

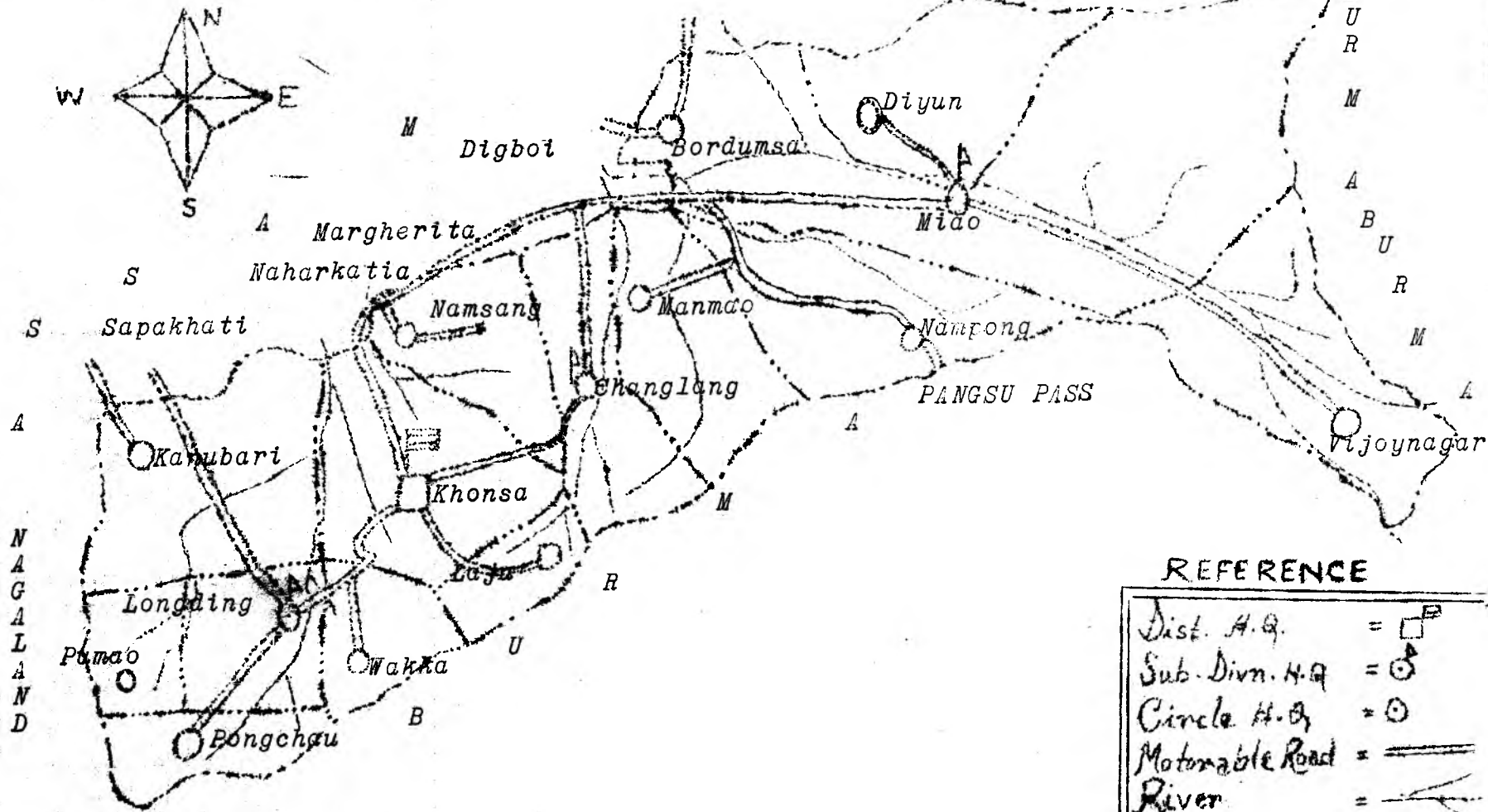

TIRAP DISTRICT

Tirap District of Arunachal Pradesh with an area of 7024 Sq.Km. is situated in a unique geographical setting bounded in the east and south by Burma. The land has a picturesque beauty of its own, the Noa Dehing rising from the snow height in the north east and flows through a fertile region until Lohit District.

Like other Districts of Arunachal Pradesh the District derives its name from its principal river, the Tirap, which flows through the mainland starting from the south to the north until it falls into the Noa Dehing river. The highest is the Dapha Bum in the north east with an altitude of 4506 Mtrs, the nearest place being Vijoy Nagar on the banks of Noa Dehing.

The climatic condition ranges from humid and hot in the plains portion like Kanubari, Namsang, Demali, Jairampur, Miao, Bordumsa to cold in places like Vijoy Nagar, Pangsus Pass, Laju and Pongchau in the hills. The climatic condition of Khonsa, the District headquarter, is moderate and pleasant, the average annual rain fall of the District headquarter is 522.13 Cm. with winter rains in many parts.

The population of the District as per 1981 Census is 1,28,135 (Prov.) out of which 68,442 are males and 59,693 are females. The analysis shows an increase of population by 30,665 in ten years i.e. 1971 to 1981. The Literacy rate of the District is 18.17%. The district has the thickest population and its density of population is 18 per sq.km. (against Arunachal figure of 7 per Sq.Km.). The Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribe population of the District are 234 and 79,957 respectively. As per 1981 Census (Prov.) there are 375 Nos. of Villages in the District.

The District is said to be the paradise of Anthropologists as it is the homeland of fascinating and interesting tribes such as the Luncho, Noctes, Tangsas, Singphos and Lichus. Further the District has given shelter to some Tibetans, Chakmas, Ahoms, Hajongs and Deoris who were displaced from their original homeland. Distinct features for four major tribes of the District are given below :

NOCTE

The central part of the District is occupied by the Noctes. They are well-built and of medium stature; their facial features are of mongoloid type; pigmentation is light to medium brown with a ruddy tinge and the eyes are dark brown or black with epicanthic folds.

Nocte villages are situated on hill tops, generally thickly populated with a cluster of houses huddled together. They are skilled crafts-men so far bamboo and cane are concerned. Bamboo sticks decorated with dyed goat hair, decorated head-gear and various types of baskets reveal their fine and artistic worksmanship.

Their dress consists of a loin cloth for men and a skirt hanging from waist to the knees for women. Modern dresses are becoming popular now. They put on various ornaments which are parts of their dress. Tattooing is common amongst the women folk, however, certain groups do not tattoo. The social life of the Noctes is divided into two distinct classes, the chief and his kinsmen form one class while the rest form the other.

WANCHO

Wanchos live in the Western part of the District, physically they are well built, tall and sturdy. Their facial features represent mongoloid characters. They prefer to construct their villages on ridges or spurs from which the land drops sharply into the surrounding valleys (mainly Tisa and Tising).

Among them division of labour visibly exists. In agricultural activities both men and women coordinate but no woman takes part in making basket, wood-curving, metal work and no man takes part in making pots, in weaving or in dyeing of yarn.

They are famous for their beautifully curved wood works, hand-woven bags of various designs, bead and basketry works.

Men's wearing consists of loin-cloth and for women of small skirts. They have various ornaments for personal decoration. Tattooing is very important feature in their lives, both men and women. Men tattoo when they reach manhood but girls when they reach maidenhood.

Like the Noctes, their social life is governed by the traditional chieftainship system assisted by a council of elders.

TANGSA

Tangsas live in the central part of the District along the Indo-Burma border. They are physically of medium stature and well built their facial features are of mongoloid type with a fair complexion.

They generally live in steep hills where there are availability of water sources and suitable land for cultivation. The villages are sparsely populated.

Man's clothes consist of a loin cloth or chequer patterned lungi, sleeveless shirt and a turban. The dress of women consist of a skirt and to cover, upper part with separate pieces of cloth.

Like Noctes and Wanchos, the Tangsas are good craftsmen. Their textile designs are mostly of geometrical patterns, they have a special fascination for scarlet, red, black and dark green colours. They are expert in cane and bamboo basketry works.

They are divided into a number of sub-groups and each group has a number of exogamous clan divisions.

SINGPHO

It is in the plain foothills towards the North of Tirap District, in the land watered by rivers Buri-Dehing, Noa-Dehing and Tengapani where the Singphos live. Physically they represent most of the mongolian traits. Once they were a very powerful and warlike tribe.

Men wear 'lungi' made with yarn of various colour combination, a jacket and a turban. The dress of women consists of a skirt with design on lower border, a Jacket, a designed scart, a waist band and a turban.

They practice permanent rice cultivation and a variety of rice they grow is fine and tasteful.

CULTURE

So far religion is concerned, each tribe has its own trend of religious beliefs and practices. Generally it is observed that all religions of all tribes are around mother NATURE for its munificence, abundance of food, the well being of man and his livestock. In addition to this, the Singphos are Budhists and some of the Noctes follow Vaishnavism.

The land provides a panorama of colourful folk festivals varying from tribe to tribe. The main festivals are Oziale of the Wangchos, Chahlo Lokri of the Noctes, Moh of the Tangsas and Fra-Poi of the Singphos. Agriculture being the primary means of their subsistence, most of their festivals are interwoven and regulated by different aspects of agricultural operations.

Places of Interest

The District being closer to the industrial towns of Digboi, Tinsukia, Dibrugarh and Dulianga in Assam with a fairly good means of communication (Khonsa is 4 hours journey from Dibrugarh or Tinsukia). The District has interesting places such as :-
