- 6.1.2.12. Due to the increased enrolment of pupils and opening of additional primary schools it is necessary to strengthen the inspectorial staff. 200 kelvani nirikshaks will berequired for which amount of Rs. 11.88 lakhs fhas been proposed for the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.2.13. Despite all the efforts that have been made so far/ and will continue to be made, it shall be difficult to bring the children in the age group 6.14 to scho ls in the formal schooling system. The strategy of the State Government is to impart education to the 16% of the additional children enrolled through non-formal education system.

It is targeted that 25,000 children will be given non-formal education during the year 1979-80. Out of these 10,000 will be tribal children.

- 6.1.2.14. Teacher's Education Board looks after the work of inservice programme curriculm projects and experimentation, crganisation and conduct of programmes of workshops, seminarr, etc., for teacers at all levels. The board needs resh stafing pattern for mutifarious activities for which a provision of Rs. 50,000 towards salaries contingency and non-recurring expenditure peen provided for the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.2.15. Recommendations of Shri Ishwarbhai Committee for the introduction of the programme of Socially Useful Productive work being accepted in standards I-X from the year the year 1979-80 it has becomes necessary to provide a sum of Rs. 10.00 lakhs for the scheme for the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.2.16. In view of the revision of syllabus teachers are required to go under training to get themselves acquivented with to current educational treads. In service fTraining is therefore necessary. A sum of Rs. 15.00 lakhs for the year 1979-80. has been proposed for the scheme and 15000 teachers will be covered under this programme.
- 6.1.2.17. Government Primary Training Institutions in the state need to be strengthended by providing them with furnitures, laboratory equipments, sanitary equipment etc. For a 8 Training Institutions, at the rate of Rs. 0.50 lakhs provision Rs. 4.00 lakhs is proposed for the year 1979-80.

6. 1. 3. Adult Education (MNP)

- 6.1.3. 1. The Adult Education programme has been advered under the Minimum Needs Programme in Five Year Plan 1978-83. As per the norms for Minimum Needs Programme the Government of India have fixed the target of 100% coverage of adults in the age group 15-35. by 1988 and 66% by 1983. Guearat however intends to cover 100% by 1983. According to 1971 census nearly 41.75% lakhs of Adults in the age roup of 15 to 35 are illiteates' Taking into consideration the normal increare the Projected estimates of ill terates is 50 lakhs which is proposed to be covered by 1982-83. During the year 1979-80 it is proposed to cover 2,47,700 illiterates under 6 Audit Education Programme viz 4 programme under State Government 1 under Central Plan and 1 Under Centrally Sponsored programme.
- 6.1.3.2. Teachers' educations Board looks after the wark of in service programe, curr'culam projects and experimentation, Organisation and conduct of programmes of workshops seminars,

- etc. for teachers at all levels. The Board needs a fresh staffing pattern for multifarious activities for which a provision of Rs. 50,000 towards salaries. contingency and non-recurring expenditure has been provided for the year 1979-80
- 6.1.3.3. Recommendations of Shri Ishwarbhai Committee for the introduction of the programme of Socially Useful Productive work being accepted in Standards I-X from the year 1979-80, it has become necessary to provide a sum of Rs. 10.00 lakhs for the scheme for the year 1979-80.
- 6.1.3.4. In view of the revision of syllabus teachers are required to go under training to get themselves acquented with current educational trends. In service Training is therefore necessary. A Sum of Rs. 15.00 lakhs for the year 1979-80, has been proposed for the scheme and 15000 teacher will be covered under this programme.
- 6.1.3.5. Government Primary Training Institutions in the State need to be strengthened by providing them with furnitures, laboratory eaquipments sanitary equipment etc. For 8 Training Institutions at the rate of Rs. 0.50 lakhs provisions of Rs. 4.00 lakhs is proposed for the year 1979-80.

6.1.4. Secondary and Higher Secondary Education:

6.1.4.1. Secondary education constitute a Second tier alongwith the Higher Education in the educational set up of the State. Secondary Education has been made free both for boys and girls since 1969' Since then there has been a rapid expansion in this fileld. At the end of 1977-78 there were 2978 Secondary Schools in the State.

3.1.5 Improvement of Science Education:

- 6.1.5.1. General Science is taught in all secondary schools in Gujarat After the upgrading of the carriculum of Science in Std., VIII--X and introduction of higher secondary stage, study of physics, Chemistry and biology as separate disciplines is essential. This has necessitated the division of the school laoboratory into three separate laboratories for each discipline. Each school was given a special grant under this scheme and till now 356 schools were covered under this schemes. During the year 1979-80, it is proposed to pay science equipment grants to 20 secondary schools in tribal area and 30 in the non-tribal area.
- 6.1.5.2. The Higher Secondary pattern of education (10 + 2) came into existance from June 1976' During the last two years 782 Higher Secondary schools including 36 in tribal areas were started. A substantial amount is proposed to provide grantin- aid newly started higher secondary schools, orien-ation training of teachers equipment grants for science stream and Arts and ommerce stream etc.,

6. 1. 5. 3. Among the main schemes in the field of Secondary Education for the year 1979-80 it is proposed to provide grant-n-aid to the newly opened non-Government Secondary Schools, opening of Government and non Government Secondery Schools and for expansion of existing schools. It is proposed to continue the programme of Socially useful productive work and community setvice in 180 Secondary Schools of which 60 will be in tribal area. It is also to provide text books bank for the students to economically backward and weaker sections. A provision is also proposed to provide in service training to 1000 Secondary teachers including 250 in tribal areas.

6. 1. 6. Vocationalisation :-

6. 1. 6. 1. I. T. I. type certificate courses will be introduced in 15 technical institutions in 1979-80. About 18 vocational courses in Commerce, Arts and girls education are identified at present and survey is being carried out to identify more number of vocational courses. It is propos to provide assistance to introduce vocational career courses in about 30 institutions during the next year. It is also proposed to start vocational career courses in the fields of Agriculture, Home Science, Forestry, Cottage Industry, Fisheries etc. in about 18 institutions.

6. 1. 7. Higher Education :-

6. 1. 7. 1. It is proposed to continue to provide matching grants to the Universities and Colleges against the matching assistance of the University Grants Commission towards the development schemes. It is also proposed to provide grant-in-aid to Universities for Higher Administrative and Mangement Development Courses in order to train the students for I. A. S. and preparing for entrance examination to the I. I. M. and other institutions of Higher Management. It is evisaged to set up the Council of Jtudies for Social and Scientific advancement and for which a provision of Rs. 10.00 lakhs is proposed for 1979-80. It is also envisaged to provide special booking classes to help the students of weaker sections of the community.

6. 1. 8. Arts and Culture :-

Library :

6. 1. 8. 1. Provision is proposed for construction of Mehsana District Government Library and for extension of Central library Vadodara Provision is also proposed for providing furniture and reading materials in Government Libraries. It is envisaged to provide special grant of Rs. 1000/- to each of the 500 new village libraries.

Sporjs and Zam?s ;-

6. 1. 8. 2. It is proposed to construct a hostel building with the capacity of about 375 inmates at the Sports complex in Gandhinagar. It is proposed to open new sub-coaching centres and to provide equipment grants. It is proposed supplement the assistance provided by Central Government to Physical Education Colleges to help them develop the facilities for the Gymansics, Swiming Pools, etc. It is also envisaged to open Mountaineering Training Centre on the Mount Girnar in Junagadh district.

Youth Welfare :-

6. 1. 8. 3. Provision of Rs. 7.37 lakhs is proposed for the Youth Welfere activities for the year 1979-80.

Cuttural Scheme :-

6. 1. 8. 4. Provision of Rs. 9 41 lakhs is proposed for the year 1979-80 for cultural schemes viz. (1) Sangeet Nritya Natya Akadami Rs. 7.41 lakhs and (2) Lalit kala Akadami Rs, 2.00 lakhs. The main activities under the sangeet Nritya Natya Akadami also. (i) It is proposed to provide matching grants to the local bodies for construction of enclosed auditorium and (ii) it is envisaged to establish a Film Training Instityute with an intake capacity 40 Students.

6. 1. 9. Development of Archaeology:-

6. 1. 9. 1. Programme is proposed to be continued in the year 1979-80 for which a provision of Rs. 4.00 lakhs is proposed.

6. 1. 10. Development of Archives :-

6. 1. 10. 1. A provision of Rs. 7.00 lakhs is proposed for the Development of Archives for the year 1979-80. The main activity under this programme is the construction of Archives building at Gandhinagar.

6. 1. 11. Development of museum:

6. 1. 11. 1. A provision of Rs. 6 00 lakhs is proposed for the Development of Museum for the year 1979-80.

6. 1. 12. Development of Languages:

6. 1. 12. 1. In the Annual Plan 1979 -80, a provision of Rs. 8.00 lakhs is proposed for the Development of languages. There are two schemes viz. (i) Development of Gujarati Language and its literature for which a provision of Rs. 3 00 lakhs is proposed and (ii) Development of Urdu-Sindhi and other modern India Languages for which a provision of Rs. 5.00 lakhs is proposed.

6.2 TECHNICAL EDUCATION

6.2.1 Introductory:

6.2.1.1. There are at present 7 institutions conducting degree courses having total intake capacity of 1840 sets. There are 19 polytechnics with the total intake capacity of 3255 seats.

6.2.2 Review of Progress:

- 6.2.1.1. During the Fourth Plan and the Fifth Plan there was no addition to the number of institutions. During the Fifth Plan period 50 degree seats have been added and 2 new girls wings were added in the polytechnics at Rajkot and Adipur.
- 6.2.2.2. A degree course in Chemical Engineering has been started from June, 1974. A egree course in Textile Technilogy with an intake capacity of 20 has been started from June, 1977 at L. D. College of Engineering, Ahmedabad. A part-time degree course in Electronics and communications Engineering has also been started with an intake capacity of 15 from June, 1976 by way of adjustment in the existing seats. The following new diversidied diploma courses have been also started by way of adjustment of seats:
 - (i) Automobile Engineering with an intake capacity of 30 at Ahmedabad from June, 1974.
 - (ii) Plastic Engineering with an intake capacity of 30 at Ahmedabad from June, 1975.

Two separate wings for girls have been established at the following centres during the 1974-75.

- (1) A. V. Parekh Technical Institute, Rajkot.
 - (i) Radio Technology(ii) Secretarial Practice(iii) Garment Making15
- (2) T. F. Gandhidham Polytechnic, Adipur.
 - (i) Garment Making 15 (ii) Home Science 15

One more girls wing has been established during the year 1978--79, at the centre mentioned below:—

- 6.2.2.5. Linkag between the institutons impartting technical education and industries is at prasent established in the following forms.
 - (i) An Industry Liaison Board has been established in the State.
 - (ii) Production-cum-training centres have been established at three institutions, Ahmdabdabad and one at Rajkot.
 - (ii) Consultancey practice is allowed at the level of institutions.
 - (iv) Industrialists have been appointed as the Chairman of the Advisory Committees of the technical institutions.
 - (v) Technical personnel from industries are associated with the drawing up curricula of the diploma and degree courses.
 - (vi) Products of industries are being exhibited at the time of "Do-It-Yourself" exhibition.
 - (vii) Teachars are deputed to industries for practical training and personnel from industries are called to give lectures in institutions.
 - (viii) Testing facilities are made available to the industry directly as well as under the auspices of I.S.I.
 - (ix) Project and field work by students in the indisries is regular critical requirements.

6.2.3. Objectives a d Strategy;

- 6.2.3.1. The objectives of the programme of Technical Education au (i) to consolidate the progress achieved so far, (iij diversification of course (iii) curriculm development and (iv) the development and estiblishment of linkages between technical institutions and industries.
- 6.2.3.2. The Plan 1978-83 envisages the following programmes:—
 - (1) To introduce additional 5 post-gradute dgree courses with 30 addmission and 4 post-graduate diploma courses with 40 admission capacity in the engineering collees.
 - (2) To introduce 60 additional seats at under graduate level thereby rasiing the present seats of 1840 to 1900 in Engineering Colleges.
 - (3) To establish two additional polytechnics and to introduce 485 additional seats at diploma education level in the State, there by rasing the present seats from 3255 to 3740.

- (4) To develop the polytechnics as community polytechnics.
- (5) To introduce 1266 additional seats at cert-ficate level-under the vocationalisation programme.
- (6) To impleent other programmes such as, faculty development, improvement of libraries-modernisation of equipments, mod 'ising the administrative set up of the Directorate, revison of staff structure, student amenities, staff quarters and continuing education.

6.2.3.3. An outlay of Rs. 100 lakhs in proposed for the year 1979-80. The froad break-up is as under:—

- 6.2.4.1. A special manpower survey for the textile and chemical industries has been under taken in the State and the report has been publicshed. Similarly report for Rubber industries is also published. The work for Plastic industries is in progress.
- 6.2.4.2. It is proposed to provide for additinal staff and equipment for chemical Engineering and Textile Techology Courses. It is also proposed to provide funds for the construction work for degree course in Chemical Engineering and Textile Techology (Rs. 12.00 lakhs). It is also proposed to provide equipment for the twi government engineering colleges, ffunds for book service centres and staenghthening of libraries.
- 6.2.4.3. It is proposed to provide funds for the construction of Hydraulic Laboratory at the L. D. College, Morbi.
- 6.2.4.4. It is proposed to start a post-diploma course in BIO-Medical Instrumentation with an intake capacity of 10 students at Government Polytechnic, Ahmedabad from June, 1979.

6.2.4.5. The Girls wing is also porposed to be started at K. D. Palytechnic, Patan. The funds are proposed to be provided for moderailation of equipments, Rural Engineering course at Government Polytechnic, Porbandar and Vallabh-Vidyanagar, strengthoing of Libraries and provision for acquisition of land for National Desain Institute, Ahmedavad. Provision is made for aditional building for the separate firls wing at Bhavnagar. Provision is also made for the paymot of development grants for five non-Government Engineering collees and three non-Governments Polytechnics (including D. D. Institute of Tech. Nadiad) for their developmental activities.

6.2.5. Scholarships:

6.2.5.1. It is proposed to revise the value of scholarships for degree course from Rs. 40/- to Rs. 75/-per month, and for diplomas courses Rs. 35/- to Rs. 60/- p.m.

6.2.6. Tachers Training:

6.2.6.1. Under the programmes of the teachers training 4 teachers wil be deputed for post-graduate courses and doctoral research, 20 per training at the diploma level and for conducting 10 short-term training programmes. Teachers will also be deputed for industrial training and sequential summer schools under the Government of India's programmes.

6.2.7. Amenities for Students:

- 6.2.7.1. An outlay of Rs. 11.90 lakhs is 'poposed for providing canteen facilties, water colers play grounds at the various polytechnics in the State.
- 6.2.7.2. The existing Hostel accommodation for the students at the Engineering colleges Morbi and the R. C. Teachnical Institute at A'bad is very inadequate. A provision is of Rs. 8.00 lakhs is proposed for providing necessary hostel facilities at these places.

6.2.8. Staff Quarters:

6.2.8.1. At Morbi, it is difficult to get suitable accommodation for the Gazette teaching staff. It is therefroe proposed to make a provision of Rs. 2.50 lakhs for sataff quarters at Morbi during 1979-80.

6.2.9 Development of Technical High Schools:

6.2.9.1 A programme of strengthening the exising facilities in the technical high schools and inroduction of new vocational courss in technical institutes, is undertaken. Accordingly the scheme of development of technical high schools will continue during the year 1979-80. It is proposed to make provision for staff, equipments, etc. for the existing courses in technical high schools.

6.2.9.2 Under the vocationalisation programme, 160 seats plus 510 seats (670) have been introduced as sated in a preceeding paragraph. Necesary provsion as been proposed for these courses. It is propose to provide additional vocational certificate courses from July, 1979 as under:—

6.2.9.3 With the inroduction of these courses the alternate training facilities for the students will be incresed. It is proposed make provision of Rs. 10700 lakhs for impementating the above programme under the scheme of vocationalisation.

6.2.10 Tribal Area-Sub-Plan

6.2.10.1 A scheme for the development of the weir Industrial Institute, Dharampur is provided in the tribal area Sub-Plan. Certificate courses for general mechanics and electricians with intake capacity of 20 each have been introduced from June 1976 and additional courses in Turner is introduced from Jun, 1977. The construction of additional building will be completed. A hotel building at an estimated cost of Rs. 12.00 lakhs is proposed to be provided.

6.2.10.2 It is also proposed to provide training facilities for motr winding certificate course in tribal areas at Dohad and Godhra at an estmated cost of Rs. 0.84 lakhs. An amount of Rs. 5.00 lakhs is proposed to be provided for the scheme for the year 1979-80, for staff, eqouipment and additional hostel at Dharampur.
