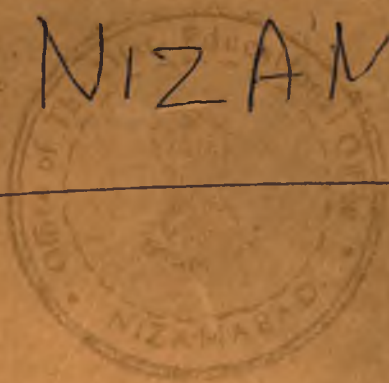

STATE: ANDHRA PRADESH

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GENERAL INFORMATION:

The District derived its name Nizamabad from the Nizam of Hyderabad, Asaf Jahi VI who ruled Deccan during 18th century A.D. Originally the District was called Indur - Supposed to have originated from the name of the King Indra Jatta who seems to have flourished in this region during 5th century A.D. Indur became a District during 1876 A.D. When the districts in the Nizam's Dominion were re-organised at the time of the Prime Ministership of Sri Salarjung-I. The District in its new shape was Christened as Nizamabad in 1905.

Nizamabad District is bounded on the North by Adilabad District and on the east by Karannagar District, on the South by Medak District and on the west by Nanded District of Maharashtra State and Bider of Karnataka State. The geographical area of the District is 7956 Sq.Ms. The District lies between 18° and 19° of the Northern latitudes and 77° and 89° of the Eastern longitudes. The District is situated at a considerable distance from the sea coast. Hence the climate is tropical. The temperature fluctuations are high in the district. The normal mean minimum temperature is 13° 70 'C, and mean maximum is 39° 90 C. At times the temperature goes as low as 5° C during winter and rises as high as 47° C during peak summer. The total forest area in the district is 1.69 lakh hectares forming 21% of the total geographical area of the district. The forest and Jungles fall under the category of southern tropical dry type forests. The thick forest belt of these forests produces teak, ebony, black wood, nallamaddi, yeppa, and tarwar. The forest produce includes timber, fuel, bamboo and beedi leaves which yield good revenue. Tigers, Panthers, Jungle cats, wild sheep, blue bulls, sambar spotted deer, wild boar common deer etc., are some of the common animals besides birds like ducks, Jungle fowls, Peacocks pigeons etc. are found in the jungles. Nizamabad is situated in the table land of Deccan. Hence hills of any considerable range are quite rare. Isolated peaks and rocky clusters occur frequently.

The Principal rivers flowing in the district are the Godavari and the Manjeera, the Chief tributary of the Godavari River Godavari flows for about 143 K.Ms. on the northern boundary of this district separating it from Nanded of Maharashtra and Adilabad districts and finally enters into Karannagar district.



In Nizamabad district, paddy and sugar-cane are predominantly grown in the ayacut of Nizamsagar, Pocharam, Sriramsagar, and Ramadugu Projects, which irrigate Banswada, Bodhan, Nizamabad and part of Armoor, part of Yellareddy erstwhile taluks. Sugarcane and paddy are grown in the areas of Kamarreddy, Domakonda and Bhongal also under wells and tanks. Turmeric is also an important crop in Nizamabad district and is grown mostly in Armoor, Bhongal and Nizamabad erstwhile taluks. Dry crops like Maize, Jowar, and pulses like green gram black gram and Red gram are also grown in non command area of this district.

The economy of Nizamabad district is predominantly agricultural one. There are industries such as rice mills, Khandasari Sugar factories and Badi industries. There are industrial estates at Sarangapur, Kisannagar, Kamarreddy and Bodhan. There are two large Sugar factories in the district. They are the Nizam Sugar Factory at Shakkarnagar, Bodhan and the Nizamabad Co-operative sugar factory at Sarangapur. On account of the ayacut of the Major and medium irrigation sources viz., Nizamsagar, Pocharam, Sriramsagar(Pochampad) and Ramadugu projects, Industrial development such as the establishment of general Engineering fabrication work shops, casting foundaries, steel rolling mills, R.O.s spun pipes, Aluminium utensils, steel furniture manufacture, pipe fittings and biscuit manufacture, is taking place.

The population of the district is 16.80 lakhs of which the rural population accounts for 13.57 lakhs i.e., 80.8 percent of the total while the urban population accounts for 3.23 lakhs forming 19.2 percent of total population. In the district the male population accounts for 8.35 lakhs and female population accounts for 8.45 lakhs. The increase in population during decennium ending 1981 over 1971 is 28% for the district as against 23.1 percent of the state. The rate of growth of population of the district is higher than the growth rate of the state.

The ratio of female population is (more) 1013 females for every 1000 males.

The density of population of the district is 211 persons per Sq. K.Ms. as against the state average of 195 persons per square K.M. as per 1981 census. Out of the total population of the district 2.59 lakhs are scheduled caste persons and 0.90 lakh persons are scheduled tribes forming (15.4%) and (5.36%) respectively.

The number of literate persons in the Nizamabad district is 3.65 lakhs as per 1981 census i.e., 21.73 percent of the total population as against the state average of 30 percent. The percentage of literacy in the district increased from 17.21% in 1971 to 21.73% in 1981. The rate of increase in the percentage of literacy in Nizamabad district over 1971 is 4.52 whereas the state average increase is 5.4. As per 1981 census the percentage of literacy among male in the total population is 31.89% and female is 11.70%.

FIFTH ALL INDIA EDUCATIONAL SURVEY:

In furtherance of Government of India instructions Fifth all India Educational Survey was under taken in Andhra Pradesh with a view to collect the data pertaining to educational facilities available in rural and urban areas. The schools run by various managements and different types located in rural and urban areas such as Govt., Local body Private aided and Private Un-aided Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary, Higher Secondary and Ashram schools also were surveyed with reference to the availability of physical facilities, Educational aids, Science laboratories, Libraries, Furniture and Teachers etc., The survey also was intended to identify the school-less habitations and to propose for the opening of new schools in addition to the collection of data. One post of District survey Officer to each district in A.P. was created to collect and consolidate the data as required for the Survey.

The reference date of the survey was 30.9.1986. Hence the data as on 30.9.1986 was collected in regard to villages, Urban areas and different types of Educational Institutions such as Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary, Higher secondary, and Ashram schools. Three types of questionnaires viz., VIF, UIF and SIF were evolved for the purpose by the N.C.E.R.T. New Delhi and were supplied through the state survey Officer O/o the Director of School Education, Govt. of A.P. Hyderabad.

During the 3rd week of June 1987 a Training class was organised for the benefit of all the District Survey Officers, by the State Survey Officer in the Office of the Director of School Education, Hyderabad to acquaint them with

the method of filling in the VIF, UIF and SIF and the method of their compilation. Dr. Bhurguna from NCERT, New Delhi dealt with the method at length. In turn the District Survey Officers conducted Training class to all the M.E.Os. in the district in July 1987 and explained them the procedure of filling in the forms by the Heads of Recognised Educational Institutions and method of consolidation. The Mandal Educational Officers were made responsible to canvass the forms to the Heads of institutions, collect the filled in forms from them and to scrutinise the forms after they are collected, and finally submit the consolidated Mandal level data pertaining to VIF, UIF and SIF to the District Survey Officer. The M.E.Os. in turn organised training classes in their respective mandals for the benefit of heads of institutions in this regard.

VILLAGE:- Some of the important concepts and terms in the forms are discussed in the following paragraphs, the village is defined as a 'Revenue village'. Detailed information regarding the habitations or hamlets attached to the revenue village has to be furnished in the VIF in addition to the information regarding the main village. In the VIF particulars of population as per 1981 census and the estimated population as on 30-9-1986 have to be shown. Child population in the age groups 4-6; 6-11; 11-14; 14-16 and 16 to 18 as on 30-9-1986 also is to be shown. Particulars about the existing educational facilities for the village have to be furnished in the form.

In case of Educational facility for any stage is not available in a habitation of the village the particulars of the nearest habitation/village with that facility of education has to be shown. Besides particulars of formal education; particulars of non formal; adult; pre-primary; and educational facilities for physically handicapped also have to be furnished in VIF.

S.I.F:- In the School information form particulars of schools about their management, type, whether for boys, for girls or co-educational and the stage of educational facility available in the school have to be furnished. Further detailed information regarding the type of building; instructional rooms available; availability of facilities such as library, laboratory, etc., availability of play ground and its extent, Information

regarding the availability of black boards, furniture, Science apparatus; teaching aids; drinking water facility, sanitary facilities, programme of SUPW; implementation of incentive schemes such as midday meals, No. of beneficiaries; Scholarships; Free supply of dresses and Text books etc., classwise, agewise & sexwise particulars of enrolment and particulars of teachers according to their qualifications, sex, and the stages at which they are teaching have to be furnished.

UIF:- In the Urban information form the information regarding the Urban areas have to be filled in. The items are almost common in VIF and UIF.

In Nizamabad district there are 35 mandals; 1309 habitations, 859 inhabited villages and 56 un-inhabited villages. As per 1981 Census the total population in rural area of Nizamabad, district is 13,57,030, of which 6,68,645 are males and 6,88,385 are females. In ~~several~~ area the scheduled caste population is 2,31,570 and S.T. population is 87,462. The estimated population of rural area as on 30-9-86 is 15,15,970.

As per 1981 census, 7 towns namely Sreeram Sagar Project, Yellareddy, Banswada, Kamareddy, Arnoor, Bodhan and Nizamabad are identified as urban areas. Their total population is 3,22,653, of which 1,65,851 are males and 1,56,802 are females. The scheduled caste population as per 1981 census is 27,270 and the S.T. population is 2,800. The estimated population of the urban area as on 30-9-86 is 3,61,116.

PRIMARY EDUCATION
CHAPTER - II

In Nizamabad district there are 1309 habitations with a total population of 15,15,970. Out of 1309 habitations in 997 habitations with a population of 14,42,750 Primary school facility is available within the habitations, 177 habitations with a population of 48812 have primary school facility within a distance of 0.5 K.M. and 60 habitations with a population of 10325 have primary school facility within a distance between 0.6 K.M. to 1 K.M. For the remaining 75 habitations in the district with a population of 14,083 Primary schooling facility is available at a distance of beyond 1 K.M. Among such 75 habitations Primary school facility within the distance of 1 to 1.5 K.M. is available for 24 habitations; within the distance of 1.5 to 2 K.Ms. is available for 26 habitations and for the remaining 25 habitations the primary school facility is available beyond the distance of 2 kms. As per the V All India Educational Survey Pitlam, Nizamsagar mandals have the highest number of habitations 10 in each mandal for which primary school facility is available beyond 1 K.M. Next comes Birkur, Tadwai Jukkai, Yellaroddy mandals in which 6 habitations in each mandal have primary schooling facility beyond the distance of 1 km.

Thus 1234 habitations have already been served by a Primary school/section facility within the habitation and within the distance of 1 km. from among the remaining 75 habitations which are served by primary school facility available beyond 1 km. 18 Schools are proposed for opening of Primary school/Section keeping in view the norms fixed in the V All India Educational Survey. The norms are that a Primary school can be started within the habitation or group of habitations if the population is 300 and schooling facility does not exist within the distance of 1 km. Thus 95.64% of habitations are covered by Primary school facility. The total population of 1309 habitations is 1515970. Out of which primary school facility is available for a population of 1508266. Thus 99.4% of the total population is covered with the primary school facility. As per the V All India Educational Survey, there are 859 inhabited villages. Out of them 486 villages in different population slabs have SC. population upto 25%. 139 villages have 26-50% of SC. population. There are 150 villages in which proportion of SC population is zero. 69 villages have 51-75% of SC population, 15 villages have more than 75% of SC population. In 486 villages

in which the percentage of SCs is upto 25%. There is primary school facility for 467 villages and 304 villages are provided with Secondary school facility. Similarly there are 859 inhabited villages. Out of them 442 villages in different population slabs have ST population upto 25%, 80 villages have 26-50% of ST population. There are 254 villages in which proportion of ST population is zero. 67 villages have 51-75% of ST population. 16 villages have more than 75% of ST population.

In Nizamabad district, there are altogether 840 primary schools, out of which 62 primary schools are located in 7 Urban areas i.e., Nizamabad, Bodhan, Kamaroddy, Bauswada, Yellareddy, Armoor and Sri Ramsagar project. Remaining 778 primary schools are located in rural area of Nizamabad district. In rural area managementwise number of primary schools is as hereunder.

Thus in rural areas Primary school facility is predominantly provided by mandal praja parishads and in urban areas Government management schools are predominantly catering the needs of primary education. Next to Government, Private, Unaided primary schools are catering the need for primary education in urban areas. In rural areas there are no private aided schools and the number of unaided primary schools is negligible. In addition to the aforesaid private unaided primary schools there are many more private unaided primary schools in urban and rural areas for which the managements did not obtain recognition of the department. In addition to purely Primary schools there are Primary sections in 186 Upper Primary Schools in rural area and in urban area there are 47 Upper Primary schools having primary sections.

Similarly 80 secondary schools in rural area and 26 secondary schools in urban area are having Primary sections. In urban area in three higher secondary schools there are primary sections. Thus in rural areas, there are altogether 1046 schools having primary sections. In urban areas there are altogether 140 schools having primary sections. Total schools in the district having primary sections are 1186.

In rural areas there are 778 primary schools. Among them 506 schools are having pucca buildings, 83 schools are functioning in partly pucca buildings, 63 schools are functioning in Kucha buildings 66 schools are functioning in thatched huts and 60 schools are functioning in open space. Among the 506 primary schools having pucca buildings 500 schools are of M.P.P. 702 schools are housed either in pucca or semi pucca buildings or thatched huts. In rural area among the 15 Govt. primary schools 2 schools are functioning in open space. They are 1 in Dichpally mandal and the other in Sadasivnagar mandal. Among the M.P.P. managed primary schools 10 schools in Dichpally mandal, 5 schools in Sadasivnagar mandal, 5 in Madnoor and 7 schools in Gandhari mandals, and the remaining 33 schools functioning in the remaining 31 mandals are without buildings.

Regarding no. of additional rooms required in primary schools, 25 schools require 1 additional room, 58 schools require 2 additional rooms, 129 schools require 3 additional rooms, 491 schools require 4 additional rooms and 73 schools require 5 and above additional rooms. Thus altogether 776 primary schools require 2857 additional rooms.

In urban area altogether there are 62 primary schools of which 19 schools are having pucca buildings, 20 schools are having partly pucca buildings, 11 schools have kucha buildings 3 schools are functioning in thatched huts and 9 schools are functioning in open space. All the 9 schools which are functioning without any building are of Govt. schools. Hence in Govt. sector more number of school buildings for primary schools have to be constructed in urban areas i.e., in Bodhan and Nizamabad. Among the 19 primary schools which have pucca buildings in urban area, 10 schools are of M.P.P. managed schools 8 schools are of private unaided, only 1 Govt. primary school has pucca building.

There are 778 primary schools in rural area. Among them 2 schools have 10 and above instructional rooms, 487 primary schools are functioning with only one instructional room.

60 schools do not have instructional rooms, 487 primary schools with one instructional room are spread over among the 35 mandals of the district. Armoor is having the minimum number of such schools i.e., three, next comes Veilpur in which 4 schools are with one instructional room, Jukkai is the mandal in which maximum No. of Primary schools i.e., 28 have one instructional room next comes Yellareddy mandal in which 25 schools are having one instructional room.

There are 41 Govt. primary schools, Fifteen in rural area and 26 in urban area in the district, out of which 39 schools require additional rooms. The details of requirement are Six schools require one room each; nine schools require two rooms each; four schools require three rooms each; four schools require four rooms each and sixteen schools require five or more than five rooms each.

There are only 3 private aided schools in the urban area which do not require any additional rooms.

Schools in almost all the mandals are short of black boards. Nizamabad mandal has 36 schools having 189 sections, but it has only 74 Black boards. Lingampet mandal has 30 schools having 136 sections; but it has only 70 black boards. Gandhari mandal has got 28 black boards for 36 schools having 111 sections. Domakonda mandal is the best. There are 17 schools with 71 sections. It has got 69 black boards.

It is observed that 21 out of 35 mandals require more than 50 black boards; 12 mandals and two urban areas (i.e., Nizamabad and Bodhan) require more than 20 black boards; one mandal (Morshad) requires 17 black boards. Only one mandal, namely Domakonda is well equipped in this regard. It is short of only 2 black boards.

Out of the 840 Primary schools in the district, 36 Government 695 local body, 3 private aided and 18 private un-aided schools (total 752) have drinking water facility. Coming to the Urinals, 23 Government, 286 local body, 3 private aided and 17 private unaided primary schools have the facility. Regarding provision of separate urinals for girls; 14 Govt.; 99 local body, 3 private aided and 10 private unaided primary schools have got it. There are no lavatory facilities in any of the schools. No medical checkup is done in primary schools. Of course pupils in most of the schools are vaccinated/incubated.

36 Government; 555 local body, 3 private aided and 15 private unaided Primary schools (total 609) are covered.

Out of the 840 primary schools in the district, there are local body schools with 'Zero' teachers; one in Tadwai mandal, two in Yellaraddy mandal, one in Machareddy mandal and one in Nizamabad mandal. There are 249 schools having 1 teacher each; 423 schools having 2 teachers each, 68 schools with 3 teachers; 24 schools with 4 teachers; 15 schools with five teachers and 56 schools with above 5 teachers. It is observed that about 50% of the schools are plural teacher schools and about 30% of the schools are single teacher schools. Zero teacher schools are roughly 0.6%. — **TEACHERS:** —

(i) RURAL AREA

On classification of teachers working in Primary schools according to qualification, Sex and stage at which they are teaching, it is noticed that there are 2,164 trained teachers (2025 men and 139 women) as against 179 untrained teachers (125 men and 54 women).

The trained male teachers according to their qualification are - 2 below middle passed, 252 middle passed, 874 matriculates, 631 Intermediate/Higher Secondary, 231 graduates, 24 Post graduates, 4 language teachers and 7 others. The untrained male teachers are 14 middle passed, 31 matriculates, 50 Intermediate/Higher Secondary, 16 Graduates, 11 post graduates and 3 language pandits.

The trained women teachers according to their qualification are - 15 middle passed; 76 matriculated, 7 Intermediate/Higher Secondary, 31 Graduates, 3 post graduates, 6 Language Pandits and 1 others.

The untrained women teachers are - 1 below middle passed, 1 middle passed, 26 matriculated, 13 Intermediate/higher secondary 12 Graduates, and 1 language pandit.

(ii) URBAN AREA

In the urban area of this district, there are 406 trained teachers (243 men and 163 women) and 137 untrained teachers (54 men and 83 women) at the primary stage. On classification according to qualification and sex, Out of the 243 trained men teachers there are 1 - Below middle passed, 32 middle passed, 107 Matriculates, 47 Intermediate/Higher Secondary; 45 Graduates, 5 Language pandits, and 6 others. Out of the 54 untrained men teachers there are 1 below middle passed, 2 middle passed, 35 higher secondary/Intermediate; 15 Graduates, and 1 others. Out of the 163 trained women teachers, there are 13 middle passed, 47 matriculates, 52 Inter/Higher secondary; 48

Graduates and 3 Language pandits. Out of the 83 untrained women teachers, there are 1-below middle passed, 8 middle passed, 17 matriculates, 42 Inter/Higher secondary; 11 Graduates, 3 language pandits and 1 others.

ENROLEMENT: (i) RURAL AREA.

The total enrolment in classes I to V is 1,19,033 (77,419 boys, 41,614 girls). Out of this, the enrolment of S.C.Children is 19,626 (12,944 boys, 6,682 girls). The enrolment of S. I.Children is 6,932 (5,164 boys, 1,770 girls). The percentage of enrolment is boys in general 65.04; girls in general 34.96; SC.boys to total enrolment is 10.87; SC.girls to the total enrolment is 5.61; S.I.boys to the total enrolment is 4.33; S.I.girls to the total enrolment is 1.48;

(ii) URBAN AREA

The total enrolment in classes I to V is 36,716 (20,004 boys, 16,712 girls). Out of this the enrolment of S. C.children is 3,262 (1909 boys, 1353 girls. The enrolment of S.I.children is 1,106 (626 boys, 480 girls).

There are 1,081 habitations with a total population of 13,63,994 which are served by Upper Primary Education facility within themselves or with a walking distance of 3 kms; as against 228 habitations with a population of 1,51,976 served by Upper Primary Schools facility beyond distance of 3 K.ms.

Nizamabad, Navipet, Renjal, Gandhari, Machareddy and Domakonda Mandals, have no habitations which are served by Upper Primary Schools within a walking distance of more than 3 Kms.

Pilam, Lingampet, Jukkai, Yellareddy and Nizamabagar, has more than 20 habitations each which are served by Upper Primary Schools at a distance of more than 3 Kms.

Out of the 1309 habitations in the District, 1081 habitations have already been served by an Upper Primary School/Section within themselves or within a walking distance of 3 Kms. In the remaining 228 habitations, there are 23 habitations where a new Upper Primary School/Section may be opened (since they are served by Upper Primary School at a distance of more than 3.00 Kms).

There are Upper Primary Schools in 476 Villages where the S.C. Population is upto 25% and in 92 villages where the S.C. population is between 26% and 50%. Similarly there are Upper Primary Schools in 329 villages where the S.T. Population is upto 25%, and in 10 Villages where the S.T. Population is between 25% and 50%.

There are 188 Upper Primary Schools in Rural area of this District. Out of them 183 are local Body Schools, and 5 Private un-aided ones. Coming to the Urban area, there are 49 Upper Primary Schools, of which 14 are Govg. Schools, 8 Local body Schools 6 Private Aided Schools, and 21 Private un-aided Schools.

The total number of Upper Primary Schools in the Dist. is 237. The management wise position is Govt. 14; Local Body 191, Private Aided-6, and Private un-aided -26.

Out of the 237 Upper Primary Schools, 167 Schools are housed in Pucca buildings; 43 are housed in partly pucca Buildings; 16 are housed in the Kacha buildings, 9 are housed in Thatched huts; and 2 are run in open space.

The type of buildings 186 Upper Primary Schools in Rural area is as hereunder:--

- 140 Schools are housed in pucca buildings;
- 26 are housed in partly pucca buildings;
- 11 are housed in kacha buildings;
- 9 are housed in Thatched huts and 2 are run in open space.

In the Urban area, there are 49 Schools of which 27 schools are housed in pucca buildings; 17 schools are housed in partly pucca buildings; 5 are housed in Kacha buildings.

Sadasivnagar and Gandhari Mandals have one school each run in open space. The Schools housed in Thatched huts are 2 in Sadasivnagar, (1) in Dharpally, (3) in Bichkunda, (1) in Varni and (2) in Gandhari Mandals.

Regarding the Upper Primary Schools, all the 14 Govt. Upper Primary Schools are in the Urban area and they require 5 or above class rooms each.

There are 191 Local Body Upper Primary Schools 183 in Rural area and 8 in the Urban area out of which 172 Schools require additional class rooms 94 of them require 2 rooms each and 78 of them require three rooms each.

There are 26 Private un-aided Upper Primary Schools 5 in Rural area and 21 in the Urban area out of which 11 Schools require 2 rooms each.

There are 6 Private Aided Upper Primary Schools in the Urban area only which do not require any additional rooms.

On the whole it is observed that 40 out of 237 Upper Primary Schools (have enough class rooms) do not require additional class rooms; and 197 Upper Primary Schools require additional class rooms varying from one to 5 or above five.

Regarding the availability of Library facilities in the Upper Primary Schools of this District, it is observed that all the 237 Upper Primary Schools have got Libraries. Out of them 54 Schools have 201 to 500 books; 66 schools have 101 to 200 Books and 117 Schools have upto 100 Books. The Libraries in Private Aided as well as un-aided Schools have got more number of Books than their counterparts under Local Body and Government managements.

Coming to the ancillary facilities available in Upper Primary Schools in the District, it is noted that drinking water facility is available in 219 Schools of which 12 are Govt. Schools; 181 are Local Body Schools; 6 are Private Aided schools and 20 are Private un-aided. Urinal facility is available in 192 Schools out of which 13 are Government schools; 156 are Local Body schools, (6) are Private aided schools and 17 are Private un-aided. There is 1 Separate Urinal facility for girls in 85 schools only out of which 4 are Govt. schools; 66 are Local Body Schools; 3 are Private aided schools and 12 are Private un-aided Schools.

On 8 schools under Local Bodies have lavatory facility.

When it is examined in Rural area of the District it is as under. 180 Schools have drinking water facility; 153 Schools have urinal facility; 64 Schools have separate urinal facility for Girls and 8 Schools have lavatory facility. In the Urban area, 39 Schools have drinking water facility; 39 schools have urinal facility; and 21 schools have separate urinal facility for girls. There are no Schools with lavatory facility in the Urban area.

No medical check-up is done in Upper Primary Schools.

Students in 14 Govt. Schools; 131 Local Body Schools; 6 Private Aided schools and 23 Private Un-aided schools totalling to 174 are vaccinated/incubated.

RURAL AREA:

On Classification of teachers working in Upper Primary Schools according to qualification and sex; it is noticed that there are 740 Trained teachers (634 Men and 106 Women) as against 62 un-trained teachers (36 men and 26 Women). Out of the 634 Trained Men teachers, 163 are Matriculates, 142 are Inter-Mediate /Higher Secondary; 250 are Graduates 27 are post Graduates; 36 are Language Pandits and 16 are others. Amongst un-trained men teachers are 5 Matriculates; 8 Inter-passed, 19 Graduates; 2 Post Graduates and 2 others.

Among the Trained women teachers, there are 32 Matriculates; 29 Inter passed, 22 Graduates, 6 Post-Graduates; 16 Language Pandits; and 1 others. The un-trained women teachers are 5 Matriculates; 4 Inter passed, 10 Graduates, 1 Post-Graduate and 6 Language Pandits.

URBAN AREA:

There are 482 Trained teachers (337 men and 145 Women) as against 39 un-trained teachers (18 men and 21 Women).

Among the trained men teachers, there are 84 Matriculates 79 Intermediate/ 114 Graduates, 20 Post-graduates, 30 Language Pandits and 10 others. The un-trained men teachers are 17 Graduates and one Post-Graduate.

Among the trained Women teachers, there are 46 Matriculates, 49 Inter passed, 37 Graduates and 13 Language Pandits. The un-trained Women teachers are all Graduates, 21 in number.

RURAL AREA:

The total enrolment in (rural area) classes VI-VIII is 28179 (21,469 boys and 6,710 girls). Out of this the enrolment of S.C. children is 4048 (3,345 boys and 703 girls). The enrolment of S.T. children is 726 (650 boys and 76 girls).

There are 1,186 habitations with a total population of 14,25,334 served by a secondary school facility within them or at a distance upto 8 kms; as against 123 habitations with a total population of 90,636 served by a secondary school facility at a distance of beyond 8 kms.

The habitations in 18 mandals namely Birkur, Mortad, Bhiknoor, Balkonda, Jakranpally, Nizamabad, Kotgir, Dichpally, Vailpur, Bheemgal, Navipet, Dharpally, Bodhan, Renjal, Varni, Gandhari, Machareddy and Domakonda have secondary schools serving habitations at a distance upto 8 kms. The remaining 17 mandals have secondary schools serving habitations at a distance beyond 8 kms.

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There are 720 habitations with a total population of 8,79,060 are served by a higher secondary/Jr.College facility with in them or at a distance upto 8 kms; as against 589 habitations with a total population of 6,36,910 served by a Higher Secondary/Jr.College facility at a distance beyond 8 kms.

Lingampet, Madnoor and Kotgir Mandals have no habitations served by higher secondary/jr.college at a distance of 8 kms.

Nizamabad, Bheemgal, Navipet, Dharpally, Bodhan mandals have all the habitations served by higher secondary/jr.colleges at a distance of 8 kms.

Thirteen mandals namely, Sadasivnagar, Birkur, Jakranpally, Nandipet, Pitlam, Tadwai, Lingampet, Jukkal, Madnoor, Nizamsagar, Kotgir, Dichpally and Nagareddypet have more than 20 habitations served by High secondary/Jr.College at a distance beyond 8 kms.

There are 162 secondary schools in the district, out of which there are 123 in rural area and 39 in urban area. The management wise classification of the secondary schools in rural area is Govt. - 2, Local body - 119, Private aided - 1 and private unaided - 1. In urban area there are 10 Govt. schools 9 local body schools, 11 private aided schools and 9 private unaided schools.

There are 7 higher secondary schools in rural area and 9 in urban area totalling to 16. All the 7 rural schools are Govt. schools. In the urban area, 5 are Govt. schools, 3 are Private aided schools and One private unaided school.

There are 113 secondary schools having library facilities, in the rural area as against 39 secondary schools in the urban area. 100 schools (77 rural + 23 urban) have library books between 501 and 1,000.

Library facilities are available in all the 16 higher secondary schools (i.e., 7 in the rural area and 9 in the Urban area). 12 of them have got 501 to 1000 books each, and three schools have more than 1,000 books. There is no marked difference in the availability of library facilities in the higher secondary schools between rural and urban areas.

At the Secondary school stage, large number of teachers are qualified.

Rural area: There are 673 trained teachers, (559 men and 114 women) as against 32 untrained teachers (28 men and 4 women).

Out of the 559 trained men teachers, there are 6 matriculates, 93 Intermediate/Higher secondary, 306 graduates, 65 Post graduates, 53 Language pandits and 36 others. Out of the 28 untrained men teachers, there are 8 Intermediate, 11 graduates, 7 Language pandits and 2 others.

Among the trained women teachers, there are 12 matriculates, 26 Inter/H higher secondary schools; 37 graduates; 11 Post graduates, 24 Language pandits and 4 others. The untrained women teachers are 1 matriculate, 1 Inter/higher secondary; 1 Graduate and 1 Language pandit.

Urban Area: There are 562 trained teachers (425 men and 137 women) as against 47 untrained teachers (24 men and 23 women)

Among the trained men teachers, there are 9 Intermediates, 276 Graduates, 46 Post graduates, 71 Language Pandits and 23 others. The untrained men teachers are 1-Inter, 16 Graduates and 7 Post graduates.

The trained women teachers are - 8 Intermediates, 74 Graduates, 18 Post Graduates and 37 Language Pandits. The untrained women teachers are - 3 Inters; 9 Graduates, 2 Post Graduates, 3 Language Pandits and 6 others.

At the Higher secondary stage all are Post Graduate teachers; but most of them are untrained.

In the rural area, there are 10 trained men teachers, 86 untrained men teachers and 5 untrained women teachers; in total 101.

In the urban area, there are 59 trained post graduates (48 men and 11 women) and 118 untrained one (95 men and 23 women); in total 177 (143 men and 34 women).

Out of 162, Secondary schools in the district 84 have science laboratories (i.e. 78 secondary schools do not have science laboratories). Among the 84 schools having science laboratories, 15 local body schools situated in the rural area have separate laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology. The others have combined laboratories.

In the rural area, out of the 123 secondary schools, 2 Govt. schools and 58 local body schools are without laboratories. In the urban area out of the 39 secondary schools 4 Govt. schools, 6 local body schools, 3 Private aided schools and 5 Private unaided schools do not have science laboratories.

There is no school, teaching 'Home Science'.

Out of the 16 Higher secondary schools, 13 schools have separate laboratory facilities for Physics, Chemistry and Biology, and the other 3 schools have combined laboratory facility.

There are 7 Govt. higher secondary/Junior Colleges in the rural area of them 4 have separate laboratory facilities for Physics, Chemistry and Biology; and the remaining three have combined laboratory facilities; In the urban area, there are 5 Govt., 3 Private aided and 1 private unaided Junior colleges and all of them have separate laboratory facilities for physics, Chemistry and Biology.

Even at the Higher Secondary Stage, there is no facility for teaching Home science.

There are 385 trained and 87 untrained science teachers teaching science at the secondary school stage. On classification according to their qualifications, there are 7 trained M.Sc.s. and 52 untrained M.Sc.s; 308 trained B.Sc.s and 21 untrained B.Sc.s; 69 trained Inter (Science) and 14 untrained Inter (Science); There are no teachers with M.Phil and B.Sc.(Hons.) qualifications.

At the higher secondary stage, there are 35 trained and 83 untrained science teachers with the following qualifications - 83 untrained M.Sc.s; 33 trained B.Sc.s; 2 trained Intermediates and

Rural Area:

The total enrolment in secondary classes is 8,421 boys and 2,121 girls totalling to 10,542. Out of this the enrolment of S.C. children is 1,105 boys and 282 girls totalling to 1,387. The enrolment of S.T. children is 228 (216 boys and 12 girls).

Ancillary facilities:

Out of the 162 secondary schools, there is drinking water facility in 12 Govt., 118 local body, 12 Private aided and 10 Private unaided schools.

There is no drinking water facility in 10 local body schools.

There is urinal facility in 12 Govt., 119 local body 11 private aided and 10 private unaided schools. There is no urinal facility in 9 local body schools and one private aided schools.

There is separate urinal facility for girls in 7 Govt. 35 local body, 7 private aided and 4 private unaided (total 53) schools.

There is lavatory facility in 4 Govt.; 15 local body; 4 private aided and 1 private unaided (total 24) secondary schools. No separate lavatory facility for girls available in any secondary school.

No medical checkup is done. However students in 12 Govt., 107 local body, 12 private aided and 10 private unaided (total 141) secondary schools are vaccinated/inoculated.

At the higher secondary stage, all the 16 schools have drinking water facility, urinal facility and separate urinal facility for girls - 2 Govt.Jr.Colleges do not have lavatories; but the others have lavatory facilities also. The same is the case with the separate lavatory facility for girls.

No medical checkup is done.

Students in all the Jr.Colleges are vaccinated/inoculated.

All the 16 Higher Secondary Schools/Junior Colleges offer instructions in Arts, Science and Commerce subjects. Instruction in vocational courses is offered in 2 Govt.Jr. Colleges only.

CHAPTER - V

NON FORMAL EDUCATION:

There are 540 Non Formal Education centres in 540 villages and 74 N.F.E.Centres in 7 Urban areas.

The total enrolment of children in these centres is - Boys 16,315; Girls 2,728 and total 19,043 in the rural centres; as against boys 983, girls 1,009 and total 1,992 in the Urban centres, grand total of enrolment is:

Boys - 17,298; Girls - 3,737; Total: 21,035.

The enrolment in the N.F.E.Centres in Urban area Nizamabad is the highest in the district with 524 boys, 588 girls totalling to 1,112. In respect of girls enrolment too, the urban area tops the list. Next comes centres in Bichkunda mandal with an enrolment of 785 boys and 227 girls totalling to 1,012.

The enrolment is the lowest in Jakranpally mandal with 210 boys and 84 girls totalling to 294. The enrolment in Charpally mandal is also low with 245 boys and 27 girls totalling to 272.

The enrolment of girls is quite better in urban area than that in rural area. In the rural area, the enrolment of girls in Birkur and Banswada mandals is better than the others.

ADULT EDUCATION:

There are 291 Adult Education centres - 182 for men and 109 for women in rural area with a total enrolment of 5,460 men and 3,270 women totalling to 8,730; as against 9 centres - 1 for men and 8 for women in urban area with a total enrolment of 30 men and 240 women totalling to 270.

All the 300 centres are run by the Government. No private agency managing the centres in this district.

There are no schools for the disabled (Handicapped) in this district.

There are no facilities of pre-primary education in the form of Balwadi/Anganwadi/independent pre-primary schools/Pre-primary class attached to schools.
