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## INTRODUCTION

The Andaman and Nicobar Islands situated in the Bay of Bengal comprise of 319 islands. Out of these only 38 islands are inhabited with a total population of 188741 as per 1981 census. Though the population is constituted by all linguistic groups of almost all the States of India, the Link is Hindi. The aboriginals of these islands such as Nicobarese, Shompens, Andamanese, language Santal-ies, Onges and Jarawas, the decendants of the people of penal settlement, families from East Pakistan and Sri Lanka, the ex-servicemen from Punjab, Maharashtra and Tamilnadu and some immigrants seeking employment constitute the present population of this island territory.

The first primary school in these islands came into existence only towards the end of 19th century i.e. sometimes in 1891-92. This school was subsequently upgraded to the status of a High School with English as a Medium of Instruction and Urdu as a major language. In the year 1946, 12 schools were functioning comprising of one High School, One Middle School, 8 Primary Schools, One Karen School and One Burmese School. The total enrolment was only 1013.

At present this territory has 28 Senior Secondary, 27 Secondary, 42 Middle and 185 Primary Schools 18 Pre Primary & our strength with a total enrolment on 67039 children. The Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools are affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. Literacy percentage of the islands is 51.56 according to census of 1981.

Instruction is being imparted to the children in 8 media at the primary stage and 6 at the secondary and senior secondary stage. Some of the schools have 4 to 5 media of instruction under the same roof. The multi-media instruction has created lot of problems regarding printing and publication of text-books in different languages. The Territory is forced to procure text books from different states for different media. This does not give a chance to the children to study their own environment as the books are based on the environment, flora and fauna of different states and not those of Andamans. To overcome this difficulty some steps have been taken for the preparation and printing of text books atleast at the primary level with assistance from UNICEF. Similar difficulties are being faced by the students at the middle, secondary and senior secondary levels.

The Central Board of Secondary Education has allowed the students to opt their mother tongue as the medium of instruction upto secondary and senior secondary stage with the result that there are 6 media of instruction at the secondary and senior secondary stage. But the Board does not print or prescribe text books other

than in Hindi and English media. Hence, the students of this territory are put to great difficulty and are unable to compete with their brethren on the mainland.

Majority of the population of this territory belong to the weaker sections of the society who are not having any proper shelter. They are unable to contribute any share for the construction of school building. These islands remain under rain for about 7 to 8 months in a year. Therefore, it is not possible to conduct classes in the open space as is possible in the mainland. The problem can be overcome only if additional funds are provided for the construction of school buildings in this territory.

The schools in this territory have been established in all the far flung islands but are not having sufficient residential accommodation for staff. The teachers are also not getting rented accommodation as private houses are simply not available in the villages. To provide them the barest minimum shelter, the villages are only having hutments. The teachers, especially lady teachers are reluctant to work in the outlying areas. This problem can be solved only if additional funds are provided by GOI for construction of residential quarters.

It is a matter of pride that this territory is free from all the stigmas of casteism, regionalism and linguism and thus these islands fulfil and realise the values that India stands for the oneness of our cultural heritage. Residents of A & N Islands are not denied access to education on the basis of caste, region or language. As for education of female children our territory can compare with the best in India. Effective access for all can however be provided only when more funds are provided to provide text books, additional school buildings, Science labs, workshops utility stadia and other amenities in which field the islands are lacking.

For activating the youth of this territory it is essential that infrastructure for the involvement of the youth in sports and games are to be provided in different parts of this territory. We have got only a small stadium under construction at Port Blair. We have got good potential of sportsmen especially among the tribals of Nicobar District and Karens of Mayabunder but that can be tapped only if they are provided with a chance by providing utility stadia atleast at the block levels in all the islands.

Youths of the islands have shown excellent performances in water sports in National level competition and won 17 medals including golds. Overall achievement of the islands in Water Sports was the second position in National Level Competition.
