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REPORT OF THE STEERING GROUP ON GENERAL EDUCATION FOR THE FIFTH FIVE YEAR PLAN

PART I

LEVEL OF DEVELOPMENT

1. Introduction.

The present social political situation in the country provides a favourable setting for developing large scale programme of educational reform. It is, therefore, proposed to include in the Fifth Five Year Plan an integrated and comprehensive programme of educational development which will catalyse social transformation, promote economic growth and accelerate our progress towards socialism.

The Education Commission (1964-68) emphasised that the present educational system will need radical changes if it is to meet the purpose of a modern, democratic and socialist society, changes in objectives, in content, in teaching methods, in programmes, in size and composition of the student body, in the selection and professional preparation of teachers, and in organization. The major steps to be taken to this end have been outlined in the National Policy of Education (1968). On the basis of these documents, it is proposed that the main ingredients of the programme of educational development to be included in the Fifth Plan would be the following:—

- (i) Transformation of the Educational System: This is essential to make education a powerful tool of social transformation, economic growth, modernization and national integration. It implies a radical transformation of the content of education accompanied by such related reforms as the adoption of improved methods of teaching, examination reform and improvement of text-books and other teaching and learning aids.
- (ii) Improvement of standards: This will include a programme of establishing a model comprehensive secondary school in each district and a model primary school in each community development pace-setting institutions. The establishment of autonomous colleges, the upgrading of a fairly large number of primary, middle and secondary schools and colleges to optimum levels and an effort to improve other institutions to the best extent possible, through institutional planning and local support supplemented by guidance and assistance from the State.
- (iii) Initiation of a comprehensive programme of pre-school development meant specially for the under privileged social groups.
- (iv) The provision of universal primary education in the age group 6-11 by 1975-76 and in the age group 6-14 by 1980-81.
 - (v) The adoption of the uniform pattern of school and college classes viz, 10+2+3.
 - (vi) Vocationalisation of education at the higher secondary stage.
- (vii) The development of a national scholarship policy so that talented students, and especially those coming from the most deprived sections of the community are assisted to receive the best school and university education.
- (viii) Reorganization of collegiate and university education, with special reference to (a) Provision of greater access to students from the under privileged social groups (b) expansion of facilities for part-time education or self-study (c) Improvement of Colleges (d) substantial increase in post-graduate education and research. (e) drastic restructing of courses on the principle of relevance, flexibility, diversification and moderanization coupled with adoption of modern methods of teaching, examination reform and improved library and laboratory facilities and (f) major administrative reform on the lines recommended by the Gajendragadkar Committee.
 - (ix) Introduction of large scale programme of National Social Service and
- (x) Strengthening of administrative machinery to plan and implement this significant programme of expansion and qualitative improvement.

2. Achievements.

During the periods of First, Second. Third and Three Annual Plans, tremendous progress has been made in so far as the facilities for educational expansion are concerned. During the first Five Year Plan the number of Primary Schools increased from 11,189 to 15,322 whereas at the end of Second Five Year Plan it rose to 18,512. It was during the Third Five Year Plan, however, that Universalisation of physical facilities was practically extended to 90.7% of the total rural population either on their own habitation or within one mile thereof. In the Third Five Year Plan, the number of Primary Schools, rose to 20,242. This number at the end of three Annual Plans i.e. 1968-69 was 21,103.

The enrolment in Primary Schools, which was 16.39 lakhs at the end of First Five Year Plan, increased to 22.47 lakhs by the end of Second Five Year Plan. It rose to 29.71 lakhs by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 32.62 lakhs by the end of 1968-69. The number of teachers working in these schools also increased from 58,807 by the end of Second Five Year Plan to 77,916 by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 85,259 by the end of 1968-69. The percentage of the trained teachers also increased from 48.1% in 1960-61 to 68.6% in 1965-66 and 81.5% in 1968-69.

This tremendous expansion of facilities of Primary Education has resulted in expansion of Secondary Education also. The number of Secondary Schools which was 333 in 1950-51 rose to 539 at the end of First Five Year Plan, to 1,099 at the end of Second Five Year Plan and to 1,590 at the end of Third Five Year Plan. This number further rose to 1,943 in 1968-69. Similarly the number of students studying in the schools increased from 3.65 lakhs by the end of second Five Year Plan to 6.03 lakhs by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 7.16 lakhs by the end of 1968-69. The number of teachers working in these schools also increased from 14,208 by the end of Second Five Year Plan to 22,188 by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 26,310 by the end of 1968-69. The percentage of trained teachers also increased from 59.2% by the end of Second Five Year Plan to 70.6% by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 73.4% by the end of 1968-69.

The number of institutions, pertaining to higher education increased from 101 in 1960-61 to 193 in 1965-66 and to 245 in 1968-69. The enrolment in these institutions simultaneously increased from 0.5 lakes by the end of Second Five Year Plan to 0.93 lakes by the end of Third Five Year Plan and to 1.31 lakes by the end of 1968-69.

It will be seen from the above information that there was an over all expansion of the educational facilities at all stages of Education.

The enrolment in Stds. I to V, VII to VIII and IX to XI which was 64.8% of the children belonging to the age group 6-11, 29.3% of the children belonging to the age group 11-14 and 14.5% of the children belonging to the age group 14-17 by the end of Second Five Year Plan increased to 83.1%, 36.7% and 22.5% of the children in the respective age groups by the end of 1968-69.

3. Fourth Five Year Plan.

In the first Three Five Year Plans and Three Annual Plans the accent was on expansion of educational facilities. As a result of which Universalisation of physical facilities was practically extended to 97.7% of total rural population either in their own habitation or within one mile thereof. In the Fourth Five Year Plan the emphasis was therefore, shifted on the programmes aiming at improvement of quality of education. As such as 20% of the outlay envisaged in Fourth Five Year Plan had been ear-marked for the schemes of qualitative improvement. The progress in so far as physical and financial targets envisaged in Fourth Five Year Plan are concerned has been very encouraging. This will be clear from the following statements:—

It will be seen from the above figures that as against an outlay of Rs. 2491.35 lakhs provided in the Fourth Five Year Plan an amount of Rs. 3368.95 lakhs which works out to 135.2% of the outlay is likely to be spent. In case of physical targets, however, there will be slight short fall which is due to the fact that it has not been possible to bring expected number of children to schools as originally envisaged. At the end of the Fourth Five Year Plan the enrolment in classes I to V is expected to be 87.5% of the population in the age group 6-11. Similarly the enrolments in classes VI to VIII and IX to XI are likely to be 42.4% and 24.9% respectively of the population in the age groups 11 to 14 and 14-17. The corresponding anticipated figures of achievement for the age group 6-11 and 11-14 for the country are 85.3%, 41.3% respectively.

PART II

PROPOSALS FOR THE FIFTH PLAN

In the paper "towards an approach to the Fifth Plan" presented to the National Development Council, the Planning Commission has suggested a list of basic minimum needs which will have to be adopted immediately. One of the items suggested in the list is Elementary Education for Children upto the age of a 14. In respect of Elementary Education the Constitutional Directive is that all the children upto the age of 14 should be provided with free and compulsory education within a period of ten years of the commencement of the constitution. Due to various reasons however it has not been possible to achieve this goal. With the present rate of enrolment Gujarat State will require 15-20 years to achieve this goal. It has, accordingly been suggested to undertake special programmes so that the provision for free and universal education upto the age of 14 can be achieved within a time perspective. It has also been suggested that the primary school may be provided within a radious of 1.5 Kms. At the same time, it has been suggested that the expenditure will have to be stepped up on items such as free text books, uniforms, attendance allowance and Mid-day-meals and to make adequate provision for school inspectors as well as to provide larger allocation for construction of class rooms.

The following objectives have been envisaged:-

- (1) The encourage and regulate pre-primary education.
- (2) To provide Free and Universal Primary Education upto the age of 11 years by the end of 1975-76 and upto the age of 14 years by the end of 1980-81 and to implement.
- (3) To provide free and Universal primary education upto the age of 11 years by the end of 1975-76 and upto the age of 14 years by the end of 1980-81 and to implement qualitative improvement programmes in primary education.
 - (4) To implement qualitative improvement programme in secondary education.
 - (5) To strengthen the teacher training programmes.
 - (6) To introduce the programmes of Work Experience in primary schools.
 - (7) To introduce the programmes of Work Experience in Secondary schools.
 - (8) To create adequate facilities for various types of Vocational Courses at Secondary Stage.
 - (9) To open more channels of suitable courses so as to minimise the growth of Arts and Commerce Colleges.
 - (10) To expand facilities for teaching and evaluation of Science, Agriulture, Medicine and Engineering subjects.
 - (11) To expand the facilities for Adult Education and to provide for continuing education.
 - (12) To expand the programme of NCC and National Services Scheme.
 - (13) To expand the facilities of inspection and supervision (The Directorate and Sub-Offices).
 - (14) To ensure proper organisation of Evaluation and Examinations.

In addition to the programmes of Free and Universal Education, various other programmes viz. strengthening of teachers' Training improvement of Science Education at School Stage, introduction of Work Experience Programmes in Primary and Secondary Schools, Vocationalisation of Education at Secondary Stage providing more channals of suitable courses so as to minimize the growth of Arts and Commerce Colleges and to expand the programmes of Adult Education are proposed to be included in the Fifth Five Year Plan.

The programmes of Work Experience have been made an integral part of primary and secondary education. It has been decided to introduce work experience in primary and secondary classes by stages. The Work Experience has been introduced in Classes I, II and III in 1972-73 and will be introduced in Std. VII by 1976-77. Similarly, it will be introduced in Std. VIII in 1973-74 and will cover Std. X by 1975-76. The programmes of training of teachers as well as for providing necessary equipments and raw materials for various crafts have also been finalised.

Under the programmes of Vocationalisation it has been proposed to introduce these programmes at higher secondary stage. The present institutions like post basic schools, multipurpose schools, I.T.I.s etc. would require re-orientation as per recommendation of the committee on 'Introduction of Work Experience Programme and Vocationalisation of Education at School Stage'.

Necessary funds required for implementation of all these Programmes have been proposed to be included in the Fifth Five Year Plan.

For implementing all the programmes envisaged above an amount of Rs. 18034.00 lakhs will be required during the Fifth Five Year Plan. The sub-groupwise break up is shown below:—

4. Personnel Training Programme.

For the implementation of all these programmes of General Education and also with a view to improve the quality of education it will be necessary to organise inservice and pre-service training programmes for primary and school teachers. It is also considered necessary to organise training programmes for Assistant Educational Inspectors, Head Masters of Primary and Secondary Schools and also for various administrative personnels.

- (a) Teacher Training Programmes.—It is proposed to cover every primary and secondary school teacher under inservice training programme at least once in a period of every five years. The Inservice training programmes with will be organised in existing training institutions for teachers and the State Institute of Education and the State Board of Teacher Education will guide and Supervise these programmes.
- (b) To enable the inspecting officers viz. the Educational Inspectors and Assistant Educational Inspectors know the latest developments in the field of education it is proposed to organise at least two seminars of these officers at least twice in one year. These seminars will be organised by the State Institute of Education.
- (c) Similarly the State Institute of Education will organise Seminars of Head Masters of Primary and Secondary Schools and also of the principals of training institutions for primary and secondary teachers.
 - (d) The State Science Unit will organise training programmes of Science and Mathematics teachers.
- (e) The teachers, head masters, Administrators will be deputed to participate in various training programmes organised by the National Council of Educational Research and Training and other Regional Institutions.

5. Surveys.

In a planned economy, the demand and supply of manpower are vital ingradients. It will therefore be necessary to ensure adequate supply of trained personnel for achieving satisfactory progress of various development projects in the field of education. It is absolutely necessary to maintain balance between demand

and supply of manpower at all times. These calls for an integrated and statistical approach to the problem of general education.

In view of these factors, the Central Advisory Board of Education has recommended Third Educational Survey to be conducted in the year 1973-74, so that on the basis of the findings of this Survey we can formulate defenite programmes of educational development in the field of education. The entire cost on account of the Third Educational Survey will be borne by the Government of India.

In the year 1972-73, educational and vocational survey was conducted Baroda District with the assistance of the State Bureau of Economics and Statics and its findings are now available. Similarly our Vocational Guidance Bureau has been conducting one survey on vocations. The findings of all these surveys will prove very much helpful during the Fifth Plan.

6. Financial and Physical Resources

The financial targets proposed are as under:--

The pattern of Central Assistance during the Fifth Plan is not known and therefore it is not possible to estimate.

7. Outline of proposals made for the Fifth Plan.

The objectives envisaged in Part II of the Report are proposed to be fulfilled provided adequate resources are made available. The schemewise write ups are given in the Appendix-I attached to this Report.

8. Conclusion.

The administrative machinery in education is far from satisfactory. It has not been adequately strengthened during the last 25 years even to meet the tremedous expansion that has taken place. What is more important, it is not all in a position to plan and implement the large scale programme of expansion and qualitative improvement which is visualised in the Fifth Five Year Plan Steps, will therefore, have to be taken to strengthen the administrative machinery both at the State and in the Districts.

The Central Advisory Board of Education and the National Development Council have advocated the need for expansion of educational facilities and also to improve the quality of Education. Moreover it has been emphasised that the constitutional Directive of providing free and Universal education to all the children upto the age of 14 has to be achieved within a time perspective. The programmes like Vocationalisation of Education as well as the adoption of uniform pattern of 10 23 school and college classes will-require huge resources. The State Government within its limited resources will not be available to provide funds for all these programmes. The programme of free and Universal Education upto the age of 14 is a national programme. In view of all these factors it is strongly recommended that the Central Government should come forward with liberal Central Assistance.

16. Content of the scheme.

In spite of all our efforts the number of adult illiterates has been increasing. This has very adverse effect on other programme of educational development. It is accordingly proposed to undertake mass literacy programme during the Fifth Plan. All the 80 lakhs adult illiterates in the age group 14-45 are proposed to be covered under this programme and provide them training in stage I and stage II as per our adult education programme which has been sanctioned by the State Government. The cost on account of per adult made literate in Stage I has been assumed at Rs. 4.45 P. of which the State/Central Government will have to bear Rs. 3.52 while Rs. 0.93 P. will have to be borne by Panchayats. For Stage II the cost has been assumed at Rs. 8.85 Ps. (Rs. 6.80 P. State/Central share and Rs. 2.05 P. Panchayat share) an outlay of Rs. 900/- lakhs has accordingly been proposed. It was expected that about Rs. 700 lakhs will be available from the Government of India.

The Government of India have provided 500 National scholarships to this state at a rate of 2 scholarship per CD Block /Unit at school stage for talented children belonging to rural area. This is a very good scheme wherein scholarships amounting to Rs. 1000/-p.a. to scholars staying in hostels and Rs. 500/-p. a. to scholars not staying in hostels are awarded to students. 16. Content of the scheme.

It is proposed to continue the National Service Scheme during the fifth Plan and cover 60000 additinal students. The cost on account of introduction of this Programme has been fixed by the Government of India at Rs. 120/-per student per annum. Of this amount the State Government is required to incure an expenditure of Rs. 50/-per student per annum while an amount of Rs. 70/- per student per annum is made available from the Government of India. Accordingly Rs. 126.00/lakhs will be available Rs. from the Government of India and the State Government will have Rs. 90.00 lakhs from this programme. An outlay of Rs. 216.00 lakhs has accordingly been proposed.

16. Content of the Scheme.

It is proposed to cover about 20% of the student population under Vocationalisation. These students who want to enter the wored of work quickly or have no aptitude for further studies in general education will be diverted into appropriate Vocational Courses. For this purpose an outlay of Rs. 300 lakhs has been proposed during the Fifth Five Year Plan.

The Scheme is likely to be fully Centrally sponsored Scheme.

PART V

PROPOSALS FOR THE DRAFT OUT LINE OF THE FIFTH FIVE YEAR PLAN

DEVELOPMENT OF GUJARATI LANGUAGE AND ITS LITERATURE.

Introductory:

The scheme for the development of Gujarati language and its literature has remained as a part of the main scheme of Establishment of Sahitya Akademy and production of children's literature' scheme No. 429. which is under the purview of the Education and Labour Department. The Sahitya Akademy has not so far been established but it is understood that suitable action in the matter is under consideration of the Government, at present. As and when the Sahitya Akademy is established, the present minor schemes of the development of Gujarati Language and literature will continue to be implemented as a part thereof. The provision of Rs. 5 lacs proposed in the draft outline of the fifth five year plan will therefore be a part of the main provision to be made for the Sahitya Akademy during the fifth five year plan.

II-Achievements of the Fourth Five Year Plan:

Following schemes were implemented during the period of the fourth five year plan.

- (1) Compilation and publication of a six-volume series of political and Cultural History of Gujarat by Shri B. J. Institute of Learning and Research on Grant-in-aid basis.
- (2) Compilation and publication of a for Volume series of History of Gujarati literature by the Gujarati Sahitya Parishad on Grant-in-aid basis.
- (3) Compilation and publication of encyclopedia in Gujarati by the Gujarati Vidyapith, Ahmedabad, on Grant-in-aid and loan assistance basis. The scheme was originally initiated during Third Five Year Plan.
 - (4) Assistance for the publication of works of knowledge reprints of literary works etc.
- (5) Financial assistance to needy writers for publication of their works pertaining to Literature, Language, Educational Science, Philosophy etc.

The physical achievements in respect of above schemes are as under-

- (i) Vol. I-II of Political and Cultural History of Gujarat are already published and Vol-III and IV are under print at present. By the end of Fourth Five Year Plan it is likely that Vol. III and IV will be published and Vol.V will be in the press.
- (ii) Vol. I of the History of Gujarati Literature will be published shortly and by the end of the Fourth Five Year Plan it is likely that Vol. II will be published and Vol. II will be sent to the Press.
- (iii) Gujarat Vidyapith has prepared Introductory Volme of encyclopedia in Gujarati and has collected and endited numerous articles of various topics. The scheme is proposed to be transferred to the University Books Production Board on certain terms and conditions and hence the work has remaned stand still
- (iv) Financial assistance was given for publication of the "Gnan Gangotri series" of Sarder Patel University. Vallabhvidyanagar. 11 volumes of the servies have so far been published Financialassistanc was also given for the publication of three other works (including a Gujarati -English Dictionery) durin the Fourth Five Year Plan period.
- (v) The scheme for offering financial assistance to the needy writers for the publications of selected types of literary works has recently been initiated and it is expected that quite, a few writers will be able to avail of this schemes.

Proposals for the Fifth Five Year Plan.

It is expected that out of six volumeses of Political and Cultural History of Gujarat, at least publication of one volume namely Vol.6 will have to be considered as spill-over scheme, during the Fifth Five YearPlan

period. Besides, it jis proposed to bring out three additional volumes of the history namely vol. 7 to 9 during the Fifth Flye Year Pian period in order to bring the compilation up to the period of 1st May 1960. Similarly the publications of Vol.III and Vol. IV of the History of Gujarati Literature by the Gujarati Sahitya. Parishad will probably be treated as spill-over scheme during the Fifth Five Year Plan period. Financially assistance will be accorded to Voluntary literary agencies for the publication works which have gone out of print and are not likely to be reprinted without suitable assistance. The scheme for according financial assistance to needly writers in the publications of their selected types of literary works is proposed to be further extended during the Fifth Five Year Plan period. It is also proposed to take up publications of omnibus cheap editions of literary works of some of the most popular poets of medieval Gujarati Literature.

The above activities will get due impetus with the establishment of Sahitiya Akademy, which it is envisaged, will be charged with the functions of all round development of Gujarati Lenguage and Literature.

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
