PREFACE

The year 1998 marks the completion of 10 years of the National Literacy Mission and its gigantic efforts to eradicate the scourge of illiteracy from the country. The history of adult education in India is replete with the pioneering works of social activists to spread the message of literacy and their efforts to make the non-literates equipped with reading and learning skills. However, in a vast multi-cultural and multi-linguistic country like India, achieving the goal of full literacy needs constant, coordinated and committed efforts. Recognising the need of a time bound approach to the problem of illiteracy, the National Literacy Mission was set up. The campaign approach was adopted as its dominant strategy. The programmes adopted by the Mission were volunteer based, area-specific, time bound and cost-effective. The Mission aimed at not only making the non-literates well versed with the 3 R's but also making them use the literacy skills in their day to day life. It also helped them to acquire awareness about national values such as national integration, secularism, small family norms, protecting the environment etc.

Although these campaigns have been implemented with varying degrees of success, a lot of good efforts have gone into them. It is time to build upon our successes and surmount the weaknesses that we face. For this, obviously, it is very essential to have a systematic Management Information System to assess the strengths and weaknesses of the programme.

The Directorate of Adult Education, Government of India being the National Resource Centre has been entrusted with the task of monitoring literacy campaigns in the country. The key functions of the Monitoring Unit of the Directorate are to collect the progress reports from the State Directorates every month in the prescribed proforma, process them and generate periodic reports for use by all concerned.

The data contained in this annual report presents only the direct results of the campaigns. There is definitely more excitement in the field than these figures would suggest. There are various other spin-offs of these campaigns which are not amenable to such statistical presentation. This report, therefore, is only a partial story of the unfolding saga of the literacy campaigns in the country.

NATIONAL OVERVIEW

INTRODUCTION

The National Literacy Mission (NLM) was launched on 5th May, 1988 as a Technology Mission to impart functional literacy to 100 million non-literate persons in the age-group 15-35 in a time bound manner. During this one decade the mission has made spectacular achievements. The success story of Ernakulam Literacy Campaign was followed by many more districts in different parts of the country. 434 literacy projects were sanctioned covering 442 districts located in 22 States and 4 Union Territories upto March 1998. The campaign approach which was adopted as the dominant strategy under the mission proved itself to be the most appropriate strategy, because apart from achieving 3 R's it had other spin-offs. Thus, the campaigns taken up in most parts of the country today have not merely been campaigns for literacy but also campaigns for family welfare, immunisation, maternal and child health care, conservation of environment, communal harmony, cohesion, national integration etc. Thus there have been several exciting, interesting and positive spin offs beneficial to the individuals and to the community at large.

Monitoring is one of the vital elements in any programme as it will enable us to know the health of the programme from time to time and also take corrective measures as and when necessary. The Directorate of Adult Education is constantly monitoring the progress made by different campaigning districts in the States. The achievements under different campaigns have been uneven and there are variations and trends which are noticeable. Although these campaigns have been implemented with varying degrees of success, a lot of good effort has gone into them. The present report compiled by the DAE on the literacy campaign scenario in the country gives information at one place regarding the status of coverage and achievement in literacy and post-literacy campaigns. The facts and figures given in this report are entirely based on the monthly progress reports received from States/UTs.

2. MONITORING AND EVALUATION SYSTEMS

(a) Monitoring System:

In the early 90's monitoring of literacy programme was quite simple since there were very few campaign districts . Every district implementing literacy campaign was expected to send the progress reports every month in the prescribed proforma directly to the Central Directorate. Gradually the number of campaign districts started increasing and from 1993-94 onwards the coverage of districts increased considerably due to NLM's focus on Hindi-speaking States. This gave rise to several problems and monitoring the campaign districts directly became a formidable task. Eventually, decentralisation of monitoring system became inevitable. This was discussed in one of the national conferences of State Directors of Adult/Mass Education held in October 1996. It was resolved in this Conference that the State Directorate of Adult Education should assume full responsibility for close monitoring of literacy campaigns in each district This resulted into a more simplified and decentralised monitoring system. Following were the steps taken to strengthen the system at district level, State level and at the national level:

i) Revised district level proforma:

The district proforma was reviewed thoroughly to make it more simple and user friendly. A simple two-page district proforma was developed consisting of bear minimum statistical data essential at the national level. The campaign districts are expected to send the progress reports in this new proforma every month to their respective State Directorates of Adult/Mass Education. A copy of the proforma may be seen in the Annexure.

ii) State level proforma:

Simultaneously a new State level proforma was also introduced. The State Directorates will compile and consolidate the progress reports received from

the districts. The compiled data is to be furnished in the new State level proforma to the Central Directorate directly every month along with copies of district proformae. A copy of the State proforma may be seen in the Annexure.

iii) Monthly Monitoring Meetings:

One of the important features of the revised monitoring system is the introduction of monthly monitoring meetings at the State level. Under this system every State Directorates are advised to hold monthly monitoring meetings on a fixed date under the Chairmanship of the State Director to review the status and progress of literacy programmes. These meetings are attended by the Secretaries of ZSS, Director SRC, Directors of SVPs, State/Area Coordinator of BGVS, and representative of a nodal voluntary agency in the State. Besides, a representative from Government of India will also participate in these meetings.

These meetings are held with the following objectives:

- to review the progress made by each district in the literacy, post literacy and CE phase.
- to suggest concrete measures to the districts facing problems specially in the areas like training, drop-outs etc.
- to examine the accuracy of the data contained in the progress reports and remove the errors as far as possible to make it more reliable.
- to provide opportunities to every district for sharing mutual experiences.
- to capture qualitative data wherever possible.

- to sort out problems relating to funding, expenditure, auditing of accounts and other financial matters.

The State Directorates after conducting the monthly monitoring meetings will compile and consolidate the district reports for sending the same to the Central Directorate.

iv) Computerisation of State Directorates:

Another important step taken towards revitalising the State level monitoring system was computerisation of State Directorates. Under the new decentralised monitoring system the State Directorates have been assigned a vital role to play in monitoring campaign districts. This task essentially requires proper computer facilities. Realising the need, the NLM made a special provision and provided additional budget to State Directorates to purchase computer systems. Now most of the State Directorates have installed the computers and the system is being efficiently used for the monitoring of campaign districts.

(b) Evaluation System:

(1) Literacy Phase:

The NLM has adopted stringent measures for the objective evaluation of the Literacy Campaigns and Post Literacy Programmes. A six member expert group under the Chairmanship of Prof. Arun Ghosh (former Member of Planning Commission) was constituted in 1993 to undertake a status-cum-impact evaluation of literacy campaigns. As per the recommendations of the group, the evaluation system of the campaigns has been considerably tightened up in order to make an objective and reliable assessment of literacy and social impact of the campaign in the concerned districts. At present the Literacy

Campaigns are being evaluated in two phases which are known as (1) Concurrent Evaluation; and (2) External Evaluation.

(i) Concurrent Evaluation:

Now all the literacy campaigns are being subjected to concurrent evaluation (process evaluation). The concurrent evaluation is conducted in two stages during the course of implementation of the campaign. The first stage of concurrent evaluation is taken up when 50% or more of the enrolled learners have completed Primer I. The second stage is completed within 3 months after the first stage of evaluation. The concurrent evaluation is carried out by the competent evaluating agencies from outside the concerned districts and these agencies are nominated by the State Directors of Adult Education. The purpose of concurrent evaluation is to analyse the strength, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of the programmes so that mid-course correction is initiated at the appropriate point of time.

(ii) Final External Evaluation:

The external or final evaluation process has been tightened and standardised through a number of regional workshops in which experts from well-known social science research institutes took part. The final evaluation is undertaken when at least 60% of the enrolled learners have completed Primer III or nearing completion of Primer III. This evaluation is carried out by reputed empanelled evaluating agencies from outside the state and empanelled with the National Literacy Mission. On receiving a request from the concerned ZSS through the State Directorate of Adult Education, the NLM suggests a panel of 3 to 5 agencies to the district to enable them to choose one of them for external evaluation of the literacy campaign. The main focus of the evaluation is the learners and the evaluation is done in the random sample method. A minimum sample of 5% or 10,000 of the universe (whichever is

less) is to be selected randomly. Care is taken to avoid sample loss, absenteeism and proxy attendance. The criteria for considering a learner literate is achievement of at least 50% marks in each of the abilities i.e. reading, writing and numeracy and 70% in the aggregate. So far, 211 districts have been subjected to final evaluation of Literacy Campaigns.

During final evaluation, the evaluating agency makes an objective and reliable assessment of the literacy and social impact of the campaign in the campaign districts.

Besides, special impact studies of the campaigns on the social, cultural and economic environment of the areas are also being undertaken by the State Resource Centres and such other organisations under the aegis of the National Literacy Mission.

(2) Post Literacy Phase:

Since a number of districts have entered post literacy phase, guidelines for the mid-term evaluation of PLP have also been evolved through a series of regional and national workshops. The selection of agencies for conducting the evaluation of post literacy programme is the same as that for the literacy campaigns. The agencies are expected to keep in mind the objectives of the PLP while carrying out its evaluation and assessing its impact.

The agencies involved in the task of evaluation and studying the impact of TLC and PLC are oriented from time to time with the latest developments in the field of literacy and objectives of the NLM. The State Directorates of Adult/Mass Education also conduct such orientation workshops for the evaluating agencies.

It is expected that the new approach to evaluate literacy campaigns and post literacy programme will ensure complete transparency and enhance the credibility of the results declared and impact assessments made.

3. COVERAGE OF DISTRICTS (upto March, 1998)

** In Delhi one literacy project covering different areas of all the districts has been sanctioned to the N.C.T. of Delhi. In Orissa, one or two districts are yet to be covered under literacy campaigns.

In West Bengal one district i.e. Calcutta has been covered by the State Government and hence all the districts are covered literacy campaign.

It may be seen from the above table that there are around 577 districts in the country in 26 States and six Union Territories. The National Literacy Mission sanctioned 434 literacy projects (upto March, 1998) covering 442 districts fully or partly (some of the districts in Assam, Madhya Pradesh are being covered partly) in 22 States and 4 UTs. The States which are fully covered are Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. Among the UTs Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Pondicherry have been fully covered so far.

4. SANCTION OF LITERACY/PL PROJECTS YEAR-WISE (up to March 1998)

A table showing the year-wise sanction of literacy/post literacy campaigns from 1988-89 upto March 1998 may be seen below:

It may be seen from the above table that upto 1990 only 3 projects had been sanctioned on experimental basis. The success of these projects gave a lot of confidence and hence the programme was extended further. Upto 1992-93 the focus was on four

Southern States and West Bengal. The results were tremendous in these States. From 1993-94, the NLM's focus was diverted towards the Northern States like Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh and hence there is a steep raise in the number of sanctioned literacy projects sanctioned during this year. The number of literacy projects started decreasing gradually since large number of districts in the country have already been covered and only a few districts are yet to be covered.

5. SANCTION OF LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CE PROJECTS STATE-WISE:

A table showing the number of Literacy, Post Literacy and Continuing Education Projects sanctioned upto March 1998 State/UT-wise is given below:

It may be seen from the above table that out of 434 literacy projects sanctioned (upto March 1998) 211 projects have moved to post literacy phase and 61 projects have entered the continuing education phase.

While most of the districts in Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal have progressed to the post literacy phase, quite a number of districts in Assam, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh are still in the literacy phase since they were sanctioned at a later date compared to States mentioned earlier.

Kerala State is in a very advanced stage where all the 14 districts have entered to continuing education phase. In Andhra Pradesh 16 districts and 9 districts in Tamil Nadu have also gone into the continuing education phase.

Mizoram with a literacy rate of 82.27 as per 1991 Census was relatively in an advanced stage compared to many other States. There the continuing education programme was launched directly in all the three districts.

It may be seen from the above table that the total target was 1263.24 lakh out of which 965.76 lakh learners were enrolled which works out to 76.45%. The number of learners who have completed primer-III was 524.73 lakh which works out to 41.53% against the target.

TARGET:

- Among the States which have reported the target so far, Uttar Pradesh tops the list with 189.15 lakh learners. There were four States with more than one hundred lakhs as their target. They are Uttar Pradesh 189.15 lakh, West Bengal 142.92 lakh, Andhra Pradesh 141.62 lakh and Madhya Pradesh 125.89 lakh.
- There were six States having the target of above 50 lakh and below 100 lakh. The States are: Bihar 98.53 lakh, Rajasthan 91.17 lakh, Tamil Nadu 90.08 lakh, Karnataka 73.45 lakh, Gujarat 69.48 lakh, Maharashtra 64.08 lakh and Orissa 54.93 lakh.
- There was only one State with a target of above 25 lakh and below 50 lakh i.e. Assam with 32.96 lakh.
- The States/UTs with target of above 1 lakh and below 25 lakh were: Kerala 24.17 lakh, Haryana 22.06 lakh, Punjab 19.81 lakh, Himachal Pradesh 7.21 lakh, Delhi 6.59 lakh, Tripura 4.90 lakh, Meghalaya 1.38 lakh, Goa 1.01 lakh and Pondicherry 1.01 lakh.
- The States/UTs with less than one lakh target are Chandigarh 0.53 lakh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli 0.29 lakh and Daman & Diu 0.02 lakh.

ENROLMENT:

- The overall scenario as far as enrolment is concerned appears quite impressive. The highest enrolment among the States was reported from Goa where more than

99% of the targeted learners were enrolled in the programme. In all (including Goa) nine states have reported more than 80% enrolment. They are Tamil Nadu (91.49%), Maharashtra (88.63%), Andhra Pradesh (88.65%), Tripura (87.39%), Rajasthan (84.78%), Himachal Pradesh (81.72%), Karnataka (81.39%), Madhya Pradesh (80.15%)

- The enrolment in eight States was above 50% and below 80%. They are: West Bengal (79.68%), Orissa (77.23%), Kerala (73.73%), Uttar Pradesh (68.67%), Gujarat (65.96%), Bihar (60.41%), Haryana (59.63%) and Assam (53.45%).
- The States where the enrolment was below 50% were Punjab (38.19%), Delhi (36.41%) and Meghalaya (26.29%).
- Among the four Union Territories the enrolment figures of 3 UTs appears quite impressive. They are Pondicherry (89.59%), Daman & Diu (82.85%) and Chandigarh (69.27%). The enrolment reported by Dadra & Nagar Haveli was only 36.13%.

ACHIEVEMENT:

- Nine States have reported more than 50% achievement. They are: Tripura (72.49%), Tamil Nadu (64.09%), Maharashtra (59.41%), Gujarat (59.16%), West Bengal (57.75%), Himachal Pradesh (57.10%), Kerala (55.65%), Karnataka (52.10%), Andhra Pradesh (51.47%).
- Four States have reported achievement of above 25% and below 50%. They are Goa (49.60%), Orissa (38.17%), Madhya Pradesh (33.67%) and Rajasthan (31.39%).
- Seven States have reported less than 25% achievement. They are – Uttar Pradesh (24.45%), Bihar (22.92%), Haryana (14.84%), Punjab (13.89%), Assam (12.01%), Meghalaya (8.42%) and Delhi (6.89%).

- Among the Union Territories Pondicherry reported highest achievement (87.80%) followed by Chandigarh (46.84%), Daman & Diu (23.00%) and Dadra & Nagar Haveli (1.26%).

(b) Post Literacy Phase:

A table showing the target, enrolment and achievement (PL-I completers) State-wise may be seen below:

It may be seen from the above table that the target set so far for coverage of neo-literates in 211 post literacy projects (229 districts) is 424.21 lakh. So far only 164 projects have reported the target set for post literacy phase. The data from remaining post literacy projects is awaited.

301.48 lakh neo-literates have so far been reportedly enrolled in PL phase which works out to 71.06% of the target. The number of neo-literates who have completed PL Book-I is 169.77 lakh which works out to 40.02% of the target.

TARGET:

- West Bengal had the highest target of 78.48 lakh. Excluding West Bengal there were only two States with more than 50 lakh target. They were: Andhra Pradesh 69.51 lakh and Tamil Nadu 58.18 lakh.
- States having a target of above 25 lakh and below 50 lakh were: Karnataka (38.37 lakh), Gujarat (30.40 lakh) and Bihar (25.90 lakh), Orissa (25.32 lakh).
- States with a target of above 10 lakh and below 25 lakh were: Rajasthan (24.86 lakh), Maharashtra (20.78 lakh), Madhya Pradesh (15.01 lakh), Kerala (12.22 lakh), Uttar Pradesh (12.24 lakh).
- States with less than 10 lakh target were: Himachal Pradesh (4.75 lakh), Punjab (4.38 lakh), Assam (1.36 lakh) and Haryana (1.21 lakh).
- Among the Union Territories Pondicherry had a target of 0.89 lakh and Chandigarh had 0.35 lakh.

ENROLMENT:

- The highest enrolment of 94.01% was reported from Tamil Nadu followed by Gujarat (92.50%) and Kerala (90%) (However, the status of Kerala remained static as no reports on PL phase are received after April, 1994).
- States which have reported more than 50% enrolment were – Maharashtra (89.50%), Andhra Pradesh (79.72%), Karnataka (78.49%), Punjab (74.20%),

Haryana (73.55%), Uttar Pradesh (72.30%), Orissa (71.72%), Madhya Pradesh (69.68%), Rajasthan (55.59%) and Himachal Pradesh (50.94%).

- States with above 25% and below 50% enrolment were: West Bengal (49.45%) and Assam (46.32%)
- The enrolment in Bihar was the lowest with 20.57%.
- Among UT's, Pondicherry reported 83.14% and Chandigarh 45.71% enrolment.

ACHIEVEMENT (Neo-literates completing PL Book I):

- Maharashtra tops in achievement during PL phase where 75.12% of the targeted neo-literates have completed PL Book I. Besides, these States Andhra Pradesh was the only state which crossed 50% mark. In Andhra Pradesh 53.05% have completed PL Book I.
- States with an achievement of above 25% and below 50% were: Gujarat (49.44%), Uttar Pradesh (48.85%) (number of PL districts was only 7), Tamil Nadu (46.97%), Assam 38.97%), Karnataka (37.97%), Orissa (33.57%), Madhya Pradesh (33.11%), West Bengal (32.90%), Kerala (32.81%), Himachal Pradesh (30.31%).
- States with below 25% achievement are: Rajasthan (21.56%), Haryana (20.66%), Punjab (16.66%) and Bihar (10.38%).
- Among the UT's, the achievement of Chandigarh was 20% and the data from Pondicherry was not available.

(c) Continuing Education Phase:

NLM designed a scheme of continuing education for neo-literates which was approved by the Government of India and come into existence from 1st January 1996. The main objective of the scheme is to institutionalise continuing education for neo-literates and provide considerable flexibility in designing and implementation of a diverse kind of continuing education programmes suited to the felt needs of the neo-literates.

The Scheme of Continuing Education Programme as visualised by NLM is an attempt to provide systematic, organised and well coordinated mechanisms to mobilise all resources in support of literacy, post literacy and continuing education in the perspective of lifelong education.

A table showing the number of continuing education projects sanctioned so far (State-wise) may be seen below: (Also a detailed list of districts covered in CE phase may be seen in the Annexures)

It may be seen from the above table that the continuing education projects have been launched in 12 States and one Union Territory. So far 61 CE projects have been sanctioned. The whole of Kerala and Mizoram States have been covered. More than half of the districts in Andhra Pradesh have also moved to CE phase. The State of Tamil Nadu also made a considerable progress with 9 districts going in for CE phase.

The total number of Continuing Education Centres and Nodal Centres to be opened by these projects is 32,976 and 4,257 respectively. An amount of Rs.4324.25 lakh has been released to these projects.

7. BREAK UP OF LEARNERS

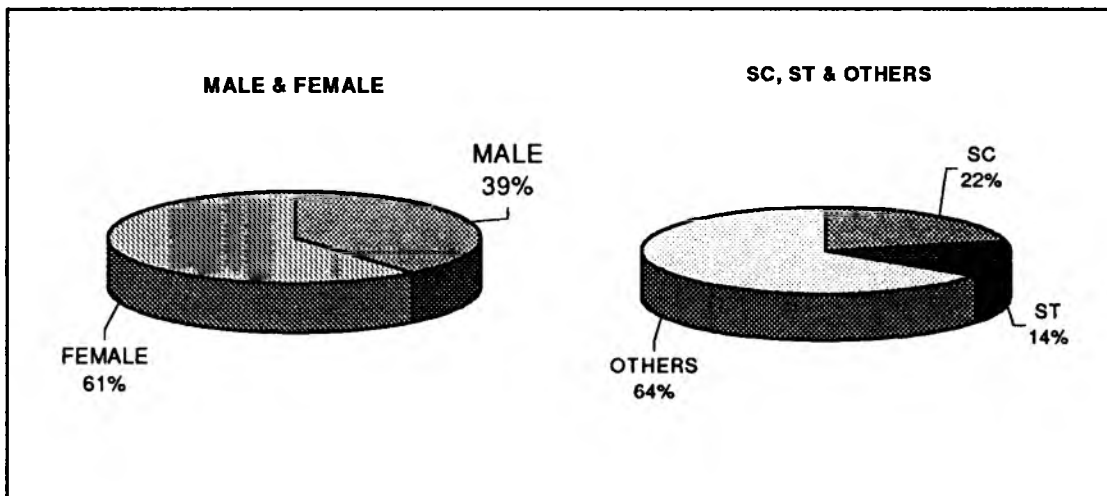
Most of the campaign districts are not furnishing the break-up of learners in terms of male, female, SC and ST. This is a very critical data which is very useful for different purposes, i.e. to know the participation of women, SC and ST learners in the literacy programme and also to take certain vital decisions regarding the kind of measures to be taken to improve the status.

An attempt has been made to estimate these figures based on the data made available by some of the districts. A table showing the target, enrolment and achievement of male, female, SC & ST learners may be seen below:

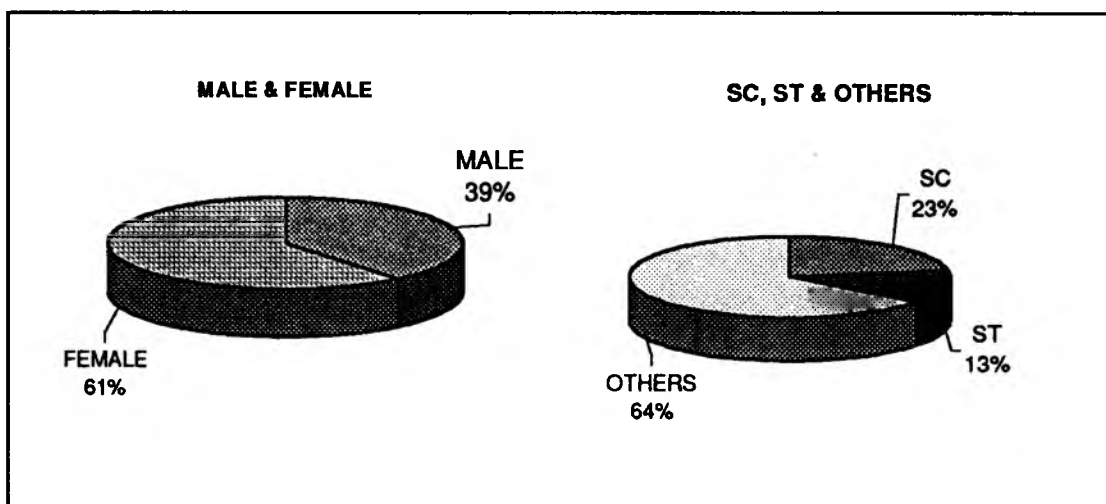
It may be seen from the above table that the number of women learners exceeds the male learners. Out of the total targetted learners, 60.83% learners were females and 39.17% were males. The percentage of SC & ST learners was 21.50% and 13.56% respectively.

TARGET (SURVEYED LEARNERS)



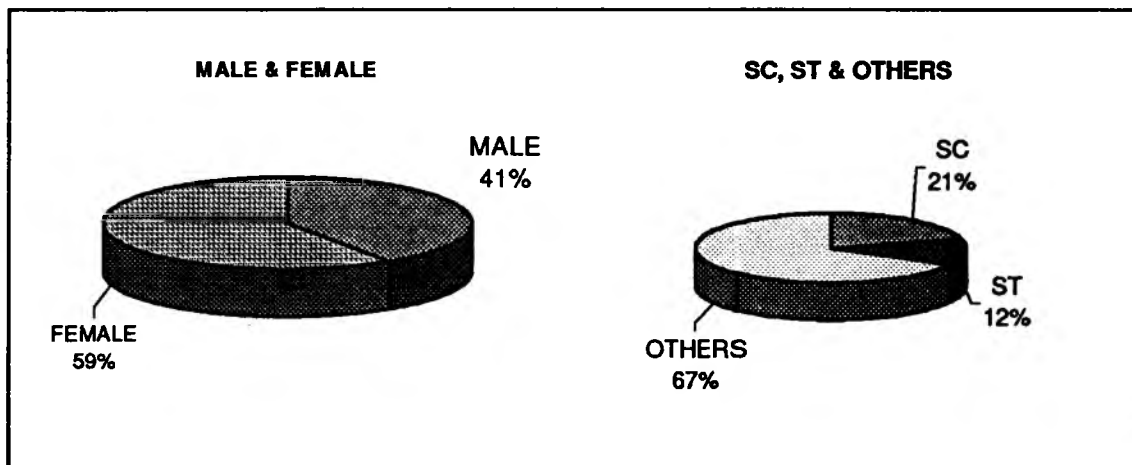
The women participation also had an upward trend in the enrolment. 60.75% of the targetted women learners have enrolled against 39.25% male learners. The status of achievement is also quite favourable since 59.10% of the targetted women learners have completed primer-III as against 40.90% male learners.

ENROLMENT



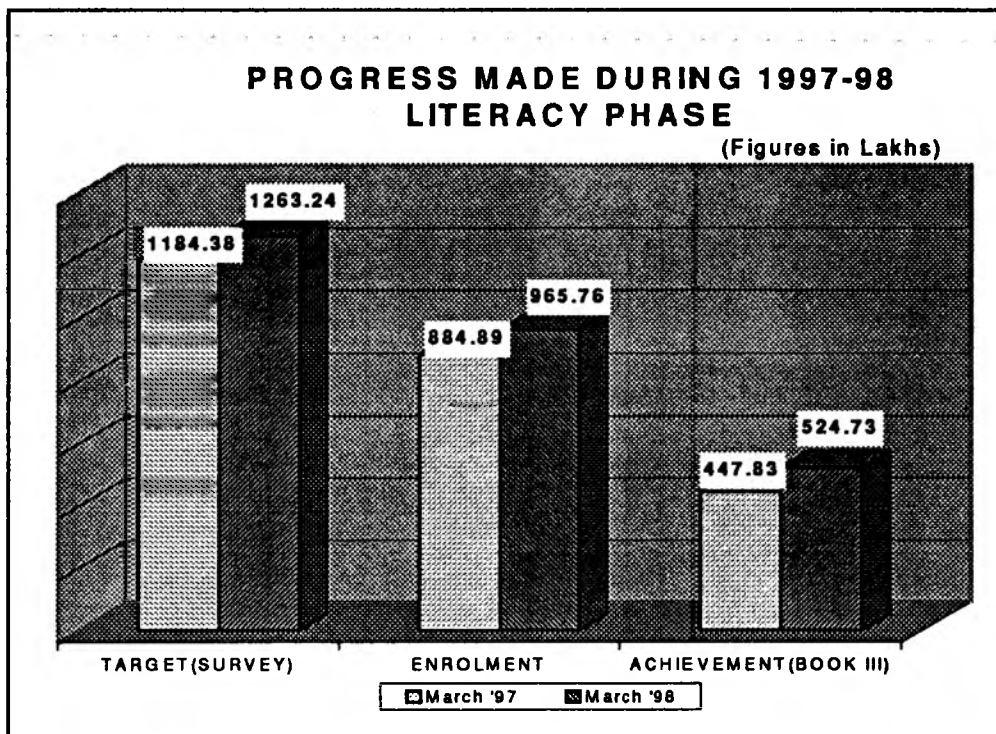

8. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a). Literacy Phase:



It may be seen from the above graph that the target increased from 1184.38 lakh to 1263.24 lakh during 1997-98. The enrolment during this period increased from 884.89 lakh to 965.76 lakh and the achievement (primer-III completers) increased from 447.83 lakh to 524.73 lakh.

TARGET:

- The target under literacy phase has increased from 1184.38 lakh (1997) to 1263.23 lakh (1998). The increase in the target was mainly from four

Hindi-speaking States, where the newly sanctioned projects have started reporting target after completing the door-to-door survey.

- Among the four major States in the Hindi belt, Uttar Pradesh, increased its target by 18.84 lakh (from 170.31 lakh to 189.15 lakh) followed by Rajasthan 13.79 lakh (from 77.38 lakh to 91.17 lakh) and Bihar 12.59 lakh (from 85.94 lakh to 98.53 lakh). However, Madhya Pradesh registered a marginal increase of 0.64 lakh, (from 125.25 lakh to 125.89 lakh).
- Punjab was another State where the target increased considerably during the year by 11.73 lakh (from 8.08 lakh to 19.81 lakh).
- The increase was marginal in Assam, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Orissa and Tamil Nadu.
- The status did not change in the following States – Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Kerala and Meghalaya. The target of Gujarat decreased by 0.50 lakh due to change in the survey figures of Kheda (Phase III) from 64,942 to 14,821. The target of UTs, namely, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu and Pondicherry remained same during the period.

ENROLMENT:

- The enrolment during the year increased from 884.89 lakh (74.71 %) to 965.76 lakh (76.45 %).
- Increase in the enrolment was mainly from the four major Northern States. In Rajasthan it increased by more than 17 lakh (from 60.14 lakh to 77.29 lakh) followed by Madhya Pradesh where the increase was 15.19 lakh (from 85.71 lakh to 100.90 lakh). In Uttar Pradesh it increased by 14.13 lakh (from 115.76

lakh to 129.89 lakh) and in Bihar the raise was 7.13 lakh (from 52.40 lakh to 59.53 lakh).

- Besides, Maharashtra also reported a considerable increase i.e. 9.12 lakh (from 47.68 lakh to 56.80 lakh). The increase was moderate in the following States:

Tamil Nadu 3.77 lakh (from 78.64 lakh to 82.41 lakh), Orissa 3.22 lakh (from 39.20 lakh to 42.42 lakh), Andhra Pradesh 2.79 lakh (from 122.72 lakh to 125.51 lakh), West Bengal 2.42 lakh (from 111.46 lakh to 113.88 lakh), Punjab 2.32 lakh (5.25 lakh to 7.57 lakh), Assam 2.14 lakh (from 15.48 lakh to 17.62 lakh), Karnataka 1.86 lakh (57.93 lakh to 59.79 lakh), Haryana 0.85 lakh (12.30 lakh to 13.15 lakh). In Himachal Pradesh the increase was only 0.01 lakh (from 5.88 lakh to 5.89 lakh) which was negligible.

In Tripura and Meghalaya which were smaller states it increased by 1.26 lakh (from 3.42 lakh to 4.28 lakh) and 0.21 lakh (from 0.15 lakh to 0.36 lakh) respectively.

In the States/Uts of Goa, Gujarat, Kerala, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu and Pondicherry the status was static.

Due to some error in reporting by Delhi the enrolment has come down from 4.81 lakh to 2.40 lakh.

ACHIEVEMENT:

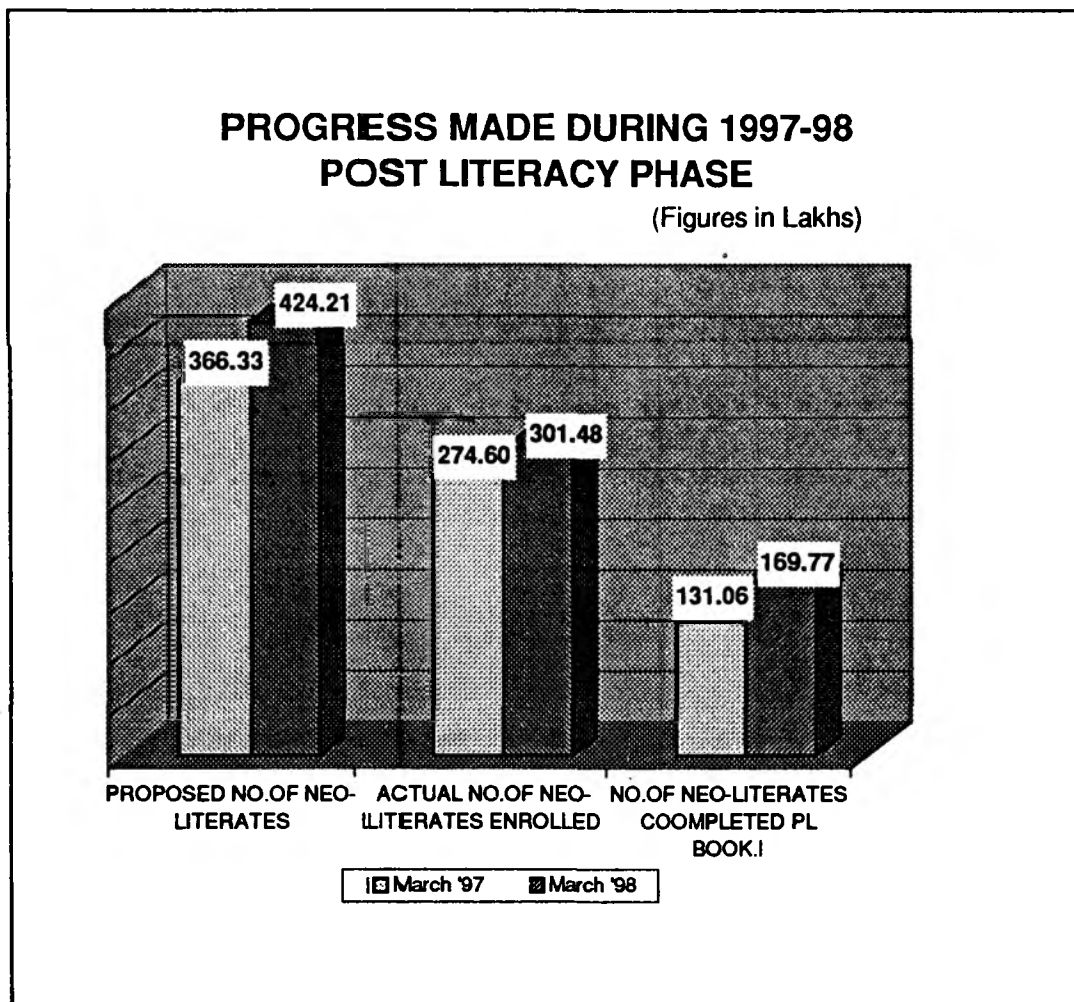
- The overall achievement under the literacy phase has increased from 447.83 lakh (37.81 %) (1997) to 524.73 lakh (41.53 %) (1998).

- A sharp increase in achievement can be noticed in the four Hindi speaking States during the year. In Uttar Pradesh 19.91 lakh learners completed Book III during the year where the total rose from 26.35 lakh to 46.26 lakh. Rajasthan was in second position with an increase of 13.17 lakh (from 15.45 lakh to 28.62 lakh). In Madhya Pradesh the figure increased by 10.07 lakh (from 32.31 lakh to 42.38 lakh) and in Bihar it rose by 8.23 lakh (from 14.36 lakh to 22.59 lakh).
- However, the overall achievement percentage against the target remained at lower level in these states. The earlier achievement in descending order was Madhya Pradesh (33.66%), Rajasthan (31.39%), Uttar Pradesh (27.16%) and Bihar (22.92%).
- Five other States have also improved their status during the year. They are Maharashtra by 6.99 lakh (from 31.08 lakh to 38.07 lakh), Tamil Nadu by 4.66 lakh (from 53.07 lakh to 57.73 lakh), Karnataka by 4.03 lakh (from 34.24 lakh to 38.27 lakh), Andhra Pradesh by 3.64 lakh (from 69.26 lakh to 72.90 lakh), Tripura by 2.62 lakh (from 0.93 lakh to 3.55 lakh) and Orissa by 1.56 lakh (from 19.41 lakh to 20.97 lakh).
- The increase was marginal in Assam 0.88 lakh (from 3.08 lakh to 3.96 lakh), West Bengal 0.58 lakh (from 81.95 lakh to 82.53 lakh), Punjab 0.41 lakh (from 2.34 lakh to 2.75 lakh), Haryana 0.21 lakh (from 3.06 lakh to 3.27 lakh) and Himachal Pradesh 0.14 lakh (from 3.98 lakh to 4.12 lakh).
- The project in Delhi reported a negligible increase of only 0.03 lakh (from 0.42 lakh to 0.45 lakh). The status of Gujarat was little different. Since there was an error in the data reported from this State the achievement declined by 0.35 lakh (from 41.45 lakh to 41.10 lakh). Meghalaya and Dadra & Nagar Haveli which reported nil achievement in 1997 have made progress and have reported achievement of 0.12 lakh and 0.004 lakh respectively.

- There was no change in the status of Kerala and in the UT's of Pondicherry, Daman & Diu.

(a) Post Literacy Phase:

A graph showing the increase in the target, enrolment and achievement(PL-I completers) during 1997-98 may be seen below:



It may be seen from the above graph that the target of neo-literates increased from 366.33 lakh to 424.21 lakh. The enrolment increased from 274.60 lakh to 301.48 lakh. The increase in the achievement was from 131.06 lakh to 169.77 lakh.

TARGET:

- The target increased considerably in six states. They are Bihar by 14.66 lakh (from 11.24 lakh to 25.90 lakh), Rajasthan by 10.27 lakh (from 14.59 lakh to 24.86 lakh), West Bengal by 7.80 lakh (from 70.68 lakh to 78.48 lakh), Tamil Nadu by 7.23 lakh (from 50.95 lakh to 58.18 lakh), Andhra Pradesh 5.38 lakh

(from 64.13 lakh to 69.51 lakh) and Karnataka by 5.13 lakh (from 33.24 lakh to 38.37 lakh).

- The increase was moderate in the States of Maharashtra 2.20 lakh (from 19.08 lakh to 20.78 lakh), Uttar Pradesh 2.03 lakh (from 10.21 lakh to 12.24 lakh), Orissa 2.10 lakh (from 23.22 lakh to 25.32 lakh) and Gujarat 1.82 lakh (from 28.58 lakh to 30.40 lakh), Himachal Pradesh 0.73 lakh (from 4.02 lakh to 4.75 lakh), Madhya Pradesh 0.62 lakh (from 15.63 lakh to 15.01 lakh), Assam 0.14 lakh (from 1.22 lakh to 1.36 lakh) and Punjab 0.11 lakh (from 4.27 lakh to 4.38 lakh).
- The status did not change in the States of Haryana and Kerala and also in the Union Territories of Chandigarh and Pondicherry.

ENROLMENT:

- The enrolment increased considerably in four States. They are Karnataka 9.09 lakh (from 21.03 lakh to 30.12 lakh), Andhra Pradesh 6.61 lakh (from 48.81 lakh to 55.42 lakh), Tamil Nadu 4.88 lakh (from 49.82 lakh to 54.70 lakh), Rajasthan 4.82 lakh (from 9.00 lakh to 13.82 lakh), Orissa 3.47 lakh (from 14.69 lakh to 18.16 lakh) and Gujarat 2.73 lakh (from 25.39 lakh to 28.12 lakh).
- The increase was moderate in UP 1.65 lakh (from 7.20 lakh to 8.85 lakh) and it was marginal in Maharashtra 0.35 lakh (from 18.25 lakh to 18.60 lakh), Himachal Pradesh 0.34 lakh (from 2.08 lakh to 2.42 lakh), Assam 0.26 lakh (from 0.37 lakh to 0.63 lakh), Chandigarh 0.16 lakh (from 0 to 0.16 lakh and Punjab 0.14 lakh (from 3.11 lakh to 3.25 lakh).
- There was no change in the status of Haryana, Kerala and Pondicherry.

- In three States the enrolment decreased due to misreporting earlier. Among these States the enrolment of West Bengal has decreased considerably. It came down from 44.33 lakh to 38.81 lakh which means a decrease of 5.52 lakh. Similarly the enrolment of Madhya Pradesh decreased from 12.34 lakh to 10.46 lakh (by 1.88 lakh) and Bihar from 5.55 lakh to 5.33 lakh (by 0.22 lakh).

ACHIEVEMENT:

- The progress was good in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Gujarat and Orissa. In Tamil Nadu more than 11 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I during the year. The total number of neo-literates completing PL Book-I rose from 16.29 lakh to 27.33 lakh. In Andhra Pradesh it increased from 31.80 lakh to 36.88 lakh (by 5.08 lakh), Karnataka from 10.33 lakh to 14.57 lakh (by 4.24 lakh), Gujarat from 11.11 lakh to 15.03 lakh (by 3.92 lakh) and in Orissa it increased from 5.30 lakh to 8.50 lakh (by 3.20 lakh). Rajasthan also improved its status where the achievement rose from 3.11 lakh to 5.36 lakh.
- Bihar which had zero achievement under post literacy in 1997 made a considerable progress during the year where 2.69 lakh neo-literates have been reported completing PL Book-I.
- The progress was moderate in Assam, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab and West Bengal.
- There was no change in the status of Haryana, Kerala and Pondicherry.

9. OVERALL ACHIEVEMENT OF NLM SINCE INCEPTION :

When the NLM was launched in 1988 the centre based programmes under the scheme of RFLP and SAEP were still in progress in some of the States as they could not stop abruptly. Besides, some of the difficult terrains where campaign mode was not suitable the centre based programme under the RFLP scheme was sanctioned.

This apart, there are agencies like UGC, NYK and others who are also actively participating in this programme on their own.

One has to take all this in account in order to get the overall achievement (total number of persons made literate) upto March '98.

While the achievement under other scheme is about 200.84 lakh, it was 524.73 lakh under the campaign approach. Thus overall achievement made so far works out to 725.57 lakh.

10. SATYAN MAITRA MEMORIAL NATIONAL LITERACY AWARD:

The Satyen Maitra Memorial National Literacy Award was instituted by NLM in the year 1996 to commemorate the sacred memory of late Shri Satyen Maitra, an Educationist and Social Reformer of Bengal Social Service League, Calcutta. The Award was instituted to encourage the campaign districts and to have a healthy competition among themselves. The criteria for selecting the districts for this Award is entirely based on their performance as reported in the external evaluation reports.

The prizes are awarded every year on the International Literacy Day on 8th September. So far following districts have been given this Award in recognition of their spectacular performance:

STATE/UT SUMMARIES

ANDHRA PRADESH

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Andhra Pradesh is the fifth largest State in India having a population of 66.51 million as per 1991 Census, out of which 33.73 million were males and 32.78 million were females. Urban and rural population was 17.89 million and 48.62 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population constitutes 15.92% and 6.31% respectively. There are 23 districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Andhra Pradesh is one of the educationally backward states. Its literacy rates was 44.09% (1991) and ranks 25th in the country. The male literacy rate was 55.13% and that of female was 32.72%. There were three districts with a literacy rate above the national average, namely, Hyderabad (71.52%), West Godavari (53.38%) and Krishna (53.11%). The literacy rate of Mahbubnagar was lowest i.e. 29.58%. There were ten districts with more than 40% literacy rate: Visakhapatnam (45.51%), East Godavari (48.79%), Guntur (45.35%), Prakasam (40.30%), Nellore (47.76%), Chittoor (49.75%), Cuddapah (48.12%), Anantapur (42.18%), Rangareddy (49.07%) and Khammam (40.50%). The literacy rate of nine districts was more than 30% viz., Srikakulam (36.22%), Vizianagram (34.19%), Kurnool (39.97%), Medak (32.41%), Nizamabad (34.18%), Adilabad (32.96%), Karimnagar (37.17%), Warangal (39.30%) and Nalgonda (38.00%).

The female literacy rate was highest in Hyderabad district, i.e. 63.56%. Three districts had more than 40%, namely, West Godavari (46.98%), Krishna (45.54%) and East Godavari (42.26%). Seven districts were having more than 30%, namely, Guntur (35.85%), Nellore (36.99%), Chittoor (36.44%), Vishakapatnam (34.60%), Cuddapah (32.35%), Khammam (30.53%) and Rangareddy (36.91%). Ten districts were in the range of 20 to 30%, namely, Srikakulam (23.52%), Vizianagaram (22.47%), Prakasham (27.06%), Ananthapur (27.61%), Kurnool (26.04%), Nizamabad (21.35%), Adilabad (20.60%), Karimnagar (23.37%), Warangal (26.08%) and Nalgonda (24.92%). Two districts had less than 20%, i.e. Medak (19.25%) and Mahbubnagar (18.03%) was lowest in female literacy.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the 23 districts of Andhra Pradesh were sanctioned literacy projects. The current status of the campaigns is as follows:

TARGET

The total number of learners identified in the State is 141.62 lakh. Two literacy projects i.e. Medak and Mahabubnagar Ph.II had proposed the highest target of 8.43 lakh and 8.21 lakh learners respectively. Five districts had more than 7 lakh target i.e. East Godavari (7.24 lakh), Karimnagar (7.09 lakh), Nalgonda (7.82 lakh), Warangal (7.01 lakh) and West Godavari (7.31 lakh). Six districts were with 6 lakh and above i.e. Adilabad, Amantapur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, Srikakulam and Visakhapatnam. Five districts had more than 5 lakh target i.e. Guntur, Khammam, Kurmool, Prakasam and Vizianagram. Four districts were with more than 4 lakh target i.e. Krishna, Nellore, Nizamabad and Hyderabad. One district i.e. Rangareddy and the Project of BGVS(AP) had a target of more than 1 lakh learners.

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment reported till March '98 was 125.51 lakh learners which works out to 88.52% of the targeted learners. Two districts i.e. Chittoor and Cuddapah have shown 100% enrolment which appears unrealistic. Ten districts i.e. Adilabad, Ananthapur, East Godavari, Karimnagar, Kurnool, Medak, Nizamabad, Rangareddy, Warangal and Hyderabad have reported more than 90% enrolment. Eight districts i.e. Guntur, Krishna, Nalgonda, Nellore, Prakasam, Srikakulam, Vizianagaram and West Godavari have reported more than 80% enrolment. Two districts i.e. Mahabubnagar and Visakhapatnam have reported more than 70% enrolment and project of BGVS(AP) and Khammam district have reported 60% and 50% enrolment respectively.

ACHIEVEMENT

Achievement for Book- III is available from all the literacy projects. So far 72.90 lakh learners have completed Book-III which works out to 51.47% of the targeted learners. Chittoor reported highest achievement of 94.24%. Besides, East Godavari (74.41%), Karimnagar(71.63%), West Godavari (74.94%), Cuddapah (66.47%), Nizamabad (66.04%), Srikakulam (68.28%), Vizianagaram (69.26%) and Hyderabad (63.97%) have done very well. The achievement of Ananthapur (50.71%), Warangal (51.49%) , Guntur(47.93%), Krishna (49.16%), Kurnool (43.10%), Rangareddy (43.78%) and Visakhapatnam (48.86%) was moderate. Four districts i.e. Medak (30.54%), Nalgonda (39.77%), Nellore (37.84%) and Prakasam (34.12%) have reported more than 30% achievement and three districts i.e. Adilabad (24.77%), Khammam (29.70%) and Mahabubnagar (21.09%) and the project of BGVS, AP (20.14%) have reported less than

30% achievement. The literacy project of Mahabubnagar Ph.II reported lowest achievement, i.e. 18.48%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Twenty- two post literacy projects have been sanctioned to Andhra Pradesh. A separate PL project was also sanctioned to BGVS, AP to cover 9 Mandals in 9 districts. The current status is as follows:

TARGET

Twenty-one districts have reported the target under Post Literacy (including BGVS, AP project) which was 69.51 lakh. West Godavari, Chittoor and East Godavari districts had high target of 5.70 lakh and 5.71 lakh and 5.38 lakh neo-literates respectively. Districts with more than 3 lakh target were Cuddapah, Srikakulam, Hyderabad, Khammam, Nalgonda, Warangal, Prakasam and Ananthpur and the districts with more than 2 lakh neo-literates were Nizamabad, Visakhapatnam, Vizianagaram, Krishna, Medak, Kurnool and Guntur. Nellore reported more than one lakh target. BGVS, AP had the lowest target of 0.75 lakh.

ENROLMENT

55.42 lakh neo-literates have been reportedly enrolled in the PL phase which works out to 79.72%. Karimnagar, Chittoor, Nizamabad, Warangal, Vizianagaram and Visakhapatnam districts have reported cent per cent enrolment which may not be true. The enrolment of all districts is fairly good except Khammam where only 26.08% neo-literates were enrolled. In Kurnool post literacy programme was sanctioned in March '94, which has not been launched so far.

ACHIEVEMENT

Andhra Pradesh was one of the first few states to complete both the literacy and post literacy programmes in several districts. 36.88 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL I Book. Two districts i.e. Nizamabad and Cuddapah have shown 100% achievement in PLP. Four districts i.e. Visakhapatna, Chittoor, Srikakulam and Warangal have reported more than 95% achievement. Karimnagar also reported a good achievement of 80%. Three districts i.e. Nellore, West Godavari and East Godavari have reported more than 50% achievement. Three districts i.e. Visakhapatnam Ph.II, Hyderabad and Guntur have reported more than 40% achievement. Four districts i.e. Khammam, Rangareddy, Vizianagaram and Ananthapur have reported more than 20% achievement and two districts i.e. Nalgonda and Medak have reported lower achievement of less than 20%. Three projects i.e. BGVS(AP), Krishna and Prakasam have not yet reported any achievement under PL phase.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

External evaluation has been conducted in seventeen districts of Andhra Pradesh. Achievement of two literacy campaign districts i.e. Karimnagar and Visakhapatnam was 92.30% and 92.27% respectively. Three districts i.e. Chittoor, Srikakulam and West Godavari have reported 87.00%, 82.05% and 81.79% achievement respectively. Achievement of Nizamabad was 78.12% and East Godavari was 61.17%. Nellore and Cuddapah have reported more than 50% achievement i.e. 57.08% and 55.73% respectively. Three districts i.e. Rangareddy, Nalgonda and Krishna have been reported 49.00%, 43.00% and 41.74% achievement respectively. Vizianagaram and Khammam have reported 39.10% and 33.00% achievement respectively. The external evaluation results of Kurnool showed an achievement of 20.00% and two districts i.e. Warangal and Prakasam have reported achievement of 13.00 and 9.24% which is the lowest in the State.

External evaluation is yet to be conducted in six districts in Andhra Pradesh i.e. Adilabad, Ananthapur, Guntur, Mahabubnagar, Medak and Hyderabad. The literacy project of BGVS, AP was also not evaluated.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

16 districts in Andhra Pradesh have been sanctioned Continuing Education Projects. The State has a target of 9583 Continuing Education Centres (CECs) and 1369 Nodal Continuing Education Centres (NCECs) to be opened in 16 districts. As per the latest report available from the State, 6085 CECs have so far been started in the state.

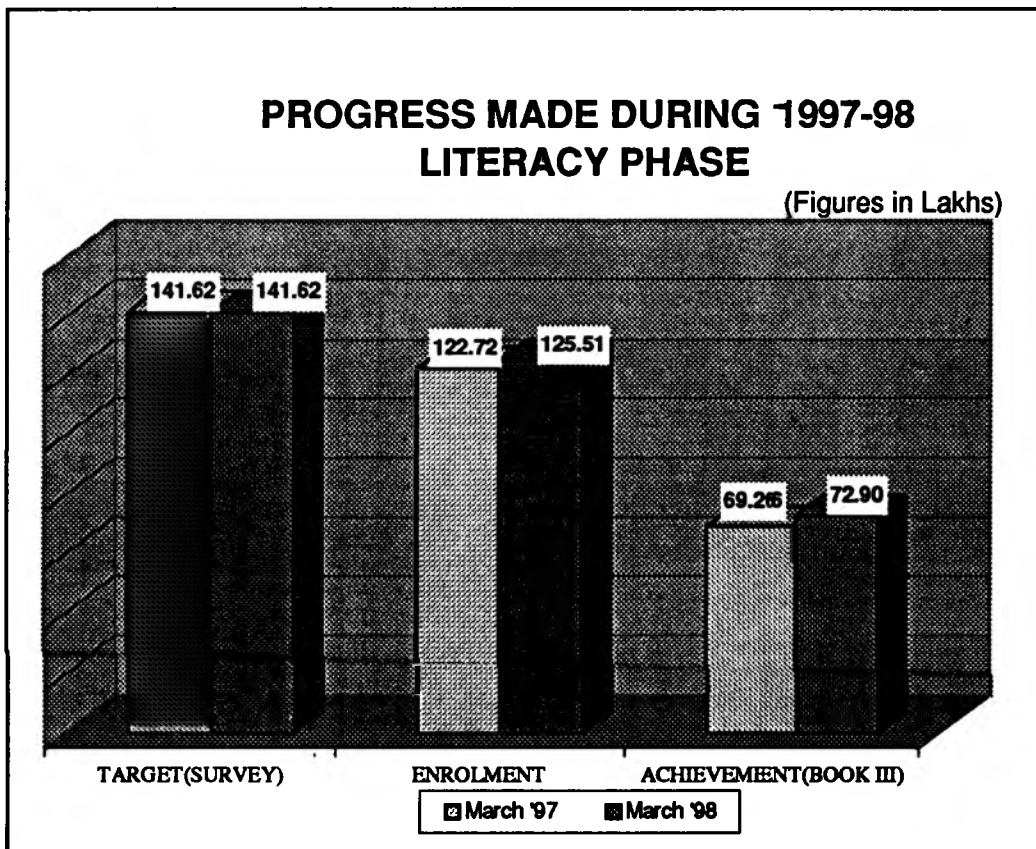
State Government has prepared a well thought-out plan to ensure the community participation and for linking skill based activities in the CECs to make it sustainable and meaningful for the people whom it is meant. The weekly activities for CECs has been launched by the State Government in January, 1998. As per reports, three districts i.e. West Godavari, Visakhapatnam and Nellore are doing very well under Continuing Education Programme.

3. REPORTING STATUS

Reporting Status of all the literacy campaign districts in Andhra Pradesh is fairly good except BGVS(AP).

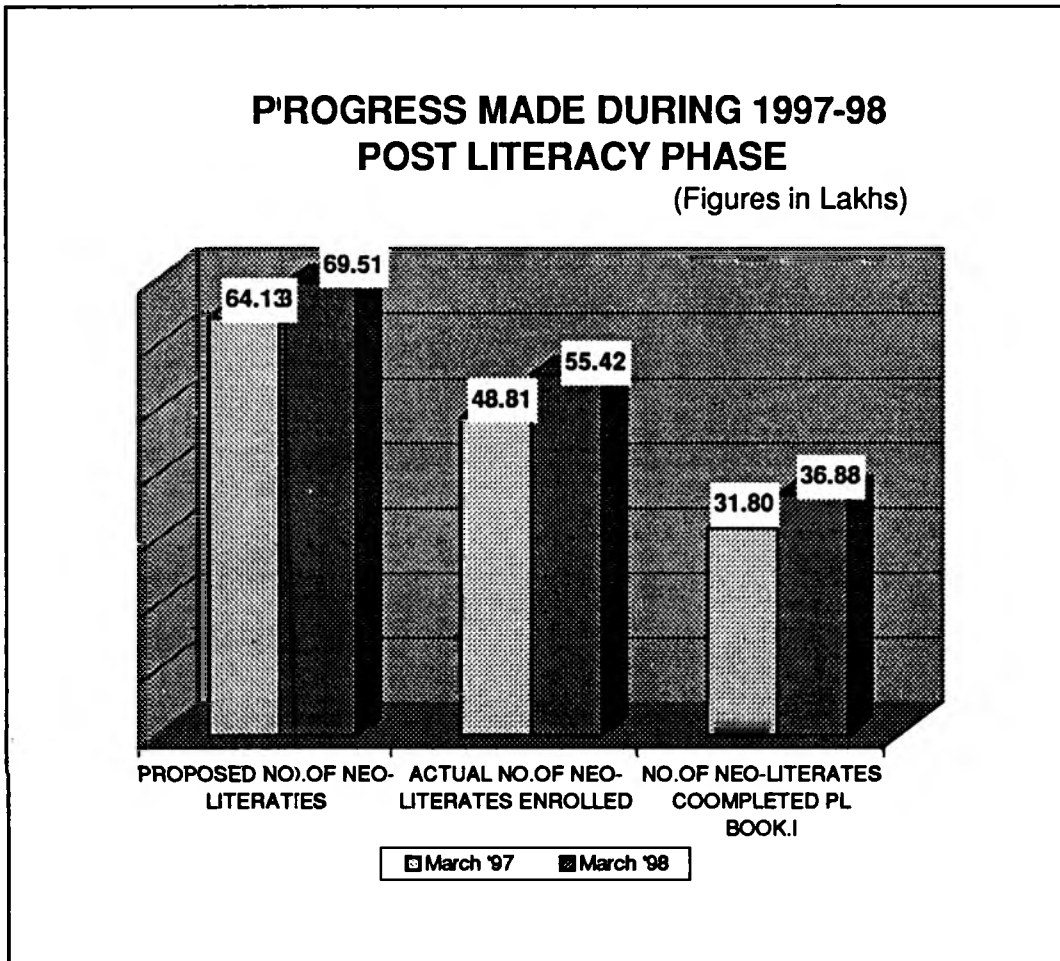
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



It is evident from the above graph that there is no change in the target during 1997-98 since all the districts have already been covered under the programme. However, a marginal increase could be noticed in the enrolment and achievement figures which means the mopping up of dropouts and uncovered learners is in progress. While the enrolment increased from 122.72 lakh to 125.50 lakh, the achievement (number of learners completing Book-III) rose from 69.26 lakh to 72.90 lakh. The achievement against the target is 51.47% which means a lot of efforts have to be put in by the State since nearly half of the targeted learners are yet to become literate.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy Phase changes can be noticed in all the three factors, i.e. target, enrolment and achievement. The target for coverage of neo-literates increased from 64.13 lakh in 1997 to 69.51 lakh in 1998. There is a proportionate increase in the enrollment which has gone up from 48.81 lakh to 55.42 lakh. Similarly the number of neo-literates who have completed PL Book-I rose from 31.80 lakh to 36.88 lakh. It means 53.05% of the targeted neo-literates have completed PL Phase, which means nearly half of the targeted neo-literates are still participating in the PL Phase.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority (SLMA) has been constituted in the State of Andhra Pradesh and an amount of Rs. 25 lakh has already been released to the State Government as seed money.

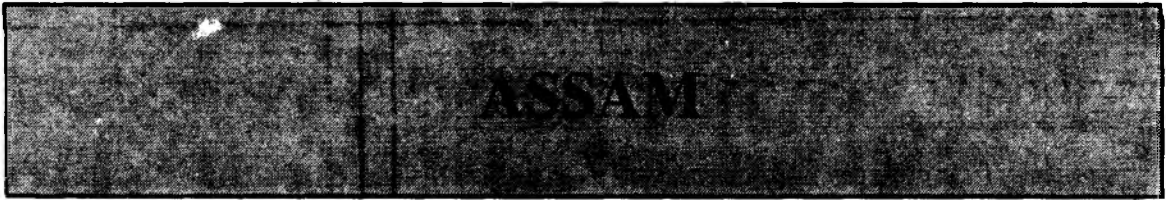

1. PROFILE**(a) POPULATION**

Assam is relatively a smaller State having a population of 22.41 million as per 1991 Census. The male and female population was 11.66 million and 10.75 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 19.92 and 2.49 million respectively. Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population was 1.65 million and 2.87 million respectively. There are 23 districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate in Assam as per 1991 Census was 52.89% which was slightly above the national average of 52.21%. The male and female literacy was 61.87% and 43.03% respectively. Jorhat with 65.51% was in first position followed by Kamrup with 65.04%. Besides, these two districts only Sibsagar with 64.46% had more than 60% literacy. Eleven districts had a literacy rate of more than 50%. Eight districts had more than 40% and one district i.e., Dhubri had 38.31% which was lowest in the State.

Female literacy rate was highest in Jorhat i.e., 56.88%. Other two districts with more than 50% female literacy were Sibsagar 56.14% and Kamrup 55.01%. There were ten districts with female literacy rate of 40%, nine districts had above 30% and only one district had less than 30% female literacy rate i.e., Dhubri 28.75%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

Nineteen districts have been sanctioned literacy projects. The current status of the programme is as follows:

TARGET

The total target reported by the State is 32.96 lakhs. Two districts i.e. Sonitpur and Dhubri have a big target of 4.28 lakhs and 3.06 lakh respectively. The districts of Hailakandi and Sibsagar were having a target of 1.05 lakh and 1.01 lakh respectively. The lowest target of only 0.28 lakh was recorded in NC Hills. Two districts, i.e. Nagaon and Nalbari have not yet reported survey figures.

ENROLMENT

The State reported an enrolment of 17.62 lakh learners in fourteen districts which works out to 53.45% of the total target. The enrolment figures from five districts Barpeta, Kamrup, Lakimpur, Nagaon and Nalbari are still awaited. Also, enrolment of learners against target is very low in Golapara (8.23%), Karimganj (1.49%), Kokrajar (19.68%), N.C. Hills (8.77%), Hailakandi (0.94%) and Golaghat (2.02%) districts.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement for book III is available from only five districts out of nineteen districts. As per the monitoring report of March 1998, 3.96 lakh learners have become literate after completing book III which works out to only 12.01% achievement against the target. There is a slight improvement in achievement figures of 3.96 lakh this year in comparison to last year's achievement of 3.08

lakh. Three districts have done well in literacy phase, namely, Jorhat 80.34%, Tinsukia 75.96% and Dibrugarh 61.11%. ASS Guwahati Project sanctioned in 1992 reported a meagre achievement of 22.34%.

There are many districts in Assam where the progress is very tardy. The names of the districts which have not reported any achievement for book III is given below along with sanction date. Kokrajhar, Sibsagar and Sonitpur (sanctioned in August-October, 1994), Cochar, Kamrup, Nalbari and Hailakandi (sanctioned in 1995), Dhubri, Golapara, NC Hills and Golaghat (sanctioned in 1996) and Barpeta, Nagaon and Lakhimpur (sanctioned in 1997). The achievement of Karimganj sanctioned in March '95 is only 0.85%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Only two projects, i.e. G.V.S. Guwahati project and Jorhat district have been sanctioned post literacy projects in January 1995 and in June 1995 respectively. GVS Guwahati started post literacy in May 1995 and Jorhat in February 1997. The proposed number of neo-literates in G.V.S. Guwahati project is 1.20 lakh and in Jorhat 0.16 lakh (total neo-literates 1.36 lakh). As per the last monitoring report, 0.61 lakh neo-literates have actually been enrolled under PLP in GVS Guwahati and 0.02 lakh neo-literates in Jorhat district. So far 0.53 lakh neo-literates have completed PL book I in GVS Guwahati and Jorhat is yet to report any achievement in PL phase.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

None of the districts have been evaluated externally in Assam. Dibrugarh (61.11%), Jorhat (80.34%) and Tinsukia (75.96%) were ready for external evaluation.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

No Continuing Education Project was sanctioned to the State of Assam.

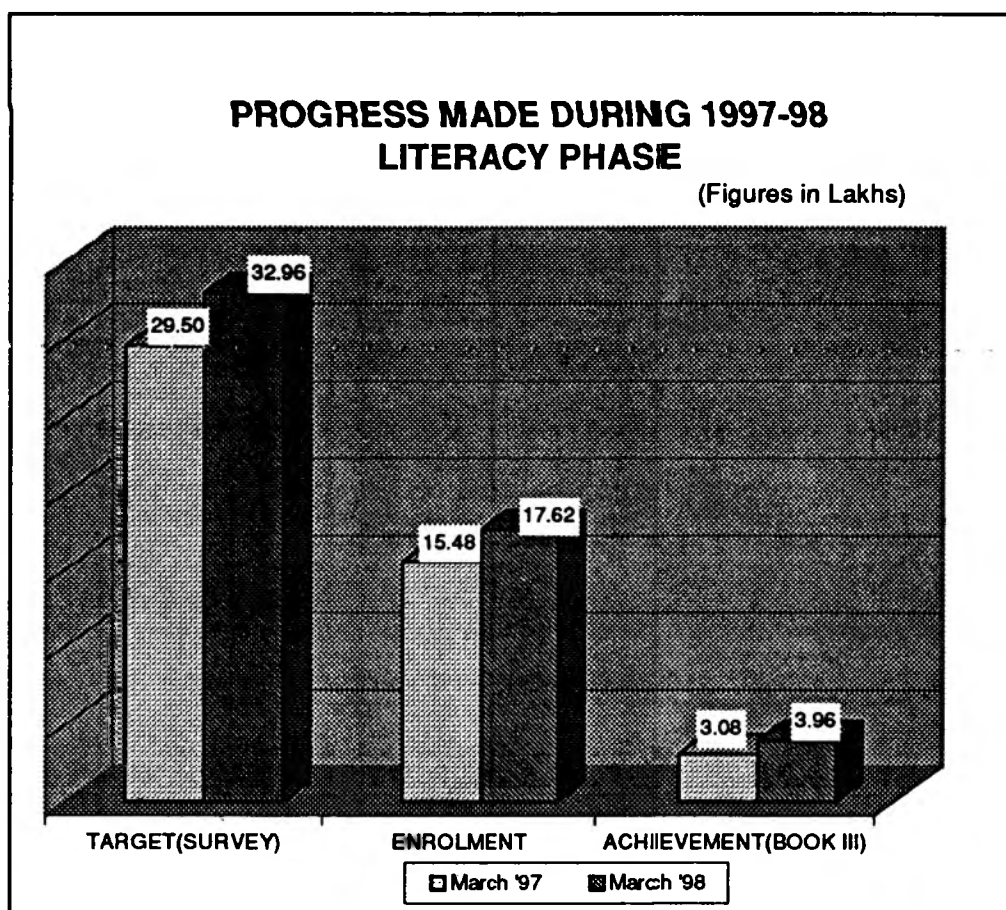
2. REPORTING STATUS

Reporting status of 10 districts i.e. Barpeta, Cachar, Dibrugarh, Karimganj, Kokrajhar, Lakhimpur, Nagaon, Nalbari, Sibsagar and Tinsukia is satisfactory whereas last progress report from five districts i.e. Golapara, Dhubri, N.C. Hills, Sonitpur and Hailakhandi was received in December 1997. Golaghat and Kamrup have not reported anything after June 1997 and September 1997 respectively.

In PL phase last monitoring report from GVS Guwahati was received in December 1997 and from Jorhat in June 1997.

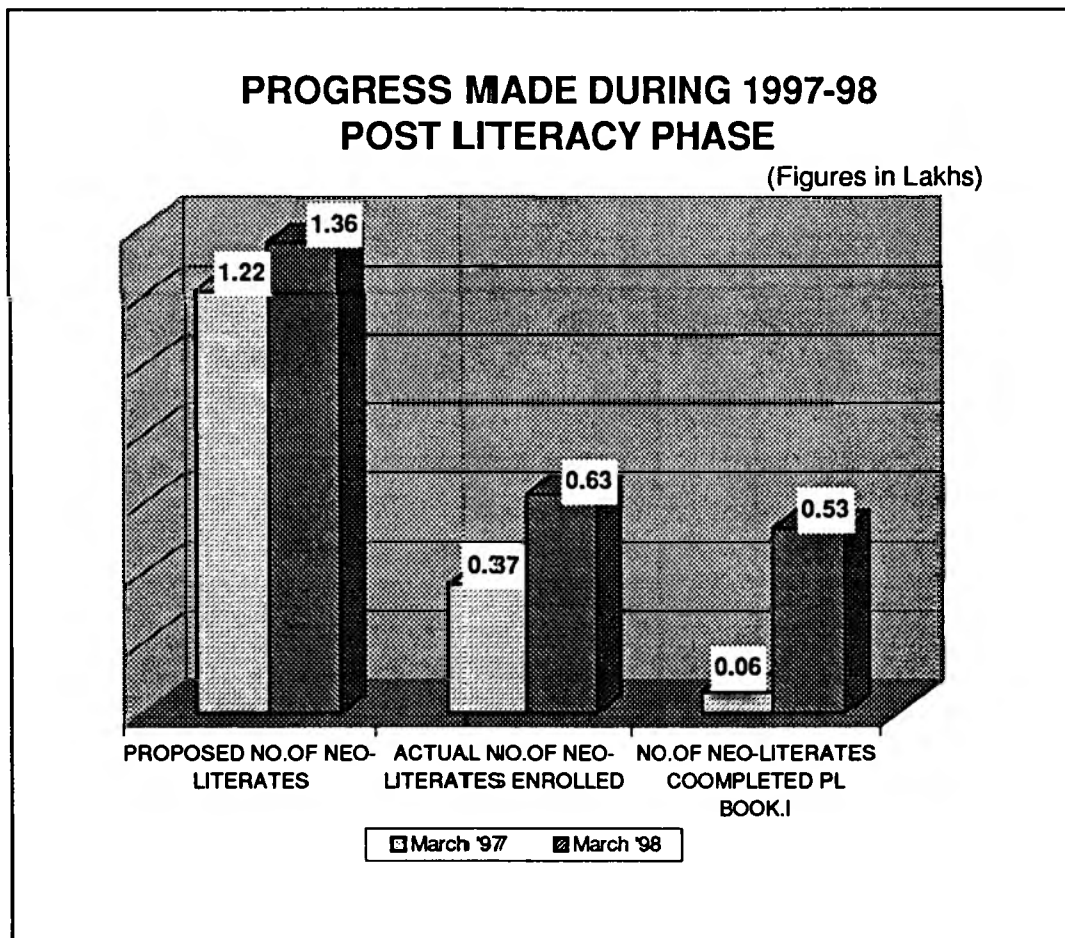
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



In Assam the target increased from 29.50 lakh in 1997 to 32.96 lakh in March 1998 due to the inclusion of the target of two districts, namely, Barpeta and Lakhimpur. The enrolment rose from 15.48 lakh to 17.62 lakh. The enrolment percentage against the target is 53.45% which means nearly half of the targeted learners are yet to be enrolled in the programme. The achievement for Book-III is also not very encouraging. There is a marginal increase from 3.08 lakh to 3.96 lakh during this period. The achievement percentage against target is only 12.01%.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There is a marginal increase in the target of neo-literates to be covered in Assam during 1997-98. The number has increased from 1.22 lakh to 1.36 lakh. However, there is a substantial increase in the enrolment which has increased from 0.37 lakh to 0.63 lakh which means a net increase of 0.26 lakh. The number of neo-literates completing PL Book-I also increased considerably from 0.06 lakh to 0.53 lakh. The net increase is 0.47 lakh during the year. The achievement so far against the target is 38.97% which means more than 60% are still participating in the PL Phase.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority (SLMA) has been constituted in the State of Assam but no grant has so far been released to the State by NLMA for the purpose.

BIHAR

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Bihar is the second largest State in the country in terms of population only next to Uttar Pradesh. As per 1991 Census, the population was 86.37 million out of which 45.20 million were males 41.17 million were females. The rural and urban population was 75.02 million and 11.35 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population constitutes 14.21% and 7.69% respectively. The total number of districts which was 42 at the time of Census has increased to 55 at present.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate in Bihar was far behind the national average. As per 1991 Census, the literacy rate was 38.48%. The male and female literacy rate was 52.49% and 22.89%. There were only 3 districts with a literacy rate of more than of the national average of 52.21%, namely, Purba Singhbhum (59.05%), Patna (56.33%) and Dhanbad (55.47%). The lowest literacy rate was recorded in Kishanganj where only 22.22% persons were literate. Besides, four districts werewith above 50% literacy rate, ten districts were in the range of 40% to 50%, eighteen districts in the range of 30-40% and ten districts in the range of 20-30% literacy rate.

The status of female literacy is very discouraging. The highest female literacy rate was recorded in Purba Singhbhum district with 45.50% and second highest Patna with 41.35%. The lowest female literacy was recorded in Kishanganj with 10.38% and the female literacy rate in rural areas of this district was in single digit i.e. only 7.55%. There were two districts with more than 30% female literacy, Dhanbad (37.88%) and

Ranchi (36.57%), twenty districts were in the range of 20-30% and eighteen districts were in 10-20%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

The literacy campaigns were in progress in 39 districts out of 55. The current status of the campaigns is as follows:

TARGET

Out of 36 reporting districts, the survey figures were available for twenty seven districts. The total target of these districts was 98.53 lakh. The highest number of learners i.e. 9.51 lakh were identified in Muzaffarpur district. Darbhanga district was in second position with 9.14 lakh learners and Rohtas was in third position with 5.92 lakh. Another district with more than 5 lakh learners was Supaul with 5.79 lakh learners. There are five districts with more than 4 lakh learners to be made literate. They are: Begusarai (4.34 lakh), Bhojpur (4.96 lakh), Dhanbad (4.69 lakh), Saharsa (4.23 lakh) and Banka (4.36 lakh). Six districts have a target of more than 3 lakh, namely, Hazaribagh (3.99 lakh), Katihar (3.81 lakh), Mungher (3.03 lakh), Jamui (3.35 lakh), Khagaria (3.28 lakh) and Dumka (3.84 lakh). Seven districts have a target of more than 2 lakh, namely, Godda (2.21 lakh), Madhepura (2.13 lakh), Madhubani (2.55 lakh), Ranchi (2.54 lakh), Saran (Chapara) (2.62 lakh), Jehanabad (2.59 lakh) and Buxar (2.10 lakh). There were only three districts with more than 1 lakh learners, namely, Aurangabad (1.55 lakh), Sahibganj (1.85 lakh) and Siwan (1.75 lakh). The lowest target was in Jamshedpur (urban) which was only 0.70 lakh learners. The literacy projects of Muzaffarpur and Jamshedpur (Urban) which were sanctioned with the assistance of UNICEF have since been closed.

The districts which have not reported the survey figure are: Giridih, Nalanda, Samastipur, Palamu (Daltonganj) (all sanctioned in 1996), Vaishali, Purba Singhbhum, Kaimur and Araria (sanctioned in 1997). Also from Madhubani Ph.II which was sanctioned in 1994 the survey figure is awaited.

ENROLMENT

Out of 36 projects, the enrolment figure was available from twenty two districts only. The total enrolment upto March '98 was 59.53 lakh which works out 60.41%. Three districts, namely, Godda, Dumka and Buxar have reported 100% enrolment which may not be a fact. Five districts have reported more than 90% enrolment. They are: Dhanbad, Hazaribagh, Madhepura, Madhubani and Siwan. Districts with more than 80% enrolment were: Bojpur, Darbanga, Munger, Saharsa and Jehanabad. Five districts, namely, Aurangabad, Begusarai, Sahibganj, Khagadia and Jamshedpur (Urban) have reported more than 60% enrolment. One district i.e. Ranchi reported 54% enrolment. The lowest enrolment was reported from Jamui where only 0.16 lakh learners have been enrolled against a target of 3.35 lakhs which works out to only 4.77%.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement figures for Primer-III are available from only thirteen districts. The total numbr of learners who have completed Primer-III was 22.59 lakhs which works out to 22.92% of the targeted learners. The highest achievement of 81.23% was recorded from Dumka district. The other three districts which have done well are: Madhepura (75.47%), Dhanbad (61.10%) and Hazaribagh (58.69%). The achievement was moderate in Bhojpur (49.20%), Madhubani (47.25%), Munger (43.32%), Begusarai (38.36%), Darbanga (33.75%) and Saharsa (30.59%). Ranchi reported lower achievement of 21.52%. Khagaria and Muzaffarpur are dragging with 8.93% and 8.41% achievement respectively. The literacy campaign in Supaul was sanctioned in 1994 and so far only 20 learners have completed

Primer-III. Names of the districts which have not reported any achievement are given below along with year of sanction: Jamshedpur (1990), Aurangabad, Jamui, Madhepura Ph.II, Madhubani Ph.II (1994), Giridh, Godda, Katihar, Nalanda, Palamu (Daltonganj), Sahebganj, Samastipur, Saran, Banka, Buxar (1996).

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in only one district, namely, Dumka. There is a wide variation between the achievement figure reported in the monitoring report i.e. 81.23% and the evaluation report which is 49%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to 11 districts. The current status is as follows:

TARGET

Out of eleven sanctioned districts, eight districts have reported the target for post literacy which is 25.90 lakh. Darbhanga district with 6 lakhs neo-literates to be covered is in first position at present and Bhojpur with 4.96 lakh was in second position. Two districts, namely, Dhanbad and Begusarai have a target of 3 lakhs each. Three districts, namely, Dumka, Madhubani and Saharsa have a target of more than 2 lakh neo-literates. The lowest target was in Madhepura (Ph.I) where only 1.50 lakh neo-literates are proposed to be covered.

ENROLMENT

Only two districts have reported enrolment figures under the PL phase. They are Dumka (2.61 lakh) and Bhojpur (2.72 lakh) which means a total of 5.33 lakh neo-literates have been enrolled in these two districts.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far the achievement of only two districts are available, i.e. Dumka and Bhojpur. In Dumka out of 2.61 lakh proposed target 2.48 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I and in Bhojpur only 0.21 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I against a target of 4.96 lakhs.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The Continuing Education Project is not sanctioned to any of the districts in Bihar.

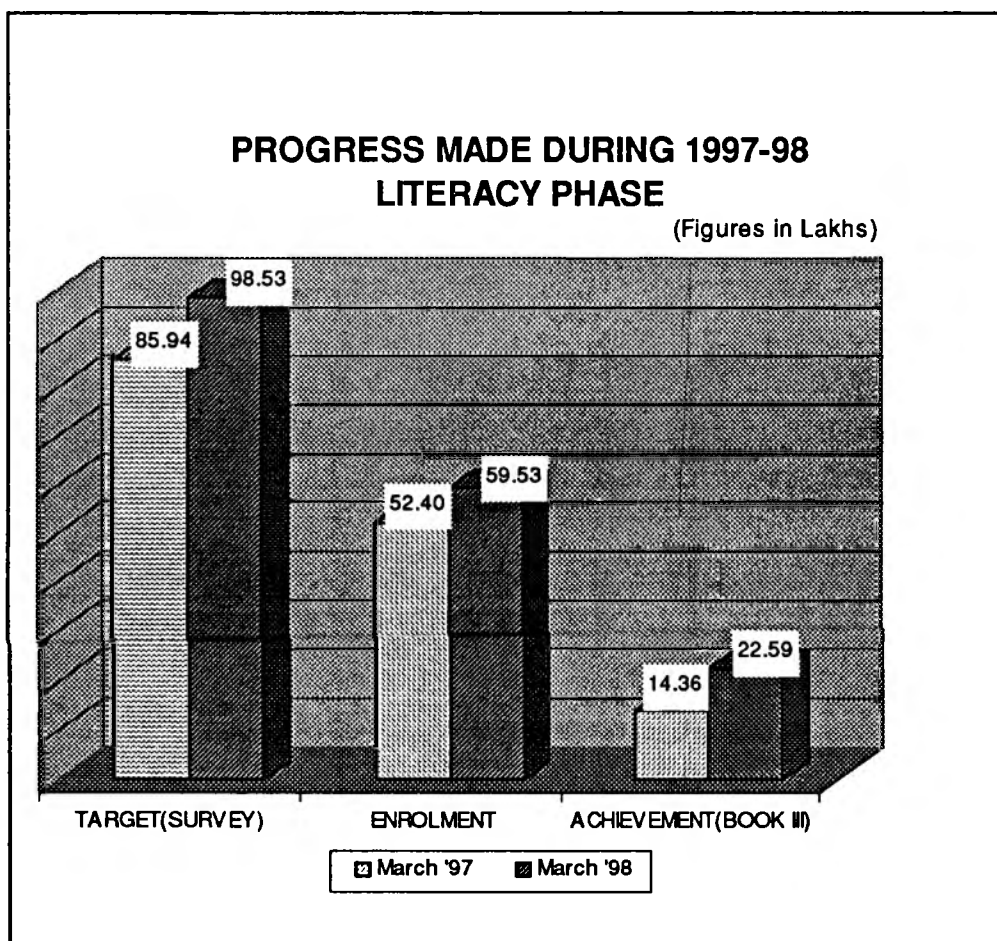
3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status of Bihar State is very poor. The latest report available for thirty one districts was for December 1997. Dhanbad have not sent reports after September 1997. The districts of Bhagalpur, Kishanganj, Chatra, Gopalganj, West Singhbhum, Deogarh and West Champaran were sanctioned literacy campaigns in 1997 and no report has been made available by these districts.

Even in PL phase most of the reports received are for December 1997 and report from Madhubani was for July 1997.

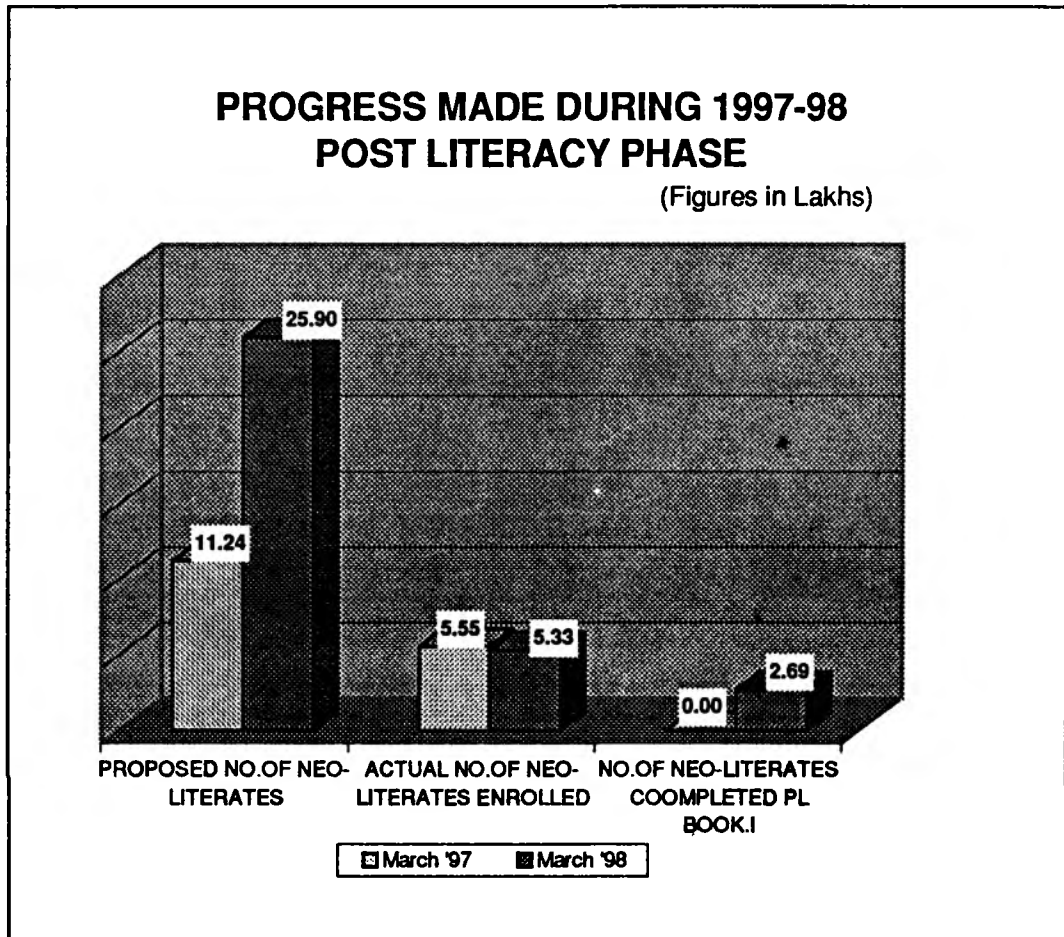
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The total target of Bihar State increased from 85.94 lakh in 1997 to 98.53 lakh in 1998. In fact only twenty seven districts out of thirty nine sanctioned so far have reported the target after completing the door to door survey. Therefore, the total target of the State will further increase when all the 39 districts furnish their targets. The enrolment increased from 52.40 lakh to 59.53 lakh. The enrolment percentage against the target works out to 60.41%. The achievement for Book-III during this period increased from 14.36 lakh to 22.59 lakh. The achievement percentage against target works out to only 22.92%, which means a large number of learners are still in Book-I and II.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



The target for coverage of neo-literates in Post Literacy Phase in Bihar has doubled during the period due to the inclusion of the target of three more districts. In 1997 the target reported was 11.24 lakh (target of 5 PL districts) rose to 25.90 lakh (target of 8 PL districts) in 1998. The figures from four more PL districts are still to come.

The total enrolment for the State (only 2 PL districts) decreased from 5.55 lakh ('97) to 5.33 lakh ('98). This is due to misreporting by one district, i.e. Madhubani. During last year the enrolment reported for the district was 1.64 lakh. However, in the July 1997 report nil enrolment was reported. Only one district i.e., Bhojpur reported a substantial increase in enrolment from 1.30 lakh to 2.72 lakh during the period.

There is a good progress in the achievement in PL phase. While in March '97 none of the neo-literates had completed PL Book-I in March '98 2.69 lakh learners have reportedly completed PL phase. A greater portion of the achievement came from only one district, i.e. Dumka (2.48 lakh).

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in Bihar and a sum of Rs.25 lakhs has already been released towards seed money.

1. PROFILE**(a) POPULATION**

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The Post Literacy Project was sanctioned to Chandigarh in August 1996.

The number of neo-literates proposed to be covered was 0.35 lakh.

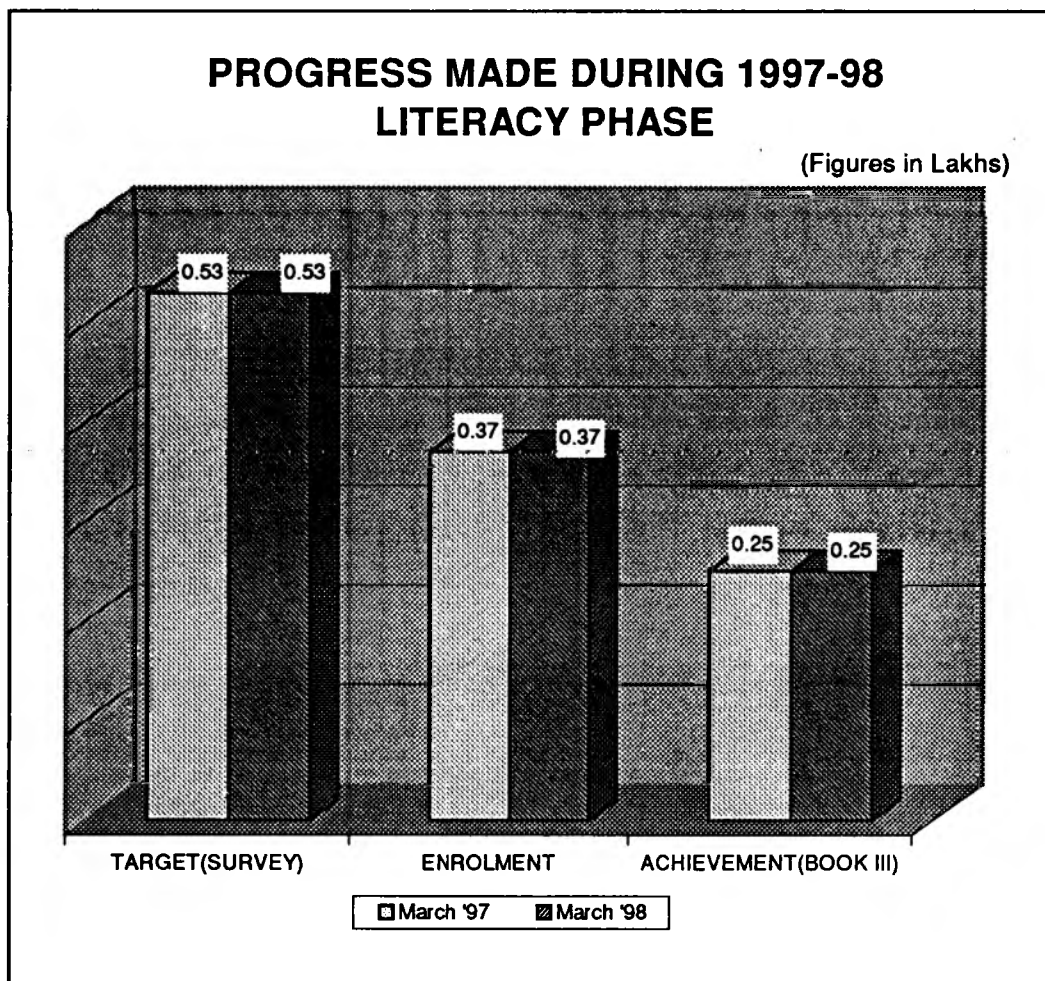

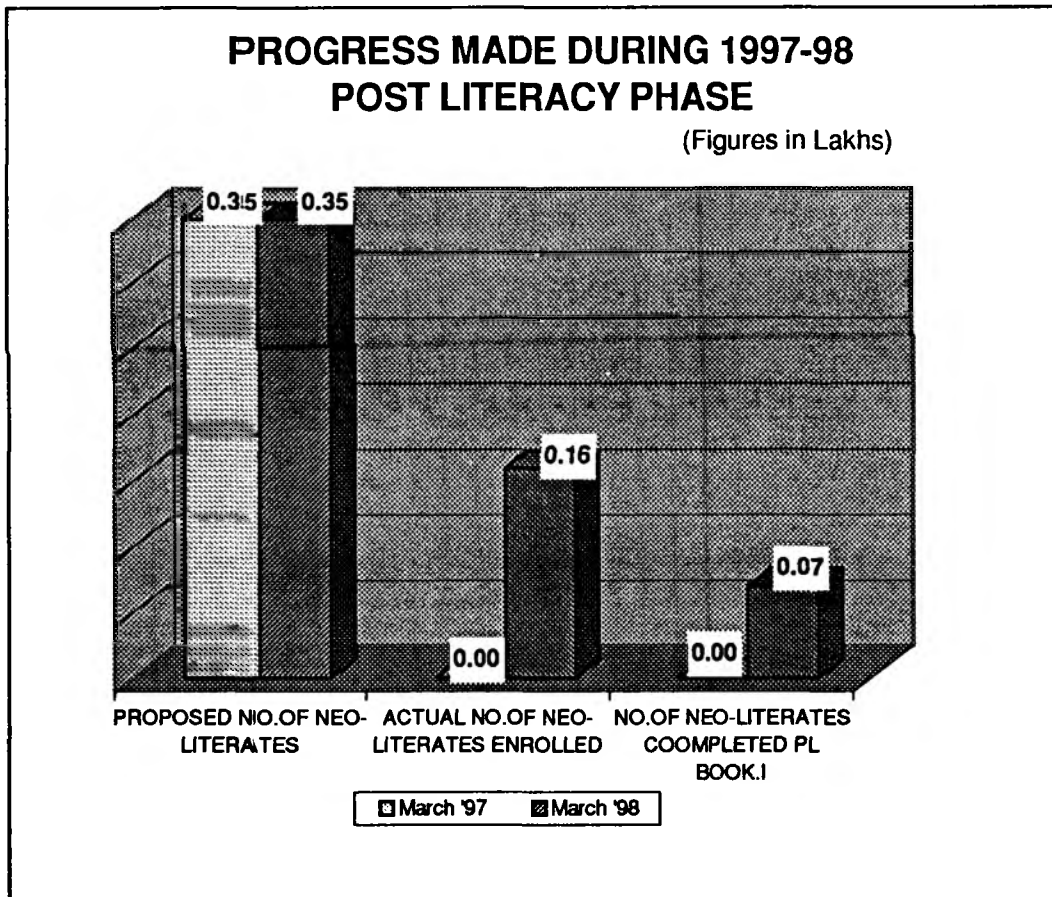
3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

DADRA & NAGAR HAVELI

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Dadra & Nagar Haveli is one of the UTs which is small in size. As per 1991 Census its population was 1.39 lakh out of which 0.71 lakh were male and 0.68 lakh were female. The rural and urban population was 1.27 lakh and 0.12 lakh respectively. The scheduled castes population was 0.03 lakh and that of scheduled tribes was 1.09 lakh and in terms of percentage it works out to 1.97% and 78.99%. There is only one district in the Union Territory.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The UT had a literacy rate of 40.71% as per 1991 Census. The male and female literacy rate was 53.56% and 26.98% respectively.

One literacy project was sanctioned to Dadra & Nagar Haveli in July 1994.

TARGET

The target after survey was 0.29 lakh.

ENROLMENT

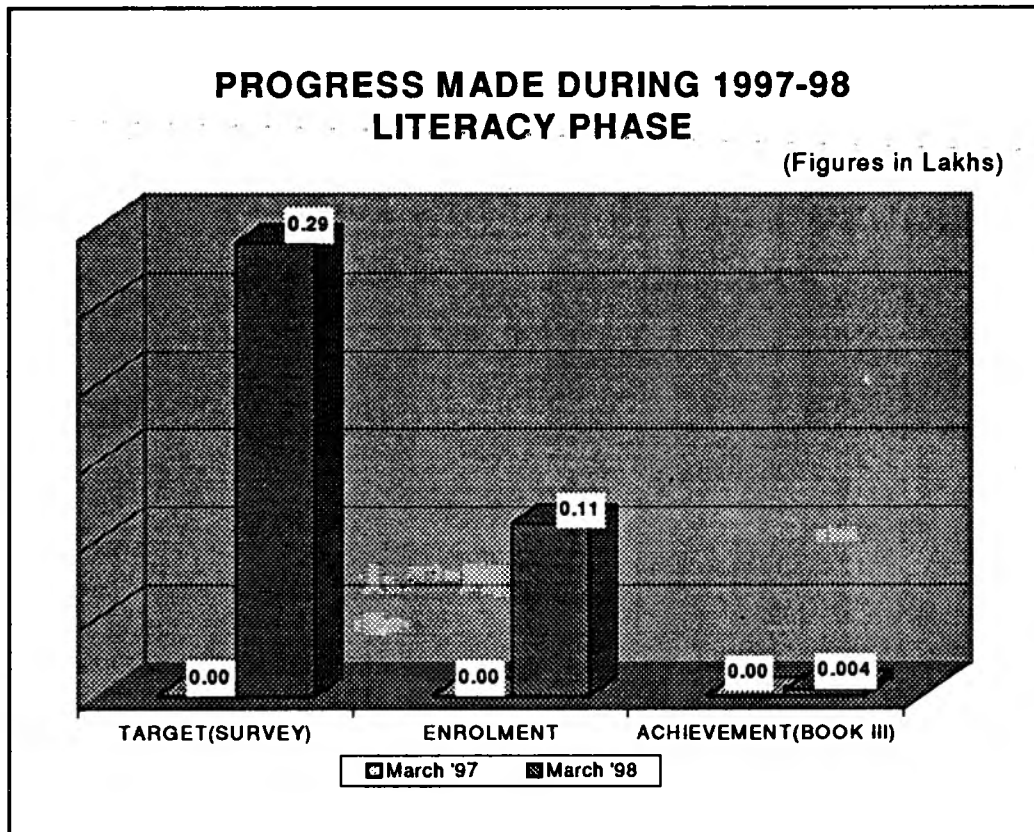
Only 0.11 lakh learners were reportedly enrolled in the campaign which works out to 36.13%..

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement of this project is also not very encouraging. As per the latest report available for March 1997 which was collected by an officer who visited the literacy campaign, only 369 learners have reportedly completed Primer-III which works out to 1.26% achievement. Since then no reports have been received from this UT.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



Although the campaign was sanctioned to Dadra & Nagar Haveli in July '94 the reporting was poor. Until Feb.'97 there was no report from this Union Territory. There is no change in the status of the literacy campaign which remained static during the year and the achievement percentage against target is only 1.26%.

Post Literacy is yet to be sanctioned.

DAMAN & DIU

DAMAN & DIU

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

The Union Territory of Daman & Diu ranks 30th in population. As per 1991 Census its population was 1.02 lakh out of which 0.52 lakh are males and 0.50 lakh are females. The rural and urban population was 0.54 lakh and 0.48 lakh respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population was 0.04 lakh and 0.12 lakh which works out to 3.83% and 11.54% respectively. There are two districts in this Union Territory.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Daman & Diu as per 1991 Census was much higher than the national average, i.e. 71.20%. Literacy rate among male and female was 82.66% and 59.40% respectively. Daman district has the highest literacy rate i.e. 75.34% and Diu was in second position with 64.46%. The female literacy rate in Daman was 64.39% and in Diu it was 51.99%.

1. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

Only one literacy project was sanctioned to Daman in December 1993. Diu is yet to be taken up under literacy campaign. The current status is as follows:

TARGET

Number of learners identified through survey in Daman district is 0.02 lakh.

ENROLMENT

As per the latest report available for January 1996 Daman district reportedly enrolled 1657 learners which works out to 82.85% of the targeted learners.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 460 learners have reportedly been completed Primer-III against a target of 2000 learners which means an achievement of 23%.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

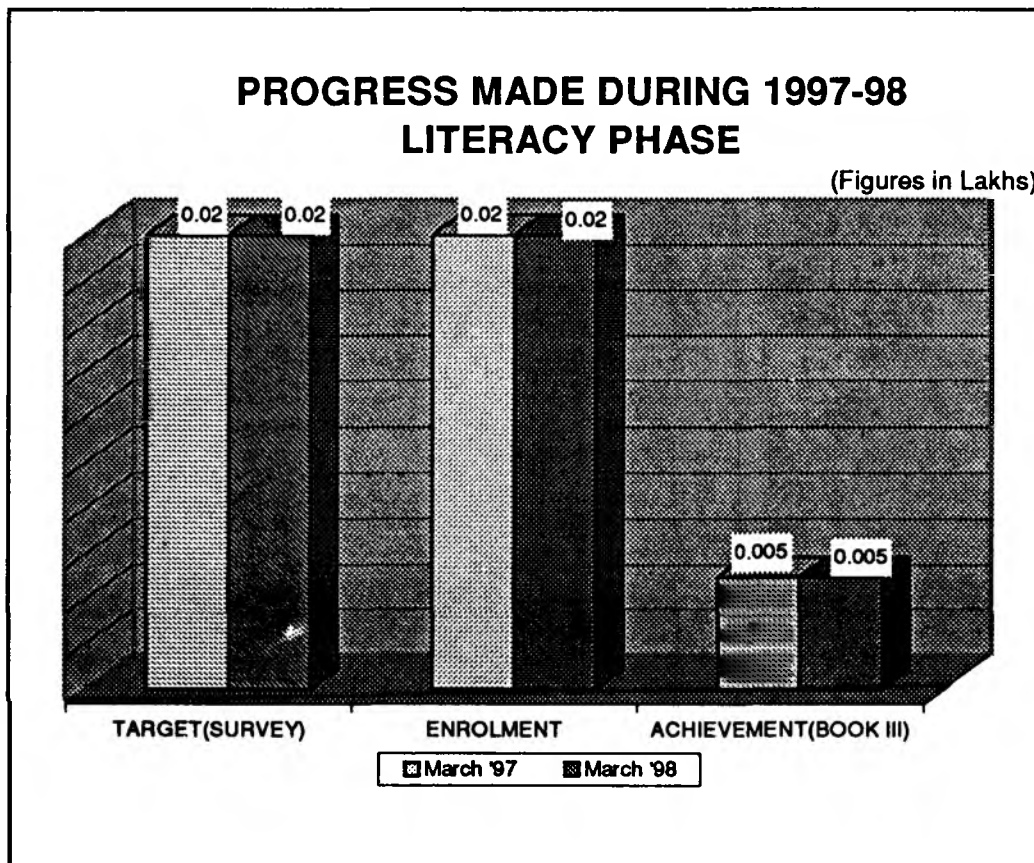
The external evaluation of the literacy project has been completed according to which the achievement is 25%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

One Post Literacy Project was approved for Daman district. However, the current status of the PL project is awaited.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The campaign scenario during the year 1997-98 was static in Daman & Diu. There is no progress in any of the three factors, namely, target, enrolment and achievement. The achievement percentage for Book-III against the target remained at only 23% which means more than 75% of the targeted learners are still to become literate.

DELHI

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Delhi has a population of 9.42 million as per 1991 Census out of which 5.16 million are males and 4.26 million are females. The rural population is 0.95 million and that of urban is 8.47 million. 19.05% of the population belongs to Scheduled Castes. There is no Scheduled Tribes population in Delhi.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO 1991

Delhi is an educationally advanced State having a literacy rate of 75.29%. The literacy rate among males is 82.01% and females is 66.99%. The total number of non-literates (7+ age group) is 19.31 lakh out of which 16.82 lakh non-literates were in urban areas and 2.49 lakh non-literates live in rural areas.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

So far three literacy projects have been sanctioned to Delhi. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

The total target of three projects, namely, (1) DSS, Delhi (2) NDMC Area of New Delhi and (3) NCT Delhi is 6.59 lakh. The target of NCT Delhi which is 6.15 lakh is highest.

ENROLMENT

The effective enrolment reported so far is 2.40 lakh which works out to 36.41%

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 0.45 lakh learners have reportedly completed book III which works out to 6.89% achievement. The Delhi Saksharata Samiti (DSS) was the oldest project sanctioned in November 1991. They reported an achievement of 20.69%. This project was wound up in 1993. The project sanctioned to NDMC area also ended up with a meagre achievement of 17.18% and was wound up in 1995.

The project sanctioned to NCT is an ambitious project sanctioned in March 1995 having a target of 6.15 lakh learners. However, the progress reported so far in terms of enrolment and achievement is dismal. Out of 34.71% enrolled learners only 0.37 lakh learners i.e., 5.98% of target have completed book III.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

None of the three projects sanctioned to Delhi have been evaluated externally. In fact all the three projects are far behind the achievement rate of 60% required for initiating external evaluation.

(b) POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION

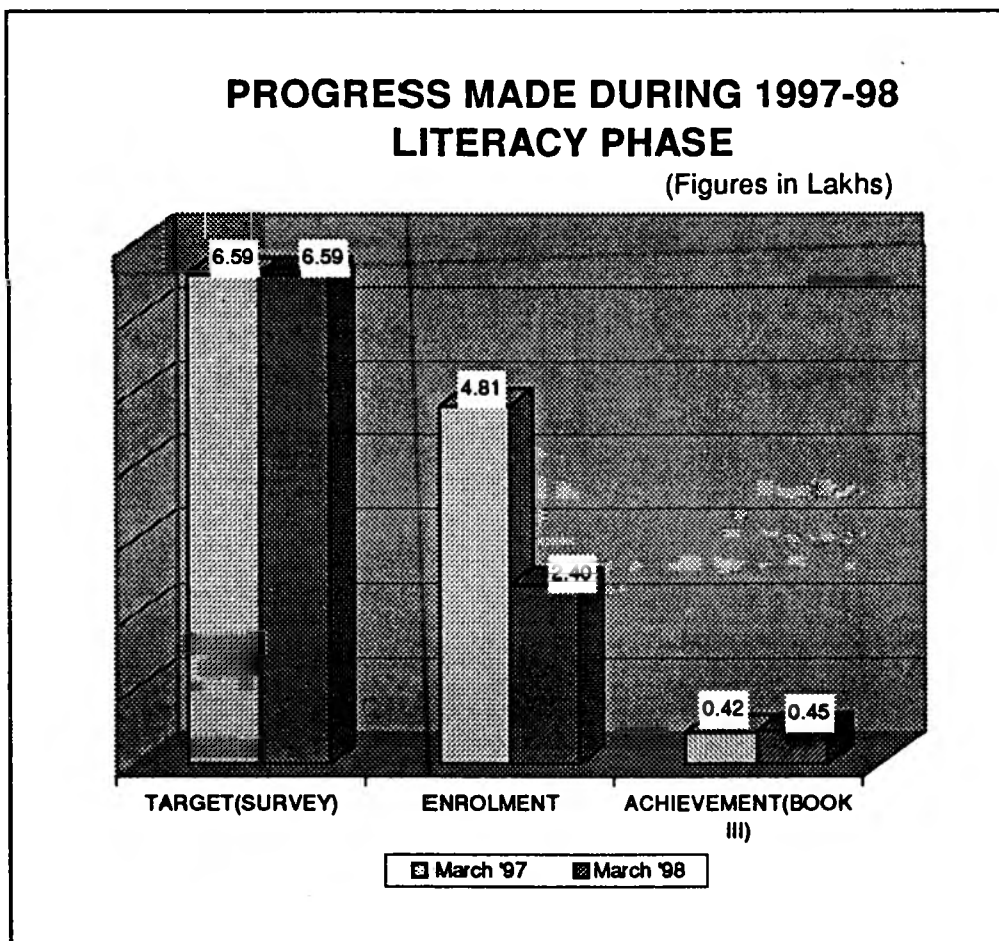
No post literacy or continuing education projects have been sanctioned to Delhi so far.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status is also far from satisfactory. The NCT Delhi project is the only project which is in progress and the latest report available from this project is for December, 1997.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



In Delhi while the target remained same during 1997-98 the enrolment came down from 4.81 lakh to 2.40 lakh. There is confusion specially in NCT of Delhi project due to weak monitoring system. There is a marginal increase in the achievement (Book-III) from 0.42 lakh to 0.45 lakh. However, the achievement percentage against target works out to only 6.82% which means a large portion of the targeted learners are still to become literate.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority (SLMA) has not been constituted so far in Delhi.

1. PROFILE**(a) POPULATION**

Goa is one of the smaller States having a population of 1.17 million, out of which 0.60 million are males and 0.57 million are females. The rural and urban population is 0.69 and 0.48 million respectively. Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population is 0.24 lakh and 0.04 lakh respectively. There are two districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy scenario of Goa State is far better as compared to the national average literacy rate. As per 1991 Census, the literacy rate was 75.51% (males: 83.64% and females 67.09%). The literacy rate of North Goa district was 77.67% (Males: 86.15% and Females 68.86%). In South Goa district males and females literacy was 80.30% and 64.76% respectively. The literacy rate of the district being 72.64%.

**2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING
EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS****(a) LITERACY PROJECTS**

Literacy Project was sanctioned in two districts of Goa during the year 1993. The number of learners identified through survey in this project in age group of 15-50

was 1.01 lakh and the same number of learners were reported to be actually enrolled in literacy centres.

As per the monitoring report of September 1993, 0.50 lakh learners have become literate after completing book III which works out to 49.60% achievement against the target.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

No post literacy project has been submitted by the State Government for launching of the post literacy programme in the State. It is possible that neo-literates have relapsed into illiteracy.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

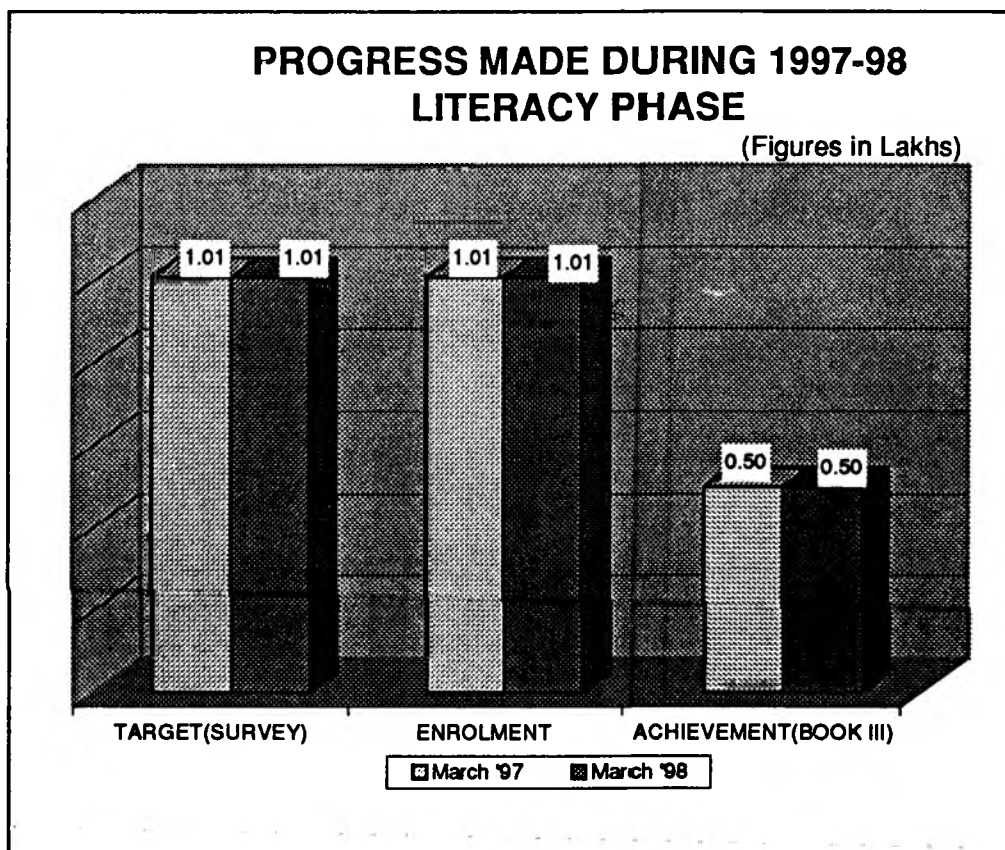
External evaluation of the project has been conducted and 18.20% achievement has been reported as per evaluation report.

GUJARAT

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Gujarat had a population of 41.31 million as per 1991 Census. The male and female population was 21.36 million and 19.95 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 27.06 million and 14.25 million respectively. The scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population constitutes 7.44% and 13.90% respectively. There were nineteen districts in the state.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy scenario of Gujarat is relatively better. As per 1991 Census it was 61.29%. The male and female literacy rate was 73.13% and 48.64% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 87.11% was recorded in Gandhinagar district and the lowest was 39.29% in Banaskanta district. Including Gandhinagar district there were eleven districts with more than 60% literacy rate. They are Rajkot (66.96%), Amreli (60.06%), Junagarh (60.33%), Mehsana (65.14%), Ahmedabad (73.10%), Kheda (65.83%), Vadodra (63.61%), Bharuch (61.92%), Surat (64.36%) and Valsad (64.35%). Five districts had more than 50%, namely, Jamnagar (58.96%), Surendranagar (54.77%), Bhavnagar (57.89%), Kachchh (52.75%), Sabarkantha (59.03%). Two districts had more than 40%, namely, Panchmahals (43.79%) and Dangs (47.56%).

The female literacy rate was also highest in Gandhinagar i.e. 80.51%. In fact this is the only district which has crossed 80% mark in female literacy. The second highest was 62.39% in Ahmedabad. Besides these districts, five districts had more than 50%, namely,

Rajkot (56.66%), Mehsana (51.60%), Vadodara (52.02%), Surat (55.13%) and Valsad (54.79%). Nine districts had more than 40%. They are Jamnagar (47.45%), Surendranagar (40.65%), Bhavnagar (44.33%), Amreli (48.77%), Junagarh (47.83%), Kachchh (40.89%), Sabarkantha (43.08%), Kheda (49.93%) and Bharuch (47.71%). Only one district, namely, Dangs had above 30%. Its literacy rate was 31.31% and two districts had less than 30%. They were: Panchmahals (27.31%) and Banaskantha (22.56%) which was lowest in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the nineteen districts have been sanctioned literacy projects. The status of these projects in terms of target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The State reported a target of 69.48 lakh learners identified through door to door survey. The project of Gujarat Vidhyapith implemented in 100 Talukas had the highest target of 30 lakhs. Besides this project, Panchmahals and Banaskantha had more than 3 lakh learners; Ahmedabad, Bhavnagar, Kheda, Mehsana, Surat, Vadodara districts had more than 2 lakh learners; Bharuch, Jamnagar, Junagarh, Rajkot, Sabarkantha, Surendranagar, Valsad and Bhuj-Kutch districts have more than 1 lakh learners as their target. Districts with less than one lakh target were Amreli, Dangs and Gandhinagar. The target of Gandhinagar was only 0.21 lakh which was lowest in the State. Three projects exclusively for urban areas were also in progress, namely, M.C.Area of Vadodara, M.C. Ahmedabad City, M.C.Surat City.

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment reported from the State was 45.83 lakh which works out to 65.96%. The monitoring system in Gujarat does not appear to be reliable since fifteen districts have reported cent per cent enrolment which may not be true. The enrolment of Gujarat Vidyapith Project was quite low where only 8.85 lakh learners reportedly enrolled against the target of 30 lakh. Low enrolment was also reported from Rajkot district.

ACHIEVEMENT

41.10 lakh learners have reportedly completed Book-III which works out to 59.16%. The achievement figures from Dangs Ph.II and Surat City are awaited. Three districts, namely, Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar and MC Area of Vadodara have reported 100% achievement. Besides these districts, five project have reported more than 90%. They are Kheda (92.14%), Sabarkantha (99.70%), Surendranagar (94.98%), Valsad (96.64%), MC Ahmedabad City (98.15%). Seven projects have reported more than 80%, namely Amreli (88.31%), Bharuch (89.32%), Dangs, (82.26%), Panchmahals (87.04%), Surat (83.82%), Kheda Ph.II (85.41%) and Bhuj-Kutch Ph.II (83.51%). Three districts reported more than 70%, namely, Banaskantha (78.90%), Bhavnagar (76.59%) and Valsad (70.51%). Districts with more than 60% achievement were Jamnagar (64.36%), Junagarh (65.56%), Rajkot (62.24%) and Bhuj-Kutch (64.74%). The project of Gujarat Vidyapeeth which was closed after launching the district-wise campaign in the State had reported an achievement of 29.50%.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation of 20 projects have been completed. The names of the projects along with the achievement reported is given below:

Ahmedabad (83.15%), Amreli (50%), Banaskantha (61%), Bhavnagar (84.80%), Dangs (62%), Gandhinagar (99.71%), Jamnagar (29.64%), Junagarh (36.80%), Kheda (86.20%), Mehsana (17.50% lowest achievement), Panchmahals (23.48%), Rajkot (59.0%), Sabarkantha (60%), Surat (19.30%), Surendranagar (86%), Vadodara (71%), Valsad (24.60%), Gujarat Vidyapeeth (29.50%), Bhuj-Kutch (32.05%), MC Area of Vadodara (24.40%).

In some of the districts there was a wide gap between the achievement reported in the MIS and the achievement reported in external evaluation. The names of the districts along with the achievements given below in brackets:

Amreli (MIS 88.31%, EE 50%); Jamnagar (MIS 64.36%, EE 29.64%), Junagarh (MIS 65.56%, EE 36.80%), Mehsana (MIS 78.85%, EE 17.50%), Panchmahals (MIS 87.04%, EE 23.48%), Surat (MIS 83.82%, EE 19.30%), Valsad (MIS 70.51%, EE 24.60%), Bhuj-Kutch (MIS 64.74%, EE 32.05%), MC Area of Vadodara (MIS 100%, EE 25.40%).

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

All the nineteen districts have been sanctioned Post Literacy Projects. The status of these projects was as follows:

TARGET

30.40 lakh neo-literates is the target reported by the State. Panchmahals had the highest target of 3.44 lakh neo-literates. Six districts, namely, Bhavnagar, Kheda, Ahmedabad (Rural), Surat, Vadodara and Banaskantha had more than 2 lakh neo-literates as the target. Seven districts have more than one lakh target. They were: Valsad, Mehsana, Jamnagar, Sabarkantha, Bhuj-Kutch, Bharuch and Surendranagar. Five districts had less than one lakh target. They were: Gandhinagar, Rajkot, Dangs, Amreli, and MC Area of Vadodara.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment in the post literacy phase was available from all the districts except Valsad. 28.12 lakh neo-literates were reportedly enrolled which works out to 92.50%. The enrolment figures reported by the PL districts does not appear to be reliable since most of them are cent per cent.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 15.03 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I in eleven districts. The achievement figures from 3 districts are awaited.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

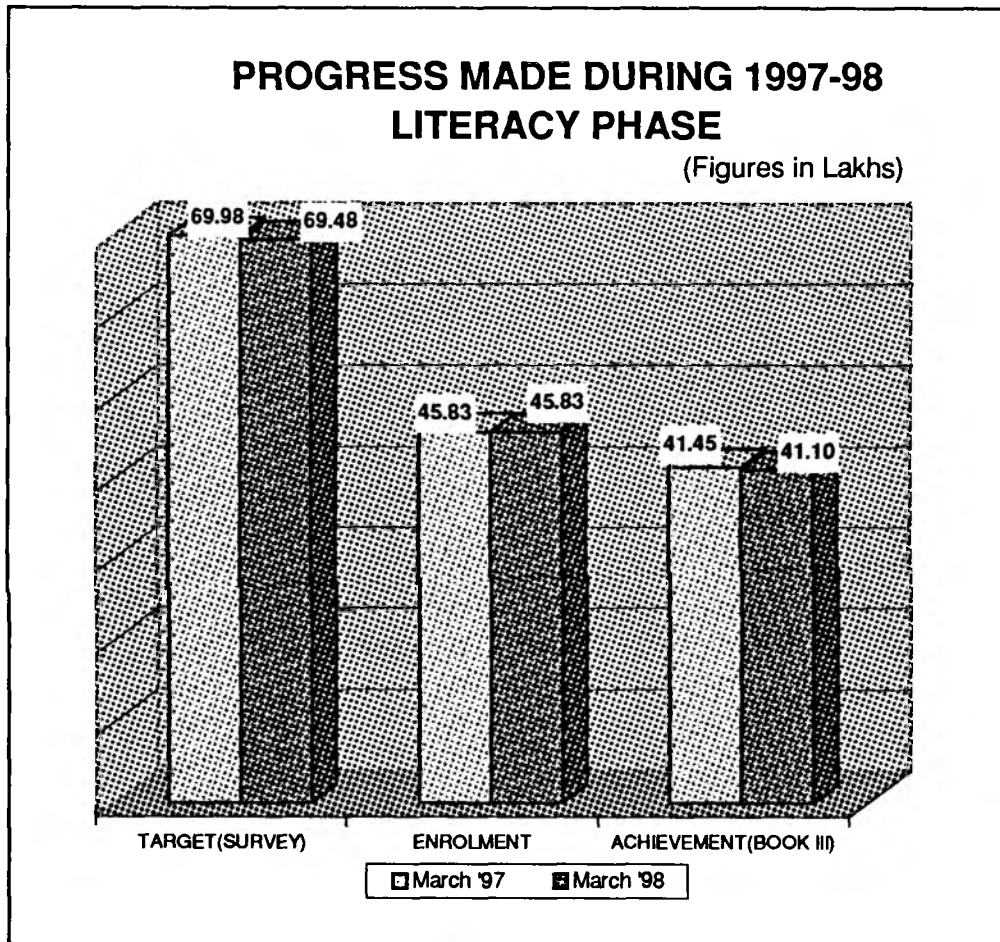
Continuing Education Projects have not been sanctioned to any of the districts in Gujarat.

3. REPORTING STATUS

March '98 report was available from Bhavnagar, Dangs, Gandhinagar, Jamnagar, Kheda, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Surendranagar, Vadodara districts. Ahmedabad and Amreli districts latest reports were for March '97; Bhuj-Kutch and Kheda Ph.II it is for Dec. '96. In Post Literacy phase March '98 reports were available from Gandhinagar, Bhavnagar, Kheda, Mehsana, Valsad, Surendranagar, Jamnagar, Rajkot, Dangs, Vadodara, Bhuj-Kutch, Panchmahals and MC Area of Vadodara. The report from Ahmedabad and Amreli was for March '97, Banaskantha for April '97, Sabarkantha and Surat for June '97 and Bharuch the report was for August '97.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

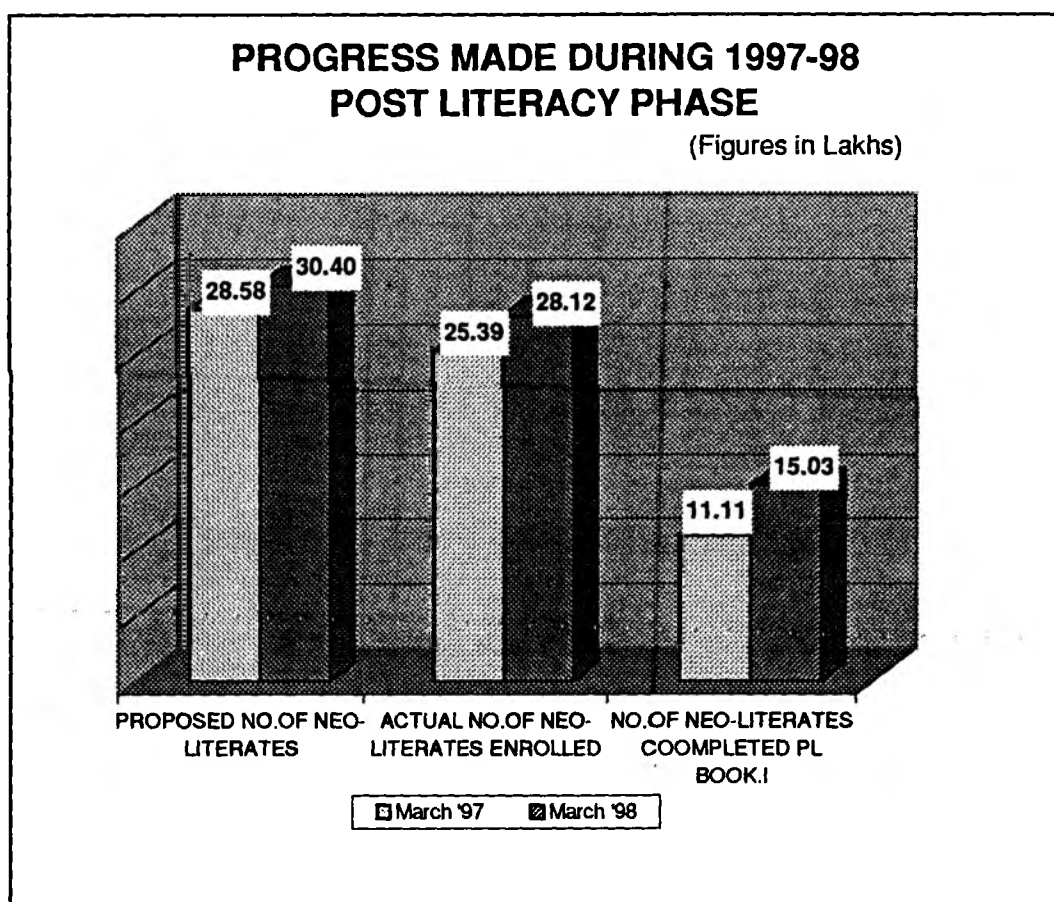
(a) LITERACY PHASE



The scenario in Gujarat State during 1997-98 was static as far as target and enrolment is concerned since there was no change in the enrolment figures. However, in the case of target and achievement it has come down from 69.98 lakh to 69.48 lakh and 41.45 lakh to 41.10 lakh respectively. The target has come down since project of Kheda phase II reduced its target from 0.64 lakh (in March '97) to 0.14 lakh (in March '98) and Banaskantha district which had reported 2.77 lakh as achievement for Book-III in 1997

have made corrections and reported 2.42 lakh as their achievement. Therefore, the overall target and achievement of the State decreased 0.50 lakh and by 0.35 lakh respectively. The achievement percentage against the target also decreased from 59.24% to 59.16%.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There is a marginal increase in the target of neo-literates in Gujarat during 1997-98. The target has increased from 28.58 lakh to 30.40 lakh and enrolment from 25.39 lakh to 28.12 lakh. There is a substantial increase in number of neo-literates who completed PL Book-I from 11.11 lakh to 15.03. The net increase reported is 3.92 lakh

neo-literates. The achievement against target is 49.44% which means more than 50% neo-literates are yet to complete PL Book-I.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted. The seed money has not yet been released to the State.

NICNET

HARYANA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

As per 1991 Census the population of Haryana was 16.46 million and ranks 15th in the country. The male and female break-up was 8.82 million and 7.63 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 12.41 and 4.05 million respectively. The scheduled caste population was 3.25 million which works out to 19.75% of the total population and there were no schedule tribes in the State. At the time of 1991 Census there were sixteen districts in the state which has increased to nineteen.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate was 55.85% as per 1991 Census. The male and female literacy rate was 69.10% and 40.47% respectively. There are 16 districts in the State. The highest literacy rate was recorded in Ambala district i.e. 66.41%. Rewari district was in second position with 64.77% and Sonapat was in third position with 64.06%. Five districts had a literacy rate of more than 60%, 7 districts had the literacy rate between 50-60% and 4 districts were in the range of 40-50%. The lowest literacy rate was recorded in Kaithal district with 42.59%.

Ambala district also stood first in female literacy with 56.62% followed by Yamunanagar 50.07%. In fact there were only two districts with more than 50% female literacy rate in the State. Seven districts had female literacy in the range of 40 – 50% and six districts were in the range of 30 – 40% Kaithal district also recorded lowest female literacy rate i.e. 28.37%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

The literacy campaigns have been sanctioned to sixteen districts of Haryana and three more districts have been carved out of these districts. The status of these campaigns is as follows:

TARGET

The total number of learners identified through the survey in thirteen districts from where the figures are available was 22.06 lakh learners. Hissar district had the highest number of learners i.e. 3.50 lakh. Gurgaon stood second with 2.59 lakh learners. Out of thirteen districts which have reported survey figures only one district had more than 3 lakh learners, three districts had between 2-3 lakh learners, five districts were in the range of 1-2 lakh learners and four districts had less than one lakh learners to be covered under the literacy campaign. Mohindergarh district had lowest number of learners i.e. 0.87 lakh. Three districts, namely, Faridabad, Kaithal and Karnal have not yet reported the survey figures although they have completed more than a year since they were sanctioned. Among these three literacy campaigns, Kaithal is the oldest project sanctioned in December 1995 and it is strange that even the survey figures are not reported as yet.

ENROLMENT

The total number of learners enrolled in the State was 13.15 lakh (13 districts) which works out to 59.63% against target. Two districts, namely, Ambala and Rewari have reported 100% enrolment which may not be true. Some of the other districts which have done very well in enrolment are Yamunanagar, Panipat and Sonapat. The enrolment in Hissar, Jind, Kurukshetra, Rohtak was fairly good and

it was poor in Gurgaon where only 0.71 lakh learners have been enrolled out of 2.59 lakh target. Bhiwani district also reported only 0.96 lakh enrolment against 2.17 lakh targetted learners.

ACHIEVEMENT

Out of sixteen districts where the literacy campaign was in progress, the achievement for Book - III was available from eleven districts only. The total number of learners who have completed Book-III in the State was 3.27 lakh which works out to only 14.84% against the of target. The only district which has done well so far is Yamunanagar which reported 70.10% achievement (as per May 1997 report). Panipat was in second position with 43.40% (December '96 report) and Ambala was in third position with 38.92% achievement (December '96 report). Sonapat was in fourth position with 30.67% (December '97 report). The status of other districts was as follows: Bhiwani 0.50% (Sept.96 report), Rohtak 5.30% (Mar.97 report), Rewari 14.22% and Sirsa 1.94% (all May 97 report), Jind 16.12%, Hissar 9.55% and Kurukshetra 6.39% (all December '97 report).

Some of the districts like Bhiwani, Kurukshetra, Sirsa, Rohtak, Hissar have completed more than 2-3 years since they were sanctioned and the achievement so far is very poor. Mohindergarh district sanctioned in March 1995 is yet to report any achievement.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

So far external evaluation studies have been completed only in two districts, namely, Yamunanagar and Panipat. Yamunanagar reported 49.60% and Panipat had an achievement of 9.20% only.

(c) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

So far four districts have been sanctioned post literacy projects. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

Out of four post literacy projects sanctioned so far only Panipat and Yamunanagar are reporting. The total target of these two districts is 1.21 lakh neo-literates. The other two districts are Panchkula and Jind. Panchkula is a new district carved out of Ambala. The target to be covered in these two districts is 0.65 lakh and 0.96 lakh neo-literates respectively.

ENROLMENT

Out of 1.21 lakh neo-literates to be covered in two districts, namely, Panipat and Yamunanagar from where the reports are available, 0.89 lakh neo-literates have been enrolled so far which works out to 80.90%.

ACHIEVEMENT

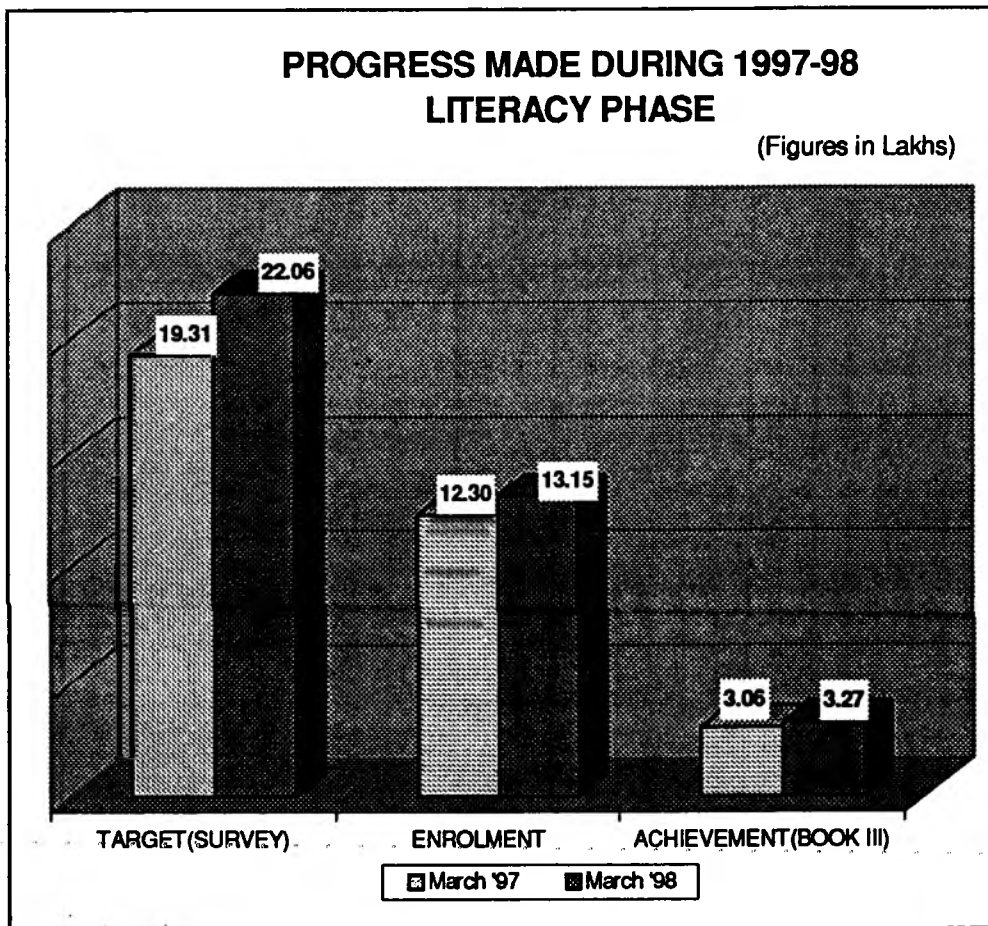
0.25 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I as per the status report available from Yamunanagar (Dec.97). None of the neo-literates have completed PL Book-I in Panipat (March '97).

(a) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Continuing Education Programme has not yet been sanctioned to the state.

1. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE

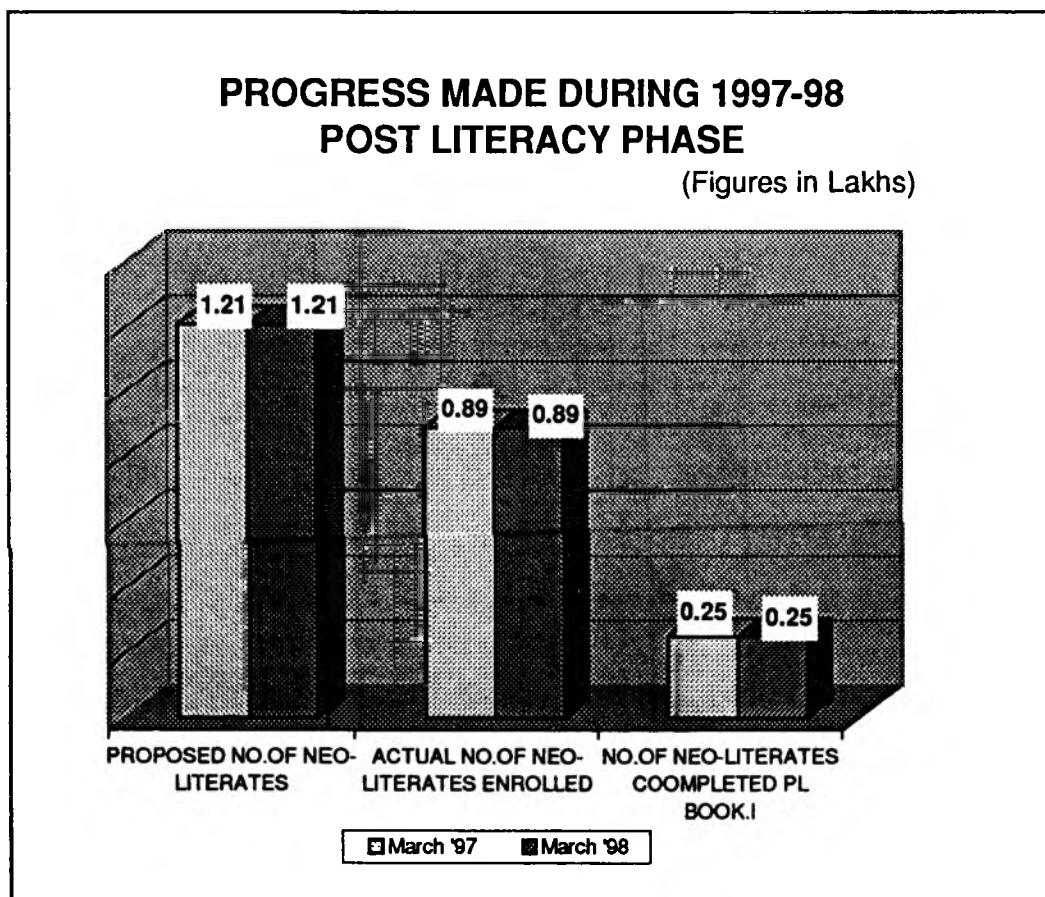


In Haryana the target increased from 19.31 lakh to 22.05 lakh during 1997-98. This is because of the inclusion of the target of Gurgaon. The target is likely to increase further as the actual target of two more districts, i.e. Faridabad and Kaithal had not been reported till March '98.

There is a marginal increase in the enrolment from 12.30 lakh to 13.15 lakh during the period. The enrolment percentage against the target works out to 59.63% which means more than 40% of the targeted learners are still to be enrolled.

The increase in the achievement for Book-III was also very marginal which rose from 3.06 lakh to 3.27 lakh which works out to only 14.82% against target. More than 85% of the learners are still to become literate in the State.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the post literacy phase the scenario remained static. There is no change in any three factors, i.e., target, enrolment and achievement during the period.

4. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority is not yet constituted in Haryana.

HIMACHAL PRADESH

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Himachal Pradesh is one of the smaller States in the country having a population of 5.17 million as per 1991 Census and ranks 17th in the country in population size. The male and female population was 2.62 million and 2.55 million respectively. The break up of rural and urban population was 4.72 million and 0.45 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population constitutes 25.34% and 4.22% respectively. There are twelve districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Himachal Pradesh was 63.86% as per 1991 Census. The male and female literacy rate was 75.36% and 52.13% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 74.88% was recorded in Hamirpur district and the lowest was 44.70% in Chamba district. Besides Hamirpur two more districts had more than 70% literacy rate i.e. Una (70.91%) and Kangra (70.57%). Four districts had 60% and above, namely, Bilaspur (67.17%), Shimla (64.61%), Solan (63.30%) and Mandi (62.74%) and four districts had more than 50%, namely, Kinnaur (58.36%), Lahul & Spiti (56.82%), Kulu (54.82%) and Sirmour (51.62%). Only one district had a literacy rate less than 50% i.e. Chamba (44.70%) which was lowest in the State.

The female literacy rate was also considerably high in some of the districts. The highest was recorded in Hamirpur (65.90%). Two more districts with more than 60% female literacy rate were Kangra (61.39%) and Una (61.01%). Three districts had 50%

and above, namely, Bilaspur (56.55%), Shimla (51.75%) and Solan (50.69%). Two districts had above 40%, namely, Mandi (49.12%) and Kinnaur (42.04%). Three districts had more than 30%, namely, Kulu (38.53%), Lahul & Spiti (38.05%) and Sirmour (38.45%). Chamba district which recorded lowest literacy rate in the State also had lowest female literate rate i.e. 28.57%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the twelve districts in Himachal Pradesh have been sanctioned with literacy projects. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

All the twelve districts have reported the target after survey which is 7.21 lakh. While Mandi had the highest target of 1.52 lakh, Kinnaur district had the lowest target of only 5,468 learners. Another district which had more than 1 lakh learners was Sirmour. All other districts had a target of less than 1 lakh learners.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment is fairly good in this State. Out of 7.21 lakh targeted learners 5.89 lakh have been enrolled in the programme which works out to 81.72%. Three districts have reported 100% enrolment which may not be reliable. They were: Hamirpur, Kinnaur and Una. All other districts have reported more than 80% enrolment except Sirmour where the enrolment was 72%.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement for Primer-III is available from all the twelve districts. So far 4.12 lakh learners have reportedly completed Primer-III against a target of 7.21 lakhs which works out to 57.10% achievement. The highest achievement of 96.01% was recorded in Kinnaur. Hamirpur stood in second position with 94.92%. The achievement percentage of other districts in the descending order is as follows: Bilaspur (83.42%), Una (82.51%), Solan (74.29%), Lahul & Spiti (66.57%), Kangra (63.14%), Sirmour (62.71%), Shimla (62.43%), Chamba (33.59%), Kulu (24.29%).

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in five districts. The names and their achievement are: Bilaspur (38.07%), Hamirpur (89.20%), Kangra (35.91%), Kinnaur (30.30%) and Mandi (47.74%).

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to all the twelve districts. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

The target reported was 4.75 lakh in ten districts. Status of Kangra and Kulu is awaited. Mandi's target of 1.51 lakh was highest and Chamba with 0.99 lakh was in second position. The lowest target of 0.03 lakh was in Lahaul & Spiti.

ENROLMENT

Out of 4.75 lakh targeted neo-literates 2.42 lakh have reportedly been enrolled which works out to 50.94%. Three districts, namely, Hamirpur, Lahaul & Spiti and Solan have reported 100% enrolment. The lowest enrolment of 20% was reported from Kinnaur.

ACHIEVEMENT

1.44 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I. The highest number of neo-literates i.e. 0.59 lakh have completed PL Book-I in Mandi and in Hamirpur it was only 0.06 lakh out of 0.21 lakh. In Bilaspur and Solan 0.28 lakh neo-literates each have completed PL phase.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

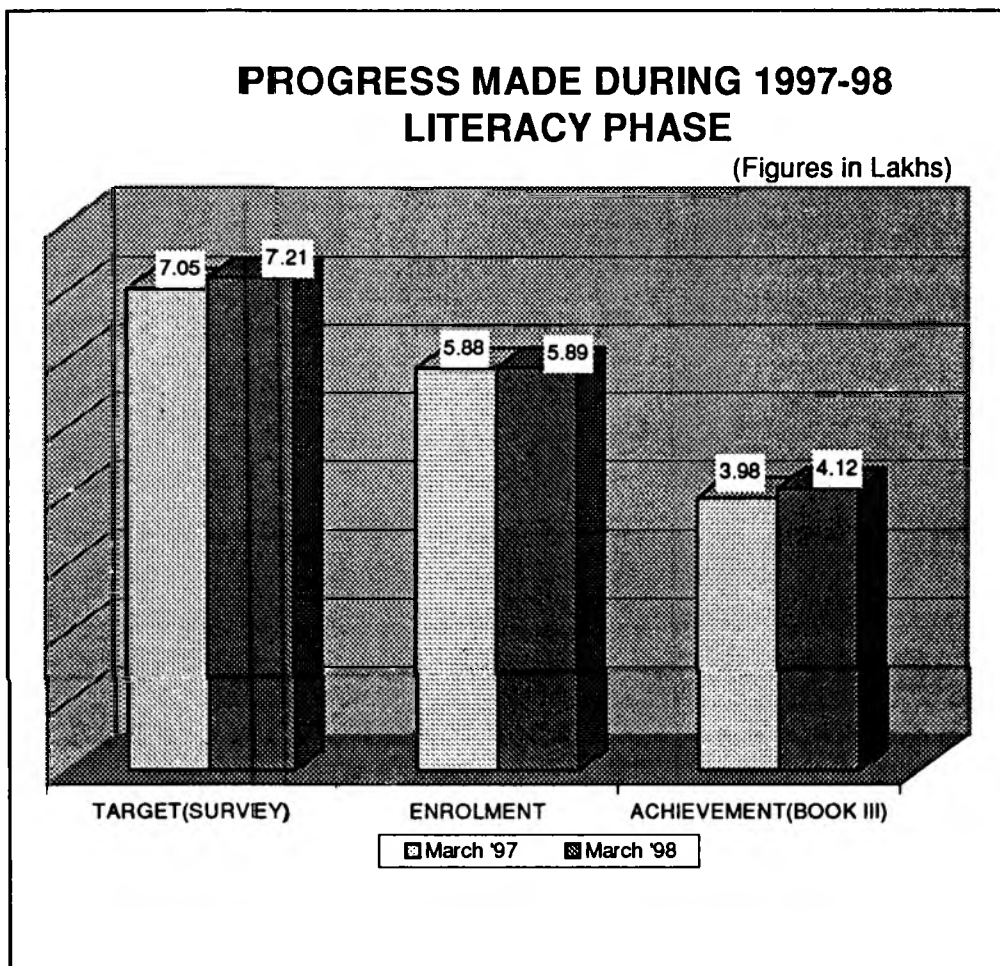
The CE Project has been sanctioned in only one district i.e. Mandi. The district is expected to open 2200 CECs and 50 Nodal CECs.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The status report for March 1998 was available from all the districts except Lahaul & Spiti. The latest PL report available of this district is for March '97.

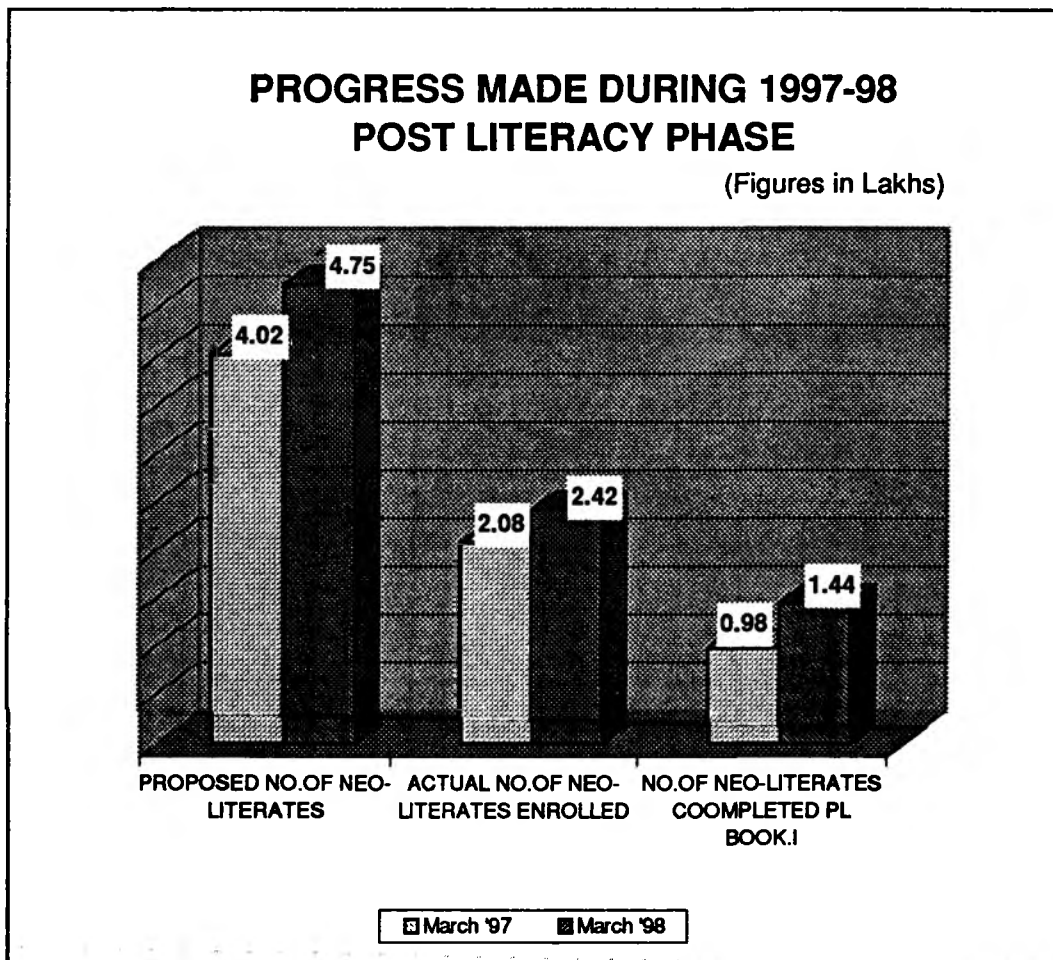
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The target of Himachal Pradesh increased from 7.04 lakh in 1997 to 7.21 lakh. This was due to increase in the target of Chamba district from 0.82 lakh (1997) to 0.99 lakh (1998). The increase in the enrolment was negligible, i.e. from 5.88 lakh to 5.89 lakh. The achievement also rose marginally from 3.98 lakh to 4.12 lakh which works out to 57.10%. It means more than 40% of the learners are yet to be made literate in the State.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy programme the target increased from 4.02 lakh to 4.75 lakh. This is due to increase in the target of Mandi district from 0.80 lakh (1997) to 1.51 lakh (1998). The enrolment rose from 2.08 lakh to 2.42 lakh this was mainly due to good progress reported from Shimla district where enrolment increased from 0.22 lakh (1997) to 0.41 lakh (1998).

The achievement also increased from 0.98 lakh to 1.44 lakh which was due to good progress made by Sirmour, Mandi, Bilaspur and Solan. However, the overall

achievement percentage against the target was 30.31% which means nearly 70% of the neo-literates are still to complete PL phase.

4. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has already been constituted in Himachal Pradesh. However, the seed money is yet to be released.

KARNATAKA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Karnataka State is one of the larger States in India. As per 1991 Census the total population was 44.97 million out of whom 22.95 million are males and 22.02 million are females. The rural and urban population was 31.06 million (69.06%) and 13.91 million (30.93%) respectively. The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population constitute 16.38% and 4.26% respectively. There were 20 districts at the time of Census. Seven new districts have been carved out taking the number to 27.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Karnataka was slightly higher than the national average. According to the 1991 Census the literacy rate was 56.04%. The male and female literacy rate was 67.26% and 44.34% respectively. Out of 20 districts (number has gone up to 27 in 1997), twelve districts had literacy rate above the national average. Two districts with high literacy rates were: Bangalore and Dakshin Kannada which had 76.27% and 75.86% respectively. The literacy rate of 4 districts, namely, Chickmagalur, Kodagu, Shimoga and Uttara Kannada was in the range of 60-70%. Two districts, Raichur and Gulbarga had a literacy rate less than 40%. The lowest literacy rate in the State was in Raichur district which was only 35.96%. Gulbarga was another district with low literacy rate of 24.49%.

Bangalore district also had the highest female literacy rate of 68.81% followed by Dakshin Kannada 67.96% and Kodagu with 61.22%. There were three districts with above 50% female literacy. They are: Chikamagalur (51.31%), Shimoga (51.42%) and Uttar Kannad (56.77%). Five districts had above 40%, i.e. Bijapur (40.06%),

Chitradurga (43.36%), Dharwad (45.20%), Hassan (44.90%) and Tumkur (41.93%). Seven districts had more than 30%. Raichur and Gulbarga districts reported less than 30%. Raichur with 22.15% was lowest in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS - STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the 20 districts have been sanctioned literacy projects being implemented through out the State. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

All the 20 districts in Karnataka State have conducted the door-to-door survey and have reported the target which is 73.45 lakh. Raichur had the highest learners i.e. 6 lakh. Three districts namely Belgaum, Bijapur and Gulbarga have identified more than 5 lakh learners. Two districts, namely, Bellary and Mandya have identified more than 4 lakh learners and rest of the districts identified less than 3 lakh learners. Kodagu which is the smallest district in the State identified only 0.66 lakh learners which is lowest in the State.

ENROLMENT

The State reported an enrolment of 59.79 lakh which works out to 81.40% of the target. The enrolment figure from only one district i.e. Bangalore is awaited. Almost all the districts have fairly good enrolment except one district i.e. Bangalore (Rural) which reported less than 50% enrolment. Three districts, namely Belgaum, Bidar and Chickamagalur have reported 100% or nearly 100% enrolment which appear to be incorrect.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 38.27 lakh learners have become literate after completing Book-III which works out to 52.10%. Four districts, i.e. Dakshin Kannada, Mandya, Shimoga and Tumkur have reported an achievement of above 80% against the target. Six districts, Belgaum, Bidar, Chickamagalur, Chitradurga, Dharwad and Uttara Kannada have reported more than 70% achievement and Hassan, Bellary and Mysore have also done fairly well with 56.15%, 48.87% and 40.76% respectively. The progress made in some districts is not very encouraging, namely, Bijapur (sanctioned in 1990) which is stagnating with only 35.16%. Gulburga and Kodagu districts both sanctioned in 1993 have so far reported only 31.75% and 33.19% achievement respectively. The performance of Raichur sanctioned in 1991 is only 29.59%. Kolar (1994) with 28.56% and Bangalore (Rural) (1993) with only 15.09% were also dragging for quite long.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

Out of 20 districts the external evaluation has been completed in 13 districts. Dakshin Kannada District tops the list with 88.50% achievement. The achievement of 4 districts, namely Bidar, Mandya, Tumkur and Uttara Kannada was in the range of 70-80%. Two districts, i.e. Belgaum & Chickamagalur are in the range of 60-70%. Bijapur and Shimoga were in the range of 50-60% and Bellary and Dharwad were in the range of 40-50%. The achievement of two districts, namely Mysore Ph.I and Raichur was very low i.e. 17% and 11% respectively.

(c) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Eighteen Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned covering 18 districts. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

The total number of neo-literates proposed to be covered in 18 post literacy projects sanctioned so far is 38.37 lakhs. The target of Dharwad and Belgaum districts under post literacy is more than 4 lakhs which is highest compared to other districts. The number of neo-literates to be covered in Mandya, Tumkur and Bellary is in the range of 3-4 lakhs. In Bijapur, Shimoga and Bidar the number is between 2-3 lakhs. Dakshin Kannada, Raichur, Uttara Kannada, Chickamagalur, Chitradurga and Mysore (Phase I) it is between 1-2 lakhs. Kodagu district has the lowest number of neo-literates i.e. 0.40 lakh. The report from 3 PL districts, namely Hassan, Bangalore (Rural) and Gulburga is still awaited.

ENROLMENT

The total number of neo-literates enrolled so far in the ongoing post literacy projects is 30.12 lakh which works out to 78.49%. Four districts have reported 100% enrolment. They are: Dakshin Kannada, Shimoga, Raichur and Belgaum which may not be correct. The enrolment was fairly good in all other districts except Bellary where only 1.25 lakh neo-literates have reportedly been enrolled..

ACHIEVEMENT

27.62 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I which works out to 74.58% of the targetted neo-literates. Under the PL phase, Mandya did fairly well where 3.40 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I out of 3.80 lakh target. The progress in other districts is moderate except Dharwad, Tumkur, Bellary where progress is very slow.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

None of the districts have so far conducted external evaluation of the PL projects.

(d) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

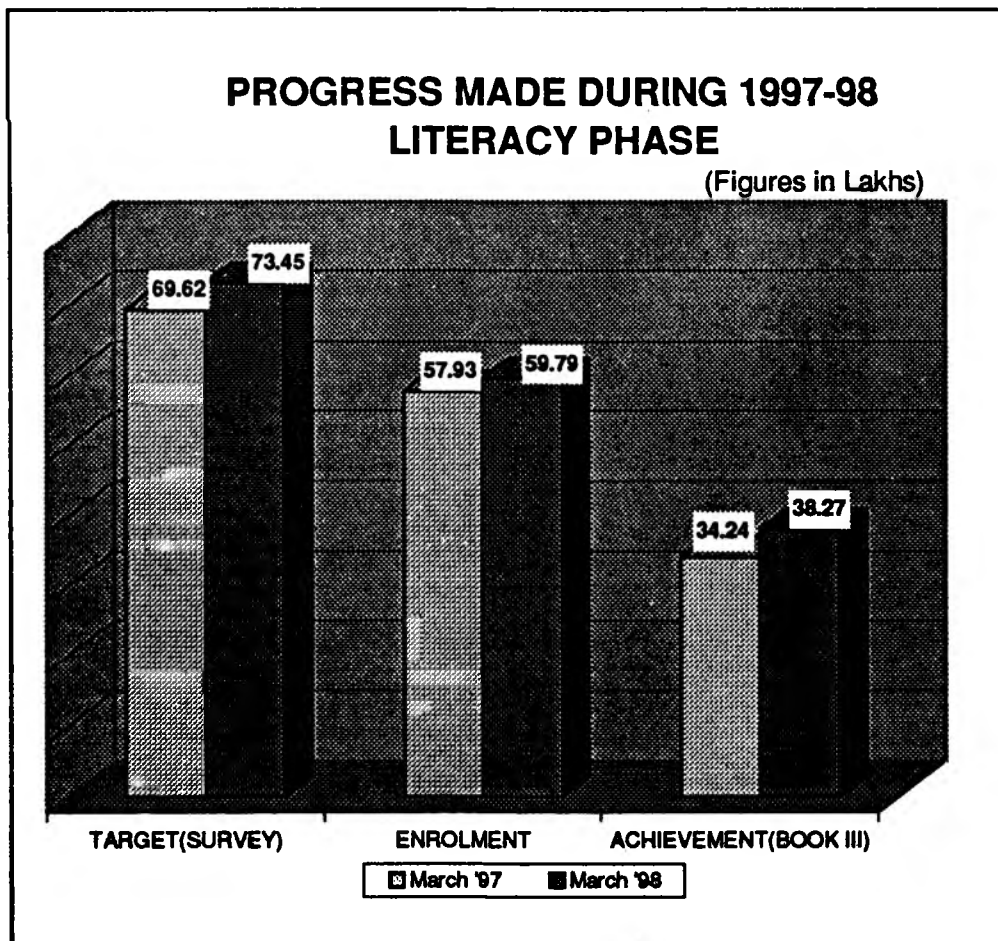
The Continuing Education Project have not been sanctioned to any district in Karnataka.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status of Karnataka State is quite irregular. Only two reports have been received during the year 1997-98. They are for March 1997 and for March 1998.

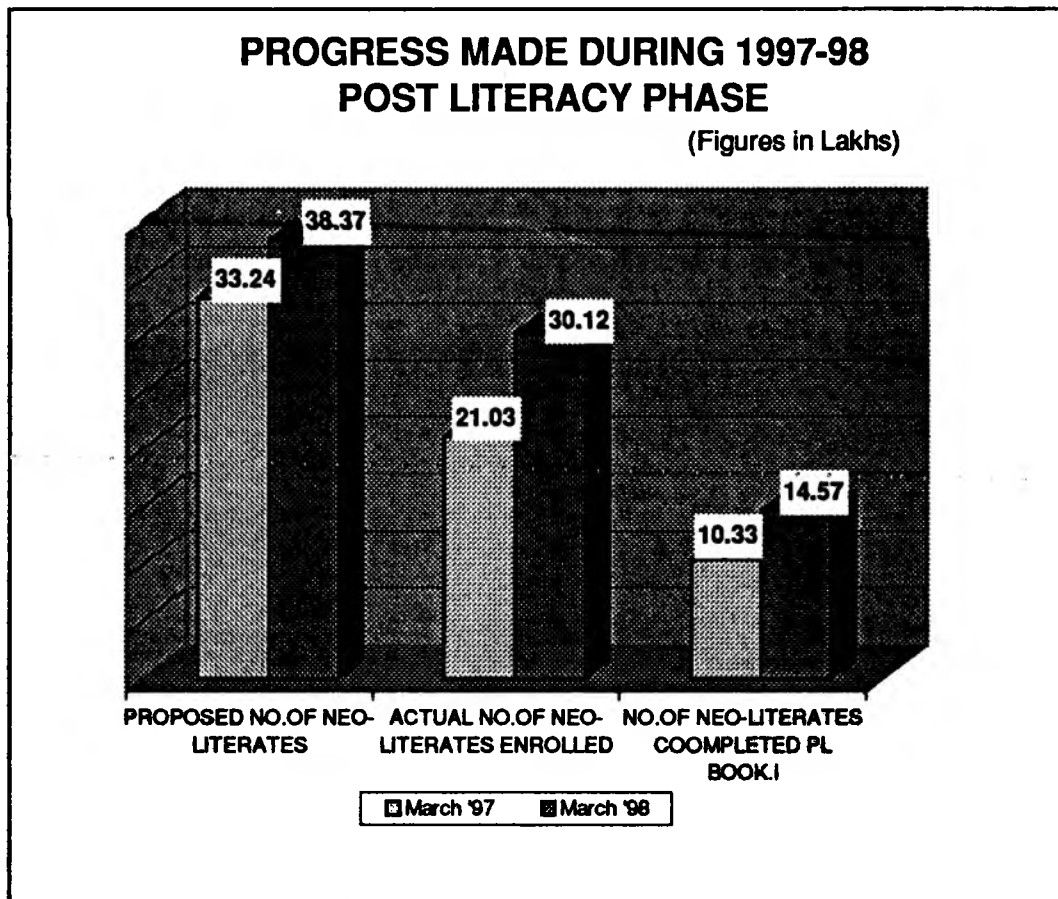
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The target of Karnataka State increased from 69.62 lakh to 73.45 lakh during 1997-98. This was due to inclusion of the targets of Bangalore Urban district and Mysore Ph.II. There was a marginal increase in the enrolment from 57.92 lakh to 59.79 lakh during this period. The enrolment percentage against the target works out to 81.40% which is a good progress. The achievement for book-III also rose from 34.24 lakh to 38.26 lakh. The overall achievement of the State works out to around 52% which means 48% of the learners are still to become literate.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy Phase the target increased from 33.24 lakh to 38.37 lakh. This is because of the inclusion of the targets of Kodagu and Belgaum. Besides the target of Tumkur increased from 2.67 lakh to 3.84 lakh. The enrolment has increased considerably during this period from 21.03 lakh to 30.12 lakh. The progress was mainly from four districts, namely, Bijapur, Shimoga, Dharwad Ph.I, Chitradurga and Belgaum. The achievement also increased from 10.33 lakh to 14.57 lakh. The overall achievement percentage against the target was 37.97% which means more than 60% of the neo-literates are yet to complete the PL phase.

5. INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMES

In order to mobilise the dropouts and the unenrolled learners, a special programme was launched through out the State titled 'Kannada Nadu Sakshara Nadu'. The main objective of this programme was to bring back all the identified learners to the literacy centres and to inject enthusiasm in volunteers to rejuvenate the literacy centres through out the State. This was the first programme of its kind in the country where some special efforts were made to revive literacy project in every district. This programme is still in progress and the achievement made so far appears to be encouraging. It is proposed to conduct an evaluation of this programme to assess the progress/achievement so that it can serve as a model for other States facing similar problems.

6. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has already been constituted in Karnataka. The seed money has been released by NLMA.

KERALA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Kerala is one of the smaller States in the country which had a population of 29.10 million in 1991. The male and female population was 14.29 million and 14.81 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 21.42 million and 7.68 million respectively. Out of the total population 9.89% were scheduled castes and 1.09% were scheduled tribes. There are fourteen districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Kerala State has made a remarkable achievement in literacy. It had the highest literacy rate of 89.81% in India as per 1991 Census. The male and female literacy rates were highest in the country, i.e. 93.62% and 86.17%. The literacy rate among scheduled caste and schedule tribe was also considerably high i.e. 79.66% and 57.22% respectively. Out of fourteen districts, eight districts had more than 90% literacy rate. They are: Kottayam (95.72%) (highest), Pathanamthitta (94.86%), Alappuzha Rural (93.87%), Kollam (90.47%), Kannaur (91.48%), Kozhikode (91.10%), Trissur (90.18%), Ernakulam (92.35%). Districts with more than 80% literacy rate were Kasaragod (82.51%), Wynad (82.73%), Malappuram (87.94%), Palkkad (81.27%), Iduki (86.94%) and Thiruvananthapuram (89.22%).

The female literacy rate was also highest in Kottayam i.e. 94%. Other two districts with more than 90% were Alappuzha Rural (91.12%) and Pathanamthitta (93.29%). Districts with more than 80% were Kannaur (87.65%), Kozhikode (86.79%), Malappuram (84.09), Trissur (86.94%), Ernakulam (89.27%), Iduki (82.96%), Kollam (87.00%) and Thiruvananthapuram (85.76%). Only three districts had less than 80%, namely, Wyanad (77.69%), Kasaragod (76.29%) and Palkkad (75.72%).

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

Two literacy projects were sanctioned covering entire State: one for Ernakulam in September '88 and another project covering thirteen districts sanctioned in June '90. The status regarding target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The total target of the State including Ernakulam project was 24.17 lakh. District-wise target figure was not available.

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment reported for the State as a whole was 17.82 lakh which works out to 73.73%.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement for Book-III was 13.45 lakh which works out to 55.65%. In Ernakulam 1.23 lakh learners had reportedly completed Book-III against 1.35 lakh target which works out to 91.11%. Rest of the State reported an achievement of 53.55%.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation of Ernakulam revealed 84.18% achievement.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The Post Literacy Project was sanctioned in January '92 to the State as a whole covering all the fourteen districts.

TARGET

The total target of neo-literates was 12.22 lakh.

ENROLMENT

Against 12.22 lakh target, 11 lakh neo-literates have reportedly been enrolled in the PL phase which works out to 90.01%.

ACHIEVEMENT

It was reported that only 4.01 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I. There is no report after April '94.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The Continuing Education Project has been sanctioned to all the fourteen districts in March 1997. The State is expected to open 3500 CE Centres and 500 nodal CE Centres. The current status of the CE project is as follows:

(A) IMPLEMENTATION OF CE PROJECT

i) AT STATE LEVEL

At the State level there are three structures to oversee the implementation of the project.

1. General Education Department
2. Kerala State Literacy Mission Authority (KSLMA)
3. State Adult Education Officer

ii) AT DISTRICT LEVEL

At the district level the main agency in charge of implementation of the project is the District Panchayat Saksharata Samiti (DPSS). This agency receives the funds from KSLMA and in turn transfers the same to the Gram Panchayat Saksharata Samiti. The parallel organisation at the district level is the office of the DAEO. The DPSS would be the financing and implementing organisation.

iii) AT VILLAGE LEVEL

At the village level, the Gram Panchayat would be the grassroots level organisation to oversee the implementation of the project. Apparently, the selection of the functionaries (Preraks) for the CEC and the nodal CEC, their locations etc. would be decided by the Gram Panchayat. It would receive the funds from the DPSS.

The main implementing agency of the State level is the Kerala State Literacy Mission Authority (KSLMA) which is a registered body. The KSLMA at present is engaged in the distribution of CECs to various Panchayats. As per the norms, each CEC is meant for a cluster of 500 neo-literates or a population of 1500. However, the spatial

and geographical distribution of neo-literates is such that a mechanical and arithmetical distribution of CECs is not feasible. After much deliberation, the KSLMA has decided to allocate 2-3 CECs per Panchayat. The KSLMA also proposes to select 14 KRPs for each of the district. The KSLMA also proposes to select 14 KRPs for each of the district.

(B) TRAINING

The most important activities conducted by the SLMA so far has been the training of the district level functionaries. An orientation-cum-training programme has been jointly organised by the State Resource Centre and SLMA for the Presidents and Secretaries of the District Panchayats. This one day programme has been conducted at the District Headquarters of all the 14 districts in the State.

(C) PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

The SLMA has planned to have Project Coordinator in each district who will work in coordination with the panchayat functionaries. They would be responsible for both implementation and monitoring as well as academic and training support to CE in the district.

(D) SELECTION OF PRERAKS

The SLMA has prepared comprehensive guidelines for setting up the CECs. Each district panchayat would set up a Selection Committee for identifying Preraks for the CEC. Selection Committee will compose of teachers, 2-3 social workers, President/Secretary of the District Panchayat and Member of the Ward where the centre is to be located. The funds would be released to the District Panchayat only after the above particulars are furnished.

(E) STATUS REVIEW

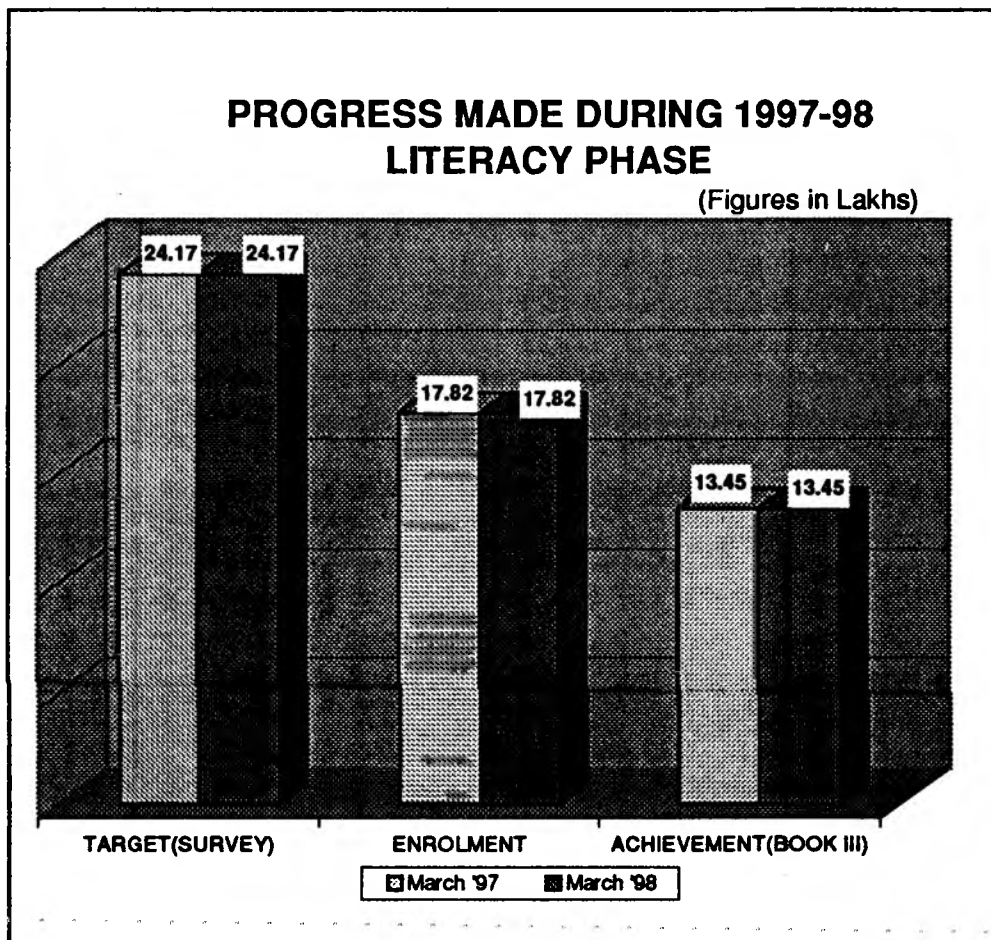
The project was proposed to be launched from 1st November 1997, but the project has not yet been launched in the State. The main reason given is that the funds have not yet been released by the State Government to the SLMA though the project was earlier scheduled to start on 1st November, 1997. The reason for the delay in starting the project appears to be non-release of funds. The funds for the project was released by the NLMA in March, 1997. It is a matter of serious concern that the project could not be launched for one full year. The reason put forward for not starting the project is the non-release of funds by the State Government to the SLMA. The State has a network of voluntary organisations and other bodies who are conducting a large number of vocational skill training programmes. A linkage needs to be established with such agencies at this stage itself so that components relating to income generation, skill upgradation etc. are built into the programme. A comprehensive strategy for monitoring the programme is absolutely essential.

REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status from Kerala State is far from satisfactory.

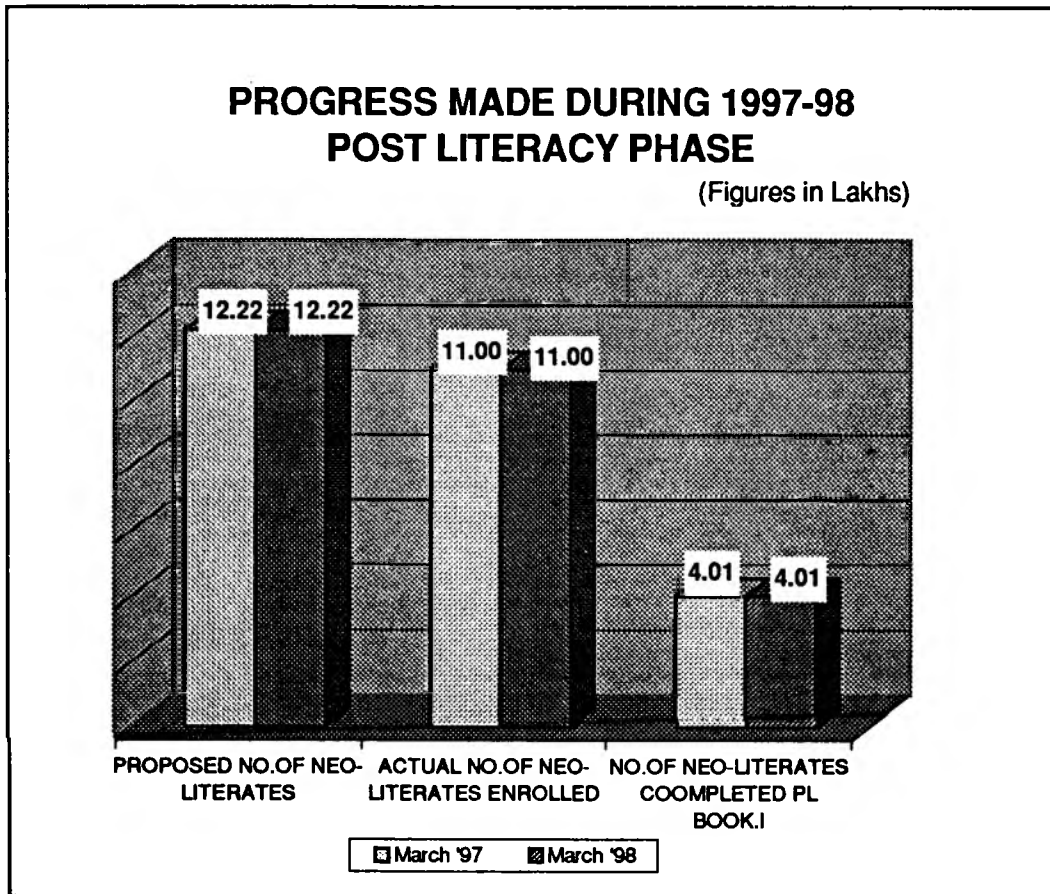
4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The scenario in Kerala was static as there was no change in the target, enrolment and achievement during the year which is quite evident from the above graph. The achievement percentage against the target remained at 55.64% which means more than 40% of the targeted learners were still to become literate.

(d) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy phase also no progress has taken place in the enrolment and achievement. The percentage of neo-literates who have complete PL phase remained at 32.81% which means around 70% are still to complete the PL phase.

(e) CONTINUING EDUCATION PHASE

The progress made in the CE phase has already been reported earlier.

3. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted. However, the seed money has not been released.

MADHYA PRADESH

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Madhya Pradesh is one of the major Hindi-speaking States and ranks 6th in population. According to 1991 Census its population was 66.18 million out of which 34.27 million were males and 31.91 million were females. Rural and urban break-up of the population is 50.84 million and 15.34 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population was 9.62 and 15.39 million which works out to 14.54% and 23.27% respectively. It may be observed here that the scheduled tribe population is more than the scheduled caste in this State. There were 45 districts at the time of Census. Sixteen new districts have been carved out taking the total to 61.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Madhya Pradesh is one of the educationally backward States and ranks 25th in the country. According to 1991 Census the literacy rate was 44.20% which is far below the national average of 52.21%. There is a big gap between the male and female literacy rates. While the male literacy rate was 58.42%, the female literacy rate was only 28.85%.

Out of forty-five districts (1991) only nine districts had the literacy rate above the national average. Indore with 66.32% stood first followed by Bhopal with 64.27%. The literacy rate of twenty-one districts was in the range of 40-50% and twelve districts were in the range of 30-40%. While two districts recorded less than 30% literacy rate,

one district recorded less than 20% literacy rate, i.e. Jhabua where the literacy rate was only 19.01% lowest in the State.

The female literacy rate was highest in Bhopal, i.e. 54.17% and Indore which recorded 53.35% was in second position. In fact only six districts had female literacy rate above 40%. Ten districts were in the range of 30-40%, nineteen districts were in the range of 20-30% and in ten districts it was less than 20%. The female literacy rate was lowest in Jhabua which was only 11.52%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECT – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the sixty-one districts have been sanctioned literacy projects. The current status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

All the campaign districts have conducted door to door survey and have identified 125.88 lakh learners. Bilaspur district which is implementing the programme in three phases had the highest target of 8.67 lakh. Raipur district also in three phases had 8.50 lakh learners. Three districts, namely, Khargaon, Bastar and Jabalpur have a target of more than 4 lakh learners. Six districts were having 3 lakh learners, seventeen districts have identified 2-3 lakh learners and target of 9 districts was between 1-2 lakh. There is only one district i.e. Datia which has less than one lakh learners, which is lowest in the State.

There are four tribal districts, namely, Sarguja with 3.81 lakh target, Shahdol with 3.86 lakh, Dhar and Mandla districts with 2.65 lakh and 2.26 lakh learners respectively.

ENROLMENT

All the literacy projects have reported good enrolment. The total enrolment was 100.90 lakh which works out to 80.15%. Some of the districts have reported 100% enrolment which may not be true. There were two districts with poor enrolment, namely, Dhar where only 0.48 lakh learners against 2.66 lakh and Morena 0.82 lakh learners against 2.93 lakh were reportedly enrolled.

Among the tribal districts Sarguja, Shahdol and Mandla have done very well in terms of enrolment and Dhar district was lagging behind.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement for Primer-III has so far been reported from forty-one districts and four districts are still to report. So far 42.38 lakh learners have reportedly completed Primer-III which works out to 33.67% achievement (against the target). Seven districts have reportedly achieved more than 80%, namely, Narsimhapur (87.37%), Raisen (85.05%), Shivpuri (84.78%), Raigarh (83.89%), Durg (82.86%), Surguja which is a tribal district also achieved with 80.54% and Indore (80.47%). Bilaspur district which had highest target (8.67 lakh) also did well in first phase with 62.30% achievement. However, in the second phase, the achievement was only 39.69% and in the third phase it was 54%. The overall achievement of the district in all the three phases works out to 52.04% which is fairly good. Rajnandgaon district which implemented in two phases did well in both the phases with 63.89% and 59.04% achievement. The combined achievement was 59.70%. Jhabua district (two phases) also did well in the first phase with 70.88%. However, the second phase achievement was only 38.72% and the combined achievement was 42.53%. Among other districts which have done fairly well are Khandwa (62.18%), Bhopal (67.28%) and Ujjain (first phase 64.19%). In some of the districts the programme appears to be dragging and the achievement reported so far is not at all impressive. Behind Phase I, Gwalior and

Dewas (all sanctioned in 1993) have so far reported only 36.69%, 31.82% and 22.63% achievement respectively. The programme in Guna, Tikamgarh, Sagar, Rewa, Bastar Phase I (all sanctioned in 1995) have achieved very little success and the achievement is less than 30%.

The progress in some districts is extremely low even after completing more than two years. Satna (March '94) 0.17%, Shahjapur (January '94) 6.47%, Datia (August '95) 8.42%, Mandsaur (January '95) 9.15%, Seoni (January '95) 7.70%, Hoshangabad (January '95) 0.51% Morena (February '95) 8.36%, Sehore (August '96) 4.61% and Sidhi (January '94) nil achievement are stagnating.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in only six districts so far. Among them Ratlam tops the list with 86.46%, Raipur (Phase I) 82%, Indore 78.90%, Bilaspur (Phase I) 74%, Durg 72.18% and Narsimhapur 41%. Some of the districts which have done exceedingly well like Shivpuri, Raisen, Surguja, Rajnandgaon are yet to report external evaluation status.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Nineteen Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to Madhya Pradesh so far. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

Out of nineteen ongoing PLC districts only nine districts have reported the status and their total target was 15.01 lakh neo-literates. Five districts are implementing the programme in two phases, namely, Bilaspur, Raigarh, Raipur, Betul and Rajnandgaon. Among these districts Bilaspur had a highest target of 3.64 lakh. Raigarh and Durg districts also have more than 2 lakh neo-literates as their target.

ENROLMENT

The current enrolment (excluding Betul and Raisen who have not reported) was 10.46 lakh. The enrolment reported by Bilaspur (Ph.II), Raigarh, Raipur and Ratlam is quite impressive and it was low in Bilaspur Ph.I and Narasingpur.

ACHIEVEMENT

Out of 10.46 lakh enrolled neo-literates, 4.97 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I and 3.41 lakh neo-literates were attending PL Centres as on March '98. In Durg all the 2 lakh targeted neo-literates have completed PL Book-I. All other districts were dragging.

EVALUATION

None of the PL projects have been evaluated.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

One Continuing Education Project has been sanctioned to Durg district in Madhya Pradesh.

3. REPORTING STATUS

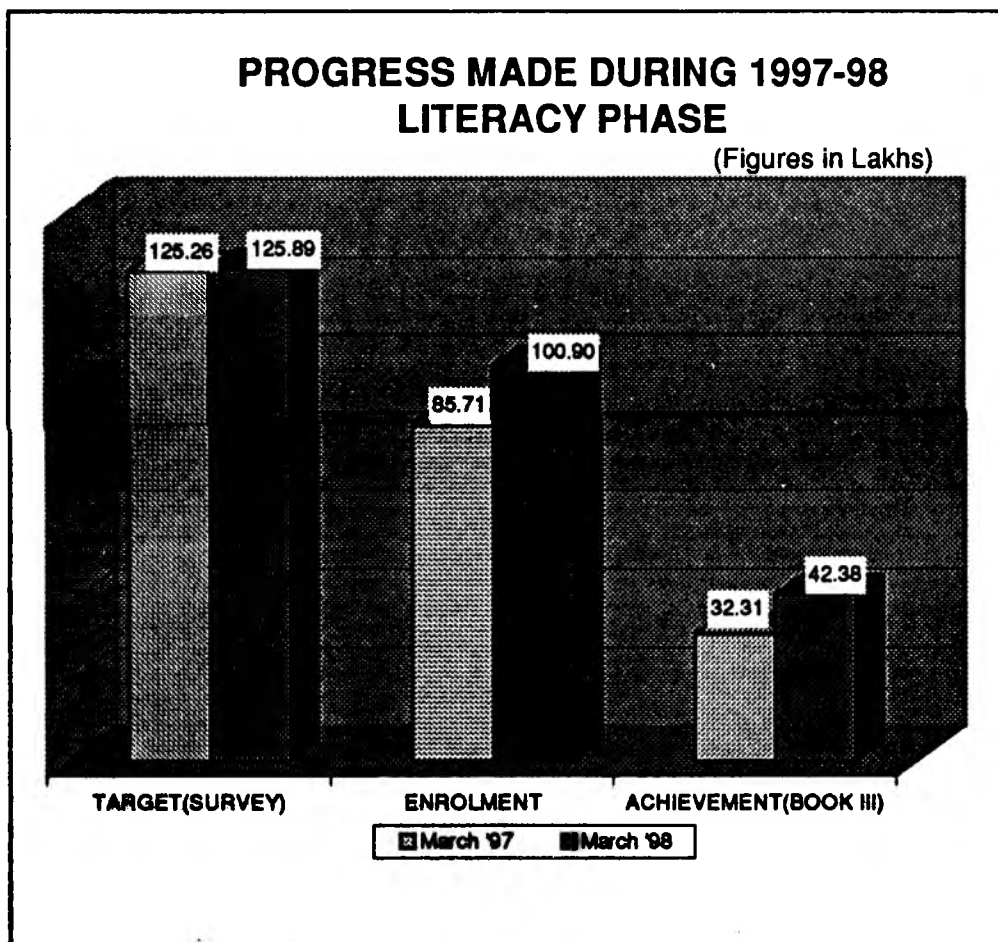
Fairly good. Almost all the districts have reported the March '98 status except three. Names of those districts along with dates of latest report are: Durg (May '97), Bastar (February '98), Raigarh Ph.I & II (February '98).

In Post Literacy Phase, Durg district's latest report was for Dec.'97. All post literacy projects sanctioned in Nov.'97 have not yet reported their status (of March '98). They

are: Raigarh Ph.II, Raipur Ph.II, Rajnandangaon, Chharpur, Shivpuri, Bhind Ph.I, Sarguja, Khandwa, Jabalpur City, Gwalior City, Rajgarh and Thikamgarh.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



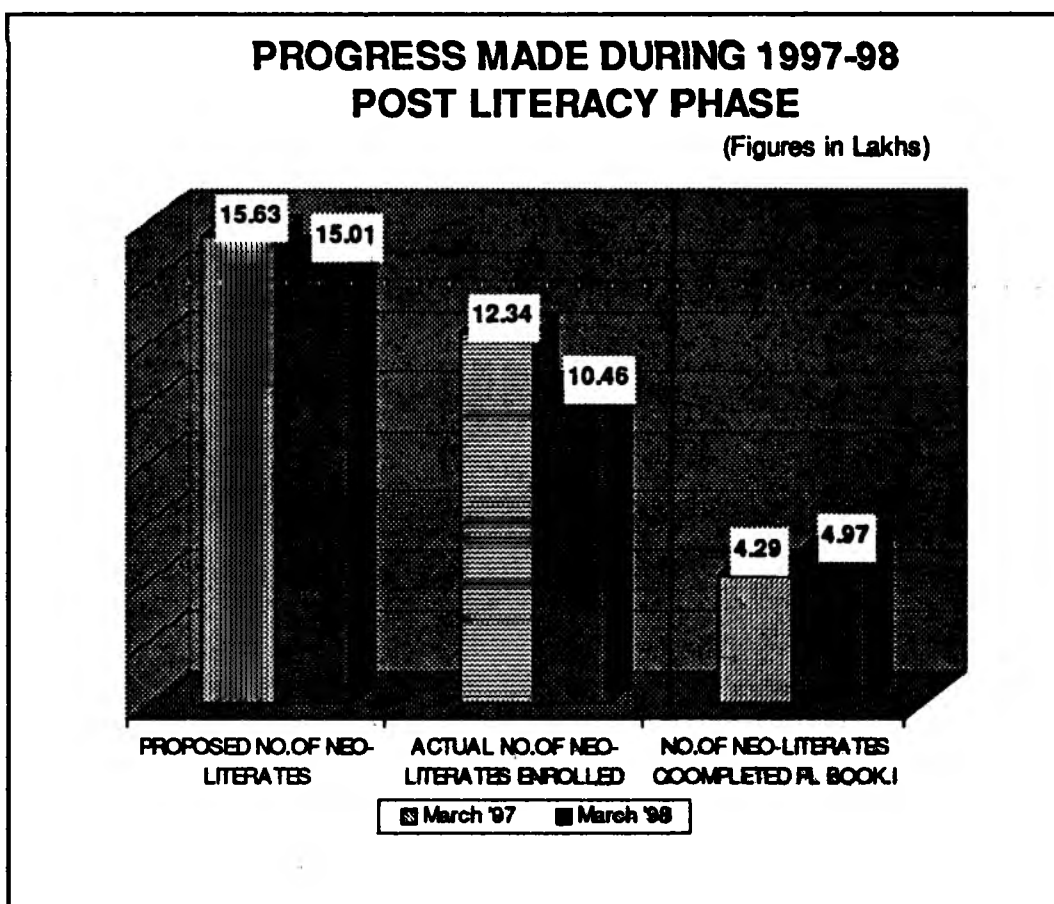
There was a marginal increase in the overall target of Madhya Pradesh from 126.25 lakh to 125.89 lakh. This was due to revised targets of Sidhi and Ujjain Ph.II projects. The enrolment and achievement figures also have registered a moderate increase during the period which can be seen from the graph. The enrolment increased from 85.70 lakh

to 100.90 lakh during the period. The enrolment increased substantially in nine districts, namely, Rewa, Shahdol, Sidhi, Khargaoon, Sehore, Chhindwara, Seoni, Jabalpur and in Betul Ph.II. It increased moderately in twenty-one districts/projects. In sixteen districts/projects status remained static.

The achievement for Book-III increased from 32.31 lakh to 42.38 lakh which means 10.07 lakh additional learners have completed Book-III during the period. Good progress was reported from seven districts, namely, Morena, Guna, Chhindwara, Bhopal, Jabalpur, Bilaspur Ph.III and Jhabhua Ph.II. Twenty three districts reported moderate increase. The status did not change in twenty-six districts/projects.

The overall achievement was 33.67% against the target which means more than 65% of the targeted learners were still to complete Book-III.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy phase the target has come down from 15.63 lakh (1997) to 15.01 lakh (1998). This is because of the revised targets submitted by three districts, namely, Narasingpur (from 1.08 lakh to 0.94 lakh), Bilaspur Ph.I (from 2.20 lakh to 1.76 lakh) and Indore (from 1.09 lakh to 1.05 lakh).

The enrolment was also reduced from 12.34 lakh to 10.46 lakh. There was misreporting by three districts earlier which have furnished revised enrolment figures. The districts are Narasingpur (from 1.08 lakh to 0.21 lakh), Bilaspur Ph.I (2.02 lakh to 0.90 lakh) and Raigarh (from 1.60 lakh to 1.45 lakh). The only district which has reported increase in the enrolment was Indore from 1.00 lakh to 1.26 lakh. The status was static in four districts, namely, Raipur, Betul Ph.I, Raisen and Ratlam.

There was a marginal increase in the achievement from 4.29 lakh to 4.97 lakh. Good progress was reported from Indore from 0.39 lakh to 0.96 lakh and the progress in Raipur and Ratlam was marginal. The scenario was static in Durg, Narasingpur, Bilaspur Ph.I and II, Raigarh, Betul Ph.I and Raisen districts.

The overall achievement was only 33.11% against the target which means more than 65% of the targeted neo-literates were yet to complete the PL phase.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has already been constituted in Madhya Pradesh and the seed money has also been released.

MAHARASHTRA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Maharashtra is one of the bigger States having a population of 78.93 million and ranks third in the country in population. The male and female population was 40.82 million and 38.11 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 48.39 million and 34.54 million respectively. The scheduled caste and schedule tribe population constitutes 11.10% and 9.27% respectively. There were thirty districts at the time of Census. Three new districts have been carved out taking the number to thirty three.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy scenario was fairly good with 64.87% literacy rate as per 1991 Census. The male literacy rate was 76.56% and the female literacy rate was 52.32%. Out of thirty districts, only six districts were having the literacy rate less than the national average. They are: Dhule (51.22%), Beed (49.82%), Parbhani (47.58%), Nanded (48.17%), Jalna (46.25%) and Gadchiroli (42.89%). The highest literacy rate of 82.50% was recorded in Greater Bombay. Sindhudurg district was in second position with 75.81% and Nagpur stood in third place with 73.64%. Four districts were having literacy rate in the range of 70-80%, thirteen districts were in 60-70%, seven districts were in 50-60% and five districts with less than 50% literacy rate.

The highest women literacy rate of 75.80% was recorded in Greater Bombay followed by Sindhudurg district with 66.87%. The lowest female literacy rate of 27.30% was recorded in Jalna district. There were six districts with 60% and above female literacy rate; seven districts with above 50%, eight districts with above 40% and

six districts had the female literacy rate of above 30% and three districts with less than 30% female literacy rate.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECT

All the districts in the State have been sanctioned literacy projects . The current status is as follows:

TARGET

Out of 30 projects, 29 have reported the target after survey. Only one district, namely Dhule which was sanctioned in January 1997 is yet to report the survey figure. The total number of learners identified so far in 29 districts was 64.08 lakh. The highest number of learners i.e. 6.62 lakh were identified in Nanded district followed by Parbhani district with 4.26 lakh learners. There are 4 districts in the State having more than 3 lakh learners as their target. Seven districts have a target in the range of 2-3 lakhs and 12 districts were having the target in the range of 1-2 lakhs. Only 4 districts were having less than one lakh learner. Among them Sindhudurg had the lowest target of 0.28 lakh learners, Wardha was another district with a lower target of only 0.34 lakh. The other two districts were Satara (0.98 lakh) and Greater Bombay (0.87 lakh).

ENROLMENT

Out of 64.08 lakh targeted learners 56.80 lakh learners have been reportedly enrolled in the State which works out to 88.65%. The number of districts reporting 100% enrolment is more in Maharashtra State. Nearly ten districts have reported 100% enrolment, namely, Ahmednagar, Buldana, Jalgaon, Jalna, Kolhapur, Pune, Ratnagiri Sangli, Sholapur and Sindhudurg. It appears that there

is some confusion regarding the definition of the enrolment among these districts. Other districts which have done well in enrolment were Amravati (95.53%), Aurangabad (98.55%), Nasik (97.79%), Satara (92.83%), Wardha (94.19%), Bhandara (88.59%) and Raigadh (93.88%). Nanded which was having the highest number of illiterates i.e. 6.62 lakh reportedly enrolled 81.90% learners. There is only one district i.e. Thane where the enrolment was poor which enrolled only 1.46 lakh learners against a target of 3.28 lakh which works out to 44.51%. All other districts are fairly good in enrolment.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement figures for Book-III was available for 23 districts. So far 38.07 lakh learners have reportedly completed Primer-III against a target of 64.08 lakhs which works out to 59.41% achievement. Two districts, namely, Jalna and Sindhudurg have reported 100% achievement which may not be correct. Five districts have reported more than 90% achievement. They are Aurangabad (97.21%), Pune (93.20%), Buldana (92.07%), Sangli (91.96%), Yavatmal (90.01%). Six districts have reported more than 80% achievement, namely, Amravati (86.61%), Kolhapur (84.65%), Latur (80.44%), Nasik (88.59%), Wardha (89.17%) and Greater Bombay (84.30%). Five districts have reported more than 60% achievement, namely, Ahmednagar (61.06%), Nanded (64.29%), Osmanabad (60.61%), Parbhani (61.38%) and Ratnagiri (68.93%). Three districts have a moderate achievement, Beed (55.26%), Nagpur (41.56%) and Solapur (48.49%). The achievement of two districts, namely, Raigad (5.74%) and Satara (19.65%) is very poor. In fact both these districts were sanctioned in 1995.

Some of the districts are dragging without any achievement for Book-III for quite some time. They are: Gadchiroli, Thane and Chandrapur sanctioned literacy campaigns in 1996.

EVALUATION

The external evaluation of eleven districts have been completed. There is a wide variation in five districts in the achievement figures reported by the district vis-à-vis percentage of achievement declared by the evaluating agency. They are Latur district (MIS 80.44% and evaluation report 49.70%), Nanded (district report: 64.29%, evaluation report (38.80%), Sindhudurg (district report 100%, evaluation report 34.40%), Wardha (district report 89.17%, evaluation report 47.20%) and Sangli (district report 91.96%, evaluation report 68%), Jalna (MIS 100%, evaluation report 75.97%). A moderate variation is noticed in 3 districts, namely, Aurangabad (MIS 97.1%, evaluation report 78.1%), and Pune (MIS 93.20%, evaluation report 76.91%). In only two districts the achievement figures quoted by the districts and by the evaluating agency are more or less at the same level. They are Amravati (MIS 86.61%, evaluation report 82%) and Ratnagiri (MIS 68.93% , evaluating report 62.90%). As on March 1998, there were six districts with more than 60% achievement where the external evaluation was to be initiated. They are: Ahmednagar, Kolhapur, Nasik, Osmanabad, Yavatmal and Greater Bombay.

(c) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Fifteen Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to Maharashtra State. The current status is as follows:

TARGET

Out of fifteen post literacy districts, eleven districts have reported the proposed target of neo-literates to be covered under Post Literacy Programme. The target reported was 20.78 lakh neo-literates. Nanded district had the highest target of 4.25 lakh. Two districts, namely, Parbhani and Aurangabad have a target of more than 3 lakh. Two districts, namely, Pune and Jalna have a target of more than 2

lakh and three districts were having a target of 1-2 lakh. Two districts, namely, Wardha and Greater Bombay were with less than one lakh target. Wardha had the lowest target of 0.32 lakh neo-literates.

ENROLMENT

So far 18.60 lakh neo-literates have reportedly been enrolled in eleven districts which are reporting. Six districts have reported 100% enrolment, which may not be true. Parbhani district reported more than 100% enrolment (i.e. 3.04 lakh against 3 lakh target) which means there is some problem in monitoring system. The overall enrolment of the State is 89.50%.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 15.61 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I. All the post literacy districts except Greater Bombay and Beed have reported more than 80% achievement in PL phase.

(d) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

In Maharashtra Continuing Education Programme was sanctioned to five districts, namely, Pune (Rural), Wardha, Parbhani, Latur and Sindhudurg. In these five districts 2604 Continuing Education Centres and 298 nodal CECs are proposed to be set up.

The current status of Continuing Education Programme is awaited.

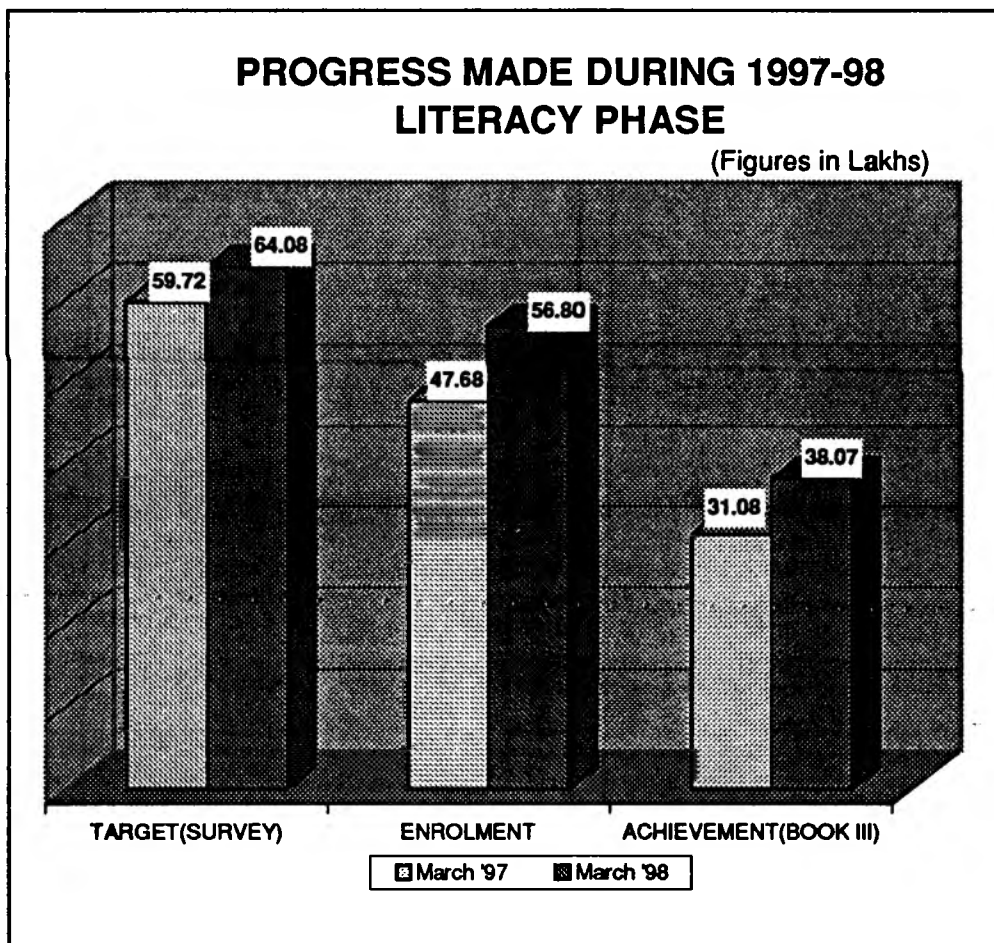
3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status of most of the post literacy districts in Maharashtra is not satisfactory. Only three districts have submitted the progress reports for March 1998. The latest report available for six districts is for November 1997. They are Nanded,

Wardha, Latur, Sindhudurg, Parbhani and Jalna. The report from Greater Bombay last received was in December 1996. The other four districts, namely, Yavatmal, Buldana, Osmanabad and Amravati have not submitted any report on the status of the PL phase.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



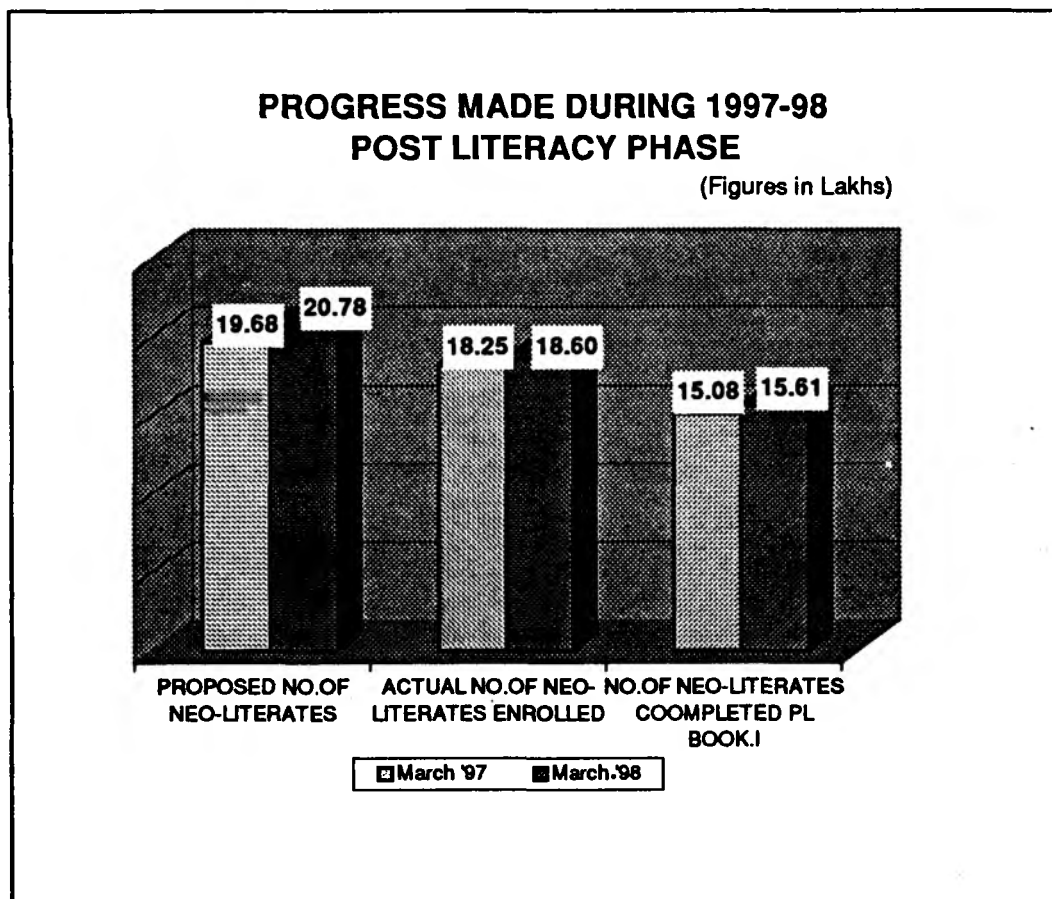
The overall target of the State was increased from 59.71 lakh to 64.07 lakh. This was due to the inclusion of the targets of Akola, Bhandara and Jalgaon districts. The target of Nagpur was also increased during this period.

The enrolment during the year increased from 47.67 lakh to 56.80 lakh. The increase was mainly reported by five districts, namely, Akola, Chandrapur, Gadchiroli, Jalgaon and Thane. The progress was moderate in four districts, namely, Nanded, Nasik, Raigad and Satara. The scenario was static in twenty districts.

The achievement rose from 31.08 lakh to 38.07 lakh. Good progress was reported from Nasik, Ahmednagar, Sholapur and Nagpur. The progress was moderate in Amravati, Buldana, Raigad, Sangli, Satara and Greater Bombay. The status was static in seventeen districts.

The overall achievement of the State was 59.41% against the target which means more than 40% of the learners were still to complete Book-III.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE:



In the Post Literacy Phase the target has increased from 19.08 lakh (1997) to 20.78 lakh (1998). This was due to the inclusion of the target of Beed district.

The enrolment registered a marginal increase from 18.25 lakh to 18.60 lakh. This was due to the inclusion of the enrolment of Beed district. The position of all other PL districts remained static.

The achievement in PL phase also registered a marginal increase from 15.08 lakh to 15.61 lakh. Progress was reported from only two districts, namely, Ratnagiri and Aurangabad. In all other districts the scenario was static.

The overall achievement percentage against the target was 79.03%.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in Maharashtra State and a sum of Rs.45 lakhs has already been released towards the seed money.

MANIPUR

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Manipur is one of the smaller State in the Noth Eastern Region with a total population of 18.37 lakh. The male and female population was 9.38 lakh and 8.99 lakh respectively. The rural and urban population was 13.31 lakh and 5.06 lakh respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population was 0.37 lakh and 6.32 lakh respectively which works out to 2.20% and 34.41%. There are eight districts in the State.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Manipur is slightly above the national average. As per 1991 Census it was 59.89%. The male and female literacy rate was 71.63% and 47.60% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 70.74% was recorded in Imphal district and the lowest literacy rate was 46.04% in Senapati district. Ukhrul district was in second position with 62.54%. There was one district with above 70% (Imphal), one district with above 60% (Ukhrul), five districts with above 50%, namely, Churachandpur (58.17%), Bishnupur (54.94%), Thoubal (52.47%) and Tamenglong (50.16%). Two districts had 40% and above literacy rate. They are: Chandel (46.68%) and Senapati (46.04%).

The highest women literacy i.e. 58.32% was recorded in Imphal district. Besides Imphal, there is another district, namely, Ukhrul with 51.57% which stood in second position. There were two districts with more than 40%, namely, Churachandpur (49.30%) and Bishnupur (41.13%). Four districts had above 30% female literacy rate.

They are: Tamenglong (39.68%), Thoubal (36.31%), Senapati (36.13%) and Chandel (34.80%) which is lowest in the State.

2. LITERACY PROJECTS – STATUS

Only one literacy campaign has been sanctioned to Churachandpur district in July 1995 to cover a proposed target of 0.74 lakh learners in 9-45 age-group.

The current status is not known since no progress report has been received from the project so far.

MEGHALAYA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Meghalaya is one another smaller State in the North-Eastern Region with 17.75 lakh population as per 1991 Census. The male and female population was 9.08 lakh and 8.67 lakh respectively. The rural and urban population was 14.45 lakh and 3.30 lakh respectively. The scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population was 0.09 lakh and 15.18 lakh which works out to 0.51% and 85.53% respectively. There were five districts at the time of Census and now the number has gone to six.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Meghalaya was slightly below the national average. As per 1991 Census, the State had literacy rate of 49.10%. The male and female literacy rate was 53.12% and 44.85% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 60.04% was in East Khasi Hills. West Khasi Hills was in second position with 50.52%. The other districts with their literacy rates in decending order is as follows: East Garo Hills (48.38%), West Garo Hills (39.32%), Jaintia Hills (35.32% , the lowest literacy rate).

The female literacy rate was highest in East Khasi Hills, i.e. 57.04%. West Khasi Hills recorded 47.94% and East Garo Hills with 41.70% stood in second and third position. Jaintia Hills had 36.31% and West Garo Hills had the lowest female literacy rate in the State which was 31.32%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

Six literacy campaigns have been sanctioned in Meghalaya. The current status with regard to target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The target is available from only 3 districts, i.e. East Garo Hills, Jaintia Hills and Ri Bhoi. The total target of these three districts was 1.38 lakh as of March 1998. Jaintia Hills had a highest target of 0.57 lakh. East Garo Hills had a target of 0.42 lakh and Ri Bhoi had a target of 0.38 lakh.

ENROLMENT

Out of 1.38 lakh targeted learners in three districts, only 0.36 lakh learners have been enrolled which works out to 26.29%. The highest enrolment of 53.11% was recorded in Ri Bhoi. Jaintia Hills reported 26.32% enrolment and East Garo Hills reported a poor enrolment of 1.75% only.

ACHIEVEMENT

Out of 1.38 lakh target, so far only 0.12 lakh learners have reportedly completed Primer-III which works out to only 8.42% achievement.

All the 3 projects were sanctioned in January-February 1996 and the achievement made so far is negligible. Jaintia Hills reported 15.32% achievement and Ri Bhoi had 7.31% achievement. The East Garo Hills district is yet to report achievement for Primer-III.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

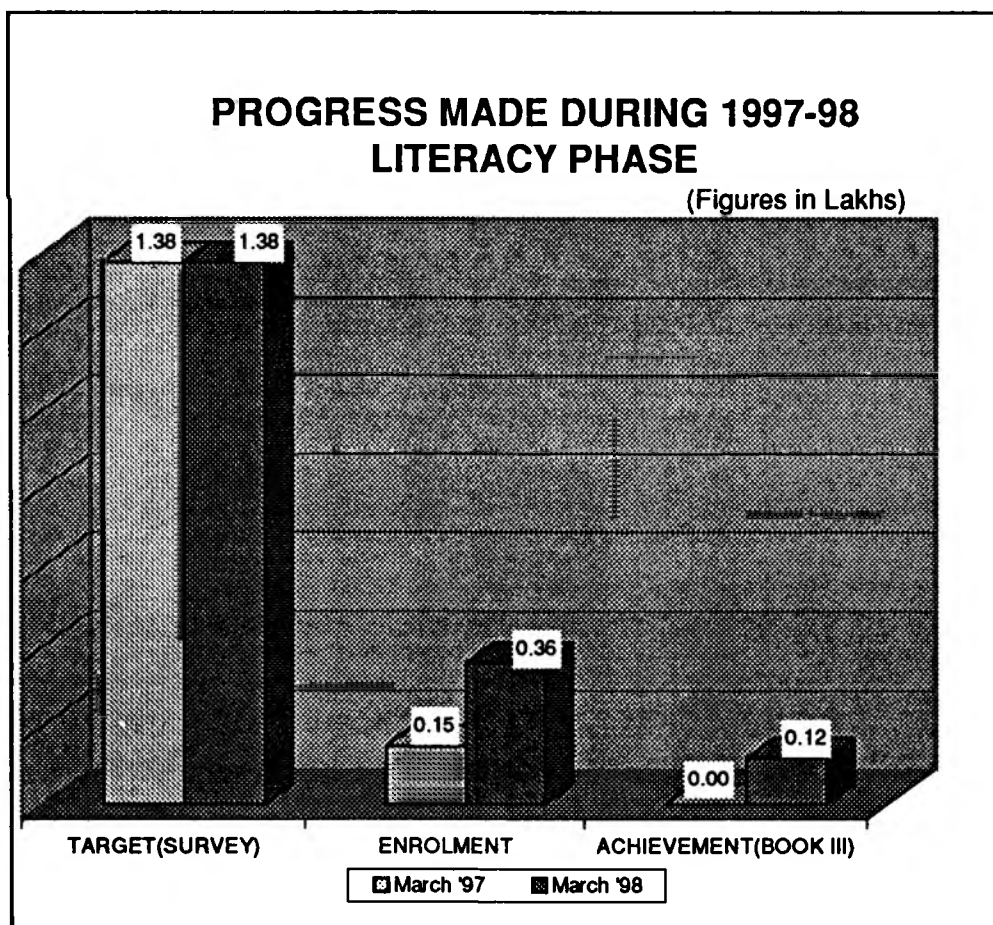
Post Literacy Projects are not yet sanctioned to any district in Meghalaya.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status is poor from Meghalaya. Although six districts have been sanctioned literacy projects in 1995-96, only three projects have sent the progress reports and even these three districts are quite irregular in reporting. The latest report from East Garo Hills was for March 1997 and for Jaintia Hills and Ri Bhoi was for December 1997. There is no report from other three districts, namely, West Garo Hills, East Khasi Hills and West Khasi Hills.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The target of Meghalaya remained at 1.38 lakh during 1997-98. However, there was some progress in the enrolment and achievement figures. While the enrolment

increased from 0.15 lakh to 0.36 lakh the achievement for Book-III increased from nearly 0.5 lakh to 0.12 lakh which is a good progress. However, the overall achievement percentage against the target was only 7.97% which means more than 90% of the learners are still to complete Book-III.

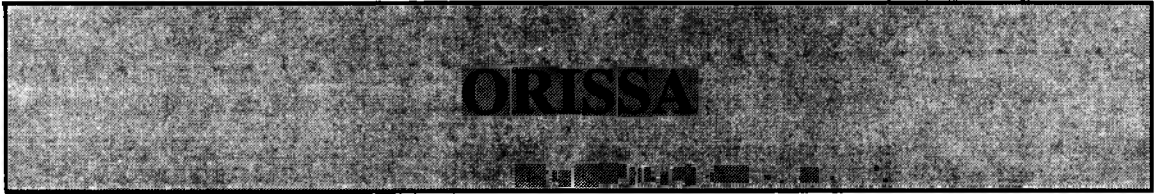

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Orissa ranks 11th in terms of population. As per 1991 Census the State had a population of 31.66 million. The number of males and females was 16.06 million and 15.60 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 27.42 million and 4.23 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population constitutes 16.20% and 22.21% respectively. There were thirteen districts at the time of Census. seventeen new districts have been carved out taking the number to thirty.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Orissa State (1991 Census) was 49.09% which is slightly lower than the national average of 52.21%. The male and female literacy rate was 63.09% and 34.68% respectively. Out of thirteen districts, five districts had the literacy rate above the national average. Puri district tops the list with 63.82% followed by Cuttack (63.28%), Balasore (58.78%), Dhenkanal (53.22%) and Sundergarh (52.97%). Three districts were in the range of 40-50%, namely, Sambalpur (49.38%), Keonjhar (44.73%) and Ganjam (44.26%). Four districts were in the range of 30-40%, namely, Balangir (39.74%), Phulbani (38.64%), Mayurbhanj (37.88%) and Kalahandi (30.05%). The lowest literacy rate of 22.66% was recorded in Koraput.

The female literacy rate was highest in Cuttack district i.e. 50.38%. Puri district was in second position with 49.94% and Balasore stood in third place with 44.57%. Four districts had the female literacy rate in the range of 30-40%, namely, Sundergarh (39.60%), Dhenkanal (37.34%), Sambalpur (33.55%) and Keonjhar (30.01%). Four districts were in the range of 20-30%, namely, Ganjam (28.09%), Mayurbhanj (23.68%), Balangir (21.88%) and Phulbani (20.26%) and two districts had less than 20%. Koraput with 13.09% recorded the lowest female literacy rate in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

So far twenty eight districts have been covered under the TLC and PLC. Sixteen districts were implementing TLC as on March '98. The current status regarding the target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The survey figures were available for 23 districts and their total target was 54.93 lakh. Ganjam district had highest number of illiterates i.e. 7.83 lakh. Mayurbhanj district stood second with 4.45 lakh learners and Balangir district was in the third position with 4.43 lakh learners. There were three districts with more than 3 lakh learners, namely, Keonjhar (3.83 lakh), Koraput (3.44 lakh) and Sundergarh (3.25 lakh). The target of five districts was in the range of 2-3 lakh, namely, Malkangiri (2.70 lakh), Kalahandi (2.64 lakh), Balasore (2.51 lakh), Dhenkanal (2.31 lakh) and Sambalpur (2.06 lakh). Nine districts had a target in the range of 1-2 lakh and three districts had less than one lakh learners. Deogarh district had the lowest target of only 0.68 lakh learners.

ENROLMENT

The effective enrolment as on March 1998 was 42.42 lakh which works out to 77.23% of the overall target of the State. Out of 23 reporting districts the enrolment is reported by 19 districts. Four districts, namely, Mayurbhanj, Puri, Gajapati and Bargarh have not reported the enrolment figures. Among these districts Gajapati is the oldest sanctioned in 1994. Mayurbhanj and Puri districts were sanctioned in 1996 and Bargarh was sanctioned in March 1997. Out of twenty three districts, five districts, namely, Dhenkanal, Kalahandi, Sundergarh, Sonapur and Nayagarh have reported 100% enrolment which may not be true.

One literacy project i.e. Rourkela reported more than 99% enrolment and two districts i.e. Balangir & Angul have reported more than 98% enrolment.

ACHIEVEMENT

Out of twenty three districts, only fifteen districts reported achievement for Primer-III. So far 20.97 lakh learners have reportedly completed Book-III which works out to 38.17% achievement. The districts/projects which have reported higher achievement figures are Angul (91.13%), Rourkela (84.84%), Dhenkanal (76.06%), Malkangiri (70.78%), Balangir (67.83%) and Sundergarh (61.23%). The districts where the achievement was moderate were: Jharsuguda (57.82%), Ganjam (56.13%), Sonepur (47.03%) and Kalahandi (44.19%), Keonjhar (39.14%) and Nayagarh (30.51%). The achievement of Koraput was only 1.50% which was lowest in the State.

The programme in some of the districts is dragging for quite long without much progress. The names of these districts are given below along with sanction date: Gajapati (Feb.'94), Cuttack, Mayurbhanj (Mar.'96) and Puri (Jan.'96), All these districts have not reported any achievement for Primer-I, II or III. Balasore (Mar.'95) and Deogarh (Mar.'96) have so far reported achievement for Primer I & II only.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation of the literacy campaigns have been completed in four districts, namely, Ganjam, Balangir, Sundergarh and Rourkela. Out of these, Ganjam district reportedly achieved 66.55% achievement. Balangir district is in second position with 61% and Sundergarh and Rourkela projects are in third and fourth position with 46.50% and 41.10% achievement respectively.

There is a wide gap in the achievement between MIS (84.10%) and external evaluation report (41.10%) in respect of Rourkela.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Twelve districts have been sanctioned post literacy projects in Orissa. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

The target reported for PL programme is 25.32 lakh. Ganjam district tops the list with 7.44 lakh target. There were four districts with a target of 2-3 lakh, namely, Kalahandi (2.64 lakh), Balangir (2.60 lakh), Malkangiri (2.24 lakh) and Sundergarh (2.17 lakh). Five districts have a target of 1-2 lakh and 2 districts have less than one lakh as their target. Nuapada has the lowest target which is only 0.45 lakh neo-literates.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment reported was 18.16 lakh which works out to 71.72%. Two districts, namely, Kalahandi and Dhenkanal have reported 100% enrolment which may not be true. Ganjam reported 4.30 lakh enrolment which works out to 57.79% and Rourkela reported remarkable enrolment of 80%. The lowest enrolment of 0.10 lakh was reported from Sambalpur against a target of 1.50 lakh. Jharsuguda also reported poor enrolment of only 0.11 lakh against a target of 0.60 lakh.

ACHIEVEMENT

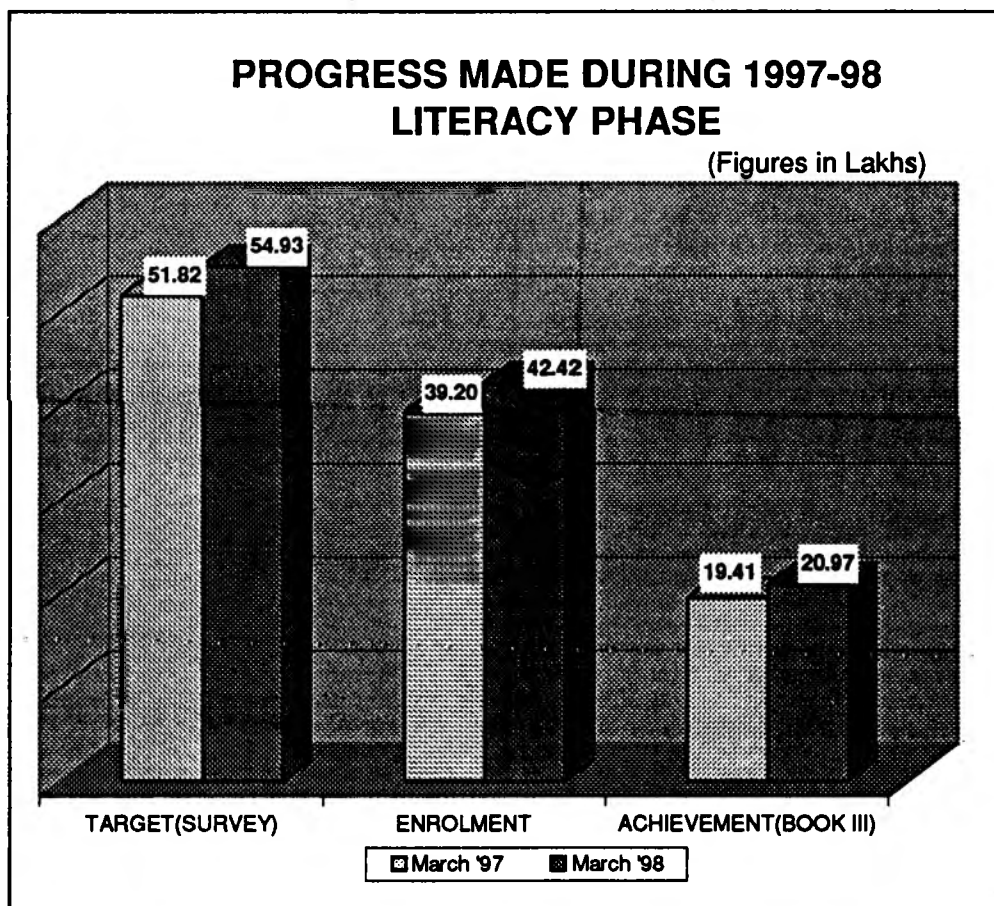
Out of 25.32 lakh targeted neo-literates 8.50 lakh have reportedly completed the PL Book-I which works out to 33.57%. Ganjam district which has the highest target appears to have done well in PL phase. Out of 7.44 lakh target, 4.23 lakh neo-literates have completed PL book-I. The achievement of Balangir district is also fairly good where 1.03 lakh have completed PL Book-I against a target of 2.60 lakh. The achievement figures from Sambalpur and Jharsuguda are awaited.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Continuing Education projects have not been sanctioned to any district in the State.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



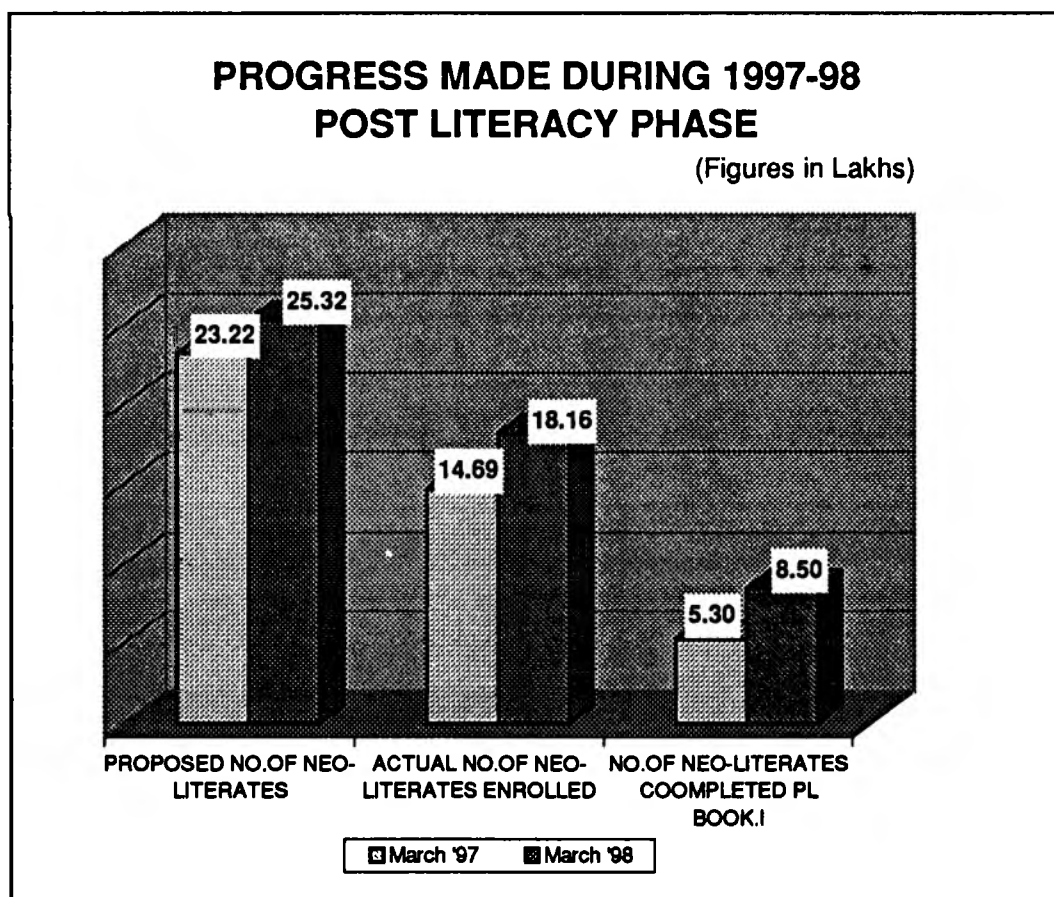
The overall target of the State has increased from 51.82 lakh to 54.93 lakh. This was due to inclusion of the target of two districts, namely, Bargarh and Kandhmal. At the same time the target of Rourkela was revised with a marginal increase.

The enrolment also rose from 39.20 lakh to 42.42 lakh. Good progress was reported from Cuttack, Kalahandi, Kandhmal and the increase in Ganjam was moderate. All other districts remained static.

The achievement also registered a marginal increase from 19.41 lakh to 20.97 lakh. Good progress was reported from Kalahandi, Angul and Sonepur during this period. The progress was moderate in seven districts and it was static in thirteen districts.

The overall achievement percentage against the target was 38.17% which means more than 60% of the targeted learners are still to complete Book-III.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



In the Post Literacy Phase the target increased from 23.22 lakh to 25.32 lakh. This was due to the inclusion of the target of two districts, namely, Sambalpur and Jharsuguda.

The enrolment rose from 14.69 lakh to 18.16 lakh which is a good progress. The enrolment increased substantially in Rourkela, Sundergarh, Kalahandi, Balangir and Nuapada districts. The scenario was static in two districts, namely, Dhenkanal and Malkangiri.

The achievement in post literacy phase also increased from 5.30 lakh to 8.50 lakh. All the PL districts have reported progress. The achievement was relatively good in five districts and it was moderate in four districts.

The overall achievement percentage against the target works out to 33.57% which means more than 65% of the targeted neo-literates are yet to complete PL phase.

4. REPORTING STATUS

All districts except three have submitted the status report of March '98. Names of three districts and the date of last report are: Dhenkanal (February '98), Nayagarh (May '97) and Bargarh (December '97).

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has already been constituted in Orissa State. However, the seed money is yet to be released.

PONDICHERRY

PONDICHERRY

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Pondicherry ranks 24th in population. As per 1991 Census its population was 0.08 million. The male and female population is 0.04 million each. The rural and urban distribution is 0.03 and 0.05 million respectively. The scheduled caste population was 1.31 lakh and there is no scheduled tribes population in Pondicherry.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy scenario of this Union Territory is quite encouraging and it ranks 9th in the country. According to 1991 Census, the literacy rate was 74.74%. The male and female literacy rate was 83.68% and 65.53% respectively. There are four districts. The literacy rate of all the four districts is quite high. The district Mahe had the highest literacy rate of 94.10% where male and female rate was 96.90% and 91.73% respectively. Yanam district stood second with 76.86%. Karaikal district was in third position with 75.78% and Pondicherry district was in fourth position with 73.35% literacy rate.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS - STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

One literacy project was sanctioned in November 1989 covering all the four districts in the UT.

TARGET

The total number of learners identified through survey was 1.01 lakh in 15-45 age-group.

ENROLMENT

Out of 1.01 lakh learners 0.91 lakh learners were reportedly enrolled which works out to 89.59%.

ACHIEVEMENT

The UT has not intimated the number of neo-literates who completed PL Book-I.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed according to which the achievement is 70%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The post literacy project was sanctioned in March 1995.

TARGET

The target under the post literacy was 0.89 lakh neo-literates.

ENROLMENT

Out of 0.89 lakh targeted neo-literates 0.74 lakh neo-literates were reportedly enrolled in the programme which works out to 83.14%.

ACHIEVEMENT

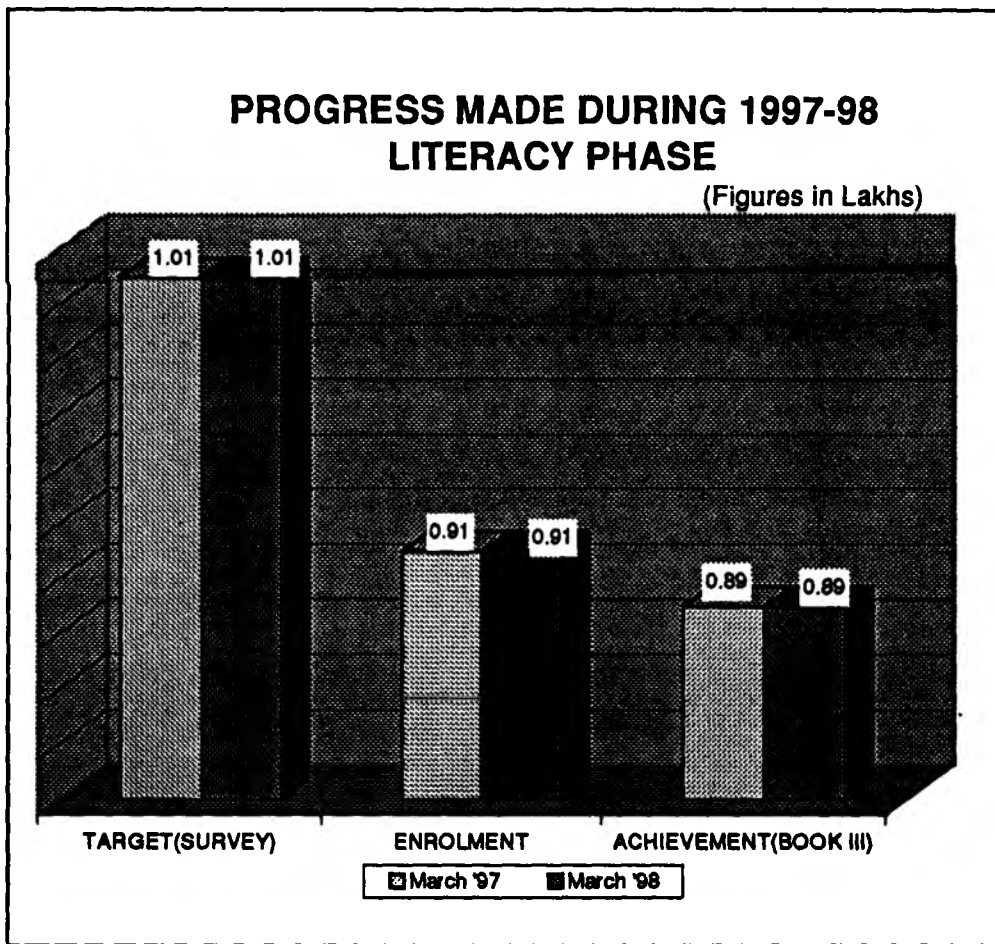
About 0.58 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL book-I.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The UT of Pondicherry was sanctioned Continuing Education Programme in all the four districts. 172 Continuing Education Centres and 28 nodal Continuing Education Centres are proposed to be set up under the CE programme.

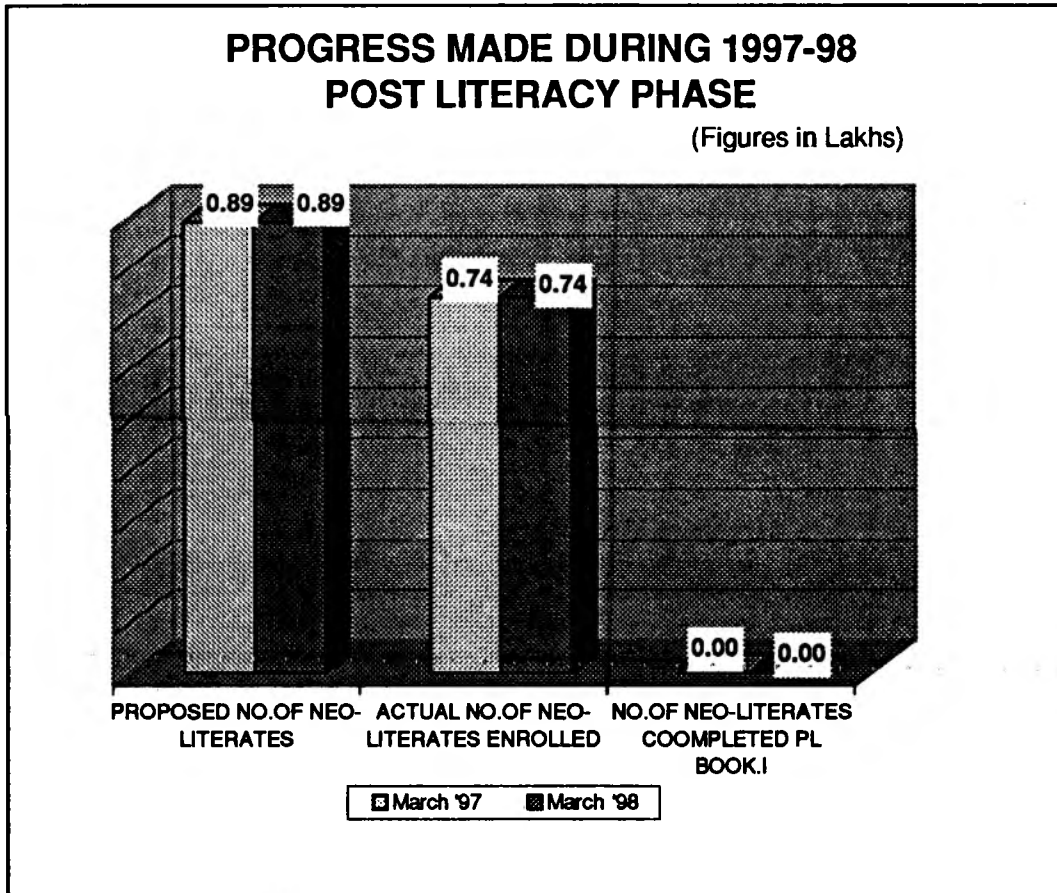
3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

PUNJAB

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

The population of Punjab State was 20.28 million as per 1991 Census. The male and female population was 10.78 million and 9.50 million respectively. The rural and urban break up of the population was 14.29 million and 5.99 million respectively. The scheduled castes population was 5.74 million which works out to 28.31%. There is no scheduled tribes population in the State. There were twelve districts in the State at the time of Census. At present the number of districts has increased to 17.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The literacy rate of Punjab State was slightly above the national average i.e. 58.51%. The male and female literacy rates were 65.66% and 50.41% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 70.74% was recorded in Hoshiarpur. In fact this was the only district which crossed 70% literacy rate. Jullundur district with 68.45% was in second position. Six districts had a literacy rate of more than 60%, namely, Hoshiarpur (70.74%), Jullundur (69.45%), Rupnagar (68.14%), Ludhiana (67.35%), Gurdaspur (61.84%) and Kapurtala (63.31%). Two districts had more than 50% literacy rate, namely, Patiala (58.62%) and Amritsar (58.09%). Four districts had literacy rate in the range of 40-50%, namely, Faridkot (49.42%), Ferozpur (48.01%), Sangrur (46.16%) and Bhatinda had the lowest literacy rate of 43.03%.

The highest female literacy rate of 61.48% was also recorded from Hoshiarpur. Besides, Hoshiarpur, two more districts had more than 60% female literacy. They are: Jullundur (61.33%) and Ludhiana (61.23%). Five districts had more than 50%. They are: Rupnagar (58.54%), Kapurtala (55.83%), Gurdaspur (53.33%), Patiala (50.33%) and

Amritsar (50.10%). Only one district had more than 40%, i.e. Faridkot (41.50%) and three districts had less than 40% female literacy rate, namely, Ferozepur (38.11%), Sangrur (37.86%) and Bhatinda (34.51%) which was lowest in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

The literacy campaigns have been sanctioned to 14 districts. The current status with regard to target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

Out of the fourteen districts, the target is available from twelve districts. Two districts, namely, Gurdaspur and Nanashahr have not yet reported their targets. The target of twelve districts is 19.81 lakh. Two districts, namely, Sangrur and Faridkot had more than 3 lakh learners as their target out of which Sangrur had the highest i.e. 3.80 lakh learners. Ferozepur had more than 2 lakh learners. The target in six districts was in the range of 1-2 lakh and three districts had less than 1 lakh learners. The lowest target of 0.54 lakh was in Fatehgarh Sahib.

ENROLMENT

Only nine districts have reported the enrolment figures as of March 1998. The total enrolment was 7.57 lakh which works out to 38.19%. The enrolment reported is quite good in Faridkot, Hoshiarpur, Jullundur, Ludhiana, Rupnagar and Mansa districts. It was moderate in BGVS Punjab (40%) and it was poor in Sangrur district (23.83%) and Fatehgarh Saheb (24%).

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement for Book-III was available from four districts only. Three districts have done fairly well, i.e. Hoshiarpur (63.32%), Rupnagar (51.29%) and Faridkot (46.61%). The achievement reported by BGVS Punjab was poor which is only 15.03%.

The progress of districts in Punjab is slow and needs to be accelerated. In Jullundur and Ludhiana, the learners have completed Primer-I and in Sangrur the learners have completed Primer-II. The names of the districts along with the date of sanction is as follows: Ludhiana (March '95), Jullundur (March '96) and Sangrur (March '96).

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

Two districts have completed the external evaluation, namely, Hoshiarpur and Rupnagar. The achievement reported is 62% in Hoshiarpur and 71.80% in Rupnagar.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Only three districts have been sanctioned Post Literacy Programme, namely, Hoshiarpur, Faridkot and Rupnagar. One of the blocks in Faridkot district i.e. Kotkapura is under BGVS. The current status is as follows:

TARGET

The proposed target in post literacy is available from three projects, i.e. Hoshiarpur, Faridkot and BGVS projects. 4.38 lakh is the target of these projects. Faridkot has the highest target of 3.11 lakh and the other two districts have less than one lakh as their target.

ENROLMENT

So far 3.25 lakh neo-literates have reportedly been enrolled in the PL programme. The enrolment in Faridkot district was 2.22 lakh against 3.11 lakh target. Hoshiarpur reported 100% enrolment which may not be correct. The BGVS project has 0.33 lakh enrolment against 0.57 lakh target.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 0.73 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I and 1.26 lakh were still participating in the PL phase. In Hoshiarpur district 0.66 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I out of 0.70 lakh target and in BGVS project only 0.07 lakh neo-literates have completed out of 0.57 lakh.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

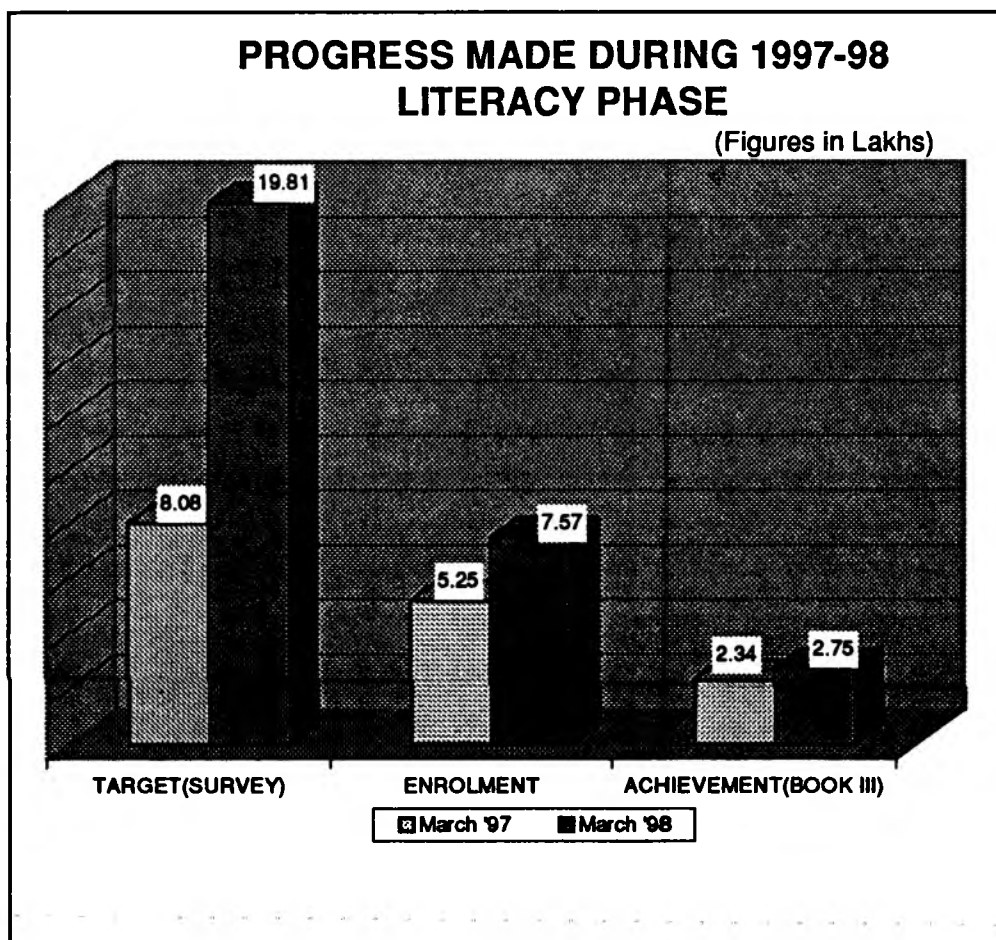
One continuing education project has been sanctioned to Hoshiarpur district in November '97. The district is expected to open 1,000 Continuing Education Centres and 130 nodal CE Centres. The current status is awaited.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The reporting status of Punjab State is not very satisfactory. The latest report available from many districts was for January '98. Faridkot and Ludhiana was for September '96 and Rupnagar the last report was for November '97. Even the PL districts are not reporting the status regularly.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



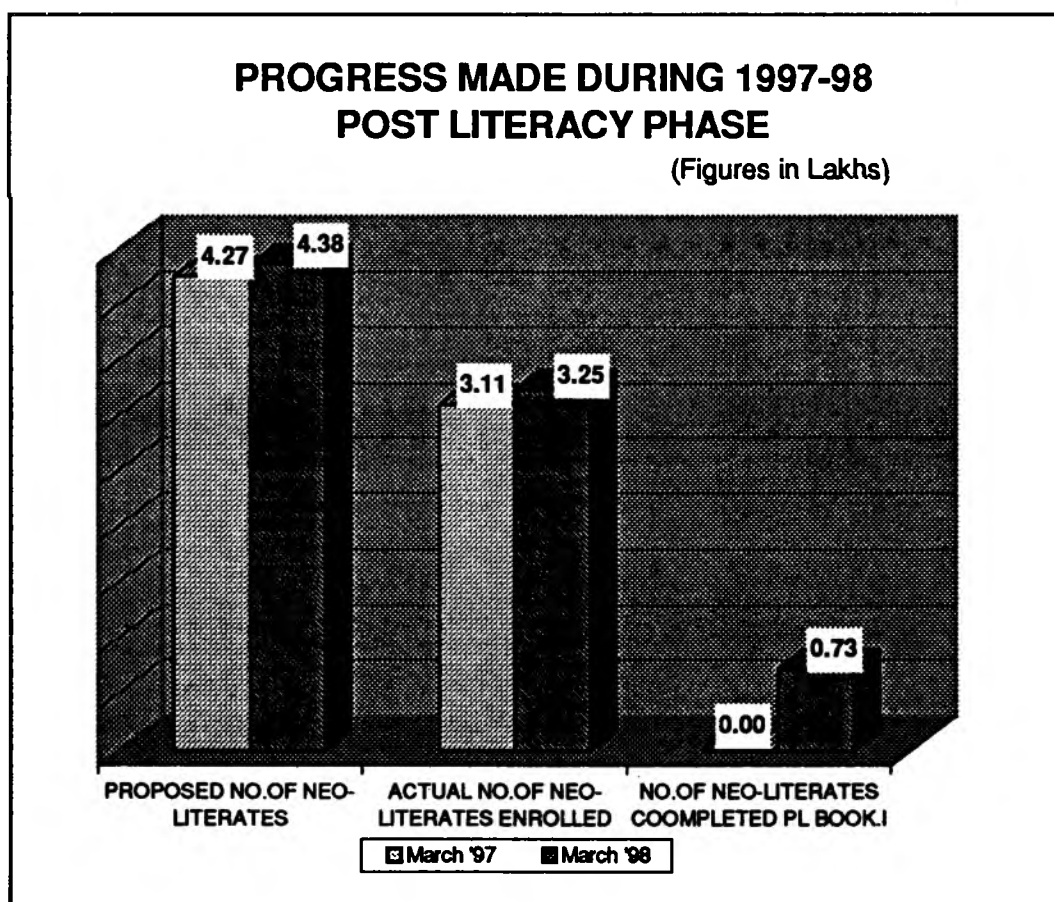
The target in Punjab increased by more than 100% during the year due to inclusion of the target of seven districts. The target increased from 8.08 lakh to 19.81 lakh during the year. The districts which reported the target were Ferozpur, Bhatinda, Jullundur, Patiala, Sangrur, Mansa and Fatehgarh Sahib.

The enrolment increased moderately from 5.25 lakh to 7.57 lakh. Out of 12 districts (which have reported target) nine districts have furnished the enrolment figures. The enrolment figure from Bhatinda, Ferozpur and Patiala are awaited (as on January '98).

During the year there was a marginal increase in the enrolment of only Roopnagar from 0.50 lakh to 0.55 lakh. There was no change in the status of Faridkot, Hoshiarpur, Ludhiana and BGVS, Punjab Project.

The increase in the achievement for Book-III was meagre during the year. It increased from 2.34 lakh to 2.75 lakh. The status improved in only two projects, namely, Roopnagar (from 0.03 lakh to 0.38 lakh) and in BGVS, Punjab Project (from 0.16 lakh to 0.22 lakh). The status of Faridkot and Hoshiarpur did not change during the year.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There was a marginal increase in the target under PL phase from 4.27 lakh to 4.38 lakh. This was due to some alterations in the target of two projects, namely, Hoshiarpur

and BGVS Project. While Hoshiarpur's target increased from 0.56 lakh to 0.70 lakh, BGVS Project's target declined from 0.60 lakh to 0.57 lakh.

The enrolment in PL phase also registered a marginal increase from 3.11 lakh to 3.25 lakh. Hoshiarpur reported increase in enrolment from 0.56 lakh to 0.70 lakh. There was no change in other two projects, namely, Faridkot and BGVS Punjab.

There is a good progress in the achievement front. While it was nil during March '97, it rose to 0.73 by March '98. Hoshiarpur reported a good progress where 0.66 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I out of 0.70 lakh target. The progress of BGVS Punjab Project was moderate where only 0.07 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-II out of 0.57 lakh target.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in the State. However, the seed money has not been released by NLM.

RAJASTHAN

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Rajasthan had a population of 44.01 million out of whom 23.04 million were males and 20.97 million were females. The rural and urban population was 33.94 million and 10.07 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population constitutes 16.93% and 12.23% respectively. The number of districts which was twenty seven at the time of Census has increased to thirty two at present.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Rajasthan is one of the educationally backward States in the country which had only 38.55% literacy rate which is second lowest in the country only next to Bihar. The male and female literacy rates were 54.99% and 20.44% respectively. Rajasthan's female literacy rate was lowest in the country. The highest literacy rate in the State was recorded in Ajmer i.e. 52.34%. In fact this is the only district in the State having a literacy rate above the national average. Kota and Jaipur districts were in second position with 47.88% and Jhunjhunu district was in third position with 47.60%. Nine districts had literacy rate in the range of 40-50%, fourteen districts were in the range of 30-40%, and three districts with less than 30% literacy rate. Barmer district had lowest literacy rate of only 22.98%.

The status of female literacy was dismal. The highest female literacy rate of 34.50% was recorded in Ajmer and the lowest 7.68% was in Barmer district. Kota had the second highest with 29.50% and Jaipur was in the third position with 28.69%. Seven districts were in the range of 20-30% and seventeen districts were in 10-20% range.

There were two districts, namely, Barmer (7.68%) and Jalore (7.75%) with a single digit female literacy rate.

1. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the thirty two districts have been sanctioned with literacy programme. The current status is as follows:

TARGET:

All the thirty two districts in the State have completed the door to door survey and have identified 91.17 lakh learners. Udaipur district had the highest number of learners i.e. 5.55 lakhs followed by Jodhpur 4.95 lakh and Nagaur district was in the third position with 4.70 lakh. Four districts had a target of more than 4 lakh, eight districts with more than 3 lakh, thirteen districts with more than 2 lakh and five districts had a target of more than one lakh learners. Only one district had a target of less than one lakh i.e. Jaisalmer which had only 0.99 lakh learners.

ENROLMENT

As on March 1998, 77.29 lakh learners have reportedly been enrolled in thirty two districts which works out to 84.78%. Four districts have reported 100% enrolment. They are Ajmer, Banswara, Bharatpur and Hanumangarh. The enrolment figures of the State in general is quite encouraging as it is more than 80%.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 28.62 lakh learners against 91.17 lakh target have reportedly completed Primer-III which works out to 31.39% achievement. Out of thirty two districts the

achievement figure for Primer III is available from twenty three districts. The highest achievement of 89.80% was reported from Ajmer where the programme was implemented by the district authorities on their own. Bharatpur stood in second position with 80.96% followed by Dungarpur with 79.26% achievement. Besides these, districts which have done considerably well are Pali (66.86%), Chittorgarh (62.17%), Jhunjhunu (61.34%), Tonk (63.40%), Udaipur (59.69%), Rajsamand (54.76%). The districts with moderate achievement are Sikar (44.75%) and Sawai Madhopur (31.93%). There are many districts which are dragging with very poor achievement. The details of the districts along with the sanction dates and achievement so far is as follows:

Alwar (24.86%), Baran (20.89%) both sanctioned in 1994; Banswara (14.04%), Barmer (27.20%), Bhilwara (29.37%), Bikaner (29.68%), Jodhpur (28.84%), Karauli (25.64%), Nagaur (6.47%) all sanctioned in 1995; Dholpur (0.19%), Sriganganagar (0.37%) and Sirohi (3.71%) sanctioned in 1996.

Some districts are dragging without any achievement for Book-III. The names along with sanction date are as follows: Bundi (1995) and Churu, Jaisalmer, Jalore, Jhalawar, Kota, Dausa, Hanumangarh (all sanctioned in 1996) .

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation of twelve districts has been completed so far. They are: Ajmer (85.01%), Alwar (19.34%), Banswara (36.54%), Bharatpur (64%), Chittorgarh (48.56%), Dungarpur (91.90%), Jhunjhunu (36.54%), Pali (45%), Sikar (21%), Tonk (25.40%), Udaipur (60.52%) and Baran (24.89%).

There is a big difference in the achievement reported in the external evaluation report and the monitoring reports of 4 districts. The names of the districts along with achievement figures are as follows:

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to eighteen districts. The status of these districts is given below:

TARGET

Out of eighteen districts, the proposed target under post literacy is available from 12 districts. The total target of these districts is 24.86 lakh. Banswara has the highest target of 2.85 lakhs. Seven districts have more than 2 lakh target and five districts have more than 1 lakh target.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment figures are available from eight districts only. So far 13.82 lakh neo-literates have been enrolled which works out to 59.51%. Banswara reported 100% enrolment. Tonk (41.10%) and Sikar (54%) have reported lower enrolment.

ACHIEVEMENT

The number of neo-literates who have completed PL Book-I is available from seven districts i.e. 5.36 lakh. In Ajmer and Bharatpur a considerable number of neo-literates have completed PL Book-I i.e. 1.73 lakh and 1.67 lakh respectively. In all other districts the number was less than a lakh.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

In Rajasthan Continuing Education Programme was sanctioned to Ajmer and Dungarpur. In Ajmer and Dungarpur 967 and 483 CECs and 131 and 57 NCECs are sanctioned.

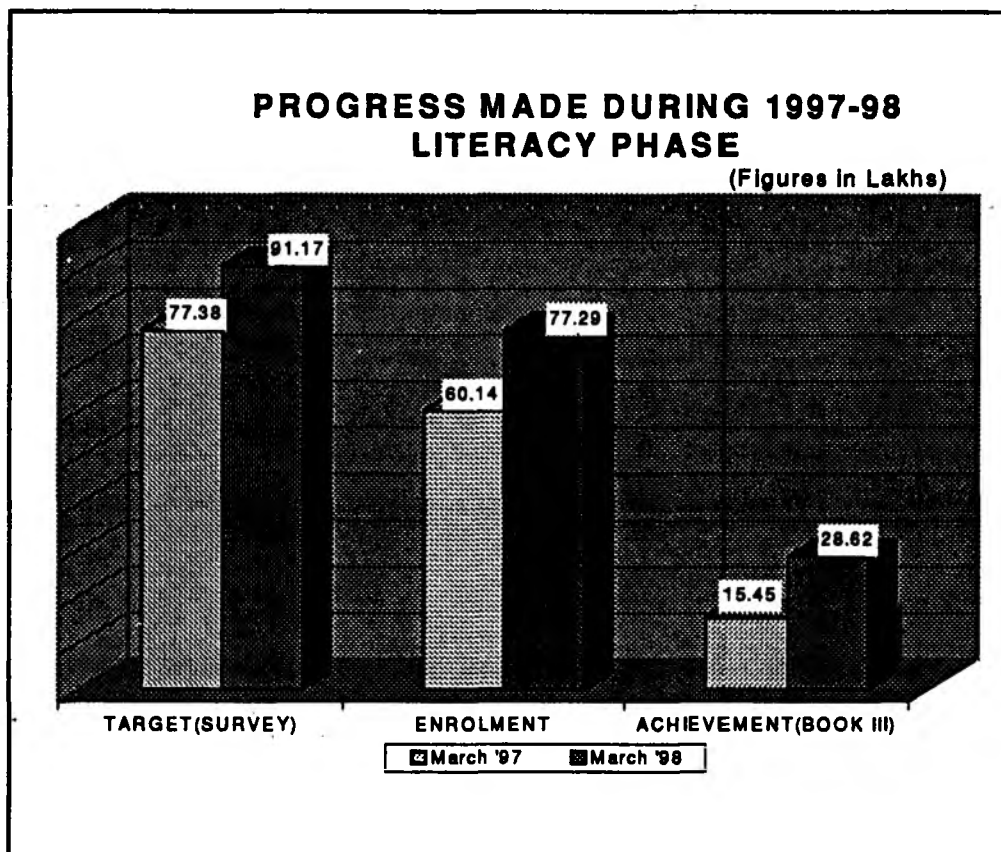
The current status of the Continuing Education Programme in these districts is awaited.

2. REPORTING STATUS

While most of the districts have submitted the status report for March 1998 except Bikaner which has submitted report for the month of January '98.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE

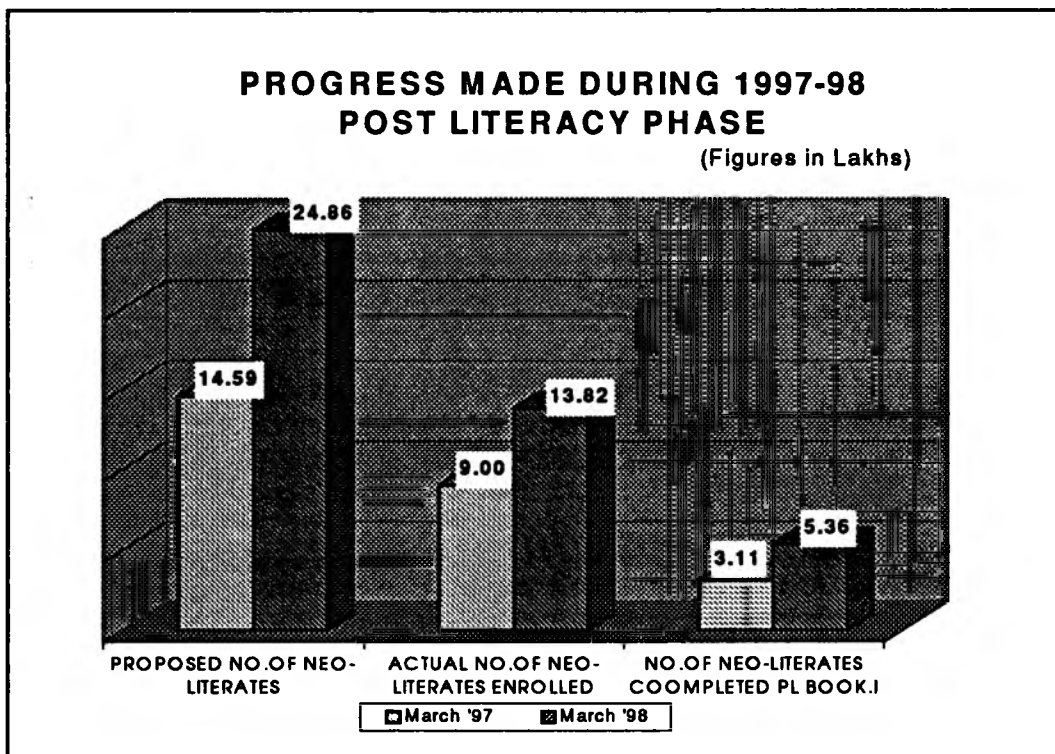


The target for coverage in Literacy Phase increased considerably in Rajasthan which can be noticed from the above graph. The target increased from 77.38 lakh to 91.17 lakh during the year. This was mainly due to the inclusion of the target of six districts, namely, Churu, Jaipur, Jaisalmer, Jalore, Kota, Hanumangarh and Karauli.

The enrolment during this period rose from 60.14 lakh to 77.29 lakh during this period. There was a good progress in eight districts and it was moderate in four districts. The status was static in Pati, Sikar, Rajsamand, Ajmer, Banswara, Sikar, Tonk, Jodhpur and Rajsamand districts. The progress was moderate in Alwar, Banswara, Jhunjhunu and Pati. Some districts which had nil achievement in March '97 have made a good progress during the year. They are: Barmer, Bikaner, Chittorgarh, Nagaur, Baran, Swai Madhopur and Sirohi.

The status did not change in some of the districts. They are: Ajmer, Bharatpur, Dungarpur. Some of the districts which had nil achievement in 1997 have continued to be with the same status in March '98 also. They are: Bundi, Churu, Dholpur, Ganganagar, Jaipur, Jaisalmer, Jalore, Jhalawar, Kota, Dausa and Hanumangarh.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There is considerable increase in the target under PL phase which has increased from 14.59 lakh to 24.86 lakh during the year. This was because of inclusion of the target of five more districts, namely, Alwar, Baren, Chittorgarh, Jhunjhunu and Bhilwara. Meanwhile the target of Tonk and Banswara have also increased during the period.

The enrolment rose from 9.00 lakh to 13.82 lakh. Only one district, i.e. Pali reported a good progress where the enrolment increased from 1.28 lakh to 1.78 lakh. The increase was marginal in Tonk and Sikar. The progress in Banswara was substantial where the enrolment rose from Nil ('97) to 2.85 lakh ('98). The enrolment of Bhilwara district is a new addition during the year. The status of Ajmer, Dungarpur and Bharatpur remained static.

The achievement for PL Book-I also registered a marginal increase from 3.11 lakh to 5.36 lakh. There was a good progress in Ajmer, Bharatpur and Pali. The achievement of Sikar was new addition. The increase was marginal in Dungarpur and Tonk. The status did not change in Pali during the year.

6. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in Rajasthan and a sum of Rs.25 lakh has been released towards seed money.

TAMIL NADU

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Tamil Nadu is one of the larger State having a population of 55.86 million and ranks 7th in the country as per 1991 Census. 28.30 million were males and 27.56 million were females. The rural and urban distribution was 36.78 million and 19.07 million respectively. The scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population was 10.71 million and 0.57 million respectively which works out to 19.18% and 1.03% respectively. There were twenty one districts at the time of Census. Eight new districts have been carved out taking the total number to twenty nine.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Tamil Nadu ranks 12th in the country in literacy rate which was 62.66%. The literacy rate among males was 73.75% and females 51.33%. Literacy rate among SC and ST was 46.74% and 27.89% respectively.

Kanyakumari had the highest literacy rate i.e. 88.06%, Chennai (Madras) was in the second position with 81.60%. Two districts, namely Nilgiris and Chidambaranar had more than 70% literacy rate. The literacy rate in 10 districts was in the range of 60-70%. Six districts were in the range of 50-60%. It is very interesting to note that there was only one district in the State having a literacy rate of less than the national average, i.e. Dharmapuri with 46.02%.

The female literacy rate was highest in Kanyakumari district i.e. 78.39% and lowest in Dharmapuri district which was 34.23%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All districts in the State have been covered under the programme. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

All the districts have reported the target after survey which is 90.08 lakh. Salem district had the highest number of learners i.e. 8.38 lakh. Coimbatore and Dharmapuri Districts were having more than 6 lakh learners. Velur and Thiruvannamalai districts had more than 5 lakh. Four districts had a target of more than 4 lakh and six districts were having more than 3 lakh, five districts had more than 2 lakh and five districts were having more than 1 lakh learners as their target. There is only one district i.e. Nilgiris which had a target of less than 1 lakh i.e. 0.74 lakh.

ENROLMENT

The State reported an impressive enrolment which was 82.41 lakh and it works out to 91.49% against target. Almost all the districts have enrolled good number of learners except Chennai City where only 0.30 lakh learners have been enrolled out of 3.12 lakh identified learners.

Seven districts have reported 100% enrolment which may not be correct. They are: Kanyakumari, Ramanathapuram, Cuddalore, Thiruchirapalli, Dindigal, Perambalur and Karur.

ACHIEVEMENT

The achievement figures for Book-III are available from 22 districts. So far 57.73 lakh learners have completed Book-III as per March 1998 report which works out to 64.09% achievement against target. Four districts i.e. Kancheepuram, Chennai City, Villupuram and Karur have not yet reported any achievement. Among these districts Kancheepuram, Madras City and Thiruvarur have completed more than 3 years and Villupuram completed more than 2 years without any achievement.

Three districts, namely, Virudhunagar, Ramanathapuram and Dindigal have reported 100% achievement which may not be correct. Erode district is in the second position with 98.89%. There are three districts (including Erode) which have reported more than 90% achievement. Six districts have reported achievement in the range of 80-90%. Two districts were in the range of 70-80% and six districts were in the range of 60-70% achievement. Two districts have reported achievement in the range of 40-50%. Nagapatnam reported an achievement of 44.01% which was lowest in the State.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in seventeen districts. As per the external evaluation report, the achievement of Ramanathapuram is the highest i.e. 96.30%, Pudukottai is in second position with 96.26% and Madurai stood third position with 94.14%. The status of other districts is as follows: Kanyakumari (90%), Cuddalore (90%), Dindigal (88.47%), Virudhunagar (87.24%), Coimbatore (85.12%), Sivagangai (82.69%), Thanjavur (81.95%), Velur (67%), Thiruvarur (64.99%), Erode (58%), Karur (49.56%), Perambalur (48.19%) and Nagapatnam (47%).

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Post Literacy projects have been sanctioned to twenty districts in the State. The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

Out of 20 Post Literacy Projects sanctioned so far the target was reported by 19 districts. 58.18 lakh neo-literates are to be covered in the State. Coimbatore had the highest target which is 6.25 lakh neo-literates. Salem is in second position with 5.43 lakh. Two districts, namely Thiruvavur and Dharmapuri have a target of 4 lakh neo literates. Five districts have a target in the range of 3-4 lakhs, 6 districts in the range of 2-3 lakhs and 2 districts have a target of 1-2 lakh neo-literates. Kanyakumari and Sivagangai districts have less than one lakh as their target. The lowest target is from Sivagangai which is 0.69 lakh.

ENROLMENT

The total number of neo-literates enrolled in 19 post literacy districts is 54 .70 lakh which works out to 94% against the target. Nine districts have reported 100% enrolment which may not be correct. They are: PMT Sivaganga, Kanyakumari, Kamarajar, North Arcot Ambedkar, Madurai, Ramanathapuram, Dindigal Anna, Tiruchirapalli and Perambalur. Almost all the post literacy projects have done well in enrolling the neo-literates except Nagapatinam district where only 1.55 lakh neo-literates were reportedly enrolled out of 3.63 lakh target.

ACHIEVEMENT

27.33 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I against a target of 58.18 lakh which works out to 46.97%. Out of 19 post literacy districts from

where post literacy programme reports have been received, the achievement figures from six districts is awaited. The achievement status of all those districts which have reported so far is quite encouraging except two districts, namely, Cuddalore and Salem. While in Salem 1.59 lakh neo-literates have completed the PL Book-I against a target of 5.43 lakh, in Cuddalore only 0.25 lakh have completed PL Book-I against 2.54 lakh target.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

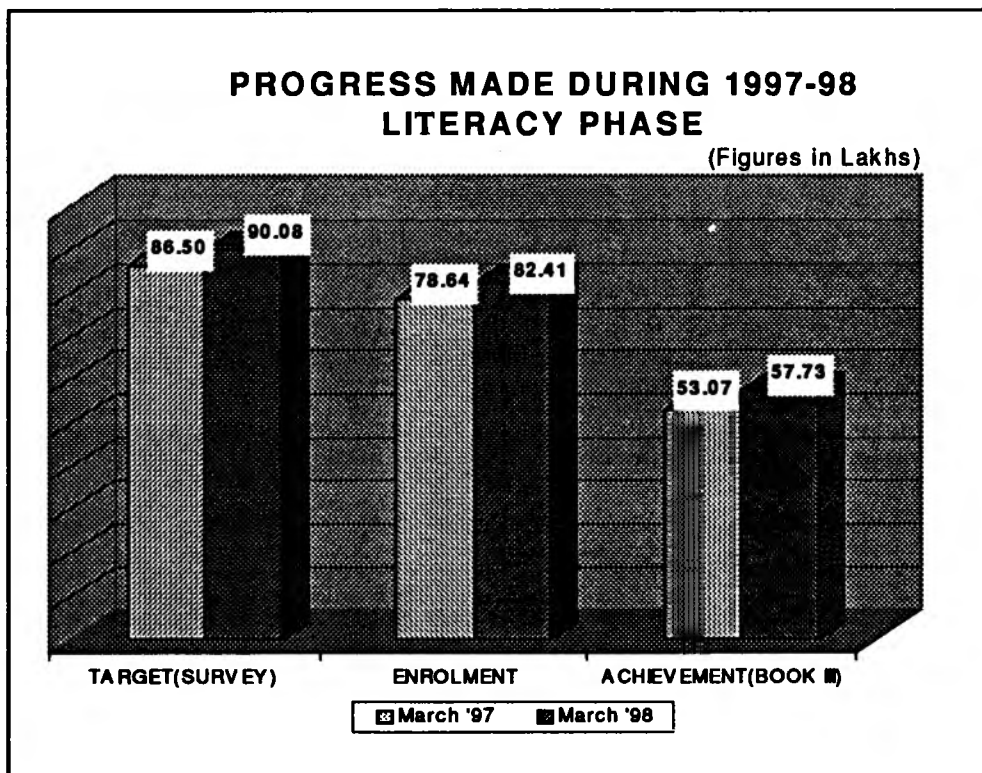
None of the post literacy projects have been evaluated so far.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Continuing Education Projects have been sanctioned to following nine districts: Kanyakumari, Tirunelveli, Virudhunagar, Sivagangai, Ramanathapuram, Pudukottai, Madurai, Theni, Vellore.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE

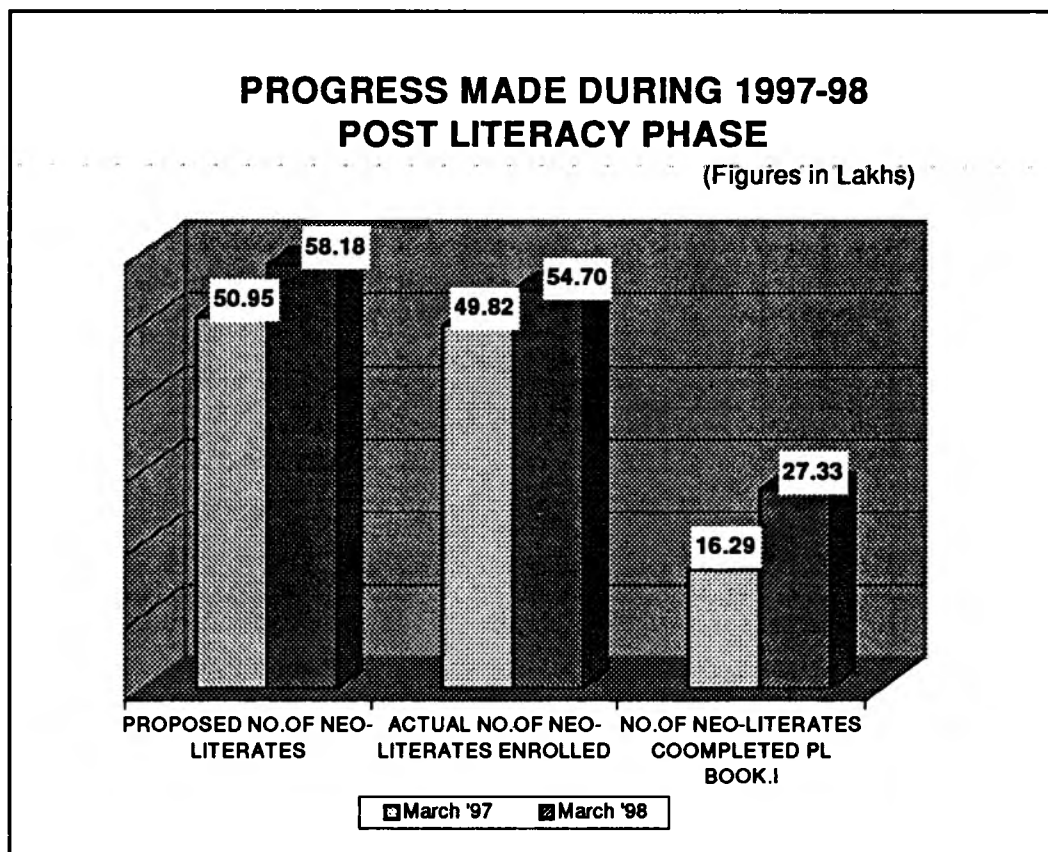


The total target of the State increased marginally from 86.50 lakh to 90.07 lakh. This was mainly due to the readjustment of targets of some new districts carved out during the year. In fact the target of Tiruchirapalli was 7.21 lakh in March '97 which was highest in the State was now declined to 2.87 lakh due to reorganisation of districts.

The enrolment rose from 78.63 lakh to 82.41 lakh during the year. Good progress was reported from Coimbatore, Dharmapuri and Salem. The status did not change in other districts. The project in Chennai City appears to be dragging since only 0.30 lakh learners have been enrolled out of 3.12 lakh target. There is absolutely no change in its status during the year.

The achievement increased from 53.07 lakh to 57.73 lakh. Good achievement was reported from Coimbatore and Thiruvannamalai and the progress was moderate in six districts, namely, Dharmapuri, Periyar, Salem, Thanjavur, The Nilgiris and in Nagapattinam. The scenario remained static in rest of the districts.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



The target increased from 50.95 lakh to 58.18 lakh during the year. This was due to the inclusion of the target of Dharmapuri and Perambalur, besides increase in the targets of Nagapattinam and Thanjavur.

The enrolment of Tamil Nadu has increased from 49.82 lakh to 54.70 lakh. This was mainly due to the inclusion of the target of two more districts, namely, Dharmapuri and Perambalur. In addition to this three districts have reported good progress. They are Coimbatore, Nagapattinam and South Arcot.

There is a substantial progress in the achievement (PL Book-I) from 16.29 lakh to 27.33 lakh. This is mainly due to the good progress made by Dindigal Anna, Periyar, Salem and South Arcot. The status of remaining districts did not change.

4. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted and the seed money to SLMA is not yet released from Central Government.

TRIPURA

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Tripura is one of the smaller States in North East Region having a population of 2.75 million as per 1991 Census. 1.41 million were males and 1.33 million were females. The rural and urban population was 2.33 million and 0.42 million respectively. The scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population was 4.51 lakhs and 8.53 lakhs, i.t. 16.36% and 30.95% respectively. There were only three districts at the time of Census. One new district, viz. Dhalai, has been carved out taking the figure to four.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The State had a literacy rate of 60.44% which is above the national average. The male literacy rate was 70.58% and that of female was 49.65%. West Tripura recorded 65.83% literacy rate which was highest followed by North Tripura 60.37% and South Tripura with 51.35%.

The female literacy rate was highest in West Tripura with 55.15% followed by North Tripura 50.31% and South Tripura with 39.75%.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the four districts have been sanctioned literacy projects. The status of these projects is as follows.

TARGET

Four lakh learners have been reportedly identified through survey. The highest target of 2.16 lakh learners were identified in West Tripura. In South Tripura it was 1.47 lakh. North Tripura had 0.69 lakh and the lowest target of 0.57 lakh was identified in the new district Dhalai.

ENROLMENT

So far 4.28 lakh learners have reportedly been enrolled which works out to 87.39%. The enrolment of all the four projects is fairly good.

ACHIEVEMENT

3.55 lakh learners have reportedly completed Book-III which works out to 72.49% achievement. All the four districts have more than 60% achievement. South Tripura reported highest achievement of 82.20% followed by West Tripura with 70.08%, North Tripura with 66.43% and Dhalai with 63.95%.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation of three projects have been completed. The achievement as per the report was as follows: North Tripura 72.21%, South Tripura 82% and West Tripura 70%.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

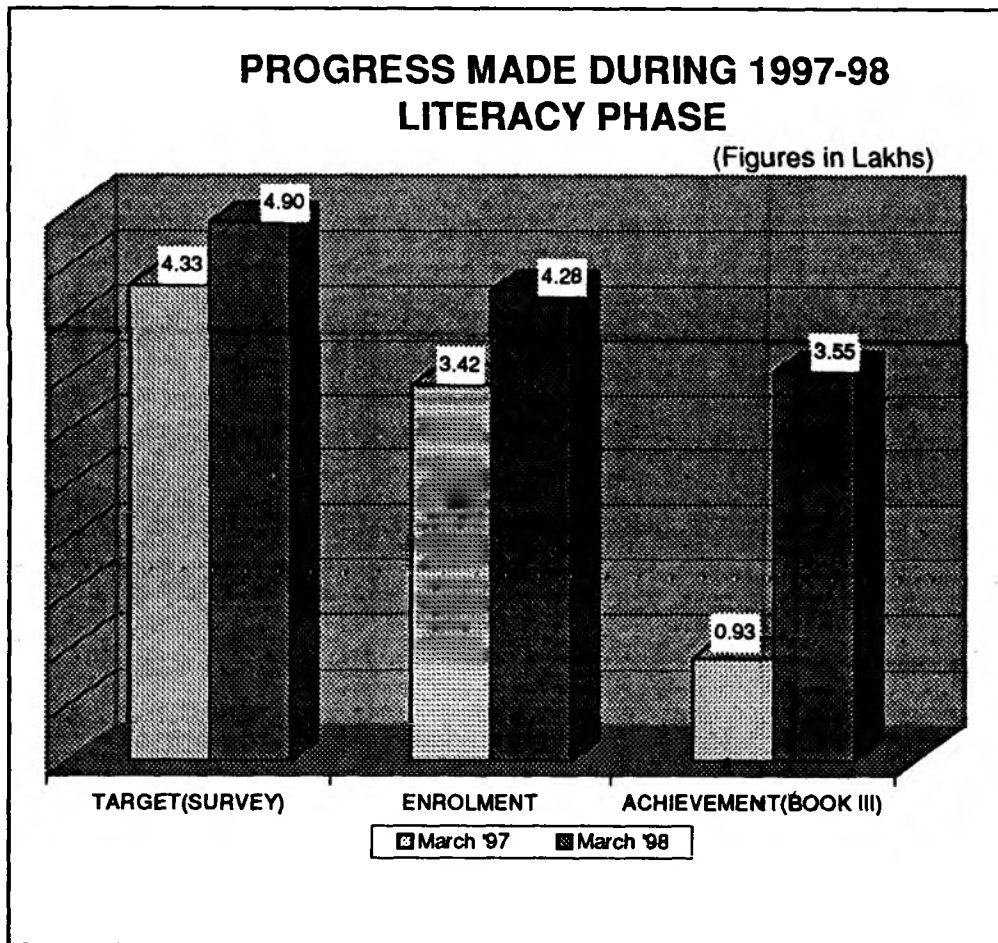
Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to all the four districts. West Tripura and North Tripura were sanctioned in January and February 1997, South Tripura and Dhalai were sanctioned in Aug.97. The current status regarding the target, enrolment etc. is awaited from the State.

3. REPORTING STATUS

The status report for March '98 was available from all the 4 districts. However, the post literacy status is awaited.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



The target of the State for coverage of non-literates has increased from 4.33 lakh to 4.90 lakh. This was due to the fact that one more district which was carved out of the existing districts has reported its target.

There is a significant improvement in the enrolment. It is increased from 3.42 lakh to 4.28 lakh. There is a considerable increase in the enrolment figures of North Tripura district which has increased from 0.39 lakh to 0.50 lakh. Dhalai reported enrolled 0.46 lakh learners. There is a marginal increase in enrolment figures of South and West Tripura.

There is a good progress in achievement status during the year. The achievement of the State has increased from 0.93 lakh to 3.55 lakh. There is a considerable improvement in achievement of the districts of North Tripura, South Tripura and West Tripura. The achievement reported by Dhalai is 0.36 lakh (63.95%).

4. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has not been constituted in the State.

UTTAR PRADESH

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

Uttar Pradesh is the largest State in India. According to 1991 Census, the State had a population of 139.11 million (74.04 million were males and 65.07 million were females). The rural-urban population was 111.50 million and 27.60 million respectively. The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population was 29.27 million and 0.29 million respectively which works out to 21.04% and 0.21% of the total population. There were 63 districts at the time of Census. Twenty new districts have been carved out taking the number to 83.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

Uttar Pradesh is one of the educationally backward States and ranks 27th in the country. The literacy rate as per 1991 Census was 41.60% which is far behind the national average of 52.21%. The male and female literacy rate was 55.73% and 25.31% respectively. The total number of illiterates in 7+ age group was 64.76 million out of whom 26.29 million are males and 38.47 million are females, which means the number of female illiterates outnumber males.

Out of 63 districts (now 83) only ten districts had the literacy rate higher than the national average. Dehradun recorded 69.50% literacy rate which was highest in the State followed by Kanpur Nagar with 68.75% and Garhwal was in third position with 65.35%. It is interesting to note that there were only four districts having a literacy rate of more than 60%. Eleven districts were in the range of 50% to 60%. Twenty two districts had the literacy rate in the range 40% to 50%, nineteen districts were in 30% to

40% range and seven districts were in 20% to 30% range. Bahraich district recorded a literacy rate of 24.39% which was lowest in the State.

As far as female literacy is concerned a wide gap exists in the State. Dehradun district has a highest female literacy rate i.e. 59.26%. In fact there are only two districts i.e. Dehradun (59.26%) and Kanpur Nagar (58.82%) where literacy rate was in the range of 50% to 60%. Two districts, namely Garhwal (49.44%) and Nainital (43.19%) were also fairly good in female literacy. 19 districts have less than 20% female literacy rate. Maharajganj district recorded lowest female literacy rate with 10.28% and Baharaich was in second position with 10.73%. The gap between the male and female literacy rate in some districts is so wide that the female literacy rate is not even half of male literacy rate, e.g. Uttarkashi has 68.74% male literacy rate whereas the female literacy rate was only 23.57%, Tehri Garhwal had a male literacy rate of 72.10% and only 26.41% for females, Hardoi 49.45% males, 19.75% females, similar is the case with many more districts in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS - STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the districts in the State have been sanctioned literacy projects. The status of these projects in term of target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The total number of learners identified through survey is 189.15 lakh. Moradabad district which is implementing the programme in two phases had the highest number of illiterates i.e. 8.55 lakhs followed by Lakhimpur Kheeri with 8.13 lakh learners. There are six districts with more than 5 lakh learners, ten districts with more than 4 lakh learners, ten districts with more than 3 lakh learners, twelve

districts with more than 2 lakh learners and twenty districts with more than one lakh learners. There are only five districts with less than 1 lakh illiterates. They are Chamoli, Pithoragarh, Tehri Garwal, Uttar Kashi and Pauri Garwal.

Out of 72 projects sanctioned so far 6 projects have not completed the survey. Among these, Meerut is the oldest project sanctioned in November 1995. Other districts are: Varanasi (Nov. 96), Nainital (Feb.97), Udham Singh Nagar (Feb.97), Hardwar (Mar.97) and Ambedkar Nagar (Mar.97). All other projects have completed the door to door survey.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment figures for the State appears to be quite impressive. So far 129.89 lakh learners have been reportedly enrolled which works out to 68.67% of the target. The enrolment figure from 18 projects is still awaited. Some districts have not reported the enrolment figures even after 1 – 2 years of their sanction. They are Balia, Etah, Nainital, Sitapur, Varanasi, Kanpur Nagar, Maharajganj, Meerut, Gorakhpur, Lucknow, Padrauna, Mahoba, Pauri Garwal, Udham Singh Nagar, Haridwar, Ambedkar Nagar, Kushinagar.

In one district, namely, Bulandshahr the enrolment was extremely poor. Out of 3.83 lakh learners identified through survey only 0.05 lakh learners have been reportedly enrolled. Some districts have reported 100% enrolment which may not be true. They are Basti, Hardoi, Pilibhit, Hamirpur and Bhadohi.

ACHIEVEMENT

Out of 72 projects sanctioned so far, the achievement figures for Primer-III is available from 42 districts. Almost all the projects have completed more than one year since their sanction. The achievement reported by the State so far is very

poor. Only 46.26 lakh learners have reportedly completed Primer-III which works out to 24.45% of the target. There are three districts where the programme is in existence for the last 4 years and none of the learners have reportedly completed Book-3. They are Lakhimpur Kheeri, Uttar Kashi and Mau. Six districts have not reported any achievement figure for the last 3 years. They are Gonda, Hardoi, Pillibhit, Sidharthnagar, Kanpur Dehat (Phase II), Bulandshahr. There are 5 districts without any achievement for the last 2 years. They are Aligarh, Balia, Etah, Sitapur and Kanpur Nagar.

The performance is very poor in 11 districts. The programme in Dehradun is in existence for the last 5 years and the achievement so far is only 17.82%. Similar is the case with some other districts like Ghazipur (17.43%), Pithorgarh (25.65%), Rai Bareilly (10%), Mathura (27.58%) and Sultanpur (21.67%) where the programme is going on for the last 4 years. Unnao, Jaunpur, Badaun districts have completed more than 3 years and their achievement so far is 9.86%, 27.16% and 12.44% respectively. The programme in Banda and Rampur districts is in existence for the last two years and the achievement so far is only 10.96% and 9.96% respectively.

Among the districts which have performed very well, Agra tops the list with 92.72% achievement followed by Shahjahanpur with 89.21% and Kanpur Dehat is in third position with 89.07%. Ghaziabad district which implemented the programme in two phases also achieved a good success with 86.99% achievement in the first phase and 72.90% in the second phase and the overall achievement was 78.34%. Allahabad is another district which has done well where the achievement was more than 80%. The achievement of Chamoli, Farrukhabad and Etawah was in the range of 70-80% and it was between 60-70% in Deoria, Fatehpur and Faizabad. The achievement rate in Jalaun, Moradabad was between 50-60% and in Almorah, Azamgarh, Baharauch, Mirzapur,

Mainpuri, Tehri Garhwal between 40-50% and in Barabunki, Bareilly, Basti, Lalitpur, Bijnor, Mussafar Nagar between 30-40%.

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in only five districts, namely, Agra, Almorah, Bareilly, Fatehpur and Moradabad Phase I. Among them the success rate of Agra is highest which is 70.76%, Moradabad Phase II is 62.80%. Bareilly and Fatehpur have 59% and 58% achievement respectively. Almorah has the lowest achievement with 38.10%.

There are number of districts where the external evaluation is due. They are Allahabad, Chamoli, Deoria, Faizabad, Farrukhabad, Gaziabad Phase II, Jalaun, Shahjahanpur, Kanpur Dehat, Morabad Phase II and Etawah.

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

Post Literacy Projects have been sanctioned to only eleven districts in the State (March 1998 status). The status of these projects is as follows:

TARGET

Out of eleven districts, only six districts have reported their target. They are Agra, Almorah, Fatehpur, Moradabad Phase I, Gaziabad, Kanpur Dehat. The total number of neo-literates to be covered by these districts was 12.24 lakh. While Agra and Fatehpur had a target of more than 3 lakh neo-literates Moradabad Phase I had a target of 2.61 lakh neo-literates. The target of other

three districts was less than 1 lakh i.e. Almorah, 0.70 lakh, Gaziabad Ph.I 0.45 lakh and Kanpur Dehat 0.99 lakh.

ENROLMENT

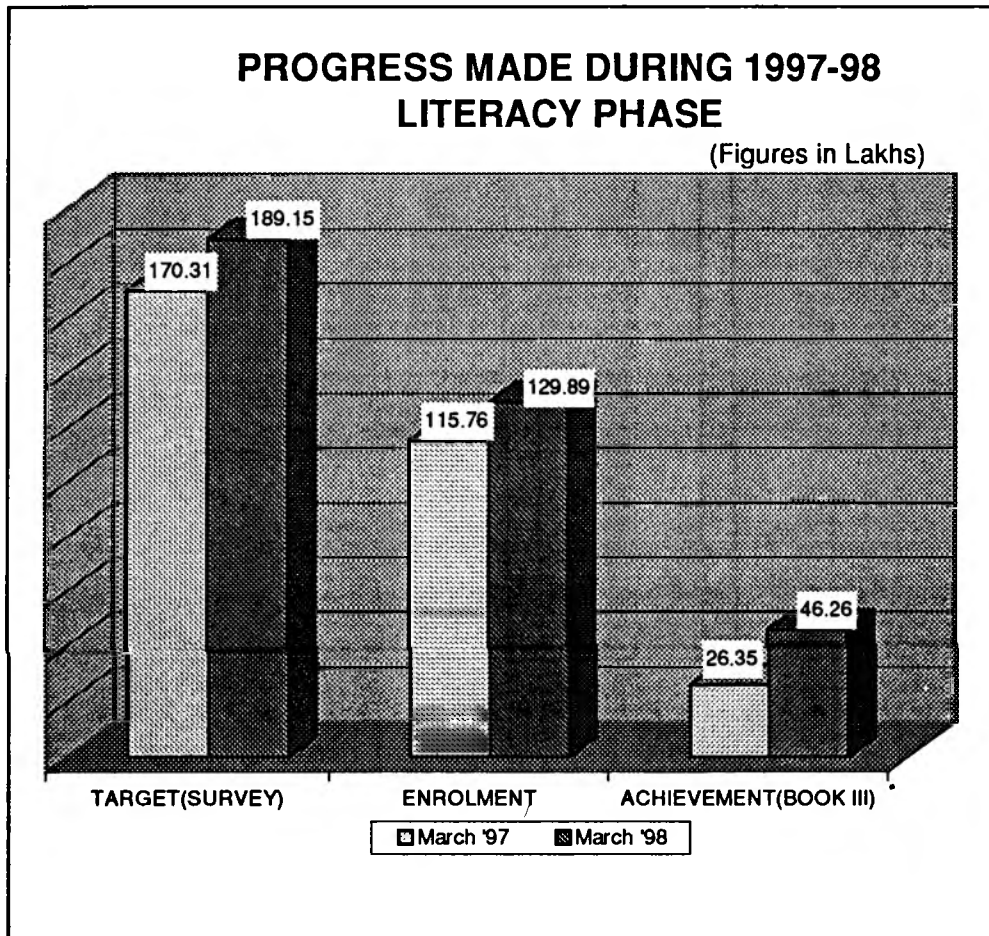
Out of 12.24 lakh targetted neo-literates 8.85 lakh neo-literates have reportedly enrolled in five districts. The enrolment figure from Kanpur Dehat is awaited. The enrolment reported by Agra district and Moradabad Phase I is 100% which may not be realistic. The enrolment in Fatehpur district is 45.22%, Almorah 68% and Gaziabad 49%.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 5.98 lakh (48.85% of target) neo-literates have completed PL Book-I in only 4 districts, namely Agra, Fatehpur, Moradabad and Gaziabad. In Agra all the targetted neo-literates i.e. 3.93 lakh have reportedly completed PL Book-I. In Fatehpur 1.14 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I which works out to 32% of the targetted neo-literates. In Moradabad and Gaziabad 0.75 lakh and 0.16 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book I which works out to 28.70% and 35.55% respectively.

3. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE



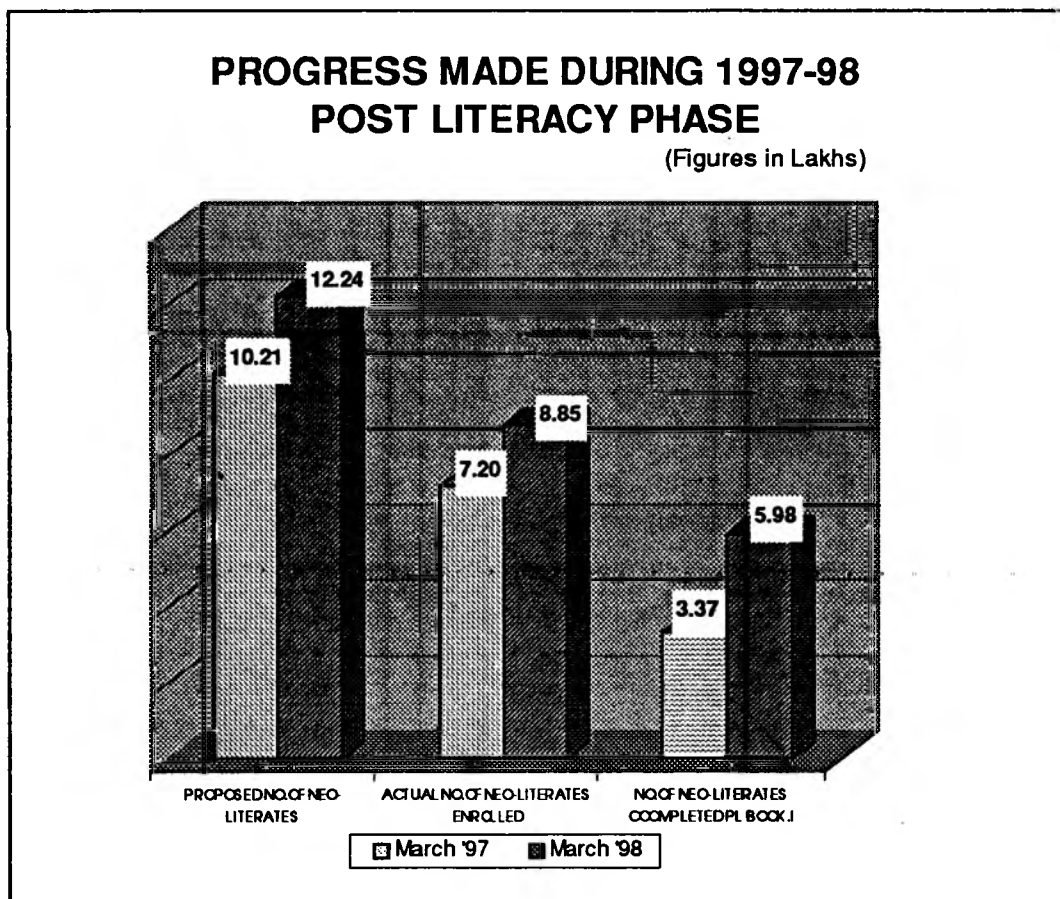
The target for coverage in literacy phase has increased from 170.31 lakh to 189.15 lakh. This was due to the inclusion of the target of seven districts during the year. Besides, some of the districts have also altered the targets and have reported revised targets.

The enrolment also increased considerably during the period from 115.76 lakh to 129.89 lakh. Good progress was reported from five districts, namely, Ghazipur,

Lakhimpur Kheri, Lalithpur, Pratapgarh and Muzzaffarpur. The progress was moderate in 17 districts and it was static in 44 districts.

The achievement also has increased considerably from 26.35 lakh to 46.26 lakh. Good progress was reported from 20 districts and it was moderate in twelve districts. The status did not change in 38 districts during the year.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There is some progress in the scenario of PL projects in UP. The target has increased from 10.21 lakh to 12.24 lakh. This was due to the inclusion of the target of Kanpur Dehat and increase in the target of Agra.

In the enrolment also the increase was marginal i.e. from 7.20 lakh to 8.85 lakh. This was due to good progress reported by Agra and a marginal increase reported from Gaziabad.

The achievement (for PL Book-I) has increased from 3.37 lakh to 5.98 lakh. This was due to good progress reported by Agra and Fatehpur during the year.

4. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in Uttar Pradesh. A sum of Rs.25 lakh has also been released to SLMA towards seed money.

WEST BENGAL

1. PROFILE

(a) POPULATION

The population of West Bengal was 68.07 million in 1991. The male and female population was 35.51 million and 32.56 million respectively. The rural and urban population was 49.37 million and 18.70 million respectively. Out of the total population 16.08 million were scheduled castes and 3.80 million were scheduled tribes. There were seventeen districts in the State at the time of Census.

(b) LITERACY SCENARIO

The State had a literacy rate of 57.70%. The male and female rates were 67.81% and 46.56% respectively. The highest literacy rate of 77.61% was recorded in Calcutta and the lowest was in Malda i.e. 35.62%. Apart from Calcutta, there were five districts with more than 60% literacy rate. They are: Midnapur (69.32%), Howrah (67.62%), North 24-Parganas (66.81%), Hooghly (66.78%) and Burdwan (61.88%). Four districts had more than 50%. They are: Darjeeling (57.95%), Nadia (52.53%), South 24-Parganas (55.10%) and Bankura (52.04%). The districts with more than 40% literacy rate are Purulia (43.29%), Birbhum (48.56%). There were five districts with more than 30% literacy rate. They are: West Dinajpur (39.29%), Malda (35.62%), Murshidabad (38.28%), Cooch Behar (33.31%) and Jalpaiguri (33.20%) which was the lowest in the State.

Calcutta district also recorded highest female literacy rate of 72.09%. Five districts had more than 50%, namely, North 24-Parganas (57.99%), Howrah (57.83%), Hooghly (56.90%), Midnapur (56.63%) and Burdwan (51.46%). Three districts had more than 40% female literacy rate. They are: Darjeeling (47.84%), Nadia (44.42%) and South 24-Parganas (40.57%). Four districts had more than 30%, namely Birbhum (37.17%), Bunkura

(36.55%), Cooch Behar (33.31%) and Jalpaiguri (33.20%). Districts with less than 30% female literacy rate were West Dinajpur (27.87%), Malda (24.92%), Murshidabad (29.57%), Purulia (23.24%) which was lowest in the State.

2. LITERACY, POST LITERACY AND CONTINUING EDUCATION PROJECTS – STATUS

(a) LITERACY PROJECTS

All the districts have been sanctioned the literacy projects. Almost all the projects have completed the literacy phase long back. The status of these projects in terms of target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The total target was 142.91 lakh. Five districts had a target of more than 10 lakh learners. Midnapur had the highest target of 19.55 lakh learners followed by Burdwan (12 lakh), South 24-Parganas (12.48 lakh), Murshidabad (12.73 lakh) and North 24-Parganas (10 lakh). Districts with more than 8 lakh learners were Birbhum (8.77 lakh), Hooghly (8.03 lakh), Jalpaiguri (8.18 lakh) and Malda (8.32 lakh). Districts with more than 5 lakh learners were Bankura (7.43 lakh), Uttar Dinajpur (6.49 lakh), Cooch Behar (5.37 lakh), Nadia (7.75 lakh), Purulia (5.73 lakh). Three districts have less than 5 lakh learners, namely, Howrah (4.64 lakh), Dakshin Dinajpur (3.83 lakh) and Darjeeling (1.57 lakh) which was lowest in the State.

ENROLMENT

As on March '98 the total enrolment of the State was 113.88 lakh which works out to 79.68% against target. Nine districts had more than 80% enrolment and rest of the districts reported more than 50% enrolment except Howrah which reported 44%.

ACHIEVEMENT

So far 82.53 lakh learners have reportedly completed Book-II (only 2 primers were used in West Bengal) which works out to 57.75% achievement. Nine districts have

more than 60% achievement. Burdwan district reported 90.72% which was highest in the State and the other districts were Bankura (72%), Birbhum (68.89%), Midnapur (69.91%), Nadia (62.53%), North 24-Parganas (80.60%), Purulia (82.41%) and South 24-Parganas (60.41%). The achievement was fairly good in 4 districts, namely, Cooch Behar (54.98%), Darjeeling (41.21%), Murshidabad (41.64%), Dakshin Dinajpur (43.49%). The lower achievement reported from two districts, namely, Howrah (34.30%) and Jalpaiguri (34.31%).

EXTERNAL EVALUATION

The external evaluation has been completed in twelve districts. The achievement as per the report along with the names of the districts are as follows:

Birbhum (93.09%), Burdwan (90.30%), South 24-Parganas (90.48%), Purulia (85.50%), North 24-Parganas (82.01%), Hooghly (88.80%), Howrah (87%), Midnapur (77.60%), Bankura (67.24%), Jalpaiguri (53.20%), Nadia (62.59%), Murshidabad (43.18%).

(b) POST LITERACY PROJECTS

The post literacy projects have been sanctioned to fourteen districts. The status of these projects regarding target, enrolment and achievement is as follows:

TARGET

The target under PL phase was available for 13 districts. The total target was 78.48 lakh neo-literates. Two districts had a target of more than 10 lakh neo-literates, namely, Midnapur (11.50 lakh) and Burdwan (10 lakh). Districts with more than 5 lakh target were North 24-Parganas (8.41 lakh), South 24-Parganas (7.54 lakh), Hooghly (7.30 lakh), Bankura (6.44 lakh), Birbhum (6.04 lakh) and Murshidabad (5.30 lakh). Districts with less than 5 lakh target were Purulia (4.50 lakh), Nadia (4.85 lakh), Cooch Behar (3.36 lakh), Jalpaiguri (1.81 lakh) and Howrah (1.73 lakh) which was lowest.

ENROLMENT

The enrolment figures were available from 12 districts. So far 38.81 lakh neo-literates have been enrolled in the PL phase which works out to 49.44% enrolment. Districts which have done well are Burdwan, Birbhum, Bankura and Midnapur and districts which are dragging in the PL phase are Cooch Behar, North 24-Parganas, South 24-Parganas, Murshidabad, Nadia, Jalpaiguri, Howrah and Hooghly.

ACHIEVEMENT

The number of neo-literates who have completed PL Book-I is available from nine districts. 25.82 lakh neo-literates have reportedly completed PL Book-I which works out to 32.90% of the target. 31.69 lakh neo-literates are reportedly participating in the PL phase.

(c) CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMME

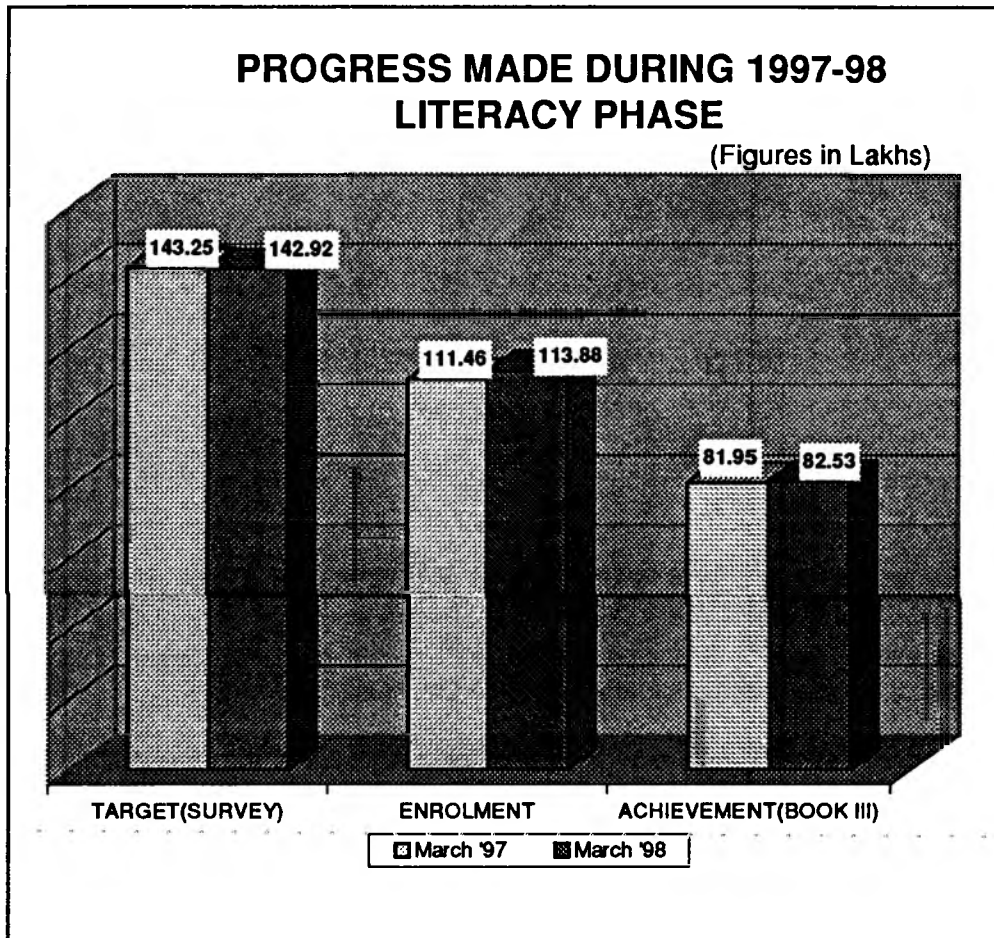
Three districts have been sanctioned Continuing Education Projects. They are: Birbhum, Burdwan and North 24-Parganas. The expected number of CE Centres and the nodal CE centres to be opened in these districts are: Birbhum (1737 CECs and 290 nodal CECs), Burdwan (1750 CECs and 250 nodal CECs), North 24-Parganas (2010 CECs and 230 nodal CECs). The current status of CE is awaited.

3. REPORTING STATUS

Only four districts, namely, Darjeeling, Malda, Dakshin Dinajpur and Uttar Dinajpur have sent March '98 status on literacy phase. All other districts have stopped reporting on the literacy phase. Regarding PL phase, out of thirteen reporting districts eleven districts have submitted March '98 report. The other two districts, Burdwan and Birbhum the latest report available was for March '97 and June '97 respectively. The status of South Dinajpur on PLC is awaited. The status of CE districts was also awaited.

4. PROGRESS MADE DURING 1997-98

(a) LITERACY PHASE

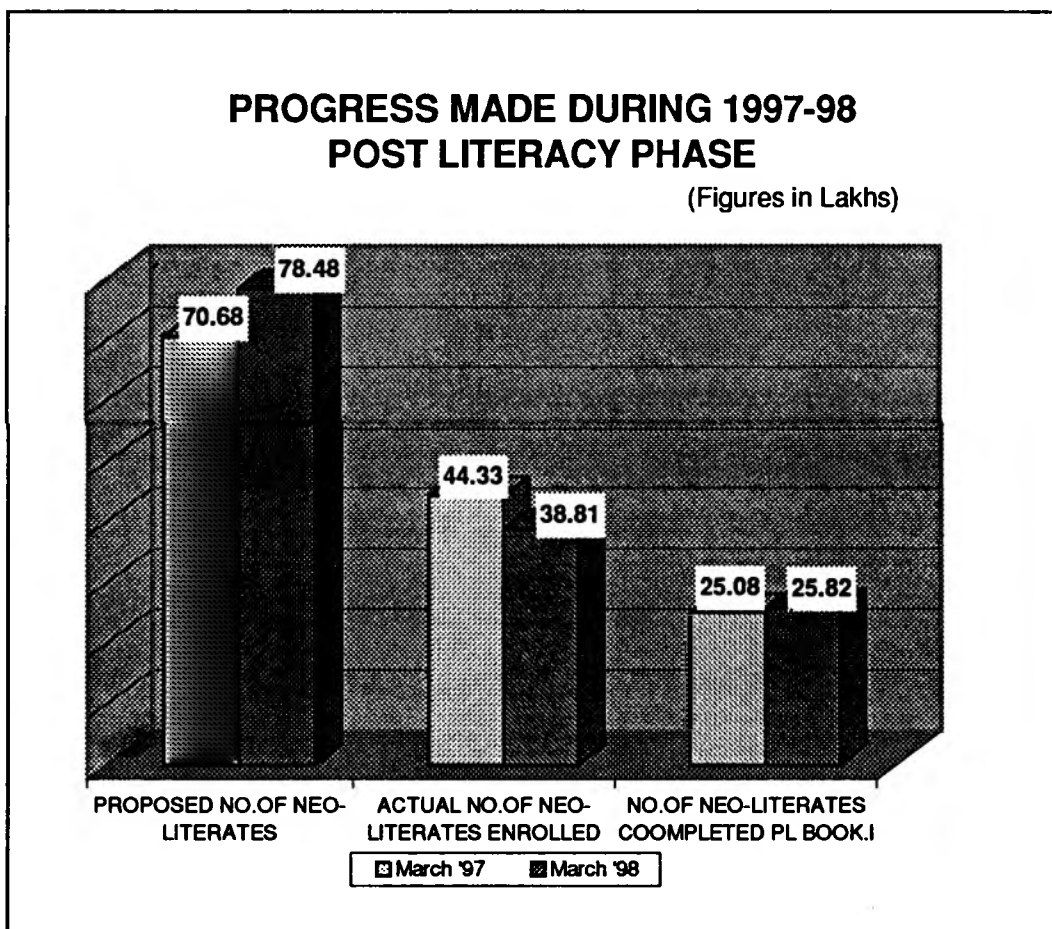


There has been decrease in the target of the State. During 1996-97 the target reported was 143.25 lakh which has gone down to 142.92 lakh in 1997-98. This has been due to change in target of Darjeeling district which was 1.92 lakh has been reduced to 1.58 lakh. There is no change in target of rest of the districts of West Bengal.

The enrolment during the period rose from 111.46 lakh to 113.88 lakh. The enrolment of Malda literacy campaign increased from 3.78 lakh to 6.11 lakh and Darjeeling from 0.99 lakh to 1.04 lakh. There is no change in enrolment of the rest of the districts.

There is considerable improvement in achievement of Darjeeing district which was 0.07 lakh rising to 0.65 lakh during the year. No achievement was reported by the districts of Malda and Uttar Dinajpur. There is a slight increase in achievement of Dakshin Dinajpur district. There is no change in achievement of the rest of the districts.

(b) POST LITERACY PHASE



There is an increase in the target under PL Phase which has increased from 70.68 lakh to 78.48 lakh during the year. The increase in target is due to reporting by Hooghly district. It has reported target of 7.30 lakh neo-literates. Bankura and Cooch Behar have also reported increase in the target. The post literacy programme of Birbhum report decrease in target from 6.67 lakh to 6.04 lakh.

The enrolment figures of the State has come down to 38.81 lakh from 44.33 lakh. The district of Bankura reported considerable progress in enrolment where it has increased to 6.44 lakh from 5.00 lakh. Hooghly reported enrolment of 1.20 lakh. Midnapur and North 24-Parganas reported decrease in the enrolment from 13.67 lakh and 8.41 lakh to 11.27 lakh and 0.24 lakh respectively. Purulia has not reported any enrolment so far. The status of post literacy programme in Burdwan, Birbhum and Murshidabad remained static.

There is a marginal increase from 25.08 lakh to 25.82 lakh in number of neo-literates who completed PL Book-I. Midnapur reported decrease in number of neo-literates who completed PL Book-I from 10.23 lakh to 7.49 lakh. The district which reported increase in achievement are: Birbhum, Bankura, Cooch Behar, North 24-Parganas, South 24-Parganas, Nadia, and Hooghly also reported that 0.40 lakh neo-literates have completed PL Book-I. No achievement has been reported by the districts of Murshidabad, Jalpaiguri, Howrah and Purulia.

5. CONSTITUTION OF STATE LITERACY MISSION AUTHORITY

The State Literacy Mission Authority has been constituted in the State. However, the seed money has not been released to them.
