In order to bring about a radical change in the Education system prevailing in India, which was a long felt demand, the New Education Folicy and programme of action was formulated and it was announced on 5th January'85 by the Hcn'ble Frime Minister of India after nation wide debate and discussion in both the "Lck Sabha" and the "Rajya Sabha" and approval by both the two houses of the parliament. The effective implimentation of it however required first the collection of Data on Education through out the country in order to asses the achievement of existing system of Education in India. The 5th All India Education survey was therefore conducted throughut the country with the reference date as 30/9/86. In view of this, a training programme was organised at Fasighat to conduct survey at Block Level, District Level and State Level in Arunachal Iradesh. Accordingly collection of Data, their scruting followed by compilation at Block Level for all the 5 Dlocks of Tirap District, which include 2 Blocks of the then Changlang Sub-Division also was done with the reference date 36/9/36.

The information's were supplied by the Head of the Institutes in the District and compiled by the ADEC/ Supervisor of the respective Blocks as authorised by the Directorate of Lublic Instruction, Government of Arunachal Tradesh, Naharlagun. Finally the work of preparation of Dist. tables was shouldered to the Asstt. Dist. Education Officer (Hw) with the help of Supervisor, Kanubari and Laju. Basing on these datas of District Level, a report has been prepared the first part of which deals with the summary of the main findings with details of Trimary, Upper Trimary, Decondary and Higher Secondary schools as well as the habitation with and without the schools and the 2nd part of the report deals with the facilities available in schools including details of Teachers in the schools.

The resconsibility of preparing District Survey report was shouldered by Shri K.Frasad, Assistant Dist. Education officer, Headquarter, who had to work hard to prepare report besides his normal routine.

BRIEF REPORT ON EDUCATIONAL SURVEY::

PART-I

GENERAL INFORMATION:-"Tirap District" was in existence as Tirap Frontier Tract long before 1954. Readjustment and redesigning of Administrative units were made in the year 1954 as a result "Tirap Frontier Tract" was renamed as the "Tirap Frontier Division" with it's Headquarter at Khela. Later on in the year 1957 the Headquarter of Tirap Frontier Division was shifted to Khensa.

From 1.9.1965, the nomenclature of the "Frontier Division" were changed to "District" and Tirap Frontier Division assumed the name of "Tirap District" with it's Headquarter at Khonsa. Tirap exists as one important District of Arunachal Pradesh though the state assumed the form of "Union Territory" in 1972 and later on as full fledge state in 2/1988. It was Nov'1987 that "Tirap District gave birth to one more District i.e. Changlang District with it's Headquarter at Changlang. But as the Education survey was conducted with date of refrence as 30/9/1986, hence almost all information collected and given in this book belong to "Unitedided Tirap District" consisting of Changlang District and Tirap District both".

The entire undevided Tirap District has been devided into five "Community Development Blocks" each under the charge of Extra Assistant Commissioner/Circle Officer as the Ex-Officio Block Development Officer. The namber of villages, population of each Block as per the 5th All India Education Survey as on 30th September 1989 is given below.

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Tirap District is bounded by Burma in the South as well as East Nagaland and Assam in the West and Assam and Lohit District of Arunachal Pradesh in the North.

The area of underided Tirap District was 7024 Sq.km. The District was predominantly inhabited by the local scheduled Tribe viz "Nocte", Wangchu" Tangsa and "Singpho". People of other communities were outsiders who were temporarily staying here for their livelyhood only. The population count of 1981 in respect of Tirap District reveals that there were 1,28,650 which constitutes 21.79% of total population of Arunachal Pradesh which was the highest population amongst all other District of Arunachal Pradesh. The population of the scheduled Tribe was 79,957 which was again the second largest as per 1981 census and it was 62.15% of the total population of this District. The population of scheduled Tribe Male was 40,530 and Scheduled Tribe Female was 39,427. This showed Male and Female Scheduled Tribe was approximately same. The population of scheduled casts as per 1981 census was 234 only which was very negligible and those had come from outside Arunachal Pradesh.

The population of scheduled casts in comparision to the total population of this District was only 0.18%. The density of population in Tirap District was 18 in comparision to 8 in the state per Sq.km.

The Literacy rate of Tirap District was 19.33% out of which 27.68% was the literacy rate of male and only 9.68% was the literacy rate of female. Out of 24,866 total literate in population, the percentage of male and female literate in the District come 76.74% and 23.25% respectively.

The District is one of the most industrially based District. The industries are mainly wood based industries, cil based industries, coal based industries and also the Tea-Plantation.

2 FIFTH ALL INDIA EDUCATION SURVEY.

The 5th All India Education Survey was started in the District as per Government Instruction and guideline vide letter No.ED/ES/4/87 Dated 17th March 1987.

In view of this a training programme was organised at Pasighat in collaboration with the NCERT, New Delhi. The following ADEOs/Adult Education Supervisors attended the training programme. No any DEC out of these two attended the programme which was conducted for 7 days with effect from 18th April 187 to 25th April 187 both days inclusive.

1) Shri K.Frasad, ADEC, Khonsa as Block Survey Officer Namsang Block.

2) Shri R. Chaturvedi, AES, Laju, as B.S.C. Wakka Pongchau Block.

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- 3) Shri M.D. Ram, AES, Kanubari, as B.S.C. Niausa Block.
- 4) Shri J.K.Chakravorty, ADEC, Changlang, As B.S.C. Changlang Block.
- 5) Shri N.Sukumaran, AES, Bordumsa as B.S.O. Khagam Block.

Che school information form(S.I.F) and one village information form(V.I.F) for each of the villages/habitations were received from the State Survey Officer, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, Itanagar by the respective Block Survey Officer(B.S.C.) of 5 Blocks of this District for Survey.

The Block Survey Officer visited villages and imparted training to the Headmasters/ Teacher In-charges of schools regarding procedures followed for "data collection" from each and every villages/schools allotted to them. They started their work with effect from July 1987 and submitted duly filled up FIF and SIF in the month of August 1987 to the Block Survey Officer of that Block.

The Block Survey Officer checked/ scrutinised all informations collected from the schools and villages and these informations were tabulated Rick Blockwise. The state Survey Officer visited the District and examined and conducted sample scrutiny of the VIF and SIF and then he gave instruction and guidelines for final Tabulation of the Block-Tables. All Block Tables thus compiled were ggain scrutinised/checked by the State survey officer during his second trip to the District Headquarter and again by the "NCERT" experts at Naharlagun. There guidelines/Instructions were given by the expert of the NCERT and the B.S.C. Namsang Block was given the responsibility to prepare District Tables with the assistance of B.S.C. Naiusa and B.S.C. Wakka-Fongchau Block. The prepared District table was scrutinised and checked thoroughly by the State Survey Officer at Naharlagun.

As per District Table compilation it was found that there were 369 villages with the estimated population 1,52,137 in the District as on 30/9/1986.

The following catagories of the schools were functioning in the ν istrict.

- A. Higher Sec. School :- 6 Nos including 1 Private Aided.
- B. Secondary School :- 9 Nos including 2 Private Aided.
- C. Middle School :-29 Nos
- D. Primary School :-181 Nos including 1 private aided. (including IV.School)
- E. Fre-Frimary School :-44 Nos.

CHAPTER-II

1. BLOCKWISE HABITATION WITH AND WITHOUT PRIMARY SCHOOLS:

NAMSANG BLCCK: There were 73 Primary Sections within 69 habitations out of 88 habitation covering the total population 39,480. Five habitations were having primary section at a distance of 1 km. covering the population 4,458 and 14 habitations were having primary sections at a distance of more than 1 km. covering 1534 population. This is because of seattered habitations and sparsely population.

NIAUSA BLOCK :- There were 32 habitations out of which 26 primary sections were functioning within 26 habitations covering a population of 20,310.Cne habitation was having primary section at a distance of 1 km.with 160 population and 5 habitations than 1 km. with 325 population when which is only 1.50 % of the total population 20,795.This is due to seattered habitations and sparsely population.

WAKKA-PINGCHAU BLICK:- There were 21 habitations out of which 15 habitations were having 15 primary sections within the habitations covering 12,925 population. One habitation was having one primary section at a distance of 1 km. with 1830 population. Only 5 habitations were having primary sections at a distance of more than 1 km. which cover 3127 population and is 17.4% of the total population.

KHAGAM BLCCK:- There were 129 habitations out of which 48 habitations were having 50 primary sections within the habitation covering a hepulation of 29,825. There were 33 habitations with 10,498 population where primary sections lie at a distance of 1 km. 50 habitations were having primary section at a distance of more than 1 km. which cover 9978 population.

CHANGLANG BLCCK:- There were 103 habitations cut of which 57 habitations were having 57 primary section covering a population of 18,395.6 habitations were having primary section at a distance of 1 km. 42 habitations with 3983 population have primary section at a distance of more than 1 km. This is due to seattered habitations and sparsely population.

DISPARITIES:- There were a sufficient no of habitations which were very thinly populated Habitations were also seattered enough. Changlang Block had 38 habitations within a population of 100, Khagam Block had 26 such habitations and Namsang Block had 12 such habitations. Wakka-Fongchau Block villages had got communication problems.

2. NUMBER OF HADITATIONS SERVED WITH FRIMARY SCHOOL.

There were 377 habitations in this District out of which 261 habitations were served with primary sections covering 87.54% of the total population i.e. 1,52,137 of this District.Further 28 habitations out of the remaining villages, were selected for opening of primary school/section as per criteria. Thus a total 95.18% population is served with primary school/section after opening of schools in 28 habitations.

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3 VILLAGES ACCURDING TO PROPERTION OF ST/SC.

(i) 27 villages were having the scheduled caste population up to 25% and out of these habitations, 20 habitations were covered with primary section/school.(ii) 49 villages were having 0% scheduled caste population cut of which 12 villages have primary section within it.(iii) 32 villages were having scheduled population up to 25% and out of which 16 villages were having primary section/school within it. 20 villages were having scheduled Tribe population from 25% to 50% out of which 14 villages were having primary section within it. 17 villages were having scheduled Tribe population above 50% to 75% out of which 10 villages were having primary school/section within it. 251 villages were having scheduled Tribe population above 75% out of which 165 villages have primary section/school facility within it.

4. NUMBER OF PRIMARY SCHOOL ACCORDING TO MANAGEMENT:-

Out of total 181 primary schools under the Listrict 180 primary were running under the management of the State Government and remaining 1 primary school was managed by voluntary agencies i.e. Vivekanand Kendra Aided by the Govt. All schools were in Kural areas.

5. PRIMARY SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO TYPE OF BUILDINGS:

tut of 181 total primary schools of this District, 33 primary schools were having rucca school building 15 were having partly pucca i.e. MIB Type, 37 were Katchna school buildings and 96 schools were having thatched hut i.e. CB Type school buildings. All are in Rural areas.

6. PRIMARY SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO NO OF INSTRUCTIONAL ROOMS:

48 Primary schools were having one instructional room, 87 primary schools were having two instructional rooms 26 schools were having 3 instructional rooms, 11 schools were having 4 instructional rooms and 8 schools were having 5 instructional rooms in schools.

7.PRIMARY SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO ADDITIONAL ROOMS REQUIRED;

28 Primary schools required one additional room, 31 primary schools required two additional rooms, 55 primary schools required three additional rooms, 34 primary schools required four additional rooms, and 1 primary school required Five additional rooms for the school.

8. BLCCKWISE FRIMARY SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO AVAILABILITY OF BLACK BOARD:-

NAMSANG BLCCK:- 60 Primary schools were having 281 Primary sections out of which 144 sections were having Black Board.

NIAUSA BLCCK :- 22 Primary schools were having 101 primary sections out of which 52 sections hav

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have usable Black Board.

WAKKA-P(NGCHAU BLCCK:- 13 Primary schools had 55 sections out of which 22 sections have usable Black Board.

KHAGAM BLCCK:- 37 Primary Schools have 172 sections out of which 143 sections had usable Black Board.

CHANGLANG BLCCK: 49 Primary school had 243 sections out of which 124 sections usable Black Board.

The school which are away from the Read had neighter craft centre nor wood work shop to make the Black Board in sections.

9. PRIMARY SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO ANCILLARY FACILITIES.

Primary schools have drinking water facilities 70 primary schools have urinal facilities,42 primary schools have separate urinals for girls.15 Frimary schools have Lavatory facilities. 5 Primary schools have separate lavatory for girls.11 Primary schools have got medical check up facilities. 70 Frimary schools have got vaccination/Innoculation facilities.

10 NUMBER OF SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO TEACHER POSITION.

Nansang Block: Cut of 60 Frimary schools 38 schools are single teacher schools, 13 schools had two teachers, 6 schools had three teachers, 1 each had four, five and six teachers.

Niausa Block: -cut of 22 Frimary schools in total 17 schools had one teacher in each, 3 schools had two teachers in each and 2 schools had three teachers.

Wakka-Fongchau Block: -cut of 13 Frimary Schools, 11 schools had 1 teacher in each, only 2 schools had 2 teachers in each.

Khagam Block: Gut of 37 Primary Schools 22 schools had 1 teacher in each, 12 schools had 2 teachers in each, one each school had four, seven and eight teachers respectively.

Changlang Block: Out of 49 Primary Schools, 39 had 1 teacher in each, 7 schools had 2 teachers in each, 1 school had three teachers and two schools had 7 teachers in each.

Thus in the District, 127 Frimary schools are single teacher school which is only due to (i) shortage of teacher &(ii) thin enrolment of schools.

11 TEACHERS AT PRIMARY STAGES:

Cut of 145 male untrained teachers serving in primary schools, 2 are Middle pass, 15 are Matriculate, 11 are H.S.Fass, 111 are graduate, and 6 are post Graduate.

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Out of 24 Female untrained Teachers serving in primary schools, 3 are middle pass, 6 are P.U.C. and 13 are Graduate.

Besides these there are 101 Male Trained Teachers and 12 Female Trained Teachers who are serving in primary school.

12.SCHEDULES CASTE/SCHEDULED TRIBE ENROLMENT:

There were 60 Boys and 42 Girls under SC Group and 6429 Boys and 2478 Girls of Scheduled Tribe studying. in primary schools in Tirap District.

13. INDICATORS OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

The age specific enrolment ratio of the students in primary schools was where the ration of the boys to girls was...... The entire area comes under rural. The less enrolment of girls is due to the Sccio-Ecomomic condition of the villages.

The pupil teacher ration was......in the primary level. Some schools had more and some had less students. The Teachers were posted against the school and less weightage was given to the enrolment. This was just to keep all school functioning.

CHAPTER-III UFFER PRIMARY EDUCATION

1. BLOCKWISE HABITATION WITH AND WITHOUT UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOLS/SECTIONS IN RULAL AREAS.

42 Habitations were served with 44 Upper Frimary sections within the habitations out of which 12 were in Namsang Block with a population 13069, 4 were in Niausa Block with 3,666 population, 2 were in Wakka-Fongchau Block with 455 population, 14 in Khagam Block with 12,445 population and 10 habitations were in Changlang Block with 9,976 population.

73 habitations were served with upper primary section/school at a distance upto 3 Km. of which 6 habitations were in Namsang Block, 4 habitations were in Niausa Block, 1 in Wakka-Fongchau Block, 46 in Khagam Block and 16 were in Changlang Block.

262 habitations were served with upper primary school/section at a distance beyond 3 km. covering a population 85,219. Cut of this 70 habitations were in Namsang in Namsang Block, 24 in Niausa, 18 in Wakka-Fongchau,71 in Khagam and 79 habitations were in Changlang Block.

The habitations were scatted and less populated therefore had thin enrolment in terminating class d.e. class V. Some habitations were located in far flung area and have rivers/hills in between these habitations. The students had to be a long way to appear at such upper primary school/section. However many upper primary schools were opened even in sparsely populated area considering their remoteness and topographical situation.

2. HAB ITATION AND FOI ULATION SERVED BY EXISTING AND FROPESED UPPER FRIMARY SCHOOL/SECTION.

23 habitations of Namsang Block, 10 habitations in Niausa Block, 5 in Wakka-Fongchau Block, 32 in Khagam Block, 83 in Changlang Block covering population of 20237, 7635, 4248, 13073 and 36183 were served with upper primary school/section respectively.

5 habitations in Nomes ng Eleck & 1 in Changlang Eleck with population 2798 and 383 respectively were proposed for opening upper primary school/section as per the criteria.

3.VILLAGES IN VARIOUS FORULATION SLAB ACCORDING TO PROPERTION OF SCIAND ST POLULATION AND AVAILABILITY OF EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES:-

27 villages were having the SC population upto 25% out of which 14 villages were covered with upper primary school facility.

214 village were having ST population below 300 which had no upper primary school.

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29 villages were having 5T regulation between 300-399 had 9 upper primary school.

26 villages having ST population between 400-499 had 6 upper primary school.

44 village having ST population between 500-999 had 6 upper primary school.

31 villages having ST population between 1000-1999 had 9 upper primary school.

6 villages having ST population between 2000-4999 had 2 upper primary school, and 1 village having oT population upto 25% of total population 5000 and above had 3 primary schools.

4. SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO AREA MANAGEMENT AND TYPE:

There were 29 upper primary schools. All are co-education and are managed by Government in rural areas.

All 29 upper primary schools were supported by primary section, 5 upper primary schools were attached to the Secondary schools out of which 1 was having only upper primary school and secondary sections. 6 upper primary sections were attached to Higher Secondary Schools out of which 3 schools had no primary sections.

Thus the total No of upper Irimary school were 44.

5. SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO TYPE OF BUILDING:

Cut of 29 upper primary schools, 11 schools had pucca buildings, 4 had partly pucca buildings, 2 had katchha buildings and remaining 12 schools had Thatched hut buildings.

6 SCH. IS WITH LIBRARY AND ALLIED FACILITIES.

cut of 29 upper primary schools 26 schools had the Library facilities.

3 schools had 1-100 Library books, 6 schools had Library books in between 101 to 200, 10 schools had Library books in between 201 to 500, 5 schools had Library books in between 501 to 1000. Where as 2 school had Library books more than 1000 in humber.

10 upper primary school had the facility of Dictionary, 9 had the facility of Subscribing "News Fager" and 11 had the facility of subscribing "Magazines".

7. SCHOOLS ACCURDING TO ANCILLARY FACILITIES.

Cut of 29 upper primary schools, the ancillary facilities provided are as follows:-

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- I) Drinking water facilities :- 21
- II) Urinals facilities :- 17
- III) Separate urinals for girls- 13

- IV) Lavetory facilities :- 13
 V) Separate Lavatory forgirls- r6
 VI) Medical check up facilities 3
- VII) Vaccination/Innoculation 17 facilities.

The disparities are due to the fact that all schools are in rural areas.

3 TEACHERS ACCURDING TO QUALIFICATIONS/SEX :-

There were 40 Male Trained Teachers and 10 Female Trained Teachers; 92 Male untrained teachers and 27 Female untrained teachers working in upper primary schools.

Cut of 40 Male Trained Teachers, 1 was below Middle pass, 2 were Middle pass, 15 were Matriculate, 3 were I.U.C. rass, 18 were Graduate, 9 were post Graduate in qualification and 2 were language teachers.

Cut of 10 Female Trained Teachers, 1 was Matriculate, 1 was P.U.C. pass, 6 were Graduate 1 was Fost Graduate in qualification and 1 was Language teacher.

Cut of 52 Male untrained teachers, 12 were Matriculate, 74 were Graduate and 6 were Fost Graduate in qualification.

Cut of 22 Female untrained teachers 4 were F.U.C. pass, 15 were Graduate and 3 were Fost Graduate in qualification.

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CHAPTER-IV

SECONDARY AND HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

- 1.NUMBER OF HABITATION WITH AND WITH UT SEC. & HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOLS.
- A. Cut of 377 habitations in this District,14 habitations had Secondary School facilities/Secondary Section facilities. These habitation had 24177 population out of the total population 152137.
- 23 habitations had secondary school/section facilities upto a walking distance of 2 Km. which served 6958 population.
- 16 habitations with population 3835 had secondary school/section facilities upto a walking distance of 4 Km.
- 16 habitations with repulation 5810 had Secondary school/section facilities upto a distance of 6 Km.
- 21 habitations with population 5249 had Sec. school/section facilities up to a distance of 8 Km. and remaining 287 habitation with population 106108 had this facility at a distance more than 8 Km.
- B. 6 habitations with population 14846 had Higher Secondary school facilities with in the habitation. 13 habitation with population 2759 had this facility up to 2 km., 6 habitations with population 315 had this facility up to a distance of 4 km., 3 habitations with population 242 had this facility at a distance 6 km. 16 habitation with population 5756 had this facility at a distance of 8 km. and remaining had this facility at a distance of more than 8 km.

2. NC.CF SECCNDARY AND HIGHER SECCNDARY SCHOOLS:

There were 9 secondary schools 1 school was having only upper primary and secondary section and rest 8 had primary-upper primary and Secondary stages.

There were 6 Higher Secondary school 3 of which did not have have primary section and remaining 3 had all the four stages.

3. SCHOOLS ACCORDING TO AREA-MANAGEMENT AND TYPE:

There were 9 Secondary schools out of which 7 were co-education schools run by the Government, one school in Changlang Block is only for boys run by Govt. aided Mission and the school in Namsang Block was only for girls which run under private Mission.

There were 6 Higher Secondary schools out of which 5 were co-education school run by the Government and one was only for boys in Namsang Block run by Frivate aided Mission.

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4.AVAILABILITY OF LIBRARY FACILITY:

A. Cut of total 9 Secondary Schools in the Dist. all had Library facility.

3 schools had Library books ranjing from 501-1000, 2 schools had Library books in between 1001-2000, 3 schools had library books in between 2001-5000 and one school had more than 5000 library books.

B. All 6 Higher Secondary schools had library books. 5 schools had library books in between 2001-5000,& one school had library books more than 5000.

5. TEACHERS ACCORDING TO QUALIFICATION SEX.

A. There were 42 Male Trained teachers, 19 Female trained teachers, 48 Male untrained teachers & 27 Female untrained teachers in all 9 Secondary school.

Cut of 42 Male Trained teachers, one was Middle pass, 5 were Matriculate, 5 were F.U.C, 18 were Graduate & 13 were Fost Graduate in qualification.

Cut of 19 Female trained teachers, 2 were Matriculate, 12 were Graduate & 5 were having Fost Graduate qualification.

cut of 48 Male untrained teachers 1 was I.U.C. 23 were Graduate, 22 were Fost Graduate in qualification and 2 were Language Teachers.

Out of 27 untrained Female teachers one was Matriculate, 2 were Fo.13 were Graduate, 9 were Fost Graduate in qualification and 2 were Language Teachers.

D. There were 51 Male trained Teachers, 6 Female trained teachers, 11 male untrained teachers and 6 Female untrained teachers working in 6 HS.Schools.

Cut of 51 Male Trained Teachers, 3 were Matriculate, one was F.U.C., 20 were having Graduate qualification.

Cut of ℓ Female trained teachers, 4 were Graduate and 2 were Post Graduate in qualification.

Cut of 71 Male Untrained teachers, 16 were F.U.C., 25 were Graduate and 30 were having Fost Graduate qualification.
