ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE CHANDIGARH ADMINISTRATION

The Union Territory Administration is headed by the Administrator who is appointed by the President of India under Article239(2) of the Constitution of India. The Administrator is assisted by the Adviser to the Administrator, who is an IAS officer of the AGMU cadre. He is assisted by three Administrative Secretaries and number of IAS, IPS, PCS and HCS officers. The Adviser oversees the day-to-day administration. The powers to legislate vest with Parliament. The nodal Ministry for the Union Territory, Chandigarh is the Ministry of Home Affairs. Being a Union Territory without a legislature, the entire plan and non-plan expenditure is met directly from the Consolidated Fund of India. All its income goes directly to the Consolidated Fund of India. Therefore, a single demand covering all functions of the Administration is presented to the Parliament as a part of Demands for Grants of the Ministry of Home Affairs.

The Union Territory, Chandigarh comprises of one Parliamentary Constituency and one District. The Municipal Corporation in Chandigarh came into existence in May, 1994 under the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976 (as extended to Chandigarh) by an Amendment Act of 1994. An elected Mayor heads the Corporation. The Commissioner, Municipal Corporation looks after the general administration of the Corporation.

There are a number of Boards and Corporations under various departments in Union Territory, Chandigarh. However, two of the more important Corporation/Boards are the Chandigarh Industrial & Tourism Development Corporation (CITCO) and Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) to look after the promotion of industries, tourism and housing respectively.


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CHAPTER-1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACKGROUND HISTORY OF CHANDIGARH

Chandigarh, the dream city of India's first Prime Minister, Sh. Jawahar Lal Nehru, was planned by the famous French architect Le Corbusier. Picturesquely located at the foothills of Shivaliks, it is known as one of the best experiments in urban planning and modern architecture in the twentieth century in India.

Historical Background

"Chandigarh derives its name from the temple of "Chandi Mandir" located in the vicinity of the site selected for the city. The deity 'Chandi', the goddess of power and a fort or 'garh' laying beyond the temple gave the city its name" (Chandigarh-The City Beautiful).

The city has a pre-historic past. The gently sloping plains on which modern Chandigarh exists, was in the ancient past, a wide lake ringed by a marsh. The fossil remains found at the site indicate a large variety of aquatic and amphibian life which was supported by that environment. About 8000 years ago the area was also known to be a home to the Harappans. (Source: www.cltco.nic.in)

Since the medieval thru' modern era, the area was part of the large and prosperous Punjab Province which was divided into East & West Punjab during partition of the country in 1947. The city was conceived not only to serve as the capital of East Punjab, but also to resettle thousands of refugees who had been uprooted from West Punjab.

In March, 1948, the Government of Punjab, in consultation with the Government of India, approved a 114.59 sq. kms. tract of land at the foothills of the Shivaliks as the site for the new capital. The location of the city site was a part of the erstwhile Ambala district as per the 1892-93 gazetteer of District Ambala. The site was selected by Dr. M.S. Randhawa, the then Deputy Commissioner of Ambala. Before the new city came up, the original site had about 59 villages (Singh *et.al.*, 1998). The foundation stone of the city was laid in 1952. Subsequently, at the time of reorganization of the state in 1967 (01.11.1966) into Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh, the city assumed the

unique distinction of being the capital city of both, Punjab and Haryana while it itself was declared as a Union Territory and under the direct control of the Central Government.

Geology

The Union Territory of Chandigarh is located in the foothills of the Shivalik hill ranges in the north, which form a part of the fragile Himalayan ecosystem. It is occupied by Kandi (Bhabhar) in the north east and Sirowal (Tarai) and alluvial plains in the remaining part. The subsurface formation comprises of beds of boulders, pebbles, gravel, sand, silt,

clays and some kankar. The area is drained by two seasonal rivulets viz. Sukhna Choe in the east and Patiala-Ki-Rao Choe in the west. The central part forms a surface water divide and has two minor streams. The stream passing through the central part is called N-Choe and the other is Choe Nala which initiates at Sector 29.

Climate

Chandigarh falls under Koeppen's Cwg category i.e. it has cold dry winter, hot summer and sub tropical monsoon. Evaporation usually exceeds precipitation and the weather is generally dry.

The area experiences four seasons: (i) Summer or hot season (mid-March to Mid-June) (ii) Rainy season (late-June to mid-September); (iii) Post monsoon autumn/transition season (mid September to mid-November); (iv) Winter (mid November to mid-March). The dry spell of summer is long but with occasional drizzles or thunder storms. May and June are the hottest months of the year with mean daily maximum & minimum temperatures being about 37°C & 25°C, respectively. Maximum temperatures can rise up to 44°C. Southwest monsoons with high intensity showers commence in late June. The weather at this time is hot and humid. The variation in annual rainfall on year to year basis is appreciable i.e. 700 mm to 1200 mm. The 20 year average rainfall for Chandigarh is 1100.7 mm. January is the coldest month with mean maximum and minimum temperatures being around 23°C and 3.6°C respectively. Winds are generally light and blow from northwest to southeast direction with exception of easterly to southeasterly winds that blow on some days during the summer season.

The Master Plan of Chandigarh

Le Corbusier conceived the master plan of Chandigarh as analogous to human body, with a clearly defined head (the Capitol Complex, Sector 1), heart (the City Centre, Sector 17), lungs (the leisure valley, innumerable open spaces and sector greens), the intellect (the cultural and educational institutions), the circulatory system (the network of roads, the 7 Vs) and the viscera (the Industrial Area). The concept of the city is based on four major functions: living, working, care of the body and spirit and circulation. Residential sectors constitute the living part whereas the Capitol Complex, City Centre, Educational Zone (Post Graduate Institute, Punjab Engineering College, Panjab University) and the Industrial Area constitute the working part. The Leisure

Valley, Gardens, Sector Greens and Open Courtyards etc. are for the care of body and spirit. The circulation system comprises of 7 different types of roads known as 7Vs. Later on a pathways for cyclists called V8 were added to this circulation system.

The Capital complex comprises three architectural masterpieces: the "Secretariat", the "High Court" and the "Legislative Assembly", separated by large piazzas. In the heart of the Capital Complex stands the giant metallic sculpture of The Open Hand, the official emblem of Chandigarh, signifying the city's credo of "open to give, open to receive".

The city centre (Sector 17) is the heart of Chandigarh's activities. It comprises the Inter-State Bus Terminus, Parade Ground, District Courts, etc. on one hand, and vast business and shopping center on the other. The 4-storey concrete buildings house banks and offices above and showrooms/shops at the ground level with wide pedestrian concourses. The Neelam piazza in the center has fountains with light and water features. Proposal to set up an eleven storey building in Sector 17 is in the offing. Sector 34 is another newly developed commercial sector.

At least three blocks in Sector 34 are proposed to have 10 storey buildings to have offices, multiplexes and hotels. As per the new proposal each building will have its own style and will not conform to the grey look (source: Chandigarh Tribune – 1.6.2004).

Park Areas:

Ample areas have been provided in the master plan of the Capital for parks. Out of a total area of 20,000 acres acquired for the first phase, about 2000 acres are meant for development of parks.

Leisure Valley: Leisure Valley originates in sector1 and is more than 8 km. long. Chandigarh-conceived as a Garden City full of – Sun, Space and Verdure" has blossomed, to a large extent, into such entity.

1. Rajendra Park: It is a vast stretch of land about 400 acres, adjoining Secretariat building on the eastern side. Le Corbusier designed the landscape scheme of this park. It was started in 1954. Trees and round canopies and evergreen foliage

- have been planted here. It is commonly used for long walks, outdoor yoga, learning to drive and horse riding.
- 2. Bougainvillea Park: It is situated in sector 3 in an area of about 20 acres. The natural choe starts from here. About 65 different varieties of bougainvillea shrubs are planted here. It was started in 1976. A few flowering trees have also been planted here.
- 3. Fitness Trails and the Flower Garden: Situated in sector 10 Physical Fitness Trails have been developed with a view to enjoying physical exercises. It was started in 1965 and then redeveloped in 1985. On the southern side is located the Flower Garden. Out of an area of 90 acres, 50 acres are under seasonal flowers and rest of the area is punctuated with sculpture by renowned artists. Cultural activities and exhibitions are also organised here.
- 4. Zakir Rose Garden: Spread over 30 acres, Rose Garden in sector 16 is said to be the largest in Area acclaimed for 17000 plants representing 1600 varieties of roses as well as several fountains. It is truly magnificent during Rose Festival (Now Festival of Gardens) hosted each year to mark the arrival of spring. Emphasis was also given on the trees of medicinal value.
- 5. Shanti Kunj: It is situated between the Rose Garden and the Cricket Stadium in sector 16 stretch of the Leisure Valley. The natural stream running through the garden divides the park into five areas, each part depicts different kinds of threes such as medicinal plants, vertical shaped threes, flowering trees, trees for shade and environmentally friendly trees.
- 6. Children's Traffic Park: It is situated in sector:23. This place is useful for children to learn cycling and to teach them rules of road safety. There is Bal Bhawan concrete pathways interlocked with undulating greens.
- 7. Hibiscus Garden: It is situated in sector:36 on an area of 8 acres and adjoins Dakshin Marg. It was opened in 1974. About 40 different types of Hibiscus shrubs are planted here which provide colour throughout the year. The choe banks are also planted with bottle brush and bamboo groves.
- 8. Garden of Fragrance: This is the most recent addition to the city's theme gardens. Flowering plants like raat ki rani, motia, varieties of jasmine, damask

rose, mehndi, champa, harshingar and many others cast of pervading aroma in this part of the Leisure Valley.

Other Gardens: Besides the above mentioned parks/gardens of the Leisure Valley, there are other gardens in Chandigarh. They are:

- 9. Botanical Garden Sector 1: It is situated between the Rock Garden and Sukhna lake and is spread over 88 acres. Its rockeries, lily-pools and rare species covered in green houses draw garden lovers and botanists.
- 10. Botanical Garden Panjab University: This Garden has about 225 types of threes and shrubs. It is spread over an area of about 16 acres and was started in 1961. One corner of this Garden is devoted to cacti and succulent plants, in another corner of the garden are grown evergreen and exotic plants. There is also a lotus corner in the garden.
- 11. Smriti Upavan: This space has been set aside to allow the people to plant trees in memory of the departed ones. The resultant forest is intended to be a place of silence and remembrance. It was formally inaugurated in November 14, 1988 when the then Adviser, Sh. Ashok Pradhan, Planted a banyan tree in the memory of the first Prime Minister of India Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru.
- 12. Topiary Garden: It is situated in Sector 35 on an approximate area of 8 acres and was started in 1987. Many animal shapes created out of creepers and bushes attract children to this park. A large variety of ornamental plants add to the park's charm.
- 13. Terraced Garden: Situated in sector 33, it is spread over 10 acres and was started in 1979. Its main attraction is an illuminated musical fountains. This garden is the venue for the annual chrysanthemum show.

One unique feature in the layout of Chandigarh is its roads, classified in accordance with their functions. An integrated system of seven roads was designed to ensure efficient traffic circulation. Corbusier referred to these as the 7'Vs. The city's vertical roads run northeast/southwest (The 'Paths'). The horizontal roads run northwest/southeast ('The Margs'). They intersect at right angles, forming a grid or network for movement.

This arrangement of road-use leads to a remarkable hierarchy of movement, which also ensures that the residential areas are segregated from the noise and pollution of traffic.

Each 'Sector', or the neighbourhood unit, is quite similar to the traditional Indian 'mohalla'. Typically, each sector measures 800 metres by 1200 metres, covering 250 acres of area. Each Sector is surrounded by V-2 or V-3 roads, with no buildings opening on to them. Access from the surrounding roads is available only at 4 controlled points which roughly mark the middle of each side. Typically a sector is divided in four parts by a V-4 road running from east to west and a V-5 road running from north to south. These four parts are easily identifiable as A, B, C and D corresponding to North, East, South and West

sides. However, sectors 1,2,3,4,5 and 6 have no Sub Sectors and sectors 7 and 8 have only three parts A, B and C (This is because they are developed according to the concept proposed by the first planner of the City Albert Mayer to give his concept some recognition). In case of Quardipartite Sectors, the houses from 1 to 1000, 1001 to 2000 to 2001 to 3000 and 3001 to 4000 are located in Sub Sectors A, B, C and D in clockwise direction. Though all the sectors are structured more or less similarly, but they have their own characteristics and individuality. Each Sector is meant to be self-sufficient, with shopping and community facilities within reasonable walking distance. The sectors of the city are numbered commencing from the northern most edge of the city with the highest numbers located at the southern edge. There is no sector 13 in Chandigarh, but the addition or subtraction of the number of any two consecutive sectors vertically amounts to 13 or its multiple (eg. Sec. 2 + Sec. 11 = 13, Sec. 11 + Sec. 15=26, etc.) Though it is generally believed that No. 13 was left out due to superstition but records indicate that Sector 12 and 13 were demarcated initially as a cultural zone in the lower halves of Sector 10 and 11 but later removed to avoid confusion. However, later No. 12 was assigned to residual area at the edge of Sector 11 but No. 13 was left out in absence of an appropriate area for its location. The location of Sectors 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 is also somewhat anomalous. As per records, the phase-I of the master plan was up to Sector 25. Later the city was extended in the space available east of Sector 7, 19 and 20 and numbered 26,27, 28, 29 and 30.

Though educational, cultural and medical facilities are spread all over the city, however, major institutions are located in Sectors 10, 11, 12, 14 and 26.

The industrial area comprises 2.35 sq kms, set-aside in the Master Plan for non-polluting, light industry on the extreme southeastern side of the city near the railway line, as far away from the Educational Sectors and Capitol Complex as possible. Of this, 136 hectares was developed in the first phase. In the event of expansion, creation of an additional industrial area in the southern part of the city was envisaged. While the Industrial area is directly connected to the civic centre by a V-3 road, a wide buffer of fruit trees was planted to screen off this area from the rest

of the city. Architectural controls have been established regarding site coverage and materials of construction, ultimately requiring all plans to be formed in consultation with the Capital Project Office. A maximum site coverage up to 50 per cent is allowed with 2.5 percent of the space permitted to be used as quarters for essential staff. In Sector 30, which is sufficiently close to the Industrial Sector, multi-storeyed buildings for providing suitable tenements for the workers have been developed. Besides Industrial housing is also provided in sectors 28 and 29.

Tree plantation and landscaping has been an integral part of the city's Master Plan. Twenty six different types of flowering and 22 species of evergreen trees (Singh et. al., 1998) have been planted along the roads, in parking areas, shopping complexes, residential areas and in the city parks, to ameliorate the harsh climate of the region, especially the hot and scorching summers.

Population Growth in the City




Figure 1.1: Population trend in Chandigarh from 1961 to 2021.

Chandigarh was planned for a finite population of half-a-million. In Phase I, 36 sq km of land was acquired by the city administration for construction of 30 sectors. Land for seventeen additional sectors (Sector 31 to 47) was acquired and developed during the second phase to cater for a population of 350,000. The predominance of 3/4 storey apartments in the second phase provide for higher population dimension. However, Chandigarh has now grown beyond its planned capacity. Hence, development in the third phase has started in sectors 48 and beyond. Demographic data indicate that between 1961 and 1971, the population increased by 144.59 percent, one of the highest for urban areas in India. According to 1981 census, it grew by another 75.55 percent, followed by 42.16 percent in 1991

and by 40.33 per cent in 2001 (with a total population of 9,00,635). By 2021 the population of Chandigarh is projected to be around 19.5 lacs (at current rate of growth) almost four times for which it was originally built (Fig. 1.1).

VILLAGES & SLUM AREAS

At present there are 18 villages namely Kaimbala, Khuda Alisher, Khuda Jassu, Khuda Lahora, Sarangpur, Dhanas, Dadumajra, Maloya, Palsora, Kajheri, Hallomajra, Behlana, Raipur Khurd, Raipur Kalan, Makhan Majra, Daria, Mauli Jagran and Kishangarh. Four villages i.e. Badheri, Butrela, Burail and Attawa are now under the Municipal limits of Chandigarh and are under the control of the Municipal Corporation. In addition, according to a survey conducted by the field staff of the office

of the Tehsildar (Colony), Estate Office, U.T. Chandigarh there are 18 colonies namely, (1) Ambedkar colony (2) Gursagar Bhattal (3) Kabri Colony (4) Kalyan Colony (5) Kumhar colony-25 (6) Labour colony-4 (7) Labour colony-5 (8) LBS colony (9) Madrasi colony (10) Nehru colony (11) Rajiv colony (12) Sanjay Labour colony (13) SBS Mauli Jagran (14) Shahpur Colony (15) Mazdoor Colony (16) Pandit Colony (17) Kuldeep Colony and (18) Gawala Colony with 22511 Households and total population 68159.

Areas of Interest

Chandigarh is famous for its architecture and landscaping world over. It combines elegant architectural forms with wide tree-lined avenues, green belts and gardens and is hence referred to as the 'City Beautiful'.

Green open space comprise about 8 sq kms out of 114 square kilometers of the capital project area. Major open areas include the Leisure Valley, Sukhna Lake, Rock Garden and many theme gardens like, Rose Garden, Botanical Garden, Terrace Garden, Fragrance Garden, etc. In addition, the sectors are vertically integrated by a green belt oriented in the direction of the mountains.

Various structures such as the Government Museum and Art Gallery, Museum of Evolution of Life and Fine Arts College have come up in the leisure valley forming the cultural zone of the city.

Sukhna Lake, a major tourist attraction, was constructed in 1958 across Sukna choe and was planned as an integral part of master plan of the city. The lake spreads on the foothills of the Shivalik mountain range. The reservoir of the lake is in the shape of a bean seed bounded by a 12.8 m high rock fill earthen dam. The total catchment area of the lake is 42.07 sq kms, of which 34.42 sq kms falls in the Union Territory of Chandigarh (including 25.42 sq km newly acquired area) and 7.7 sq km swhich falls in the state of Haryana. This additional area is prone to erosion.

Rock Garden, another tourist attraction, is the creation of Nek Chand and is built with municipal waste. It expresses the fragility of the environment, the need for conservation of the earth's natural resources, the importance of balancing industrial development and sound environmental practices.

1.2 CONCEPT NOTE ON RAJIV GANDHI CHANDIGARH TECHNOLOGY PARK.

Chandigarh's economy is changing in character as the knowledge revolution sweeps the country. There has been a decline in traditional industrial activity and a rapid increase in activity relating to the services sector. This is a especially evident in the fields of financial services, IT Services, Insurance Services, Hospitality, Health and Education services. The emphasis of the Administration is to promote Chandigarh in the knowledge sector. A proposal for developing Chandigarh as a financial services hub is also actively under the consideration of the Administration Projects like Chandigarh Technology Park, the education city and the film city are further likely to boost the employment potential in Chandigarh and also give an impetus to economic activity.

As Chandigarh is also servicing the North – West because of the increase in the number of visitors and business, the Airports Authority of India, (AAI), in association with Chandigarh Administration, has undertaken the upgradation of Chandigarh Airport.

Chandigarh Technology Park (CTP) is an extremely important project for the Union Territory of Chandigarh, as it provides the world class integrated infrastructure necessary for the setting up of facilities/campuses by leading Technology Companies and other IT/ITES/BPO companies, for the first time. Chandigarh has traditionally been a city where few multi-national companies had earlier set up their facilities and therefore a large number of professionals left Chandigarh for other cities, in search of high level employment. The level of educational facilities here is much higher than the level of employment opportunities available, especially in the knowledge sector. North India, as a whole, lagged behind the southern States, and the CTP is a major step in redressing the imbalance. Chandigarh is fast becoming one of the most preferred destinations for technology companies in the country, especially since it boasts of an excellent quality of life, a huge base of Human Resources and the proactive policies of the Administration are conducive to such investment.

By setting up the Chandigarh Technology Park, Chandigarh Administration has taken a step towards providing world class facilities in Chandigarh so

that not only employment is at the highest level but the economy of Chandigarh and the region would get a boost. Chandigarh Administration looks at Chandigarh as a regional hub for IT alongwith Mohali and Panchkula. CTP is dedicated to the application of IT for the benefit of society, by involving Technology companies in e-Governance programmes also.

CTP was conceived in 2001 by Chandigarh Administration over an area measuring 123 acres. The CTP has been approved as a Special Economic Zone by the Government of India. Chandigarh Administration has developed sufficient infrastructure for the Technology Companies to set up their facilities at CTP. CTP comprises of flexible options for Technology Companies with plots of various sizes including Ready Built Space plots, Build to Suit Sites and large and small campus sites. An area of 60 acres is earmarked for use by technology companies. The remaining area is for green spaces and services. 30 acres were allocated for the main campus, 5 acres for the small campus, 12.5 acres for the Ready Built Space and 12.5 acres for the Build to Suit Sites.

Infosys Technologies Limited was allotted 30 acres as the main anchor company and has by now constructed 525,000 Sq.ft. of their state of the art campus. Infosys plans to employ 5000 professionals at this campus. They are also constructing State of the art food courts, gymnasia, serviced apartments and related facilities for their employees on campus.

The Ready Built Space developed by the leading developer, DLF Limited is spread over an area of 12.5 acres and comprises 6 blocks measuring of total of 650,000 Sq.ft. DLF is leasing out this Ready Built Space to IT Companies. They have set up an attractive ultra-modern building, with hi-tech facilities. IBM Daksh, Outer Bay and Net Solutions are among the companies which have begun fitting out their premises at the DLF building.

Out of 42 applicants for Build of Suit sites, 6 sites, measuring 1 to 2 acres, have been allotted to Amadeus, KMG Infotech, Microtek, Bebo Technologies, Synapse and Alchemist.

10 more applications have been received, for 4 more advertised sites. The applicants include RT Outsourcing, FCS Technologies, IDS InfoTech and Second Foundation USA. We have another 7 build to suit sites, each of about 1 acre will be

advertised shortly. The emphasis is to encourage not only large companies but also Research and Development units.

An Entrepreneur Development Centre (EDC), over an area of 1.54 Acre, is being established through a leading developer, at the RGCTP. This would comprise of a floor space of 60,000 Sq.ft. and would be available for IT/ITES/BPO Company for incubation and for setting up Plug & Play facilities. A research laboratory will also be part of this EDC and will provide modern facilities for companies to work in. A commercial site, measuring about 4.5 acres, is to be auctioned at CTP for a Business Hotel/Convention centre.

The basic infrastructure of CTP has been set up by Chandigarh Administration, through the Engineering Department, which has constructed the access roads, internal roads, street lighting, sewerage, drainage, water supply and power supply for the CTP. The buildings in the CTP are energy efficient and comply with the latest environment norms. A special environment policy for CTP has also been notified. The Ministry of Environment and Forest has accorded appropriate environment clearance.

Chandigarh Administration is committed to providing holistic facilities for companies investing in Chandigarh. The second phase of CTP, comprising of an additional 250 acres, is being developed as a Technology Habitat, in order to provide integrated facilities to professionals working at the CTP to avoid the infrastructural problems being faced in some other cities. Out of this, 115 acres will be for the Technology Park and 135 acres for integrated support facilities. The Administration is providing residential, commercial, community and sports infrastructure for the IT companies to flourish in a manner that is conducive to their growth, with a futuristic outlook.

It is expected that about 1000 Engineers/Professionals shall start working at CTP by December 2005. A total of 20000 professionals are expected to work at the CTP once it is fully established.

CTP has so far attracted investment of about Rs.400 crore of Infosys and DLF. Annual Software Export of about Rs.1000 crores are likely to take place from CTP in the next 3 years.

The following companies are now part of the Chandigarh Technology Park.

Seven more Build to Suit Sites, measuring about 1 Acre each, are being advertised shortly for eligible companies which were not successful in the draw till now and for fresh applicants.

A Hotel site for a Business Hotel (150 rooms) –cum-Convention Centre (for 1200 persons) is also being auctioned.

The 115 acres of the phase-II of the Technology Park will include 70 acres which will be allotted to IT/ITES/BPO companies. This would consist of 4 large campus sites, measuring approximately 10 acres each, and about 30 acres for Build to Suit Sites, of different sizes. Keeping in view an overall FAR of 1.0, about 3.50 million Sq. ft. built up space will be constructed in this phase. About 35 companies will be accommodated in the 70 acre area which will be allotted in this phase.

CHAPTER 2

AREA AND POPULATION

This section includes abstract of available data on area and population of the Chandigarh according to different censuses. The concepts and definitions used in the 2001 census are given below:

Work:

Work was defined as participation in any economically productive activity. Such participation was physical or mental in nature.

Main Workers:

Main Workers were those who had worked for the major part of the year i.e. who were engaged in any economically productive activity for 183 days or more during the year.

Marginal Workers:

Marginal workers were those who did not work for a major part of the year, i.e. those who worked for less than 183 days in the year.

Workers:

Non workers were those who had not worked any time in the year.

Household:

A household is a group of persons who commonly live together and take the meals from common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so.

Literates:

A Person who can both read and write with understanding in any language.



CHAPTER 4

AGRICULTURE

Area according to Village Papers: It is according to village papers and is based on returns of area prepared by village staff for revenue purposes in the Chandigarh whereas area by professional survey is worked out by the Surveyor General of India. There is some difference in the two sets of figures because of different methods adopted by them.

Area under Forests: This includes actually forested area on the lands, classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forest whether State-owned or Private except in area not cadastrally surveyed. Area under forests given in this section does not tally with that of the Forest Department shown in the section on forest statistics owing to the fact that certain lands though no wooded, are taken as forest by the Forest Department while these are not treated as such by the Director Land Records, Chandigarh Administration.

Land not available for Cultivation: This includes absolutely barren and unculturable land like mountains deserts etc., which cannot be brought under plough except at exhorbitant cost or land cover by buildings, roads and railways and water or otherwise appropriated for non-agricultural purposes.

Other Uncultivated Land excluding Fallow Lands: This denotes land available for cultivation either not taken up for cultivation or abandoned later on for one reason or the other and includes culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing land and lands under miscellaneous tree crops and groves.

Fallow Land: It denotes cultivable land which after abandonment remains uncultivated over long period called "old fallow", those kept uncultivated during the current year called "Current Fallows".

Net Area sown: It is the net area sown under crops, the area sown more than once during the year being counted once only.

Total Cropped Area: It includes total area covered with crops during the year. In case different crops are raised on the same land during the year, the same area is counted more than once.
