C H A P T E R - 1

1.1 General Information:

The Nicobar District which came into existence in the year 1974 is the second District in the Territory and the Southern most District in the Country. The District consists of 19 Islands out of which 13 are inhabited. The number of census villages in the District as per 1981 census was 171 as against 491 in the State. There are two Tehsils and Two Blocks in the District namely Car Nicobar and Nancowrie. But for all practical purposes, however, the District is divided into three areas viz., Car Nicobar Island, Nancowrie group of Islands and Great Nicobar Island. Car Nicobar is the headquarter of the District. The District covers a total area of about 1841 Sq.Kms which is only 22.3% of the total area of the territory.

The population of Nicobar District in 1981 was 30,454 constituting only 16.1 percent of the territory's total population. The inhabitant of the District are predominantly members of the Scheduled tribes mainly the Nicobareese and the Shompans. The scheduled tribes formed almost 69.5 percent of the total population of the Districts, 11.2 percent of the total population of the state and 94.7 percent of the total tribal population of the territory. No area has been classified as 'Urban' in the District and as such all the population lives in rural areas. Males represented 55.2 percent and females 44.8 percent. The number of females per 1000 males was 811 as against 760 in the territory. The density of population in the District was 17 persons per sq.Km. compared to the State density of 23 per sq.Km. The decadal growth rate in population from 1971 to 1981 was 40.57 compared to the state

rate of 63.93. The literacy rate for the District was 38.2 as against the State literacy rate of 51.56. The female literacy was 29.3 percent while that of males it was 47.1 percent.

There is hardly any large scale industry in the District. About 26 small scale Industrial units have been set up by the Industries Department under the sector Village and Small Industries. The main industrial units set up are Food based industries, Agro based industries, Wood based industries, marine based industries, Coir industry centre has also been set up recently. The centre although the District has abundant plantation and marine resources, conditions exist in the District are entirely different from that of other states. Coconut and Arecanut are the major plantation crops.

1.2 Fifth All India Educational Survey:

Three Educational Surveys were so far conducted in the territory- the 3rd All India Educational Survey, 1973, the 4th All India Educational Survey, 1978 and the 5th All India Educational Survey, 1986 which is more elaborate and detailed than the previous surveys. The previous surveys were conducted with the main objective of identification of Rural habitation and the provision of educational facilities. These surveys also attempted to collect information in physical and other facilities available in the schools. The Vth Survey came at a time when the implications of the scheme Operation Black-board were being spelt out on what constitute a minimum requirement of a school for efficient and effective working. The Vth All India Educational Survey is aimed at a complete stock taking of the conditions prevailing in the schools as on 30.9.1986, which is the reference date of the survey. The main objectives of the survey are:- to assess the present position of educational facilities of various school stages, to assess the

availability of physical facilities like school building, playgrounds, drinking water etc., to assess the position of inputs like black-boards, chalk, library, laboratory etc., to know the academic and professional qualification of teachers and to prepare block maps showing habitations, existing and proposed educational facilities.

To fulfil these objectives, informations have been collected through structured questionnaires viz., the village information Form, and the school information form. 6 Schedules were canvassed in connection with the village Information Form and 17 Schedules in connection with school Information Form. As there is no urban area, the urban Information Form has not been canvassed in the District. Like the previous surveys, this survey is also confined to school stages only and that too for recognised ones.

The survey covered all the districts and blocks. One State Survey unit was set up at the State level under the guidance of state survey officer. This unit was responsible for providing academic and teaching guidance to the Deputy Education Officers, Assistant Education Officers and Heads of the Institutions for the smooth conduct of the survey in the District. No survey officers were appointed either at District or Block level. The survey operations for the entire territory were conducted at State level. The personnel of the state survey unit were the following:-

The Statistical Cell of the Directorate together with the Statistical Assistant from the zonal office helped in compilation and tabulation of the survey data.

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Dr.R.P.Rastogi, Dr K.N. Rao and Shri.M.K.Gupta from the NCERT assisted the State Unit in conducting training, scrutiny of forms, compilation and tabulation of the data.

The training programme for zonal officers, principals and Headmasters were organised at Car Nicobar on 5th March 87. Detailed instructions were given in this training how to fill up each columns of the proforma and the time schedule to be kept for distribution of forms to different schools and collection of filled-in forms from them. Questionnaires were canvassed in March 87 through the zonal officers, Principals and Head Masters. In Nancowry block, the questionnaires were canvassed through the Assistant Education Officer to the Heads of the schools as no training programme could be conducted at Nancowry due to lack of communication. The filled-in forms were later collected by the Education Officer, Car Nicobar and Assistant Education Officers Nancowry and Campbell Bay. In fact collection of data from all habitations and schools took considerable time in view of the remoteness of the area and lack of proper communication facilities. All the filled up forms were scrutinised and properly checked at the District Office at Car Nicobar and after satisfying by the Education Officer they were sent to the State unit. Sample checking of 25% Village Information Forms and School Information Forms were personally done by the State Survey Officer. The tabulation of the data at Block level and at District level was done by the State State Survey unit as there was no survey unit at the above levels.

The concepts of habitation and village followed during the course of survey are given below:-

Habitation:- A habitation is a cluster of house existing in a compact and contiguous manner with a local name. A village may have one or more than one habitation, except when it is a deserted/bechirag on Even a habitation with population less than 10 is also counted as a separate habitation.

Village:- Village means Census village. According to the census definition a village represents a parcel of land the boundaries of which are defined and settled by revenue survey.

Type of schools covered:

The Survey covered all the recognised schools in the District from pre-primary schools to Senior Secondary Schools. The different types of schools covered in the survey are as follows:-

Primary Schools	- 37

Number of Habitations, Villages, Towns and estimated Population.

According to the present survey there are 168 habitations and 162 inhabited villages in the District as against 565 habitations and 467 villages of the state. There is no town in the District as the only town in the State is in Andaman District. The estimated population of the District as on 30.9.86 is 36,462 and the total estimated population of the State is 2,52,186. The estimated child population in the District for the age-group 6-11 years is 4218 and in the age group 11-14 years is 2178 as against 38278 and 18792 of the State. Out of the 168 habitations 151 are predominantly populated by Scheduled Tribes. 111 habitations have population below 100, 35 habitations with population 399 to 100, 11 habitations with population 300 to 999 and the rest 11 habitations with population 1000 to 2999. There is no habitation in the District with population more than 3000. The number of habitations having population less than 10 comes to 12 in the District as against 22 of the state.

CHAPTER -II

PRIMARY EDUCATION

2.1

There are 168 habitations in the District (17 in Car Nicobar Block and 151 in Nancowrie Block). Out of this 111 habitations are having population less than 100, 31 habitations with population less than 300, 15 habitations with populations less than 1000 and the rest 11 habitations with a population of 1000 to 4999. Out of the 151 habitations in Nancowry Block, 110 are having population less than 100 and 30 are having population less than 300. 51 habitations (30.3 percent) in the District have been provided with Primary Schooling facilities within the habitation, 25 habitations (14.8 percent) within 1 KM 17 habitations (10.1 percent) within 2 KM. In other words 76 habitations in 45.2 percent of the total habitations are with primary schooling facilities upto 1 KM. Out of this 76 habitations, 31 habitations are having population less than 100. Amongst the Blocks, Car Nicobar Block is having 64.7 percent habitations with primary school/sections within the habitation, 82.3 percent upto 1 KM distance and 42.8 percent habitations above 1 KM distance. The corresponding coverage in Nancowry Block is 26.5 percent, 41.1 percent and 58.9 percent respectively.

2 In terms of population served, it is seen that 75.1 percent population is served by Primary schools/sections within the habitation, 85.4 percent population upto a distance of 1 KM and 14.6 percent population more than 1 KM, i.e., only 14.6 percent population are unserved by Primary schooling facilities in a walking distance of 1 KM. In the case of Blocks, the population covered by this facility within 1 KM in Car Nicobar block is 89.7 percent and that of Nancowry block it is 81.5, while the number of habitations uncovered by primary facilities in Nancowry block is 89. These habitations fall in the population slab below 100. The number of habitations unserved in population slab more than 300 is only one in the District, as 25 habitations out of 26

in the Population slab of 300 or more are served by Primary Sections upto a distance of 1 KM, which is to be covered in the remaining years. Provision of independent primary schools in habitations with population less than 100, not at all feasible. Non-formal Education Centres will serve the purpose in such habitations.

2.3 Villages according to proportion of scheduled tribes
Population and availability of Primary Schools in them.

Out of the 162 villages 153 villages are having scheduled tribe population of more than 75 percent. 46 villages of this have been provided with Primary schooling facilities. Of the 46 villages, 17 villages are with population more than 300 and 29 villages are with population less than 300. Thus 30% villages where proportion of scheduled tribe is more than 75 have been provided with primary schooling facilities i.e, 85% villages with population more than 300 and 21.8 percent villages with population less than 300. If we take the scheduled tribe habitations it is seen that 94.7% of the habitations are served by primary schools/sections upto a distance of 1 KM.

2.4 Schools:

There are 37 Primary Schools in the District. The number of schools having primary classes is 53. All the schools are being managed by the Government. There is no urban area in the District and as such all the schools are in rural.

2.5. School Buildings:

Out of 37 primary schools, only 19(51.3 percent) of them have pucca buildings and the rest 18(48.6 percent) are housed in Kutcha/thatched huts. All the Primary Schools in Car Nicobar block have pucca buildings.

2.6 Instructional Rooms:

Even though 18 schools are housed in Kutcha buildings and thatched huts there is no school in the District without class room for instructional purpose. Of the 37 Primary schools, 13 schools are with one class room, 4 schools with two class rooms, 8 schools with three classrooms, 1 school with four class rooms and 4 schools with five or more than five class rooms.

2.7 Additional Rooms:

14 Primary Schools in the District do not require additional class rooms, while 7 schools require one additional class room, 8 schools require two, 4 schools require three, 1 school require four and 3 schools require more than 5 class rooms.

2.8 Black Board Facilities:

There are about 186 sections in 37 Primary schools and of this only 108 sections have got usable blackboards and the rest 78 sections have got no blackboards. Among the blocks all the schools in Car Nicobar block have usable black boards. In the case of Nancowry Block, 52.8 percent sections are with unusable blackboards and 47.2 percent sections are without blackboards.

2.9. Other Facilities:

Of the 37 Primary Schools, 22 Primary schools (59.5 percent) are with drinking water facilities. 6 schools are having the facility of urinals and lavatory while 4 schools are having separate lavatory and urinal facilities for girls. Medical checkup and vaccination/Inoculation facilities exist in 16 schools.

2.10. Teachers:

There is no school in the District without teachers. However, there are 14 schools (37.8 percent) with one teacher in position. While 10 schools are with two teachers in

position only 4 school are there with three teachers. The number of schools with four teachers, five teachers and more than five teachers remain 3 each. In Car Nicobar Block there is no school with less than four teachers, as one school is with four teachers, 2 schools are with five teachers and the rest 1 school is with more than five teachers. In the case of Nancowry Block, the situation is not so favourable as provision of teaching staff in schools in this block is uneconomical, since the majority of schools come in the range of 10 and less than 10 pupils per teacher. Out of 33 schools in the block, 14 schools (42.42 percent) are with one teacher in position, 10 schools with two teachers, 4 schools with three teachers, 2 schools with four teachers, 1 school with five teachers and the rest 2 schools are with more than five teachers.

As regards teachers at the primary stage it is seen that there are 204 teachers teaching at this stage and out of this female teachers number 65 (31.8 percent) and male teachers number 139 (68.1 percent). Among these teachers, 194 teachers are trained and 10 teachers are untrained. The percentage of untrained male teachers is 5 percent while that of females it is 4.6 percent.

2.11. Enrolment:

The total enrolment at Primary stage is 5057 with a break up of 2738 boys (54.1 percent) and 2319 girls (45.8 percent). The number scheduled tribe students among them are 3108 which constitute 61.5 percent of the total enrolment as against the state percentage of 9.08. The break-up of Scheduled tribe boys and girls in these classes is 1661 and 1447 respectively. As regards the percentage of students in classes I-V who are in the age-group 6 to 11 years is 84.3 and that of boys and girls it is 87.4 and 80.9 percent respectively.

2.12. Indicators of Educational Development:

The estimated child population in the age-group 6-11 years is 4218. The gross enrolment ratio for the District is 119.89. This ratio for boys and girls is 123.8 and 115.6 respectively. This may be due to the fact that about 18 percent students in these classes are above 11 years of age and a little percentage is also below 6 years of age.

The age-specific enrolment ratio is 87.6 and for boys and girls the ratio is 89.8 and 85.2. This shows that out of 100 children in the age-group of 6-11 years 87 are in schools and out of 100 such boys 89 are in schools where as in the case of girls only 85 are in schools. As the age-specific ratio for the whole state is only 74.5 the position in respect of Nicobar District is comparatively better than the Andaman District.

The pupil teacher ratio for the District is 1:25 where as this ratio for the whole state is 1: 31.

The percentage of girls enrolment for Primary classes as a whole is 45.8 percent and among the scheduled tribes it is 28.6 percent.

CHAPTER-III

UPPER PRIMARY EDUCATION

Of the 168 habitations 17 habitations(6.5 percent) are served with an Upper Primary School/section within themselves. The number of habitations provided with upper primary facilities within 1 KM 10, and 11 each within 2 Kms and 3 Kms. This 49 habitations(29.2 percent) in the District are served with upper primary schooling facilities upto 3 Kms distance and in 119 habitation(70.8 percent) facility is available more than 3 Kms. Among the blocks it is seen that 94.1 percent habitations in Car Nicobar block has extended the facility within a walking distance of 3 Kms. In Nancowry Block this facility is available only in 21.8 percent habitations, In other words 70.2 percent habitations, out of 70.8 percent uncovered habitations in the District, are in Nancowry Block.

In terms of population schooling facilities are available to 51.4 percentage of the population within the habitation and to 77.2 % of the population upto a distance of 3 Kms. The percentage of population served with this facility in the state is only 73.6%. Only 22.8 percent population in the district are not having the facility within 3 Kms. In Car Nicobar Block schooling facilities are available to 64.3% of the population within the habitation and to 99.7% of the population upto a distance of 3 Kms. In Nancowry Block, 43 percent population are not served by schooling facilities upto 3 Kms distance as 56.9 percent population is only served by this facility upto 3 Kms distance. This is because majority of the habitations in Nancowry Block are sparsely populated and fall in the population slab below 100. If we take the number of habitations in the population range of 500 or more we can see that out of the 22 habitations 21 habitations(95.5%) are served by upper primary schools/sections upto 3 Kms distance.

3.2 It may be seen from the above para that 49 habitations (33 in Nancowry Block and 16 in Car Nicobar Block) are already served with an upper primary school/section within a walking distance of 3 Kms. Since 86.9 percent habitations in the District fall to the population slab below 500. Provision of this facility in these habitations is not economical. Only three habitations justify for opening new upper primary schools in the District on the basis of the given criteria.

3.3. Out of the 152 villages which are having scheduled tribe population of more than 75 percent, 16 villages have been provided with upper primary schools/sections in them. Out of this 12 villages are having population above 500 and 4 villages with population less than 500. 75 percent villages with population more than 500 have this facility within the village. As regards scheduled tribe habitations, 56.3 percent of habitations are served by upper primary schools/sections within the habitation and 100 percent habitations upto a distance of 3 Kms as per the given criteria.

3.4. Upper Primary Schools:

There are 8 Upper Primary Schools in the District, and the number of school having upper primary classes is 17. All the schools are being managed by the Government and are in rural areas.

3.5. Buildings:

At the upper primary schools in the District have pucca buildings and have more than 3 class rooms. While 2 schools require no additional rooms, 1 school requires two additional rooms and 5 schools require more than 5 additional rooms.

3.6 Library Facilities:

All the Upper Primary Schools in the District are having the facility of library. So far as the number of books in the library is concerned 4 schools(50 percent) have got books between 501 to 1000, 2 schools(25 percent) between 201 to 500 and the rest 2 schools have got less than 200 books. Text book Bank facilities exist in 6 schools. While 3 schools subscribe to magazines only 1 school subscribe to news paper.

3.7. Ancillary Facilities:

Facilities of drinking water, Urinals and Lavatories exist in 7 schools i.e, 87.5 percent schools. 6 schools have got separate lavatories and urinals for girls. Facility of medical check up exists in 4 schools while the facility of vaccination/Innoculation is available in 6 schools.

3.8. Teachers:

There are 89 teachers teaching at upper primary stage and out of this female teachers number 18(20.2 percent) and male teachers number 71(79.8 percent). The number of trained and untrained teachers at this stage are 84(94.4 percent) and 5(5.6 percent) respectively.

3.9. Enrolment:

The total enrolment at Upper Primary classes is 2278. The number of boys and girls in these classes are 1295(56.8 percent) and 983 (43.2 percent) respectively. The scheduled tribe students among them is 1471 with a break up of 840 boys and 631 girls. The percentage of scheduled tribe students to total students at the stage comes to 64.6 percent.

3.10. Indicators of Educational Development:

The percentage of students in classes VI-VIII who are in the age-group 11-14 years is 49.2, where as the gross enrolment ratio for classes VI-VIII is 104.6 as against 83.5 in the state. The gross enrolment ratio for boys is 110.4 while that of girls it is 97.6. This is due to the fact that more than 50 percent children in these classes are above 14 years of age. If we compare the age specific enrolment ratio we can see that out of 100 children of the age-group 11-14 years, 88 of them are enrolled in schools in all classes and of this only 49 are studying in classes VI-VIII. The age-specific enrolment ratio for boys and girls is 87.6 and 88.4 respectively. The teacher pupil ratio at the stage is 25.6 students per teacher as against 25.9 students in the state. The percentage of girls enrolment in the Upper Primary stage is 43.2 percent as against the state record of 44.3 percent.

C H A P T E R - I V

Secondary and Higher Secondary Education (+2 Stage)

4.1. 9 habitations covering a population of 32.1 percent have secondary schooling facilities within the habitation.

19 habitations covering a population of 28.3 percentage have been provided this facility within 2 Km distance. Again 19 habitations each covering a population of 7.9 percent and 7.2 percent are served with this facility within a distance of 2.1 to 4 Km and 4.1 to 6 Kms. 11 habitations covering a population of 2.6 percent have provided the facility within a distance of 6.1 to 8 km. This 77 habitations(45.8 percent) have secondary schooling facility upto a distance of 8 Km. In terms of population, 78.2 percent population are served by this facility upto 8 Kms distance, Among the blocks, this facility upto 8 Km distance is available in 15 habitations (88.2 percent) in Car Nicobar block covering a population of 91.7 percent. In Nancowry block 89 habitations(58.9 percent) are without Secondary Schooling facilities upto 8 Km distance. But the percentage of population not covered upto 8 Km distance is only 33.4.

4.2. 69 habitations(41.1 percent) are served with Higher Secondary School at a distance upto 8 Kms. The population served with a higher Secondary school upto a distance of 8 Km is 72.8 percent. There are 99 habitations served with this facility beyond 8 Kms and the population served beyond 8 Kms is 27.8 percent. The number of habitations served by higher Secondary School at a distance upto 8 Km in Nancowry block is 55(36.4 percent) and 14(82.3 percent) in Car Nicobar block.

4.3. Number of Secondary Schools

The number of Secondary schools in the District is 4 and the number of schools having secondary classes is 9. All the schools are in rural areas and being run by Government.

4.4. Number of Higher Secondary Schools:

There are 5 Senior Secondary Schools in the District. All the schools are in rural areas and are managed by Government.

4.5. Library facilities:

All the Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools in the District have got good libraries. Out of the 5 Senior Secondary schools and 4 Secondary Schools, 4 senior Secondary schools and 1 Secondary school have a collection of more than 2000 books. 1 Senior Secondary School and 2 Secondary Schools have more than 1000 books. Only 1 Secondary school in the District has less than 1000 books. All the Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools have got text book banks.

4.6. Teachers:

47 teachers are teaching in Secondary classes of whom 45 (95.7 percent) are trained. Only 4.3 percent teachers are untrained at this stage. As regards their academic qualifications, the survey reveals that 24 teachers (51.1 percent) possess a University degree while another 19 teachers, (40.4 percent) hold post graduate degrees. 3 teachers teaching at the state do not have a university degree but they are above matriculates.

4.7. In higher Secondary classes, total 34 teachers are teaching. All of them are trained and possess Post Graduate Degrees.

Science Laboratories:

4.8. Of the 4 Secondary schools, 1 school has got no laboratories and 3 schools have got combined Laboratories for all subjects. No school has got separate laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology.

4.9. Of the 5 Senior Secondary Schools, 2 schools are teaching science at #2 stage. These schools are ~~having~~ having separate laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology; Home Science is teaching in 3 schools and all of them have got home science lab.

Science Teachers:

4.10. Out of 47 teachers teaching at Secondary Stage and 34 teachers at Senior Secondary Stage, 13 teachers (27.6 per cent) are teaching science at Secondary Stage and 8 (23.5 per cent) teachers are teaching science at Senior Secondary Stage. Of the 13 teachers teaching Science at Secondary Stage 6 teachers possess Post Graduate Degree in Science and 7 teachers possess a University Degree in Science. Only 1 teacher teaching at this stage is untrained. Of the teachers teaching science at Senior Secondary Stage, 6 teachers (75 percent) hold Post Graduate degree in Science and 2 teachers possess a university degree. All the Science teachers teaching at the stage are trained.

Enrolment:

4.11. Total enrolment in Secondary classes is 966. The number of boys and girls in these classes are 536 (55.5 percent) and 430 (44.5 percent) respectively. The Scheduled Tribe students amongst them number 580 (60 percent) with a break up of 337 boys and 243 girls. In Senior Secondary classes the enrolment is 304 of which 191 are boys and 113 are girls. The scheduled tribe students constitute 47.3 percent of the total enrolment. The percentage of scheduled tribe girls to total scheduled ~~xx~~ tribe students is 43.1 percent.

Ancillary Facilities:

4.12. All the Secondary Schools have got drinking water facilities in the school while 1 senior secondary school (20 percent) is without drinking water facility. All the Senior Secondary Schools are with facilities of urinal and lavatories while this facility is available in 3 Secondary school. Facilities for Medical checkup exist in all the secondary and senior secondary schools.

Physical Education Teachers:

4.13. All the Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools in the District have Physical Education Teachers. 3 Senior Secondary Schools and one Secondary school have got physical Education Teachers with a university Degree. The remaining schools are having physical Education teachers with Matric/ Higher Secondary Qualification.

Higher Secondary Schools with various streams.

4.14. Of the 5 Higher Secondary Schools in the District, 2 schools are having Science stream. However arts stream exists in all the 5 schools. Commerce, Agriculture and vocational courses have not been started in any schools in the District.

C H A P T E R - V

OTHER EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

Non-Formal Education:

5.1. The system of Non-Formal Education is not in vogue in the District.

Adult Education.

5.2. 54 villages in the District i.e, 32.1 percent of villages are covered by Adult Education facilities. A total of 77 Adult Education Centres functioning in these villages; of which 30 centres are for men only, 27 for women only and 20 for both men and women. All the centres are being run by the Government. The number of Adults enrolled in these centres is 1684 with a break up of 844 men and 840 women. The average participant per centre comes to 21.87 as against the state average of 23.54 persons per centre.

Schools for the Disabled:

5.3. There are no separate schools for the education of the disabled. However under the scheme of Integrated education of the disabled this facility is extended in 4 schools of the District alongwith the formal education system.

Pre-Primary Education:

5.4.
