
F O R E W O R D

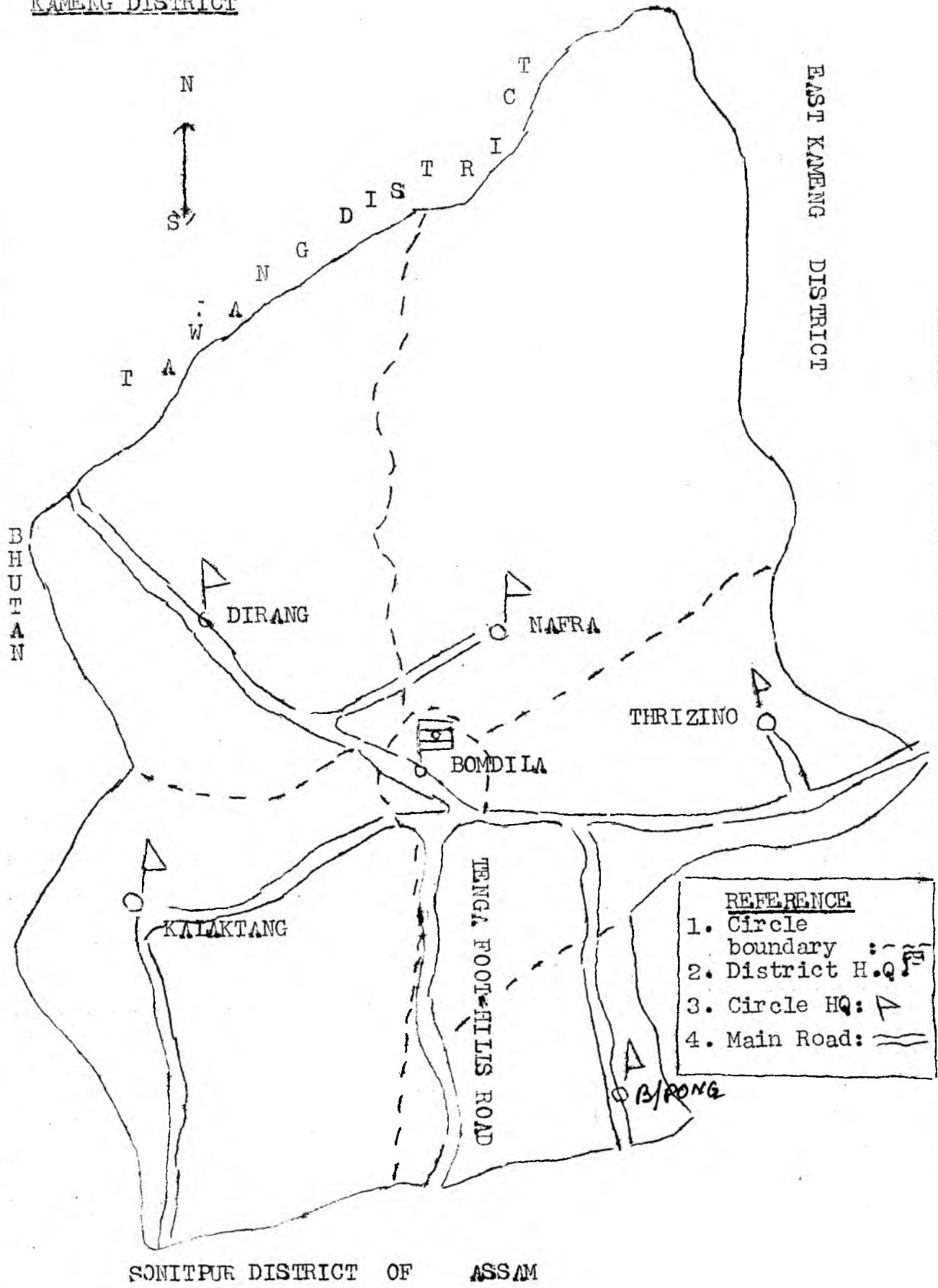

A SYNOPSIS OF WEST KAMENG DISTRICT

West Kameng District of Arunachal Pradesh is lying approximately between 91' 30' to 92' 40' East longitudes and 26' 54' to 28' 01' North latitudes. The district is surrounded by Tibet region of China in the North, Bhutan in the West, Tawang and East Kameng Districts of Arunachal Pradesh are in the North West and East respectively. The southern boundary adjoins Sonitpur District of Assam.

HISTORICAL GENESIS

The name of the district is derived from the Kameng river, a tributary of Brahmaputra, that flows through the District. Till 1914, the district was a part of the Darrang District of Assam. By a Government of India notification of 1914, the area covered by this district became a part of the 'Western Section' of the 'North East Frontier Tract' to which the entry of the British subject was regulated by an 'Inner Line'. In 1919, this tract was renamed as the 'Balipara Frontier Tract' having its headquarter at Charduar of Assam. In 1946, the district area was carved out of the Balipara Frontier Tract with the name of 'Sela Sub-Agency' and its headquarter continued to be at Charduar. In 1954, Sela Sub-Agency was renamed as the Kameng Frontier Division and its headquarter was later transferred to Bomdila. Like other parts of NEFA, it was also under the Ministry of External Affairs and over all in-charge of the district was a Political Officer. On 1st September, 1965, the Ministry of Home Affairs took over the Administrative charge of NEFA from the Ministry of External Affairs and Kameng Frontier Division was renamed as Kameng District and the Political Officer was redesignated as Deputy Commissioner.

On 1st June, 1980, Kameng District was bifurcated into East and West Kameng District. East Kameng was formed covering the area of the then Seppa Sub-Division and rest of the area of erstwhile Kameng District was placed under West Kameng. Finally on 6th October, 1984, West Kameng District was again bifurcated and carving out the area of Tawang Sub-Division, Tawang District was formed.

PHYSIOGRAPHY :

The topography of the District is mostly mountainous. A large part of it falls within the higher mountain zone consisting of mass of tangled peaks and valleys.

In West Kameng, there are three principal mountain ranges - a part of Sela range, Bomdila range and Foot-hill range. The Sela range consists a series of mountains arranged in the form of big line from Tibet in the north, Bhutan in the West and thus forming a tough terrain to pass through it. The altitude of Sela range varies from 14000' to 15000' and Sela pass is 13714 feet high. The Bomdila range having an average height of 9000 feet is separated by a 4500' high valley of river Dirang Chu, a tributary of Kameng river. On this range the district headquarter - Bomdila lies at an altitude varying from 8100' to 9000' above sea level. South of the Bomdila range lies the Foot-hills range having hills of quite low altitudes and the area is mostly plain. The area of Foot-hill range is full of tropical forests with trees of great economic values and various types of wild game.

The Kameng river flows through the district and leaving the district at Bhalukpong it ultimately joins the river Brahmaputra in plains of Assam. Lenga, Bichom and Dirang Chu are the main tributaries of the river Kameng.

CLIMATE :

The district is situated within the temperate zone and is remote from the sea. The sea has thus no influence on its climate and the distance from the Equator is immaterial owing to the influence of the snow-clad mountains. The only factor which determines the climate is the direction and height of mountains and the nature of soil.

Although the district lies close to the tropic, it furnishes every gradation of climate, from the sultry and suffocating tropical heat of Foot-hills area to the arctic cold of snow-clad peaks. Thus the climate is hot and humid upto 4000' in southern area, temperate upto 7000' and cold beyond it. Humidity is generally high throughout the year, the winter months being less humid.

POPULATION :

As per 1991 Census, West Kameng District is having 169 villages with a population of 56402, comprising 30942 males and 25460 females. Bomdila town had a population of 5570 persons.

The literate population of the district as per 1991 Census was 20348 forming 36.08 percent of the total population. However, the literacy among males and females was recorded as 44.10 percent and 26.32 percent respectively.

The average density of population per square kilometre is 7 for the district as compared to 8 persons for Arunachal Pradesh.

The district headquarter, Bomdila, is declared as urban and rest of the areas of the district are still considered as rural. The sex ratio indicates 823 females per 1000 males. The decennial growth rate of population (1981-91) was recorded as 35.69 for the district.

LOCAL INHABITANTS

There are five major tribes in West Kameng, namely Monpas, Mijis, Akas, Sherdukpens and Khawas.

MONPAS :

The monpas belong to the Tibeto-Mongoloid stock. They are well built, fair in complexion and medium to tall in structure. They are hospitable, gentle and unassuming in temperament. Some of them have good business acumen. Their houses are made of stone and timber.

A Monpa family is patriarchal. Monogamy is the general rule though polygamy is also practised. Monpas have castes and clans with no social hierarchy.

Due to slight variations in dialects Monpas can be divided into six linguistic groups, namely, Towang Monpa, Dirang Monpa, Lish Monpa, Boot Monpa, Kalaktang Monpa and Ranchan Monpa. Each group has its own dialects.

Monpas are Mahayana Buddhist by religion with close cultural and religious affinities with Bhutanese and Tibetans. All houses have small altars and chapels with statues of Buddha. Offering water in little cups and burning butter lamps are daily ritual. The people believe in transmigration of the soul and reincarnation.

The Monpas perform many pantomime dances out of which the 'Ajilamu' dance is very popular. Losar and Choskar are the major religious festivals of Monpas. Losar is celebrated to commemorate the advent of New Year. There is great merry-making and dancing during Losar festival. In Choskar festival the Lamas read religious scriptures in the Gumpa for a number of days. Thereafter the villagers carry the religious books on their back in the procession under the guidance of the senior Lama and the procession goes round the cultivation fields. The significance of this performance is to ensure better cultivation and protect the grains from insects and wild animals and also for the prosperity of the villagers in general.

The Monpas are agriculturists. They practise both shifting and permanent types of cultivation. They keep horses, yaks, cows, pigs, goats, sheep and fowls. They do hunting by net, angle, and trap. The Monpas are known for wood curving, painting, religious scrolls called Thankas, carpet making and weaving.

MIJI (Dhammai):

The Mijis live in the valley of Bichom river and they are a small group of people. According to their own tradition and belief, they had originally migrated from the plains and even claim to have connections with the Ahom Kings who ruled over Assam. Marriage among the Mijis usually takes place by negotiation. Normal bride price is given by the parents of the bridegroom.

The Mijis belong to the Mongoloid stock. They are divided into two classes, the Nyubbu and the Nyullu, who do not intermarry. Their religion is indigenous but they have come under certain amount of Buddhist influence.

The Miji family is patriarchal. The Mijis put prominent tatoo mark on faces. Basketry is a popular handicraft among the men-folk. The Mijis are agriculturist and practise shifting cultivation. They also do hunting and fishing.

The Mijis observe a number of ceremonies in the village, the most important celebration is known as Fungplin or Chindang. The Mijis believe in many Gods. Janglungnui is the most powerful of all of them. A festival is observed in honour of the spirit in the month of October. Each village has a Deori or Priest who officiates in the ritual.

There is a village council in each miji village and the council consists of village headman and other elders of the village.

AKA (Hrusso) :

The Akas are inhabitants of the South-Eastern part of West Kameng. Their main concentration is noticed in the Thrizino area.

The Aka society is said to be mainly based on two broad groups; Kutsun and Kovatsun. An Aka family is patriarchal and polygamy is practised. Marriage takes place either by the common way of negotiations or by elopement. Cross cousin marriage is preferred to others. Mithuns are essential part of the bride price for marriage. The Aka house is an elongated structure. The Akas have prominent tatoo marks on the faces. The Akas observe a number of ceremonies in the village. The most important community festival is known as Nechido, performed by village priest once in a year.

The Ak women make colourful bags. Basketry is the popular handicraft amongst the menfolk. The most common form of art is wood painting.

The Akas are agriculturist and they practise shifting cultivation. They keep mithun, cow, horse, goat, pig and poultry. They practise hunting and chasing by means of spears, bows and arrows. The Akas have a number of songs and dances for different socio-religious festivities.

SHERDUKPEN :

The Sherdukpens belong to Tibeto Mongoloid stock and they are fair in complexion. Their main concentration is spread over four main villages of Rupa, Jigaon, Shergaon and Thungre. However, at present some of them settled in Kamengbari area of West Kameng.

The Sherdukpen society is based on ~~the~~ classes: Thong and Chao. The Thongs are said to be descendants of King Japtang Bura and Chao are the descendants of his partners and servant class. As such, the class Thong is superior to Chao. The two classes are again divided into several clans.

A Sherdukpen family is patriarchal and they practise monogamous type of marriage. The Sherdukpen houses are generally erected on substantial stone foundations. The floor and walls are made of thick wooden planks.

Like Monpas, the Sherdukpens are also Buddhist and deeply religious. They observe a number of ceremonies, the important ones are (a) Choskar (b) Losar (c) Wang and (d) Khiksaba. The Choskar, Losar and Wang are Buddhist ceremonies. Khiksaba is a non-Buddhist ceremony and celebrated at the out-skirts of the villages.

The Sherdukpens are agriculturist and practise both shifting and permanent cultivation. They keep livestock like ponies, cows, goats, sheep, fowls and bullocks. They hunt with bows and arrows. They practise fishing by means of nets, angles, traps. The Sherdukpen women are skillful weavers. The Sherdukpens perform many dances, the principal dances are the Yak dance, the deer dance and Ajilamu dance which are both exciting and entertaining. An interesting feature of Sherdukpens life is their annual migration during the winter month to Doimara and in the adjoining foot-hills area for the purposes of trade and maintaining their age-long relations with the plains.

KHAWAS (Bugun) :

The Khawas inhabit in some of the villages of Thrizino circle of the district. They call themselves Bugun. The tribe is sub-divided into a number of clans. All of them are said to have originated from a single tribal identity called 'Achimpi^{lu}'. The tribe endogamy and clan exogamy is the rule of the tribe. Monogamy is the social norm but sometimes biogamy is also practised.

A Khawa family is patriarchal. The Khawas belong to the Mongoloid stock and are of fair complexion. They have flat nose, conspicuous cheek-bones, black hair and brownish eyes. Both males and females keep long hair and tie their hair like the Akas and Mijis. The Khawa houses are like those of the Akas and Mijis but the roofs of the houses are usually covered with bamboo matting.

The Khawas are agriculturist. They practise shifting cultivation and keep domesticated animals like cow, horse, pig, sheep, goat, fowl and very rarely mithun. They hunt and chase by means of spears, traps, bows and arrows.

The most important ceremony amongst the Khawas is 'Kshyat-sowai'. The village priest (phabi) perform the rituals and the ceremonies. The Khawas have a number of songs and dances which are mainly associated with their socio religious festivals.

There is a village council in each Khawa village which is responsible for the internal administration.

ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :

The administrative set up is based on single line administration which aims at keeping a close co-operation amongst various development departments with the administration and thus work together for speedy development of the people and the area.

The entire district is divided into three Sub-Divisions viz. Bomdila, Rupa and Nafra-Buragaon. Bomdila Sub-Division has got three circles i.e. Dirang, Bomdila (Sadar) and Bhalukpong; Rupa Sub-Division covers Kalaktang circle; Nafra-Buragaon Sub-Division has got two circles, namely, Nafra and Thrizino.

The Deputy Commissioner, being the overall incharge of the district, maintains law and order with the help of administrative officers and police force. The villagers have their own customary administrative system in the form of traditional village councils. The councils consist of the Gaon Buras and members. The Assam Frontier Regulation, 1945, authorises the village councils to settle all civil matters and certain criminal matters falling within their jurisdictions. However, for all matters, the Deputy Commissioner and some other administrative officers have jurisdiction under the supervision of the Assam High Court which holds the appellate and the revisional authority.

The district has been covered by 3 blocks, namely, Dirang, Kalaktang and Nafra-Buragaon.

The Panchayat Raj has been introduced in the district with the North East Frontier Agency Panchayat Raj Regulation, 1967. Under this regulation (1), the Gram Panchayat exist at the village level (2) the Anchal Samiti at the Anchal level and Zilla Parishad operates at the district level. The Regulation provides for effective participation of the people in the administration through the institutions set up under the Panchayat Raj scheme.
