PREFACE

This study presents an analysis of trends in respect of Indian students and Trainees who have gone abroad for higher studies during 1997-98. Basic data for the study was collected from the Reserve Bank of India and Association of Indian Universities.

The purpose of bringing out this publication is to maintain the statistical records of Indian Students/Trainees going abroad under various schemes for higher studies and to acquire latest know-how in various fields like Agriculture, Technology, Science, Medicine, Education, etc. Efforts have been made to compare the outflow of Indian students in foreign countries with inflow of students from foreign countries in Indian Universities in 1997-98. This publication gives statistics of out flow of Indian students/Trainees state-wise, duration-wise, sex-wise, subject-wise, country-wise etc. In addition, it also gives information about sources of financial assistance, country-wise, agency-wise etc.

I would like to place on record my deep appreciation of the team spirit and the work done by the Project Staff under Dr. R.S. Thakur, Joint Director(Statistics) since retired of Statistics Division, CMIS Unit and S&S Section in bringing out this useful publication. I am also grateful to the Reserve Bank of India, Bombay and Association of Indian Universities for supplying us valuable data for this publication.

It is hoped that this study will be of interest and use to educational planners, administrators and research workers in the field of education.

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INTRODUCTION

1. The total number of Indian students who went abroad for higher studies increased from 4861 in 1990-91 to 6466 (33.02%) in 1991-92 and then maintained the level of 6499 in 1992-93 but steeply decreased to 2284 (64.86%) students in 1993-94 over the previous year and then appreciably improved to 2983 (30.60%) students during the year 1994-95 and further increased to 3478 (16.59%) in 1995-96. This increasing trend continued in 1996-97 and 1997-98 when it substantially increased to 6426 (45.87%) and 6734 (4.79%) students respectively over the previous year. Year-wise/continent-wise details are given below in Sub-Table 1:



2. It will be observed from the above that the outflow of students to countries in the American continent has been on the decrease after 1991 onwards. In the year 1990-91, the annual outflow of students to countries in American continent was 89% which increased to 92% in 1991-92 but then declined to 89% in 1992-93, 78% in 1993-94, 60% in 1994-95, 51% in 1995-96, 47.03% in 1996-97 and further decreased to 35.97% in 1997-98. Notwithstanding this, the share of Indian students to countries comprising American continent, by and large, remains the largest amongst all the continents of the World. On the other hand, the percentage of annual outflow of students to countries in Oceania is on the increase. It was 2.7% in 1990-91; 2.8% in 1991-92; 5.8% in 1992-

- 93; 8.8% in 1993-94; 18.5% in 1994-95, which increased to 24.70% in 1995-96 and further increased to 26.67% in 1996-97 and 35.89% in 1997-98. The percentage of annual outflow of students to Europe was 6.5% in 1990-91 which came down to 3.8% in 1991-92, then decreased to 3.70% in 1992-93 but increased to 10.2% in 1993-94, 19.1% in 1994-95, 21.22% in 1995-96, 22.07% in 1996-97 and slightly increased to 24.31% in 1997-98. The annual outflow of students from India to countries in Asian continent was 1% in 1990-91 which decreased to 0.5% in 1991-92 and remained more or less at the same level at 0.6% in 1992-93. It marginally increased during 1993-94 to 1.1%, 1.4% in 1994-95 and then further increased to 1.64% in 1995-96. This trend was reversed to 1.31% in 1996-97. However, percentage of students increased to 2.17% in 1997-98.
- 3. The above analysis distinctively indicates that the three continents viz. America, Europe and Oceania put together accounted for 96.17% of the students, leaving thereby, a very small fraction i.e. 3.83% of the students who went to countries falling in other continents; and, secondly, the trend of outflow of students from India to countries comprising American continent has been on the decrease i.e. from 92% in 1991-92, the outflow has come down to just 35.97% during 1997-98, although the American continent still dominates in absorbing the largest number of Indian students. This is followed by Oceania and Europe whereto the outflow of Indian students is on the increase.


SEXWISE NUMBER OF INDIAN STUDENTS GOING ABROAD

It will be observed from the above that the number of female students comprised 13.72% in 1991-92 increased to 14.66% in 1992-93 and further to 17.38% in 1993-94. However, it slightly decreased to 16.02% during the year 1994-95 and further decreased to 13.71% in 1995-96 before finally settling at 12.50% in 1996-97. However, percentage of female students increased to 15.76% in 1997-98. There has been a decrease in the total outflow of Indian students to the extent of 46% during the period 1991-92 to 1995-96, but during 1996-97 the students outflow again picked up and stood at 6426 thereby registering a marginal decrease of 0.62% during 1991-92 to 1996-97. There has been an increase of 4.14% in the total outflow of Indian students during the period 1991-92 to 1997-98. The availability of facilities of higher studies of comparable international standards (which hithertofore were not available within the country) may be responsible for overall decrease in the number of students going abroad. Some of the countries might have imposed undue restrictions on Asians.


STATES OF ORIGIN:

The largest number of students, who went to foreign countries for higher studies belonged to Tamil Nadu during the year 1997-98, closely followed by Delhi, Karnataka and West Bengal. No student went abroad from A&N Islands, Daman & Diu & Lakshadweep. However, during the past years, the trend was altogether different. During the year 1991-92 the largest number of students who went to foreign countries for higher studies belonged to Andhra Pradesh closely followed by Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Karnataka etc. During the year 1992-93 the largest number of students who went to foreign countries belonged to Andhra Pradesh closely followed by Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Delhi, West Bengal, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Punjab and Bihar. In 1993-94 the largest number of students belonged to Andhra Pradesh, closely followed by Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Gujarat. In 1994-95, largest number of students went abroad from Delhi followed by Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal and Maharashtra. In 1995-96 the largest number of students went abroad again from Delhi followed by Tamil Nadu and West Bengal. In 1996-97, the largest number of students went abroad from Andhra Pradesh closely followed by Tamil Nadu and Delhi. Sub-Table 3 gives the details of the States share individually.

FIELDS OF STUDY


6. The distribution of students by fields of studies indicates that largest number of students who went abroad opted for Engineering, Architecture, Science, Technology and Industry, Medicine etc. during all these years. However, no specific trend has been observed in any fields of study. For instance, in 1991-92, only 37% of total students opted for Engineering & Architecture. This percentage increased to 38% in 1992-93 but declined to 31% in 1993-94 and further came down to 27% in 1994-95 and 20% in 1995-96. It, however, increased to 23% in 1996-97. In Medicine, only 5% opted in 1991-92 which increased to 7% in 1992-93 but came down to 3.72% in 1993-94. This touched 11% during 1994-95 and 1995-96 and then further increased to 14.11% in 1996-97. In Science, 21.40% opted in 1991-92, which increased to 22.26% in 1992-93, 25% in 1993-94 but then decreased to 11% in 1994-95 and 1995-96 and further decreased to 10% in 1996-97. A very small number of students went abroad to pursue subjects like Education, Nursing, Library Science. In 1996-97, the largest number of students (28%) went abroad in the fields of Commerce, Business Administration/Business Management. In 1997-98 also the largest number of students (38%) went abroad in the fields of Commerce, Business Administration/Business Management. Details are in Sub-Table 4.

Continent-wise/Subject-wise analysis indicate that during 1991-92, 5070 (78.40%) of students went for higher studies in Engineering and Architecture, Science, Medicine and Commerce & Business Management. Of these, 4767 (94.02%) went to American continent alone. Remaining less than 6% got distributed in other continents. This proportion during 1992-93, 1993-94, 1994-95, 1995-96 and 1996-97 was 5151 (79.26%) of which 4667 (90.60%) was in American continent alone; 1710 (74.87%) of which 1384 (80.94%) in American continent; and 2105 (70.57%) of which 1277 (60.66%), 2417 (69.49%) of which 1191 (49.28%) and 4788 (74.51%) of which 2326 (48.58%) in American continent alone respectively. The share of Indian students going to the American continent has considerably been reduced from 92.10% in 1991-92 to 35.97% in 1997-98, yet the number of Indian students going to American continent for higher studies still remains the highest amongst the different continents of the world. In 1997-98, 5002 students (74.27%) went abroad to study engineering and Architecture, Science, medicine and Commerce subjects of which 1724 (34.46%) went to American Continents. The Oceania continent which contributed to only 2.29% during 1991-92 took 36.78% of the Indian Students in these subjects during 1997-98 which is sixteen times more of its share in 1991-92. Similarly, the share of Europe during 1991-92 was only 2.86% in these fields of study which increased to 24.50% during 1997-98. The details are in Sub-Table-5.


8. The sources of financing as summarized in Sub-Table -6 indicate that majority of students went abroad on expenses met out of the sources which remain unidentified in all these years closely followed by sources which were fully self financing. These two sources taken together provided funds to more than 96.13% of the students. Other sources were not significant sources of financing for the Indian students who went abroad for pursuing higher studies. The pattern of financial assistance during the past few years is given in the Sub-Table 6 below:

9. Sub-Table 7 given below indicates data about the Indian students who went abroad during the years 1991-92 through 1997-98 according to continents and sources of financing year-wise. On the basis of the results obtained, it has been observed that in all these years majority of students went to foreign countries for further studies either under a fully self-financing scheme or under a project, which has not been specified in detail. If the two items i.e. fully self financed and others not specified are taken together then it can be noted that in all these years the highest number of students is in projects which are not specified are taken, followed by a fully self-financed scheme. Under these two broad heads, the number of students benefited were 97.52% in 1991-92, 95.57% in 1992-93, 93.56% in 1993-94, 90.24% in 1994-95, 95.66% in 1995-96, 96.93% in 1996-97 and 96.13% in 1997-98. Thus, it is observed that the majority of students met their expenses out of their own pockets, but this percentage increased from 19.04% in 1991 to 20.88% in 1992, further to 31.79% in 1993. It further increased to 33.89% in 1994 then increased to 34.85% in 1995-96 and decreased to 29.83% in 1996-97 and slightly decreased to 22.93% in 1997-98. If the partly selffinanced projects are also added, then the percentages of students during these five years were still higher. These were 98% during 1991, 97% during 1992, 94% during 1993, 92% during 1994, 97.03% in 1995-96, 97% in 1996-97 and 97% in 1997-98. The percentage of beneficiaries under State Government funds was negligible; it was only 0.08% in 1991, 'nil' during 1992-93 and 1993-94, 0.03% in 1994-95 and 1995-96, 'nil' again in 1996-97 and 1997-98. Such projects financed by the Central Government and foreign Governments were 0.87% during 1991, 2.26% during 1992 and 1.53% during 1993 only 0.17% during 1994, 0.48% during 1995-96, 1.95% in 1996-97 and 1.85% in 1997-98. There were no cases, which were met by foreign companies during 1991-94 but in 1995-96, foreign companies financed 0.14% students, which decreased to 0.10% in 1996-97 and further decreased to 0.01% in 1997-98.

- 10. Country-wise analysis in Table VI further indicates that out of 6734 students who went abroad for pursuing higher studies as many as 2409(35.77%) went to Australia followed by USA, 2374(35.25%) and UK, 961(14.27%). These countries taken together accommodated 5744(85.3%) of the students during 1997-98. The three continents viz. America, Europe and Oceania accounted for 96.17% of the total Indian students who went abroad for higher studies. This trend has been observed during all the years from 1991-92 through 1996-97. In 1991, it was 99%; in 1992, 98.76%; in 1993, 97.42% in 1994-95; 97% in 1995-96 and 95.76% in 1996-97. Details are given in Sub-Table 5 read with Table No. VI.
- Tables VII&VIII indicate that 2679 (39.78%) students went to foreign countries for studies covering a duration of more than one year but upto two years while 1273 (18.90%) of the students went abroad for studies extending upto a period of one year only. 1331(19.77%) went abroad for studies extending to a period upto three years. Remaining 1451(21.55%) had gone for studies extending to periods more than three years.
- As against 6734 Indian students who went abroad for higher studies, 6706 students from foreign countries were studying in Indian Universities during 1997-98. Of 6734 students who were abroad, 96.17% went to countries in American, European and Oceanic continents. Less than 3.83% only went to other continents. None went to African continent. Out of 6706 foreign students studying in Indian Universities, 6146(\$1.64%) students were from countries falling in Asian and African continents. Remaining less than 9% came from other continents. This is indicative of the fact that while majority of our students prefer going to American and European continents which have advanced technologies, the majority of foreign students who came to India are from countries falling in Asian and African continents which are less developed technologically. Sub-Table 8 gives below the continent-wise details of students:

Appendix I gives detailed information about country-wise and year-wise as also continent-wise number of students studying in Indian Universities during the year 1997-98. In 1986-87, there were 10820 foreign students studying in Indian Universities. This number came down to 6706 students thereby registering a decrease of 38.02% during the period 1986-1997.

During the year 1997-98, in all 63 Indians went abroad for training in various fields; of these 3 were females. A large number of trainees i.e. 19 (30.15%) went to American continents followed by countries of Asian continent, 16 (25.40%). However, during the last six years beginning from 1991-92 to 1996-97, it has been noticed that the highest number of trainees went to countries in the European continent. During the year 1991-92, 1502 (45%), 1992-93. 542 (55%), 1993-94, 484 (42%), 1994-95, 285 (48%) in 1995-96, 155 (54%) and in 1996-97, 211(81.78%) of the Indians went to European countries for various training. The number of Indians who went to Asian countries for various training came down year after year. During 1991-92, 723 (22%) Indians went to Asian countries which during 1992-93 was reduced to 166 (17%) and then maintained at 168 (15%) reduced to 77 (13%) and further reduced to 62 (22%) in 1995-96 and further reduced to 14, (5.43%) in 1996-97 and slightly increased to 16 (25.40%) in 1997-98. The details of number of trainees who went to foreign countries are given in Sub Table-9.

Out of the 63 trainees who went abroad, majority viz., 38 (60.32%) went for training falls under Technical and Industry. The second largest number falls under 'Others': 12 (19.05%) which have not been specified. Remaining 13 of the trainees opted for other fields of training.
