This volume on District Educational Statistics for the State of Assam is the fifth in the series of such volumes, brought out for all the States and Union Territories. The main aim is to highlight the inter-district variations in a State by giving educational data at district levels with the help of some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per-capita expenditure and teacher-pupil ratio etc.

In order to ascertain whether the educational imbalances have widened or narrowed down over a period of time, the data for the year 1981-82 has been analysed and compared with that for the year 1976-77.

I take this opportunity to acknowledge the assistance received from the Director of Education, Assam in supplying the required statistical data and the Project staff of the Planning, Monitoring & Statistics Division in compiling this report.

I. N. T. R. O. D. U. C. T. I. O. N

The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Education brings out the publication "Educational Statistics - District-wise" quinquennially since 1965-66 to highlight the Regional imbalances in educational sector. The first volume of such publication was published in 1960-61 by the National Council of Educational Research and Training.

2. In this volume, the comparative picture of Educational Statistics of Institutions, Enrolment & Teachers at district level in respect of Assam is given for the year 1976-77 and 1981-82. Indicators like enrolment, ratio, teacher pupil ratios and average school available for the population etc. in each district are also depicted in this report.

II - AREA AND POPULATION

3. The total area of the Assam State as per 1971 Census is 78,523 Sq. Kms. Assam had 10 districts in 1981-82 and 1976-77. The maximum area belonged to Goalpara (10,359 Sq.Kms) and the minimum N.C. Hills (4,890 Sq.Kms.). It may be mentioned here that due to disturbed conditions in the state, the 1981 Census could not be conducted there.

4. The estimated population for the year 1977 was 176.80 Lakhs which has been worked out for the year 1982 as 203.90 lakhs (107.25 lakhs Males and 96.66 lakhs Females). In 1977, among the districts the largest population was in Kamrup district (34.50 lakhs) and the lowest in N.C. Hills (0.92 lakh). In 1982 also the estimated population varied widely among the districts from 39.80 lakhs in Kamrup district to 1.06 lakhs in N.C. Hills district.

5. The overall density of population per Sq. Km. was 226 in 1977 which is estimated to have increased to 260 Sq.Km. in 1982. The density of population per Sq.Km. in 1982 varied widely among Districts viz. from 421 the highest in Nagaon to only 22 the lowest in N.C. Hills. The Area, total population and density of population for different Districts for the year 1976-77 and 1981-82 are given in Appendix No.2. Table No.(I) gives district-wise position of percentage share of area and percentage share of population in 1982:

The total population of the State as well as population of different Age-Groups for year 1977 and 1982 given in this report are based on the revised population projections (as on 1st March of the year) available from the office of Registrar General of India. District-wise population in the Age-Groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 are based on the following formula:-

We assume that

$$\frac{P_{6-11}}{P} = \frac{P_{6-11}^i}{P^i} = K$$

where K is estimated from the equation $K = \frac{P_{6-11}}{P}$

P_{6-11} = Denote 6-11 Age-Group population of the State

P = Total Population of the State

P_{6-11}^i = Age-Group Population of the ith District

P^i = Total Population of the ith District.

To get the Sex-wise break-up of total population in the various Age-Groups of the district first the Girls population is estimated using the above equation with the only difference that in the above formula Total Population is replaced by the Girls population. The boys population is obtained by subtracting girls population from the total population for the respective districts.

7. Similar formulae are used for estimating the District-wise Population in the Age-Groups 11-14 and 14-17 years.

8. The Total estimated population of children in the Age-Group 6-11 years was 29.23 lakhs in 1982 (15.14 lakhs Boys and 14.09 lakhs Girls) which formed 14.3% of the total population of the State.

9. Similarly the estimated population in the Age-Group 11-14 years was 14.63 lakhs in 1982 (7.37 lakhs Boys and 7.26 lakhs Girls) which constituted 7.2% of the total population.
10. The estimated population in the Age-Group 14-17 in 1982 was 14.13 lakhs (7.16 lakhs Boys and 6.97 lakhs Girls) which formed 6.9% of the total population.
11. Thus out of the Total Population of 203.91 lakhs of the State, School Going Population in the Age-Group 6-17 years was 57.99 lakhs consisting of 29.67 lakhs Boys and 28.32 lakhs Girls. The population in the Age-Group 6-17 years constituted 28.4% of the Total Population. The percentage for Boys was 27.7% while for Girls it formed 29.3%. District-wise details are given in Appendix No.2.

III. -LITERACY

12. Census was not held in Assam during 1981 due to disturbed conditions in the state. So according to the 1971 Census the effective Literacy Rate that is the number of Literates per hundred of population (excluding the Age-Group 0-4) in the State was 34.6. The Literacy Rates for Males and Females were 44.3 and 23.5 respectively indicating a wide gap between the two sexes. Details are given in the Appendix No.6.

IV. -GENERAL SURVEY

(a) INSTITUTIONS:

13. The total number of Educational Institutions in Assam was 26,486 in 1976-77 which increased to 32,491 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 22.7% during the period of 5 years. The district of Kamrup had the largest share (5,609) of Institutions while the North Cochar Hills had the smallest share of 622 institutions in the State for the year 1981-82. The District-wise details of the institutions are given in Appendix No.1..

(b) ENROLMENT

14. The total enrolment in all educational institutions in the State increased from 25.83 lakhs in 1976-77 to 31.27 lakhs in 1981-82. The increase in Enrolment is observed in all the Districts of the State. The total Enrolment increased with annual Growth Rate of 4.2%. Kamrup district had the highest Enrolment (21.1%) and the North Cachar Hill district had the lowest Enrolment (0.8%) during 1981-82.

15. The Percentage of Girls enrolment to Total Enrolment was 39.3% in 1976-77 which increased to 40.8% during 1981-82. Among the Districts, Nagaon districts had the highest (43.5%) share of Girls enrolment whereas the Karbi Anglong district had the lowest (36.7%) share of the Girls enrolment during 1981-82.

16. The total Enrolment in all the Educational Institutions as a percentage of total population was 14.6% in 1976-77 and it increased to 15.3% in 1981-82 at the State level. The percentage enrolment to total population in 1981-82 was the highest in Kamrup(21.0) District and the lowest in N.C. Hills(0.8) District.

17. The percentage of Enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to total enrolment was 8.3 and 13.9 respectively in 1976-77 which increased to 9.1% and 14.2% respectively in case of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during 1981-82.

(c) TEACHERS

18. The total number of teachers in the State in all Educational Institutions increased from 92,526 in 1976-77 to 1,05,642 in 1981-82 showing an annual rate of increase of 2.8% during the period. The number of Women teachers formed 18.2% of the total number of teachers in 1981-82, the percentage of trained teachers in Schools of General Education was 47.0%. The corresponding percentages for Male and Female teachers were 47.2% and 46.1% respectively. Among Districts the percentage of trained teachers in Schools for General Education varied from 55.7% in Sibsagar District to 20.5% in N.C. Hills District. The percentage of women trained teachers in schools was the highest (55.2%) in Nagaon district and the lowest (9.7%) in N.C. Hills District. The details may be seen in Appendix No.5.

V. PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

19. There were 307 Pre-Primary schools in Assam in 1976-77 whereas in 1981-82 these have been reported to 291. This decline is on account of these upgradation to Middle Schools. Similarly the number of teachers in 1976-77 was 344 and the same decreased to 326 (10 Male and 316 Women) in 1981-82. Out of these 51.2% were trained teachers. Total enrolment in Pre-Primary was 17622 in 1976-77 and 13418 in 1981-82. Out of these 1439 (862 Boys and 577 Girls) students belonged to Scheduled Castes and 1798 (1061 Boys and 737 Girls) students belonged to Scheduled Tribes in 1981-82. District-wise details are given in Appendix No.9.

20. Out of 291 Pre-Primary Schools in 1981-82, 195 are reported to be located in Rural Areas having a total enrolment of 7805 (4333 Boys and 3538 Girls). Out of the total LL classes, 7805 (4267 Boys and 3538 Girls) students were studying in Pre-Primary schools located in Rural Areas only. District-wise details of pre-primary education in rural areas are given in Appendix No.10.

VI. PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

21. The total number of Primary Schools in Assam increased from 20,251 in 1976-77 to 21,729 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 7.3% over the period of 5 years. The highest percentage of Primary Schools was 18.4% in Kamrup district while the lowest percentage 2.0% was in North Cachar Hills district.

22. On the average, in 1976-77, a Primary school was serving an Area of 3.9 Sq. Kms. Over the period of 5 years, this position improved slightly and a Primary school was serving an Area of 3.6 Sq. Km. in 1981-82. In 1981-82, the average Area served by a Primary school was the minimum in case of Kamrup 2.5 Sq. Km. and maximum in case of Karbi Anglong 12.9 Sq. Kms. viz. minimum primary education facilities in Karbi Anglong.

23. The Population served by a Primary School in the State was 873 in 1976-77 but the position deteriorated during the period of 5 years as for population of 938 persons only a primary was available in 1981-82. Among the Districts in 1981-82 the population served by a Primary school varied from 238 in North Cachar to 1129 in Nagaon and Dibrugarh districts. The District-wise details are given in Appendix No.11.

24. The total number of teachers in Primary Schools in Assam increased from 44,512 in 1976-77 to 48,471 in 1981-82. This shows an annual increase rate of 1.8% during the period of 5 years. During this period there was increase in the number of Teachers in all the Districts. The number of Women Teachers formed 20.1% of the total number of teachers in 1981-82. Number of women teachers in districts varied from 2030 in Sibsagar to 293 in Karbi Anglong. The highest percentage of teachers was 18.9% in Kamrup and the lowest percentage i.e. 1.8% was found in North Cachar District.

(b) ENROLMENT

25. In 1976-77 the total enrolment in Primary Schools in Assam was 15,40,383 which increased to 17,51,125 (9,97,162 Boys and 7,53,963 Girls) in 1981-82. In classes I-V the enrolment increased from 18.27 lakhs (10.83 lakhs Boys and 7.44 lakhs Girls) in 1976-77 to 21.18 lakhs in 1981-82 showing an annual growth rate of 1.8%.

these classes per annum. The annual Enrolment Growth rates in these classes separately for Boys and Girls were 4.2% and 2.5% respectively.

26. The percentage of Enrolment in classes I-V to the Total Population in the Age-Group 6-11 (also called Enrolment Ratio) gives an index of the facilities available at the Primary Stage of Education. For Assam this percentage is worked out to be 73.7% (86.2% for Boys and 60.9% for Girls) in 1976-77 and the same increased to 72.5% (80.5% for Boys and 63.8% for Girls) in 1981-82. Among the various districts taking Boys and Girls together, the Enrolment Ratio in 1981-82 was the highest in North Cachar (120.4%) and the lowest in Darrang District (60.8%).

(C) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

27. Of the total Enrolment of 18.27 lakhs in classes in 1976-77, 1.62 lakhs students belonged to Scheduled Castes and 2.78 lakhs belonged to Scheduled Tribes forming 8.9% and 15.2% respectively of the total enrolment. In 1981-82, there were 2.01 lakhs students belonging to Scheduled Castes and 3.15 lakhs students belonging to Scheduled Tribes forming 9.5% and 14.9% of the total enrolment respectively. The District-wise details are given in Appendix No.14 and 15.

(D) PRIMARY EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS:

28. Of the 21,729 Primary Schools in the State, 20827 (98.4%) were situated in rural areas. Among the rural districts the maximum number was 3745 (18.0%) in Kamrup followed by 3068 (14.7%) in Sibsagar and the minimum number was 425(2.0%) in N.C. Hills in 1981-82. It is also interesting to note that only 6.0% are only pucca primary schools in the rural areas. Percentage of pucca schools was the highest in Sibsagar(13%) and the lowest in Cachar 2.0%).

29. Of the total enrolment in primary schools in the state 15,36,102 or 87.7% was in rural areas in 1981-82. At the same time share of enrolment in primary classes in rural areas was 18,33,832 forming 86.6%. Similar share of enrolment in rural areas of primary classes for boys and girls worked out 87.4% and 85.4% respectively. District-wise position of primary education in rural areas is given in Appendix No.16. Appendix No.17 gives the district-wise position of habitations, habitation having primary schools in them and habitations having primary schools upto distance of 2 Kms. Out of 27,178 habitations in the state, 18000 had primary schools in them. Highest number of habitations viz. 2890 were in Goalpara and the lowest number of 443 in N.C. Hills. 8705 habitations had access of primary schools upto 2 kms. distance.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

(a) Institutions and Teachers

30. The total number of Middle Schools in the State increased from 3,545 in 1976-77 to 4,390 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 4.8% during the period of 5 years. In 1981-82, the highest number of Middle Schools was recorded in Kamrup District(834) and the smallest in case of N.C. Hills District(44).

31. On an average in 1976-77, a Middle school served an area of 22.0 Sq.Kms. The position improved considerably in 1981-82 as a Middle School was available on an average for 17.9 Sq. Kmss. In 6 districts the average area served by a middle school was above that at state level. The availability of middle school in respect of area served was the best in Cachar and the worst in N.C. Hills. The middle education facilities increased during the period under review as the population served by a middle school in the State was 4987 in 1976-77 and 4645 in 1981-82. Among the districts, the population served by a Middle School in 1981-82 varied from 7269 in Darrang district to 2409 in N.C. Hills district. The details are given in Appendix No.18. The number of teachers in Middle Schools also increased from 19673 in 1976-77 to 25,066 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 27.4% with an annual Growth Rate of 5.5% during the given period. Out of the total number of teachers in middle schools 29.5% are trained. It is also interesting to note that among men teachers 29.2% are found to be trained. Among the districts percentage of trained women teachers varied from as high as 48.3% in Darrang to 13.6% in N.C. Hills. District-wise position of teachers are given in Appendix No.20.

(b) Enrolment

32. The total enrolment in Middle Schools was 4,34,934 in 1976-77 which increased to 6,00,662 by 1981-82. The Enrolment at the Middle stage Education i.e. in classes VI-VIII increased from 4,18,118 (2,64,357 Boys and 1,53,761 Girls) in 1976-77 to 6,15,411 (3,80,463 Boys and 2,34,948 Girls) in 1981-82. This shows an average increase of 9.4% per annum during the period under consideration. The average Annual Growth Rate of Enrolment separately for Boys and Girls in these classes were 8.8% and 10.6% respectively.

33. The percentage of Enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the Total Population in the Age-Group 11-14 i.e. Enrolment Ratio gives an index of facilities available at the Middle stage of Education. In Assam this percentage was 30.4% in 1976-77 and 42.1% in 1981-82. In case of Boys the Enrolment Ratio was 38.0% in 1976-77 which increased to 51.7% in 1981-82. In the case of Girls it changed from 22.7% in 1976-77 to 32.3% in 1981-82. Taking boys and girls together, the Enrolment ratio in case of 5 Districts was more than that corresponding State level during 1981-82. At Middle stage, the Enrolment Ratio indicate wide disparities among the two sexes in all the districts. In 1981-82, the highest Enrolment Ratio was in Lakhimpur District (60.6) whereas the lowest was in Karbi Anglong District (26.3). The details may be seen in Appendix No.19.

(c) Enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes

34. Of the Total Enrolment of 418118 students in classes VI-VIII 30562 students belonged to the Scheduled Castes & 49,723 students belonged to the Scheduled Tribes forming 7.3% and 11.9% respectively of the total enrolment in 1976-77. Out of the total Enrolment of 6,15,411 in 1981-82, the number of students belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes was 51,076 and 68,051 respectively forming 8.3% and 11.1% respectively to the total enrolment. Details may be seen in Appendix No.21 and 22.

(d) Middle Education in Rural Areas

35. Of the total number of 4390 middle schools in the state, as many as 3988 were located in rural areas. Among districts the highest number of schools were in Cachar (583) followed by Goalpara (571) and the lowest in N.C. Hills (39). It may be observed that of all the middle schools in rural areas, only 10% are pucca. Of the total enrolment in middle schools, 515,890 or 85.9% was in rural schools. In districts the maximum enrolment of 98,308 was in rural areas of Kamrup (98308) followed by rural areas of Sibsagar (89,655) and the lowest in rural areas of N.C. Hills (2652). At the same time the enrolment in middle classes (VI-VIII) in rural areas was 484928 (297428 boys and 187500 girls). This forms 78.8% of total enrolment in middle classes in the state. District-wise position of middle education in rural areas is given in Appendix No.23. Appendix No.24 shows that of the total 27,178 habitations, 4196 have middle schools in them. However 9836 are such habitations which have middle schools at the distance of 2Km. At the same time 12,250 habitations have middle school facilities between the distance of 2 and 5 Km.

36. Appendix No.25 gives district-wise break-up of enrolment of classes I to VIII separately. Retention of enrolment in class II was 44.5% of class I for the state as a whole. In class V the retention of enrolment was 32.2% of class I at state level. Among the districts the retention of enrolment was the highest in Cachar (36.5%) and the lowest in N.C. Hills(15.9%). The retention of enrolment in class VIII was 18.6% of Class I at state level. In this class the retention rate was the highest, in Sibsagar (26.0%) and the lowest in Karbi Anglonga(8.7%).

VIII HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

(a) Institutions and Teachers

37. The Number of High/Higher Secondary Schools in Assam increased from 1,665 in 1976-77 to 2,227 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 33.8% during the period under review. The increase in number of High/Higher Secondary Schools was shared by all the Districts. Among the Districts, the largest number was in Kamrup(590) and the smallest in N.C.Hills(20

38. On an average, there was a High/Higher Secondary School for every 47 Sq. Kms. Area in Assam in 1976-77. By 1981-82 a High/Higher Secondary Schools was available for every 35 Sq. Kms.. In 1981-82 there was a High/Higher Secondary School in Kamrup district for every 17 Sq. Kms. Area whereas in N.C. Hills one High/Higher Secondary School was available for every 245 Sq. Kms. Area followed by Karbi Anglong having one high/higher secondary school for 181 Sq. Kms. Average are depending on one school in these two districts is due to the fact that most of the area in these two districts is hilly having less population.

39. On an average, at the State level, there was a High/Higher Secondary School for every 10,600 persons in 1976-77. By 1981-82, a High/Higher Secondary School was available for every 9,200 persons. Among the Districts the average population covered by a school varied from as high as 13,200 in Darrang District to as low as 5,300 in N.C. Hills district

40. The total number of teachers in High/Higher Secondary Schools in Assam increased from 21,281 in 1976-77 to 27,000 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 12.7% during the period of 5 years. During the period of 5 years, there was an increase in the number of teachers in all the Districts. District-wise details are depicted in Appendix No.26. Women Teachers formed 15.7% of the Total number of teachers in the State during 1981-82. Of the total number of 27000 teachers in high/higher secondary schools in the state only 25% are trained. Among the districts the maximum percentage of trained teachers(30.2%) was in Sibsagar and the lowest of 20.1% in Dibrugarh. Percentage of trained women teachers

was 22.4% in the state. The highest percentage of women trained teachers was in Nagaon (32.1%) and the lowest in Karbi Anglong (12.2%). District-wise position of teachers in high/higher secondary schools can be seen in Appendix No.28.

(b) Enrolment

41. The total Enrolment in High/Higher Secondary Schools of the State in 1976-77 was 4,68,706 which increased to 6,38,372 in 1981-82. This shows an average Annual Growth Rate of 7.2% during the period under review. The Enrolment of Secondary and Higher Secondary stage i.e. in classes IX-XI was 1,94,474 (1,31,400 Boys and 63,074 Girls) in 1976-77 and it became 2,56,666 (1,64,463 Boys and 92,203 Girls) in 1981-82. Among the District the percentage increase of Enrolment in these classes from 1976-77 to 1981-82 varied from 51.1% in Karbi Anglong to 14.1% in Cachar District. Percentage increase of Enrolment for the state as a whole in classes IX-XI from 1976-77 to 1981-82 worked out to be 32.0%.

42. The enrolment ratio at the High/Higher Secondary stage for the Assam State as a whole was 15.5% in 1976-77 and 18.2% in 1981-82. There is wide gap in the enrolment ratio among Boys and Girls i.e. 23.0% and 13.2% respectively. The disparity in the Enrolment Ratio for the Boys and Girls is observed in all the districts. The Enrolment Ratio was found to be maximum in Sibsagar district 26.8% (29.9% for Boys & 23.5% for Girls) and the minimum in Karbi Anglong district 7.7% (10.6% for Boys and 4.5% for Girls). The details may be seen in Appendix No.27 & 28.

c) Enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

43. Of the total enrolment of 1,94,474 in classes IX-XI, 12,405 students belonged to Scheduled Castes and 20,005 students belonged to Scheduled Tribes in 1976-77 forming 6.4% and 10.3% respectively of the total enrolment in these classes. Out of the total enrolment of 2,56,666 in High/Higher Secondary School classes in 1981-82, 18,370 students belonged to Scheduled Castes and 29,702 students belonged to Scheduled Tribes. The percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students to total enrolment in these classes were 7.2% and 11.6% respectively. Among the districts enrolment percentage of Scheduled Castes students in these classes varied from 12.1% in Cachar to 2.8% in Dibrugarh. On the other hand enrolment percentage of Scheduled Tribes students varied from 67.1% in N.C. Hills followed by 52.0% in Karbi Anglong to 2.2% in Cachar. The details of the Enrolment and Percentage can be seen in the Appendix No.29 and 30.

44. Of the total high/higher Secondary schools in the state, 1849 (83.0%) were located in rural areas. Among districts the maximum number of such schools existed in rural areas of Kamrup (489) and the minimum in N.C. Hills (11). The total enrolment in rural High/Higher Secondary Schools was 456,700 forming 71.5% of the total enrolment in the state. In the districts the maximum enrolment was observed in rural areas of the Sibsager (99,894) and the minimum in N.C. Hills (2,495). Total enrolment in Higher Secondary classes in rural areas was 1,89,932 (120,485 boys and 69,447 girls) in 1981-82. District-wise position can be seen from Appendix No.31.

IX - Professional, Vocational, Special and Other (School) Education.

45. The number of schools for Vocational, Professional, Special & Other (School) Education increased significantly from 507 in 1976-77 to 3,842 including Social (Adult) Education Schools in 1981-82.

46. The total enrolment in these schools was 21,280 in 1976-77 which increased to 1,22,734 in 1981-82. Out of the total enrolment in 1981-82, 35.6% were Girls. The total enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was 1,050 and 2,694 in 1976-77 accounting for 4.9% and 12.6% of the total enrolment in Vocational, Professional, Special & Other (School) Education in the State. In 1981-82 corresponding enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was 13,107 and 29,815 respectively forming 10.7% and 24.3% of the total enrolment for Vocational, Professional, Special & Other (School) Education. The number of teachers in these courses was 1081 in 1976-77 and 4673 in 1981-82. District-wise details are given in Appendix No.33.

X - INTERMEDIATE/PRE-DEGREE/JUNIOR COLLEGE EDUCATION

47. In Assam, there were 16 Intermediate/Pre-Degree/Junior Colleges in 1976-77. However the number declined to 12 during the period under review. The decline in such institutions appears to be due to upgradation of these colleges into degree colleges. In 1981-82 such colleges existed only in 5 of the 10 districts. The enrolment in these colleges was 2612 in 1976-77 which increased to 2649 in 1981-82. Total number of teachers declined from 151 to 106 in these colleges during the period under review. It is also interesting to mention here that of the 12 colleges as many as 11 existed in rural areas of the state and having enrolment of 2573 during 1981-82. District-wise details are given in Appendix No.32.
