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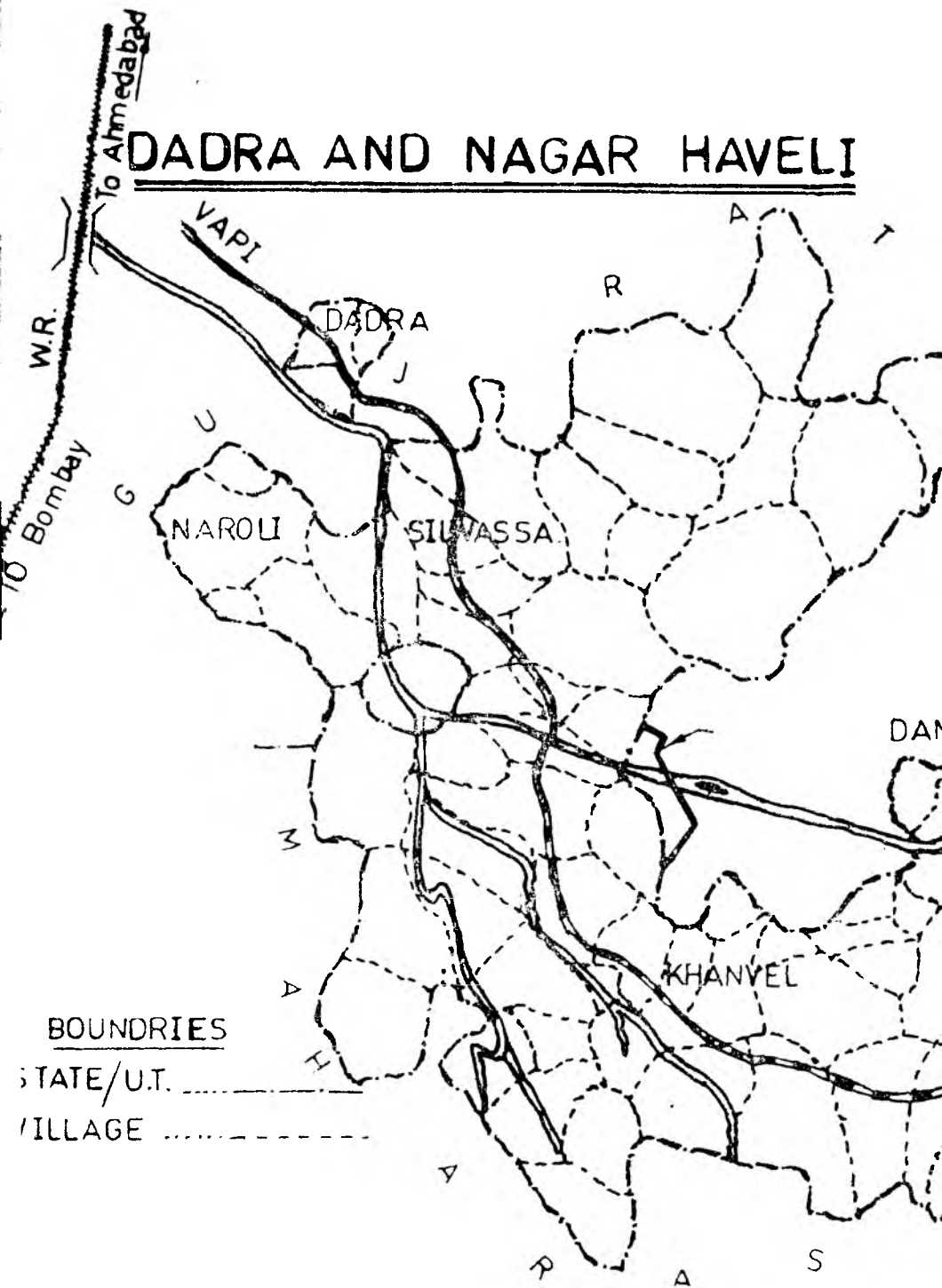

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# DADRA AND NAGAR HAVELI



P R E F A C E

Though planned development under Five Year Plan Programme was started late in this Union Territory i.e. from 4th Five Year Plan 1969—70 only, the Union Territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli which is predominantly inhabited by tribals have made tremendous progress in socio—economic fields after its liberation on 2nd August, 1954 from the Portuguese yoke. Keeping in view the keen interest of the users for statistical data in respect of development made by this Union Territory in different socio-economic fields and inter State comparability, this publication entitled "Socio-economic Development of Dadra and Nagar Haveli since Liberation" has been brought out by the Statistical wing of the Administration. Though such data have been furnished to the various Departments of Ministry of Government of India and other organisations for their periodical statistical publications, this publication provides in a nutshell the broad contours of important developments made upto 1985, in comparison to those obtaining at the time of liberation of this Territory. This is the first issue of the brochure and will be published as a continuous series annually on the liberation day of this Union Territory i.e. on 2nd August.

This statistical brochure is compiled by Shri Faquir Chand, Statistical Officer and his staff.

**UNION TERRITORY  
ADMINISTRATION OF DADRA AND NAGAR HAVELI**

Dadra and Nagar Haveli is a small Union Territory having an area of 491 Sq. Km. Small is beautiful and so is Dadra and Nagar Haveli with 40% area under forest and about 80% population consisting of colourful tribals. The Territory consists of two pockets namely Dadra and Nagar Haveli. There are 72 villages, of which 3 are in Dadra. The Territory is located between Gujarat and Maharashtra and about 30 Kms. away from west coast. Nearest Railway Station is at Vapi, which is about 15 Kms. from Silvassa, the head quarter of the Union Territory. Silvassa is situated midway between Bombay and Surat. Dadra and Nagar Haveli is linked with National Highway No. 8

Dadra and Nagar Haveli was born on 17th December, 1779 as a result of the treaty between Portuguese and Marathas. The Marathas assigned 72 villages to Portuguese in return of their friendship and the group of 72 villages came to be known as Dadra and Nagar Haveli. The Portuguese ruled the Territory until its liberation in the year 1954. After liberation, the Administration of Dadra and Nagar Haveli was carried on by local body as Free Dadra and Nagar Haveli Administration till its merger with the Indian Union on the 11th August, 1961. The Union Territory has no legislature.

## ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

Dadra and Nagar Haveli is a uni-District Administration. Collector is the Head of all Departments in the Union Territory Administration. Lt. Governor, Goa, Daman and Diu is the Administrator of Union Territory Administration of Dadra and Nagar Haveli. The Territory is divided into 10 Patelads. Each patelad has a Group Gram Panchayat, consisting of elected members. There is a Varishtha Panchayat as an apex body. Varishtha Panchayat plays advisory role only so far as Administration of this Union Territory is concerned.

The Territory is predominantly inhabited by tribals (78.82%) and hence entire developmental efforts are geared to the development of tribal populace.
