# Annual Work Plan and Budget for 2003-2004 for Dhalai-Dist under Sava Shiksha Abhiyan.

#### 1. Introduction.

Following Govt. of India's deceision for launching SSA scheme in the State, the Annual work plan & Budget for the year 2003-04 is prepared for Dhalai-Dist. on the basis of the information collected through household and School survey. The Annual Plan for the year 2003-04 is being submitted to the Govt. of India for necessary approval.

An amount of Rs. 398.01 (in Lakhs) was proposed in the Annual Plan-2002-03-out of which a sum of Rs. 147.06 (in Lakhs) has been sanctioned by the Govt. of India for expenditure on different items as indicated below:-

#### 2. DISTRICT PROFILE

Dhalai District came into exstence w.e.f. 15th August, 1995. There are 4(four) Sub-Divisions manely Kamalpur, Ambassa, Gandacharra and Longthorai Valley. There are 5(five) Blocks Salema R.D.Block, Ambassa R.D.Block, Manu R.D.Block, Chawmanu R.D. Block and Dumburnagar R.D.Block. There are also 6 (six) Revenue Circles, 130 (One hundred thirty) Gaon Panchayats, 154 (One hundred fifty four) Revenue Villages and 1(One) Nagar Panchayat. There are 60,376 Householders. Total population of the Dhalai District is 3,07,417 out of which 1,48,937 is Female as per 2001 census. Dhalai is bounded by the Bangladesh in the North and West Tripura Districtbin the , North Tripura Distric in the East and SouthTripura and Bangladesh in the South. From the report of the Households survey conducted between the period from 18th to 26th Nov-2001 it is seen that there are 60376 Nos of Households out of which ST -30959, SC -10889. The Geographical area of the Districts about 60% of the district is covered by green forest.

#### 3. District Administration :-

Sub-Division with Sub-Divisional Officer as its head.

The three tier Panchyet bodies ,Zilla Parishad,Panchyet Samity,Gram Panchyet are functioning at the District,Block and Village level respectively.The Hon'ble Sabhadipati is the Head of the Zilla Parishad and Chairman is the head of Panchyet Samity.Teh Goan Sabha is headed by Pradhan.Number of the members of the Panchyet bodies varies one to another depending on size of area and population, District Magistrate & Collector is the Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad white Block Development Officer acts as the Executive Officer of Panchyet Samity. In between District and Block levels there is another administrative structure called

#### 5. TOPOGRAPHY

Tripura is mostly a hilly state, there are lofty hills, small mountains. There are 6(six) major hills ranges in the state, part of ATARAMURA and LONGTHARAI fall within the Dhalai District. Dhalai District is also a land of countless small rivulets, streams and rivers. This rivulets and rivers carry the rain water of the state to our neighbouring country Bangladesh. The Manu and Dhalai are the major river of the District and Raima & Sarma rivers jointly created the GUMTI, the longest river of the state.

#### 6. SOCIO ECONOMIC AND CULTURAL CHARACTERISTICS

The Dhalai District is inhabited by people of different languages, relegion and culture, Majority of the people are bengali speaking, others belong to tribes of different dialects. They are Tripuries, Halams, Hrankhal, Garos, Reangs, Besides, Manipuri speaking pepole also live in certain areas of the District. Manipuri Muslim is another social group in the District. Majority pepole of the District are Hindu. There are some followers of Christianity among the tribal pepole.

#### 7. EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AT ALL LEVELS

There is one Degree Collage in the District. DIET has been sanctioned for Dhalai District. The Civil work of the DIET will be started within short period with the sanctioned money by the Government of India. There is one 200-seated residential school for ST children located at Sytyaram Choudhury Para near Ambassa. Another 200 seated residential school is going to be opened at Jaharnagar of Ambassa Sub-Division under Centrally-sponsored scheme. Number of schools having facilities of Elementary Education is indicated below including recognised aided and Unaided schools.

## 8. ENROLMENT

Total gross enrolment ratio at Primary stage is around 126 and the net enrolment ratio is around 63. Most parts of the District is (60%) covered with Forest and Hills. The tribal habitations are located in the difficult and hilly areas. Participation of tribal children in the Elementary Education is very low due to poverty and lack of awareness.

#### CHAPTER - II

# 9. PRE-PROJECT ACTIVITIES

Householder survey and School Survey were Conducted in the District between a period from 18th to 26th Nov, 2001 Covering all the household and School of the District. 669 Nos. School teacher were engaged for the said survey. The following Pre-project activities have been Completed.

- 1. VEC constituted in 121 nos of Gaon Panchayet of Dhalai District.
- 2. MTA formed in 463 Nos School under Dhalai District.
- 3. Block Level Education Committees have been formed for five nos. Block of Dhalai District.
- 4. B.R.P's & C.R.P's have been selected for all Block and Sub-Block of Dhalai District.
- 5. Requirement of New primary, Upper primary schools and Alternative Education Centre have been assessed through Micro-Planning and School-mapping at habitation level undertaken during 26-04-2002 to 09-05-2002.
- **9.1.** Achievement level Survey of class VI Student was Conducted in the 40 selected schools of Dhalai District with the Test materials supplied by NCERT & SCERT. The findings of the survey will be made available to the District office within a short period. Campaign programme has been organised in different places throughout the district to Sensitise different sections of people about SSA Scheme.

Training Programmes were organised at District Block, village, School level to build up capacities of members of Panchyet bodies, VEC, MTA, NGO'S.

**9.2.** 10 teachers were identified in each Block of the district for carrying out micro-planning and school mapping. They participated in the training programme on micro-planning and school mapping organised by the Education District Office at Chandraipara Higher Secondary School, Ambassa on the 26th April, 2002. They undertook extensive tour in their respective village/habitation area alloted to them, held meeting and mobilised the local people with the help of member of VEC, MTA, NGO and Panchayat bodies to develop village level plans.

Some important findings that have emerged from the survey are furnished in the following tables:





#### EDUCATIONAL LEVEL-WISE NUMBER OF HEADS OF HOUSEHOLDS IN THE DISTRICT



It is observed that no. of children in the age group of 6-14 years are 68,573 in the District as per survey report out of which 5577 Nos. are dropped out i.e. 8.13% and 9308 are never gone to School i.e. 13.57%. It is also observed that 1,350 number of Children could not attend School due to Non-availability of Schooling Facility i.e. 1.97%.

Now it has become the responsibility of the Government to provide schooling facilities to the above mentioned Children alongwith the children in the age group 0-6 as shown in the Table below:

#### CHAPTER - III

## 10. INTERVENTIONS UNDER SSA

#### 10.1 Enrolment :-

Enrolment of Girls Children in general and specially girls children belonging to ST, SC and Other Backward Communities is very low in the District. In order to improve enrolment ratio of girls children of the district special drive for enrolment of un-enrolled and dropped out girls in the age group 6-14 would be emphasised with great importance. Attempt will be made to creat more awareness among the women, ST, SC, OBC parents and to sensitise the community as a whole about gender disparity. Special arrangement will be made to encourage the girl children to participate in Elementary Education and residential school for ST, SC, Girls will be opened in the District

The school less habitations which fulfill the criteria as per existing State Govt. norms will be provided Primary School under SSA in phased manner. In habitations which are located in hilly & remote areas, EGS Centre will be setup to ensure participation of all children who could not be enrolled so far due to lack of schooling facilities.

#### 10.2 Retention :-

The existing incentive programme like Dress Grant, Attendance Grant, Pre-matric Scholarship, NPNSPE, etc. will be effectively utilised to improve attendance of all children in the School. With the active co-operation and support of the MTA, VEC & local parents, problems like absentism of teachers, shortage of teaching staff, lack of school building and TLE will be remove for proper functioning of each school. The atmosphere of school will be made attractive to the children by organising various games and sports, cultural activities to make their learning experience happy and joyful. Existing evaluation system at the elementary stage will be reformed to remove element of chances and anxiety from the mind of the children.

Annual target will be set each year to achieve 100% retention within fixed time frame, coaching classes, remedial classes will be arranged for providing support to the weak and slow learners.

#### 10.3 Quality Improvement :-

At present there is huge backlog of untrained teacher in the state as well as in the Dhalai District. In order to reduce the backlog the State Govt. has taken certain steps like introduction of teachers training programme through distance mode. The Tripura University and IGNOU are currently conducting in-service teachers training course for the untrained teacher. Besides, inservice training programme, orientation programme are organised by SCERT & DIET, West Tripura from time to time. More training programme will be organised under the programme SSA to upgrade the skill and competancy of the existing teachers with the fund sanctioned by GOI, in the last Annual Plan. The pedagogical inputs are of paramount importance in improving the achievement level of the students.

# 10. TARGETS & PRIORITIES OF ANNUAL PLAN (2003-2004)

- 1. Enrolment and mainstreaming of 9,308 nos. Un-enroled children and 5,577 nos. dropped out children of Dhalai District who were identified through household survey are targeted to the achived by the end of December-2003. Total 473 unsereved habitation have been identified.
- 2. 25 nos. New Primary Schools will be set up and 5 nos. Junior Basic Schools will be upgraded to Upper Primary School as indicated.

- 4. A Residential School will be set up at Gandacharra under Dumburnagar Black for St Girls children of Jumia families (i.e. shifting cultivators). The present drop-out rate at Elemantary Stage upto Class VIII in the Dhalai District is around 68%. Attemt will be made to improve retention rate by 20% by reducing the current drop-out rate at the end of academic session 2003.
- 5. Education Management Information System (EMIS) will be set up and made functional at the Dhalai District Office for effective manitoring. Required manpower will be engaged. Two technical persons with required skill will be engaged on contructual basis for EMIS.

## 6. Maintanance of School Building :-

Most of the existing School buildings in the District are in bad shape due to want of repair over a long period. The State Govt, are not in a position to take up maintanance work of a large number of School building under the Education Department because of financial constraint. During the rainy season it become very difficult to take class as water pass through the holes of damaged roofs and broken door and window. Funds for maintanance work @ 5000/- per School have been proposed for 481 Nos. Schools of Dhalai district during 2003-2004.

#### 7. Toilet's Facility:-

200 Nos. Schools of District are running without Toilets facilities. Due to non-existance of toilet facilities, the attendance of girls children is found to be poor in many toiletless schools. In order to overcome this problems it is proposed that toilets facilities may be provided for 30 Nos. Schools during the fianacial year 2003-2004.

#### 8. Teaching Learning Materials :-

There are 50 Primary and 18 Upper Primary Schools uncovered by OBB. Teaching learning process cannot take place in meaningfu; I way without use of Teaching learning material, TLE may be supplied to all the uncovered Primary and Upper Primary Schools on priority basis.

#### 9. Disabled Childrens :-

The Disabled children are considered as the most disadvantaged group. Like other children they should have equal opportunity for Elementary Education. Total 500 Nos. disabled Children have been identified in the District in the age group of 6-14 years. They will be provided assistance @ Rs. 1200/- per year during the current financial year.

#### 10. Training of Community Leaders :-

There are 130 Nos. Gaon Panchayet in the District and Village Education Commettee have been formed in all the Gaon Panchayet. Each member of the VEC will be given training for 2 days with the provision of Rs. 30/- per head per day earmarked for this purpose. The BRP will organise this training programme at Block level in different phases. The state level Resource Person of SCERT & DIET will also attend the programme as Resource Person.

## 11. Training for Teachers :-

Training Programme for Untrained as well as for other exsting teachers will be organised at different venues in the District in phased manner. Duration of the training is fixed for 10 days for each batch consisting of 100 teachers. 1,714 Nos, teachers of existing school will be provided training during current financial year.

12. All BRC's & CRC's will be made functional w.e.f. January 2004. There are 5 Nos. BRC 40 Nos.CRC in the District Fund for contingency, TA & meeting allowance, furnitures should be provided to all BRC & CRC during this current financial year. Construction work of 3 Nos. BRC 15 Nos. CRC will be taken up. The office of BRC & CRC will be housed in the rented building or existing Government building where ever available.


