
FOREWORD

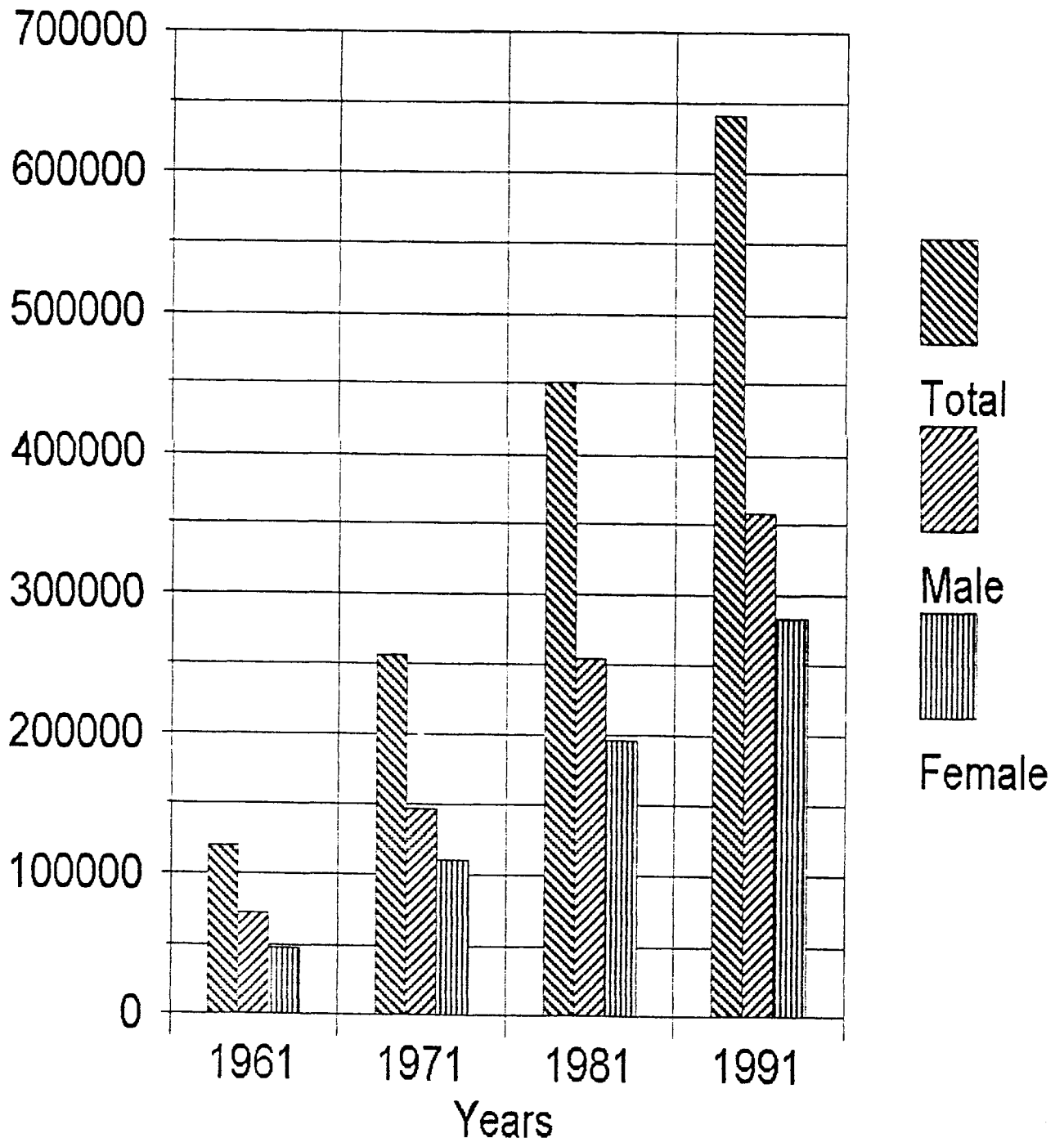

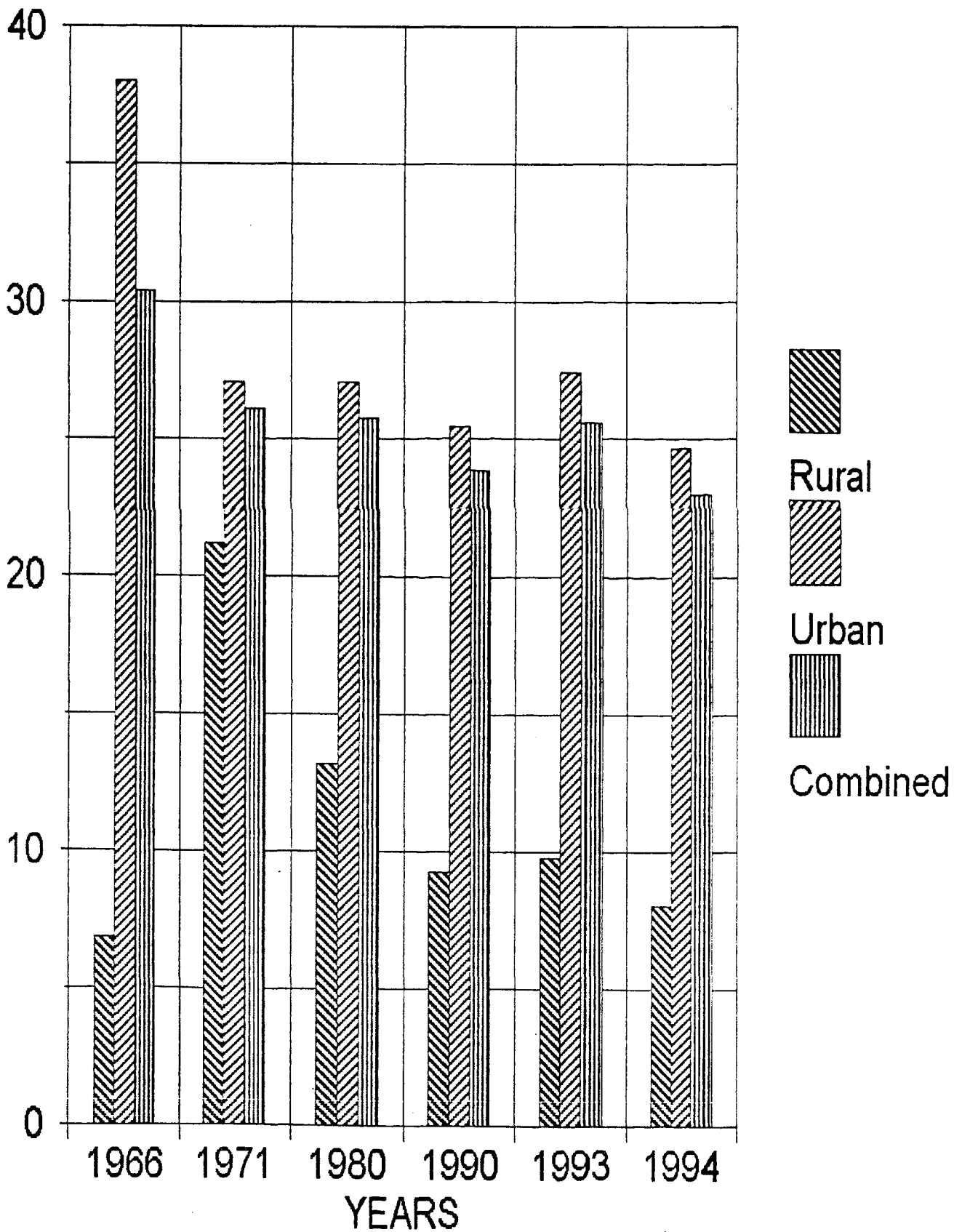

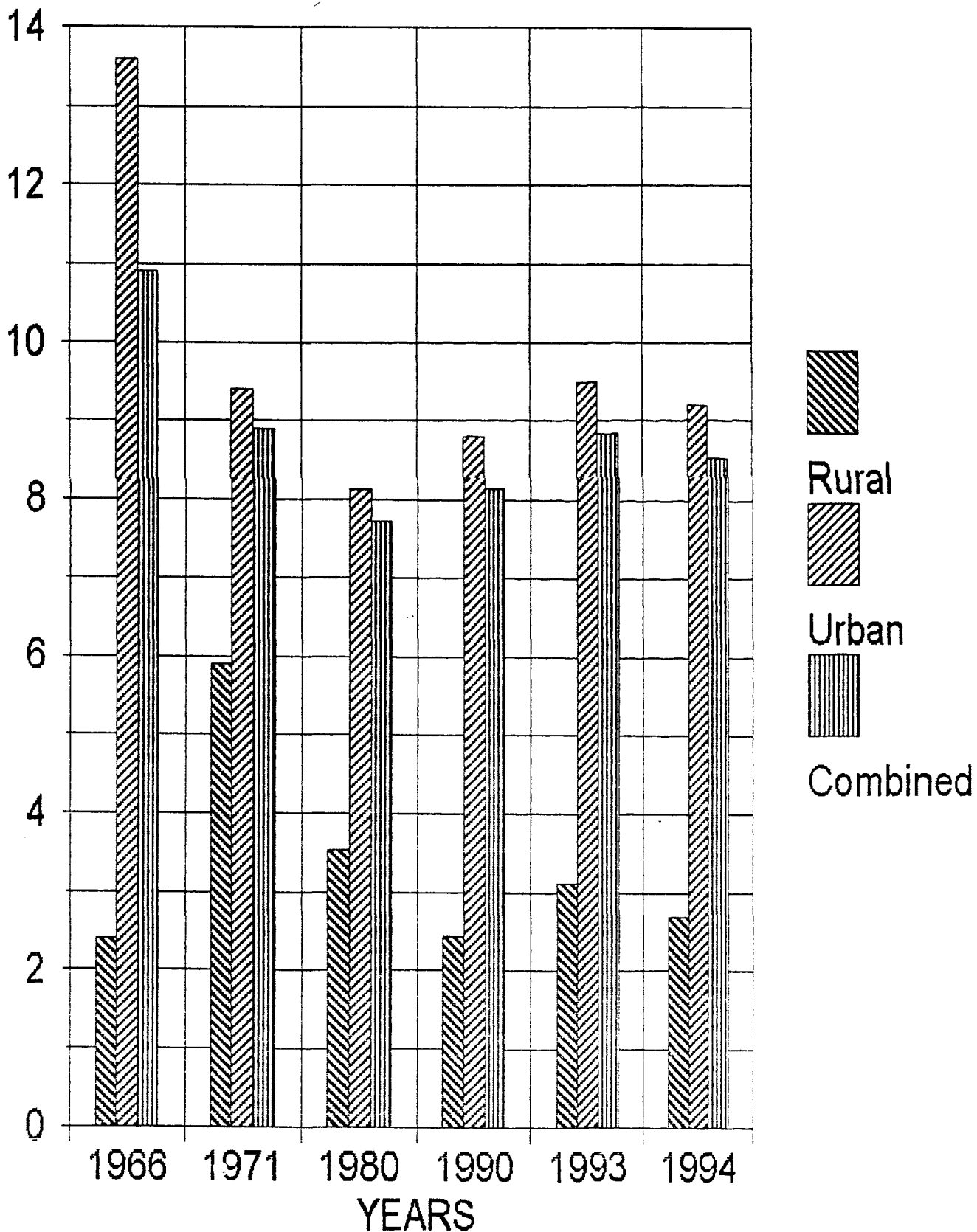

Rate in U.T Chandigarh

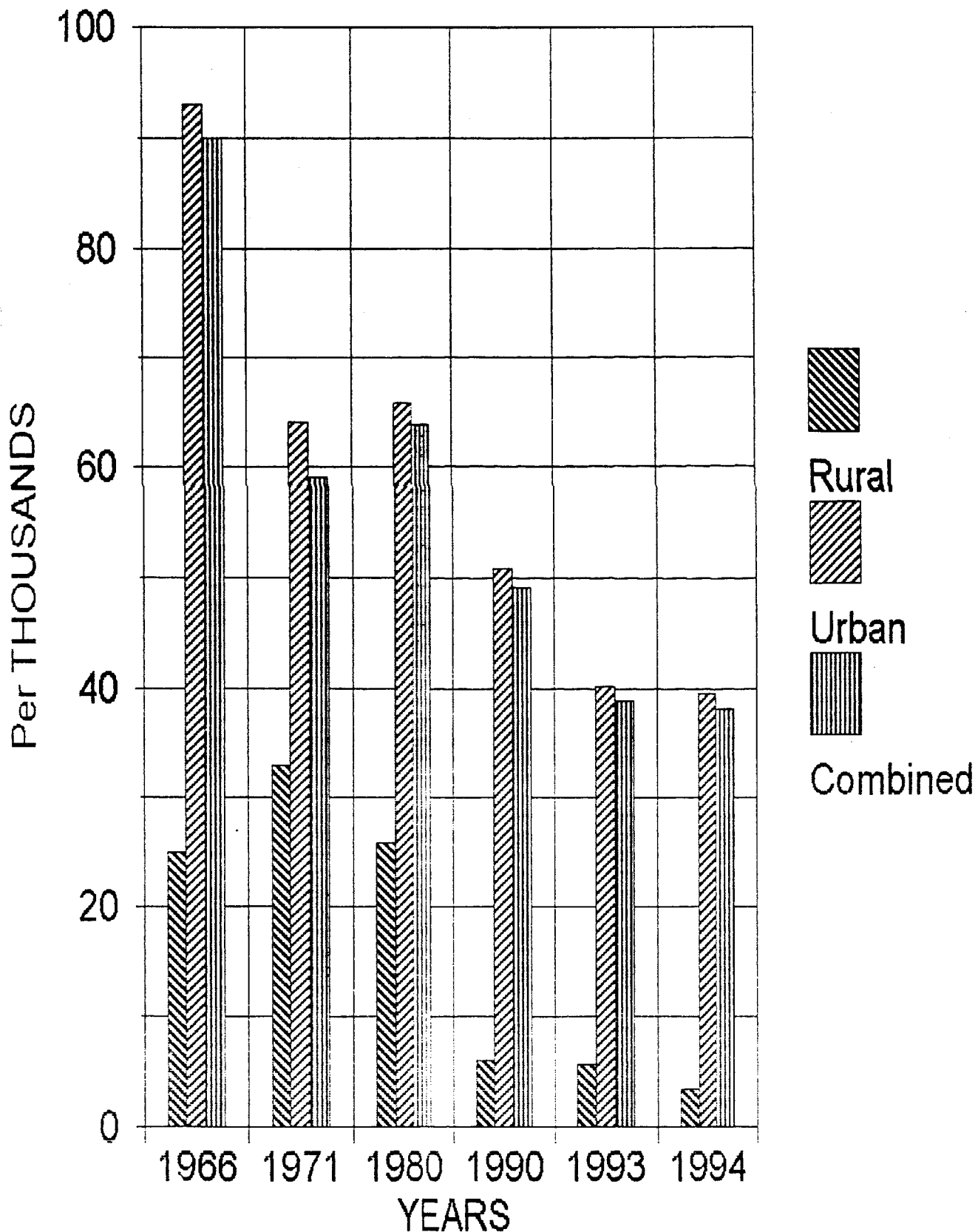


Area Wise Death Rate in U.T Chandigarh

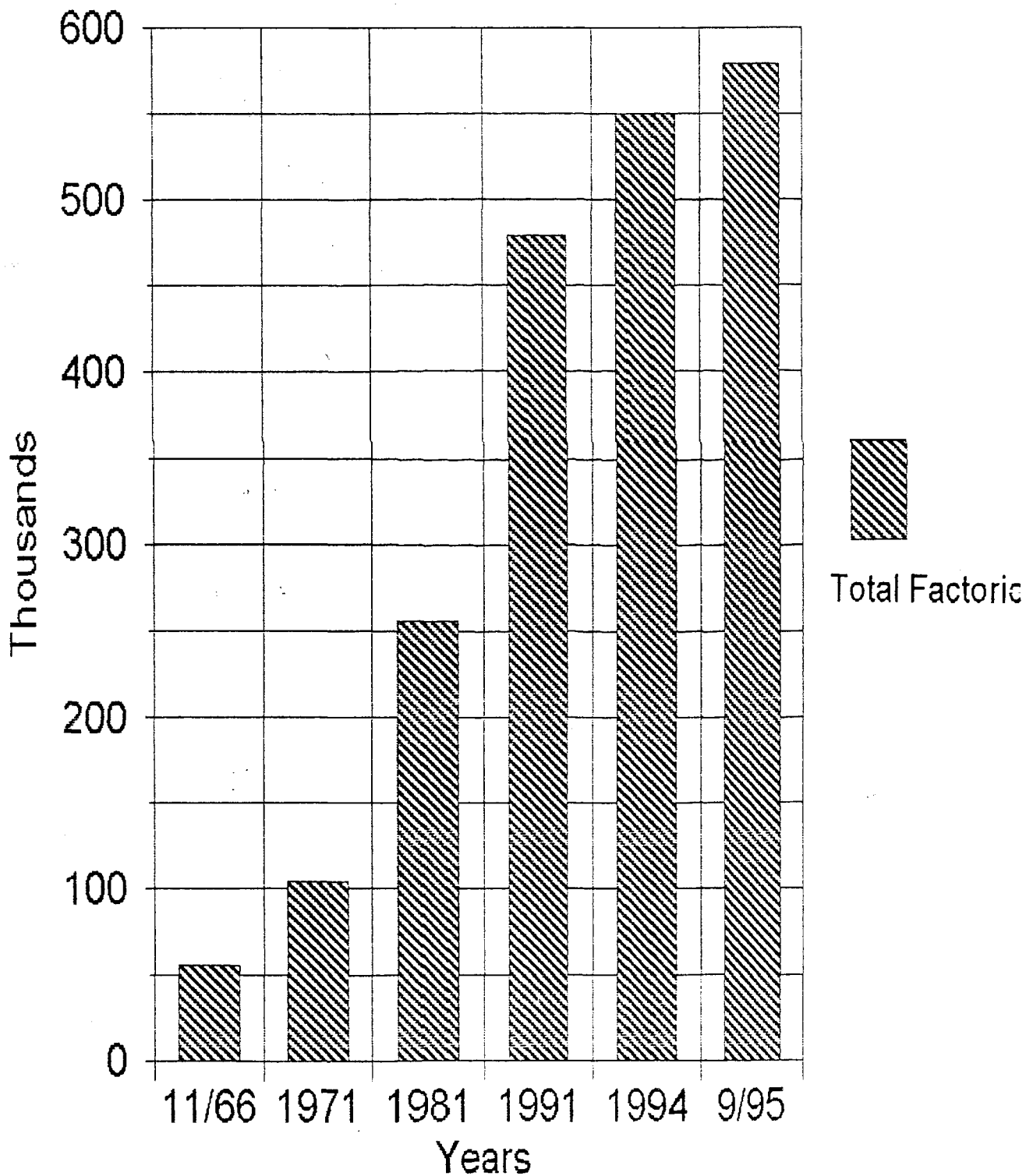

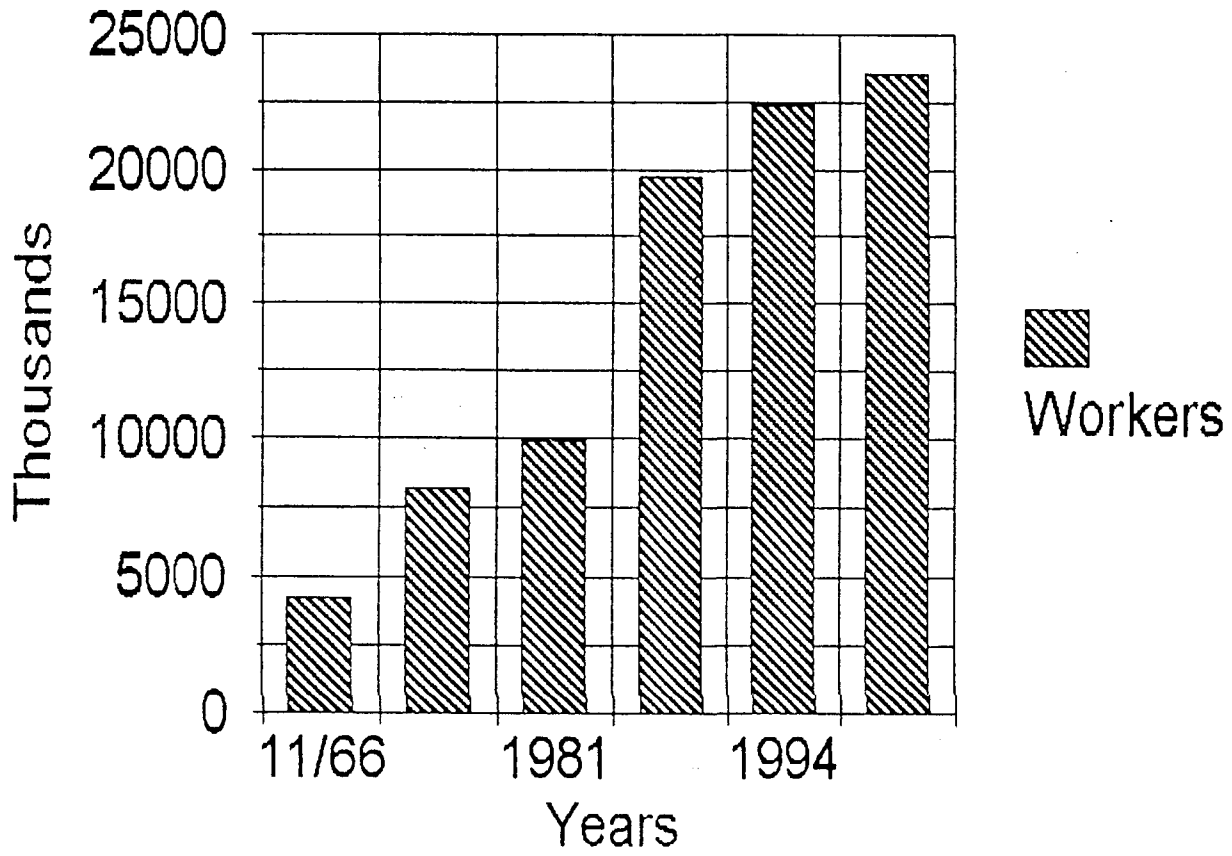

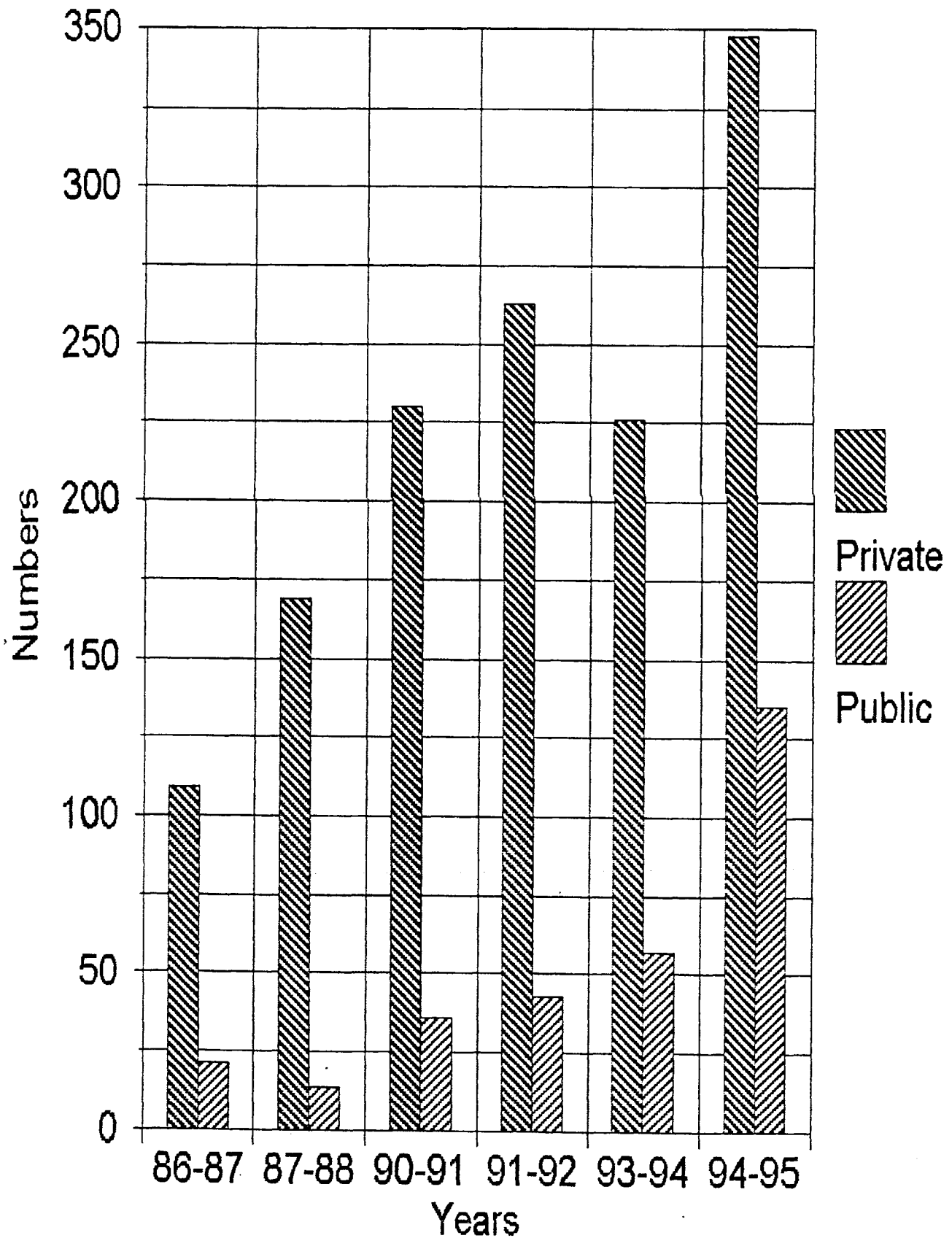

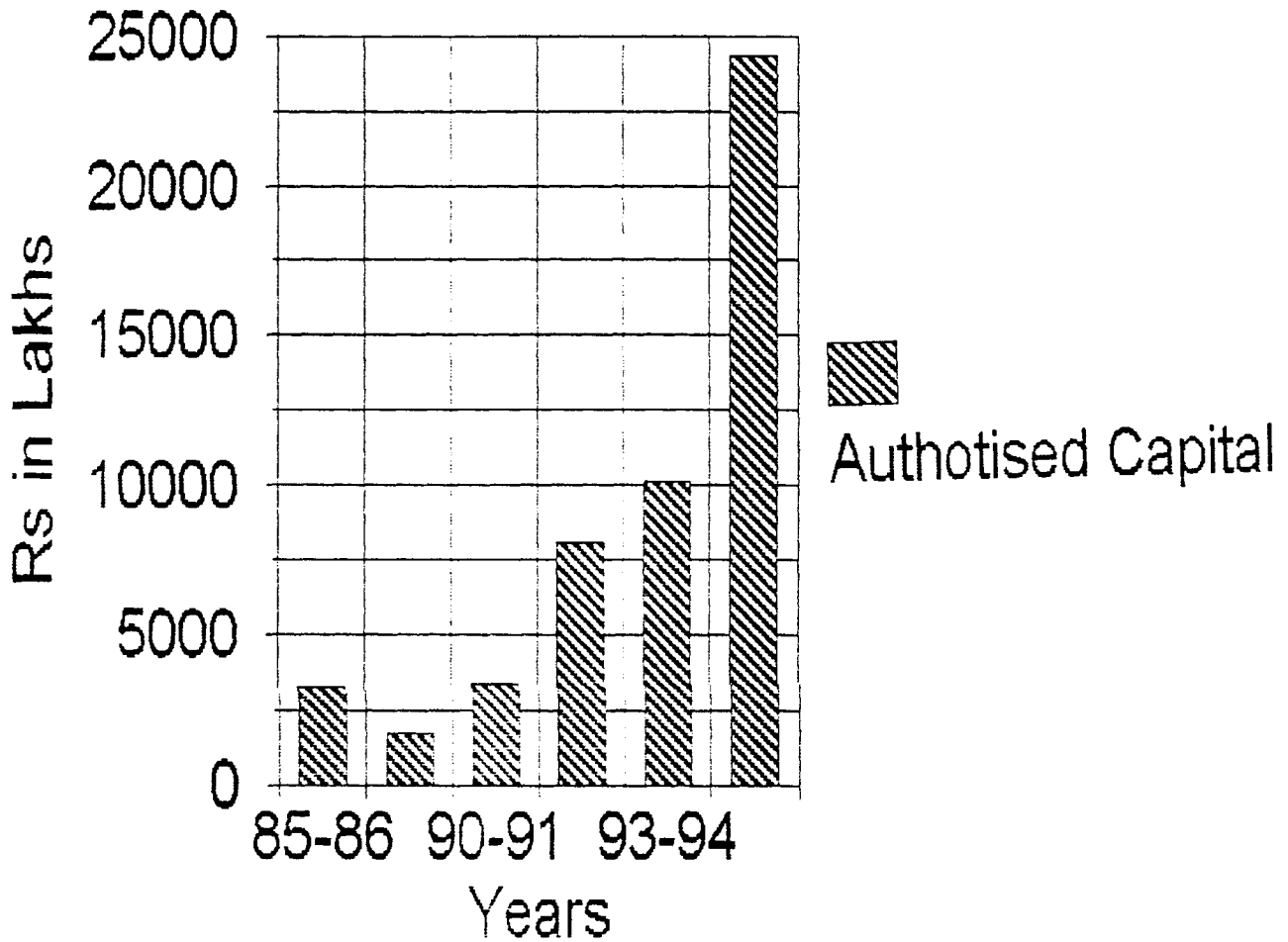

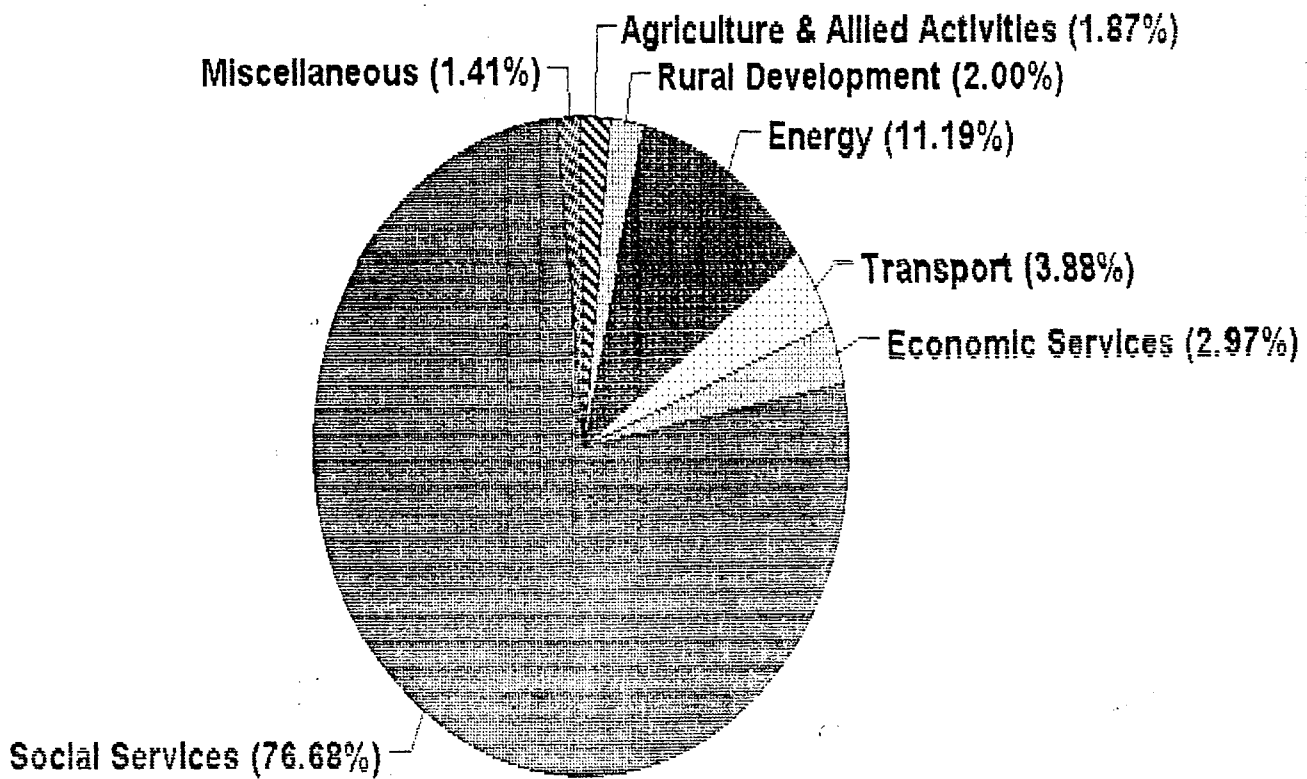

Sector Wise Actual Expenditure

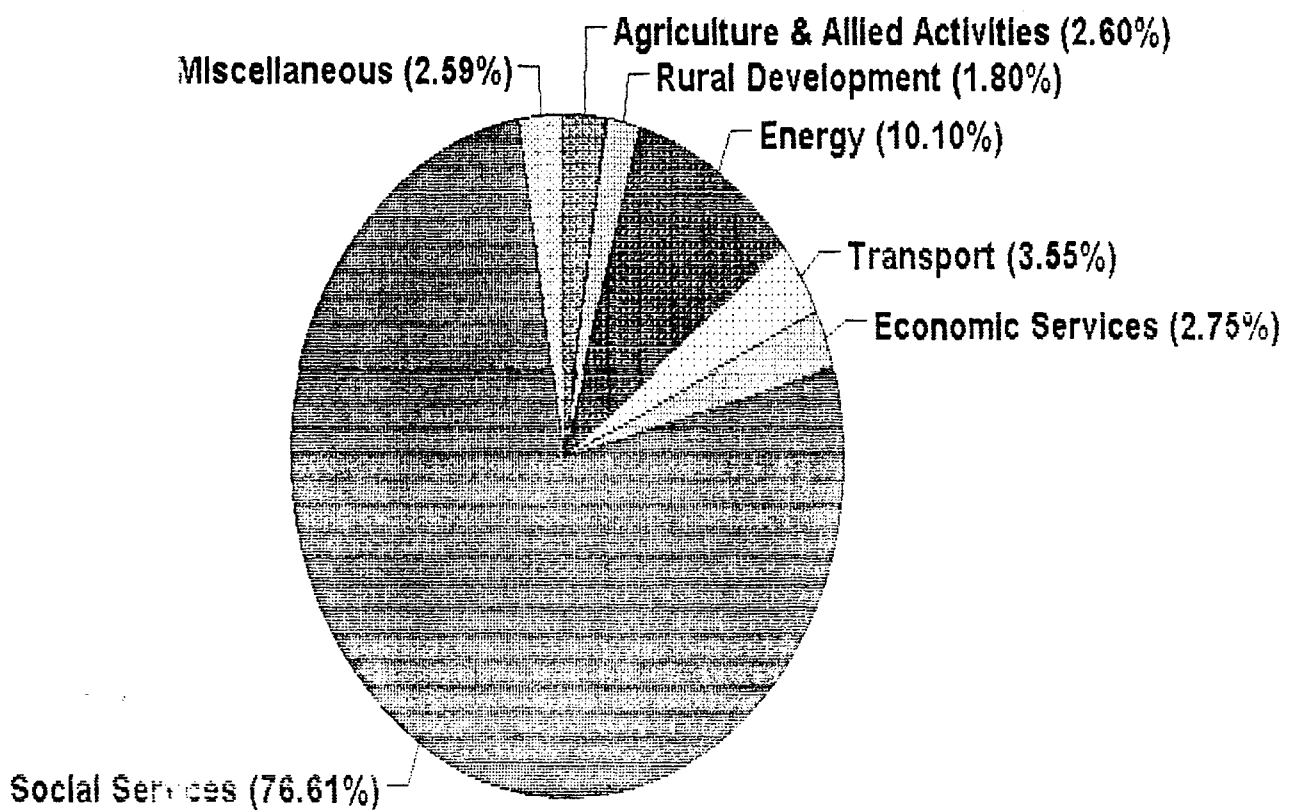

Sector Wise Anticipated Expenditure

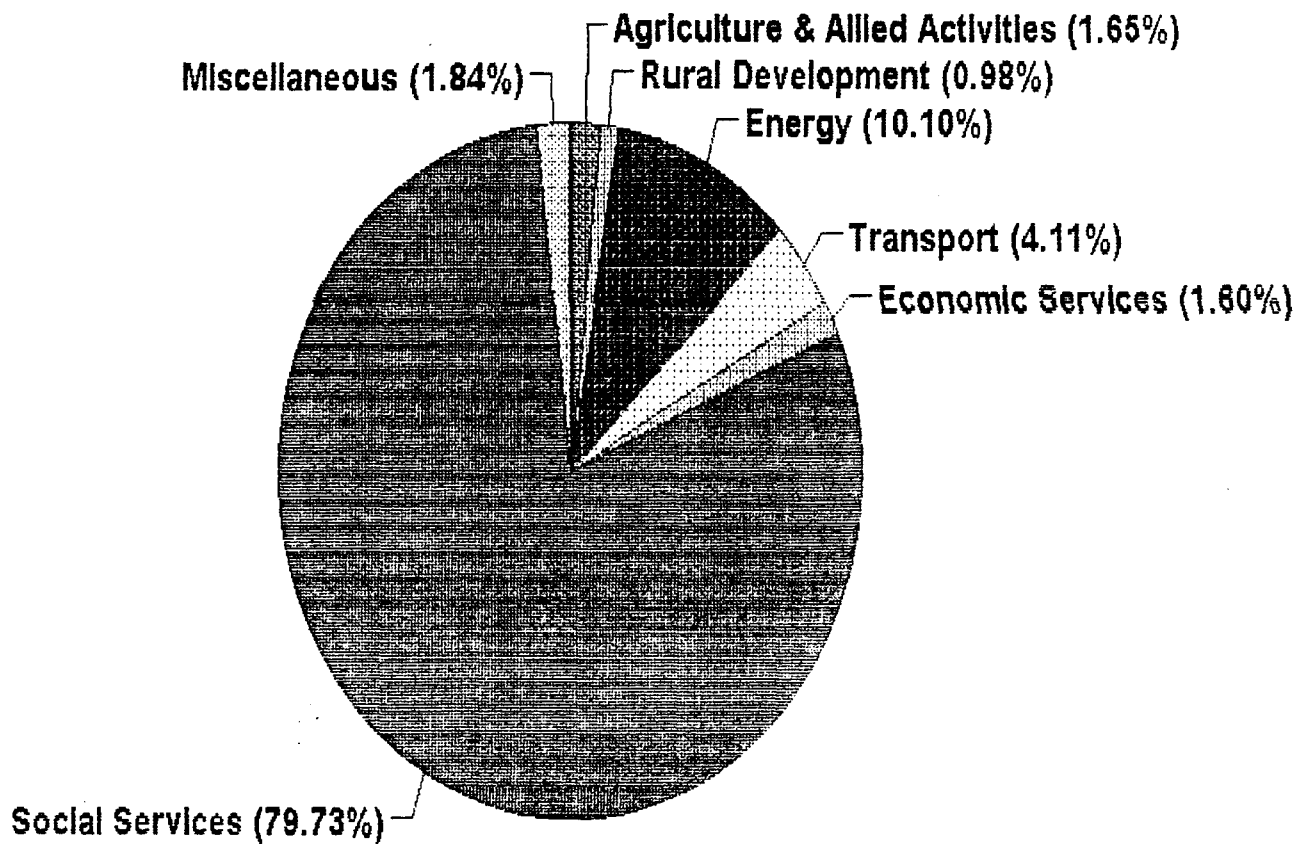

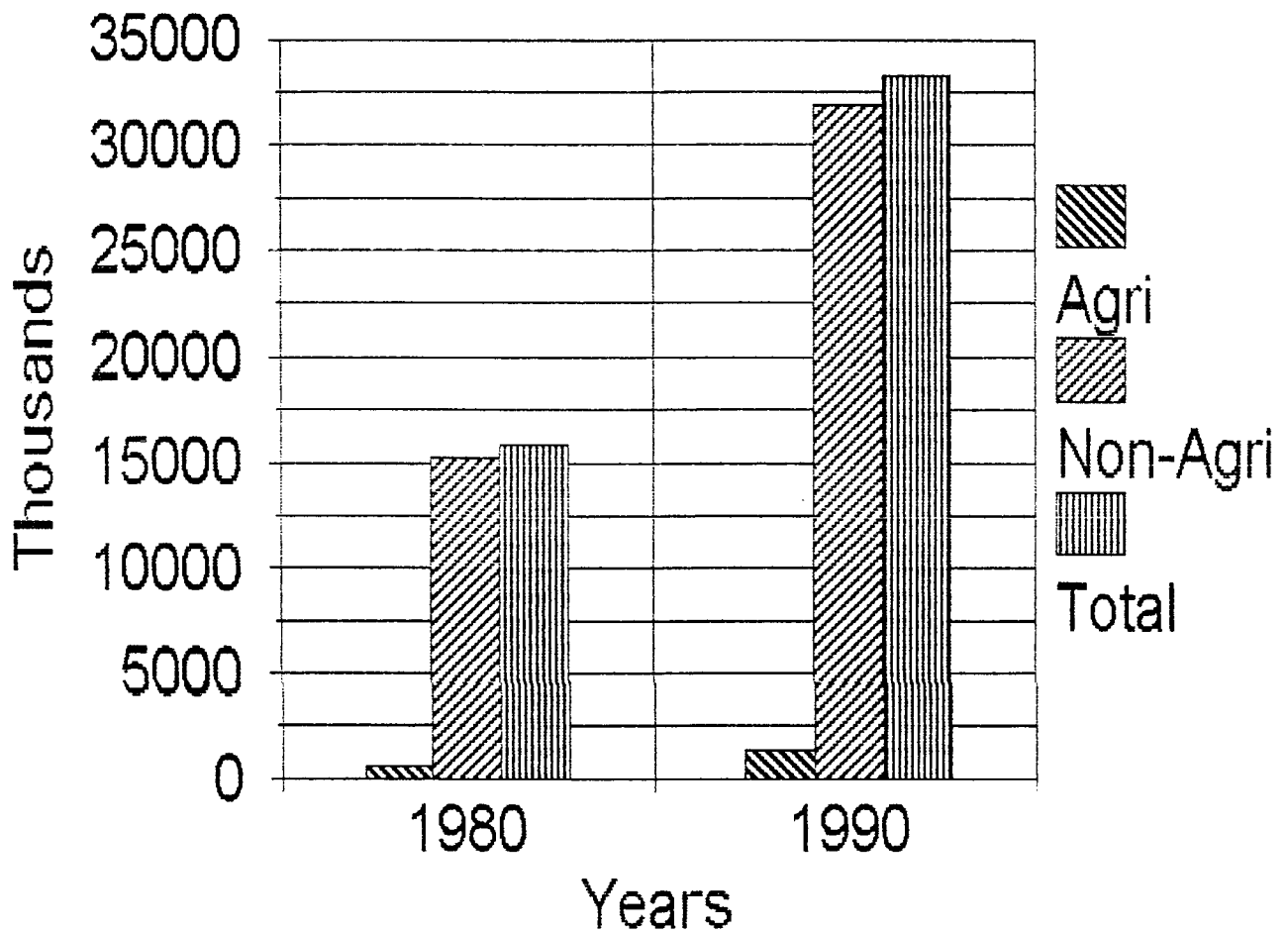
