#### Session I - SSA - Quality Issues

I. 11.45 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. Findings of Class III, VII/VIII national sample survey 2<sup>nd</sup> Round

Under the SSA, in order to track the impact of the programme in improving learning outcomes of children, the SSA framework provides for a national sample survey on pupil leaguing levels for Class III, Class V and Class VII/VIII, every three years. The NCERT, therefore, conducted such a sample survey for Class V in 2002-03, for Class III and Class VII/VIII in 2003-04. The first round of such surveys helped to establish a baseline of the pupil achievement levels and subsequent assessments are expected to show the changes in pupil achievements. The NCERT surveys cover a representative sample of students across districts and three main areas for example, Language, Mathematics and Environmental Science. It looks at three critical classes, two of which are the terminal years of the primary cycle and the elementary cycle. Class III is a crucial interim year in the primary stage of education, where basic learning at Class I and II is necessary to be able to graduate to more difficult areas of learning.

NCERT conducts Periodic pupil achievement surveys, at key grades of the elementary education cycle for national trends, interstate comparability and independent assessment.

## II. 12.15 p.m. to 12.45 p.m. Systemic Quality Index (NCERT)

A Systemic Quality Index (SQI) has been developed with the guidance of the National Expert Group in Assessment at Elementary Education, by NCERT, to provide a model for efficiency and effectiveness of the school system in facilitating children's learning.

The Systemic Quality Index is important because extreme inequalities in form of infrastructure, human resources, school environment, access and opportunity exist within schools and between schools in India. It is important to have a framework that would help us place the child's learning achievement within a web of these interrelated factors, and interpret it appropriately.

(i) Findings of Time on Task Study (TSG)

The study was commissioned by MHRD, to find out how students spend their time in school and specifically, how much time is spent on 'active learning' in classrooms. The averaging time spent by students on curricular, co curricular and other activities inside and outside the classroom has been estimated. The study was conducted in 5 States. Activities of students and teachers were observed in classrooms for 5 to 6 days in each of about 100 sampled schools in each state. The study was done with the help of DIETs/ SCERTs.

#### Issues:

#### 20-days In-service Training

The overall achievement for 20-days in-service training conducted in 2007-08 was 2588970 teachers against a target of 3573735 teachers, which reflects a 72% overall achievement. The states with the highest achievement of 100% against their proposed targets include Arunachal Pradesh, Delhi and Tamil Nadu. The states with the lowest achievement include Sikkim (19%), Tripura (25%), and Manipur (28%).

- 17 States achieved between 80 to 100% of their targets including Andhra Pradesh (92%), Arunachal Pradesh (100%), Assam (83%), Chandigarh (92%), Chhattisgarh (84%), Dadra & Nagar Haveli (96%), Delhi (100%), Goa (83%), Gujarat (95%), Haryana (91%), Kerala (87%), Mizoram (82%), Nagaland (93%), Puducherry (87%), Tamil Nadu (100%), Uttarakhand (88%), and West Bengal (93%).
- 8 States achieved between 60 to 80% of their targets including Himachal Pradesh (71%), Jammu & Kashnir (62%), Karnataka (65%), Madhya Pradesh (67%), Orissa (65%), Punjab.(66%), Rajasthan (65%), and Uttar Pradesh (53%).
- 3 States achieved between 40 to 60% of their targets including Bihar (49%), Jharkhand (44%), and Maharashtra (54%).

7 States achieved below 40% of their targets including Andaman & Nicobar Islands (32%), Daman & Diu (38%), Lakshadweep (35%), Manipur (28%). Meghalaya (39%). Sikkim (19%), and Tripura (25%).

Teacher performance standards should be developed (ADEPTS framework could be used) and inputs under in service training programmes should be tailored to enable teachers to perform at these standards.

#### 30-days Induction Training

The overall achievement for 30-days Induction training conducted in 2007-08 was 205255 teachers against a target of 335359 teachers, which reflects a 61% overall achievement. The states with the highest achievement of 100% against their proposed targets include Arunachal Pradesh, Chandigarh, Delhi, Karnataka, Meghalaya, Mizoram. Puducherry and Tamil Nadu. The states with the lowest achievement of 0% against their proposed targets include Andaman & Nicobar Island, Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Nagaland and Sikkim.

- 12 States achieved between 80 to 100% of their targets including Arunachal Pradesh (100%), Chandigarh (100%), Delhi (100%), Goa (91%), Gujarat (95%), Karnataka (100%), Meghalaya (100%), Mizoram (100%), Orissa (92%), Puducherry (100%), Rajasthan (89%), and Tamil Nadu (100%).
- 6 States achieved between 60 to 80% of their targets including Dadra & Nagar Haveli (73%), Jharkhand (73%), Madhya Pradesh (74%), Punjab (70%), Uttar Pradesh (75%), and West Bengal (78%).
- 2 States achieved between 40 to 60% of their targets including Bihar (40%) and Uttarakhand (49%).
- 8 States achieved below 40% of their targets including Andaman & Nicobar Island (0%), Andhra Pradesh (0%), Daman & Diu (33%), Haryana (0%), Jammu & Kashmir (0%), Kerala (23%), Nagaland (0%), and Sikkim (0%).
- 7 States had indicated no target for 2007-08, including Assam, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Maharashtra, Manipur and Tripura.

#### 60-days Training of Untrained Teachers

The overall achievement for 60-days training for untrained teachers conducted in 2007-08 was 231180 teachers against a target of 348124 teachers, which reflects a 66% overall achievement. The states with the highest achievement of 100% against their proposed targets include Chhattisgarh, Mizoram, and Tripura. The states with the lowest achievement of 0% against their proposed targets include Andhra Pradesh, Chandigarh, Jammu & Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, and Sikkim.

- 6 States achieved between 80 to 100% of their targets including Bihar (80%). Chhattisgarh (100%), Manipur (86%), Mizoram (100%), Tripura (100%), and Uttar Pradesh (84%).
- 2 States achieved between 60 to 80% of their targets including Assam (64%) and Jharkhand (75%).
- 1 State achieved between 40 to 60% of its target, namely Maharashtra (53%).
- 10 States achieved below 40% of their targets including Meghalaya (31%), Nagaland (31%), Arunachal Pradesh (23%), Uttarakhand (1%), Andhra Pradesh (0%), Chandigarh (0%), Jammu & Kashmir (0%), Madhya Pradesh (0%), Orissa (0%), and Sikkim (0%).
- 16 States had indicated no target for 2007-08, including Andaman & Nicobar Island, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Puducherry, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal.

#### Issues:

- Progress in distribution of free textbooks is 0% in D&N Haveli only. Progress is 95% in Chandigarh, 77% in Gujarat, 93% in Haryana, 94% in Himachal Pradesh, 85% in Meghalaya and 99% in Rajasthan. In all other states with targets under SSA, achievement is 100%.
- 2. Need to ensure distribution of free textbooks at the beginning of the academic session to all children in all the languages of instruction in the State/UT.

- 3. Need to ensure distribution of Braille textbooks, audio books, etc. to Children With Special Needs (CWSN) at the beginning of academic session, in all subjects of all grades at the elementary stage.

#### Learning Enhancement Programmes under SSA (up to March end, 2008)

From 2008-09, 2% of the total SSA outlay for a district is available for specific quality enhancement programmes such as Science and Maths laboratories at upper primary, programmes for strengthening, reading and mathematics in the early primary grades etc. This provision covers inputs/funding for components not covered under any other SSA

component, and are targeted specifically to inclass/school components directly accessed by students.

PAB in 2008-09 has supported learning enhancement programmes in nearly all states for strengthening the quality related interventions under SSA and also for enhancing children's learning achievement both at primary and upper primary level. At primary level the focus has been on acquisition of basic literacy and numeracy skills in early grades through large scale reading programmes, activity based learning programmes, etc. For upper primary level PAB has approved activities related to quality improvement in Science and Maths education and in English teaching. States have been supported for setting, up Science and Maths labs, effective use of workbooks/ worksheets and also audio visual programmes.

Learning Enhancement Programmes have been approved in 26 States/UTs, so far.

- 2. LEP implementation to be done within the overall SSA framework for quality, integrating inputs from different components like teacher training, grants to schools and teachers, remedial teaching etc.

#### Issues:

1. Large gaps in teacher recruitment remain in Bihar (57630), Jammu & Kashmir (10072), Madhya Pradesh (12753), Rajasthan (48673), West Bengal (41972), Jharkhand (16026) and Orissa (8471).

- 2. Although PTR at national level is optimal, at 36:1 for primary and 32:1 for upper primary, there are 68 districts for Primary level and 28 districts for Upper Primary level with PTR above 60: 1. There is and urgent need to focus on PTRs at school level and on the rationalization in deployment of teachers in schools.
- 3. Teacher remuneration and service conditions, especially of contract teachers, need to be examined.

#### Computer Aided Learning:

- 1. Computer Aided Learning (CAL) is operational in 25982 schools covering 48.19 lakh students with the partnership of 69 private/NGO partners.
- 2. Norms under SSA have been altered to allow for up to Rs. 50 lakh per district (from the Innovation Head) to computer aided education facilities. The focus of CAL will be to maximize coverage in upper primary schools with special emphasis on science and mathematics. Hardware, software, training, maintenance and resource support, if required, could be included in this component.

## Item: Progress of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) under SSA

The Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya scheme was launched in July 2004 for setting up residential schools at upper primary level for girls belonging to SC, ST, OBC and minority communities in educationally backward blocks where the female rural literacy is below the national average (46.13%) and gender gap in literacy is more than the national average (21.59%). The objective is to ensure access and quality education to such girls by opening facilities in areas with concentration of tribal population, SC and minority; in areas with low female literacy and in scattered habitations that do not qualify for a school. In view of the targeted nature of the scheme, 75 % seats are reserved for SC, ST, OBC and minority girls and 25 % for BPL girls. The KGBV scheme is merged with Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan w.e.f. 1st April 2007. However, separate account would need to be maintained for operating funds of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya.

The Government of India has sanctioned 2180 KGBVs upto March, 2007. Out of these 1991 KGBVs are reported to be operational and 1,82,960 girls enrolled in them. Details thereof are placed at Annexure-I.

#### Revision of KGBV norms

The KGBV norms have been revised w.e.f. 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2008 based on which the Government (Annexure II) of India has sanctioned 398 1. GBVs in Educationally Backward Blocks where rural female literacy is below 30%; and in towns/cities having female literacy rate below national average of 53.67% (as per 2001 Census), in the current year. — Out of 398 new sanchioused KGBVs in M.P and I in Karnslaka have been operationalised. The revised financial norms of three models of the Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas are at Annexure-III (a), (b) & (c).

## Progress of National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level (NPEGEL)

The National Programme for Education of Girls at Elementary Level (NPEGEL). is a focused intervention of Government of India, to reach the "Hardest to Reach" girls, especially those not in school. Launched in July 2003, it is an important component of SSA, which provides additional support for enhancing girl's education over and above the investments for girl's education through normal SSA interventions. The programme provides for development of a "model school" in every cluster with more intense community mobilization and supervision of girls enrolment in schools. Gender sensitisation of teachers, development of gender-sensitive learning materials, and provision of need-based incentives like escorts, stationery, workbooks and uniforms are some of the endeavours under the programme.

The progress of physical targets, achievements and civil works under NPEGEL during 2007-08 is placed at **Annexure-IV**. The status of expenditure incurred against sanctioned outlay in the year 2007-08 is at **Annexure-V**.

#### Agenda Note on Prime Minister's 15 Point Programme for Welfare of Minorities

#### 1. PM's 15 point programme

- (i) The Prime Minister has unfolded a comprehensive 15-point programme for the welfare and empowerment of minorities in 2006. The target groups include the eligible sections among the minorities notified under National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992: Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists and Parsis. On the basis of this 121 Minority Concentration Districts (MCDs) are identified to focus programmatic interventions. The list of these 121 MCDs is in Annexure - I
- (ii) More than 15% outlay under the SSA is targeted to these 121 MCDs to achieve the goal of UEE, to meet infrastructure gaps for schools, classrooms, teachers and providing access by opening new schools.
- (iii) The progress made in these 121 MCDs in each of the following 7 key activities under the SSA is reviewed every quarter by the Committee of the Secretaries as well as the Union Cabinet.

#### 2. SSA Targets under PM's 15 point Programme for minorities

- (i) The 7 indicators concerning SSA, for which targets have been set in the PM's 15 point programme for minorities are:-:
  - (a) Opening of new primary Schools
  - (b) Opening of upper primary Schools
  - (c) Construction of primary school buildings
  - (d) Construction of upper primary school buildings
  - (e) Construction of additional classrooms
  - (f) Recruitment of teachers
  - (g) Opening Of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas.

#### 3. Progress against these 7 key indicators in 121 districts in the last two years:

- (iii) The states are advised to closely monitor these works and furnish progress quarterly to GoI. While provisioning of these items, the states are advised to consider the needs of muslim concentration localities within these districts.

## Other Important Issues Regarding Education of Minorities under SSA

#### Other Interventions for promotion of education of muslim minority:-

#### 1 Access

- (i) The States while opening schools should consider the unserved habitations/localities with minority concentration.
- (ii) The GoI had vide its letter dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2007 advised the States that if the States have a policy of opening of 'girl's only schools' they may open so from the sanctions given under the SSA, particularly in the unserved habitations in Muslim concentrated areas. The information on this was sought vide our letter dated 27.02.2008 to which only 13 States have replied informing they have no specific policy to open girls only school. However, Jharkhand and Haryana have reported opening of 31 and 60 schools respectively. The other States are requested to send information
- (iii) Information received from 13 States in respect of Girls only upper primary schools is at Annexure (IV).

#### 2 KGBVs


- (i) GoI vide its letter dated 16<sup>th</sup> October 2007 have advised the States to open KGBVs sanctioned localities with muslim concentration, especially in EBB's with muslim population above 20%. The efforts should be made to increase the coverage of Muslim girls in these KGBVs for optimal utilization of these facilities.
- (ii) The States with low muslim girls participation in KGBVs are as follows:-
  - Karnataka(3.47%), Jharkhand(7.76%), UttarPradesh(9%) and Gujrat(10.92%)
- (iii) The KGBVs provide for the facility of Urdu Teachers/ Sections if there is a demand in a muslim concentration Block. 76 KGBVs have 81 Urdu teachers.
  - However, till now such facility has been provided in only 5 States (Andhra Pradesh (24), Bihar (38), J&K (13), Haryana (6))
  - Jharkhand, Karnataka, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Uttaranchal have not appointed any Urdu teacher in KGBVs.
  - All the States are advised to check if there is a demand and a point urdu teachers accordingly.

### 3 Community Mobilisation

- (i) The States are advised to undertake community mobilization in minority concentration area for enhancing participation of muslim children at elementary level vide our letter dated 26.02.2008.
- (ii) States must target community mobilization in 88 districts with muslim concentration.
- (iii) States must target community mobilization in 726 CD blocks with muslim concentration blocks.
- (iv) Action plan for this be drawn and shared with GOI by 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2008 and sent to TSG consultant (community mobilization) Mr. Jyoti Prakash.at cmssatsg@gmail.com

### 4 Support to Madarsa/Maqtabs for transacting regular curriculum under SSA

- (i) Recognised and Registered Madarsa /Maqtabs which are already transacting regular curriculum can be supported similar to grants in aid schools. The support will include the following:
  - School grant @Rs.5000/- p.a for primary level & Rs.7000/- p.a. for upper primary level
  - Teacher grant @Rs.500/- per teacher p.a. for low cost teaching aids,
  - Free-textbooks for all children.
  - Additional teachers if required, as per norms.
  - Teacher training
- (ii) 7896 madarsas/Maqtabs were supported in the year 2007-08 which is less than the Madarsas/Maqtabs supported under SSA during 2006-07.
  - Haryana and Uttar Pradesh have shown reduction in support to madrasas/Maqtabs.
  - States like Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan which have comparatively less muslim population, the number of Madarsas/Maqtabs supported under SSA is 2706 and 2400 respectively.
  - Uttar Pradesh (589), AP (526), Jharkhand (120), WB (527) show relatively less support to Madarsa / Maktab whereas the muslim population is high.
  - It is seen that Assam, J&K, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Manipur, Goa, Arunachal Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Tamil Nadu have not provided information on how many Madarsa/Maqtabs were supported under SSA to transact regular curriculum.
- (iii) The States are advised to ensure that all volunteering madrasas/Maqtabs are supported for transacting regular curriculum as per SSA guidelines.



(iv) The State wise details in respect of support to madarsas/Maqtabs are given in **Annexure-V**.

#### 5 88 Muslim Concentration Districts.

- (i) The MHRD also focuses on 88 Muslim concentration districts (dist with Muslim population more than 20%) as educationally backward minority.
- (ii) The list of 88 MCD is at Annexure-VI.
- (iii) SSA specifically tracks the progress against AWP&B sanctions in key indicators in these 88 districts, every quarter. The States are advised to monitor the same and provide information regularly to GOI on quarterly basis.
- (iv) Progress against 2007-08 State wise sanctions for 88 muslim concentrated districts is at Annexure- VII. It reveals that:-
  - (a) In construction of PS and UPS J & K, Jharkhand and Uttarakhand backlog.
  - (b) For construction of ACR backlog is in West Bengal.
  - (c) For opening of school backlog is in J & K, UP, and west Bengal.
  - (d) For appointment of teachers, UP, West Bengal, J&K, Uttaranchal and Jharkhand have backlog.
- 6 338 towns and cities with concentration of minority population identified by Ministry of Minority Affairs.
  - (i) GoI has forwarded vide letter dated 15<sup>th</sup> May 2008 a list of 338 towns and cities with substantial muslim population requesting to identify the gaps for primary, upper primary schools, additional classroom drinking water and toilet facilities.
  - (ii) The list of these 338 towns and cities is at Annexure VIII.
  - (iii) The inter-ministerial taskforce on the geographical distribution of minorities in its report has made certain recommendation regarding coverage of 338 towns/ cities with substantial minority population and fill the infrastructure gap. Relevant part of the report is at Annexure IX.

## Para 4.7: Report on Inter Ministerial Taskforce on the Geographical Distribution of Minorities

The Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development reported that there are 9,335 primary and 4776 upper primary 9governemtn aided) schools in identified 251 minority concentration towns/ cities. The ratio of primary schools to upper primary schools in these urban areas is 1.95:1, which is somewhat more favourable than the norm of 2.1 already sanctioned.

The Department indicated that it would continue to scrutinise the Annual Work Plan and Budgets for 2008-09 developed by districts with specific provisions for urban areas falling within its jurisdiction under Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) programme with particular reference to these 251 towns/ cities to ensure that the school infrastructure, including requirement of new schools and provision of other facilities like drinking water and toilet facilities, were completed through the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) and in convergence with the total sanitation campaign programme and drinking water mission.

### Agenda Note on Opening of Schools and Providing Access

- 1 Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan provides for opening of new schools the following norms.
  - (a) Opening of a primary school or an EGS; Within One Kilometer of every habitation. Provision for opening of new schools as per State norms or for setting up EGS like schools in unserved habitations.
  - (b) Upper Primary schools/sections School: As per requirement, based on the number of children completing primary education, up to a ceiling of one upper primary school/ section for every two primary schools.
- **Schools Sanctioned under SSA:**-Under SSA 1, 50,232 Primary Schools and 1, 24,889 Upper Primary Schools have been sanctioned upto 2007-08. Of these 2, 75,121 Schools, 1, 35,289 Primary Schools and 1,05,395 Upper Primary Schools have been opened.

The States that are yet to open all the schools are as follows:-

- (a) The States that have more balance schools for opening at primary level are West Bengal (6000), Bihar (1572), Rajasthan(66), Jharkhand (989), Gujarat (730), Karnataka (485), Orissa (474), Tamil Nadu (372), Uttarakhand (345), Manipur (265), Kerala (124)
- (b) The States that have more balance school for opening at upper primary level are MP (10960), Orissa (6694), West Bengal (3324), Bihar (1134), UP (1125), Meghalaya (591), Tamil Nadu (364), Jharkhand (308), Andhra Pradesh (234), Manipur (141)
- (c) The States are advised to open all the schools and furnish the report to GoI by September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2008 The State wise details are at Annexure-I
- Ratio of Primary to Upper Schools. Though the PS to UPS ratio has improved from 2.8:1 (2003-04) to 2.5:1 (2006-07). There are States and districts with adverse PS: UPS ratio (>2:1).

(a) There are 13 States with ratio of primary to upper primary schools more than the national average of 2.5:1 The primary to upper primary ratio is adverse in:

- The districts with ratio of PS to UPS above 2:5 are 311 (DISE 2006-07). The States with high number of districts are UP (47), MP (28), Bihar (33), Orissa (21), Assam (23), Tamil Nadu (17), West Bengal (20), Rajasthan (13), & Jharkhand (22). The details of number of such districts are in Annexure-II.
- The States are advised to concentrate on unscreed areas while opening up the upper primary schools.

# 6. While considering for the opening of schools, the States are advised to consider.

- (i) Opening of PS/ UPS in villages with SC population above 40% as per list of such villages indicated by Dept. of School Education and Literacy, Govt. of India.
- (ii) Opening of PS/UPS in 338 towns/cities with substantial minority population, wherever gap exists.
- (iii) While opening of schools in 88 Minority concentration districts to choose the locations as appropriate considering Minority concentration area.

- (iv) Opening of PS/ UPS in districts/ blocks with substantial tribal population, as per State norms for tribal areas.
- (v) The States are advised to undertake mapping and ensure that projections for filling up of the gaps such that saturation for Primary and Upper Primary is achieved. The States are requested to share district wise details by October 2008 with GoI.
- (c) GoI has sought information vide our letter no. D.O.No.9-15/2007EE.XI dated 2.7.2007 on district wise opening of schools under SSA. It is seen that only 6 states (Meghalaya, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Haryana, Mizoram,) have responded till now. 29 states have not responded .The details are in Annexure V. The States are requested to provide information by 30<sup>th</sup> August 2008.
- (d) 100691 EGS has been upgraded PS/UPS by the States up till. However, it is not clear how many have actually completed their buildings, recruited teachers and received TLE Grant. The States were requested to provide such information vide our letter dated 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2008. No States have responded till now. The States are requested to send information (Annexure-VI) by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2008 to Shri Adil Rasheed, Consultant, AIE Unit, 10-B, I.P.Estate, New Delhi-110002, email:adiltsg@gmail.com.
- (e) The States and UTs have made commitments during PAB meeting of 2008-09 to provide complete access to the habitation. The States are advised to send to MHRD the action taken on there commitments by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2008. (Annexure-VII)

# Agenda Note on Out of School Children and EGS/AIE Implementation

#### I Progress under EGS/AIE

### 1. Coverage under EGS

11.50 lakhs children were covered under EGS. Out of these, 10.49 lakhs children were covered at primary level and 1.01 lakhs children at upper primary level. The total achievement in EGS was 93 % of the targeted children, out of which 95 % were at primary level and 77 % at upper primary level. The state wise detail of progress under EGS is at Annexure I. Following are the states with low coverage under EGS.

#### 2. Target and Progress on upgradation of EGS to Primary Schools

i) EGS centres were provided for instant access in access less eligible habitations. This was a temporary arrangement for provision of schooling facility. These EGS centres were to be upgraded into primary schools after successfully running for 2 years. National picture on upgradation of EGS is given in the table below

ii) PAB had approved 12233 EGS centres for upgradation into primary schools during 2007-08. But states have upgraded only 7523 EGS centres into primary schools.

The state wise detail of EGS upgradation in 2007-08 is given at Annexure II

iii) The states that have not been able to upgrade EGS to Primary School sanctioned for upgradation in 2007-08 are Rajasthan (645); Meghalya (267);

Kerala (124); Arunachal Pradesh (73) and Uttarakhand (17). These states are advised to upgrade these centres by September 2008 and furnish report to GOI.

- iv) The states in the PAB of 2007-08 had committed to formulate the state policy for upgradation of EGS into primary school. The commitments are pending. The details of the commitments are at Annexure III
- V) Though Orissa and Punjab have done away with EGS centres which were running for more than 2 years, both the states have committed that closure of 11,949 EGS centres (Punjab 973, Orissa 10976) will not affect children and they all will be enrolled in nearby school, Both the states have committed to track these children for next six months so that they do not drop out. These states are requested to furnish the report to GOI by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2008 on the status of the children who were going to the closed EGS.
- vi) With regard to EGS centres the target in 2008-09 are given to 12 states for 33, 173 centres. In view of the need to provide children studying in EGS with proper building, teachers and access to regular schooling it is desirable that the states upgrade their EGS to PS.
- vii) These states have given following commitments in the PAB 2008-09.

#### State made the following commitments to the PAB for the year 2008-2009.

#### Andaman & Nicobar

Schools sanctioned in earlier years shall be operationalised by July, 2008.

#### **Arunachal Pradesh**

• The State will under take mapping for requirement of primary and upper primary schools in under served areas. It will also consider policy for opening of schools with relaxed norms and small schools for unserved areas with scattered population. It will provide a supplementary proposal by July 2008, if necessary.

#### Assam

- The State will share with MHRD the evaluation report of third party on the existing EGS centres by 30.04.08. The State will immediately take follow up action to upgrade EGS centres on the basis of the finding of the evaluation. As the EGS centres have been sanctioned only for 3 months. The policy should be evolved by 31.07.08
- The State should urgently evolve a policy for opening upper primary as the ratio of UPS in the State is 1:29.

#### **Himachal Pradesh**

- The State will ensure Universal Enrolment in 2008-09.
- The State will evolve a policy for upgradation of 331 EGS to formal schools by October 2008.

#### Madhya Pradesh

• The number of out of school children to be covered in 2008-09 is 1.81 lakhs. The State would ensure provision of adequate schooling facilities to cover all these children in 2008-09.

#### Maharashtra

 100% access to primary and upper primary schooling will be ensured by operationalising all sanctioned schools under SSA at the beginning of academic session 2008-09

#### Manipur

- The State will formulate norms for upgrading PS to UPS within a period of 3 months.
- The State will also review the need for continuing existing EGS and formulate a policy for up gradation of EGS.

#### Meghalaya

- 100% access to primary-schooling by 2008-09. The State should open all primary schools, upper primary schools sanctioned till 2007-08 by July 2008.
- The State will map eligible habitations for Upper Primary School Access.

#### Orissa

• The state will under take mapping for requirement of primary and upper primary schools in under served areas.100% access to primary and upper primary schooling will be ensured by relaxing its policy on opening of schools, especially in case of tribal areas. In sparsely populated areas, especially in case of tribal areas, it will provide residential facility and coverage of uncovered habitations after undertaking proper school mapping exercise. It will also consider policy for opening of schools with relaxed norms and small schools for unserved areas with scattered population. It will provide a supplementary proposal by July 2008, if necessary.

#### 3. Coverage under AIE

- i) Against the target of 48.38 lakhs children, 26.96 lakhs children were covered under AIE (56%). Out of these, 2.48 lakhs (56%) children were covered through residential bridge course (RBC) and 24.47 lakhs (56%) children were covered in non residential bridge course (NRBC) and other alternative and innovative interventions.
- ii) Low coverage under AIE was reported by:
  - Haryana (46%), AP (44%), Bihar (40%), WB (37%), Jharkhand (35%), Sikkin (33%), Orissa (31%), MP (28%), Puducherry (26%, Goa (17%) and Delhi (2%)
- iii) Some of the States have reported very low coverage under residential bridge course (RBCs). These states with their coverage are listed below.

- School-wise tracking of mainstreamed children.
- Regular monitoring of attendance of such children.
- Counseling of parents with respect to their regular attendance in schools.
- Identification of problems and hard spots standing in their way.
- Diagnosis of academic needs of the children.
- Motivation of teachers in taking care of such children.
- Providing remedial teachings against suitable time schedule.
- ii) The mainstreaming was particularly low in Arunachal Pradesh, Chhatisgarh, Haryana and Tamil Nadu. The state wise status of mainstreaming is at Annexure V
- iii) The states are advised to focus on mainstreaming of children.
- iv) The states are expected to develop a robust monitoring mechanism and regularly monitor the continuation of education of mainstreamed children.

#### 5. Direct Enrolment

- i) 24.14 lakhs children were covered through enrolment drives and were directly enrolled in regular schools. States have put more emphasis on covering children through direct enrolment in regular schools. The number of children covered through direct enrolment have exceeded the actual numbers planned initially at the time of AWP & B approvals in 2007-08.

# iii) States are advised to provide academic support and regularly track these children to ensure their retention.

iv) The children who belonged to older age group (9+) and were directly admitted in regular schools without any bridging intervention may need additional academic support which should be provided through remedial teaching. Also, regular tracking should be done so that the retention is ensured and children do not dropout.

#### 6. Prospective targets for mainstreaming in 2008-09

The states have covered above 26 lakh children under AIE in 2007-08. Out of which 9.06 lakh children were mainstreamed in 2007-08 itself. It is important that remaining 17.9 lakh children are mainstreamed in 2008-09. The detail is at **Annexure VI.**

  - (b) Only 4 states have responded uptill now. It is seen that there exists gap in access

#### 4. Focus on Education of Wards of Safai Karamcharis

- (a) It has been brought to our notice by the National Commission for Safai Karmacharis, that more efforts are required on the part of the SSA program to provide access to schooling for children / wards of Safai Karmacharis, as well as to the need of targeting mobilization activities among this community to spread awareness and encourage them to send their children to schools.
- (b) The States were advised to take action on the following vide our letter D.O. No. 10-5/2006-EE.11 dated 24<sup>th</sup> June 2008.
  - i. Identifying the areas in which Safai Karmacharis reside and thereafter ensuring that there is access to a Govt. primary schooling facility within 1 Km of that area.
  - ii. Undertake community mobilization activities in such areas to ensure universal participation of children of Safai Karmacharis in the 6-14 age group in primary / elementary schools.
- iii. Ensure that children of Safai Karmacharis are admitted, enrolled and retained in schools and that there is no discrimination in admissions.
- iv. Remedial teaching is available to these children, wherever required.
- v. All facilities as per norms, like free text books etc. are made available to these children.
- vi. Tracking of such children is done to ensure their retention and completion of elementary education with satisfactory achievement levels.
- vii. Special teacher training modules for teachers in schools are developed & transacted, so that teachers are sensitized and any in-class discrimination is not allowed.
- (c) The States are requested to furnish report on the action taken with regard to education of Wards of Safai karamcharis by Oct' 2008.

# **Infrastructure Provision**

#### Civil Works

# 1. Performance of the States/UTs up to 31st March 2008

- Total financial allocation upto 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2008 is Rs.23760.25 crore, whereas expenditure is Rs.21038.78 crores which is 89% of the total allocation.
- The cumulative completion rate for all components is 76.41% whereas completion plus work in progress is 95.38%.
- Well Performing States (Comp. rate): Kerala (98.32%), Karnataka (93%), Arunachal Pradesh (91%), Gujarat (91%), Rajasthan (91.29%), Mizoram (91.29%), Haryana (86.40%), Punjab (84.33%), Tamil Nadu (83.27%), Tripura (84.04%), Uttar Pradesh (85.34%), Maharashtra (83.50%) and Assam (80.15%).
- State which started all works sanctioned upto 2006-07: Assam, Karnataka, Kerala, M.P., Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.
- Non-performing States with reference to completion rate: Jammu Kashmir (33.19%), Orissa (60%), West Bengal (55%), Goa (39.72%), Lakshadweep(0%), Andaman Nicobar (26.62%), Dadar &Nagar Haveli (16.59%), and Daman Diu (20.80%), Delhi (55.41%) and Pondicherry (59.46%).
- Non-performing States with reference to Completion plus in progress rate: J&K (63.08%), Manipur (87.85%), Orissa (84.95%), Sikkim (67.78%), West Be3ngal (63.93%), A & N Island (53.58%) and D& N Haveli (50.22%).

## 3. Infrastructure Gaps

- The gap was analyzed on the basis of DISE data 2005-06 and reveals following:-
- The analysis revealed a gap of 6.97 lakh classrooms, 94,443 drinking water facilities and 2, 59,184 school toilets.
- The gap varies across the State and districts.

#### • Position on classrooms

- At least 66 districts have gap more than 3000 classrooms of which major share is from Bihar (23), MP (16), Jhanrkahnd (8), WB (7) and UP (5).
- The overall gap in the State of Bihar (155576), Jharkhand (51556), MP (120789), UP (104405) and West Bengal (51018) is quite high and need enhanced allocation along with capacity building to complete the existing gaps by 2010.
- The State of HP (1404), J&K (3123 Mizoram (66), Nagaland (264), Punjab (2075), Rajasthan (14036), TN (3648), Uttarakhand (2813) should complete the gap by the year 2008-09.

#### • Position on Drinking Water

• The major Gaps reported from the State of Andhra Pradesh (18798), Assam (9640), Jharkhand (8374), Karnataka (8443), MP (11409) and West Bengal (12330). These States require to take effective measures to ensure convergence with the schemes of Department of Drinking Water Supply, Ministry of Rural Development to cover the gaps.

#### Toilets

 Major Gaps reported from the State of Andhra Pradesh (29666), Assam (21738), Bihar (24052), J&K (25758) and Orissa(27748). The State should ensure to complete the gaps in convergence with Department of Drinking Water Mission for existing rural schools as the department of Drinking Water Supply targeted to cover all school for toilets and drinking water.  The toilets and drinking water facilities for new schools and existing schools located in urban areas will be covered under SSA and for rural existing schools the States should ensure convergence with Department of Drinking Water Supply as suggested above.

#### o Girl's toilets

• So far as girl's toilets are concerned the average gaps of the country is 63% ranging from 92% to 11% across the States. The States which have major gaps in girl's toilets are Arunachal Pradesh (88%), Assam (90%), Bihar (84%), Chhattisgarh(87%), J&K(80%), Jharkhand(85%), MP (74%), Manipur (82%), Meghalaya(91%), Mizoram (79%), Nagaland (69%), Orissa (72%), Rajasthan (69%), Tripura (79%) and West Bengal (69%).

# 4. Staff position and measures for capacity building

- The State of AP, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, HP, J&K, Jharkhand, Karnataka, MP, Maharashtra, Orissa, Rajasthan, TN, Uttarakhand, West Bengal have in house engineering cell.
- There is no technical post in the States of Delhi, Manipur, Kerala, UP, Nagaland, Punjab and Chandigarh. These States are taking help from the line engineering department which some time not available for SSA works especially for the supervision and monitoring of activities. These states therefore, should have dedicated technical Staff at the SPO/DPO level atleast for supervision and monitoring. Punjab is processing the recruitment of engineers at all levels (1 for State, 2 JEs per district and 4 SDOs one each for one revenue district).
- There is large number of vacancies in the States of Andhra Pradesh (226), Assam (29), Chhattisgarh(34), Jammu & Kashmir (52), Jharkhand (96), MP (66), Maharashtra (23), Rajasthan (42) and West Bengal (213).
- The States/UTs of Goa, J&K, Nagaland, Chandigarh, Dadra N Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry have not developed community manual. These states should develop community manual immediately to provide site assistance to community during construction.

# 5. Quality in Civil Works

## Third Party Independent Evaluation System.

- 4th JRM recommended Third Party Evaluation System for all States as a mandatory requirement.
- The State of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Mizoram, and Karnataka has Third Party Evaluation System in place.
- Third Party Evaluation has been started in the State of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Delhi.
- The other States have not placed in position the Third Party Evaluation System.

- The remaining States must have place the system in position during current year to ensure quality in civil works.
- The GOI has conducted a third party evaluation of civil works of 11 States and reports of the same have been shared with the States with GOI comments to improve the weaknesses highlighted by the Consultant.
- The fifth JRM (January 2007) reported that lack of school campus mapping is leading to unplanned and haphazard expansion of schools. The all States/UT's should therefore ensure school mapping to facilitate better planning for access and provision of infrastructure in the schools. Assam, Gujarat, Karnataka, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Orissa, Rajasthan, Tripura, Uttarakhand and West Bengal have either started or completed school mapping exercise and other States are immediately required to complete this process.
- It has been reported to various evaluation/ review reports that Ramps have been provided in all schools, however, there are concerns related to its slope or width. All States are there fore required to take corrective steps in improving the ramps and to strictly adhere to specifications in future construction.
- National TPE reports reported lack of maintenance and cleanliness of sanitation facilities. It also reports insufficient provision of toilet and drinking water in schools with large number of students. The reports also indicate that water potability tests are not reported from any of the schools. Therefore all States should ensure cleanliness and maintenance of toilets in convergence with department Drinking water Supply including potability tests of drinking water in schools.
- JRM reports and TPE evaluation indicate urgent need for capacity building (CB) of technical staff through training, exposure visits and other inputs. Lack of technical teams' awareness on environmental concerns and safeguard mechanisms is resulting in a number of shortfalls in safeguarding environmental concerns. MHRD has already issued instructions to the State/Ut's to provide 5 days orientation to all civil works engineers and also develop training module including one day schedule to orient the engineers on environmental concerns and safeguard mechanisms.
- Various review/ evaluation report pointed out that environment aspect is not being addressed adequately at the school level which need immediate attention from States/UT's in SSA construction. There fore all States/ UT's should conduct internal environmental audits and cover all the districts with in a cycle of 3 years by constituting special team of existing lot of engineers within the State. The audit expected to provide the State technical teams to learn through self-evaluation.

#### TEACHERS RECRUITMENT POSITION

- The total teachers sanctioned upto 2007-08 is 11.20 lakh out of which 9.09 lakh have been recruited by the States/UTs, which is 81% as on 31st March 2008.
- The State with more than 10,000 vacancies are Bihar (62912), Jharkhand (13318), M.P. (12753), Orissa (15404), Rajasthan (35627), U.P. (15865) and West Bengal

(38719). Some States even not recruited a single teacher. The State wise information is given in table below:-

There is an urgent need to fill up teacher vacancies by the States which is highlighted in the table above to improve quality of education in these States/UT's.

# Strategy in 11th Five Year Plan for provision of teachers

- At the end of 10th Plan the PTR at primary level was 41:1 and there were 12.17% single teacher schools.
- The Ministry has also planned to provide one additional teacher to teach especially mathematics and science at upper primary level.

- During 11th Plan the Ministry planned recruitment of 4.68 lakh teachers of which 2.5 lakh teachers for new schools, 2.18 lakh for improving PTR to 1:40.
- During 2007-08 SSA sanctioned 1.22 lakh teachers and in the year 2008-09 the SSA further approved 107491 teachers (provisional figures) so that the requirement of 4.68 lakh teachers can be fulfilled within the project period.

#### III(v) Financial Progress under SSA

## 1 Financial Management

- 1.1 Financial management brings together planning, budgeting, accounting, financial reporting, internal control, auditing, procurement, disbursement and the physical performance of the programme with the aim of managing programme resources properly and achieving the programme's objectives. Sound financial management is a critical input for decision making and for programme success. Timely and relevant financial information provides a basis for better decisions, thus speeding up the physical progress of the programme and the availability of funds and reducing delays and bottlenecks.
- 1.2 The financial management system produces timely, relevant and reliable financial information that would allow programme managers and Central/State governments to plan and implement the SSA, monitor compliance with agreed procedures, and appraise progress towards its objectives.

# 2. Manual on Financial Management and Procurement

- 2.1 The SSA programme covers a wide gamut of activities in all the States and Union Territories and a need was felt to bring into focus at one place appropriate financial management systems and procurement procedures for the proper implementation and management of the programme. Accordingly, the English version of a comprehensive Manual on Financial Management and Procurement was developed in 2004, and made effective from 1st April, 2004. The Manual covers Financial Planning, Budgeting, Accounting, Fund flow arrangements, Financial Reporting, Internal Control and Internal Audit, Auditing and Procurement procedures. Subsequently, taking into account the need of Hindi speaking States, a Hindi version of the Manual was also developed in 2005. In order to have a better understanding of the provisions of the Manual even at grass root level functionaries the States/UTs either developed Manual in local language or adopted Manual of neighboring States. The various formats for financial reporting at periodical intervals have also been prescribed in this Manual. As per the information available, the Manual has been rolled out in all the States/UTs. However, in the case of Andaman & Nicobar Islands the approval of the State Executive Committee is yet to be taken.
- 2.2 Ministry takes continues feed back from all stakeholders on the implementation of the Manual and wherever necessary, amendments are issued from time to time. Considering the need of the stakeholders, 8 amendments to the Manual have been issued so far. A printed Booklet consolidating all the amendments issued so far has been developed and disseminated to all States/UTs.
- 2.3 It has been observed that copies of the Manual are not available in most of the sub district level units.

## 3. VEC Manual containing guidelines for accounts maintenance and procurement

3.1 VEC Manual containing guidelines for accounts maintenance and procurement in conformity with the provisions of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement should be developed at State level for use at VEC level. All States/UTs

except Manipur have developed a simplified VEC Manual mainly containing accounting and procurement procedures. However, most of the UTs have adopted the VEC Manual of the neighbouring States.

3.2 It has been observed that copies of the VEC Manual are not available in most of the VECs.

## 4. Quarterly Review Meeting of State Finance Controllers

- 4.1 In order to take stock of the physical and financial progress of activities being implemented under SSA, a quarterly review meeting of State Finance Controllers was introduced in SSA from April 2004, immediately after the introduction of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement. 18 such review meetings have been conducted so far and the 18th review meeting was held on 18 July 2008 at Delhi. Some of the regular agenda items of the review meetings include, action taken report on the decisions of the last review meeting, performance for the year, closing balance, status of rollout of the Manuals on Financial Management & Procurement and VEC Manuals, positioning of finance and accounts staff, capacity building of finance and accounts staff, position of staff for internal audit, monthly bank reconciliation statement, position of state share release, status of statutory audit and internal audit, utilization certificates, status of compliance of audit reports, status of submission of annual report, and any other current issues / developments taking place under SSA. This forum is also used to provide capacity building to the participants on accounting, financial reporting, internal audit, statutory audit, financial review, procurement, etc.
- 4.2 The Finance Controllers of States/UTs provide reports on quarterly fund flow and cash forecast, quarterly progress, details of funds released to the districts, district wise expenditure statement, indicators for financial management checks by Government of India, financial monitoring report, etc.
- 4.3 The proceedings of the review meetings are documented and disseminated to all the States / UTs for taking further follow up action. The minutes of the meetings are also available in MHRD's web site.
- 4.4 The States/UTs of A.P., Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadar Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir, Lakshadweep, Manipur, Nagaland and Puducherry are not regularly attending the above review meetings.

## 5. Staff Position of Finance and Accounts

- 5.1 The Finance and Accounts staff position at State and District level is reviewed in the quarterly review meetings of State Finance Controllers. As per the information furnished in the last review meeting, the Finance and Accounts staff positioned in State Project Office is adequate in most States. However, vacant positions still exist in Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Punjab, Uttarakhand and West Bengal.
- Finance and accounts staff in District Project Office is adequate in most States. Some vacant positions still exist in Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, J&K, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Orissa, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand and West Bengal. Information on the finance and accounts staff position is awaited from Andhra Pradesh, Daman & Diu, Dadar & Nagar Haveli, Lakshadweep, Manipur and Puducherry.

- 5.3 In Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep, Manipur, Puducherry and Sikkim staff of Education Department are mainly looking after the SSA work.
- 5.4 In Delhi, DPOs are not functional and the entire finance and accounts work is centralized at State level. In Goa, the staff posted at SPO is looking after the DPO work also.

## 6. Capacity building

- Capacity building is very important for effective functioning of finance and accounts units and as such much focus is attached to the training of finance and accounts staff. MHRD has issued instructions to all States/UTs to provide minimum five days mandatory training to accounts staff every year. MHRD has also suggested to all States/UTs to hire the services of Chartered Accountant to impart training on double entry system of accounting to the accounts staff. During the quarterly review meetings of State Finance Controllers, capacity building is also being provided.
- 6.2 Capacity building is progressing in 24 States/UTs. While 5 States/UTs of Delhi, J&K, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Sikkim have not provided training to accounts staff, information has not been provided in this regard by 6 UTs of Andhra Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep, Manipur and Puducherry.

### 7. Internal Audit

- 7.1 Internal audit is a control that functions by examining and evaluating the adequacy and effectiveness of other controls throughout the SSA implementation. The internal auditor has to report on the adequacy of internal controls, the accuracy and propriety of financial transactions, the extent to which assets are accounted for and safeguarded, and the level of compliance with SSA financial norms and State Government procedures. The internal audit of district and sub-district units selected on a percentage basis should be conducted so as to cover all districts and sub-district units at least once in 3 years and ensure that prescribed accounting system including regular bank reconciliation is strictly followed by all.
- 7.2 MHRD reviews the status of internal audit on a quarterly basis in the review meetings of State Finance Controllers. MHRD has issued instructions on 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2007, 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2007 and 18<sup>th</sup> June 2008 to all States/UTs to strengthen the internal audit mechanism on the basis of various audit reports, IPAI review reports and JRM recommendations.
- 7.3 Currently, internal audit is being conducted in 28 States/UTs. In 1 State of Nagaland internal audit has not yet been started. Information on the internal audit has not been received from 6 States/UTs of Andhra Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep, Manipur and Puducherry.
- 7.4 The defaulting States/UTs have been asked to set up internal audit mechanism and complete the process by 2008-09.

# 8. External Audit - Audit by the Chartered Accountant Firm

- 8.1 The States / UTs should submit the annual accounts of the Society to be prepared immediately after the close of the financial year and after approval by the Executive Committee of the Society. The accounts should be audited annually by a Chartered Accountant firm appointed with the approval of the Executive Committee by April every year for the purpose. The audit of the accounts will cover the State Implementing Society, all District Project Offices and sample BRCs, CRCs, Schools/VECs in order that all are covered in a three year cycle of audits, except that School/VECs receiving more than Rs.1.00 lakh per year be included in the sample. All VECs/School bodies through whom SSA funds are being disbursed, should be audited regularly as per the auditing arrangements prescribed in the acts/rules/regulations under which they have been set-up/constituted by the States/UT concerned.
- 8.2 The CA firm for conducting the audit of SSA be selected from the C&AG/State AG's empanelled list.
- 8.3 The CA firm should complete the audit by 31<sup>st</sup> August every year. The State Society should submit the audit report along with other financial accounts to the MHRD by 31<sup>st</sup> December every year.
- 8.4 The audit reports for 2006-07 in respect of 30 States/UTs have been received.
- 8.5 The audit reports in respect of the remaining 5 States/UTs of Andhra Pradesh, Daman & Diu, Goa, Madhya Pradesh and Manipur are still awaited.
- 8.6 The following States/UTs have not submitted the Audit Report compliance of Chartered Accountant Audit.

2003-04 Assam, Mizoram and J&K

2004-05 Jharkhand, Mizoram and J&K

2005-06 Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Daman & Diu, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, J&K, Lakshadweep, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Uttarakhand and West Bengal

8.7 MHRD has issued instructions on 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2007 to States/UTs to impress upon the State Accountant General (Audit) to carry out audit of SSA accounts in addition to CA's audit and the States/UTs responded favorably.

# 9. Concurrent Financial Review by IPAI

9.1 Concurrent financial review and monitoring of the SSA implementation be carried out by Government of India at periodic intervals in order to ensure that the accounts are kept properly and the funds are utilized for the purpose for which they were sanctioned. Institute of Public Auditors of India (IPAI) with a well defined Terms of Reference have been engaged to undertake the concurrent financial review and monitoring of SSA implementation in the State/UTs on behalf of Government of India.

- 9.2 IPAI have completed financial review of 35 States/UTs by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2008. The reports have been shared with State Project Directors for taking further follow up action. The follow up action in respect of the first 12 States of Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttaranchal and West Bengal have been completed.
- 9.3 Follow up action in respect of the remaining 23 States/UTs is in progress.
- 9.4 The extension of contract of IPAI to carry out the concurrent financial review for the next phase of all the 35 States/UTs is in progress with a modified Terms of Reference.

# 10. Accounting

## 10.1 Strengthening of Accounting system in SSA

- In most of the States/UTs, a very weak accounting system has been reported in (a) the audit reports, concurrent financial review reports and review/monitoring reports of SSA. The main observations on accounting system relate to (a) Books of accounts prescribed not being maintained (b) Cash book not being maintained in double entry system, (c) Bank reconciliation statements not being prepared regularly, (d) Advances released from district to sub-district level units are treated as expenditure, (e) Advance Register not being maintained, (f) Delay in submission of utilization certificates, (g) Inadequate accounts staff, (h) Accounts staff not trained periodically (i) Weak internal audit system and (j) improper accounting at block level. Government of India has taken a very serious view on these types of procedural irregularities in accounting system. The major weak area which emerged from these reports is lack of adequate accounting staff at block level to maintain accounts books which ultimately resulted into irregularities in maintenance of accounts.
- (b) In MHRD's letter dated 17<sup>th</sup> September 2007, all States/UTs have been urged to take suitable remedial measures to strengthen the accounting system in SSA.
- (c) MHRD has also taken a decision to depute consultants from TSG to carry out concurrent financial review of States/UTs periodically. The Consultants will also provide a day's training to the Finance and Accounts staff at State and district level during their visits to the States/UTs. MHRD has issued instructions to the States/UTs to this effect on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2008.

### 10.2 Bank Reconciliation

In order to arrive at the correctness of the monthly closing balances of cash books with bank passbooks/bank statements, it is necessary to prepare a monthly bank reconciliation statement at all levels wherever bank accounts are operative. The status of bank reconciliation is obtained from the States/UTs on a quarterly basis during the review meeting of State Finance Controllers. Most of the States/UTs are carrying out the bank reconciliation on a regular basis. However, the bank reconciliation is not regular in 8 States/UTs of Arunachal Pradesh, Daman & Diu, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland, Puducherry and West Bengal.

#### 10.3 Introduction of Accounting Software

Accounting Software has been introduced in Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. In, Haryana, Jharkhand, Nagaland, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu, accounting, Tally software is in use. Some of the other States are considering the introduction of Accounting Software.

## 11. Measures taken for speedy funds flow

# 11.1 E-banking

- (a) In order to avoid delay in transfer of funds, Government of India's share of funds is being remitted to State Implementing Societies by electronic transfer. In places where branches of accredited bank (Canara Bank), are not available remittance of funds is being made through other nationalized/scheduled bank by Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS).
- (b) MHRD has issued amendment to the Manual to affect e-transfer of funds from State to District and district to sub district level mandatorily based on the availability of facilities.
- (c) Currently most of the major States like, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, J&K, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal etc. are transferring funds through E-banking upto district level. In Assam and Chattisgarh, funds are transferred through E-banking in some districts. 6 States of Andhra Pradesh, J & K, Karnataka, Orissa, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh are releasing funds by electronic transfer upto sub-district level. Other States should also take immediate measures to release funds by E-banking to district level and sub-district level, wherever such facilities are existing.

### 11.2 Web Based Monitoring System

Government of India in Partnership with Canara Bank has introduced a web (a) based financial monitoring system in Andhra Pradesh on a pilot basis by developing a Software, which is further extended to the State of Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and Delhi. Recently a meeting was also held in Guwahati to further extend this system in North Eastern States. Under this system, the Canara Bank provide access to see the cash balances available in the bank accounts at State and district level to the management of SSA working at State and Central level. In other places, where the branches of Canara Bank are not available, Canara Bank will tie up with other nationalized/scheduled Banks for sharing their data to Canara Bank to enable SSA management to ascertain cash balances in the bank accounts other than Canara Bank. The software provide various reports which contain information on funds received from Government of India, State Government, interest accrued and other receipts including releases made to districts and cash balances at the State/district level accounts. The district report will contain information on the funds received from State Implementing Society, interest

accrued and other receipts including cash balances at the district level. This information can be obtained by the designated user at the level of Government of India, Central Govt., State Govt. and district level for any range of period of the year. All States/UTs are therefore requested to implement the web-based monitoring system developed in collaboration with Canara Bank by end of this financial year.

(b) A web-portal in all States/UTs is being developed by Government of India through National Informatics Centre (NIC) to cater the need of collecting information on progress of the programme. The software will collect upward information which generally contains physical and financial progress of the programme on quarterly basis, which is presently being submitted by States/UTs manually through various formats developed. The software is developed and orientation training has been given to NIC officials posted at State level alongwith MIS staff of SSA at State level. These officials will further provide training to the NIC/MIS officials at district level very soon and work as trouble shooter during the operation of the programme. The web portal is proposed to be launched by end of July 2008.

#### 12. Procurement

#### 12.1 Procurement Plan

- Para 108 of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement envisages submission of an annual procurement plan under SSA to EE Bureau, MHRD along with the Annual Work Plan & Budget. Since the outlay approved by the Project Approval Board varies from the proposed outlay, the procurement plan is to be prepared immediately on receipt of the Minutes of the Project Approval Board, approving the Annual Work Plan & Budget.
- (b) MHRD on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2008 has instructed all States/UTs to prepare the procurement plan in the prescribed performa under SSA for the year 2008-09 and put the same on the web-site of States/UTs SSA programme.

## 12.2 Notification of tender invitation through web site

- (a) Para 110.4 (a) of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement envisages advertisement of Invitation of Bids in newspapers under open tender method for goods and works. Para 118.6 of the Manual also provides advertising of Expression of Interest for service contracts in regional and national newspapers.
- (b) In order to have a wide publicity of the tender process, MHRD on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2007 has urged all States/UTs that in future invitation for all open tender for goods and works and seeking Expression of Interest for service contracts be put on website.

# 12.3 Details of major contracts

To facilitate reviews of major procurement items by Government of India or external funding agencies as and when required, MHRD on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2007 has requested all States/UTs to maintain the record of details of major contracts (valuing Rs. 5 lakh and above) awarded at any level of the SSA programme, in the State Project Office, yearwise in the prescribed format for a quick review by Government of India / Development Partner's Procurement Review teams and the programme's auditors.

#### 12.4 Procurement Audit Check List

- (a) The State SSA Missions are conducting Chartered Accounts' audit every year to ensure proper utilization of SSA funds. The audit reports, however, revealed that the audits of procurement processes are not adequately covered in the Chartered Accounts' audit. Chapter IX of the Manual on Financial Management and Procurement envisages detailed procedure on procurement under SSA which should have been followed while carrying out procurements.
- (b) The Ministry has developed a procurement audit checklist to cover key procurement processes in order to assist the Chartered Accountant firms and internal auditors while carrying out procurement audits under SSA and the same was shared with all States/UTs on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2007 with a request to make available the same to the Chartered Accountants undertaking annual audit of accounts and procurement, internal auditors and all finance/procurement personnel in the SSA offices/offices executing SSA activities.

# 12.5 Tendering process – negotiations with L-1

MHRD on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2007 shared with all States/UTs, a copy of Government of India, Central Vigilance Commission, New Delhi Circular No. 4/3/07 dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2007 prescribing the procedure for negotiations with L-1 bidder for strict compliance.

# 13. Release of funds by Government of India and States

An outlay of Rs. 21383.07 crore was approved during 2007-08. While Rs. 11381.53 crore was released by Government of India towards its share, Rs. 5735.12 crore was released by the State/UT Governments during 2007-08.

### 14. Shortfall in State share

While 19 States / UTs have released excess State share to the extent of Rs. 911.79 crore, 16 States/UTs have backlog of State share to the extent of Rs. 236.02 crore as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2008. The backlog in State share mainly relates to Andhra Pradesh (Rs. 5.58 cr.) Arunachal Pradesh (Rs. 19.34 cr.), Chhattisgarh (Rs. 3.39 cr.), J&K (Rs. 57.67 cr.), Jharkhand (Rs. 22.13 cr.), Puducheery (Rs. 1.73 cr.), Punjab (Rs. 19.33 cr.), Rajasthan, (Rs. 98.55 cr), Tamil Nadu (Rs. 2.14 cr.), Tripura (Rs. 2.44 cr.) and West Bengal (Rs. 2.20 cr.).
