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: F O R E W O R D :

Singhbhum district of Bihar forms the southern part of the Chotanagpur plateau and is bounded by Bengal and Orissa. Situated at a height of 244 Meters above the sea level has an area of 13,440 Sq. K. M. and comprises of five administrative subdivisions namely, Chaibasa, Dhalbhum, Seraikella, Ghatsila and Chakradharpur with district headquarters at Chaibasa. The district is full of hills alternating with valleys, steep mountains, deep forests on the mountain slopes and in the river basins some stretches of comparatively level or undulating land. This district contains one of the best Sal forests and the Saranda forest area is known world over. Scenically it is beautiful with water holes and also contains wild life with elephants predominating.

Minerally Singhbhum is a very rich district containing Iron Ore, Manganese, Lime Stone, Uranium,

Copper and other minerals including gold. This has led to development of an extremely industrialised city at Jamshedpur which at present is the administrative headquaters of the subdivision of Dhalbhum.

Culturally also it has a very rich heritage and the 'Chhau' Dance of Seraikella and Kharswan patronised by the erstwhile Seraikella and Kharsawan Estate has achieved world acclaim and is accepted now as one of the classical forms of dance. The district perhaps derives its name from the patronymic of Raja of Porahat to whom the north of the district was once subject but another theory is that the name is a corruption of Sing Bonga, the principal God of the Hos, tribals of Singhbhum district. The area falling under the Sadar Subdivision and the Chakradharpur Subdivision is known as Kolhan and Porahat area. This area developed a different revenue system whereby the Mankis and Mundas of the village and the Pirs has been acting as the

Principal revenue agents of the Government. This system still continues in this particular area. The major tribes in this district are the Hos, the Santhals, Bhumij with Oraons and Mundas in areas bordering Ranchi.

This little booklet has been printed to give a glance at the district and act as ready hand book for reference. I am grateful to the different Government departments for extending their co-operation in publishing the booklet. I would also be grateful for suggestions to improve the contents in future publications.
