

6. <u>Pedagogical Improvement</u>

a) <u>Teacher Training:</u>

i) SRG (State Resource Group), DRG (District Resource Group) and MI (Mandal Resource Group have been constituted. These would help conduct of training programmes and supporting MRPs (Mandaul Reson Persons).

During 1998-99, 34,000 teachers in 5 phase-I districts and 78,000 teachers in Phase II districts were given training. The training of teachers during 1999-2000 would include pedagogical aspects and use of class III, IV Telgu textbooks, class III English workbook and class I mathematics workbook. The training of teachers is likely to commence during November, 1999 and would be completed by December, 1999.

During the year 1999-2000 more Vidya Volunteers (VV) are being appointed in phas districts and in expansion districts for increased enrolment. In addition, the state has decided set up community schools on the "Mabadi" pattern in all habitations with a population of 100 where atleast 15 children are available. The VV are appointed by the school educat committees. This will increase the number of vidya volunteers significantly. The state has a yet provided a clear picture of the total requirement of para teachers for the p-hase 1 a expansion districts under DPEP.

iv) Out of school children:

- Summer schools have been started as non residential programmes of 40-60 day duration for children in the age group 6-8 years to ensure enrolment of unenrol and dropout children. Summer schools are started based on demands from school education committees. During 1999, 16,557 summer schools we functional with enrolment of 4,22,166. About 30% of the children i.e. 1,40.8 children were enrolled in formal schools later.
- b) Back to school programme of Social Welfare department covers elder children the 9-14 years age group.
- e) AP DPEP has taken up 3 mandals of Nalgonda district for making a plan universalisation of primary education. A part of Warangal city (Warangal east also planned for universal coverage with special focus on Deprived Urb Children.

7) Community Participation:

i) School Education Committees:

8848 primary and upper primary Schools Committees have been formed in phas districts. In the expansion districts, 26,421 primary and upper primary Schools Committees have been held in many districts.

ii) <u>Training:</u>

Training for school committee chairpersons was organised at mandal level dur. August, 1999 including aspects like role of school committee, DPEP girls' educationabadi concept, school library etc.

δ) Girl Child Education:

 A state level orientation programme on Awareness campaigns was organised du May, 1999 at Hyderabad for DGCDO & MGCDOs of DPEP phase 1 & 11 distriattended the programme.

- A two day state level orientation for SRG of ECE sector was conducted in May, 1999 on school readiness. Later MGCDOs and ECE instructors were trained in a 6 day programme in all the districts.
- A state level workshop was organised for developing district specific strategies for enrolling unenrolled and out of school girl children. District specific plans for two districts, Vizianagaram and Nellore were developed.
- A state level workshop was organised in August, 1999 to develop/refine module on girl child education.
- Balika melas were organised in 15 villages in Nellore and Prakasam district during April, 1999.
- Convergence with ICDS is in progress.

9. Media

- 'Meena' video cassette being used for awareness generation for education of girls child.
- Greeting cards, posters and brochures printed.
- Orientation material printed and distributed to school committee members
- Teachers' unions representatives taken for visit to camps for education child labourers in Rangareddy district.

10. Distance Education:

- Teleconference for Mandal Resource Persons (MRPs) was held during March, 1999 at 17 district centres. 680 MRPs and 85 DIET lecturers participated in the teleconference.
- Workshop on use of video programmes for training of teachers was held in May.
- A three day teleconference programme on action research was conducted for DIET lecturers during May, 1999 at 32 district centres. 220 persons participated.
- A 10 day training-cum-development workshop for video script writers was held at State Institute of Education Technology, Hyderabad during June, 1999.
- A 5-day training-cum-development workshop for audio scriptwriters was held at Office of the State Project Officer, DPEP, Hyerabad during July, 1999.
- Plan to provide training to teacher through cable TV network on use of OBB kits to teachers working in Primary Schools in Karimnagar town is in the pipeline.

11. *MIS*

- The AP DPEP state project office has a well established MIS cell with 14 computers. 5 programmes and one data processing officer are working in the MIS cell.
- DISE data for 5 phase I districts completed for 1996-97, 1997-98 and 1998-99.
- DISE data fr 14 of the 19 expansion districts has been provided for 1997-98.

• Training programme for DIET lecturers and MRPs are planned.

II. Children with Disabilities:

Activities conducted under the Integrated Education Component Of DPEP Assam.

To fulfil the statutory obligation to comply the provisions of the Central Govt. Act, "Persons with Disability (Equal Opportunities, protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, and as per directions received from MHRD, GOL DPEP Assam introduced the component of Integrated Education for Disabled Children from 1998-99 and following activities were done:

- One State programme Co-ordinator having requisite qualifications and experience of working for disabled Child in the state of Assam has been appointed in December'98 to look after the Component of Integrated Education. Similarly, District Level Consultants on IED was also placed in Sonitpur, Goalpara and Darrang districts and was oriented including an exposure trip to Andhra Pradesh.
- A State Resource Group comprising faculties of SCERT (dealing with disability), Deaf & Dumb School, NGOs (Sishu Sarathi, Sahayika, Mon Bikash Kendra), faculties of Gauhati Medical College has been formed and now fully operationalised.
- District Level Resource Group (12-15 members) has also been formed in three districts (Darrang, Goalpara and Sonitpur) and fully operationalised. In the district, district level Resource group persons having requisite qualifications as prescribed by Rehabilitation Council of India (wherever found) and NGOs are members besides some young, educated and willing to work for disabled child. The group has been given seven days orientation on the line of thinking of DPEP Assam. Physicians dealing orthopaedics, ophthalmology, ENT, Mental Retardation etc has been associating the Resource group whenever needed.
- A comprehensive module has been prepared for the orientation of VEC, HM BRCC, CRCC and other community members.

- Five Clusters from one Block has been identified in all the above three districts for initial implementation of the IED component. Survey for identification of disabled children done in all nine DPEP districts through House to House Survey, held in 1998.
- Medical Camps has been organised in the selected five clusters of the identified Block in the districts of Sonitpur, Darrang, and Goalpara) for detail examination of extent of disability of the identified child.
- The number and type of Aids & Appliances to be distributed among disabled children is being worked out and Ministry of Social Empowerment & Justice, GOI is being requested (through the Social Welfare Department of GOA) for supply the same.
- In the General Community Mobilisation Programmes under the component of Community Mobilisation & VEC, VEC members have been oriented on various disabilities and need of special attention towards disabled children.
- The issue of inclusion of at-least one parent of a child with disability in the Village Education Committee has been taken up with GOA and instructions to that effect has already been issued.
- All the selected Block Resource Centre Co-ordinators, Cluster Resource Co-ordinators numbering 50 BRCCs and CRCCs and 151 Head Teachers under the selected Clusters have also been oriented on IED. Special Teachers and Resource Persons has been sensitised.
- Five numbers of school readiness of centres has been planned in each of selected blocks. Already interventions have been initiated in 57 schools of Darrang District, 50 schools of Goalpara District and in 57 schools of Sonitpur District.
- In the Module for Mass Teachers Training scheduled to be held during the current year inputs on Integrated Education have been included for general awareness of teachers on IED.
- Daylong inputs on IED have also been included in the Module for 21days training of Alternative Schools Workers already completed in May-June/99 and are instructed to include all disabled children in the centres.
- A Brochure & Information Booklet on IED has been developed, printed and distributed among BRCCs, CRCCs, and Head Teachers.
- Bi-Monthly meeting of State Resource Group Members is held regularly to discuss various pros & cons of IED.
- Under the current AWP&B it has been planned to increase the Target Areas to 2 blocks and 10 clusters in each district, opening of Readiness Centers in the targeted areas, disbursement of Aids & Appliances to Identified Children in addition to the training of 150 School Teachers for facilitating.
- Advocacy, liaison, and convergence with other components of DPEP and other concerned departments and organizations have been initiated.

SIEMAT is to be set up at Guwahati. Construction not yet started.

SEIMAT has been envisaged to be developed as an independent institution in Assam to look after the Educational Management and Training in the elementary sector. The present status of the institution is as follows:

- Decision taken to shift SEIMAT from Jorhat to Guwahati.
- Site for construction finalized at SCERT Campus, Guwahati.
- Modalities and status being finalized with Government of Assam.
- Process of Appointment of Staff initiated.
- SPO Staff providing support to planning and management activities; trained in micro planning and school mapping, data analysis and interpretation, project and annual plan preparation.
- Training's of HMs, BEEOs / SIs on Supervision and inspection and on school mapping and micro-planning for project staff.

A. Planning and Management (P&M)

A fully staffed Planning and Management unit is in place at the State Project Office.

B. Micro Planning

- Microplanning, initiated in a total of 90 villages of three districts on a pilot basis, has been completed.
- Microplanning for all the 3,000 villages has been planned, the module is ready.
- Workshop organised to build capacities of district officers and BRC Co-ordinators for preparation of AWP&B. The AWP&B for the current year reflect participation a the district and block level.
- The SPOs core team formulated a comprehensive training module for the BRCCs. CRCCs and other grass-root functionaries. Training will be done in a cascade mode.

whereby the state core team will orient the district team, which in turn will train the CRCCs at the cluster level.

C. Community Mobilisation

- Orientation cum training programme for VEC, MTA, PTA members was organised in May-June, 1999 at village and school level in Banaskantha, Panchamahals and Dangdistricts. More than 70,000 VEC, MTA and PTA members were trained. During this programme they were oriented on how they could organised enrollment drive and work towards 100% enrollment.
- They were oriented on other thrust areas of the project, e..g. education of the girl child. SC/ST children, disabled children, etc. The concept of alternative schooling was explained to them. They were also trained on preparing village mapping and school improvement plan. The training support was provided by the local CRC co-ordinators.
- A 'Katputli Karya Sibir' was organised at Dangs on September 1, 1999 for community mobilisation, 60 BRCCs participated.

- ➤ The textbooks for Std. I are undergoing second trial in all schools of the three DPEP districts. State wide introduction of class I books is planned in 2000-2001.
- The New textbooks for Std. III are under preparation and put into trial in specific schools of the project districts during the year 2000.
- Over 3562 newly appointed teachers were trained for seven days at BRC level. The Resource Persons (RPs) and Master Trainers were trained by DIET. The training module was also prepared by DIET. The module has been provided to the newly appointed teachers to understand their role and act effectively.
- More than 4000 teacher of Std. I have been trained in the three DPEP districts. After try out in the selected blocks, the revised text-books developed under DPEP for Std. I were introduced in all the schools of the DPEP districts. The teachers are trained at the BRC level.
- A three-day training programme was conducted from May 22-25, 1999 at Saputara, Disti. Dangs, for the Resource Persons to orient them about the new textbooks. During the workshop at Saputara, the writers of the new textbooks trained the RPs.
- A five day Training Workshop was organised for teachers of the project districts June 7-11, 1999 at Ambaji, district Banaskantha, on how to impart education using he new textbooks for Std. II. The aspects of TLM and methods to be used for teaching were discussed in detail, with the focus on Activity Based Joyful Learning. The writers (Key Resource Persons) of two new textbooks conducted the training.
- The new textbooks for Std. II are being tried out in the same schools of the selected block where the new textbooks for Std. I was tried out last year. In total 451 teachers of Std. II of these schools have been trained on new textbook of Std. II.
- A two day workshop for Multigrade Teaching was organised at the BRC Centre. Vav. Dist. Banaskantha on June 7-8, 1999 during which the teachers were oriented on the use of TLM and the methods for multigrade situation. They were also taught how they could make their daily, monthly and tri-monthly planning of their academic work.

E. Alternative Schooling

- AS Centres for girls have started.
- In Banaskantha 18 and in Panchamahal 11 AS centres have started with capacity of 360 boys and 207 girls respectively.
- Three training centres for AS instructors became operational at VAV and Warahi in Banaskantha district and Pawagadh, in Panchmahal district. Around 300 AS instructors were trained by the end of September, 1999.
- ✓ There are in total 389 AS centres in three districts. 1100 more AS are proposed.
- In Dangs, during the Bridge course for Alternative Schooling, 1600 migrating children were taught in 90 day programme from March-June, 1999. The scheme was run in 90 centres.
- Under the 'Back to School Programme', 500 centres in Banaskantha, 500 centres in Panchmahals and 100 centres in Dangs are targeted to start in the year 1999-2000.
- Teleconference on Alternative Schooling is one of the focus areas for the year 1999-2000. Prime importance is given to implementation various Alternative Schooling schemes in the project districts. Keeping this fact in mind a teleconference was organised on May 13, 1999 on AS.

F. Media and Documentation

- The monthly issues of Prathamik Shikshan Sarvani, the magazine for DPI-P functionaries and primary teachers of the project districts, regularly published from State Project Office.
- The document on community mobilization in Dist. Banaskantha was published a Gujarati, which was released by the Hon'able members of IXth JRM. The English version of the document was also prepared at the State Project Office. The Gujarati version of the documents is supplied to all the primary schools of Banaskantha, Panchmahals and Dangs.
- The State Project Office in technical collaboration with GIET. Ahmedabad, prepared a video-film on Rajput-Mahila Sammelan and Rabari Mahila Sammelan organised at Banaskantha. This video film was aired during the teleconference on community mobilization on June 4, 1999.
- Major processes and events under all the interventions in DPEP were documented. Photos and Video documentation were done.

G. Gender

- The Mater Trainers were oriented on the issues to be tackled in gender education, during a comprehensive workshop at the Din Dayal Institute, Gandhinagar from 28.4.99 to 3.5.99. During this workshop the district level officers, BRC co-ordinators and Additional BRC co-ordinators were given training on the focus areas for gendereducation.
- ✓ Mahila Sangam, which is a new scheme for gender education under DPEP that has been launched in Dist. Dangs on pilot basis, has been yielding encouraging change in the mind-set of local tribals. Under this scheme, former students of Ritumbhara Vidyalalya is Ahwa, have been brought together for the community work for our project. As per the recommendations of VIIth JRM, these girl volunteers are being given honorarium also.
- Mahila Sangam has identified 11 Alternative Schools for girls of which 4 are for never enrolled girls of 9 to 14 years of age. The dropout girls have been identified and taken in ALSs. Teachers are taking training.
- A meeting with Dr. Prerna Mohite of ECD-LRC Centre, M.S. University, was held in Baroda on June 8, 1999, for the discussion on the study assigned to her for recommendation for establishment and modernization of PPTC training institute.
- Machhi Mahila Sammelan, Thakor Mahila Jagruti Sammellan were organised in Panchmahal and Banaskantha districts to mobilize the community women for girls education. In the month of June, 1999, preparatory work was done to organise other community programmes in July, 1999. A Bhil Mahila Sammelan is planned in Banaskantha district. A Madari Mahila Sammelan is planned to be organised at Amargari in block Radhanpur, also in Banaskantha district. Madari is the community, which makes a living by entertaining people in road-shows involving trained animals, e.g. monkeys, bears, snakes and pythons. This community has traditionally discouraged girls education.
- A total of 42 CRC-coordinators will be covering the focus areas. Each CRCC will select 5 villages, so that 90 villages in Banaskantha, 90 villages in Panchmahals and 30 village in Dangs will be covered as the focus area, making it a total of 210 villages. Intensity work will be carried out in these focus villages. The home survey and data will be collected before the enrollment drive in all the villages. The integrated approach will be adopted in the villages of the focus area, throughout the year.

- ➤ The process of convergence with ICDS is under way. The training for Master Trainers has been conducted followed by training of Anganwadi workers in May, 1999 at the taluka level by MTs. Handbook and awareness material were provided. All the Anganwadi workers were given training and kits. It has been observed that the girl child is engaged in one or the other household activities along with sibling care responsibilities. These girls either come to school with their siblings or stay back at home for their care.
- ► ECE AS centres, where girls' younger siblings can play at ECE centre and the ±9 years girls can study in AS centre. A pilot project of 15 ECE AS centres in BK, PM and Dangs is undertaken where ICDS Anganwadis are not existing. The budgetary allocation is already done. The work is underway. These ECE AS will encourage girls education and bring the out of school girls back to school. The ECE on the other hand, will provide preprimary education to children.
- A three day State level workshop on 'Gender Awareness' was held from 10th August to 12th August, 1999 at Din Dayal Institute, Gandhinagar. The objective of the workshop is to orient the BRCCs and CRCCs of the 'Focus Areas' on issues pertaining to gender awareness, methods of gender sensitization and girls enrollment and retention.

H. SC/ST/Minorities

- A handbook on tribal education has been prepared and supplied to all the schools in tribal areas of project districts.
- A teleconference on tribal education was organised on August 20, 1999 at ISRO. Ahmedabad, with the help and support of Remote Sensing and Communication Unit (RESEAC), Gandhinagar. Around 600 CRC Co-ordinators, teachers. District Co-ordinators of Tribal-Gender from the project districts participated in the teleconference. They phoned and faxed questions on issues i.e. methods of teaching of tribal children. local dialect pronunciation, preparation of TEM by using local materials, etc. SPD and OIC-Tribal from the SPO who sat in the panel answered the questions.

A video script writing workshop is scheduled to be held in the last week of October.

Plan Implementation Review of Functional Areas:

a. <u>Pedagogy</u>

Teacher Training

- Identified Training needs of teachers through IVth Internal Academic Support Mission.
- Conducted State Level Workshop for improving the grading indices for Annual Evaluation.
- Conducted 5 day Teacher Training for all 28,000 Teachers for Kinginikkoottam/Patanotsavam 1999 during April-May, 1999.
- Conducted 1st one day CRC meeting for all Teachers in June, 1999.

Text Books

- SCERT has undertaken renewal work of Text Book for Std. I, II and V.
- SCERT has launched the new Std. V Textbooks and Hand Books in all 14 districts of the state during 1999-2000.
- SCERT has undertaken the development of Text Book and Hand Books for Std. VI Learning Materials and Hand Book is being developed as per the new Second Language approaches for English.
- Karuka Kinginikkoottam Special issue given to all teachers as a supplementary Teaching Learning Material.
- A list of books to be used in class room which can be purchased using Library Grant was provided to all the Teachers and Headmasters (Vayichu Vilayuka).

b. Alternative Schooling

49 Multi-grade Learning Centres are fully functional in Wayanad. Malappuram, Kasargod, Palakkad and Trivandrum. New buildings for MGLCs in 26 sites have been completed. MGLCs proposed in Expansion Districts have started during this academic year.

The Self Learning Materials for Std. III has been developed and circulated among the districts for trialling.

c. Community Mobilisation

- District and Block Advisory Committees are fully functional.
- VECs have been activated.
- Regular PTA/MPTA meetings are conducted to orient empower them on new pedagogy.
- Developed module for Social Workers for implementing IEDC Programme.
- Panchayat-Block-District level Monitoring Committees formed with the representation from Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRI).
- A pamphlet on new pedagogy was developed and given to all parents.
- School Support Group (SSG) have begun to function in many schools. These have been made functional especially durign Kinginikkoottana 1999.

d. Micro-Planning

Micro planning activities in Kerala have been undertaken as part of perspective plan preparation and during implementation of DPEP.

House to house surveys were conducted to plan various activities in the district with reference to enrolment and retention.

Micro-planning and school mapping exercise activities have been initiated in Palakkad and Idukki districts to identify the new school locations. In Palakkad, 90 Grama Panchayats and 30 Block Panchayats were covered. In Idukki, 51 Grama Panchayats and Block Panchayats were covered.

In Edappal Block of Malappuram district Micro-planning was done before initiating IED as pilot project.

e. Media

- A booklet on new pedagogy targeting parents, public and opinion makers was published. It was distributed among the parents of the DPEP districts. The booklet was also distributed among Mediamen, Opinion makers and common public.
- The matter for another booklet on new pedagogy was developed and given to Public Relations Department of the State. The same was printed, published and distributed throughout the State. PRD also brought out a special issue on Primary Education in 'Kerala Calling' which is the main monthly publication of the Public Relations Department.
- The first issue of the News letter was published in-corporating the achievements of DPEP and certain clarifications for the questions raised by people.

Talks and interviews were arranged in AIR and Visual Media to highlight the positive aspects of DPEP activities, especially the new pedagogy.

f. Gender

- District Resource Group for Gender has been made functional.
- At the District Level Programme Officers are looking after the gender activities which has been finalised and the districts have been given the direction to proceed with the Gender Interventions based on the approved AWPB 1999-2000.
- District Resource Groups are functioning in convergence with different agencies like Mahila Samakhya, Kudumbasree, Womens Welfare Office. Tribal Development Departments etc.

$g. \quad \underline{ECCE}$

- An approach paper has been finalised based on which the interventions are to be planned and executed.
- District Resource Group was constituted and equipped for providing training to Anganwadi Workers and Pre-Primary Teachers of the districts. The DRG consists of Programme Officer ICDS, one Child Development Programme Officer (CDPO), 3 ICDS Supervisors, One DIET faculty and one diploma holder in Clinical Child Development.
- A module for 5 days training to Anganwadi Workers has been developed.
- Convergence measures for effective implementation of the programme have been developed with Social Welfare Department.

h. Tribal Education

One Programme Officer at the district is in charge of District Tribal Education. Steps initiated to constitute a State Tribal Resource Group and District Core Groups.

Steps are being taken up for convergence with NGO.

i. IEDC

The State Level Advisory Committee for IEDC activities has been constituted and made functional with experts from both the State and National Levels.

- As suggested by the State Advisory Committee module planning workshop was conducted. Based on the issues raised in the planning workshop a draft Approach Paper for IEDC – Interventions as well as the preparation of modules has been finalised.
- During 1999-2000 IEDC interventions will be taken up in all the block of DPEP-I districts.

In DPEP-II districts, one block each in Thiruvananthapuram and Idukki districts and 3 blocks in Palakkad districts will be taking up IEDC intervention.

j. Distance Education Programme

DPEP. Kerala has decided to strengthen the DIETs by providing facilities for Distance Education mode which include networking, Dish Antennas etc.

k. <u>MIS</u>

- MIS Unit at state level and district levels are functional and adequately staffed with trained personnel.
- A System Analyst is appointed in State Project Office.
- EMIS data collection in DPEP-I and DPEP-II districts for the year 1998-99 is completed.

SCERT is an autonomous body functioning under the General Education Department. With the support of NIEPA, DPEP has plans to strengthen SCERT.

- SCERT has launched the new Std. V Text Book and Hand Book in all 4 districts of the state during 1999-2000.
- SCERT has undertaken the development of Text Book and Hand Books for Std. VI. Learning Materials and Hand Book is being developed as per the new Second Language approaches for English.

Functioning of SIEMAT including vacancy position

SIEMAT will be functional from January 2000 with skeletal staff. It will be set up as part of SCERT.

Position regarding DPEP experiences impacting the overall system

Main thrust of DPEP planning in Kerala has been on qualitative improvement in Primary Education. The Pedagogical renewal process under DPEP has an impact on the overall educational system in the State. In a few places, private schools are closing down due to perceived success of the new initiatives in Government schools. DPEP has also initiated steps to integrate the disabled children with the main stream. DPEP will develop designs for child friendly class rooms.

In so far as Phase-II DPEP districts are concerned data collection is completed. At the moment no analysis has been done.

9. Plan Implementation Review of All Functional Areas

DPEP-I

(a) **Pedagogy**

(i) **Teacher's Training**

In 98-99, 66430 teachers in 19 phase-1 districts and 57404 teaches in 15 phase-II districts have been given 12 days

- training. Additionally, 8182 gurujis of EGS schools have been trained in phase-I and 8303 in phase-II districts.
- → In 99-2000, 32060 teachers of phase-I districts and 20808 teachers of phase-II districts received 5 days training on class V TLM.
- → Under Quality Watch programme, 2626270 gurujis of EGS schools (14979 of phase-I and 11291 of phase-II) received 12 days training on TLM developed for Alternative Schools which is being implemented in EGS schools.
- → 450 Alternative Schools supervisors were also trained during this year.
- → 5000 teachers of Shishu Shiksha Kendras and Jhoolaghars were also trained. The District Resource Persons and the Gender Coordinators who imparted this training were also trained at Pre-primary Teachers Training Institute, Jabalpur.
- → Based on the analysis at Baseline Evaluation results which was done in Jan-Feb'99, every district through its academic group and teachers developed their own training module in order to find solutions to district specific problems being encountered in classroom transactions. The AS and EGS teachers were then trained based on such training modules.

(ii) <u>Textbook / Others Supplementary Materials</u>

- Textbook for class I IV under 'Seekhna Sikhana Package' had been introduced in all schools in June, 1998. Textbook for class V have also been introduced in 1999.
- → Supplementary teaching learning material for tribal students in district Jhabua in their local dialect has been readied & is being put to use.

(iii) Alternative Schooling

- → In all 5188 AS centres and 17774 EGS schools are functional both in phase I & II districts.
- → 7598 AS teachers and 332 supervisors in DPEP I districts and 1599 teachers and 76 supervisors in DPEP II have been recruited. All these teachers & supervisors have been trained for 21 days on the AS pedagogy.
- → State A.S. Co-ordinator is in position.
- → State Resource Groups and Districts Resource Groups have been formed
- The AS schools pedagogy is now being applied to all EGS schools so that they are in a better position to handle multigrade child based learning.

(b) <u>Community mobilisation (including training of VEC members</u> and other community leaders)

- All the 31905 VECs in 19 districts are operational. Formation and training of 23651 VECs in the 15 expansion districts has also been completed. All the VECs have been given orientation on school management last year.
- In those habitations where AS and EGS schools are running. School Management Committees have been formed with local panch as its chairman and guruji/teacher of AS member secretary, besides parents and community representing SC ST groups and women. In this connection, total number of 22962 SMCs have been formed.
- The Institutional Reforms of School Management recently approved by the State Govt. have also strengthened the VECs. On the one hand the constitution of VECs which previously was through nominations have been made elective while on the other hand the VECs have been brought further close to the schools by making them habitation based. Substantial powers have been delegated and quite a number of functions have been added so as to make schools more accountable to the VECs.
- → IEC materials like posters, hand-outs, brochures have been developed and are being used for VEC training and mobilisation.
- → Mahila Shiksha Abhiyan was taken up in 1997 and again in 1998 and is also giving on this year to encourage out of school & unenrolled girls to come to the school with the active involvement of local Panchayat representatives, teachers and guardians.

(c) Micro-planning

- State had initiated door to door survey of children in the age group of 5-14 years through the Lok Sampark Abhiyan (LSA) in 1996-97 and again in 1997-98. The exercise involved micro level information gathering and planning for the requirements in the villages. In the current year, LSA is covering the children 6-14 age group and door to door contact is going on in the EGS and AS village/habitation of 34 DPEP districts.
- → The Village Education Registers in 25000 habitations covering over 12 lakhs children have been updated.
- Three rounds of Shiksha Panchayats in 6500 clusters have been conducted with a view to bring the school related problems into community focus by using the available Panchayat structures for education related problems solving.

→ Based on the data generated through Lok Sampark Abhiyan, the Mission came out with the Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) for providing schools in accessless habitations.

(d) Media

- → Weekly publication of 'Panchayat Gazette' focussing on Mission activities being mailed directly to all villages/habitations of the State.
- → Continuos publication of Mission activities and achievements on monthly basis in the SCERT magazine called 'Shaikshik Palash'.
- Preparation of audio cassettes on classroom transaction and teaching methodology of Maths, Language and Environmental study for teaches and students during the workshops held under Distance Primary Education Programme, DPEP, SCERT and IGNOU.
- → Short introductory film'Neev' made by ' Madhyam' on EGS schools.
- → A programme 'Shiksha Paati' has been started to establish direct contact with cluster and schools. For this, a separate post box number has been given to all the teachers and gurujis to write about their problems and achievements direct to SPO. Directly mailing to select teachers every week on specific theme to clicit their response is also being done through this.
- → Various publications and brochures being developed at cluster/block levels in the districts.

(e) Gender

- → State Gender Co-ordinator / District Gender Co-ordinators are in position except in districts Bilaspur, Rajnandgaon, Panna and Mandsaur in Phase-I districts and Dewas, Damoh, Khandwa, Seoni and Raipur in Phase-II districts.
- → During July- August, 1998, a special enrolment drive called Mahila Shiksha Abhiyan II was organised with focus on enrolment of SC/ST girls and also in the current year, MSA-III is going on in the DPEP districts.
- → 30 % posts are reserved for female teachers.
- → 4036 Shishu Shiksha Kendra's (SSKs) have been established in Phase-I districts.
- → 287 Jhoolaghars are functional in Phase-II districts. The post of teacher and helper are reserved for females.

- → Mahila Samkhya has been operationalised in three districts of phase I namely, Raisen, Rajgarh and Mandsaur and two districts Seoni and Shivpuri of phase II.
- → 223 Sahayoginis in DPEP-II districts have been put into place at selected clusters for bringing gender related issues pertaining to education into clear focus.
- The Teaching Learning material prepared under the Seekhna Sikahana package and the AS schools pedagogy have been screened for its gender sensitivity.

(f) <u>SC/ST/Minorities</u>

- → 23 Ashram schools of tribal children are functional in phase-I and 73 in phase-II districts.
- → Convergence with Tribal Welfare Department for Ashram Shalas achieved.
- → In the year 1996-97, 7 Madarsas were started in district Ratlam on pilot basis in which 419 children of minorities are getting primary education alongwith Dini Taleem (religious education).
- For Muslim minorities (specially girls) scheme of "Modernisation of Madarasas" has been launched this year in 7 districts of phase-II namely, Bhind, Dewas, Jhabua, Khandwa, Morena, Seoni and Shivpuri by introducing the State curriculum including Urdu, Maths, Hindi and Environmental study in 547 Madarasas. The main aim is to modernise Madarsas by incorporating in them the features of curriculum so that they are able to mainstream their education while keeping the basic features of Dini Taleem' (religious education) intact. This is with a view to make Madarsas professionally more relevant and practical for student.

(g) <u>Children with Disabilities</u>

- → The State has selected one appropriate block in 19 districts to be covered under the IEDC scheme.
- → At present, IEDC scheme with 58 trained special teachers is in place in 6 DPEP districts.
- → The State has a core group that functions as SRG.
- Survey has been done with the help of Panchayat and Social Welfare Department in all districts.
- → A Disabled Children Assessment Camp was organised in Rajnandgaon district by RGPSM in collaboration with the Red Cross Society and Panchayati Raj Department.
- → Parents of disabled children included in VEC.

- In Tikarmgarh district, special initiatives have been taken by the District Project Director for bringing handicapped children in the mainstream. Under "Chunauti" scheme, the district administration has secured an assistance of Rs. 2.5 lakhs from Central Assistance Aid for the handicapped children under the Ministry of Social Welfare, GOI. With this fund 250 callipers and 90 tricycles have been provided to the school going handicapped children of the district. Apart from providing physical aids, an assistance of Rs. 150:- per month is being given to the handicapped children, who are regularly attending the school from the State Government scheme of "Nirashrit Pension".
- The Mission has also established a cell for handicapped children at all the BRCs. This cell would collect database of the handicapped children attending the school and monitor the progress of these children throughout their schooling tenure.
- In order to improve the functioning of the existing IEDC scheme, the Mission has decided to get its essential features, its usefulness and its impact appraised. The appraisal will be done by the joint team to be drawn from the officers of SCERT, DPI and other related organisations. Based on such a evaluation, a comprehensive strategy with required modifications will be evolved and would then be implemented by pooling in resources available for this activity under various governmental and non-governmental programmes.
- The district core group has also been requested to do the same exercise and come out with their own models both for major and minor disabilities. The districts have also been given freedom to implement their chosen model atleast in a cluster or group of clusters so that large scale replication in future becomes easier.

(h) Distance Education

- → State plan for Distance Education has been prepared.
- → Distance Education has been included in AWP&B 1999-2000 for both DPFP-L& II districts.
- → State Resource Group constituted.
- → Workshops involving teachers, CACs, Media persons, teacher educators, gurujis, and DIET persons were organised in 5 districts viz. Vidisha, Rajgarh, Shivpuri, Shahdol and Mandsaur. In these workshops about 115 video and 8 audio cassettes were screened/played so as to decide upon the cassettes useful for wider dissemination. Such selected material will then be used during training programme and monthly meetings of teachers.

- SCERT has been using the medium of All India Radio for monthly broadcasting and problem sharing. This broadcasting will be held on the first day of every month has proved to be very useful for the upward and downward movement of information/ideas related to schooling. The broadcasting also coincides with the monthly meeting of all the teachers within the cluster at the CRC.
- Two round of teleconferencing with the Cluster Academic Coordinators and the State has been organised. This has been done by using the broadcast facility available at the State level and the reception facility available in the DIETs at the district level. Teleconferencing has proved to be very useful in disseminating inputs to the CACs and the other resource persons at the district level on the one hand and getting their feedback and suggestions on the other hand.

(i) <u>*MIS*</u>

DPEP - I:

- The State Project Office (SPO) and all the District Project Offices (DPOs) have a fully operational MIS.
- The State Project Office is fully staffed. The DPOs also have one programmer and two Data Entry Operators each except in Schore and Raigarh where the post of programmer is vacant. The process is going on to fill the vacant posts.
- → EMIS data for DPEP 1 districts for 1998-99 received and transmitted.

DPEP - II:

- Out of 15 districts, the programmers are in place in 12 districts while the process to appoint programmers in districts. Jhabua, Khandwa and Raipur is going on.
- → Hardware in place in 13 districts. For the rest procurement process is in progress.
- → Manpower is in place in 15 districts to operate MIS. For the vacant posts, recruitment process is in progress.
- The State is implementing three kinds of soft-wares for its Management Information System. The Integrated Project monitoring System has been used for monitoring the key activities under the project. The data is collected right at the school level and gives updated information pertaining to adequacy / inadequacy of the key inputs pertaining to the schools. The Lok Sampark Abhiyan has been used as a People's Information System for getting village level

information pertaining to the enrolment and out of school children. The Education Management Information System gives the stock information about the school and the various components associated with the schools.

→ EMIS data collected from 11 districts of phase-II received and transmitted.

(j) Research / Evaluation

- → The EMIS analysis has been completed till the year 1997-98
- → The draft report of "Impact Evaluation of DPEP" has been prepared.
- The survey to collect data for "Learner Evaluation and Impact of Classroom process & practices" has been completed and the analysis of the collected data is in the process.
- → Data is being collected so as to do Attendance monitoring in sample districts.
- → More than 30 studies have been conducted by independent agencies to evaluate the primary schooling innovative and community based initiatives-AS schools and EGS schools in MP.
- → Districts have also conducted over 20 studies in the area of Gender, SSK and Tribal Education.

An expenditure of Rs. 115.16 crores has been made against the total plan of Rs. 118.96 crores while in phase - II the total target was 85.79 crores out of which, 60.44 crores have been spent till 30.8.99.

<u>Achievements</u>

- SCERT has developed new textbooks for classes I & V. Teacher training's modules have been developed extensively by SCERT.
- To bring about the quality improvement of DIETs, a committee has been constituted under the chairmanship of Principal Secretary, School Education. The committee is examining the present structure and working of DIETs and would give suggestions for qualitative improvement pertaining to the

management and academic issues of DIETs in the State. The first meeting of the group has been held and draft recommendations have been put up. The report is expected to be finalised within a fortnight.

Concerns

• Linkages with the SCERT, DIETs, BRCs and CRCs need to be strengthened.

1.4 Functioning of SIEMT

- As per the decision of the last Executive Committee, the SIEMAT now works as a separate cell SPO under Rajiv Gandhi Prathmik Shiksha Mission.
- The State Academic Coordinator for SIEMAT has been taken on deputation. He alongwith his core team of lecturers, programmers and date entry operators has operationlised the SIEMAT. The training of district functionaries on maintenance of accounts and financial aspects has been organised. The training programme for Cluster Academic Coordinator is commencing from 21st October, 1999.

1.5 Impact of DPEP Experiences on the overall system

- Text books developed for Classes I & IV have been introduced in the entire State.
- Teacher Training modules developed under DPEP being imparted to all the DPEP and non-DPEP districts.
- Decentralisation of printing The printing of text books for EGS schools has been decentralised from this year in which the Mission authorised the districts to print and distribute the books on thier own to all the EGS and AS schools on time. This decentralisation has saved the cost and has also created accountability among district functionaries towards timely supply of books to the children. As a result of this operation,
 - Books have reached all the children on time.
 - Costs have been saved to the extent of Rs. 1.53 cr. Out of which, Rs 1.03 cr. have been saved in printing and Rs. 0.50 cr. in transportation.
- Universalisation of Elementary Education The RGPSM has converted the primary education into a Mission Mode in 1994 and after having worked or this mode for the last five years, the State Govt. has recently initiated wideranging Institutional Reforms.
- On 30th September, 1999, the Govt. of MP has issued instructions for the Institutional Reforms. The main aim of this to give momentum as well as a Mission mode programme and management to the activities of adult education

- and school education upto middle level. This Mission Mode working is to be developed at district, block and cluster level along with the State level.
- The new structure are being developed by redefining the tasks of existing organisations and reorganising resources. This will make the programme more economical.
- At the state level, now there will be Rajya Shiksha Mission, to provide technical and administrative support to literacy programme and the school education upto the middle level. This Mission will be able to increase the community participation to involve the public representatives in middle education and literacy programme and to mobilise financial resources.
- In addition, the, management of these programmes has been decentralised upto the village level. A Jan Shiksha Kendra at the Cluster level to be created all across the state and would be used as a hub for integrating activities at this level of converging academic resources and panchayat leaderships. Since, a major issue in management of elementary education relates to quality, the management of DIETs has been decentralised and brought laterally under the districts.

1.6 Innovations

- The State had experimented with the alternative pedagogy so as to provide non-graded schooling system based on the children's individual; pace of learning. The textbooks and the supplementary teaching learning material for the alternative schools have been prepared and put to use. Based on the encouraging response and the impact of the pedagogy on the learning achievement of the students, the pedagogy has been scaled up to cover on the learning achievement of the students, the pedagogy has been scaled up to cover the Education Guarantee Schools as well.
- In order to get the first hand information from the villages pertaining to the needs and aspirations of the people and children towards primary education an alternative people's information system called Lok Sampark Abhiyan has been put into place in the State. The Lok Sampark Abhiyan as a micro planning exercise has been able to provide the feed back pertaining to the out of school children on the one hand and it has also been able to throw light on the schooling gaps on the other hand. LSA has also been used as a strategy for updating Village Education Registers and bringing the elements of community focus and pressure to push out of school children into the schooling fold.
- Based on the feedback of large scale primary schooling gaps which came from LSA, the State initiated a demand based community centred schooling initiative wherein the State acknowledged the right of the children to primary education. The scheme titled Education Guarantee Scheme has been instrumental in enabling the State to provide universal access to primary education to all its habitations within one km.

- The state has also embarked upon the innovative strategy for modernising the Madarasas curriculum. Under this, the State entails to incorporate the elements of modern education besides keeping the basic features of the Deeni Talim intact. This has been a successful experiment of using orthodox social process for a modern education programme.
- The project of 15 Sahayoginis at the cluster level in the selected block in each district is being implemented in order to bring gender related issues into critical focus at the cluster level.
- In order to stimulate the creative energies of the students by providing them an environment which enables learning by doing, the State has embarked upon a programme for creating Activity Centres in order to fulfil the ecological, cultural, recreational and physical requirements in a school. The Activity Centre would enable the students to creatively express their ideas and views and would make classroom learning more enjoyable and would improve the achievement levels of the students.
- The State has also taken on the task of improving the school building and their designs so as to enrich them functionally. The school building design has been transformed from the point of view of making them fit into the changes which have come about in the academic designs of the primary school during this year. By using the alternative building technology, the State has been able to come up with cost effective solutions to school building without compromising on the availability of space and other construction features. The State is planning to use the alternative structure as a case for wider replication in the longer run.
- The State has also decentralised the printing of text books pertaining to EGS school this year. This innovative experiment has been an eye opener and resulted in the timely distribution of the text books to the schools on the schools on the one hand and effecting huge reductions in the printing and the transportation costs on the other hand. The State also innovated by digitalising the contents of the text books and then transmitting them to the districts thereby ensuring 100 % error free text books.

- In Dharmapuri, in class IV Mathematics, the difference between the rural and urban performance has been reduced to less than 5 percentage points.

4. Review of Functional Areas:

1. Pedagogy

(i) <u>Teacher Training</u>:

During 1997-98 and 1998-99, out of a total number of 51596 primary school teachers, 51236 teachers have been trained under the "Shiksakodaya" training programme which has been formulated with the help of Development Network Organisation of Bihar. Training Module for the second round has been developed and training of trainers has been completed. Teacher training (second round) will be organised at block level.

(ii) Curriculum and textbook development:

Under this programme, visioning and conceptual workshops have been organised for the State Resource Group. Later during April-June, 1998, 2 Curriculum Review and Strategy Workshops have been organised. The revised curriculum have been approved by UP Basic Shiksha Parishad and revised textbooks for class 1-III were developed. Revised text books for Maths (class 2, 3) have been introduced from July, 1999. Rest of the textbooks are being field trialled and after finalisation would be introduced from July 2000.

(iii) BRC-NPRC:

Out of total number of 215 BRCs, 212 BRC Co-ordinators have already joined. Out of 2116 NPRCs 1655 Co-ordinators have already been selected and are in place. The contract for supervision of BRC construction is in the process of being finalised. The NPRC construction has started in all the districts. BRC-NPRC orientation has been organised. Moreover, academic support system integrating DIETs, BRC, NPRC including all aspects of school visits, monthly meetings etc. is being strengthened.

(iv) DRG-DIET

- A District Resource Group for Pedagogy has been notified in all the 15 DPEP districts. This group is being strengthened and made functional.
- The staffing position of DIET in DPEP districts may be seen at Annexure-III. Efforts are being made to fill vacancies in DIETs.
- Academic Resource Group (ARG) is constituted in DIETs and it helps in reviewing planning & implementation of programmes.
- A resource team of Govt. of India is supporting institutional development in Bareilly DIET. The recommendations given by the team are being followed up by SCERT & DPEP.

2. Alternative schooling

Target for 1999-2000 is 1952 A.S. centres.

962 A.S. centres have been opened to date with a total enrolment of 30904 including 16308 Boys and 14596 girls.

In Firozabad district 03 wards of Firozabad city have been selected for the primary education of child workers and out of school children in 1st phase. In these three wards, 34 centres are in operation having 572 children including 243 boys and 329 girls. A 30 days training for instructors of Bal Shiksha Kendra (A.S. for child labour) has been conducted by CREDA, Mirzapur.

In Moradabad city, a survey for identification of child labour and out school children have been conducting with collaboration of Labour Dept. U.P. In Moradabad City 13 A.S. centres are running in which 155 boys, 208 girls and total 363 children are enrolled.

In Sonbhadra and Lakhimpur Khiri 58 Rishi Valley Model based A.S. Centres are running in scattered and remote habitations. At present 1771 children including 1064 boys and 707 girls are enrolled in these centres.

In Block Mirdha (District Lalitpur) after 03 days short catchup camp, a 90 days long term Bridge course camp was organised for the child labour and out of school children with the help of M.V. Foundation, Hyderabad. 75 children, 47 boys and 28 girls participated in it. After completion of camp, 41 children are enrolled in primary schools and 17 children enrolled in upper primary schools.

Training programmes for Shikshaghar, Prahar Pathshala and Maktab / madrasas schemes have been organised with the support of "Nalanda" Lucknow.

3. Community Mobilisation:

- Around 11996 VEC conducted their meetings regularly out of the 14995 Village Education Committees. 11374 VECs have been trained including 227480 VEC members and other enthusiastic community members.
- 107 proposals have been received from NGOs by the State Project Office for Community Mobilisation activities. The screening of these proposals has started. The proposals are going to be screened at two level before presentation to the appraisal committee.

4. School Mapping and Microplanning:

• Around 12723 VECs have completed the Microplanning. Village Education Plans has been completed by 6834 Village Education Committees.

5. Children With Disabilities:

- Two blocks of each district viz. Basti, Sidhartha Nagar, Sonbhadra, Bareilly and Hardoi have been selected for Integrated Education under DPEP. A total of 18167 disabled children out of which 11952 boys and 6215 girls have been identified through a survey. In Bareilly district, District Co-ondinator (Integrated Education) has been appointed.
- A voluntary organisation, Shikshit Yuva Sewa Samiti has received approval from the World Bank to work for integrated Education in four blocks of Basti & Siddhartha Nagar (2 blocks in each district). The process of the first installment release for the organisation have been initiated.
- A ten days training workshop for the 25 Master Trainers of the above mentioned districts have been conducted. Remaining Master Trainers will be trained in the month of July, 99.
- To ensure the NGO participation in Integrated Education the proposals were invited through an advertisement. Only 17 proposals were received. The process of NGO selection is going on.

6. MIS:

- Hardware with UPS and software in place in all districts.
- Data entry operators are in position in all the 15 districts. Programmers have not been recruited at the district level.
- EMIS reports for 97-98 have been generated for all districts.
- EMIS reports for 98-99 have been generated for 13 districts. Reports of remaining 2 districts are expected by end of October, 99.
- Process for EMIS data for 99-2000 has been started as per schedule. Formats have been distributed to all schools and NPRC coordinators trained. School data as on 30th Sept. will be collected during the month of October, 99.

7. Free Text Books distribution:

Under DPEP provision of free text books to SC/ST boys & girls for 1998-99 session has been made. Eree text books were distributed to 19, 28692 children.

8. Distance Education:

- Distance Education Co-ordinator has been appointed at SPO.
- Planning meeting has been organised to develop a plan for distance education for DPEP districts.
- 24 video programme have been identified from programmes produced by SIET. Lucknow and NCERT.
- 16 content briefs have been developed for preparation of scripts for audio video print material.
- Action has been initiated for development of distance education model for Bareilly and Badaun districts.
- Content-brief on 1323 difficult areas and 2 contextual issues developed by SRG (training), video scripts ready for use of video films during teacher training.
- 11 SIM developed, seven finalized, ready for printing.

• Video document of 'Sabal' in 2 parts (20 minutes, 19 minutes) ready for duplication.

9. Gender:

District—gender co-ordinator have been appointed oriented in all 15 Districts. SRG & DRG have been constituted for girls education & ECCE. S.R.G. is meeting quarterly and helping in planning & implementation. Generic / integrated as well as specific intervention are being adopted for promoting girls education. Curriculum, text books revision & development in the gender perspective has been made. Teachers training & VEC trg. packages are also having proper weightage to gender & girl's education issues. A model cluster development approach is being adopted for promoting girls education as specific pockets and population section in DPEP district of U.P. slow very low female literacy rate especially SCs & minorities. There fore, to tackle the severity—of the problem, it was decided to work intensively, VECs, MTAs, PTAs, women motivator groups are constituted and trained.

- 1050 ECCE centres are supported with the convergence with ICDs. A.W. works are trained and centres are located in the premises of Primary Schools with coterminus timings to the schools.
- To promote girls education, free text books to all girls in DPEP districts are provided.

10. Civil Works:

- Installation work of handpumps has been entrusted to UP Jal Nigam, MoU has been signed work has started.
- Of the 2116 NPRC, 1571 have been completed, the remaining are in progress.
- RES engineers have been given training regarding supervision of Civil works. The supervision strategy using Rural Engineering Service (RES) engineers has not proved very effective. This may affect the pace and quality of the remaining works. Junior engineers on contract basis for site supervision have not been appointed at district level as per decision of the Executive Committee.
- 12738 toilets are being constructed out of which 2244 have been completed.
- Construction of 3627 schools had been planned of which 804 have been completed and 2095 are in progress.
- The new designs (five) are proposed to be used for the 4 expansion districts and remaining schools of the original 18 districts. Prototype construction work is nearing completion Preliminary construction manuals based on the five designs prepared.
- The physical and financial progress of Civil Works for UP-DPEP II may be seen at Annexure-IV.

11. Opening of new schools:

• 607 new primary schools have been established during 1997-98. The posts of Head Teacher and Assistant Teacher have been created and most of posts have been filled.

• During 1998-99, 1777 primary schools have been opened. Posts of Head Teachers have been created and filled. Construction work has started. Newly created 1777 asstt. teacher posts are being field by Shiksha Mitra (Para teachers).

- b) Functioning of Executive Committee / Governing Council:
 - The West Bengal DPEP Society has so far organised four meetings of General Council and nine meetings of Executive Committee.
- c) Submission of Annual Audit Report:
 - The Annual Report and Accounts for 1997-98 have been submitted to GoI and laid in both Houses of Parliament.
 - The Annual Report for 1998-99 is likely to be finalised by Nov. '99.

5. Review of Functional Areas:

i) Planning and Management

- Micro-planning and school mapping have been undertaken this year. Field work will start from Nov. '99.
- Several workshops conducted with the help of NIEPA, LBSNAA & Ed.CII. in the month of March, April, May and August with regard to preparation of AWP&B 1999-2000.

ii) Civil Works:

- 444 new school buildings, 1387 addl. rooms & 196 CLRC buildings planned for 1999-2000 involving approximately Rs. 3386.85 lakhs. Work on these buildings will start from middle of Nov.'99. Meanwhile work on 202 new school buildings, 577 additional classrooms and 104 CERC buildings going on (all spillover work).
- Civil work designs final; cost effective construction technologies adopted for buildings for CLRC & new school buildings.
- One Prototype building in each district to start by 1st week of October, 1999 to provide hands on training to local engineers, masons and VCC members on non-conventional technology.
- Convergence plans being formulated at district level to provide basic minimum building support to all primary schools including toilet and drinking facility within next 3 years.
- Programme taken up on creation of child friendly learning environment in schools out of civil work innovation funds.
- SCERT building will be constructed at a total cost of Rs. 350 lakhs.
 Rs. 100 lakhs would be provided for state component plan of existing project and Rs. 150 lakhs has been included in the state component plan of expansion districts. The balance would come from GOI and GOWB.
- The progress of civil works has been very slow on account of reconstitution of VECs, delays in design finalisation and site selection and change from BRC/CRC to CLRC. All the bottlenecks are new overcome and the target is likely to be achieved this year including the spillover works.

iii) Quality Improvement

- Teacher Training and Academic Support
 - * A 3 years integrated teachers' training package being developed which involve a training module for every year containing predetermined inputs. These modules will be finalised by mid-

October. Supplementary materials for the first year developed viz. reading material, a TLM guidebook and activity pool and a video film of activity based child centred teaching learning. This pedagogy training will be of 8 days duration in the first year, 10 days in the second and 12 days in the third year. The training strategy involves a cascade of KRP - RP - Teachers. KRP and RP trainings have been completed.

- * Other training programmes planned during the year include (14 days in total) 3 days for different functional areas of DPEP, 2 days for school management, PTA, leadership etc. and remaining 3 days for need based training as identified district-wise.
- * For the 15000 teachers (more than 1/3rd of the total) who have not undergone the Primary Teachers Training, DPEP has proposed a 4-6 weeks training programme to give them an exposure on educational theories and practices. Decision of the Government in School Education Department is awaited.
- * The Circle Resource Centres (CLRC) are coterminous with the circle/zone of the Sub-Inspectors of schools and are likely to be functional only in October 1999. There has been no follow up with teachers or academic support arrangements to date in West Bengal DPEP. Through the CLRC arrangements the number of resource persons available for support and follow up would be less than those available through the usual block and cluster based BRC CRC model.

• Textbook Revision

* The process for renewal of textbook has started. It is being undertaken by WBBPE. The manuscript of revised textbook for language (Bengali and Hindi) and Mathematics for Class-I are ready. Sample printing of these had been done during and the same are now under field testing from August, 1999. The process of revision for Urdu and Nepali textbook is going on. The final version of the revised textbook would be introduced in Class-I from the academic year 2000-2001. From March, 1999 the process of renewal of Class-II textbook has been initiated. Class II textbooks are planned to be introduced from academic year 2000-2001.

iv) Alternative Schooling

- Sishu Siksha Kendra (SSK) formerly called Child Education Centre (CEC) launched by P&RD Department has been taken as the only alternative schooling model for WBDPEP. Children not attending existing primary schools due to various reasons and unserved habitations are covered by SSKs.
- Convergence strategies have been developed jointly by School Edn. Deptt, on DPEP now provides for the following and P&RD:-
 - (i) School grant of Rs. 1,000/- p.a. to each SSK through VEC.
 - (ii) TLM grant of Rs. 250/- p.a. to each Siksha Sahayika (SS).
 - (iii) Additional training support to SS on pedagogy and TLM.
- House-to-house survey is being conducted in five existing districts to identify unserved habitations and out of school children. The survey has been completed in Birbhum and Cooch Behar. This WBDPEP-led activity has in fact being taken up all over the State (in non-DPEP districts as well) to create a common database in each district enabling them to develop a holistic plan for UPE.

v) Community Mobilisation & VEC Interventions

Administrative Arrangements:

• State and district coordinators in place. DRG formed in the districts. One Dy. DPO, as in-charge, looking after CM activities.

Material Development

- Development of training module for VEC training.
- Construction Manual developed for VCC training.
- SPO developed handbook on community participation in primary education for grass root level functionaries including, VEC members.
- SPO developed 3 posters on different aspects namely: teacher's role, community's contribution towards school infrastructure and communities role in universalizing enrolment.

Campaign and other mobilisational activities:

- Districts completed at least one wall writing in every school.
- Developed poster & hoardings and displayed.
- Districts have organized rallies and meetings, Pada Jatras, cultural competitions with the help of teachers, VEC members, Panchayats and Mahila Samity etc.

- Mobile book exhibition taken up by SPO in collaboration with NBT during February-March 1999 with a folk team attached with the exhibition Campaign to be repeated this year.
- SPO organized a Folk Festival with the help of folk artists at Calcutta. The folk artists selected from this festival have been grouped into teams which will perform in districts from village to village between November 1999-February 2000.

Community Organisations:

- In 5 DPEP districts 10453 VECs out of 12526 and 424 WECs out of 467 have already been formed.
- VCC formed for civil works under every VEC/WEC.

Empowering Community Organizations:

- The SPO organized a 2-day State level workshop with the DRG members for conducting VEC training at the district level. Panchayat representatives, MLAs also participated in the programme.
- Two districts (Cooch Behar, Birbhum) completed VEC training. Other districts organized RP training at the district level for conducting inturn training at the VEC level.

Networking:

• NGOs, Youth Clubs and other groups involved in the community mobilisation programme; [the network developed during TLC & PLC being revived and activated]

vi) <u>Integrated Education for Disabled</u>

- Five blocks identified in each district for IED activities (one old and four newly selected).
- School survey and house to house survey completed in one Block of each district and initiated in the remaining 4 blocks.
- Screening and assessment also completed in one Block of all districts except Cooch Behar.

Children with mild and moderate disability already are being enrolled in the primary schools of the blocks where IED programme is being implemented. The position is as follows:-

vii) Gender

- State and District Gender Coordinators in place. State and district Resource Groups formed in March 1999 and oriented workshop held for strategy finalisation, monthly meetings being organised with district gender coordinators at the SPO for AWP&B 1999-2000.
- Two Blocks in the five existing districts identified for intervention.
- Modules (for teachers) and resource materials (posters and audiocassettes) developed by SPO.
- Survey completed in all identified Blocks except South 24-Pgs.
- Module development for VEC members' training is in process in Birbhum.
- A Study on girls dropout in Birbhum is complete.
- SRG for Gender provided suggestions and inputs for the revision of class I textbooks.
- Awareness campaign with the help of 'Meena' cassettes going on in existing districts.

x) Link Library Programme and Mobile Book Exhibition
