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
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FOREWORD

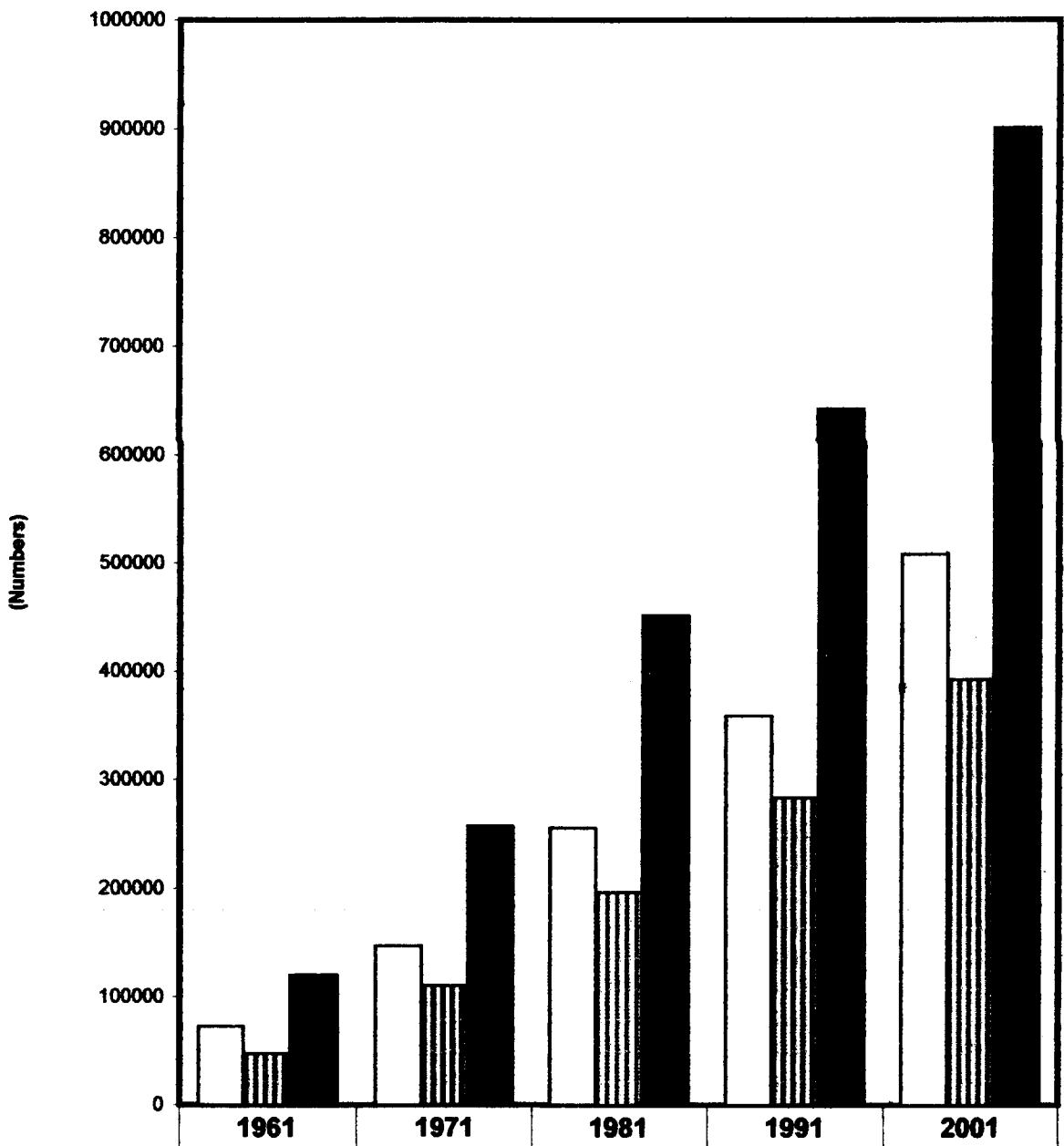

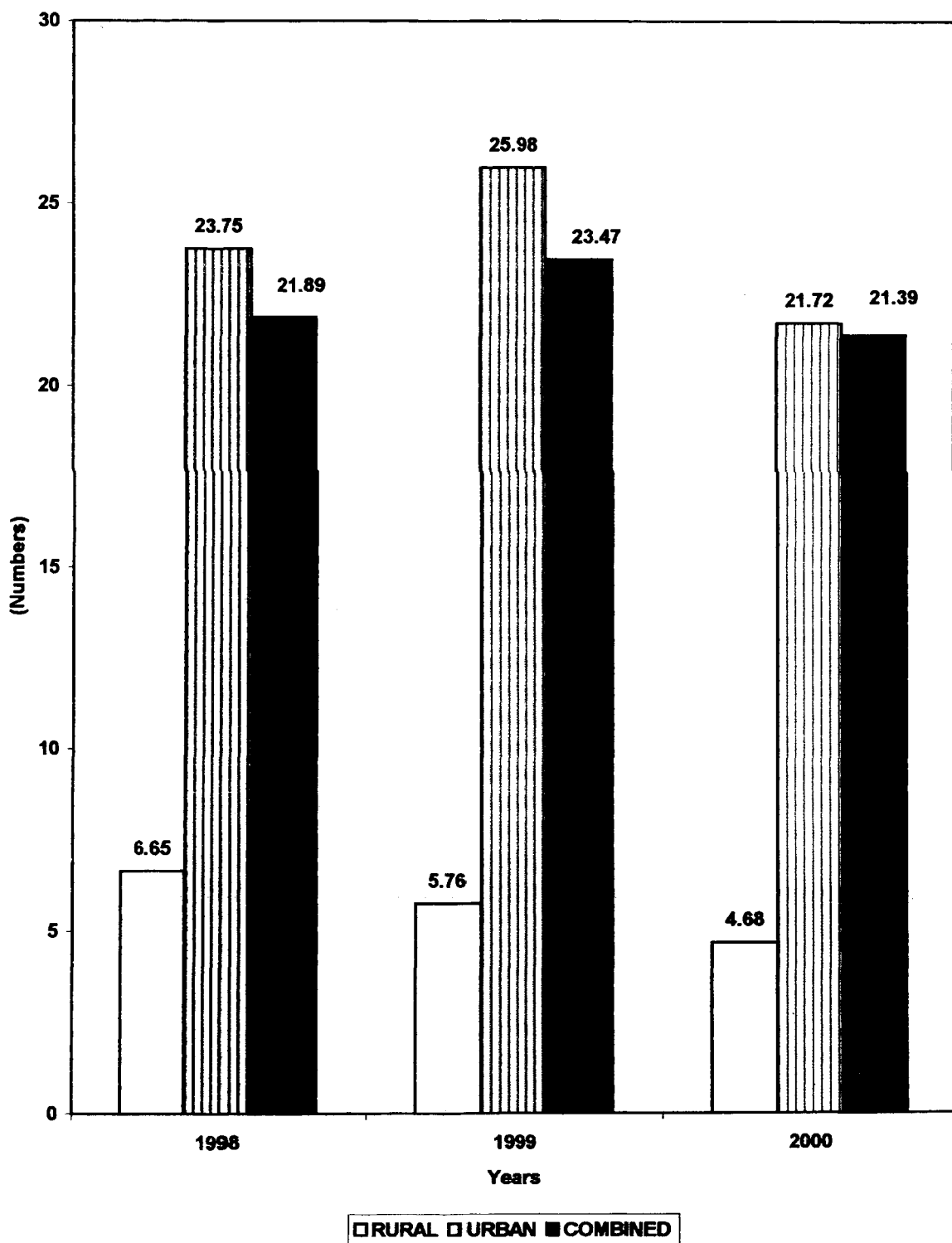

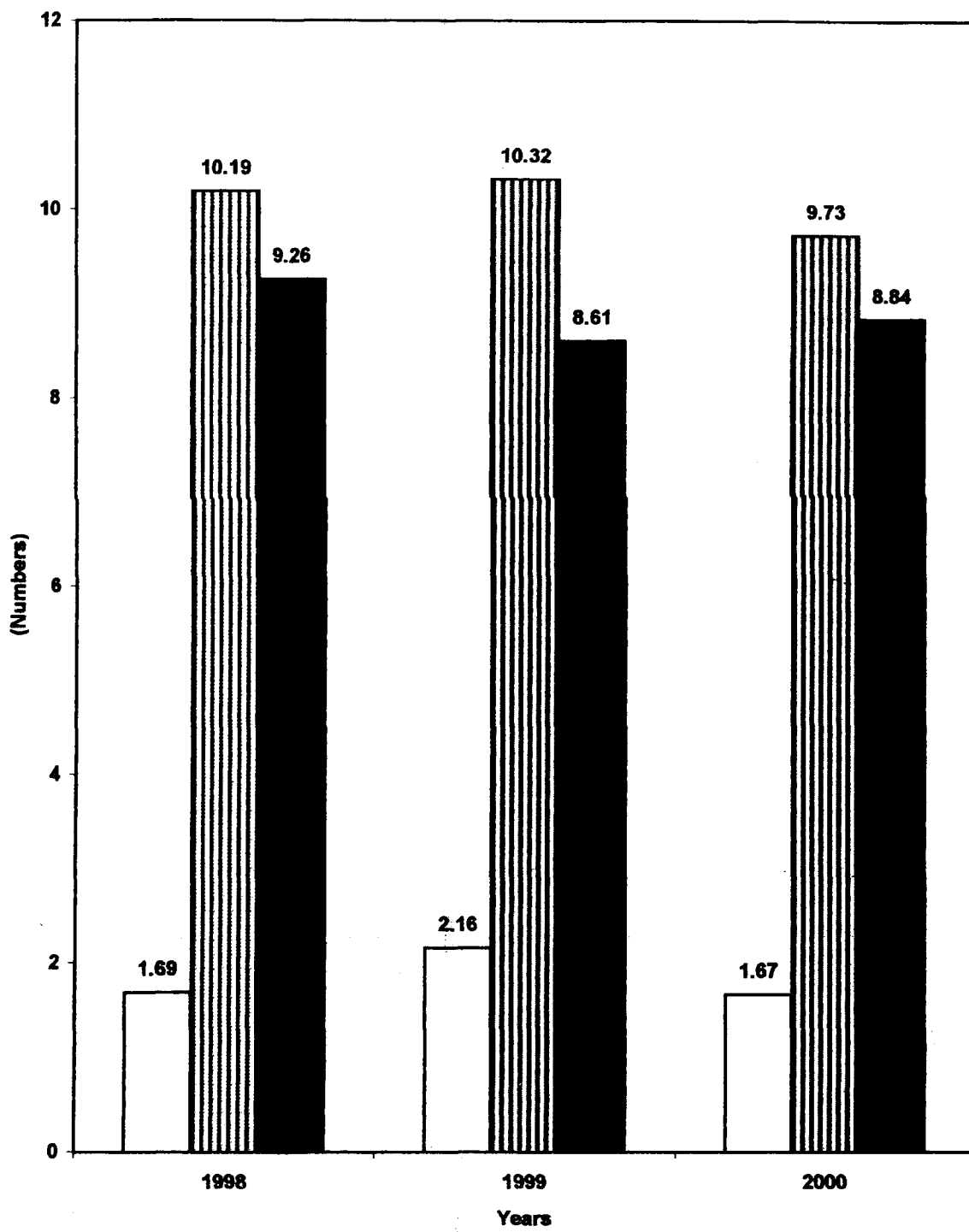

Area Wise Birth Rate in U.T. Chandigarh

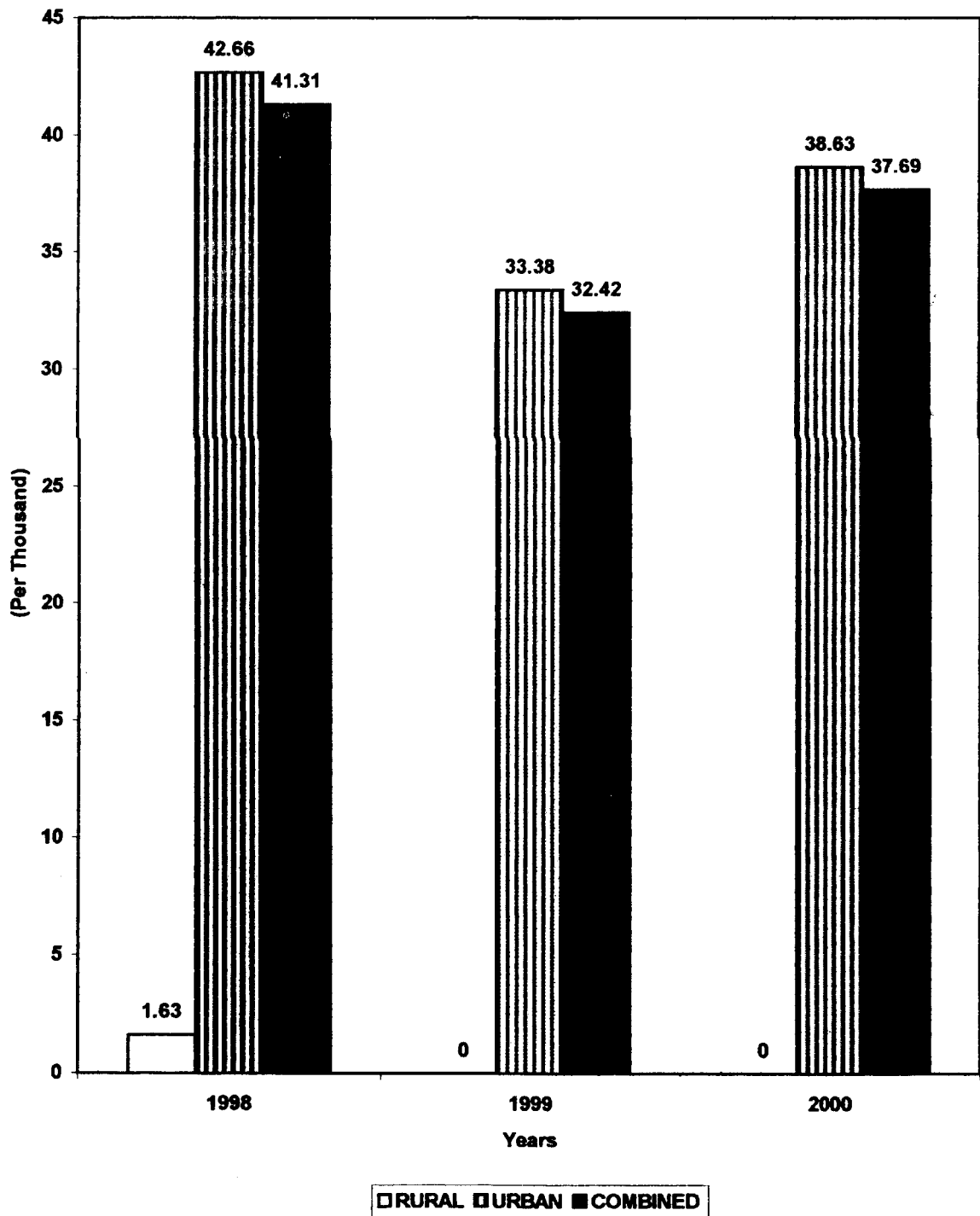


Area Wise Death Rate in U.T. Chandigarh

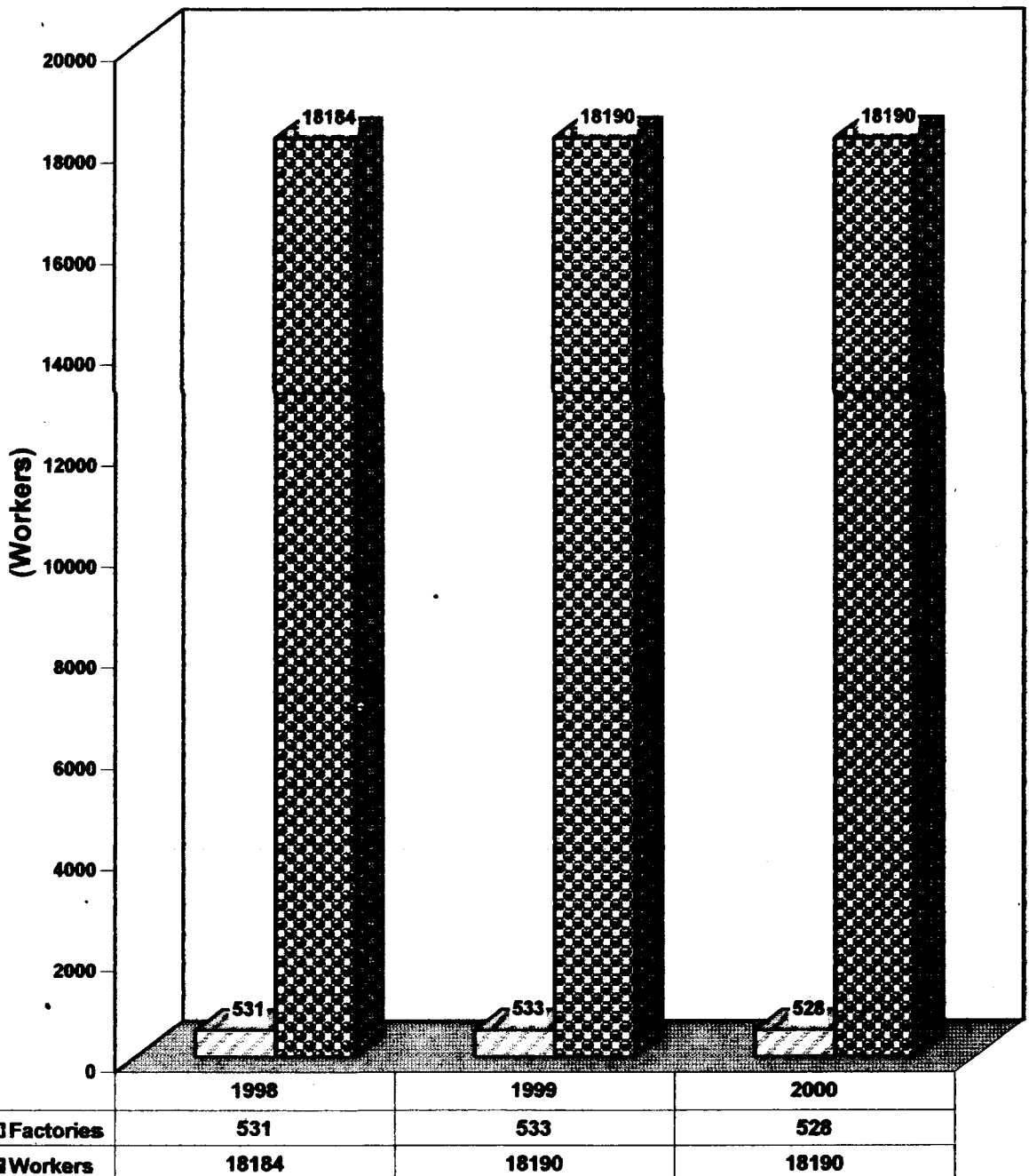

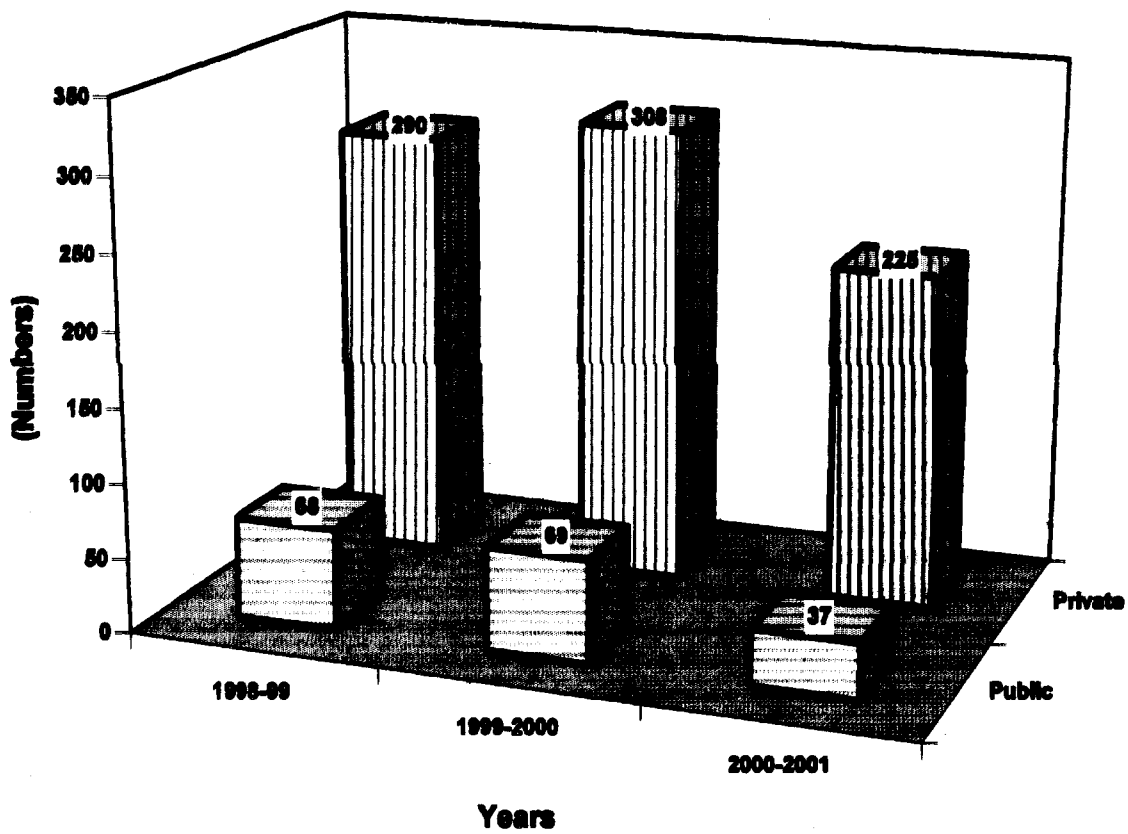

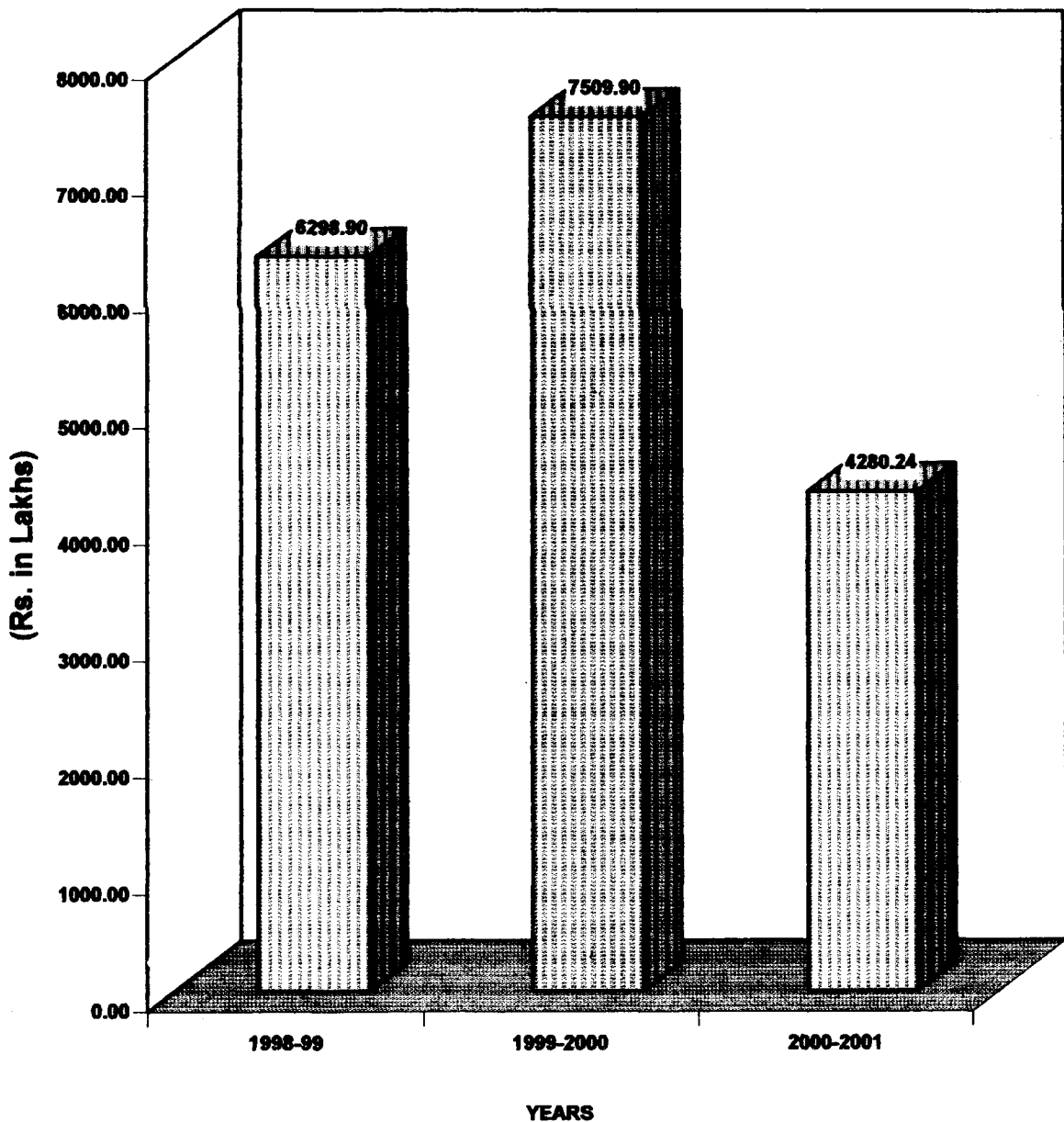

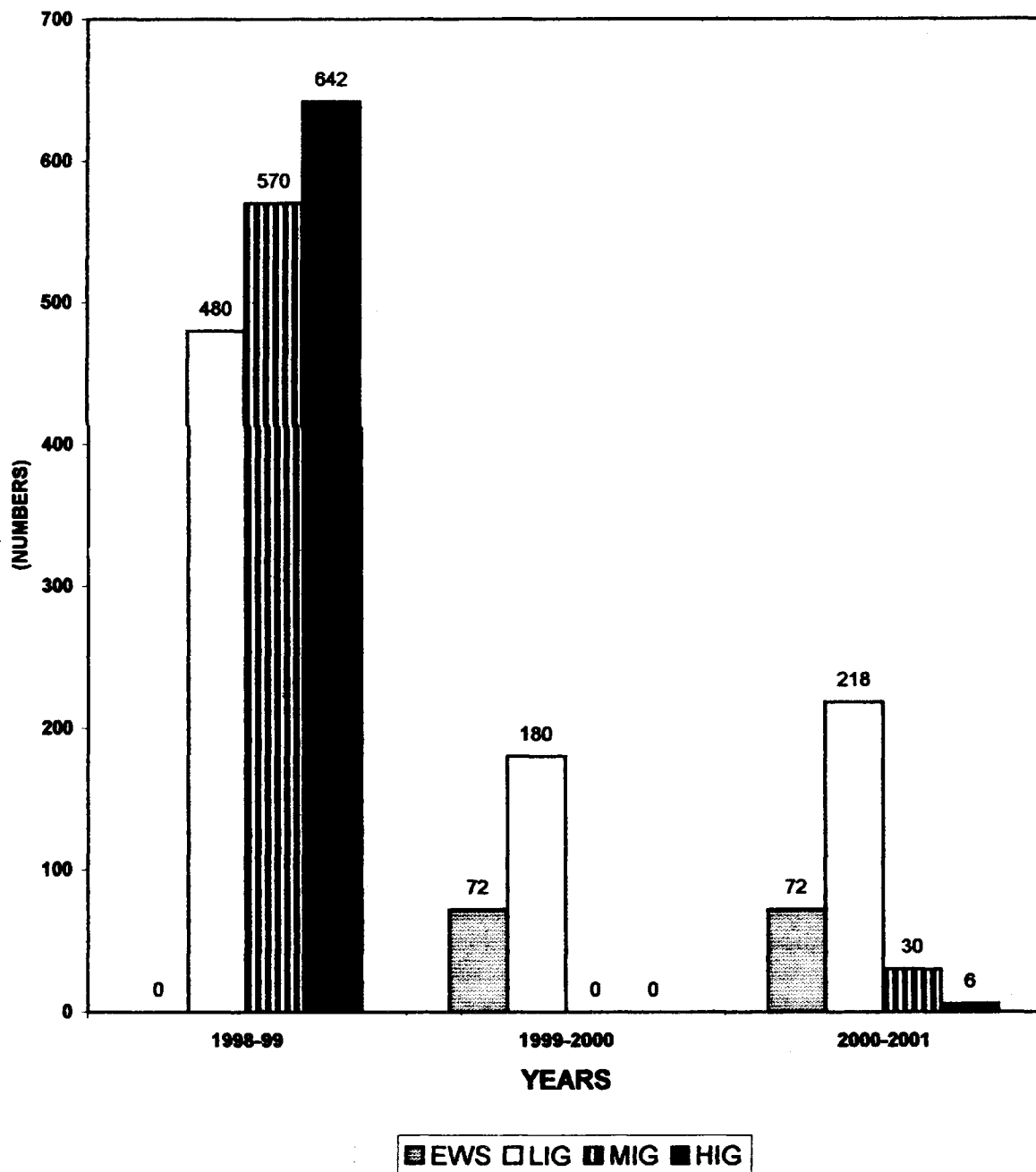

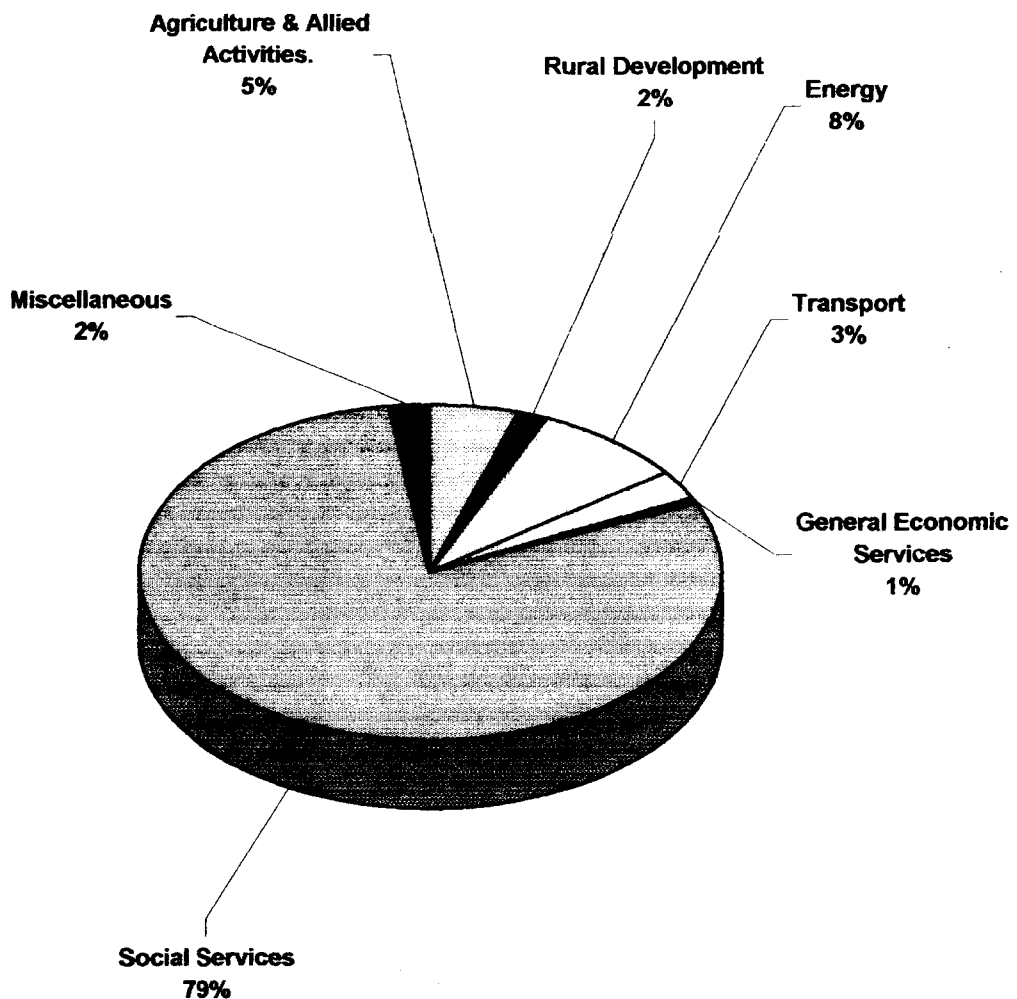
Ninth Five Year Plan 1997-2002 (Approved Outlay)



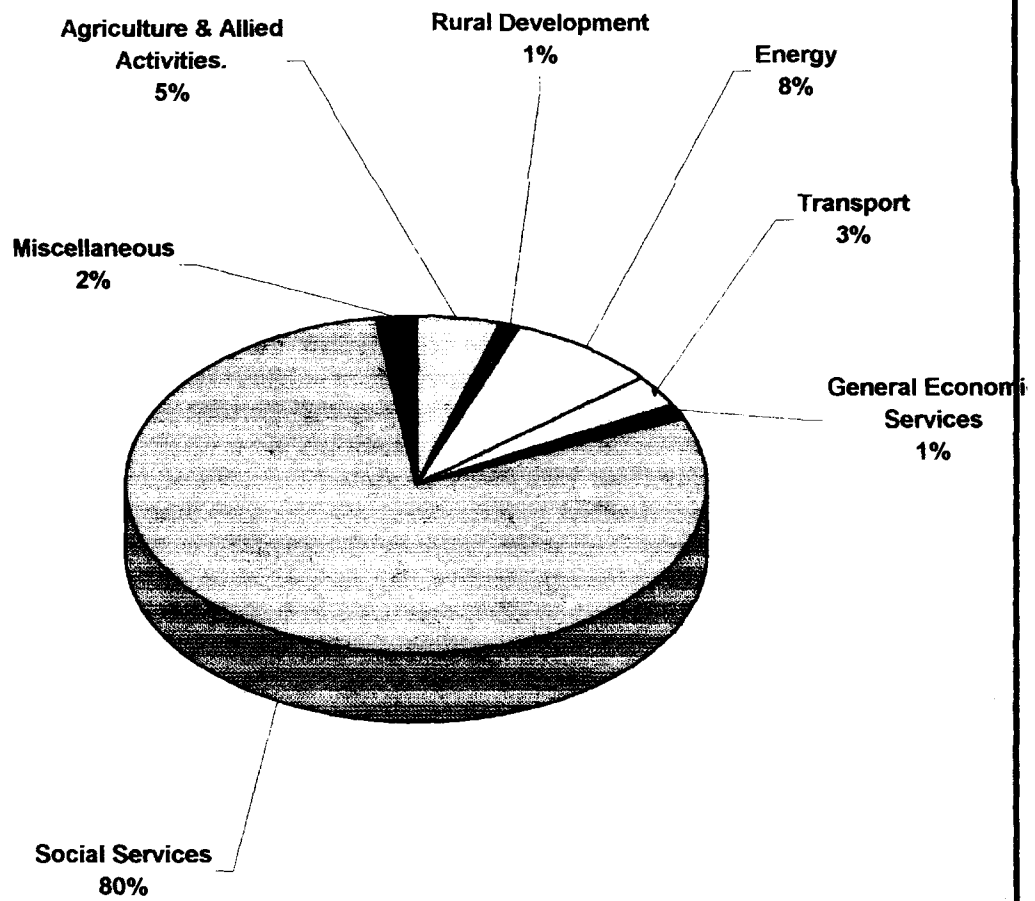
Annual Plan 1999-2000 (Actual Expenditure)
