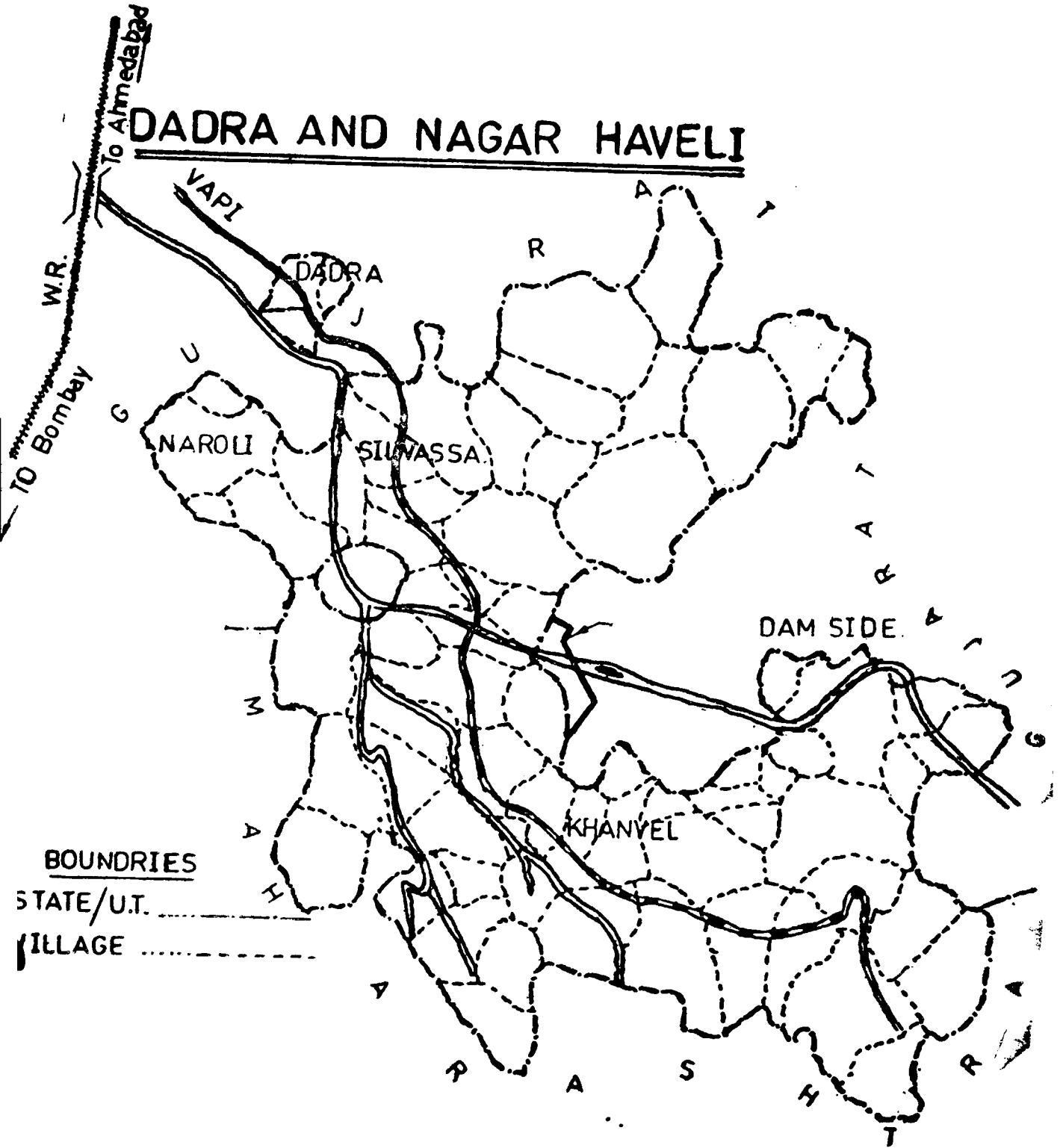

## F O R E W O R D

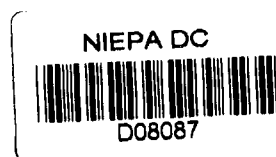

UNION TERRITORY OF DADRA AND NAGAR HAVELI

The Union territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli is situated on the western coast of India between the parallels of  $20^{\circ}-0'$  and  $20^{\circ}-25'$  of latitude North and between the meridian  $72^{\circ}-50'$  and  $73^{\circ}-15'$  of longitude. It has an area of 491.0 Sq.Km. as per the Surveyor General of India, and comprises of two enclaves, viz., Dadra and Nagar Haveli, having 72 villages of which Silvassa, the capital of Dadra and Nagar Haveli, is treated as non- statutory Census town. The territory is surrounded on the west, north and east by Valsad District of Gujarat and in the south, and south east by Nasik and Thana District of Maharashtra. It has a hilly terrain specially towards the north-east and east where it is surrounded by the ranges of Sahyadri mountains (Western Ghats). The terrain <sup>is</sup> intersected by the river Daman Ganga and three tributaries. The river rises in the ghat 64 Km from the coast and discharges itself in the Arabian Sea at the port of Daman. The climate is moderate and generally healthy in the central zone though hot during summer. The rainy season is normally from June to September. The union territory receives an average rainfall between 2000 to 2500 mm. per year.

The nearest Railway station is Vapi which is about 15 Km. away from Silvassa. Dadra and Nagar Haveli is linked with National Highway No.8.

(ii)

Dadra and Nagar Haveli was born on 17th December, 1779 as a result of the treaty between Portuguese and Marathas. The Marathas assigned 72 villages to Portuguese in return of their friendship and the group of these 72 villages came to be known as Dadra and Nagar Haveli. The Portuguese ruled the territory until its liberation in the year 1954. After liberation on 2nd August, 1954, the Administration of Dadra and Nagar Haveli was carried on by local body as Free Dadra and Nagar Haveli Administration till its merger with the Indian Union on 11th August, 1961. Consequently, the Free Nagar Haveli Administration was succeeded by a formal statutory Administration headed by an Administrator.

Dadra and Nagar Haveli comprising of 72 villages including Silvassa- the Census Town form a single district and single taluka Union territory. All the villages have been divided into 10 Patelads for revenue purpose. Each Patelad has a Group Gram Panchayat, consisting of elected members. The U.T. has no legislature. However, there is a Pradesh Council who plays an advisory role so far as Administration of this U.T. is concerned.

H.E.Shri K.S.Baidwan is the present Administrator who is assisted by the Development Commissioner, the Finance Secretary, the Collector and other Departments in day to day Administration.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

### I. DEMOGRAPHIC INDICATORS

The indicators viz. Birth rates, death rates, Infant Mortality rates etc., have been worked out by the Statistical Department of the Administration from the data collected under "Civil Registration System."

### II. AGRICULTURE

(a) Data on Irrigation Potential created by the Government have been supplied by the Irrigation deptt. and those in private sector have been furnished by the Agriculture department. Total Irrigation Potential has been worked out on the basis of these sources.

(b) The area under HYV is calculated on the basis of the quantity of seeds distributed by the Agriculture Department. The information refers to the Agriculture year 1992-93.

(c) Cereal crops include Paddy, Ragi, Wheat, Jowar, Maize, and small millets. The pulses include Tur, Gram, other Kharif Pulses such as Udid, Kudid, Chaula and Rabi Pulses lang, Moong, Val.

The Oil-Seeds cover the major Oil-Seeds like nigerseeds, mustard, castor seeds and groundnut.

Figures of Area under crops are supplied by the Agriculture Department.

The data on area and production of crops refer to the agriculture year 1992-93. Figures of Irrigation Potential created through the Government/Private are upto date. However, utilisation of the same is shown by the 'net irrigated' which refer to the aforesaid agriculture year.



Irrigated area include the area irrigated through canals hence it is on higher side compared to Irrigation Potential Created. The figures of 'net and gross area irrigated' are supplied by the Agriculture Department.

### III. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

Figures of Live Stock wealth namely 'cross breed cattle and buffaloes' are obtained from the Animal Husbandry Department. Data on Milk and Eggs production are based upon the methodology adopted by the same deptt. and related to the year 1992-93. The information on biogas plants is upto date i.e. total plants installed since the inception of the scheme.

### IV. FOREST

Figures of area under plantation and number of trees planted refer to the period from 1982 to March, 1993 under 20. Point Programme.

### V. INDUSTRY

Number of small scale industries include villages and cottage industry, Khadi industry. All figures under this item pertain to the financial year 1992-93.

### VI. EDUCATION

Data on Education indicates the upto date position except literacy rate which is based upon 1991 Census. (Final Results)

### VII. HEALTH

The data has been collected from the Medical and Health Department of the Administration.

VIII. & IX. BANKING AND COOPERATION

Data in respect of Scheduled Banks/ Cooperative Banks has been collected from individual Bank Offices and also from the Lead Bank Office.

X TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

While data on road length are furnished by the Public Works Department, those of 'Vehicles, frequency of bus routes etc. have been collected from the Registering and Licensing Authority (R.L.A.) of the Administration. Information on Post Offices are collected from the Post Office, Silvassa.

XI. IRRIGATION AND POWER

Hundred percent electrification of villages (67 villages out of 72) has been shown as the villages coming under submergence of Daman Ganga Reservoir Project have not been taken into account. The information has been obtained from the P.W.D. (Elect. Division). Data on irrigation indicate the total potential as on 31.3.93 in the Territory. The Potential created under Govt. Sector are reported by the P.W.D. (Irrigation), Whereas the same in Private Sector are reported by the Development and Planning Office.

XII. RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Data on construction of wells have been collected from the P.W.S. (Water Supply) and Development and Planning Office. No. of IRDP families pertain to the period from 1982 onwards (i.e. since the inception of 20 Point Programme).

XIII. HOUSING

The figures indicating 'Assistance provided for construction/renovation assistance of houses are for the years 1981 to March, 1992 as the

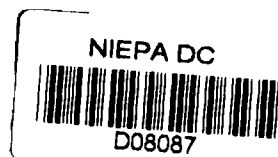
scheme was introduced in 1981. The data on construction of houses pertain to the years 1976-77, 1977-78 and 1986-87 to March, 1993 (Under Indira Awas Yojana). The information of House-sites are collected from the Statistical Department.

The details of other items are self explanatory.
