CHAPTER XV

Computer Centre

The idea of getting a computer to the University was nurtured by Prof. B. Ramachandra Rao, (M. P. H.) the then Head of the Department of Physics and Sri L. Bullayya, the then Vice-Chancellor, Andhra University. After arduous work, the I. B. M. 1130 Computer was installed in the year 1971 with the help of University grants Commission. The cost of computer with the unit record equipment is around Rs. 33 lakhs. The Centre was inaugurated on 8th January, 1972 by the Honourable Minister Sri C. Subrahmanyam.

Configuration:

The I.B. M, 1130 Computing System is a solid-state electronic computing System composed of a Central Processing

Unit and input/output devices.

I. B. M. 1130 Central Processing Unit contains the control logic circuits, the console panel, the console key-board, the console printer, core storage and all circuits and mechanisms for single disk storage drive. The cycle time is 3.0 Microseconds and the memory capacity is 16384 sixteen bit work.














CHAPTER XVI

Employment Information and Guidance Bureau

As a joint venture of the Government of Andhra Pradesh of the department of Employment and Training and Andhra University, the University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau, started functioning since 1961.

Aims and objectives of the Bureau are as follows:

- a) to give employment information and advice to the University alumni.
- b) to give information on various courses of studies, etc., on higher studies in India and abroad.
- c) to assist applicants in securing admissions to various courses of studies offered by Universities and abroad.
 - d) to collect and disseminate occupational information regarding occupations, scholarships, fellowships and financial assisstance available in India and abroad.
 - e) to assist in individual problems pertaining to education and vocation.
 - f) to assist students in securing part time employment.
 - g) to render vocational guidance to students individually and in groups.
 - h) to prepare guidance literature to help students in their educations and vocational planning.
 - i) to maintain career information and library.
 - j) to give information on competitive examinations conducted by various public service commissions.
 - k) to register professional graduates and all persons hold masters degree with at least 50% of marks for employment assistance.
 - to acquaint the unemployed youth with the facilities available with various departments under Self Employment Schemes.
 - m) to arrange coaching classes for various competitive examinations.

Administrative structure:

The organisation structure consists of the Chief, Deputy Chief, Technical Assistant, Technical (Library), Junior Assistant, and Stenographer, While the Deputy Chief, Junior Assistant, Stenographer are Government staff, the Technical Assistants were drawn from the University. The Chief is nominated by the Vice-Chancellor. Dr. P. Mohanrao, department of Educa-

and Sri. R. Gopalakrishnamurthy are continued to be the chief tion and Deputy Chief.

Jurisdiction:

The jurisdiction of the Bureau extends from Srikalulam to Prakasam districts, i.e., Eight districts for its operation. Candidates who are residents of the above districts normally register their names in this Bureau for employment assistance.

Registrations:

The Bureau registers the particulars of all the post graduates, professional graduates and technical graduates for employment assistance and forward them to the Professional and Executive office, Secunderabad. This state level office sponsores candidates against vacancies notified by the State and Central Government department, undertakings, some semi-autonomous bodies, cooperative establishments., etc. However, the Bureau is vested with the power to sponsor candidates for vacancies notified by the private employees and for part time vacancies notified by the undertakings of the Centre and state Governments.

- (a) Guidance at the time of registration: 2211 candidates were given guidance at the time of registration on job opportunities, self employment schemes, scholarships and fellowships available in India and abroad as against 2351 candidates in the previous year.
- (b) Group guidance talks: 278 group guidance talks were given to 4522 candidates during the period under report

as against 232 talks and 2872 candidates during the previous year.

(c) Career talks: During the period under report the Deputy Chief has delivered 26 Career talks in affiliated college and University Hostels for the benefit of the final years graduates and postgraduate students.

(d) Individual information: A total number of 4533 candidates were given individual information with regard to higher education facilities in India and abroad, fellowships and

scholarships.

(e) Review of old cases: During the period under report 81 candidates who were in the live register more than 3 years were reviewed and they were given guidance individually basing on their qualifications financial status, etc.

Visitors:

During the period under report a total number of 5604 candidates were visited and availed the services of the Bureau as against a number of 5212 candidates in the previous year.

Career Information Room:

The Bureau is having a Career Information room cum Library which provides information relating to various courses of study, hand books relating to differnt Indian and foreign Universities, various advertisements relating to job opportunities, scholarships are collected and displayed in this Career information room for the benefit of the job seekers, students, staff and others. A considerable number of hand books relating to foreign Universities are available in this library. The following newspapers/monthly journals are available in the library for the use of visitors:

a) Indian Express, Hindu, Eenadu Dailees
b) Employment news Weekly

c) Competition master, and Competition refresher

Monthlies.

A good number of books relating to various competitive examinations were acquired. Apart from competitive examination books, books for the preparation of examination for like GATE, GRE, TOEFL, etc. are also available in the Library.

Coaching Classes:

Providing coaching to different competitive examination was started with the financial assistante of SETIS, Visakhapatnam in the year 1982 were continued upto 1989. Subsequently keeping in view of the functioning of study circle, A.P. study circle, the SETVIS has not sanctioned funds through the Bureau

has approached the SETVIS several times. Hence the programme of coaching classes could not be taken up.

Field work Programme:

During the period under report, a batch of 22 students of Industrial Relations and personnel management, Andhra University have attended the Bureau from 27-12-91 to 28-12-91. The following topics were discussed and explained to them.

CHAPTER XVIII

National Service Scheme

National Service Scheme was introduced in the year 1969 on an experimental basis in 38 selected Universities covering 40,000 student youth. This scheme aims at correcting the phenomenon of seclusion of education from the Society by exposing the student community to reality situations and thereby creating an urge in them for greater involvement in community service and nation building activities in addition to their normal academic programme.

With the introduction of the special camping programmes in the year 1973 the programme gained momentum and attained the status of a movement in the system of higher education. Presently all the Universities and institutions of higher learning in the country with a student volunteer strength of nearly one million are implementing the programme. The present strength in Andhra University area is 25,081. In Andhra University area the programme was introduced as the +2 stage during the year 1987-88. Recently the programme was also introduced in Government Polytechnics. The reports indicate that the programme in successful in the plus 2 stage also. Participation in the programme is voluntary. The Government of India declared the programme as permanent one and removed the much criticized adhoc approach.

Regular Activities

During the period under report as per the enrolment figure there is a strength of 25,081 volunteers in all the 5 districts namely Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, East Godavari and West Godavari. There are 19,337 male volunteers and 5744 female volunteers. This includes both the degree and the plus 2 stage colleges wherein the programme is launched.

Literacy

During the period under report the district administration of Srikakulam has declared that it would make all the necessary efforts to launch 100% literacy drive.

In Kakinada with the help of local NSS units a 100 per cent literacy project was given to a voluntary organisation these two areas meeting of the Programme Officers were convened with the District Administration and suitable plans of action were developed to involve all the educational institu-

tions particularly NSS volunteers.

In West Godavari and Visakhapatnam Districts where 100 per cent literacy is being actively implemented, all the NSS Units are devoting most of the time in the literacy programmes. The District administration has been extending necesary assistance and guidance to the NSS Units. In West Godavari Programme Officers have been identified as Resource

During the period under report Andhra University has been identified for launching massive movement on creation of awareness about the dreadful disease 'AIDS'. In collaboration with the world Health Organization, the Department of Youth Affairs & Sports conducted Regional Workshops and encouraged the identified Universities to conduct various competitions for inculcating better knowledge about AIDS. titions on the preparation of slogans, cartoons, posters and greetings were conducted. Training programme was organised to highlight the role of student in youth in preventing this disease.

During this period the main emphasis was given to youth for Mass Literacy in all the 5 districts. The volunteers have shown keen interest and contributed for the success of the programme. Girl volunteers in good number produced significant results in the communities where they worked.

Health Programmes 5000 Public Under volunteers participated in a variety of projects in the communities adopted by the NSS Units. They received encouraging support from the local voluntary organisations, local self governments and governmental agencies. Under this special educational campaigns on communicable diseases were undertaken.

Environment Enrichment and Conservation:

Ecological Development and conservation are the priority programmes adopted by the NSS Units since a long time. During this period all the NSS Units took up environmental protection programmes and education and awareness campaigns in the urban, rural and tribal communities. Save the Eastern Ghats was the slogan adopted by the Units and the volunteers were involved in a massive trecking programme in the coastal districts in collaboration with the leading voluntary organisations.

Plantation Preservation and Upkeeping of trees:

With the guidance of the Forest Department and the teachers of Botanical Science, NSS Units though in a limited way participated in the plantation programmes under social forestry scheme. The volunteers also took up nurishing of the plants planted by them earlier.

Population Education and Family Welfare:

In the areas where cent per cent literacy is launched NSS Units also took up population education programmes through various Literacy Centres. By making house to house visits the volunteers educated the people on the need for small family norm.

Republic Day Parade:

2 NSS volunteers from Andhra University area (Govt. College for Men, Srikakulam and M.R. Autonomous College, Vizianagaram) were deputed for participation in the Republic Day Parade conducted at New Delhi on 26-1-1992.

Other Activities:

In the District of Srikakulam Inter-collegiate competitions were held in debates, elocution and sports and games. Mention may be made regarding the good work done by the Programme Officers particularly Pathapatnam and Polaki NSS Units of Srikakulam district who have written songs, poems and playlets highlighting the need for Mass Literacy.

Centres for the Aged:

During this period certain efforts were made to start

Centres for the Aged in the colleges with the help of local service organisations. As a result of this Dr. V. S. Krishna Govt. College and V.M.C. Mahila Vidyapeeth did excellent work.

Special Camping Programme:

During the period under report a total No. of 12 special camps were organised involving 600 volunteers. Due to paucity of funds camping programme received a great set back.

All the 600 volunteers participated in the Youth for Mass Literacy programme. They worked for the creation of congenial atmosphere for the success of the literacy movement.

During their stay in the camp, the volunteers visited the nearby villages and organised youth clubs and mahila mandals and motivated them to participate in this National programme. The reports indicate that the efforts of the volunteers yielded the desired results.

Non-formal Education:

The volunteers contacted the instructors of non-formal education centres and helped them in mobilising school dropouts to participate in the evening classes.

Sending Children Back to School:

It is one of the important activities undertaken for the dropouts by the NSS volunteers. In this effort they met dropout children, their parents and concerned teachers and convinced them to attend the school.

Road Formation Work:

All the volunteers undertook the road formation work in the villages wherein they conducted the camping programme under Shramdan activity.

National Integration Camps:

The highlight of the camping programme during the period under report was organisation of 2 National Integration Camps (minor) at Penugonda and Eluru during December, 1991 and January, 1992 respectively. St. Theresa's College for Women, Eluru conducted a camp exclusively for girls and SVKP & Dr. K.S. Raju Arts & Science College, Penugonda conducted another camp exclusively for boys. 400 student volunteers representing more than 30 Universities from Chandigarh to Kanyakumari participated in the Integration camps.

ANDHRA UNIVERSITY DISPENSARY

The North Campus Dispensary is a standard medical establishment located in the A.U. Engineering College campus where comprehensive medical examination and regular treatment is being provided round the clock to the students, teaching and non-teaching staff and their families by a compliment staff of two medical officers, two staff nurses, four qualified pharmacists, Junior Assistant, Attender O.P. Attendant, Record Assistant, Lab. Technician, Lab. Attendant, Theatre Assistant, Ayah, Ward Boy and sweepers.

The North Campus Dispensary is also attached with a clinical laboratory, tests of urine, blood and motion are conducted for prompt diagnosis. Besides clinical tests, bio-chemical tests such as bloodsugar, blood collaterol urea and billerobin also conducting in the A.U. North Campus Dispensary reports are submitted very promptly for the prompt diagnosis to the patients attending to A.U. North Campus Dispensary. An Amount of Rs. 10,000 was sanctioned towards clinical lab.

equipment for the year 1991-92.

The North Campus Dispensary is providing special drugs to the patients to the tune of Rs. 13,200/- for the year 1991-92 on the prescription of the specialists and as per the necessity of the patients keeping in view of their health condition and

nature of the disease.

The de-Addiction in the A.U. North Campus Dispensary is giving treatment as a welfare measure for the benefit of the employees who have become horrible addicts of alcohol to make them useful to the institution and to their families. Dr. N. Parameswara Rao, Honorary Director, Dr. Y. Jawahar, Associate Director, Dr. G. Bhagya Rao, Popular Psychiatrist (Visakhapatnam Steel city) Consultant are treating the alcoholic patients successfully. The de-addiction programme consists of the following stages: (1) motivation (2) detoxification (3) follow-up (4) Individual psychotherapy (5) Rehabilitation programme.

The total number of patients treated in the A.U. North Campus Dispensary for the year 1991-92 during the period from July '91 to June, 1992 is 26,990 which witnessed an increase of 791 patients over the census of 1990-91 patients. attended to the A.U. North Campus Dispensary. The North Campus Dispensary is open round the clock with emergency staff of pharmacist, ward boy, sweeper.

The clinical tests conducted in the clinical laboratory of A.U. North Campus Dispensary are enclosed herewith a detailed statement.

The North Campus Dispensary situated in the A.U.

Engineering College campus sontinues to serve the patients attending to the A.U. North Campus Dispensary with various diseases like pyrexia, malaria, enteric fevers, pneumonia, convulsions, inf. hepatitis jaundice, diarhoea, dysentries, amaebiasis, deficiency diseases like vitamins and minerals and protseins, angular stimulities, seurvay, rickets, constipation, int. colic, billiary colie, infantile colic, infections, urinary tract infections, measures, broughtis, hypertension, Diabetes, various diseases of children and women.

- 4. Inefficient watch and ward system resulting in theft of the student's property from their rooms.
- 5. Unsatisfactory sanitary conditions in the toilets; messes and in the hostel surroundings.
- 6. Pilferage of Verandah bulbs, tap head and pipe-line valves.
- 7. Several other problems are not listed here arising due to inefficient watch and ward and sanitary.

8. Irregular power supply not only in summer but also in other seasons.

9. Inadequate water supply throughout the year.

10. Construction of Van-Shed and Cycle shed in the hostel premises.

11. Insufficient dust-bins in the hostel premises.

12. Construction of T.V. Rooms in Gandhi Reading Room area to serve the V.V., A.V. blocks as well as Viveka Vinyasa.

3. Accommodation for Research Scholars: A Main Block in South Campus containing 110 rooms (100 single rooms and 10 two seaters) and a Vidya Block in North Campus containing 52 rooms (iwo/three seaters) are available in the Gents Hostel

4. Women Research Scholars are accommodated in APCC Hall, a rented building near Siripuram Junction. Food (breakfast, lunch & dinner) prepared in the gents hostel is sent to APCC Hall on a bicycle. This causes delay and the women research scholars have to wait for a considerable time for taking food sent from the gents hostel. In the absence of transport facility it is felt desirable to shift the women research scholars to the A.U. Ladies Hostel near Maharanipeta. There is an urgent need for the construction of one hostel block for women research scholars to accommodate about 100 members. Actually 565 research scholars (492 men and 73 women) are given membership in the hostel blocks out of which 186 men and 73 women are residing in the hostel blocks and the remaining 306 members (men) are boarding members. The furniture available in the dining halls is inadequate and more tables and chairs are required.

the ground and first floor of Vidya Hostel (Block).

School of Correspondence Courses

The School which was started in 1972 with a humble beginning could reach the take-off stage during the academic year 1982-83. By way of implementation and adoption of several procedures and the introduction of modern equipment to strengthen the student support services the School has achieved remarkable progress during the last few years and crossed 42,000 in enrolment during the academic year 1991-92. II. COURSE STRUCTURE AND ENROLMENT

a) Course Structure: In all the School is offering 19 courses including the conventional courses on academic year basis and the non-conventional courses on calender year basis to suit the needs of the student community. The particulars of

these courses in terms of eligibility are shown in Annexure I.

b) Enrolment: The enrolment of students crossed a 42,000 mark during the academic year 1991-92 also in spite of tough competition from Andhra Pradesh Open University and other Institutes of Correspondence Education. Course-wise details of enrolment during the academic year 1991-92 are given in Annexure II.

III. EXAMINATION RESULTS

The number of candidates who have registered for Graduate/Postgraduate and P.G. Diplema Courses for 1991 examinations are given in Annexure III. The performance of M.A. Economics, M.A. Hindi, M.A. Public Administration and M.A. Telugu students is noteworthy.

Among the P.G. Diploma courses the performance of students of P.G. Diploma in Translation is outstanding as all 15 candidates who appeared for the exams, secured 1 Classes ensuring 100% result. The performance of P.G.D.C.R.S.

students is also noteworthy.

IV. MEASURES TAKEN TO IMPROVE THE STUDENT SERVICES

(a) Personal Contact Programme Centres for B.A./B.Com. Courses: The personal contact classes were conducted on different dates at different centres to facilitate students to attend the classes depending upon their convenience. The personal contact programme classes were conducted in nine centres, viz., Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Waltair, Rajahmundry, Kakinada, Vijayawada, Guntur, Ongole and Hyderabad. The Personal Contact Programme at Hyderabad is conducted for the First time during the year. The detailed schedule of the Personal Contact Programme centres for B.A. and B.Com. courses is given in Annexure IV.

The particulars of students participation in these programmes are given in Annexure V. The attendance at the

Personal contact Programme classes is encouraging.

(e) Practical Training and Personal Contact Programme Classes for the candidates of PGDCRS: Practical Training for 91-92 batch of candidates of Postgraduate Diploma in Cooperation and Rural Studies will be conducted at 3 centres for a period of 10 days in October, 1992. For each centre, 30 to 35 candidates are allotted depending upon their geographical proximity. The practical training will be conducted at the following centres:

First Round: 1. Hyderabad 2. Eluru

3. Visakhapatnam

The candidates under the supervision of concerned teaching staff member of the School of Correspondence Courses have to visit 10 cooperative societies covering the following 4 types:

- 1. Cooperative Credit Societies and Banks.
- 2. Consumers Cooperative Stores
- 3. Producers Cooperatives
- 4. Marketing Cooperatives.

The personal Contact Programme classes for the PGDCRS students will be arranged at Andhra University Campus in October, 1992 for a period of 11 days. Attendance for both practical Training Programme and Personal Contact Programme classes is compulsory.

(f) Personal Contact Programme for P.G. Diploma Courses: The Personal Contact Programme classes for the non-conventional P.G. Diploma courses will be conducted in

November at A.U. Campus.

(g) Despatch Schedule: Consequent upon the streamlining of work relating to the despatch of course material, to schedule for the despatch of lessons could be adhered the during the academic year. Study material was despatched well in advance by taking the commencement of Examinations into accout.

- h) Conduct of Examinations (Common Core Scheme) by the School: As mentioned in the last Annual Report the Director. School of Correspondence Courses is authorised to conduct the examinations for all the courses that are being officied by the School of Correspondence courses and accordingly the Degree. Potgraduate Courses including P. G. Diploma Examinations are conducted and results are published by the School on time. The result of B. A. Degree examinations were processed within a record period of one month in order to enable the students to appear for the AUCE. Texaminations.
- i) Office Automation Equipment: As reported in the previous Annual Report the AT 386 'Micro Computer and one 60 MB cartridge Tape Drive, two PCS one PC XT Automatic Plane Paper Copier and Electronic Intercom are being used to improve the student support services, With the addition of PC-AT 386. PC-XT two PCS one PC-AT 286 and one PC during the year under report the school is able to process the results more expeditiously and reduce the delay announcing the results. Besides the examination work of the School of the Correspondence Courses the School is also processing the results of A U C E T. AUMBACET and AUHRMCET results.

V. B.A../B.COM. SUPPLEMENTARY BATCH 1991-'92

Another B. A./B. Com Entrance Examination during the academic year 1991-'92 was conducted in January, 1992 as in the case of January 1991 to give an extra opportunity to the candidates who would like to pursue their higher studies by passing B. A./B. Com. Entrance Examination. The candidates who passed the Entrance Examinations in January are admitted into first year B. A./B.Com. Degree Course in the School of Correspondence Courses as supplementary batch during the concerned academic year.

Separate personal contact Programme classes for the candidates of all the B-A./B. Com. Supplementary Batches will be arranged in October. 1992. The first year University examinations to the candidates of supplementary batch will be held in November/December of the concerned academic year 2nd and 3rd year University Examinations to these candidates will be held with a gap of one year each. there after.

VII. STUDY CENTRES AND WEEK-END CLASSES

In addition to the eight study centres which were transferred to the School of Correspondence Courses during the year 1986-87 four study centres each started during the years 1988-1989, and 1990-1991 the following four new study centres

were identified in the following places during the year 1992.

In addition to the above -four study centres it is proposed to have one study centre each at Berhampur in Orissa and Kharagpur in West Bengal during this year itself. Arrangements are already made in choosing the colleges for the purpose of starting study centres at the above mentioned places and the permission from the respetive Directors of Higher Education in this regard is awaited.

To commence with the School proposes to conduct week-end classes i. e. on Second Saturdays and Sundays at the above centres. The week end classes for the academic year 1991-92 in all the centres were scheduled from January 1992 withy addition of the centres the School has now 26 study cent res catering to the students all over the State besides one study centre at New Delhi. The detailed programme of weekend classes at various study centres and the particulars of student participation in these classes are furnished in Annexure VI and Annexure VII respectively.

VIII. WEEK - END CLASSES FOR POSTGRADUATE COURSES

The week-end class Programme facility has been extended to the students of Postgraduate courses also from the academic year 1988-89. These classes are in addition to the Annual Personal Contact Programme Classes To start with the week end classes are being held in the University Campus. Waltair, This facility will be extended to the other areas depending upon students enrolment and the availability of resource personnel to handle the classes at the respective centres. particulars of student participation during the year under report are shown in Annexure VIII.

CHAPTER XXVI

Academic Staff College

Introduction:

The Academic Staff College was inaugurated by Prof. K. Ramakrishna Rao, Higher Education Adviser to Government of Andhra Pradesh on 23rd November, 1987. The guidelines and syllabus supplied by the University Grants Commission in organising the courses have been meticulously observed and a strategy of implementation of the U.G.C. guidelines has been prepared. The four components of the course were further divided into lectures, group discussions, modified micro-teaching exercises and other related academic methods.

A list of Resource Persons drawn both from outside and from within the campus was prepared by the Advisory Committee of the Academic Staff College and the same has been used to conduct classes. The Resource Persons are requested to present their content in a most innovative manner in the class room and they are also requested to provide hand-outs on their presentations. Participants are also asked to observe the method of presentation of the content in the class room and the individual differences of the Resource Persons in presenting the matter so that the participants can emulate the best method.

The Response from the Colleges:

The establishment of the Academic Staff College has not meant the creation of a white elephant; on the contrary. The sanction for this college opened the doors to a flood of activity; in the first year, as many as eight training programmes have been completed.

The catchment area of the college has been spread over from Assam in the East and Kerala in the South for Refresher Courses. It is estimated that around 200 applications are being received for each course except for the Refresher Courses of Law and Mathematics. So far, (June, 1992) 1129 Lecturers have been trained in our college of which 409 are in Refresher Courses, 593 are in Orientation Courses and 128 are in Inter-disciplinary Refresher Courses. The Principals of the affiliated colleges have expressed their utmost satisfaction with our courses in the meeting of the Principals held during 29-31 March, 1990.

Selection of Teachers:

The Principals of the affiliated colleges are generally reque-

sted to submit their nominations of names of the Lecturers for the Orientation Course about 4 weeks before commencement of the Course. A proform a of application indicating the name. years of experience, educational qualifications, etc., has been sent to all the 200 affiliated colleges of the catchment area Andhra and Nagarjuna Universities and all the Registrars of Universities in the State of Andhra Pradesh. We have computerised the selection of candidates for the courses. selected candidates and their principals will be informed about the selection about 10 days in advance. The Director of Higher Education has also been informed about the participation of the lecturers in the course after they took admission into the college. The Govt, of Andhra Pradesh has also issued a G. O. Ms No. 445 dt. 17-10-1988 for the sanction of 'on duty' to the participants of the Academic Staff College.

Orientation and Refresher Courses:

The Academic Staff College of Andhra University has been identified by the U. G. C. to conduct Refresher Courses for in service teachers in six disciplines, i.e., (1) Economics (2) Commerce (3) Chemistry (4) Mathematics (5) Zoology and (6) Law. So far (upto 30-6-92) we have conducted 20 'Orientation Courses' 15 'Refresher Courses' and 3 'Inter-disciplinary Courses'. The Senior Professors in the Departments/Head of the Departments of concerned subjects have been appointed as Course Coordinators for the Refresher Courses and senior lecturers are appointed as Course Coordinator for Orientation Courses.

Lectures and discussions by experts are being arranged at least in two sessions per day and the last hour is kept open to introduce any innovative and creative programme. participant in the course is required to submit assignments in the form of alsummary of the presentations made by the Resource Persons at the end of the each week. In addition to these assignments, each participant will submit a paper on a topic that has already been indicated by him/her. They can consult the Course Coordinators or the Resource Persons in finalising the research paper. The participants will also be motivated to review latest editions of useful books prescribed by Director/ Course Coordinators and guided discussion will follow the Special lectures/guest lectures will be arranged in identified topics in order to introduce the participants to the latest developments in Higher Education system. The participants can also undertake innovative methods of teaching and share them with the co-participants to improve the quality of A modified micro-teaching exercise with the help of the video equipment has been made compulsory for every participant in the Orientation Course. As a matter of fact the

Refresher Courses and Orientation Programmes are innovative teaching, learning processes where in many opportunities are thrown open to the participants to experiment and benefit from their participation during the period of course.

Library Books Acquired:

The Academic Staff College Library has acquired 3345 volumes in various subjects. The books have been used by the participants and Resource Persons. The A.S.C. Library is getting journals consisting of Economic and Political Weekly. Journal of Public Administration. Social Scientist, Society and Change The Week. University News, Educational Planning & Administration and all leading dailies. The participants are however encountered with some difficulty in making use of the facilities as there is no proper accommodation for the library.

Teaching Aids Brought for A.S.C.:

The Academic Staff College has acquired one Overhead Projector and one Sliodamatic Automatic Projector. The College has also acquired a Vide Camera, T.V., V.C.R., Tape Recorder, PC XT, P.C. etc., The equipment has been used by the Resource Persons and also by the participants.

All Core Staff Appointed:

The University has appointed the Director, Reader, Lecturer, Office Superintendent, Steno-typist, Accounts Clerk, Technical Assistant (Library) and Attender on a permanent basis. In addition to the Core Staff some contingency staff has also been appointed for the hostel and for the college as per the U.G.C. norms.

Accommodation:

The University has provided Sufficient accommodation for the office and class room of the college by investing around Rs. 1,50,000/- for the establishment of the Academic Staff College in the heart of the campus. In addition to the Office complex, the University has also provided a Professor's Quarter in Shivajipalem (Near ASC Guest House) as the hired accommodation was not sufficient to provide hostel facilities to the participants. Now the College has all the facilities such as class room furniture and hostel facilities including cots, mattresses, pillows. T. V. etc., for the comfortable stay of the participants and resource persons.
