PREFACE



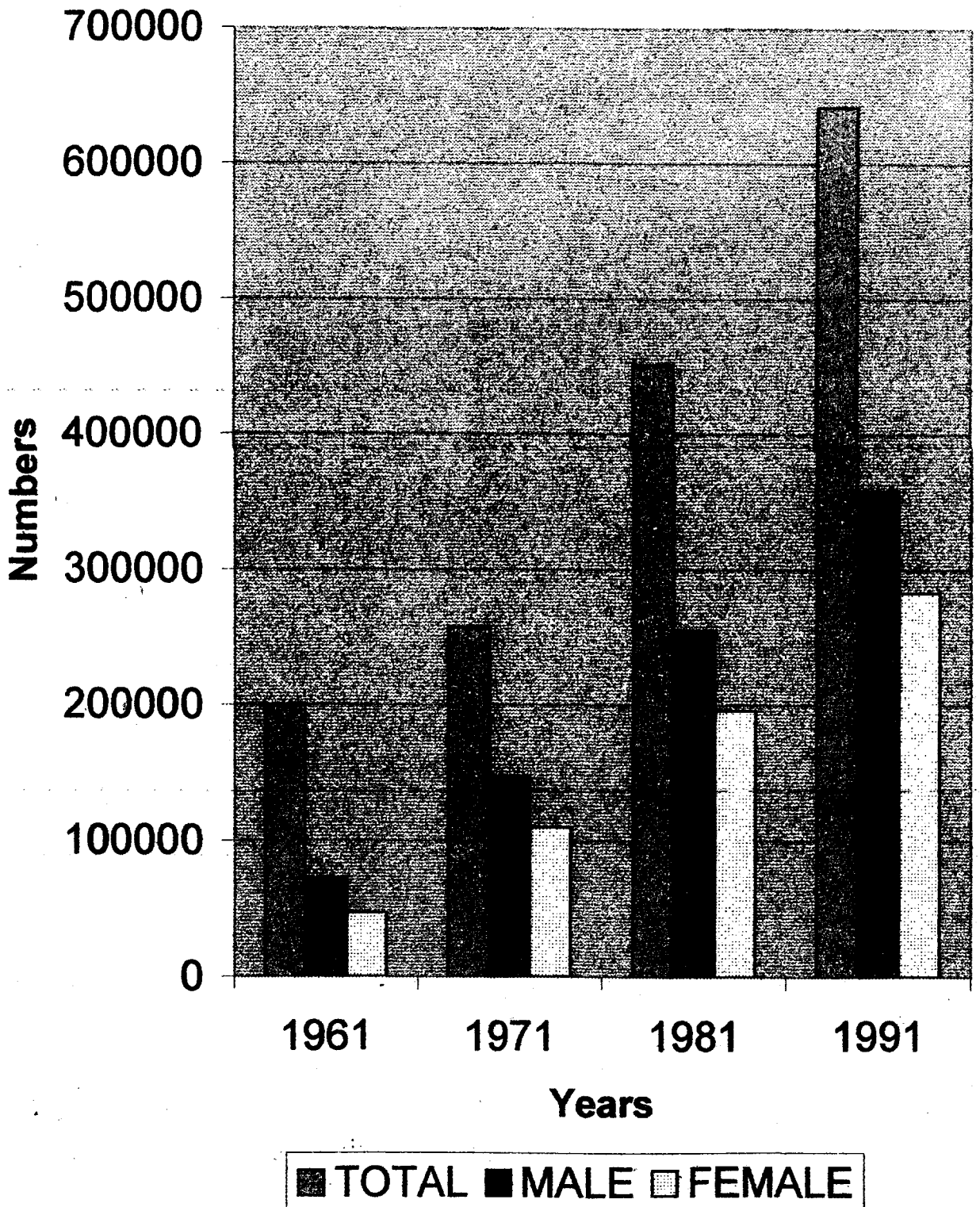

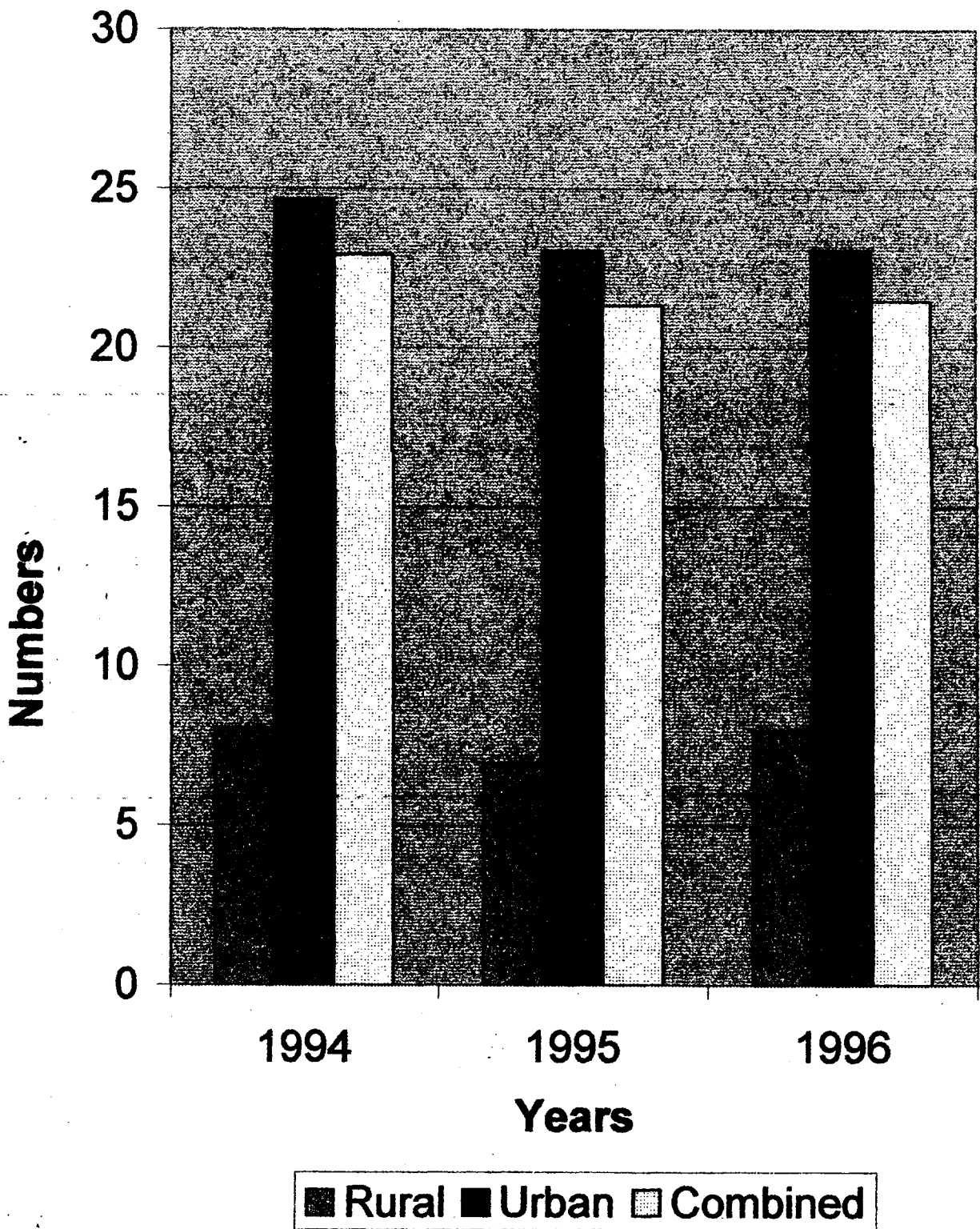

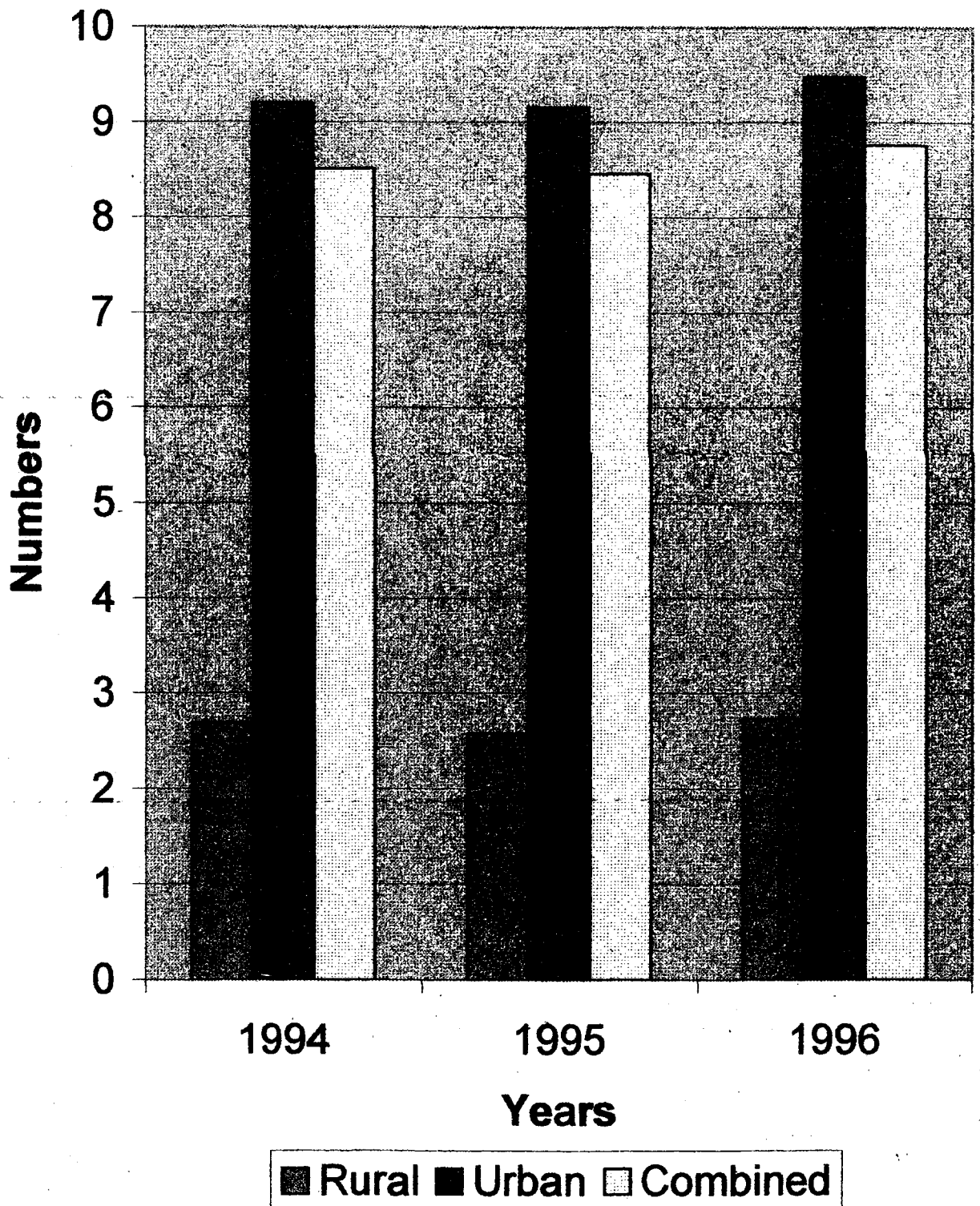

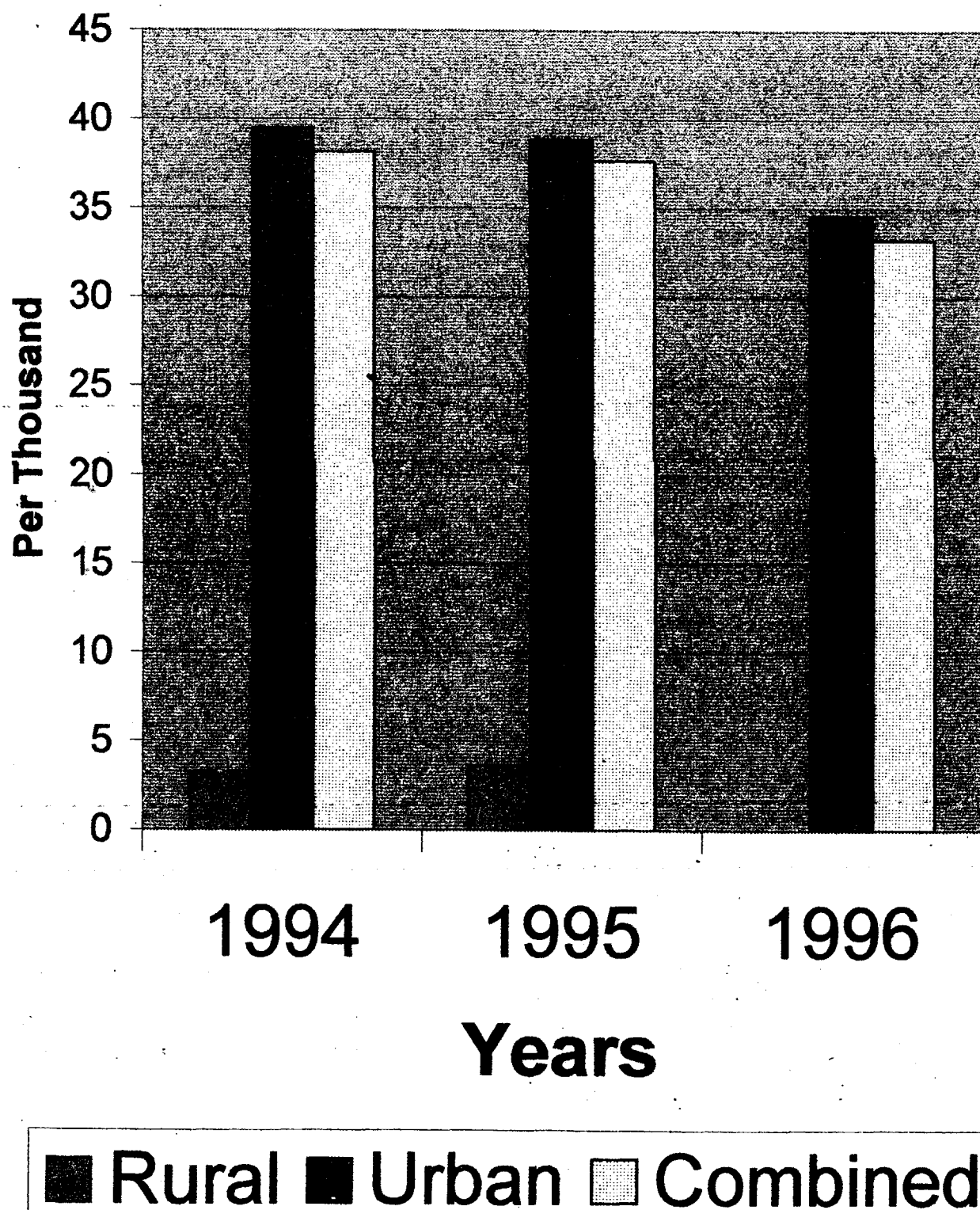
Area Wise Birth Rate in U.T. Chandigarh

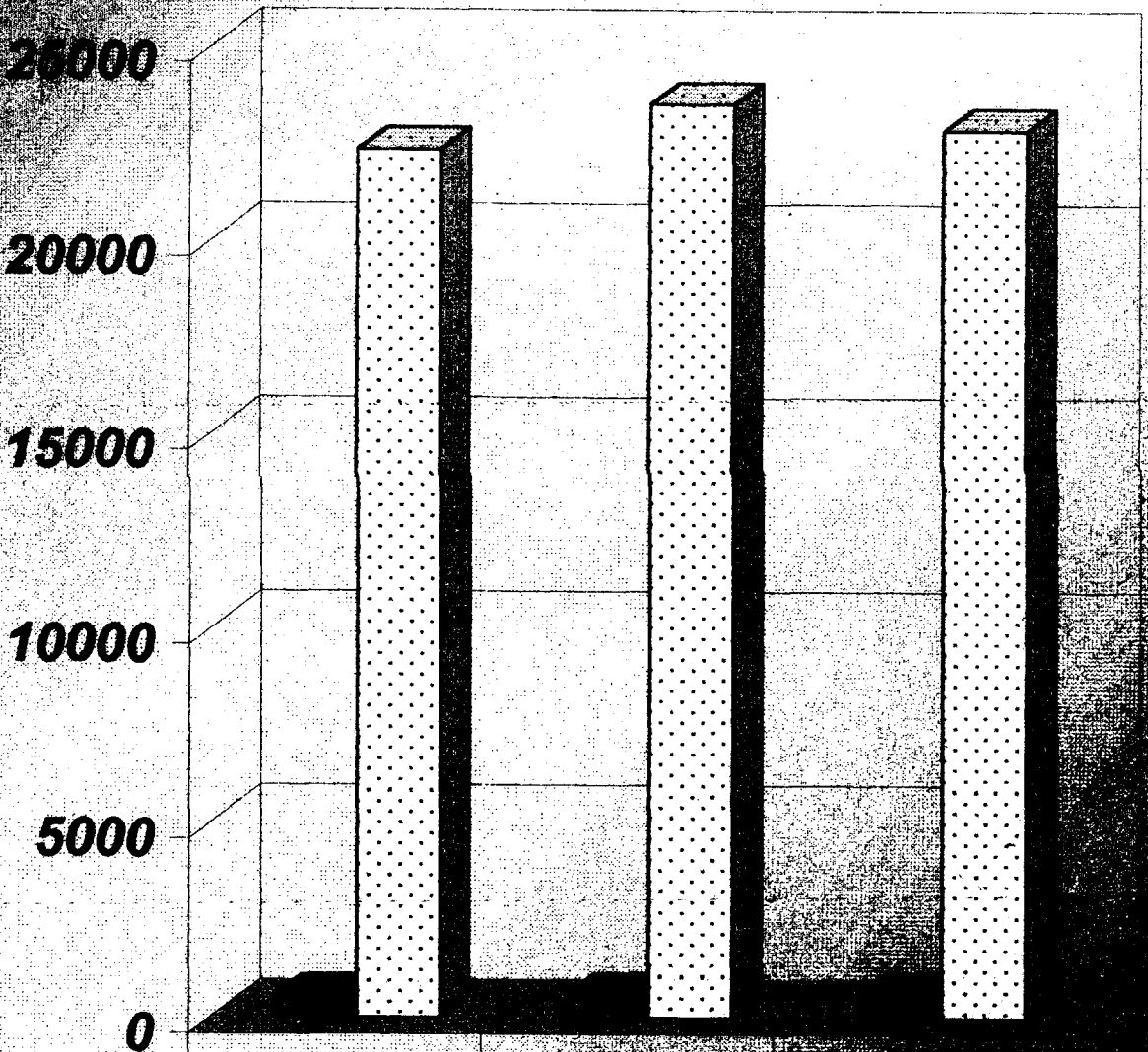

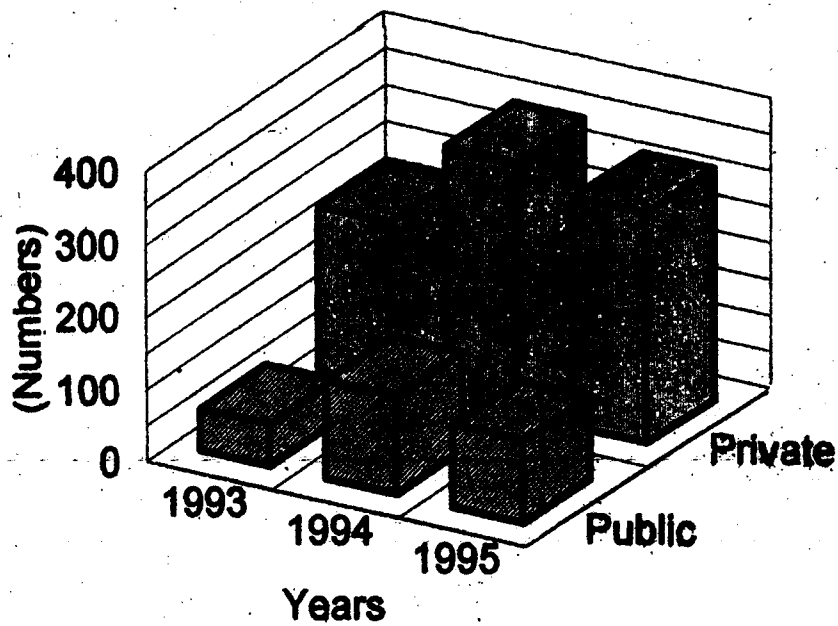

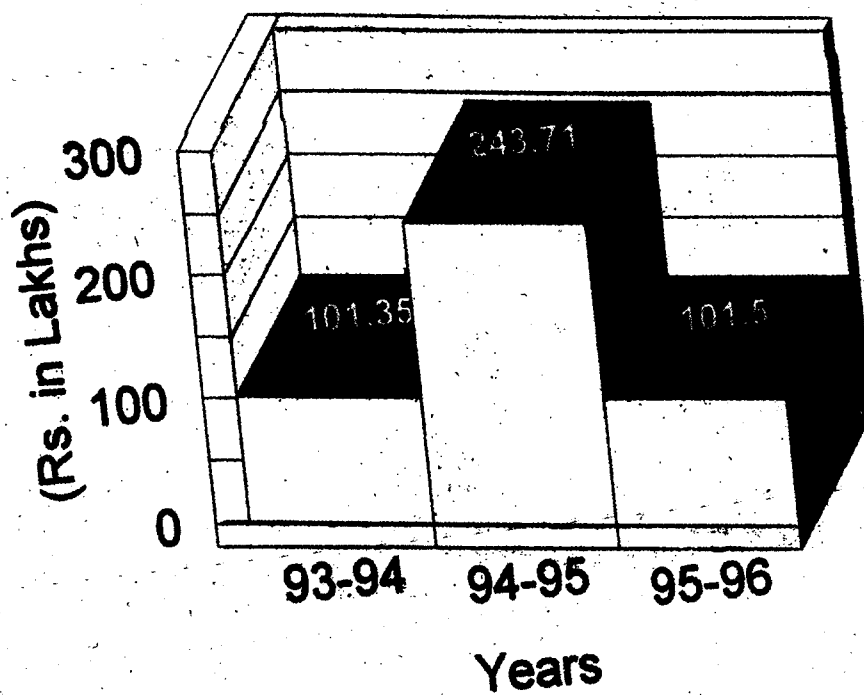

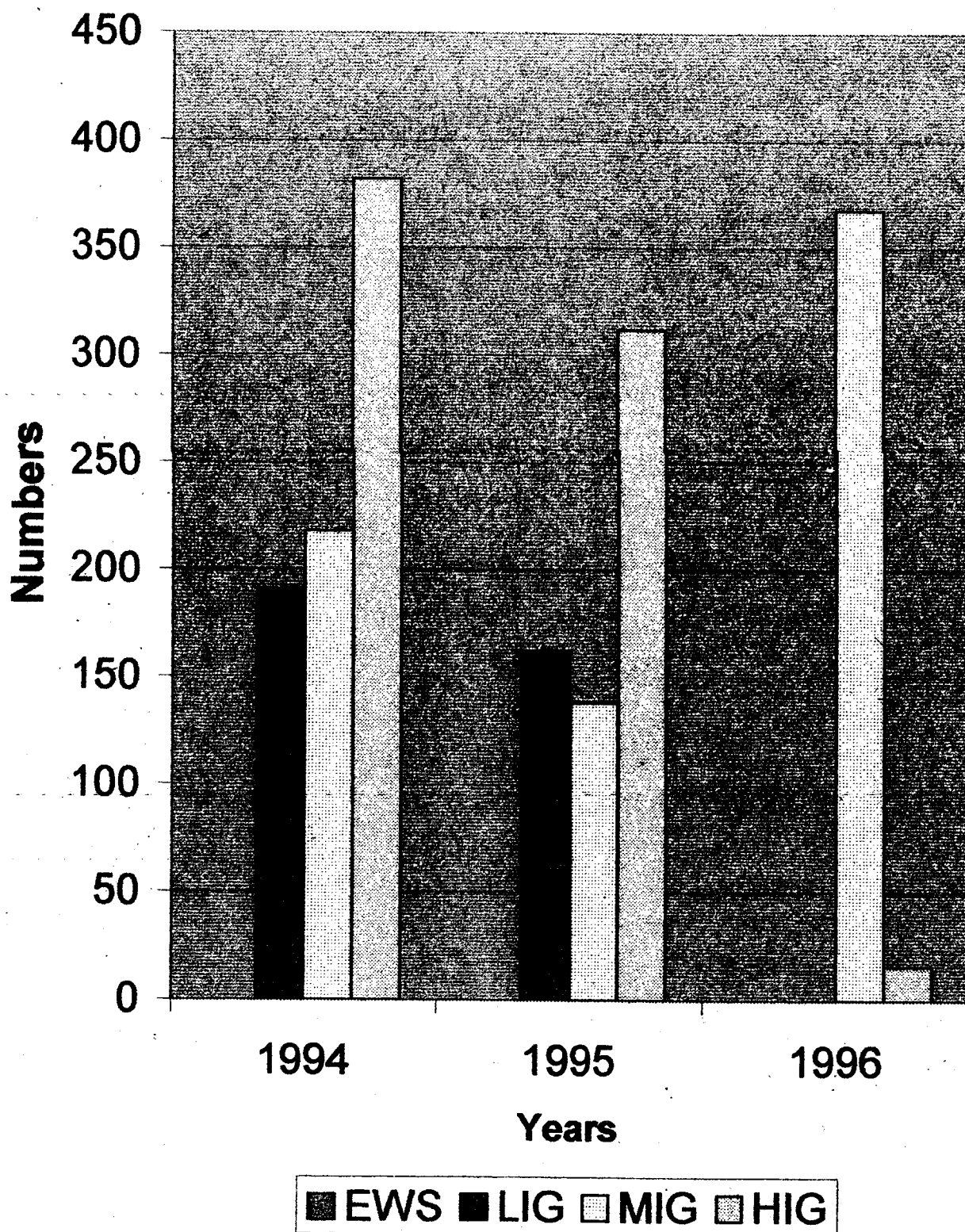

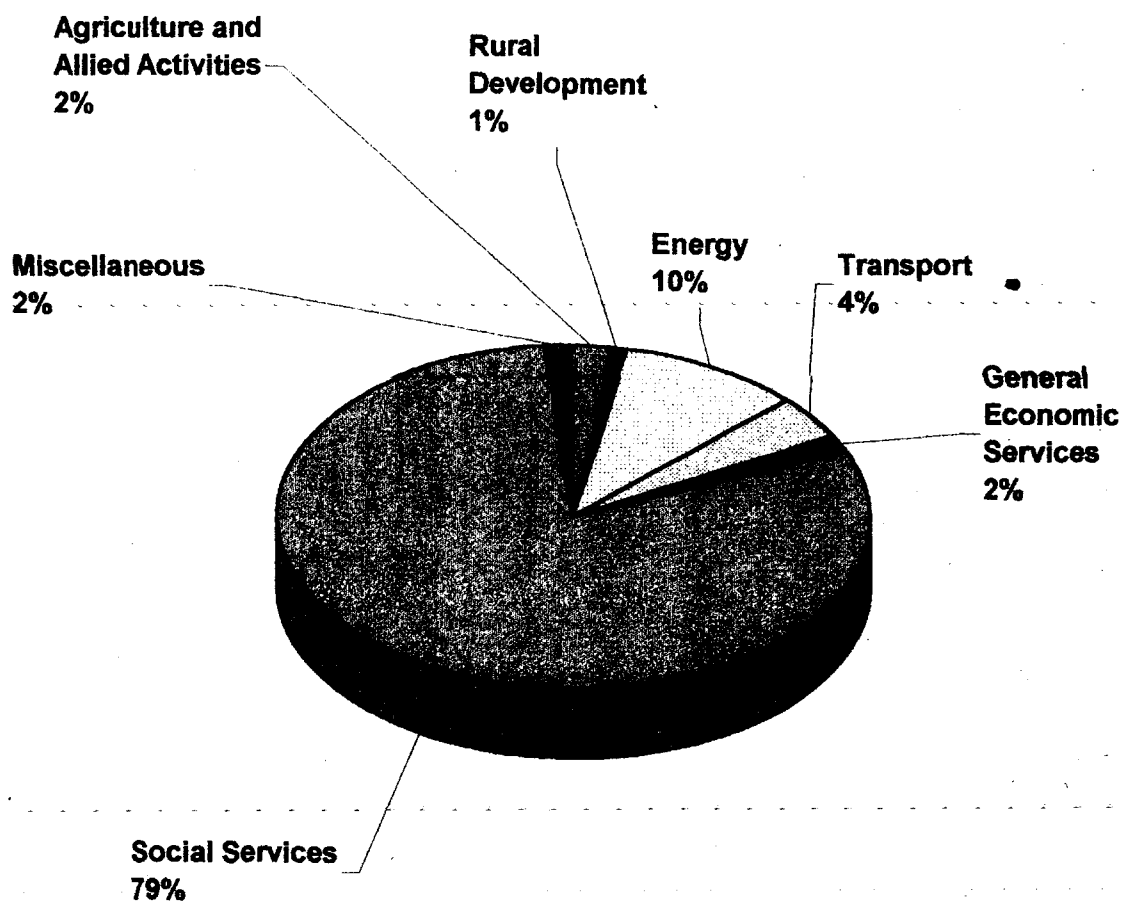

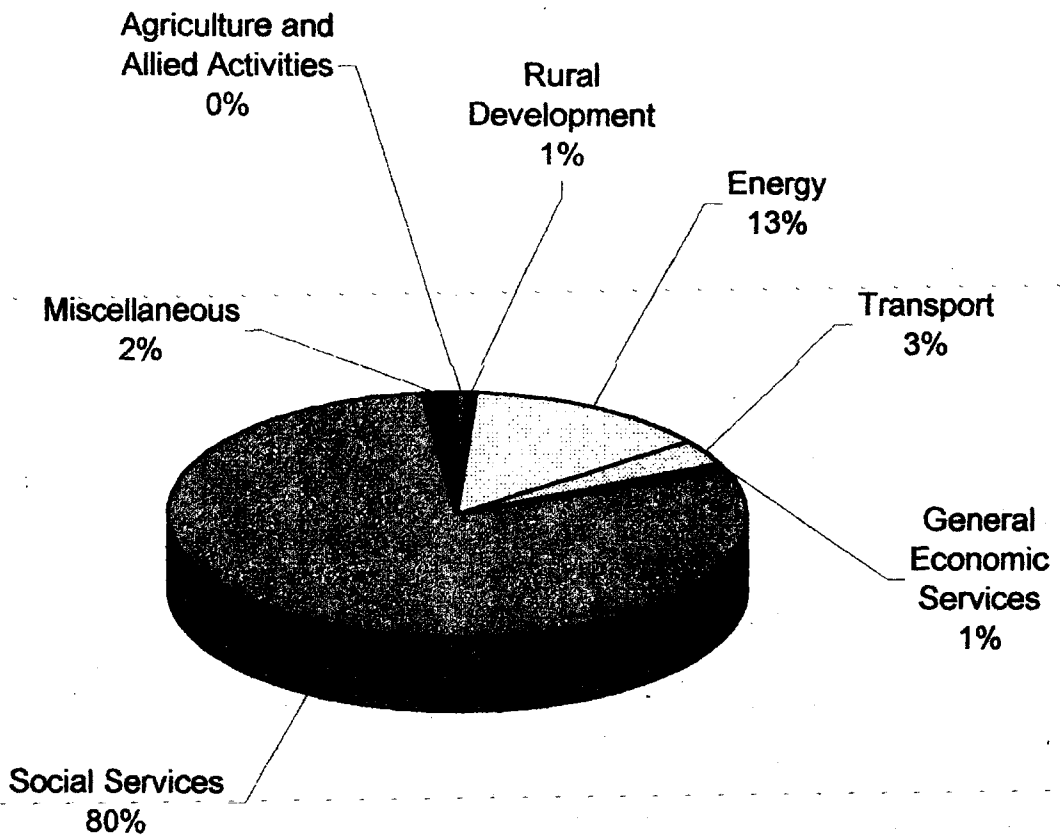

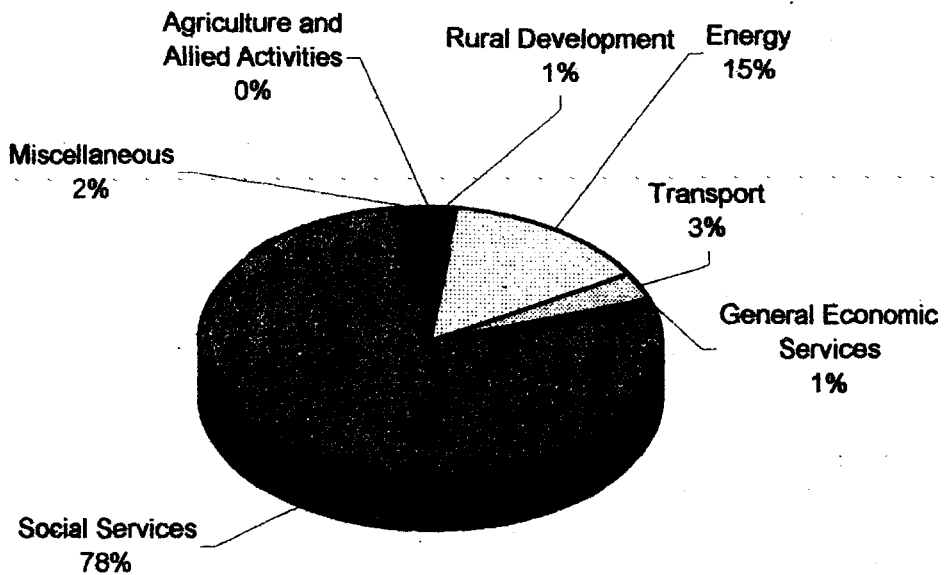
Annual Plan 1996-97 Actual Expenditure

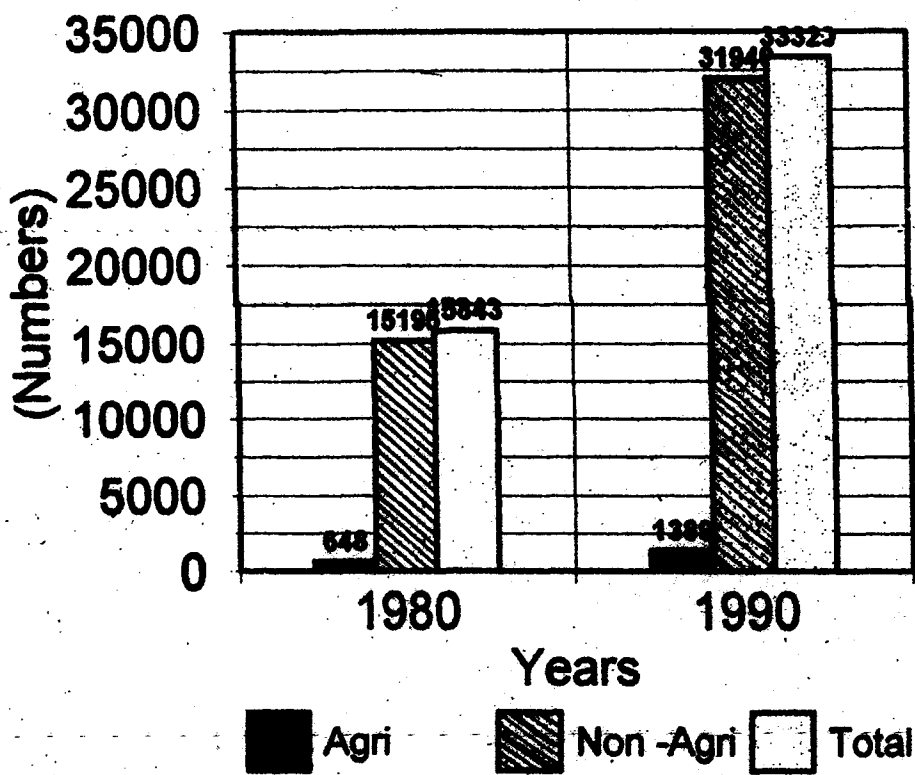
