This volume on District-wise educational Statistics for the state of Haryana is the sixteenth in the series of such volumes which will be brought out for all the states and Union Territories. The main aim is to highlight the Inter-District variations in a state by giving educational data at district levels with the help of some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, pupil teacher ratio and area served by a school etc.

In order to ascertain whether the educational imbalances have widened or narrowed down with time, the data for the year 1981-82 have been analysed and compared with that of 1976-77.

I would take this opportunity to place on record my appreciation of the cooperation received from the Director of Public Instruction, Haryana and the project staff of the Planning, Monitoring and Statistics Division who have prepared this report.

I N T R O D U C T I O N

Regional imbalances exist in the field of Educational Development too just as in urbanisation, industrialisation, distribution of income and wealth. With a view to high light national variations in the educational sector, the Ministry of Human Resource Development brings out the publication Educational Statistics-District-wise quinquennially.

2. A volume of this nature was first published by National Council of Educational Research and Training in 1960-61. There after it was decided that such reviews will be brought out in respect of each state every five years by the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Accordingly the reviews for the year 1965-66 were brought out by this Ministry in respect of some states. However for the quinquennial year 1976-77 such reviews were brought out for all the states and union territories with legislature.

3. For making inter district comparisons possible, some important indices such as Enrolment Ratio, percentage of trained teachers and teacher pupil ratio etc. have been worked out. These indices show wide range of variations between the districts and are of much need for formulating educational plans at the district level.

II. AREA AND POPULATION

4. The area of Haryana State is 44,212 sq. kms. as per 1981 Census. It had 11 districts in 1976 but in 1981 a new district namely Faridabad was formed making 12 districts in the State. The area of this new district is 2,150 sq. kms affecting the area of other districts of the State. The district wise area in Haryana varies from 2.1 thousand Sq. kms in case of Faridabad district to 5.1 thousand Sq. Kms. in case of Bhiwani district in 1981.

5. The estimated population of Haryana State was 114.3 lakhs (60.8 lakhs males and 53.5 lakhs females) (estimated) in 1976-77 whereas the Census population was 133.0 lakhs (71.1 lakhs males and 61.9 lakhs females) in 1981. The population varies among the districts from 15.4 lakhs in Hissar district followed by Ambala 14.5 lakhs to the lowest of 7.3 lakhs in Sirsa district.

6. The overall density of population per sq. km. was 258 in 1977 which increased to 301 in 1981 at State Level. The density of population in 1981 varied widely among the districts from 479 the highest in Faridabad (newly formed) district to 170 the lowest in Sirsa. The area, total population and density of population for different districts for the year 1977 and 1981 are given in Appendix No. 2. Table No. 1 below gives a general view of the extent of variation in area, population and the density at population in 1981.

7. The population of the State of different age-groups for the year 1977 and 1982 given in this report are based on the revised population (as on 1st March of the year) available from the office of the Registrar General of India. District-wise population in the age-groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 are based on the following formula:-

8. To get the sex-wise break-up of total population in the various age-groups of the districts, first the population of girls is estimated by using the above formula. The boys population is obtained by subtracting girls population from total estimated population.

9. The total population of children in the age-group 6-11 was 16.59 lakhs (8.76 lakhs boys and 7.83 lakhs girls) in 1977 which is estimated to have increased to 17.77 lakhs (9.42 lakhs boys and 8.35 lakhs girls) by 1982. In 1982, 6-11 age-group population formed 13.4% of the total population.

10. The total population of children in the age-group 11-14 was 9.29 lakhs (4.98 lakhs boys and 4.31 lakhs girls) in 1977 which is estimated to have increased to 10.24 lakhs (5.51 lakhs boys and 4.73 lakhs girls) by 1982. The percentage of population in the age-group 11-14 to total population in 1982 was 7.7 %.

11. Similarly the population in the age-group 14-17 in 1977 was 8.59 lakhs (4.63 lakhs boys and 3.96 lakhs girls) which is estimated to have increased to 12.38 lakhs (6.70 lakhs boys and 5.68 lakhs girls) by 1982. Population in the age-group 14-17 formed 9.3 % of the total population in 1982.

12. Out of the total Census population of 133.02 lakhs in 1981 of the State, the school going population in the age-group 6-17 years was 40.38 lakhs consisting of 21.63 lakhs boys and 18.75 lakhs girls. The population in the age-group 6-17 years constituted 30.4% of the total population. The percentage for boys was 16.3 % while for girls it was 14.1 %. The district-wise population of different age-groups is given in Appendix No.3.

III. LITERACY

13. According to the 1981 Census the effective literacy Rate i.e. the number of literates per hundred of the population in the Haryana State is 36.1 %. The literacy rates for males and females is 48.2 and 22.3 % per hundred respectively. The highest literacy is in Ambala 44.6 and the lowest in Jind 26.2. The literacy rate of Scheduled Castes is 20.1 at state level. The details are given in the Appendix No. 6.

IV. GENERAL VIEW:-

(a) INSTITUTIONS :-

14. The total number of Educational Institutions in Haryana was 8325 in 1976-77 which increased to 10,884 by 1981-82 showing an increase of 30.7 % during the

period of 5 years. Ambala district had the largest share of Institutions 13.9 % whereas Sonapat had the lowest 5.2 % in 1981-82. There is no Intermediate/Pre-degree junior colleges in the State. The district wise position of Institutions is given in Appendix No. 1.

(b) ENROLMENT :

15. The total enrolment in all Recognised Educational Institutions in the State increased from 17.87 lakhs in 1976-77 to 20.34 lakhs in 1981-82. The enrolment increased with an average annual growth rate of 3.32 %. Rohtak had the largest share in Enrolment i.e. 12.0 % whereas Sirsa had the lowest share of enrolment i.e. 4.6 % in 1981-82. District-wise position of enrolment and percent age share is given in Appendix No. 1.

16. The percentage of Girls Enrolment to Total Enrolment was 29.6 in 1976-77 which increased to 32.4 by 1981-82. Among the districts Ambala had the maximum (38.7 %) of girls enrolment to total enrolment whereas Jind had the minimum 25.0% in 1981-82. Out of 12 districts Six districts in which percentage of girls enrolment was below to that of State percentage. Details are shown in Appendix No. 4.

(c) EXTENT OF COVERAGE OF SCHEDULED CASTES

17. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes or the co-efficient of equality is defined as :-

18. In Haryana the percentage of Scheduled Castes students to total number of students was 14.8 % (16.6 % for boys and 12.9 for girls) in 1981-82. The percentage of Scheduled Castes population to total population was 18.5 %. Therefore the extent of coverage or co-efficient of equality at state level works out to be 30.0 %. The highest extent of coverage of Scheduled Caste students was in Gurgaon 105.1 % and the lowest in Sirsa 59.6 %. There are seven districts which reported extent of coverage less than that the State level. District-wise position for Scheduled Castes students can be seen from Appendix 7. There are no Scheduled Caste schools in Haryana.

(d) TEACHERS : -

19. The total number of teachers in the State in all educational Institutions increased from 55,947 in 1976-77 to 57,613 in 1981-82, showing an increase of 2.9 % during this period. Rohtak had the largest share of teachers 12.6 % whereas Sirsa had the smallest i.e. 4.2 %. Details may be seen in Appendix No. 1.

20. - In 1981-82, the total number of teachers upto school level was 57,613 (39,228 males and 18,385 females) out of which 57,358 (39,094 males and 18,264 females) were trained. The percentage of trained teachers to the number of males, females and total number of teachers in school education was 99.7 %, 99.3 % and 99.5 % respectively. The percentage of trained Teachers to total number of Teachers had minor variation among the districts of the States, viz., 100.0 % in three district Jind, Karnal and Kurukshetra & lowest of 92.6 % in Rohtak. Details may be seen in Appendix No. 5.

V- PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

21. The number of recognised Pre-Primary Schools in Haryana increased from 7 in 1976-77 to 27 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 285.7 % during the period of 5 years. Faridabad had not any pre-primary school. The four districts Bhiwani, Kurukshetras, Sirsa and Sonapat each had 5 pre-primary schools out of 27 schools in the State in 1981-82.

Number of teachers in Pre-Primary schools increased from 13 in 1976-77 to 34 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 161.5 %.

22. Enrolment in Pre-Primary schools as also the Enrolment in Pre-Primary and Nursery classes increased from 1,527 (827 boys and 700 girls) in 1976-77 to 2,852 (1,468 boys and 1,384 girls) by 1981-82. In 1976-77 out of 1,527 only 38 (2.5 %) students (23 boys and 15 Girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes, whereas in 1981-82 the enrolment percentage of S.C. was four. 15.5 %. District-wise position is given in Appendix No. 8. It has been observed that of these 27 pre-primary schools the substantial number viz. 12 existed in Rural Areas. Accordingly the major part of the enrolment viz, 212 (53.18 %) belongs to the Rural belt. District-wise details are given in Appendix. 9.

VI - PRIMARY EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

23. Total number of Primary Schools in Haryana State decreased from 5145 in 1976-77 to 4,940 in 1981-82. The decrease is due to upgrading of some primary Schools and some of them being merged with middle schools. The highest percentage share of Primary Schools was in Ambala (15.6 %) and the lowest in Sonapat (3.9 %). Average area served by a Primary School was 2.6 Sq. Kms. Whereas facility of separate Primary School slightly declined as for an average area of 3.9 Sq. Kms a primary school was available in 1981-82.

The average area served by a Primary School was minimum in Ambala (4.9 Sq. kms.) and maximum in Hissar district (18.2 sq. kms.). The District-wise details are given in Appendix No. 10.

24. The average population served by a Primary school in the State was 2,221 in 1976-77 but the facilities slightly declined as on an average a primary school was available for 2,093 in 1981-82. Among the districts the facilities of Primary Schools was maximum in Mahendragarh as on average a primary school served 1,632 persons whereas it was minimum in case of Rohtak as for 4,898 persons only a primary school was available. Details are given in Appendix- 10.

25. The total number of teachers in primary Schools in Haryana decreased from 17,110 in 1976-77 to 14,567 in 1981-82. In 1981-82 the highest percentage share of teachers was in Ambala district i.e. 13.37 % and the lowest in Sirsa district i.e. 4.67%. Women Teachers formed 50.56% of the total teachers in Primary Schools in 1981-82. The District-wise details are given in Appendix No.12.

Enrolment:

26. In 1981-82, the total enrolment in Primary Schools in Haryana decreased from 6,85,642 in 1976-77 to 6,08,558 in 1981-82. This is due to decrease in Primary schools. In classes I-V, however, the enrolment increased from 11,67,530 (7,91,918 boys and 3,75,612 girls) in 1976-77 to 13,07,131 (8,52,191 boys and 4,54,940 girls) during this period, with an average Annual increase of 2.39 %.

27. The percentage of enrolment in Classes I-V to the corresponding population in the Age-Group 6-11 (also called the enrolment Ratio) gives an index of the facilities created at Primary stage of education. In Haryana, this percentage increased from 70.4 % to 73.6 % during the period under review. In case of boys, the enrolment ratio slightly increased from 90.4 % to 90.5 % and for girls the increase was from 48.0 % to 54.5 %. In 1981-82, the enrolment ratio was maximum 88.0 % in Kurukshetra and minimum in Sirsa 64.9 %. In 6 districts, the enrolment ratio works out below the corresponding ratio at state level. In case of girls the enrolment ratio varied from 67.7 % in Sonapat to 36.5 % in Jind.

The total number of teachers in Primary Schools was 14,567 (10,100 men and 4,467 women). The pupil teacher ratio was 42. It is also interesting to note that 100.0 % teachers both men & women were trained in the primary schools. District-wise details are given in Appendix No. 12.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES

∠ pupils

28. In 1981-82, out of 13.07 lakhs ∠ in Classes I-V, 2.31 lakhs belonged to ∠ of the total Scheduled Castes forming 17.7 % ∠ of the total enrolment. Hence the extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes in these classes works out to be 95.68 %. District-wise details of enrolment of Scheduled Castes and its percentages etc. are given in Appendix No. 13.

PRIMARY EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

29. In 1981-82 of the total 4,940 primary schools, 4,546 (92 %) were located in rural areas. The largest number of primary schools have been reported in Rural Areas of Ambala 710 followed by Mahendergarh 537 and the minimum viz. 143 in Sonapat.

Total enrolment in all primary schools located in Rural Areas of the state was 5,17,545. At the same time, the enrolment in Primary classes I-V in Rural Areas was 11.05 lakhs (7.30 lakhs boys and 3.75 lakhs girls). District-wise details are given in Appendix No.14.

HABITATIONS WITH OR WITHOUT PRIMARY SCHOOLS

30. Appendix No. 15 depicts position of primary schools in habitations of the state. Out of total number of 7,442 habitations in Haryana, 6,392 (86 %) habitations were having a primary school in them. Remaining 1,050 habitations were covered by a primary school within a distance of 2 kms. from the habitation.

VII - MIDDLE EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

31. The total number of Middle Schools in the State increased from 754 in 1976-77 to 947 in 1981-82 showing an average annual increase of 5.12 % during the period of 5 years. In 1981-82, the largest number of middle schools were reported in Hissar (14.36 %) and lowest in Faridabad (5.17 %).

32. On an average, a middle school served an area of 58.6 Sq. Kms in 1976-77. The position improved by 1981-82, as there was a middle school available for every 46.7 Sq. Kms. In 1981-82, middle school facilities were the highest in Mahendergarh as for every 30.4 Sq. Kms a school was available but lowest in case of Sirsa (63.8 Sq.Kms). \angle the

33. The population served by a middle school in the State was 15,136 in 1976-77 but the facility slightly 'improved' as a middle school was available for 14,046 persons in 1981-82. Among the districts, the population served by a middle school in 1981-82 varied from 9,975 in Mahendergarh to 21,026 in Faridabad. Details are given in Appendix No. 16. The number of teachers in Middle schools increased from 8,337 in 1976-77 to 8,739 in 1981-82. District-wise particulars are given in Appendix No. 18.

ENROLMENT

34. The total enrolment in Middle schools was 2.73 lakhs in 1976-77 which increased to 3.11 lakhs in 1981-82 showing an average annual increase of 2.81%. The enrolment at middle stage i.e. in classes VI-VIII, increased from 3,84,789 (2,90,149 boys and 94,640 girls) in 1976-77 to 4,98,913 (3,69,647 boys and 1,29,266 girls) in 1981-82. This shows an average annual increase of 5.93%. The average annual enrolment increase separately for boys and girls works out to be 5.48% and 7.32% respectively. The district-wise details are given in Appendix No. 17.

35. The percentage of enrolment in Classes VI-VIII to corresponding population in the Age-group 11-14 years, i.e. enrolment ratio, gives an index of facilities available at the middle stage of education. In Haryana, this percentage was 41.4% (58.3% for boys and 22.0% for girls) in 1976-77 which increased to 48.7% (67.1% for boys and 27.3% for girls) in 1981-82. In 1981-82 the enrolment ratio was the highest in Sonapat District 66.2% and the lowest in Sirsa 33.4%. In 7 districts, the enrolment ratio was below to that at State level. District-wise position is given in Appendix No. 17 & 18.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES

36. Of the total enrolment of 3,84,789 in classes VI-VIII 36,551 (33,083 boys and 3,468 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes in 1976-77 forming 9.50% of the total enrolment. In 1981-82 out of total enrolment of 3,11,372 in these classes, 57,029 (47,950 boys and 9,079 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes forming 18.32%. Hence the co-efficient of equality for Scheduled Castes works out to be 99.03%. District-wise particulars are given in Appendix No. 19.

MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

37. Out of 947 middle schools in the state, 899 were located in Rural Areas. Hissar district reported the highest number of rural middle schools (130) and the lowest number was in Faridabad (37). Total enrolment in rural middle schools was 2.89 lakhs in 1981-82. But at the same time the total enrolment in middle classes was 3.65 lakhs which form 73.1% of enrolment of classes VI-VIII in the State. District-wise position are given in Appendix No. 20.

HABITATIONS WITH OR WITHOUT MIDDLE SCHOOLS

38. Appendix No. 21 depicts position of middle schools in habitations of the State out of the total number of 7,442 habitations in Haryana, only 1,824 had middle schools within them. 2,790 habitations were having middle schools up to 2 kms and 2622 habitations having middle schools from 2 to 5 kms.

39. ENROLMENT BY STANDARD

Appendix 22 depicts standard-wise enrolment from class I to VIII. At state level, the decreasing trend of enrolment in each class over the previous class has been observed showing the extent of dropouts. The % enrolment of class VIII to that of Class I worked out to be 53.4% and of Class VIII to the Class I as 42.7 %.

VIII - HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

40. There were 1,143 High/Higher secondary schools in 1976-77 which increased to 1581 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 38.3 % during the period of 5 years. These schools included 1474 High, 8 Higher Secondary schools of 10+2 pattern and 99 Higher Secondary Schools (Old Pattern) in 1981-82. Among the districts, the largest number of High/Higher Secondary schools (210) existed in Rohtak and the smallest number of schools in Sirsa (64) during 1981-82.

41. On an average, there was a High/Higher Secondary school for every 38.7 Sq. Kms. in 1976-77. By 1981-82 the position improved considerably and a school was then available for every 27.9 Sq. Kms. In 1981-82, in Sonapat district a High/Higher Secondary school was available for every 17.9 Sq. Kms. whereas in Sirsa district a school was available for an area of 66.8 Sq. Kms.

42. At the state level, there was a High/Higher Secondary school available for every 9,998 persons in 1976-77. By 1981-82, a High/Higher Secondary school was available for every 8413 persons. Among the districts, the average population served by a High/Higher secondary school varied from as high as 11,372 in case of Sirsa district to as low as 6578 in Rohtak district during 1981-82. District-wise details of High/Higher Secondary schools are given in Appendix No. 23. Showing better educational facilities this stage.

43. The total number of teachers in High/Higher Secondary Schools in Haryana increased from 24,843 in 1976-77 to 34,247 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 37.9 % during the period of five years. The increase in teachers was observed in all the districts except Gurgaon. Women teachers formed 31.8 % of total number of teachers in 1981-82. District-wise particulars are given in Appendix No. 25.

ENROLMENT

44. The total enrolment in High/Higher Secondary schools of the State was 7,07,541 in 1976-77 which increased to 10,85,383 in 1981-82, showing an average annual increase of 10.68 %. The enrolment in Classes IX-XI in 1976-77 was 1,15,519 (88,186 boys and 27,333 girls). In 1981-82 the total enrolment in classes IX-XI increased to 1,97,658 (1,49,640 boys and 48,018 girls) showing an average annual increase of 14.22 %. The average annual increase in enrolment of boys and girls separately works out to be 13.94 % and 15.13 % respectively.

45. The enrolment ratio for Haryana State at the High/Higher Secondary stage i.e., in classes IX-XI increased from 13.5 % (19.1 % for boys and 6.9 % for girls) in 1976-77 to 16.0 % (22.3 % for boys and 8.5 % for girls) in 1981-82. Among the districts in 1981-82, the enrolment ratio varied from the highest 23.2 % in Rohtak to the lowest of 10.2 % in Sirsa district. Details are given in Appendix No. 24.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES

46. Of the total enrolment of 1,15,519 in classes IX-XI, 9,309 (8,722 boys and 587 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes in 1976-77 forming 8.0 % of the total enrolment in these classes. In 1981-82, out of 1,97,658 enrolled in classes IX-XI, 19,500 (17,856 boys and 1,644 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes forming

9.9 % of the total enrolment in these classes. Thus the co-efficient of equality for scheduled Castes works out to be 53.5 %. District-wise details of Scheduled Caste enrolment its corresponding percentages are given in Appendix No. 26.

HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

47. Out of 1581 High/Higher Secondary Schools in the State 1193 were located in Rural Areas. The largest number of them was in Rohtak district during 1981-82. At the same time of the total enrolment in High/Higher Secondary schools (Rural+Urban) in the State, 7,91,101 or 72.9 % belonged to that of Rural Areas. Enrolment in classes IX to XI also works out to be 1,24,199 (1,00,980 boys and 23,219 girls) for rural areas. This enrolment forms 62.8 % of total enrolment in the state. District-wise particulars are given in Appendix No. 27.

PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL AND OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION

48. The number of schools for professional, vocational, special and other (School) Education in 1976-77 were 1054 which rose to 3389 in 1981-82 showing an increase of 221.5 % during the period of 5 years.

49. Total enrolment in professional, Vocational, special and other (School) education increased from 21,640 (17,630 boys and 4010 girls) in 1976-77 to 83,748 (40,192 boys and 43,552 girls) in 1981-82. Out of 21,640 students in these Classes in 1976-77, 1,325 (1021 boys and 304 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes forming 6.1 % to total enrolment in these Classes. In 1981-82 out of 83,748 students, only 58 (53 boys and 5 girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes forming 0.07 % of the total number of students in these classes. Number of teachers in Professional, Vocational, Special and other type of Schools increased from 383 in 1976-77 to 3426 in 1981-82. District-wise details are given in Appendix No. 28
