Subject: Rules governing recognition of schools.

## Memorandum

The question of framing rules for recognition of schools have had under consideration of the Education Department, limithal Prod sh, for some time past. It has now been decided that the following rules may be adopted and be adhered to structly while dealing with the recognition of schools:-

Definition

A schools is said to be recognised when it is allowed to present public for exa ination holder the orders of the Department or by he Punjodiffer ity to send up candidates for public scholarships, and to admit holders of such scholarships.

Recognised a complised schools may be(a) Government(b) such Schools as in the opinion of the Education Department set fy the conditions laid down hereunder:

All schools shall be recognised by the Director of Education, Limachal Pradesh. The conversion of High Schools into Higher Secondary Schools, and the addition of new classes also shell require the sanction of the Director of Education, H.P.

The recognition of High Schools or Middle Schools is governed by the following conditions:-

- (i) Fat the school is needed in the locality on Pdurational grounds i.e. it should stand included in educational survey;
- (ii) that it is under a regularly constituted managing hody which is approved by the Department and is registered every change in the management being reported to the Department;

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- (iii) that in order to ensure the continued maintenance of the school in an efficient condition the management have deposited in the name of the school with a branch of the State Pank of Indiaor with the Post Office saving Bank, or with Punjab National Bank, or with a co-operative Bank approved by the Registrar, Co-operative Socities, reserve fund equal to atleast six months salary of the staff and that that no withdrawals are made without the previous arm sanction of the District Education on Officer concerned;
  - (iv) that it has adopted the standard Provident fund Scheme for its teachers;
    - (v) that the school premises, accommodation, Play grounds, furniture and equipment are sufficient and suitable;
  - (vi) that it follows the Departmental Rules and that inter-school rules are strictly observed;
  - (vii) that it follows courses of study prescribed or approved by the Department;
- (viii) that it has attained and maintains a reasonable standard of efficiency in instructions;
  - (ix) that the rhles of the tuition fees and subscriptions to boys funds charged are in accordance with the scales prescribed or approved by the Department;
    - (x) that its discipline is satisfactory;
  - (xi) that suitable arrangements are made for compulsory Physical Training for all pupils except such as are declared unfit by a competent medical authority;
  - (xii) that the Headmaster is recognised as the sole authority in all matters connected with the internal organisation of the Institution including class promotions, teachers' time tables and assignment of work, discipline and
- (xiii) that the records and registers as prescribed by the Department are maintained;.

HAA Conditions for Recognition of Higher Secondary Multipurpose chools.

The recognition of Higher Secondary/ Multipurpose schools shall be governed by the conditions laid down in rule 4 and the following

## conditions:-

- (i) that the school has adequate equipment and teaching aids for the elective groups introduced in it;
- (ii) that the school follows the regulations, outline of test and syllabus for Higher Secondary Examinations prescribed by the Punjab University;
- (iii) that the staff engaged wis fully qualified and is capable of teaching the enriched curriculum prescribed by the Punjab University;
  - (iv) that the school has set up a career committees for providing guidance to student in the selection of suitable careers;
  - (v) that the school having once adopted the new pattern will not seek permission of the Department to switch back to the old pattern;
  - (vi) that the school will not run old type Matriculation classes;
  - (vii) that the school will endeavour to introduce minimum of two elective groups so as to run as a Higher Secondary/Multipurpose schools.

If a school is promising enough to deserve encouragement but does not satisfy all the conditions of recognition provisional recognition may be granted for a period of three years. In such a case, the order shall be accompanied by a clear and definite statement of the conditions which should be fulfilled, before the school will be permanently recognised.

Conditions for the recognition of Primary & Elementary Schools

The recognition of Primary and elementary Schools governed by the following conditions:

- (i) that it is needed in the locality on educational grounds i.e. it stand included in educational survey conducted by the Department:
- (1i) that it is under a manager or managing body approved by the Department;
- (iii) that it has been in existence for at least six months;
  - (iv) that it follows the curriculim prescribed by the Department;

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- (v) that it has an efficient teaching staff;
- (vi) that it is satisfactorily housed and equipped:
- (vii) that it will be open to boys and girls alike except where the District Education Officer consider this undesirable;
- (viii) that there is atleast one whole time teacher provided for every thirty five pupils in average attendence;
  - (ix) that khaxxxix it observes the departmental rules;
  - (x) that it maintains the records and registers as prescribed by the Department for such schools.

gement but does not satisfy all the conditions of recognition, Provisional recognition may be granted or, renewed for a total period not exceeding three years in the case of Primary schools and not exceeding four years in the case of Middle/High/Higher\_Secondary Schools. In such cases orders shall be accompanied by a clear and definite statement of the conditions which should be fulfilled before the school will be permanently recognised.

7. General: Underteking

The management of recognised school shall undertake that all orders of the Government or of the admission and removal of Pupils, the promotion of pupils, the dates and duration of school terms and holidays, the conditions under which religious instructions may be imparted, the Physical Training of Pupils, school games, school discipline, and the appointment, removal and conditions of service of the teaching staff, so far as such order are applicable to the school in question, shall be strictly observed.

8. Alteration of Standards

Without the previous sanction of the authority empowered to recognise it, a recognised school shall not open a class or classes either higher or lower than those for which the school has been recognised. When such classes are opened under proper sarction, a formal application of recognition shall be made to the District Education Officer concerned by the Ist June following the date of opening them and if recognition is not accorded, the classes shall be closed at the end of the term in which the refusal of recognition is communicated. The rules relating to admission and withdrawal, discipline and registers, shall be observed with respect to such probationary classes.

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Note: For the purpose of this rule, the Summer and Christmas Holidays determine the end of a term.

Political Activities Recognition is liable to be withdrawn from a school if the management or the staff of the school take part in agitation devoted against the authority of Government or disseminate opinions terling to excite feelings of disloyality or disaffection against Government or of enmity and hatred between different classes or if the pupils are permitted to attend Political meetings or to engage in any form of political or communal agitation. Recognition will not be withdrawn under this provision without giving apportunity to the school authority concerned to show cause why recognition should not be withdrawn.

Lapse of recognition.

The recognition of a school or Department shalllapse if:

- (a) a recognised school or Department ceases to exist; or
- (b) a school is transferred to different building or locality not already approved by the Department; or
- (c) school is transferred to a different managing body not, already approved by the Departments or
- (c) in the case of provisional recognition the conditions imposed under rule 6 are not fulfilled on the expiry of the period of provisional recognition, or an application for prime nort recognition is not received on the proper proforma, in the office of the District Education Officer concerned three months before the expiry of the said period.

If the recognition of a school or a Department has lapsed under this article then for the purpose of future recognition it shall be treated as a new school or Department

11. Appeal regarding recognition.

An appeal against an order refusing or withdrawing recognition will in all cases be to the Director of Education, Himachal Pradesh.

12.

In a recognised school no pupil shall be refused admission on account of his caste or religion. No pupil who has once been admitted to a recognised school shall be treated differently from the other pupils of his caste or religion.

13.

Every recognised school with its accounts books registers and other records shall be open to inspection at all the reasonable hours by the authorised officers of the Department by the executive officers of Government authorised to inspect schools, by the Director of

Assistant Director or Director of Public Health and by take civil Surgeon; Assistant Sergeon or Health Officerdeputed by or acting under the general orders of the Governments examine the health of the students or the sanitary conditions of building and premises.

14.

Every recognised school must periodically and in t prescribed form submit such other reports as may be required by the Department.

15.

Any book not authorised by the Department or the University shall be used in any recognised school Government reserve to themselves the right to forbid or prescribe use of any book, or books or other publication in recognised schools.

16.

All applications for recognition should be in the form prescribed, a speciment of which is enclosed. Such applications from schools applying for recognition for the first time or for the extension of provisional recognition should reach the District Education Officer concerned on the Ist June, and the Director of Education on the Ist October each year.

- Above rules may be circulated to all concerned for the information and guidance.
- 3. It is also emphasized upon all the inspecting officers that they should examine the cases for recognition of schools strictly in accordance with the Provisions of these rules and forward only gamine cases complete in all respects to this Department for further necessary action well in time.
