# Part-A: General Information

### 1.1 Introduction:

To enhance enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improve nutritional levels among children, the national programme of nutritional support to primary education (NP-NSPE) was launched as a centrally sponsored scheme on 15th August 1995 in the state (United Bihar). 3 k.g dry food grains per student per month was being distributed to the students of Primary stage (class I to V) of the Government schools.

As per the order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Case No- W.P.(C) 196/2001, Union of Civil liberties versus Union Government, Mid-Day-Meal scheme was started in the State of Jharkhand in Nov. 2003 on a pilot basis in 3140 Government Primary schools in 19 districts. The Government has issued resolution no 2029 dated 14.8.2003 giving broad guidelines their-in to facilitate the implementation of this scheme. Now the scheme is covering all the Government schools, Gram Shiksha Abhiyan Vidyalyas, Education Guarantee Scheme, Government Aided (including minority) schools. Recognized Madrasas, recognized Sanskrit Vidyalaya and A.I.E Centers. In the year 2007-08, from the month of October 2007 the scheme was extended to the student of class VI to VIII of above category of school.

# 3.0 <u>Utilization of food grains:</u>

### 5.2 Reconciliation of Food grains utilized vis-à-vis No. of Meals served:

An analysis of foodgrains utilisation during 2010-11, It has been noticed that State Govt has shown <u>70-100% utilization against expected utilization on the basis on meal served during 01.04.2010</u> to 31.12.2010 in 21 districts and in 2 districts 60% to 67%. State Govt is requested to confirm it. (Reference Table – 5.2 of Analysis Sheet)

# 5.3 Reconciliation of Cooking cost utilized vis-à-vis No. of Meals served:

An analysis of cooking cost utilisation during 2010-11, It has been noticed that State Govt has shown 70-110% uniformly utilization against expected utilization on the basis on meal served during 01.04.2010 to 31.12.2010 in 23 districts and in 1 districts as 68%. State Govt is requested to confirm it. (Reference Table – 5.3 of Analysis Sheet)

#### **6.3 <u>Utilization of MME</u>** (*Reference Table – 6.3 of Analysis Sheet*)

A sum of **Rs.517.16 Lakhs** was availability during 2010-2011 (including unspent balance of Rs. 349.22 lakhs as on 31.3.10) as Central Assistance towards MME. Against this, **the State Govt. has utilized an amount of Rs. 167.94 lakhs (32%)**.

# **7.3** <u>Utilization of Transport Assistance</u> (Reference Table – 7.3 of Analysis Sheet)

A sum of **Rs725.08 lakhs** was availability during 2010-11 (including unspent balance of Rs. 425.06 lakhs as on 31.3.10) as Central Assistance towards Transport Assistance. Against this, the State has utilized **Rs. 300.02 lakhs (37%).** 

# **2.7** Construction of Kitchen sheds (Reference Table -8.3 of Analysis Sheet)

Out of **Rs. 15510.54 lakh** of Central assistance released towards construction of 22401 kitchen sheds during 2006-07 to 2010-11 for primary and upper primary stage, the State reported an amount of Rs. 7527.60 Lakh has been incurred for 12546 kitchen sheds (C+IP) as on 31.12.2010. **(Physical-56% and Financial-49% progress)** 

# **8.4 Procurement of Kitchen devices** (*Reference Table -8.6 of Analysis sheet*)

Out of **Rs1856.59Lakh** of Central assistance released towards procurement of 37132 kitchen devices in schools during 2006-07 to 2009-10 for primary and upper primary stage, the State reported an amount of Rs. 1556.24 Lakh has been incurred for 31125 Units (C+IP) as on 31.12.2010. **(84% Physical and 84% in Financial)**
