It presents the status of Education in Andhra Pradesh and its relative position in India. It also aims to present the inter-district variation. An attempt has been made to give the data both in statistical as well as graphic form. It is hoped that this volume will be of use to policy makers, administrators as well as researchers. It is requested that comments and further advice may kindly be communicated to Sri V.Krishnamacharyulu, Director, State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), Fateh Maidan Road, Hyderabad - 500 001. This attempt should indeed be considered only as a draft as it is proposed to improve this volume further. The next version is expected to contain the details about the various programmes as also the innovations in Education both official as well as the contributions made by the Non-Government Organisations. To this end, it is requested that details of such efforts and contributions be sent immediately to the Director, SCERT at the above address.

I must compliment the officers and staff of the Directorate of School Education and the SCERT in bringing out this volume.

The Education department is shortly planning to bring out district-wise booklets detailing the data on education mandal-wise so as to be of help to various people in the districts including the peoples' representatives. The drafts of these volumes will be communicated to the respective District Collectors before they are finalised.

INTRODUCTION

This is an attempt to meet the needs of a diverse group of people consisting of policy makers, senior level administrators and researchers. The document is prepared with the following objectives in view:

1. To compare the position of Andhra Pradesh with India with respect to population growth and literacy.
2. To compare the literacy of Andhra Pradesh with South Indian states.
3. To understand the historical trends in the behaviour of key educational indicators like literacy rates, institutions, enrolment of students, teachers etc. in all the 23 districts.
4. To understand the level of inputs and achievements of important programmes of educational development like the education of the physically handicapped and non-formal education.
5. To understand the drop-out rates, gross enrolment ratio, teacher-pupil ratio in all the 23 districts of Andhra Pradesh.

The main feature of the volume is that it presents the basic data as well as the illustrations together. The former is achieved with the help of data tables, the latter through graphs and maps. In this volume, no attempt has been made to analyse, describe and draw conclusions based on the trend analysis and graphic presentations.

Before presenting the educational data, the historical trends in the growth of population and its density, district wise, in Andhra Pradesh vis-a-vis India have been presented. The areas of concentration of S.C. and S.T. population have also been depicted through separate maps.

The second section deals with the progress of literacy in Andhra Pradesh. District- wise literacy rates for male, female have been presented. A number of maps based on 1991 census have also been included in this section. The data presented in maps and diagrams highlight the changing profile of literacy.

The growth of formal and non-formal education is given in the third section. There are 49,247 Primary schools, 6,341 Upper primary schools and 7,145 High schools. Distribution of schools by the type of management (Govt., Local-bodies, Private aided and unaided) is also depicted. The percentage change in the number of Primary, Upper Primary and High schools over the decade also is given in this section.

The fourth section presents the increase in the number of teachers at Primary, Upper Primary and High school level. The growth of teachers is then viewed in comparison to the growth of enrolment through teacher- pupil ratio. District-wise teacher-pupil ratio for the year 1993-94 is presented.

The section on enrolment begins by presenting the data on the growth of enrolment for the last four decades. In view of increasing coverage at various levels, the comparative structure of class-wise enrolment for 1986 and 1993 is given. Enrolment in class I for the last 16 years has also been presented. The other important aspects of the enrolment, gross enrolment ratio, drop-out rates at Primary, Upper primary and High school level are also presented. Finally the trend in the expenditure on education has been presented.

DEMOGRAPHY

Andhra Pradesh with a population of 665 lakhs (1991) and 2.75 lakhs sq.km. of area accounts for 7.9% of the country's population and 8.4% of the area of the country respectively. The Scheduled Castes population numbering 106 lakhs in the state is widely distributed across the geographical space and accounts for 15.93% of the total population of Andhra Pradesh and the population of Scheduled Tribes in the state with 42 lakhs accounts for 6.31% of the total population.

The growth rate of population during the year 1981-1991 is 24.20 in the state as against 23.85 in the country. The decadal growth rate shows a slight upward trend from 23.10 in 1981 to 24.20 in 1991.

The density of population has increased from 195 per sq.km. in 1981 to 242 in 1991. The districts with high density of population are West Godavari(454), Krishna (424) and East Godavari (420). The urban district of Hyderabad has the highest density of population viz., 14,499 while Adilabad district has the least density of population viz., 129.

GROWTH OF POPULATION 1901 - 1991











POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS INDIA vs ANDHRA PRADESH


GROWTH RATE




BIRTH RATE











DENSITY OF POPULATION



INDIA VS ANDHRA PRADESH RURAL AND URBAN POPULATION



DISTRIBUTION OF SCHEDULED CASTES POPULATION



DISTRIBUTION OF SCHEDULED TRIBES POPULATION







AREA, POPULATION AND DENSITY OF POPULATION, 1991



(DISTRICTS)**



(DISTRICTS)



(DISTRICTS)**






LITERACY RATES OF ANDHRA PRADESH VS SOUTHERN STATES 1991

LITERACY RATES IN ANDHRA PRADESH 1901-1991



LITERACY RATES OF ANDHRA PRADESH (Caste wise) 1991





(DISTRICTS)**







NUMBER OF PRIMARY SCHOOLS - MANAGEMENT WISE (1993-94)



NUMBER OF UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOLS - MANAGEMENT WISE (1993-94)





PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN 1993-94 OVER 1982-83



PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN 1993-94 OVER 1982-83















ESTIMATED POPULATION OF HANDICAPPED CHILDREN IN ANDHRA PRADESH (1993)





ENROLMENT IN ANDHRA PRADESH 1956-57 to 1993-94



ENROLMENT IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS (1993 - 94)



ENROLMENT IN UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOLS (1993 - 94)



ENROLMENT IN HIGH SCHOOLS (1993 - 94)



CLASS I - ENROLMENT FROM 1977-78 TO 1993-94













(SCHEDULED CASTES 1993-94)**



(SCHEDULED TRIBES 1993-94)**





(SCHEDULED CASTES 1993-94)**





CLASSES I - V 1993-94



DROP-OUT RATES - SCHEDULED CASTES CLASSES I - V 1993-94



CLASSES I - V 1993-94



CLASS I - VII 1993-94



CLASS - I to VII 1993-94








