

Any constructive suggestions for improvement of this Annual publication of Statistical Hand Book will be gladly accepted.

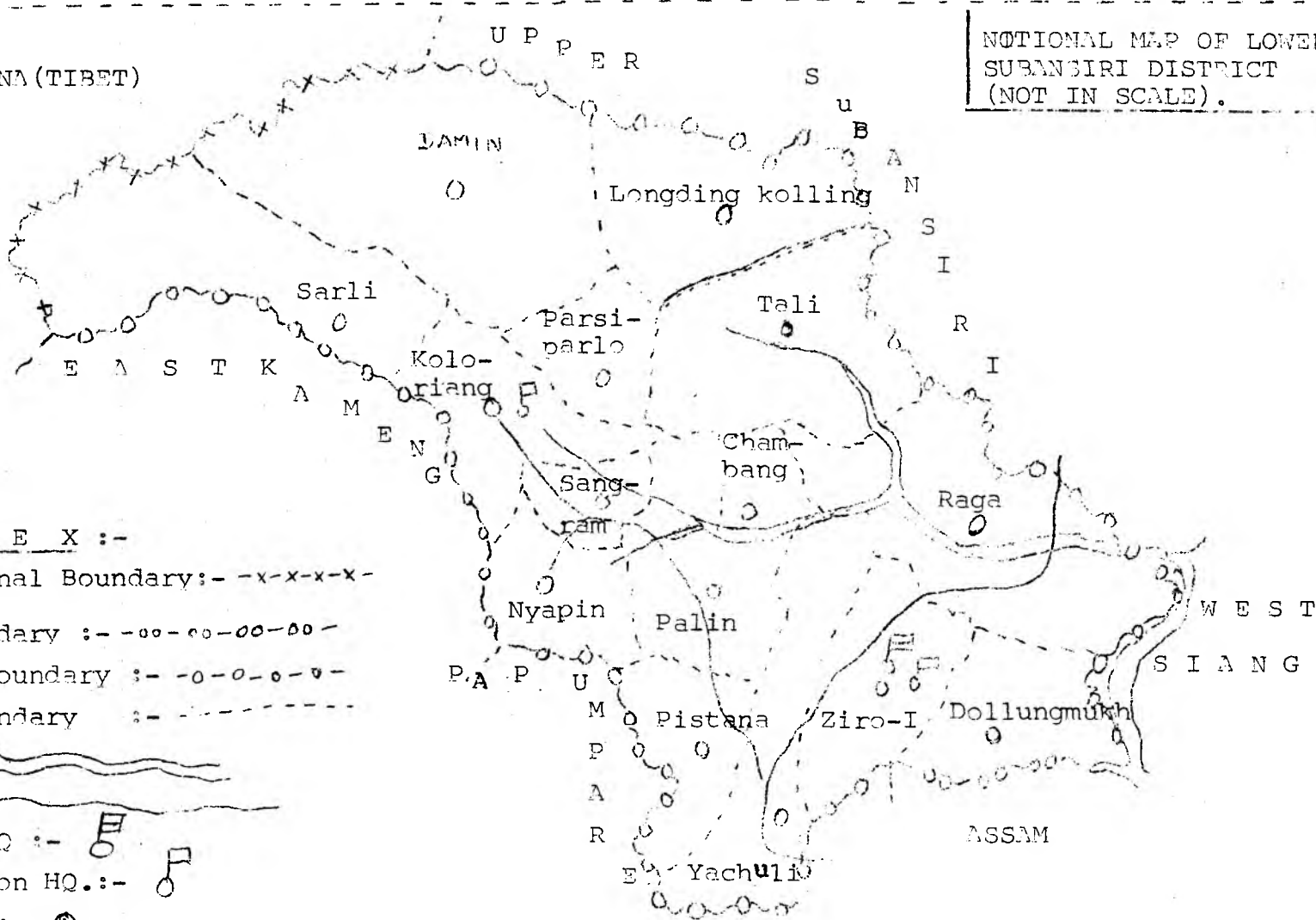

A SYNOPSIS OF LOWER SUBANSIRI DISTRICT:

Lower Subansiri District of Arunachal Pradesh is lying approximately between 92°40' to 94°21' East Longitudes and 26°55' to 28°21' North Latitudes. The district is surrounded by China (Tibet) and some part of Upper Subansiri District in the North, West Siang District and some part of Upper Subansiri district in the East, Papumpare district and State of Assam in the South and East Kameng District in the West respectively.

HISTORICAL GENESIS:

The name of the district is derived from the Subansiri River, a tributary of Mighty Brahmaputra, that flows through Raga Circle of this District. Till 1914, the district was a part of Lakhimour District of Assam. By a Government of India Notification of 1914, the area covered by this district became a part of Lakhimpur Frontier Tract of the "North East Frontier Tract". In March 1919, by another public Notification the Lakhimpur Frontier Tract along with Western sector was renamed as the "Balipara Frontier Tract". In 1946, the district area was carved out of the Balipara Frontier Tract in the name of "Subansiri Area" with its Headquarter at North Lakhimour. In 1954, Subansiri Area was renamed as the "Subansiri Frontier Division and its Headquarter was later transferred to Ziro. Like other parts of NEFA, the District was also under the Ministry of External Affairs and over-all In-charge was a political Officer. On 1st September, 1965, the Ministry of Home Affairs took over the Administrative charge of NEFA from Ministry of External Affairs and Subansiri Frontier Division was renamed as Subansiri District and Political Officer was redesignated as Deputy Commissioner, Addl. Political Officer as Addl. Deputy Commissioner, Assistant Political Officer (I) as Assistant Commissioner, Asstt. Political Officer (II) as Extra Assistant Commissioner and Base Superintendent as Circle Officer respectively.

On 13th May 1980, Subansiri District was bifurcated into Lower and Upper Subansiri District, Upper Subansiri District was formed, covering the area of the then Daporijo Sub-Division and rest of the area of erst while Subansiri District was placed under Lower Subansiri. Finally on 22nd September, 1992, Lower

Subansiri District was again bifurcated and Papumpare district was formed.

#### PHYSIOGRAPHY:

The Lower Subansiri District covers approximately an area of 10,135 Sq.Km. The topography of the district is mostly mountaneous terrain, where the Hill Ranges varies aproximately from 1000 to 1600 metres above sea level. A greater part of it, is falls within the higher mountain zone consisting of tangled peaks and valleys. Nature has gifted the heart land of the district in the form of magnificent plateau at about 1564 metres above sea level, where District HQ Ziro is situated.

The forest of the district are rich in valuable species of trees and different varieties of shrubs. Cane and Bamboo grows plenty and in the shadowy recesses of the forests may often be found the exquisite floral treasures of wilder species. The forests of the district has got great economic values and various types of wild game. The district is also rich in wild fauna. Tigers, panthers, Leopard, Cats, Bear, Boars, Antelopes and barking deer beautify this nature's Zoological Garden.

One of the main river of this district is Kamala. The origins of the river is from snow ranges of China(Tibet), which flows towards South-East and meets the Subansiri river at Raga Circle. The Subansiri river, at one time famous for its gold dust flows through the district and leaving the district at Dollunqumukh Circle. It ultimately joins the mighty Brahmaputra in plains of Assam. Khru, Panior, Kime, Panya, Selu, Pugo, Persen, Rein, Sipu, Pange, Kale etc. rivers are also worth mentioning.

#### CLIMATE:

The climatic condition of the district varies from place to place and season to season. The climate is largely influenced by the nature of terrain depending upon altitude and location of place and it can, at best, a year may broadly be divided into four seasons in a general (1) The cold weather season in from December to February (2) March to May is the premonsoon season of thunders storms followed by (3) The South-West monsoon from June to about the middle of October and (4) the second half of October to November which constitutes the post monsoon or the retreating monsoon period and is a period

of transition. In the foot hills or low high belt area of the district, the climatic condition is moderate in comparison to high belt areas, where during winter is very cold and chill while in summer is pleasant. December and January are generally the coldest months and July and August are warmest months.

Annual Rainfall in the South is heavier than that in the northern areas of the district. During the monsoon period more than 70 percent of the rain over the southern half occurs while in the northern portions it is about 60 percent. Variability of rainfall for the monsoon and the year, as a whole, are relatively small. Average Annual Rainfall of the District Headquarter, Ziro recorded as 122.32 cms.

Relative humidity is always high throughout the year except in the winter months being slightly less humid. In the old season, the sky is obscured on many mornings due to lifted fog which clears with the advance of the day generally moderately clouded in the period of March to May, heavily clouded to overcast in the monsoon season and clear or slightly clouded during the post monsoon season. Winds are generally light. Strong Katabatic winds down the valleys are experienced as local effect produced by the nature of terrain.

POPULATION (1991 CENSUS):

As per 1991 Census, the Lower Subansiri district has recorded a population of 83,167 comprising 42,502 males and 40,665 females of which 74,305 (37,442 males (+) 36,863 females) are rural population spread over 595 villages and 8862 (5060 males(+) 3,802 females) are urban population. The proportion of of rural population of the district constitute 89.34 percent while the urban population constitute only 10.66 percent. The average size of population of CD block is found to be 8,256. The district population accounts for 9.62 percent of total population of the State. The average density of population per Sq. Km. is 8 for the district as compared to 10 persons for Arunachal Pradesh.

Lower Subansiri district ranks Eight in population size and Third in area (Approx. 10,135 Sq. Km.) among all the

(D)

Thirteen districts of Arunachal Pradesh. Out of 9(Nine) CD Blocks, Ziro-II CD block stands highest in rural population followed by Nyapin and Ziro-I CD blocks and the lowest being Chambang CD block.

As per 1991 Census, the literate persons and percentage to the total population of the district (excluding children in the age-group 0-6) has been recorded as 20,162 (30.07%), the male being 13,187 (38.26%) and female 6,975 (21.41%). Total rural literates and percentage of the district constitutes 15,489 and 25.88. Out of which 10,135 (33.53%) are males and 5,354 (18.07%) are females. Urban population constitutes 4,673 literates, the percentage being 64.99 to total urban population. Out of which 3052 (71.98%) are males and 1,621 (54.95%) are females. The literacy rate of the district (Rural(+) Urban) has increased from 11.63 percent in 1981 to 30.07 percent in 1991 Census (excluding 0-6 years of age group).

So far as CD block-wise literacy rate is concerned, Ziro-I ranks first in literacy rate (43.40%) followed by Ziro-II (34.69%) and Tamen-Raga CD block (31.10%) respectively. The lowest literacy rate is found to be in Tali CD block with only 6.43 percent.

Decadal variation of population of the district is found to be (+) 14.06 percent during the last decade (1981-91). While looking at the block level figures of decadal variation, it is observed that percentage of decadal variation is found to be highest (+) 49.93 in the Ziro-II CD block for the rural population followed by Tamen-Raga (+) 27.74 and Chambang (+) 21.81 CD blocks. The Palin CD block constitutes very negligible (1.52%) during the decade. It is also noticed that Ziro-I, Tali and Koloriang-Sarli CD blocks has the negative growth rate i.e. (-) 36.43, (-) 16.68 and (-) 0.69 percent respectively. The reason is possibly due to declaration of Ziro HQ as Census Town in 1991, shifting of population to some other Circle of the district and some other district of the State.

The sex ratio of the district indicates 957 females per 1000 males as compared to 859 females per 1000 males for Arunachal Pradesh. It is noticed that the sex ratio of rural areas of the district constitutes 985 females per 1000 males and.

sex ratio of Urban area of the district has recorded 751 females per 1000 males. Out of 9 CD blocks, Chahang CD block ranks first in respect of sex ratio (1042 females per 1000 males) followed by Nyapin CD block (1030 females per 1000 males) and Ziro-I CD block (1025 females per 1000 males) respectively. The lowest being found in Ziro-II and Damin CD blocks (949 females per 1000 males) each.

Scheduled Caste population in the district is found to be very negligible as there is no indigenous scheduled caste population in the district as well as State. Out of 595 villages in the district only 9 villages, totalling 72 persons are having scheduled caste population, the percentage being 0.10 to total rural population as against 0.08 percent in 1981 Census. The Ziro Town has recorded only 61 persons scheduled caste population, the percentage being 0.69 to total urban population. The district scheduled caste population constitutes 0.16 percent as compared to 0.47 percent for Arunachal Pradesh. They are either government employees or migrated from other State for contractor's construction works or business men.

As per 1991 Census, it is revealed that all the 595 villages and lone Ziro Town of the district are inhabited by the Scheduled Tribes population constituting 74,543 (89.63%) to the total population, of which 36,733 (44.17%) are males and 37,810 (45.46%) are females as compared to 63.66 percent for Arunachal Pradesh. Total Scheduled Tribe population to total rural population has recorded 69,773 persons (34,353 males (+) 35,420 females), the percentage being 93.90% (91.75 males and 96.09 females) as against 92.98 percent in 1981 Census. Total scheduled tribe population to total urban population constitutes 4,770 (2380 males and 2390 females), the percentage being 53.83 (47.04 males and 62.86 females).

The total workers in the district constitutes 41,682 persons (22,616 males and 19,066 females), the percentage being 50.15 (53.21 males and 46.89 females) as against 57.62 percent in 1981 Census, while 49.55 percent (41,205 persons) being the main workers and 0.57 percent (477 persons) Marginal workers as against 55.09 and 2.53 percent respectively in 1981 Census. The main workers to total Rural population constitutes

51.31 percent, the male being 53.14 percent and female 49.46 percent and marginal workers recorded 0.56 percent, the males being 0.22 percent and females 0.91 percent. The Main workers to the total Urban population indicates 34.71 percent, the males being 51.28 percent and females 12.65 percent and Marginal workers 0.65 percent, the males being 0.87 percent and females 0.37 percent. In case of CD block-wise percentage of Main Workers to total population and total workers to total population, it is noticed that Tali CB block stands first (68.98%) and (70.54%) followed by Huri-Damin (61.00%) and (61.10%). The lowest percentage of Main workers and total workers is found in Ziro-I CD block, the percentage being 42.48% and 43.34% respectively.

The district HQ Ziro was declared as Urban during 1991 Census and rest areas are still considered as Rural.

#### LOCAL INHABITANTS:

There are 3 (Three) major tribes in Lower Subansiri district namely; Apatani, Nishi (Nishangs or Dafla) and Hill Miri:-

#### APATANI:

The Apatanis are belong to the Tibeto-Mongoloid stock. All Apatanis trace their descent from one legendary ancestor, ABOTANI. They are migrated to this magnificent Valley from northern areas, beyond Khru and Kime rivers. This reveals from finding of three neolithic celts at Parsiparlo and Raga Circles and historical remains at Talle Valley by Archaeological survey. It is, therefore, apparent that they followed the path of Kime, Khru (now called Kamala) and Subansiri rivers. They are well-built, fair in complexion and medium to tall in structure. The Apatanis live in fairly large villages, which are compact and permanent, although during recent years they have been persuaded to disperse to avoid damage by fire accidents. In spite of their entities among class they are mutually linked up with kinship, ritualistic and friendship ties- Some of them have business acumen. Their houses are made of bamboo and timber

An Apatani family is patriarchal. They divided into two classes, the Gyuchi and the Gvutti, who do not inter-marry. But now a days inter-marriage among these classes is being encouraged by the younger generation and intellectual group of

the Tribe. The religion is indigenous. Earlier, the Apatanis have prominent tattoo marks on the face. However, the system of tattooing is being discouraged by the younger generation and has been abolished.

The Apatani tribe is sub-divided into a number of clans. All of them are believed to have originated from a single tribal identity. Among themselves, these people are highly co-operative. The tribe endogamy and clan exogamy is the rule of the tribe. Monogamy is the social norm but sometimes bigamy is also practised. Marriage is being solemnised either by the way of negotiations or by seeing omen with the help of chicken liver. The process is first initiated from the boy side.

The Apatanis perform many pantomime dances out of which the DAMINDA and PAKHU ITTU dances are very popular. DREE, YAPUNG, MYOKO and MURUNG are the major festivals of Apatani. Dree and Yapung festivals are celebrated every year in the month of July and sometimes in the month of September or October respectively. There is great merry making and dancing during the Dree festival. The Myoko festival is celebrated each year in the month of March in a cycle manner by forming three groups of villages. First group comprised of Hong village alone. Second group are Hari and Bulla (comprising Kalong, Reru, Tajang and Lempia villages). Third group are the villages of Hija, Dutta, Mudang Tage and Bamin-Michi. Murung is celebrated every year in the month of January. The significance of these festivals are mainly to ensure better cultivation, protect the grains from hailstone, storms, insects and wild animals and well being of villagers in general and their livestock.

The Apatanis are agriculturists. They practise permanent type of cultivation and their agricultural paddy field are well developed and irrigated. They rear Mithuns (*Bos frontalis*), cattle, pig goats and poultry. They practise fishing by nets, angles and traps. They hunt and chasing by means of spears, traps and arrows. The Apatani women are skillful weavers. Basketery is the popular handicraft amongst the men folk.

There is a village council in each Apatani village and the council consists of one or two BULIYANG representative from each clan. The position of a Buliyang is hereditary. They

are arbiters of tribal law and upholders of tribal justice, but the individual Buliyang are primarily the spokesman of their own clan or groups of clans and not chieftains, wielding absolute authority. The councils of Buliyang formerly decided almost all the cases that were reported to them. If a person or party did not conform to the decision of the council, the MEEHAS could destroy the disputed property and thus coerce his or their property to agreed party.

The Buliyangs of the entire Apatani community are divided into broad groups viz;

(1) TALYANG-HAO; comprised of Hari, Kalong, Dutta, Mudang-Tage and Bamin Michi villages and (2) NIICHII-NIITII-REPU-TAJANG-DIIRE-HIJA; comprising of Reru, Tajang, Hija and Hong villages.

#### THE NISHIS:

The Nishis, also called Nishangs in the upper areas are believed to be belonged to the Tibeto-Mongoloid stock. All Nishis trace their descent from one legendary ancestor, ABOTANI, whose sons are believed to have been the fore fathers of three groups of clans known as DOPUM, DODUM and DAL respectively. The Nishis, inhabitants of the western half of the district are migrated from northern area, beyond Khru and Kime rivers. They are well-built, fair in complexion and medium to tall in physical structure. Some of them have good knowledge of business. Their houses are made of thatch, bamboo and timber.

Each of these main groups (Dopum, Dodum and Dal) is sub-divided into phratries and exogamous clans and there are areas where clan of all these three main groups live side by side. Nishi family is patriarchal and polygamy is practised. Mithuns are essential part of the bride price for marriage. Their house are dispersed over the hill-side and they live in small scattered villages. Most of their dwelling houses are long with many hearths accomodating as many as five to six households belonging to a common lineage. Families may join or leave a village at will from one village to the other.

The nishis observe a number of ceremonies in the

(I)

villages. The important community festival is known as NYOKUM, performed once in a year in the month of February. During this festival the priests devote days together to pray the supreme being. Men and women rejoice by dancing, singing and feasting as part of the ceremony. The Nishis too have a number of songs and dances for different socio-religious festivals. The RIKAM-PADA is most popular and important song and dance of Nishis community. The significance of Nyokum festival is to ensure better cultivation, protect the grains from natural calamities and also for the prosperity of the villagers well being in general.

The Nishis women are adept in weaving skill. Basketry is a popular handicraft among the men-folk.

The Nishis are agriculturists and they commonly practise shifting cultivation (Jhuming). Permanent cultivation is also being progressively adopted, wherever it is feasible. Principal method of Jhuming consists of clearing of a patch of jungle by cutting and burning after a number of years called the "Jhum Cycle". MithunsmCows, Pigs, Goats and fowls are kept. They hunt and chase by spears, traps, bows and arrows.

The primary social unit is the household comprising of several elementary families having in some cases as many as sixty or seventy members. Such a long house is virtually autonomous and self contained. The members of each such household submit to the authority of the head of the household. In every village, there are one or two influential men to whom the people of the village may approach for helping in disputes among themselves. Such people are called Nyats and in their role of intermediaries are referred to as BOOT or GINGDUNG. Inter village disputes are settle by Nyats and Gingdung.

The Nishis are basically individualistic. The feeling of openness is through blood and the clan spirit. Wrings are considered to be personal rather than social matters and the parties are often left themselves to settle their scores/ without interference of the society.

The theoretical anarchy in the absence of councils of elders is mitigated by two factors first the co-existence of several clans in the same area compels them to conform to

certain peaceful standard. Secondly, the services of the go-betweens universally recognised and accepted lead to peaceful settlement of disputes. These Gingdungs or intermediaries have no political or judicial power nor can they enforce their decisions. Their success lies in arranging the meeting of the two contending parties and their influential supporters discuss the disputes and reach an unanimous agreement or decision. What is reasonable and just is usually accepted. Such assemblies sometimes sit for many days and the case is debated. The penalties decided are eventually paid by the offender but the society at large does not bear any responsibility to ensure that such payment is made except in the way of persuasion through public opinion and intimidation in the way of presenting the possibility of enlarging the area of conflict through partisan-ship. These are often enough to pressurise the offender to pay the fines imposed in the assembly usually through his friends and relatives, who may even go to the extent of materially assisting the offender to make a down payment of fines. The Daflas customary laws prescribed standardised compensations for various offences.

Now a days, most of the Nyats have been recognised as the Gaon Burahs who take a leading role in the settlement of disputes. In important cases, they are usually called from the different villages of the area to sit in a Council.

#### THE HILL MIRIS:

The Hill Miris are fair in complexion. Their main concentration is spread over Raga Circle. Main festival is BOORI-BOOT, which is being celebrated in the month of February with full of rejoicing and enthusiasm. They weave elegant garments and are fond of dance and music. The Socio-economic and political life of the Hill Miris are almost similar to that of the Nishis. There are, of course, certain regional differences, for example, the Hill Miri have only three to four hearths, their head-dress is more elaborate and they claim association with the Miri of the plains.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP:

The Administrative set-up is based on single line administration, which aims at keeping closest co-operation amongst

various developmental departments with the administration to keep step together for speedy development of the people and the area.

The entire Lower Subansiri District is divided into 2 (two) Sub-Divisions viz; Ziro and Koloriang. Ziro Sub-Division is comprised of 9 (Nine) Circles, namely; Ziro (Sadar), Yachuli, Pistana, Palin, Chambang, Tali, Longding-Koling, Raga and Dollungmukh. Koloriang Sub-Division has got 6 (Six) Circles, i.e. Koloriang, Sarli, Damin, Parsiparlo, Nyapin and Sangram.

The District has 15 (Fifteen) Circles and 595 villages. The district has been covered by 9 (Nine) blocks, comprising of Palin, Chambang, Ziro-I, Ziro-II, Tali, Tamen-Raga, Koloriang-Sarli, Huri-Damin and Nyapin.

The Deputy Commissioner being the over-all In-charge of the district maintains law and order with the help of Administrative Officers and Police force. He is also look after the developmental activities of the district. The villagers have their own customary administrative system in the form of traditional village councils. The Assam Frontier (Administration of Justice) Regulation, 1945, authorises the village councils to settle all civil matters and certain criminal matters falling within their jurisdictions. However, for all matters, the Deputy Commissioner and other administrative officers, have jurisdiction under the supervision of Assam High Court, who hold the appellate and the Revisional authority.

The Panchayat Raj has been introduced in the District with the North East Frontier Agency Panchayat Raj Regulation, 1967. Under this Regulation (1) The Gram Panchayat (Grass-root bodies) exist at the village level, (2) The Anchal Samiti at the Block/Anchal level, (3) The Zilla Parishad operates at the District level and (4) Agency Council operates at the Agency level. The Regulation provides for effective participation of the people in the administration of Arunachal Pradesh through the Institutions set-up under the Panchayat Raj Scheme.
