## PREFACE

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) conducted a survey of rural and urban households in the 64<sup>th</sup> round of NSS during July 2007- June 2008. The subjects covered were (i) participation and expenditure in education (ii) employment –unemployment and migration (iii) consumer expenditure. This report presents the results of the survey on participation in education and private educational expenditure.

Government of West Bengal, like previous rounds, participated in this survey on equal matching sample basis. The survey conducted by Bureau of Applied Economics and Statistics, Government of West Bengal with its field staff. Same questionnaire, training manuals, data processing and data validation software and table generation software supplied by NSSO were used by the Bureau.

The major purposes of the survey were to study (i) the extent of use of educational infrastructure as reflected in current attendance status of population in educational institutions, and of educational incentives received by students from the Government or private sector (ii) the magnitude & nature of private expenditure on education (iii) the extent of educational wastage in terms of dropout and discontinuance, and its causes.

Chapter I of the report is introductory. Important concepts and definitions adopted in the survey are explained in Chapter Two. Literacy and completed education level of the population and the current attendance/enrolment status of person of age 5-29 in educational institutions are discussed in Chapter Three. A detailed analysis on participation in the education system, various incentives availed and private expenditure incurred on education for persons in the age-group 5-29 years, currently attending at primary level are given in Chapter Four. Non-enrolment and the educational wastage in terms of drop-out or discontinuance, and the reasons thereof, are discussed in Chapter Five. Detailed tables on State Level data based on State Sample are shown in Appendix A. The sampling design and estimation procedure followed in arriving at the estimates presented in the report are outlined in Appendix B. A facsimile of the schedule of enquiry canvassed in the field is in Appendix C.

Survey Design and Research Division of NSSO developed the sample design and survey instruments. State used the same materials as were supplied by NSSO. The field workers of the Socio-Economic Survey Office of the various districts and also State headquarter carried out the field work. Officers of State headquarter carried out the manual scrutiny. The data was processed and validated using NSSO software. Finally tables were generated using NSSO software as per NSSO plan for table generation.

The Officers and staff attached to the Socio-Economic Survey Unit at State headquarter and at District Statistical Offices of the Bureau of Applied Economics and Statistics also deserve my thanks for their sincere effort in bringing out this report. The indefatigable effort of Sri Amit Gupta, Deputy Director and Smt. Soma Dey, Assistant Director of Socio-Economic Survey Office of this Directorate deserves a special mention for the entire mission.

I hope this report will be useful to planners, policy makers and researchers. Comments and suggestions for improvement will be most welcome.





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## Chapter I Introduction

1.0 The report is based on the findings of the State Sample data of 64<sup>th</sup> Round programme of NSS during July 2007- June 2008. Central sample results for all the states/ Union Territories including West Bengal have been brought out in NSS Report No. 532, Education in India, 2007-08, Participation and Expenditure, Government of India, Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation, NSS Organization, May 2010.

1.0.1 To avail the educational facilities, individuals have to incur expenditure in the form of tuition fees, examination fees, cost of books and stationary etc. Expenditure incurred by the Government is available in the budget documents. There is an increasing role of non-Government organizations as well as individuals in the education sector. The generation of information on education and the expenditure incurred by the individuals revealed through this survey has special significance.

1.0.2 The NSS 64<sup>th</sup> round was designed to collect information on (a) participation of persons aged 5-29 years in the education system of the country (b) private expenditure incurred by households on education and (c) the extent of educational wastage in terms of dropout and discontinuance, and its causes. The purpose was to study (i) the extent of use of educational infrastructure, or facilities and incentives provided by the Government and private sectors as reflected in the current attendance status of population in the educational institutions; (ii) the magnitude and nature of private expenditure on education; (iii) the incidence and causes of dropping out, non enrolment etc.

### 1.1 Coverage

1.1.1 For the purpose of this survey, 'education' covers the following:

- I. School education including that under the Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) from class I to X or XII, irrespective of the status of recognition of the educational institution,
- II. Higher secondary/ pre-University education leading to certificate / diploma/ degree etc. It also includes enrolment in private recognized institutions which have regular classes and follow the syllabus and pattern of education as in recognized schools or colleges, and which sponsor students for public examinations as private or external candidates,
- III. General University education, whether full-time or part –time, leading to certificate/diplomas, degrees, etc. Universities not recognised by University Grant Commission are not covered,
- IV. Correspondence courses conducted by Universities, deemed Universities or institutions authorised by competent authorities for awarding regular diploma or degrees or certificates,

- V. Higher secondary/ pre-University / under-graduate/ post-graduate/ professional / technical education leading to certificates, diplomas, degrees etc. conducted by recognised open Universities/ Schools,
- VI. Technical or professional courses, leading to degrees /diplomas / certificates, conducted by Universities, Deemed Universities or institutes like National Institute of Fashion Technology, National School of Drama or institutions authorised by competent authorities like All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), Medical Council of India (MCI), etc.
- VII. Professional courses conducted by Institutes like the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the Institute of Cost and Work Accountants of India, the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, Actuarial Society of India, etc.
- VIII. All types of vocational courses of duration three months or more, conducted by institutions like Industrial Training Institute (ITI), National Vocational Training Institute, Regional Vocational Training Institutes etc. authorised by competent authorities,
- IX. All the courses at primary level and above, whether recognised or not, conducted by recognised educational institutions and not covered under the above-mentioned categories.

1.1.2 The following courses are specifically excluded:

- ❖ *Art, music and similar types of course conducted by individuals in their house or unrecognized unaffiliated institutions,*
- ❖ *Classes taken by private tutors,*
- ❖ *Education at nursery/kindergarten/preparatory levels – except for information on enrolment status and drop-out/ discontinuance status,*
- ❖ *The non-formal system of education being implemented through various programmes by Government or other agencies – except for information and enrolment status and drop-out / discontinuance status.*

## 1.2 The 64<sup>th</sup> round survey (July 2007 - June 2008)

1.2.1 The 64<sup>th</sup> Round of NSS was a multi-subject household survey round covering 'Employment-unemployment and Migration', 'Household Consumer Expenditure' and 'Participation and Expenditure in Education'. The three detailed household enquiry schedules used in this round were Schedule 10.2, on employment- unemployment and migration, Schedule 1.0, on consumer expenditure, and Schedule 25.2, on participation and expenditure in education.

1.2.2 In this round also the used NSS practice of hamlet group/ sub-block formation by dividing the large villages /UFS blocks was applied. The numbers of households and persons in the State Sample from which data were collected through the survey questionnaire were as follows:

1.2.3 From each sample village or urban block, eight households were selected for the survey on 'Participation and Expenditure in Education'. For each sample household some general particulars such as age, sex, educational level attained, current attendance and enrolment status, etc. were collected from all the household members. For persons of age 5-29 years, who formed the main target group of the survey, further information on current attendance and enrolment status in educational institutions was obtained. Those currently not attending any educational institution were asked whether they had ever been enrolled, and if so, whether they had completed their education or discontinued midcourse, and what was the main reason for dropping out or for non-enrolment.

### **1.3 Layout of the report**

1.3.1 Important concepts and definitions adopted in the survey are explained in Chapter Two. Literacy and completed education level of the population and the current attendance/enrolment status of person of age 5-29 in educational institutions are discussed in Chapter Three. A detailed analysis on participation in the education system, various incentives availed and private expenditure incurred on education for persons in the age-group 5-29 years currently attending at primary level and above are given in Chapter Four. Non-enrolment and the educational wastage in terms of drop-out or discontinuance, and the reasons thereof, are discussed in Chapter Five. Detailed tables on State Level data based on State Sample are shown in Appendix A. The sampling design and estimation procedure followed in arriving at the estimates presented in the report are outlined in Appendix B. A facsimile of the schedule of enquiry canvassed in the field is in Appendix C

1.3.2 It may also be noted that the estimated proportions and ratios are generally presented as per 1000 numbers, with the figures rounded off. Therefore, the accuracy of the aggregates derived from the estimates of ratios provided in this report will be limited to the number of significant digits available in the ratio or percentage estimates used.

## Chapter II

### Concepts and Definitions

2.1 Important concepts and definitions used in this survey are stated below.

**2.1.1 Household:** A group of persons normally living together and taking food from a common kitchen constitute a household. It includes temporary stay-aways (those whose total period of absence from the household is expected to be less than 6 months) but excludes temporary visitors and guests (expected total period of stay less than 6 months).

**2.1.2 Household monthly per capita expenditure (MPCE):** Household consumer expenditure is measured as the expenditure incurred by a household on domestic account during a specified period, called reference period. It also includes the imputed values of goods and services, which are not purchased but procured otherwise for consumption. In other words, it is the sum total of monetary values of all the items (i.e. goods and services) consumed by the household on domestic account during the reference period. Monthly per capita expenditure (MPCE) is the household consumer expenditure over a period of 30 days divided by household size.

**2.1.3 Educational level:** It refers to the stage of educational attainment. It is the highest level a person has completed successfully. The levels are:

- not literate
- literate without any schooling;
- literate without formal schooling
- literate with formal schooling:
  - below primary,
  - primary,
  - upper primary/middle,
  - secondary,
  - higher secondary,
  - diploma/ certificate course,
  - graduate,
  - post-graduate and above.

It may be noted that if a person has successfully passed the final year of a given level, then and only then will he/ she be considered to have attained that level of education. For example, for a person studying in Class IX the educational level will be middle and not secondary.

**2.1.4 Level of current attendance:** The term in the present report refers to the stage of education that a student is currently pursuing, if any. For example, the level of current attendance of a person studying in Class IX will be secondary. Here the categories are:

- never attended;
- ever attended but currently not attending;
- currently attending in:
  - non-formal education,

- pre-primary (nursery/ kindergarten, etc.),
- primary,
- upper primary or middle,
- secondary,
- higher secondary,
- diploma or certificate (below graduate level)
- diploma or certificate (graduate and above level)
- graduation level degree courses
- post-graduation and above degree courses

In the schedule used for data collection, the 'levels' of current attendance, at the higher stages of education, referred to more specific categories indicating not only stage of education but also subject of study. Thus, graduate in agriculture and graduate in medicine were given different 'level codes'.

**2.1.5 Literate:** A person is considered literate if he/she can read and write a simple message in at least one language with understanding.

**2.1.6 School education levels:** A uniform pattern across the country for the number of years of schooling at primary level, upper primary/middle level, secondary level and a higher secondary level is yet to be achieved. Generally, the primary level refers to Classes I-V, the middle to Classes VI-VIII, the secondary to Classes IX-X and the higher secondary to Classes XI-XII. While in many states, this system is being followed, there are some states where the primary level comprises Classes I- IV, the middle Classes V to VII or VIII, the secondary Classes VIII-X, etc., and the higher secondary in some states is taught in colleges.

**2.1.7 Type of education:** Education is broadly divided into three categories: (i) general education, (ii) technical and professional education and (iii) vocational education. General education, in this survey, includes general school education from the primary to the higher secondary level, normal university education for a degree, whereas technical/professional courses involve the hands-on training in addition to theoretical classes. Engineering, Medicine, Agriculture, Management, Chartered Accountancy, Cost Accountancy, etc. are examples of technical/ professional courses. The education which aims at imparting training in very specific fields through providing significant 'hands-on' experience in acquiring necessary skill, which will make them employable or create for them opportunities of self employment and the degree/ diploma/ certificate awarded by the institute which have recognition by State/ Central Government/ public sector or similar employers is included under vocational education. Education offered by ITIs, polytechnics, etc. are examples of vocational courses.

**2.1.8 Course:** A course a) is a structured educational programme having a specified syllabus, duration, level, etc. and b) necessarily involves appearing in some kind of examination/ performance appraisal for getting the degree/ diploma/ certificate or advancing to the next class/ level. Depending upon the subjects covered and the mode of instruction, the courses can be

categorised broadly as (a) general, (b) technical/ professional and (c) vocational. For the purpose of this survey, only those courses covered under the definition of 'education' above are considered.

**2.1.9 Basic course:** When a particular member is undertaking more than one course, the basic course is identified as per following criteria -

- The course which is in the highest level is considered as the basic course.
- If all the courses simultaneously pursued currently are in the same level, then the course of the general education is the basic course.
- In absence of any general education, the course which involves higher cost, is taken as the basic course.
- If a person is enrolled both in regular course and course through distance learning then regular course is treated as the basic course irrespective of the cost involved.

**2.1.10 Second course:** If an individual is pursuing more than one course, then the basic course is taken as the first course in the way suggested above. After the first course is selected then from the remaining courses, the course which involves highest cost is taken as the *second course*.

**2.1.11 Academic session:** The academic session is defined in relation to the duration of the course in which one is enrolled in the following manner -

- i) If duration of the course is less than one year, the academic session covers the full duration of the course,
- ii) If duration of the course is more than one year, then generally at the end of every year there is an evaluation process through examination or otherwise, the passing of which enables the individual for to continue the course further. In such cases, the academic session is of 1 year. For the educational institutions pursuing three to six months semester system, too, academic session is taken as one year.

**2.1.12 Nature of institution:** This refers to whether the institution is recognised or not. A recognised school/ institution is one in which the course(s) of study followed is/ are prescribed or recognised by the government or a university or a board constituted by law or by any other agency authorised in this behalf by the central or state government.

**2.1.13 Type of institution:** This refers to the type of management by which the institution is run. It may be run by government or a local body or a private body either receiving or not receiving government aid. Thus, the four types are: (a) government, (b) local body, (c) private aided and (d) private unaided. All schools/ institutions run by central and state governments, public sector undertakings or autonomous organisations completely financed by government are treated as government institutions. All institutions run by municipal corporations, municipal committees, notified area committees, zilla parishads, panchayat samitis, cantonment boards, etc., are treated as local body institutions. A private aided institution is one which is run by an individual or a private organisation and receives maintenance grant from a government or a local body. A private unaided institution is one which is managed by an individual or a private organisation and is not receiving maintenance grant either from a government or from a local body.

**2.1.14 Free education:** Education is free of tuition fee in government schools in most of the states and also in private schools in some states up to certain levels of education. There are some schools where students up to a certain level are not required to pay tuition fees. Nevertheless, a fixed sum of money has to be paid such as development fee, library fee, etc. Education in such schools is still considered to be free. This applies to the institution as a whole and not to the specific situation obtaining for the student.

**2.1.15 Exemption from tuition fees:** This refers to exemption from payment of tuition fees granted to some students on some special consideration in those institutions where it is reported that the education is not free. The exemption may be full or partial.

**2.1.16 Private expenditure on education:** It is the sum total of all the expenditures incurred by the student on education (towards fees, books & stationery, uniform, transport, private coaching, study tours, etc.). This include all the expenditures incurred and/or to be incurred during the **current academic year/session** on the education of the household members, aged 5-29 years who are currently attending at primary level and above.

**2.1.17 Attendance and enrolment:** The current attendance status refers to whether a person is currently attending any educational institution or not. While every person, who is attending an educational institution, is necessarily enrolled in that institution, it may so happen that a person, who is enrolled is not currently attending the institution. While most of the official educational statistics are based on enrolment, NSSO survey, because of its household approach, bases its analysis on the current attendance status.

**2.1.18 Drop-out/ discontinuance:** An ever-enrolled student currently not pursuing the education may be due to either: (i) he/ she has discontinued after completing the last level of education for which he/ she was enrolled or (ii) he/ she has discontinued education before attaining a specific level. For the first category, for example, if a person has completed the middle level but does not enrol for the next higher level of education, he/ she is not considered as a 'drop-out'. It is considered as a case of 'discontinuation'. However, if the person enrols for the secondary level but does not complete it, then he/ she is considered a 'drop-out'. For this survey, 'drop-outs' and 'discontinuations' are treated alike.

**2.1.19 Usual activity status:** The usual activity status relates to the activity status of a person during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. The activity status on which a person spent relatively longer time (major time criterion) during the 365 days preceding the date of survey is considered the *usual principal activity status* of the person.

## 2.2 Some concepts/ indicators used in the report:

**2.2.1 Literacy rate:** Percentage of literates in a population is taken as its literacy rate.

**2.2.2 Adult literacy:** Literacy rate for population of age 15 and above.

**2.2.3 Decile class of MPCE:** In the distribution of population of any domain by MPCE level, the first decile is the level of MPCE below which 10% of the population lie, the second decile, the

level below which 20% of the population lie, and so on. Thus the population can be divided into 10 decile classes (%) of MPCE: from 0 to the first decile (called 0-10%), from the first decile to second decile (called 10-20%), and so on. Averages of other variables of interest, computed separately for the 10 decile classes, help to portray the variation in the variable with the behaviour of MPCE. In this round decile classes are used in all-India tables separately for rural sector, urban sector and for rural and urban sectors combined.

**2.2.4 Quintile class of MPCE:** Similarly, the population of a domain can be divided into five quintile classes of MPCE. The first quintile of MPCE means the level of MPCE below which 20% of the population lie, the second quintile, the level below which 40% of the population lie, and so on. In this round quintile classes are obtained separately for rural sector, urban sector and for rural and urban sectors combined in each state.

**2.2.5 Educated persons:** Persons with completed education level secondary and above.

**2.2.6 Student:** A person in the age-group 5-29, who is currently attending formal education at primary level or above, is referred as 'student' in the discussion here.

**2.2.7 Gross attendance ratio (GAR):** For each class-group, this is the ratio of the number of persons in the class-group to the number persons in the corresponding official age-group. For example, for Class group I-V the ratio (in %), corresponding to normative age-group of 6-10, is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons attending Classes I-V}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

For the remaining class-groups of school education, i.e. VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII, the corresponding official age-groups are taken as 11-13, 14-15 and 16-17 respectively.

**2.2.8 Age-specific attendance ratio:** For each age-group this measure gives an idea of proportion of persons of a particular age-group currently attending educational institutions, irrespective of the level or class in which they are studying. For example, for age-group 6-10, this attendance ratio is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons in age-group 6-10 currently attending educational institutions}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

**2.2.9 Net attendance ratio:** For each education class-group, this is the ratio of the number of persons in the official age-group attending a particular class-group to the total number persons in the age-group. For example, for Class group I-V the ratio (in %) is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons of age 6-10 years currently attending Classes I-V}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

Similarly it can be obtained for the remaining class-groups of school education, i.e. VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII, with the corresponding official age-groups as 11-13, 14-15 and 16-17 respectively.

**2.2.10 Repeater:** A student is taken as a 'repeater', if he/ she reported present class attended to be the same as the previous class attended

### Chapter III

## Level of Education, Current Attendance & Enrolment Status

3.1.1 Information on the level of education attained was found for all the members of the selected sample households in the 64<sup>th</sup> round survey. The performance of the educational infrastructure, facilities and incentives provided by the Government, as well as the private sector, is studied through the current attendance status of the school and college going population. The focus of the survey was on the persons of age group 5-29, who formed the main target group of the survey. Information on their current attendance and enrolment status in educational institutions was collected. From the survey, detailed data on the nature of participation in education, various incentives availed of, and private expenditure incurred on education for persons aged 5-29 who were reported to be currently attending any educational institutions at primary or above levels was found.

3.1.2 In addition to the sizeable portion of the population who do not enter the education system at all, the education system is also characterised by high rate of early discontinuance of education. To study the extent of discontinuance and non-enrolment, those currently not attending any educational institution were also asked whether they had ever been enrolled, and if so, whether they had completed their education or discontinued midcourse, and what was the main reason for dropping out or for non-enrolment.

3.1.3 In the present chapter the discussion are mainly on

- ❖ Major survey findings on literacy and level of education of the population
- ❖ Current attendance and enrolment status of persons in the age group 5-29 years
- ❖ Distance of households to the nearest school having primary/middle/secondary level

## 3.2 Literacy and level of education of population


3.2.1 According to NSS definition, a person who can read and write a simple message in any language with understanding is considered as literate. Table 1 shows literacy rate for persons in different age groups during 2007-08. The proportions of literates among various age groups of the population, with rural-urban and male-female classification, serve as key indicators of the socio-economic progress of the country.

3.2.2 The survey estimates (Table 3.1) that in 2007-08, more than two-thirds (69.8%) of population of all ages were literate. Overall disparity in literacy existed due to the presence of rural-urban and male-female disparity. Of the population of age 15 and above, 71.8 % was found to be literate. Sector and sex wise adult literacy is shown in fig 3.1.




3.2.3 The highest level of education completed is reported for each member of the surveyed household after taking into consideration the education attained by her/him in general, technical and vocational stream. The levels of education include non-formal education, below primary, primary, secondary, higher secondary (HS), diploma/certificate courses, graduate level degree courses, post-graduate and above level degree courses. The distribution of population of age 15 and above across various levels of education is shown in Table 3.2.

3.2.4 The literates (71.8%) included 1.8 % who had no formal education and 11.3 % who had not completed primary level. The highest level of education successfully completed was primary for 21.4%, middle level for 19.8%, secondary for 8.4%, higher secondary (HS) for 3.7%, diploma for 0.3%, graduate for 4.5% and post graduate and above for the remaining 0.7% of the adult (15+ population). The proportion of persons having completed graduate (or above) level was only 1.1% among rural females, 3.5% among rural males, 10.9% among urban females and 16.9% among rural males. The distribution of population of age 15 years or more by completed level of education is shown in fig.3.2.



3.2.5 The distribution of adult literates of age 15 years and above by completed level of education is shown in Table 3.3. It is revealed from the table that the gender disparity was more pronounced in the rural areas than in the urban areas. The rural-urban and female-male disparity accentuate, with the increase in the level of education.



3.2.7 In the lowest decile class of MPCE , 49.9% of the population in the rural West Bengal were not literate. Even in the highest decile class, 15.4% persons were not literate In the urban West Bengal, 40.3% of the population in the lowest MPCE class was not literate. In the second lowest MPCE class the same figure was found. Following these, the proportion of not -literate persons decreased steadily to 3.3% in the richest decile class of MPCE. The sections of population which were economically disadvantaged were also disadvantaged on account of their education levels. The difference in literacy rates between lowest and highest decile class of MPCE was 35 percentage point in rural areas whereas the corresponding difference in urban areas was 37% (Fig 3.3)




### 3.3 Distance to nearest school having primary /middle/ secondary level classes

3.3.1 Distance to nearest school is one of the important factors that affect access to education and attendance. Table 3.5 shows that around 96 % of rural as well as urban households have a school with primary classes within 1 km distance. Sector wise availability of schools with middle or secondary level classes differed considerably (Fig. 3.4).

3..3.2 Table 3.6 indicates that the availability of primary schools at a distance less than 2 km was 100 % for the first three lower decile classes and sixth decile classes in the rural sector and second, third, fifth, sixth eighth decile classes in the urban sector. In case of both middle and secondary education, the range of disparity between the poorer and richer households was less compared to the urban sector.

3.4.2 34.8% of the population in the target age group (5-29) years was currently not enrolled in any educational institution, 12.1 % was enrolled but not attending and 53% were currently attending educational institutions. Around 3% gap remained between male and female attendance position in both rural and urban sector.

3.4.3 Variation in current participation and enrolment status of persons across economic levels is shown in Table 3.8. The proportions of persons in the age group 5-29 years, currently attending educational institutions, were 48.4% for the bottom 10 % of the population and 61.9% for the top 10%, ranked by MPCE in the rural sector and 46.9% for the bottom 10 % of the population and 75.8% for the top 10% ranked by MPCE in the urban sector. The proportion of persons currently enrolled but not attending was found to be significant, in general, indicating that the enrollment of the educational institutions include a good number of children who have discontinued attendance due to various reasons.

3.4.4 In this survey, information on social group and religion is collected at household level, all the members of the household being classified according to the religion and social group of the head of the household. Percentage distribution of population by current attendance and enrollment status is presented in Table 3.9 for persons belonging to different social groups and in Table 3.10 for persons belonging to various religious groups. The overall percentage of persons of age 5-29 years currently attending varied between 51.9% and 53.6% for different social groups and between 51.1% and 100% for different religious groups. The disparity among religious groups in this respect was greater in urban areas than in rural areas.

## Chapter IV

### Details of Participation and Expenditure in education

**4.1** The main beneficiaries of the formal education system are generally regarded to be in the age-group 5-29 years. Based on the survey, an analysis on participation in education, educational incentives and private household expenditure on education is given in this chapter.

#### 4.2 Current attendance

##### 4.2.1 Type of education

4.2.1.1 Education is broadly classified into three categories: (i) general education, (ii) technical and professional education and (iii) vocational education. In this survey, general education included school education at primary, middle, secondary and higher secondary level, and normal university education at graduate and post-graduate level. Technical or professional education included courses involving hands on training in addition to theoretical classes, viz. Engineering, Medicine, Agriculture, Management, Chartered Accountancy, Cost Accountancy, Computer courses of various levels and others. Vocational education covered courses imparting training in specific field through significant 'hands-on' exercises for acquiring necessary skill in order to create employment opportunity. Courses offered at ITIs, polytechnics, etc. were examples of vocational education. Also, information on type of education was collected separately for the 'major or basic course' and the 'second course'.

4.2.1.2 Percentage distribution of students aged 5-29 by type of education received through the major course attended is shown in Table 4.1. A high share of general education was found in both rural (around 100%) and urban (around 98%). The proportion receiving vocational education was 0.3% for rural students and 2.1% for urban students. The percentage of students pursuing vocational education was nil in

rural areas and only 0.1% in urban areas. A small fraction of students (0.03%) of students were reported to be attending a second course.

#### 4.2.2 Type of educational institution


4.2.2.1 Type of institution refers to the type of management of the educational institution. The types are (i) Government, (ii) local body, (iii) private body receiving aid from government and (iv) private body not receiving aid from the Government. The distribution of students by type of institution they attended (as reported by the surveyed household) at different levels of school education is given in Table 4.2 and Fig. 4.1.

4.2.2.2 In rural areas, around 84% of both primary and middle level students and around 85% of secondary and HS level students were attending Government schools. Schools run by local bodies accounted for 7 -8% students at all the levels. The remaining students were in private schools. In urban areas, the majority of the students attending Government school at all the levels were found.


4.2.2.3 Distributions of students by type of institution for different types of education are shown in Table 4.3 and Fig. 4.2. It is revealed that, in general, for technical and vocational education majority of the students were enrolled in the Government and local body institution. In rural areas, around 50% of the students in technical education were either in Government & local body or private aided institutions

#### 4.2.3 Nature of institution

4.2.3.1 In this survey, for the unaided private institutions, information was collected on the nature of the institution. Table 4.4 presents the percentage of students attending recognised or unrecognised institution at the primary or middle level. It is revealed that around 50 % of the students at the middle level were attending recognised institution. In this respect, rural –urban difference was wider at the middle level.

#### 4.3 Attendance Ratios

4.3.1 Enrollment ratios are important indicators giving an idea of the proportion of a population enrolled in educational institutions in most of the official educational statistics. In the present survey, household approach adopted have the advantage of being able to collect information on attendance, rather than that on enrolment, in the educational institutions. Therefore, instead of enrolment ratios, the corresponding attendance ratios are obtained.

**Gross attendance ratio (GAR):** For each class-group, this is the ratio of the number of persons in the class-group to the number persons in the corresponding official age-group. For example, for Class group I-V the ratio (in %), corresponding to normative age-group of 6-10, is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons attending Classes I-V}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

For the remaining class-groups of school education, i.e. VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII, the corresponding official age-groups are taken as 11-13, 14-15 and 16-17 respectively.

**Age-specific attendance ratio:** For each age-group this measure gives an idea of proportion of persons of a particular age-group currently attending educational institutions, irrespective of the level or class in which they are studying. For example, for age-group 6-10, this attendance ratio is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons in age gr.6-10 currently attending educational institutions}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

**Net attendance ratio:** For each education class-group, this is the ratio of the number of persons in the official age-group attending a particular class-group to the total number persons in the age-group. For example, for Class group I-V the ratio (in %) is

$$= \frac{\text{Number of persons in age gr.6-10 years currently attending Classes I-V}}{\text{Estimated population in the age-group 6-10 years}} \times 100$$

Similarly, it can be obtained for the remaining class-groups of school education, i.e. VI-VIII, IX-X and XI-XII, with the corresponding official age-groups as 11-13, 14-15 and 16-17 respectively.


4.3.2 Table 4.5 presents the gross attendance ratio by broad class group in any education. In the class group, class I-V, gender and sector wise gross attendance ratio was more than 100. For the class group, classes I-VIII which corresponds to elementary education as a whole gross attendance ratio was more than hundred.( Fig. 4.3)



4.3.2 The overall age-specific attendance ratio drops steadily from 92% in age-group 6-10 and 89% at age 11-13, to 65% for age 14-17, 18% for the age-group 18-24 and finally to only 1% for the age-group 25-29 (Table 4.6 & Fig.4.4). A high age-group attendance ratio might be due to a large number of persons actually studying in a lower class group than the desirable one, at their age.


4.3.3 Net attendance ratio overcomes the deficiencies of both gross attendance ratio and age specific attendance ratio. In the current survey net attendance ratio at XI-XII and post HS level were obtained by two methods: a) considering general education only and b) for all types of education combined. In West Bengal, as a whole, 92% children in the age-group for class I-V were reported to be attending. No major rural-urban or male-female disparity was found. (Table 4.7 and Fig. 4.5).

#### 4.4 Change in educational institution

4.4.1 In the survey, students currently attending were asked whether they had changed their educational institution during the last one year, and if so, on the nature of the change. It is revealed from the Table 4.8, at primary, middle and secondary level, more than 92% of the students did not report any change in institution.

#### 4.5 Proportion of repeaters in school education

4.5.1 A student was considered as a 'repeater', if he/ she reported present class attended to be the same as the previous class. Table 4.9 shows that among the class groups the proportion of repeaters was highest in the classes I-IV followed by the classes XI-XII.

4.6 In this survey information was obtained for each 'student' on various educational incentives received by them, viz.

- free education or tuition fee waiver,
- scholarship or stipend,
- subsidised books or stationery,
- mid-day meal,
- students' concession in public transport etc.

### 4.6.1 Free education and exemption from tuition fee

4.6.1.1 The proportion of students receiving these facilities (viz. free education and tuition fee exemption – fully or partly) among the students currently attending at various levels of school education is shown in Table 4.10

4.6.1.2 It is observed from the table, around 89% of rural students and about 72% of urban students attending primary level classes got free education. At middle level, education was free for 84% of rural and 66% of urban students. At secondary and higher secondary level, it was free for 77% of rural and 56% of urban students. The proportion receiving free education was higher among rural students compared to urban students.

4.6.1.3 Table 4.11 shows the proportion of beneficiaries of the educational incentives in different MPCE classes in rural and urban sectors. No general trend was observed, as one move along MPCE decile classes in rural and urban sectors for primary, middle, secondary and HS level.

#### 4.6.2 Other Incentives

4.6.2.1 Some students are awarded scholarships or stipends in cash as long as they continue their studies or are provided with free or subsidized books and/or stationary as educational incentives. Schools provide the students with mid-day meals or concession in public transport fare for the students. Table 4.12 shows the proportion of students who reported having availed themselves of these incentives.

4.6.2.2 Rural students benefited more from these incentives, especially in respect of scholarship, free subsidised books, mid-day meals from Government etc. Of the students of age 5-29 and pursuing general education, 4.3% received scholarships, 52.6% received free or subsidized books, 4.4% got free or subsidized stationery, 43% received mid-day meals and 2% got concession in public transport fare.

4.6.2.4 In Table 4.14, the proportions of beneficiaries are obtained separately for different levels of education. The percentage of students receiving free or subsidised books was as high as around 84% at primary level but only 29% at middle level, 6% at secondary/ HS level. The percentage receiving free mid-day meals was as high as around 79% at primary level but only 7% at middle level and 1% at secondary/ HS level. The percentage receiving scholarships was highest at the secondary level among all the educational levels. Only the use of public transport, and the percentage availing themselves of fare concessions in public transport, increased with the educational level.

4.6.2.5 It is revealed from the Table 4.15 that those institutions run by Government or local bodies received more incentives compared to those by private institutions. Around 42% of students in Government and local-body-run institutions got mid-day meals compared to 35% in aided private institutions and 8% in unaided private only. Difference across institution types was equally remarkable in case of free/subsidized

books. In case of concessional fares in public transport, less difference were found.

## C. Private Expenditure on Education

4.7 Individuals attending educational institutions incur expenditure in the form of payment of fees of different kinds (tuition fee, examination fee, other fees, etc.), purchase of books, stationery and uniforms, expenses on conveyance, private coaching, etc. This is referred to as private expenditure on education. In the current survey information on this has been obtained from all the persons in the age-group 5-29 years currently attending at primary level and above. For all the courses attended, related information on private expenditure on education incurred by the 'students' was collected in the survey.

### 4.8 Average expenditure on education

4.8.1 Table 4.16 shows the average annual expenditure in general, technical and vocational education and also for general education by level of current attendance for each sex and sector wise. At the primary level, the average annual expenditure in the urban sector (Rs. 2328) was more than three times than the rural average (Rs.770). The average expenditure at the middle, secondary /higher secondary and above higher secondary were Rs. 2377, Rs.4872 and Rs. 9065, respectively. The expenditure on vocational education was less than the expenditure at above-HS level in both the rural and urban sector. The expenditure on technical/professional education was more than three times the expenditure on vocational education in the rural sector.

#### 4.9 Components of private expenditure on education

4.9.1 The private education expenditure is comprised of different items of educational expenditure, viz. tuition fees, examination fees, other fees and payments, and expenditures on books, stationary, conveyance, private coaching etc. The average expenditure for each of the components by sex and sector wise are shown in Table 4.18. All the types and levels of education in major course are taken into account for estimating the average expenditure on different items. There is a huge difference in average amount spent on tuition fee, examination fee and other fees, between rural and urban sectors. Average expenditure on private coaching contributed 42% of total expenditure in the rural sector and 44% in the urban sector.

4.9.2 Table 4.19 indicates the proportion of students reporting expenditure on different items. It is found that 83% students had paid examination or other fees and 99% students had incurred some expenditure on books and stationary. There was wide variation between rural and urban sector in the proportion of students incurring expenditure on items like tuition fee, transport and uniform.

4.9.3 The shares of individual components in the average expenditure of students for each type of education and level of current attendance are shown in Table 4.20. One may observe that in technical education tuition fee, examination fee and other fees together claimed a much larger share in the total expenditure, than in general education and vocational education.

4.9.4 Table 4.21 gives the average expenditure per reporting student by item of expenditure for different types and levels of education. This differs from the average

expenditure per student shown in Table 4.20, because it is the average of the non-zero expenditures only. This makes the figures in Table 4.21 much higher than the corresponding figures in Table 4.20, especially for items such as tuition fee and private coaching.

4.9.5 In respect of levels of general education, average annual expenditure per student of age 5-29 years is presented in Table 4.22. At primary level, expenditure per student in urban areas was Rs. 2328, which is more than three times than that in rural areas and for urban students, tuition fee was around 53% of their total expenditure. The costs of transport, private coaching and examination fee per urban student was more than two times higher than that of rural students. The rural-urban expenditure difference reduces, as one move up to higher levels of education. This was also due to two-fold increase in expenditure per rural student, from middle (Rs. 1988) to secondary/ higher secondary (Rs. 4009) level. In urban areas the corresponding increase in expenditure per student was around 1.8 times, from Rs.4127 to Rs.7304.

4.9.6 Average annual expenditure (Rs.) per reporting student of age 5-29 years pursuing general education by item of expenditure and by type of institution is shown in Table 4.23. It is found that those who have paid tuition fee have spent Rs. 584, on an average, in institutions run by Government and local body, Rs. 1372 in private aided and Rs. 1351 in private unaided institutions. However on private coaching, students in these three types of institutions have spent on an average Rs. 1379, Rs. 1844 and Rs. 1987 respectively.

## Chapter V

### Non-enrolment and Discontinuance of Education

5.1.1 Non-enrolment and dropping out are the two critical issues that affect the education system. The discussion here will focus on persons of age 5 to 29 years who were not currently attending any educational institution according to the current survey. A section of them had never been enrolled in any educational institution and others had been enrolled at some point in the past, but were not currently attending any institution, *i.e.* either they had completed their desired level of education or because they could not complete education for some reason.


5.1.2 Table 5.1 indicates that around 11 % of the population in the age-group 5-29 years had not entered the education system through educational institution at all, while around 40% were found to have been enrolled at some time but currently not attending. In rural areas, the proportion of never enrolled was 12 %, while in urban areas it was 8 %. Around 14 % of females and 8% males of age group 5-29 years were never enrolled (Fig.5.1).

### 5.2 Non-enrolment in different age-groups


5.2.1 The percentage of never enrolled persons in different age-groups between 5 and 29 years with gender and sector specific details are furnished in Table 5.2. Percentage of never enrolled persons of age 5-29 years is shown graphically in Fig. 5.2. Among persons in the age-group 25 -29 years, around 26% in rural areas and around 14.5% in urban areas were found to have never been enrolled. Diminishing phenomenon of non-enrolment is found in both the sectors as one moves along the age-group 10-13, 14-17, 10-13 etc. The higher percentages of never enrolled children at age-group 10 and lower may be due to late entry into the educational system, particularly in the rural sector. The highest proportion of not enrolled persons in the lowest age-group reflects the fact that they were yet to join schools and might be joining educational institutions late. The percentage of ever enrolled persons (enrolled at some time in the past but currently not attending) includes persons at the upper age-group of the target population who might have completed education.

### 5.3 Non-enrolment and MPCE level


5.3.1 The behavior of proportion of never-enrolled with change in household living standards as measured by household monthly consumption expenditure (MPCE) is shown in Table 5.3. It is observed that the proportion of never-enrolled persons, considering all ages between 5 and 29, did not follow any specific pattern in both rural and urban sectors. In the poorest decile class, the percentage was around 23% and 18% and in the richest decile class, the percentage was around 3% and 2 % in the rural and urban West Bengal respectively.

5.3.2 The gender differentials in rural and urban West Bengal with the fall in the percentage of never-enrolled across MPCE decile classes is shown in Fig 5.3. The male-female differential was less marked in the urban sector than in the rural sector and narrowed in both rural and urban sectors, as one move along the MPCE classes. The incidence of never enrolment in this respect was more than 24 % for the first and second decile classes.



## 5.4 Reason for non-enrolment

5.4.1 The percentage distribution of never-enrolled persons of age-group 5-29 years given by major reason for non-enrolment for different categories of persons is shown in Table 5.4. From a specified list of reasons, only one reason, considered to be most important, was recorded for each never-enrolled person. Therefore, the reasons might not be mutually exclusive. The three most frequently given reasons for non-enrolment were a) parents not interested in education of their children (29.5%), b) financial constraints (21.3%) and c) education not considered necessary (28%). For both rural female and male, education not considered necessary was most commonly given as the reason for non-enrolment, while for both urban female and male parents not interested in studies was most commonly given reason for non-enrolment.

## B The education-discontinued population aged 5-29

5.5 The term 'discontinued (education)' is used to refer to a person who was enrolled at some time in the past but was currently not attending any educational institution at the time of survey. The persons temporarily not attending due to illness, vacation, etc., as well as those awaiting their results after completing a particular course, were also considered as 'currently attending' in this survey. Thus the category 'education-discontinued' consists of those whose education had started and also came to a stop before the date of survey (in the sense that it was unexpected to be resumed in the normal course).

### 5.5.1 The education-discontinued population: highest level of enrolment

5.5.1.1 The percentage distribution of all education-discontinued persons in the age-group 5-29 years by their level of last enrolment is presented in Table 5.5. Out of 1000 such students, 375 dropped out when they were enrolled at primary level, 330 at the middle level, 168 at secondary level, 55 at higher secondary level, and 43 when they were enrolled at graduation level. Little difference in the male and female distributions was found in the urban sector. The percentage of females in the rural sector who discontinued at primary level was higher than the percentage among rural males.

### 5.5.2 The education –discontinued population: desire for further education

5.5.2.1 The number of persons aged 5-29 who reported that they were last enrolled in that level when they discontinued education were broadly classified into three categories: a) who completed desired level of education, and among the rest, b) those who completed the last level of enrolment, and c) those who did not complete the last level and had to leave mid-course. It is revealed from the Table 5.6 that, among those (of age 5-29 years) who were enrolled in the past but were not attending at the time of the survey, 3% discontinued at various levels as they had completed their desired class/level of education. Out of the rest, 44% completed their level of last enrolment and 53 % did not complete their level of last enrolment.

### 5.5.3 The education-discontinued population : reason for discontinuance or dropping out

5.5.3.1 The percentage distribution of persons of age 5-29 years enrolled in the past but not currently attending by major reason for discontinuance is shown in Table 5.7. For each of the four categories of population, financial constraints had been the most common reason for dropping out (41.8%). It was 55.2% for urban males. For 12.9% of the rural female and 16% of the rural males the major reason was ‘child not interested in studies’. 15.8% of rural females and 11.6% urban females had to discontinue as their parents were not interested in their studies.

5.5.3.1 It is found that in both the cases of never enrolled and drop out, financial constraints was the major reason. The other reasons responsible are parents not interested in studies or child not interested in studies. It may be expected that financial compensations and other incentives may improve the situation.

## Appendix B

### Sample Design and Estimation Procedure

**1.0 Subject Coverage:** The 64<sup>th</sup> round (July 2007-June 2008) of NSS is earmarked for survey on ‘Employment-Unemployment and Migration’, ‘Participation and expenditure in Education’ and ‘Household Consumer Expenditure’. NSS 55<sup>th</sup> round (July 1999 – June 2000) and 49<sup>th</sup> round (January – June 1993) were the two latest rounds where migration was taken up as one of the subjects. Detailed information on education was collected for the last time in NSS 52<sup>nd</sup> round (July 1995 – June 1996), prior to which such information were collected during the 47<sup>th</sup> round of NSS (July – December 1991).

**2.0 Period of survey:** The period of survey is of one year duration starting on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2007 ending on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008. The survey period of these round are divided into four sub-rounds of three months.

- sub-round 1: July –September 2007
- sub-round 2: October –December 2007
- sub-round 3: January –March 2008
- sub-round 4: April –June 2008

In each of these four sub –rounds, equal number of sample villages / blocks (FSUs) have been allotted for survey with a view to ensuring uniform spread of sample FSUs over the entire survey period. Attempt has been made to survey each of the FSUs during the sub –round to which it is allotted.

**3.0 Schedules of enquiry:** During this round, the following schedules of enquiry are being canvassed:

- Schedule 0.0 : list of households
- Schedule 10.2 : employment & unemployment and migration particulars
- Schedule 25.2 : participation and expenditure in education
- Schedule 1.0 : household consumer expenditure

### 3. Sample Design

**3.1 Outline of sample design:** A stratified multi-stage design has been adopted for the 64<sup>th</sup> round survey. The first stage units (FSU) are the 2001 census villages (Panchayat wards in case of Kerala) in the rural sector and Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks in the urban sector. However, for the newly declared towns and out growths (OGs) in census 2001 for which UFS has not yet been done (i.e. non-UFS towns), each individual town/ OG is considered as an FSU. The ultimate stage units (USU) are households in both the sectors. In case of large FSUs i.e. villages/ towns/ blocks requiring hamlet-group (hg)/ sub-block (sb) formation, one intermediate stage is the selection of two hgs/ sbs from each FSU.

**3.2 Sampling Frame for First Stage Units:** *For the rural sector*, the list of 2001 census villages constitutes the sampling frame. *For the urban sector*, the list of latest available Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks and for non-UFS towns list of such towns/ OGs has been considered as the sampling frame.

**3.3 Stratification:** Within each district of a State/ UT, generally speaking, two basic strata have been formed: i) rural stratum comprising of all rural areas of the district and (ii) urban stratum comprising of all the urban areas of the district. However, within the urban areas of a district, if there are one or more towns with population 10 lakhs or more as per population census 2001 in a district, each of them have been formed a separate basic stratum and the remaining urban areas of the district is considered as another basic stratum.

#### 3.4 Sub-stratification:

**3.4.1 Rural sector:** If ‘r’ be the sample size allocated for a rural stratum, the number of sub-strata formed was ‘ $r/4$ ’. The villages within a district as per frame have been first arranged in ascending order of population. Then sub-strata 1 to ‘ $r/4$ ’ have been demarcated in such a way that each sub-stratum comprises a group of villages of the arranged frame and has more or less equal population.

**3.4.2 Urban sector:** If ‘u’ be the sample size for a urban stratum, ‘ $u/4$ ’ number of sub-strata have been formed. The towns within a district, except those with population 10 lakhs or more and also the non-UFS towns, have been first arranged in ascending order of population. Next, UFS blocks of each town have been arranged by IV unit no.  $\times$  block no. in ascending order. From this arranged frame of UFS blocks of all the towns, ‘ $u/4$ ’ number of sub-strata has been formed in such a way that each sub-stratum has more or less equal number of FSUs.

For towns with population 10 lakhs or more, the urban blocks have been first arranged by IV unit no.  $\times$  block no. in ascending order. Then ‘ $u/4$ ’ number of sub-strata has been formed in such a way that each sub-stratum has more or less equal number of blocks.

All non-UFS towns, if available in a district and exceeded a certain minimum number, formed one separate stratum within the district. Hence, there are separate stratum numbers for UFS towns and non-UFS within a district. No sub-stratification has been done for non-UFS towns. However, sub-stratum number for all sample non-UFS towns has been given as 1 for uniformity.

**3.5 Total sample size (FSUs):** 12688 FSUs for central sample and 13600 FSUs for state sample have been allocated at all-India level.

**3.6 Allocation of total sample to States and UTs:** The total number of sample FSUs is allocated to the States and UTs in proportion to population as per census 2001 subject to a minimum sample allocation to each State/ UT. While doing so, the resource availability in terms of number of field investigators has been kept in view. The total number of FSUs allocated for West Bengal was 880.

**3.7 Allocation of State sample to rural and urban sectors:** State sample is allocated between two sectors in proportion to population as per *census 2001* with 1.5 weightage to urban sector subject to the restriction that urban sample size for bigger states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu etc. has not exceeded the rural sample size. A minimum of 8 FSUs has been allocated to each state/ UT separately for rural and urban areas. Further the State level allocation for both rural and urban has been adjusted marginally in a few cases to ensure that each stratum gets a minimum allocation of 4 FSUs. The total number of FSUs allocated for West Bengal was 552 for the rural sector and 328 for the urban sector

**3.8 Allocation to strata:** Within each sector of a State, the respective sample size is allocated to the different strata in proportion to the stratum population as per census 2001. Allocations at stratum level have been adjusted to a multiple of 4 with a minimum sample size of 4.

**3.9 Selection of FSUs:** From each sub-stratum of a district of rural sector, four FSUs have been selected with Probability Proportional to Size With Replacement (PPSWR), size being the population as per census 2001. For urban sector, from each sub-stratum four FSUs have been selected by using Simple Random Sampling Without Replacement (SRSWOR) for UFS towns and by PPSWR in case of non-UFS towns with size being the population as per Census 2001. Within each sub-stratum, samples have been drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples in both the rural and urban sectors.

### 3.10 Selection of hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks/ households

3.10.1 Large FSUs having approximate present population of 1200 or more is divided into a suitable number (say, D) of ‘hamlet-groups’ in the rural sector and ‘sub-blocks’ in the urban sector as stated below.

3.10.2 Two hamlet-groups (hg)/ sub-blocks (sb) are selected from a large FSU wherever hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks have been formed, by SRSWOR. Listing and selection of the households are done independently in the two selected hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks to be described as sample hg/ sb 1 and 2. The FSUs without hg/ sb formation will be treated as sample hg/ sb number 1.

#### 4. Formation of Second Stage Strata and allocation of households

If a household is selected for more than one schedule only one schedule is canvassed in that household in the priority order of Schedule 10.2, Schedule 25.2 and Schedule 1.0 and in that case the household is replaced for the other schedule. If a household is selected for Schedule 10.2 it is not selected for Schedule 25.2 or Schedule 1.0. Similarly, if a household is not selected for Schedule 10.2 but selected for Schedule 25.2 it is not selected for Schedule 1.0.

The overall estimate  $\hat{Y}$  at the State level is obtained by summing the stratum estimates  $\hat{Y}_s$  over all strata belonging to the State/ UT/ all-India.

## 6.6 Estimates of Ratios:

Let  $\hat{Y}$  and  $\hat{X}$  be the overall estimate of the aggregates Y and X for two characteristics y and x respectively at the State.

Then the combined ratio estimate ( $\hat{R}$ ) of the ratio ( $R = \frac{Y}{X}$ ) will be obtained as

$$\hat{R} = \frac{\hat{Y}}{\hat{X}}.$$
