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

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STATE PROFILE HARYANA



CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

Haryana is one of the prospering states of India. It is in the northern state of India. It is surrounded by 5 states namely Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Punjab and Rajsthan. Chandigarh, the most beautiful and planned city of India, is the Capital City of Haryana. It is the twin city of Panchkula. Many important offices, like Chief Minister's Office, High Court, Governor House, Secretariat and Chief Minister Residence are located in Chandigarh.

HISTORY OF STATE

State of Haryana came into existence on 1st November, 1966, when the State of Punjab was further divided into two parts for the proper growth of the land and people of India. Every year this day is celebrated as Haryana Day. At the time of division, there were seven districts in the state where as there are 19 districts at present.

There are many historical places in Haryana, namely Kurukshetra, Sohna, Kurukshetra is a place, where Mahabharta was fought and there are many Panipat. beautiful temples of Krishna. Two historical battles of Panipat were fought at Panipat.

Most of the villages of the state are linked with the roads. Main highway of India, Grand Trunk Road from Delhi to Amritsar passes through Haryana. Many developments have taken place in the last decade, due to which three new districts have been created for further development. Panchkula is one of them, whose profile is presented here.

DEMOGRAPHY

Physically the land of Haryana is divided into four parts:

Part of Shivalik Hills 1.

- 2. Plains
- 3. Sandy area
- 4. Part of Aravali Hills

Due to the physical conditions of the state, the temperature varies from place to place. The evenings are generally pleasant in the districts like Panchkula, Ambala, which are near the hills. In the winters, the chilly winds blow, dropping the temperature to even 1 degree, whereas in districts like Hisar, Sirsa, Bhiwani, which are near Rajsthan have temperatures above 45 degree during the summers, heating up the areas. In the plains, the land is fertile.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Tourism industry has developed many Hotels, Restaurants, Lakes and other places for the tourists. Every year thousands of tourists from within India and abroad visit these places of interest, which brings lot of finances to the state of Haryana. Lots many things, which are manufactured in Haryana are exported to different countries of the world.

OCCUPATIONAL STRUCTURE

Most of the people of Haryana are engaged in Agriculture, Diary Products, Small Scale Industries. Main crops grown here are Wheat, Rice, Maize, Bajra, Cotton, Sugar Cane etc. The great Yamuna River is situated in the east of Haryana. Irrigation in the fields is mainly done by the net of canals spread all over the state. In the recent years many industries have been emerged in Gurgaon, Sonepat, Panipat, Faridabad,

Gurgaon, Yamunanagar etc in H. Lots many things, which are manufactured in

Haryna are exported to different countries of the world. People of Haryana are

hardworking. Women folk also work shoulder to shoulder with men in the fields as well as in the industry.

POPULATION

Rural and urban classification of population is an accepted demographic practice the world over. When we look at the population of different countries, we find that with development generally urbanization follows. Some countries such as USA or Latin America consisting largely settlers, had in fact a Reserve flow. People first settled in Port Cities and gradually spilled over to rural areas. Such is not the case with ancient civilizations such as ours. Lots many things, which are manufactured in Haryana are exported to different countries of the world. Literacy has risen sharply in the recent years. There are four Universities in the state imparting higher education in the field of computer, medical sciences, engineering, business management and many other countries of the world.

As per 2001 census the provisional population of Haryana State is 21,082,989, out of which, the male population is 11,327,658 and female population is 9,755,331. Out of this 14,968,850 is the rural population and rest 6,114,139 is urban population. Thus rural population accounts for 71% of state's population whereas urban population constitutes 29,00 percent only. In other words, almost 3 out of every 10 persons in Haryana are staying in urban areas. The percentage of urban population has gone up from 24.63% in 1991 census to 29.00% during present 2001 census.

During 2001 number of children in the age group 0-6 have been recorded as

3,259,080 as against 3,125,173 recorded during 1991 census. As a percentage of

population this constitutes 15.46% as against 18.98% in 1991, which is a welcome drop.

In the rural areas, in absolute terms, the number of children in the age group of 0-6 has marginally increase from 2,429,267 during 1991 census to 2,430, 318 in 2001 census. Interestingly the number of children in the similar age group was recorded 828,762 during 2001 census in urban areas as against 695,906 in 1991 census. The number of literates has also shown significant improvement in both rural and urban areas of Haryana. In absolute terms the number of literates in rural areas has increased from 4,974,926 in 1991 census to 8,002,496 in 2001 census. However in urban areas, these have been increased from 2,474,086 in 1991 census to 4,222,540 in 2001 census. Thus rural literacy has gone up from 49.85% to 63.82% and urban literacy from 73.66% to 79.89% during the decade.

District wise study reveals that ironically Gurgaon, though lying in the NCR has the highest numerical strength of rural population viz. 1,288,365 persons followed by Bhiwani 1,154,259 persons. The third largest rural population is recorded in Hisar District (1,138,437 persons). Interestingly, Panchkula recorded lowest rural population 260,538 followed by Panipat 575,435 persons and Yamunanagar Distt.589,448 persons.

SEX RATIO.

According to the census 2001, the sex ratio of India is 933 females per thousand males, whereas in Haryana, it is 861 females per 1000 males. Overall Haryana is a region with deficiency of females. In rural areas of Haryana, sex ratio is 867, which is comparatively higher than the sex ratio of 847 in urban areas. The sex ratio of Haryana has declined continuously since 1981 and is at its lowest during 2001 census. The lowest rural sex ratio is recorded in case of Panchkula District, where there are only 797 females per thousand males and Mahendergarh has the highest rural sex ratio of 925 females per 1000 males.

1000 males. It indicates the male selective migration to urban areas and also perhaps

higher access to sex selective technology in urban areas. In comparison to all India figure,

the sex ratio is relatively low in Haryana, both in rural and urban areas. Imbalanced sex

ratio at birth, female foeticide and higher rate of mortality among females etc. may perhaps explain this phenomenon. The sex ratio in the age group 0 to 6 attempts to bring out the recent changes in our society in its attitude and outlook towards the girl child. The abysmally low sex ratio in 0 to 6 age group shows that while the son preference has remained as before or perhaps gone up in the society. The availability of sex selective technology has led to elimination of female child. It is also vital that the sex ratio at birth at the various hospitals and institutions is checked up.

LITERACY

Haryana state recorded 68.59% literacy rate during 2001. Male literacy is found higher than female literacy rate in all the districts. Rewari district where male literacy is 89.04% ranks first in the State while lowest male literacy has been recorded in Fatehabad district (68.71%). Female literacy rate is highest in Panchkula (68.98%), whereas it is the lowest in Fatehabad district (46.40%). Literacy rates are comparatively higher in Haryana that the national average for males. In so far as rural literacy is concerned district Rewari ranks first in rural literacy (74.19%) followed by Sonipat (71.08%) and Ambala (70.74%). The lowest rural literacy is recorded in Fatehabad District 54.65%. Similarly Ambala District ranks first in urban literacy (85.97%) followed by Panchkula (85.70%) and Rewari 82.76%. District Kaithal records lowest urban literacy rate i.e. 73.07%.

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CHAPTER II

INTRODUCTION

Panchkula is one of the 19 districts of Haryana, located in the north east. Panchkula is a new District and came into being on 15th August, 1995 by the then Chief Minister, Ch. Bhajan Lal. It was carved out of the Ambala Division, which is located in the foot hills of Shivalik Mountains. Most of the people speak Hindi in the region. It was named Panchkula due to the presence of five Kulas (Resources of Water). It is a twin city of Chandigarh and planned in the similar manner as of Chandigarh. It is spread over to 898 Sq. K.M. area. It is the district with the smallest geographical areas in the state, which is as under:

North east	Himachal Pradesh
West	U.T. Chandigarh & Punjab
South	Ambala District.

Many state corporations and boards have shifted their headquarters in Panchkula, making it vital address of Haryana.

BRIEF HISTORY

There are 236 villages in the District and average population is 1500. The rural area is divided into four community development blocks i.e. Pinjore, Morni, Barwala and Raipur Rani, The District has two subdivisions namely Kalka and Panchkula. Part of this District is Hilly tracks. The total forest land of the district is 25,000 hectare, which is highest in the state. In villages, the houses are mostly pucca. There are many historical

places in Panchkula District, namely Chandimandir, named after Goddess Chandika,

Samlotha Temple of Mata Samlasan Devi, Yadvindra Garden in Pinjore named after

Maharaja Patiala. Mansa Devi and Nada Saheb.

DEMOGRAPHY

In summers the evenings are pleasant due to the cold winds coming from the hills. In winters sometimes the temperature drops below normal i.e. around 2 degrees and the chilly winds blow, making the region very cold.

OCCUPATIONAL STRUCTURES

The main occupation of the residents is Agriculture and the land is fertile. Main crops are Wheat, Rice and Maize Vegetable such as Tomatoes Ginger, Amla and garlic

are cultivated in hilly area. In the Morni block Mushroom is also cultivated. Rural people

are also engaged in the business of breeding domestic animals for milk and hens for eggs.

Lot of medicinal plants are also available in the Morni Hills.

Panchkula is at 67th rank which is lowest in Haryana with sex ratio of only 810. Panchkula district consists of 2 tehsils namely Kalka and Panchkula. In Kalka tehsil the rural sex ratio has gone up in 2001 to 856 from 820 in 1991. In Panchkula tehsil the rural sex ratio is down by 27 points from 837 in 1991 to 810 in 2001. The strength of population in 0-6 age group in Panchkula district has increased to 64.614 in 2001 from 51,993 in 1991 and the proportion of population in age group 0-8 has declined from 16.75% in 1991 to 13.77% in 2001. Population of this age group is gradually stabilizing. It clearly reflects that we need more teachers to educate the society rather than schools to teach the children. The relatively high literacy rates among females are responsible for low fertility rates in Panchkula district.

LITERACY

The literacy rate of Panchkula District was 54,84% as per census figures of 1991. According to a sample survey conducted in the year 1999, its literacy rate was 64%. As per latest survey of 2001, the literacy rate of this district is 76.54%, that is the highest in the State of Haryana. The total literacy in male is 82.74% and in female, it is 68.97%. The total literacy rate of Haryana is 68.59%, Male literacy rate is 79.25 and female literacy rate is 56.31. Female literacy rate is also highest in the District. The literacy rate of the district rose by 12% during the period PLC campaign was launched and completed. Total literacy rate in rural area is 88.95%, male literacy rate in rural areas is 77.50, whereas female literacy rate is 58.11. In urban areas, total literacy rate is

85.70, where male literacy rate is 89.32 and female literacy rate is 81.490. The district

Many computer educational institutes, both Government and Private have emerged, imparting training and Diplomas and Degrees in various fields of information technology.

ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

The administrative structure of district is similar to the other districts of the state. The Deputy Commissioner heads the District administration. He is also the President of the Zila Saksharta Samiti. There is also an Additional Deputy Commissioner, who is looking after development administration and is also responsible for administering

Saksharta Programme in the District. There are two sub-divisions, which are headed by

Sub-divisional Officer ©. They are also Vice-president of Zila Sakshrta Samiti. The

Education Department is headed by the District Education Officer and District Primary Education Officer. Health Department is headed by the Civil Surgeon. Anganwari Centers are also functioning in each village and urban slum. There are many other offices as S.D.M., Tehsildar, City Magistrate etc. in the District.

BRIEF HISTORY OF LITERACY CAMPAIGN

Total literacy campaign was launched in Ambala District in the year 1992 and at the time of formation of Panchkula District there was no activities going on in this programme. According to the figures of TLC made available by Ambala District, there were 20,000 semi-literate and 25,000 illiterate in the area of this District. During the year 2000 some villages of Panchkula (Raipur Rani Block) were transferred to Ambala District and thus number of illiterates were reduced to 31,428.

At the District level Additional Deputy Commissioner was made responsible for the administration of the campaign and at sub-divisional levels, S.D.M. concerned was made responsible for supervision of the campaign.

To begin with, Kala Jathas were prepared. These Kala Jathas visited each village and spread message by enacting Nukkad Natakas and folk songs. Saksharta Rallies were also organized in each village with the help of school children. Prabhat Pharies and Mashal Jalus were also organized on walls, stickers and pamphlets were also distributed.

The environment building process continued from time to time and a number of functions were organized. In March, 1999, Saksharta Sammelan was held at Pinjore and His Excellency the Governor of Haryana was the Chief Guest. Nearly 5000 people

attended the function. International Literacy Day was also celebrated on 8th September,

2000, which was attended by large number of Akshar Saniks, Neo-literates, Sarpanches,

Panches and other people from all walks of life. Panchayat Raj Institutions were motivated to take active part in this campaign in the meeting held at Block level. Akshar Saniks males were held at cluster level, training was also imparted to them in skill upgradation. Seminars were held to involve Panchayati Raj Institutions and administrative officers in the campaign.

For the implementation of the programme contact persons and village coordinators at each village were identified who helped in monitoring of the learning centers and conducting internal evaluation. During the process of implementation, nearly 3000 learning centers were established and out of 31,428 illiterate 26,630 persons were brought to learning centers. Out of those who joint learning centers 13,039 persons had complete Jatan III and thus completed TLC. It was 41.48% of the total illiterate.

POPULATION

The district has a population of 4,69210 as per census 2001 and accounts for only 2.23% of the total population of the state. The growth rate of population is astonishingly higher in the district during 1991-2001 i.e. 51.16% even more than the state which is 28.06%. The relative higher rate of growth may attributed to migration, its close proximity to the union territory Chandigarh where state Headquarters are also located, having comparatively cheaper accommodation, better environment and plots at relative!y affordable price in comparison to Chandigarh, attracting people to settle over here.

CHAPTER III

WHAT IS SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN ?

The SSA programme is also an attempt to provide opportunity for improving human capabilities to all children, through provision of community-owned quality education in a mission mode.

- A programme with a clear time frame for universal elementary education. ٠
- A response to the demand for quality basic education all over the country. •
- An opportunity for promoting social justice through basic education. ۲
- An effort at effectively involving the Panchayati Raj Institutions, School • Management Committees, Village and Urban Slum level Education Committees, Teachers' Associations, Mother Teacher Associations, Tribal Parents' Autonomous Councils and other grass root level structures in the management of elementary schools.
- An expression between the Central, State and the local government. ٠
- An opportunity for States to develop their own vision of elementary education.

GOALS OF SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

education for all children in the 6 to 14 age group by 2010. There is also another goal to

bridge social, regional and gender gaps, with the active participation of the community in the management of school.

Useful and relevant education signifies a quest for an education system that is not alienating and that draws on community solidarity. Its aims is to allow children to learn about and master their natural environment in a manner that allows the fullest harnessing of their human potential both spiritually and materially. This quest must also be a process of value based learning that allows children an opportunity to work for each other's well being rather than to permit mere selfish pursuits.

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan realizes the importance of Early Childhood Care and Education and looks at the 0-14 age as a continuum. All efforts to support pre-school learning in ICDS centers or special pre-school centers in non ICDS areas will be made to supplement the efforts being made by the Department of Women and Child Development.

relevant information with respect to project. Micro planning was done ir the district under the guidance of the core team members.

FORMATION OF V.E.C./P.T.A.,/M.T.A.

As the team is formulated only at district level so it becomes difficult task to cover all the villages for the formation of the village education committees. Still efforts were made by the team members and visited many villages in different blocks from time to time. Villagers gathered in the school premises of the concerned villages. Formal introduction of the team members was given .people showed their curios ty to know about the mission for which they were present. Head Teachers of the different schools also helped in making these village committees in their respective villages to achieve the goal. Members of the team wentt visited these places to check the work of making village education committees. The problems were discussed at length with different community members, teachers regarding the problems faced by them in the school / teaching work. 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



CONSOLIDATION OF THE MEETINGS.

A meeting of all the ceenter incharges, head teachers and teachers of the Panchkula district was held under the leadership of D.E.O., B.E.D. Panchkula ,B.E.O. Morni and Raipur Ranni block by the members of the team. The aims and objectives of Sarva Shiksha Abbhiyan, Micro planning process were mrated in the meetings held during the maonths of September, October, November, and December. Micro planning i.e.e. household survey was conducted in 40% of the villages of Panchkula, coveriring Raipur Rani and Ramgarh Bbcl by the concerned teachers of the villagges. To achieve the goals for perspectve planning from 2003 to 2007, the data waas consolidated by the members of the team. The total number of children in the 3 age group 6 to 11 and 11 to 14 vere mainly included in the plan. From the numicro planning the total population, Ω children, BC children, disabled children, children studying in school, dropott children, non- starters were taken into connsideration for computing dropout rate, retention rate, gross enrolment rate, net enrolment rate etc.

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Various Level Committees are formed in the Distt. in accordance with Notification No. 21/18-2002PF(2) dated 11-9-2002 of Haryana Govt. Education Department for proper monitoring and supervision of the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan at School Level, Village Level, for Urban areas, Cluster Level, Block level, District Level and State Level respectively.

The Head of the school shall be ex-official Vice-President of the Association. The Secretary of the Association shall be nominated from amongst the members of the staff by the President in consultation with the

Vice-President. Except the Vice-President, the Treasurer and the Secretary all

the office bearers and members of the Executive Committee shall be elected at

the time of the annual meetings.

There shall be an Executive Committee of the Association to carry out the day-to-day functions of the Association. It will consist of 10 members

(with at least 3 from amongst the teachers) beside office bearers. Meetings of the Executive Committee will be held once in a months preferably on Saturday.

The aim of the association is to encourage parents to share the responsibility along with the teachers for better educational standard and moral, social & physical development of the children and overall improvement in schools.

The specific objective of the PTA will be as follows: -

- i) Creating awareness amongst the parents regarding the need and importance of inculcating the habits of punctuality, regularity in attendance & cleanliness in their wards.
- ii) Diagnosis of educational backwardness and need for adopting remedial measures in time.
- iii) Helping for making provision of physical facilities such as furniture, electric fans, building etc. to the schools.
- iv) Making improvement in the overall conduct and behaviour of the students.

The tenure of the associations would be two years.

b) Mother Teacher Association (MTA):

It is not basically different from the Parent Teacher Association. Here the membership is open only to mothers and Lady guardians of the children. The MTA will meet twice a month instead of once as in case of PTA.

The school may have either of the two or both of the Associations. From Primary Wing MTAs may be there, and for the whole school (i.e.

Upper Primary Level) the PTAs may also be there.

The tenure of the committee would be two years.

These bodies can inspect the records (students attendance, staff attendance) of the school.

JUSTIFICATION OF STRATEGIES

SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN, PERSPECTIVE PLAN, PANCHKULA

FROM APRIL- 2003 TO MARCH - 2007

The success of any project lies in the meticulous planning which should be based on the strength of the implementation area i.e District (as District is considered a macro unit of this plan and a village is considered as the grass root unit of it). Panchkula has be present strength, as it has been shown in the relevant section of the data, a satisfying gross enrolment ratio in primary and upper primary schools including recognized and non-recognised private institutions.

Drop out at Primary level of total children is 0.64%, boys .71%, girls 1.32%. Drop out at upper primary level of total children is 4.45%, boys 3.39%, girl 5.66%.

Retention rate at primary level of total children is 99.36%, boys 99.29%, Girls 98.68%.

Retention rate of upper primary level of total children is 95.55%, boys 96.61%, Girls 94.34%.

N.E.R. of primary level of total children is 93.91% boys 94.44% and gils 93.27% N.E.R. of Upper primary level of total children is 93.11%, boys 94.92% and Gir.: 91.07%

The house hold survey of every inhabitation gives gloomy picture of out of school children in which more girls are found at upper primary stage in the form of out if school. It appeals to the planners to think over some relevant causes and reveals the possible socio-economic conditions of the society in which the girls are considered as other mens property and a liability on the parents. It suggests some interventions for guil education in this perspective plan of SSA.

The description of the infrastructure in our school is not very congenial and satisfying. The condition of toilet facilities specially for girls is almost non-existent.

Again, as per the objectives of the SSA, every child without consideration of caste and sex must be enrolled by 2005 which requires certain specific provisions for the basic facilities for girls in our schools. Hence the another type of interventions are required to be made in the perspective plan in the form of construction of rooms, toilets, drinking water and boundary walls. There is also another type of social group in the society which hence forth comprises which could not afford education and employ themselves in financial activities. This type of population, working children, street children, disables and the children of some special group. It requires the special provisions in educational plan like Alternative Schooling and Innovative Education, Education for Disables and certain in-built provision in our formal school system.

As it has already been described and interpreted through our present data most of the non starter at Primary level are girl children and it has been revealed that those girls have been detained out of school because there must be certain specific provisions which may fulfill the requirement of their home affairs and their education. The provision of ECE along with the formal schooling and also the parallel to the formal school timing and these girls are debarred from education.

Hence the perspective plan of SSA of this Distt. Determines the following interventions:

> Alternative schooling and innovative education (for dropouts and non-starters as well as for difficult groups)

> Block Resource Centre (functions as a linkage and as a resource center for all

academic and administrative activities with in the block).

- Cluster Resource Centres (Co-ordinate grass root activities with in the block).
- Cluster Resources Centres (Co-ordinate grass root activities, in elementary education and act as a resource unit and as a center for ETT).
- Civil work (Provision for improvement in infrastructure facilities in school, CRC, BRC, DPIU & D.I.E.T.)
- District Institute of Education and Training (for quality improvement through teacher training, research activities, evaluation and a nodal Institute for all educational activities of the DistLineluding monitoring and supervision).
- District Primary Information Unit (managing and monitoring body for all activities of elementary education in the Distt.).
- Early childhood Education (Caters the need of the children as pre-school activities).
- Elementary Formal Education (all activities that relate to access, retention and quality improvement in elementary education).
- Education Management Information System (keeps information of elementary education in the Distt. Intact).
- Integrated Education for disabled children (catering to the needs of disabled group as a provision for enrolment and retention for all).
- Mass Mobilization and Women Empowerment (Mobilizes awareness activities for enrolment of all, retention, no dropout and quality improvement.

The total budget of the plan from the year 2003-2007 is 1739.8368 lacs. All these components and interventions are being defined on the following pages: 103

ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLING (E.G.S.)

The number of drop out and non starters in the District in the age of 6 to 11 years (boys 110 and girls 171) according to the micro planning i.e. Household Survey done in these areas at primary level, where as in upper primary level i.e. 11 to 14 years age group, 319 boys and 466 girls come under this category. Not starter at primary level is 801 boys and 848 girls, whereas that of upper primary is 167 boys and 295 girls. Their educational needs are to be catered. If the objective of enrolment of all is to be achieved, it requires some specific provision in the form of opening of some such alternative center for their education which fully adhere to their individual need and which observe the child centered approaches. As per norms of the SSA one center for every 25 children proposed to be opened. Though priority should be given to improve the quality of our schools so that most of these nonstarter and dropout may enter the formal schooling system. This may be done with the help of mobilizing the masses, parents and children. It may also be supposed that still a great number of children may not turn up to formal schooling. Again, the reflects in the carefully opening such centers. Hence centers, on a pilot basis are proposed to be opened are 20 in number of alternative schools. In this way the whole perspective plan for District Panchkula consists of centers, which will be opened in the most difficult areas where all other inventions are proved to be fruitless. One instructor for each Centre, preferably, a

women of that locality where these children are amassed is proposed to be

appointed for each center. This instructor is proposed to be given Rs. 1000/- as

honorarium, Rs. 2000/- are proposed to be given every year to every center for

T.L.M. and Stationary. One Dari @ Rs. 1500/- to each Center every year, On Kit @ Rs. 2000/- to each center every year, which includes Educational Games, Supplementry Reading material, spsorts material, charts, self learning material. This was proposed by S.C.E.R.T., D.I.E.T. experts and teachers according to the need of children of the area. Rs. 2000/- for work book for student for each center which will includes practical exercises for practice. Furniture will include one table, chair and trunk for each center, costing Rs. 2000/-. There is a provision for training to the instructors:

- i) Induction Training to all the newly appointed instructors
 for 30 days.
- ii) Orientation Training for in service instructors for 20 days
 (7+7+6) in a year for updating the knowledge of the instructors at B.R.C. level by experts.

No. E.G.S. (A.S.) functioned during 2002-2003. List of the E.G.S. (A.S.) to be opened in 2003-2004 is attached in Appendix.

All the above are proposed in ensuing perspective plan for SSA of this District. The details of the activities and the costing of it is given in the budgetary section given at Page No. 124. The total plan lay out of this Component is Rs. 29.561 Lacs.

BLOCK RESOURCE CENTERS

This intervention is essential to function as a Continuous resource support, training to teachers (lower primary) monitoring unit nearer to the grass root, Coordinating for all Education activities of the Block and serving as a linkage between CRC and D.I.E.T as a academic support, CRC and DPIU as an administrative unit. To strengthen this organization, it is proposed that the information system, the furniture, equipments, library books etc. are proposed to be provided in the perspective plan for SSA. This District has Four Educational Blocks having one B.E.O. who requires to be supported by a person of academic and pedagogical experience of elementary education and who could effectively support the primary and upper primary education system of the Block. This intervention is supposed to be proved very effective in the qualitative improvement of elementary school education which is an important objective of SSA for helping BRC's, two Assistant BRC's are proposed at every block. Annual Sports Meet shall be held at BRC's level every year and the money proposed is Rs.30,000/- for every block. This expenditure shall be done on catables, bus fare, lunch for children and for other needful sports events. Hence some activities, whose detail is given in the budgetary section are proposed in this prospective plan costing Rs. 228.86 lacs. Roge 105.

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CLUSTER RESOURCE CENTRE

The success of any programme of education lies in its monitoring and supervision system most of our educational system to the ground because of effective monitoring system nearer to the grass root. So it is rightly proposed to set up cluster Resource Center with 8 Km radius in the plains and 5 to 6 Kms in hilly area like Morni and Kalka etc. comprising 5 to 8 schools having cluster Resource Coordinators. In this District there have been proposed to set up 42] such centres. It requires rigorous exercise of school mapping in the district and center located for this purpose are enlisted in the appendix. This organization will function in close coordination and convergence at both level and it will serve an effective linkage as well as powerful monitoring system alongwith resource support to bring a qualitative improvement in elementary education system within the cluster, moreover this institution serve as a training ground for extended teacher training and these coordinators are supposed to work as a supervisor They will serve as the leader and page setter of those school within the cluster. It will be further strengthen by the provision of furniture, equipment, library books newspaper and periodicals, and they are required to function as a meeting place for VEC members, teachers and Head Teacher and they are supposed to publish a monthly news letter at each Center for all their activities within the month. Hence some activities (detail is given in budgetary section) are proposed in this

perspective plan costing Rs. 14.112 Lacs.
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CIVIL WORK

Most of our Elementary schools are running with poor infrastructure, lack of necessary physical facilities like toilets, drinking water and electricity etc. In order to attract children and specially the girls in the school and to retain them in the system the following budgetary provision of the activities is being proposed under the heading of Civil Work:

- > Construction of new School building (15 for Primary schools and 35 for upper primary schools)
- Construction of new class rooms (102 in Primary School);
- > Construction of Boundary walls (110 for primary and 36 for upper primary schools);
- ▶ Water facilities in 78 Primary Schools and in 23 Upper Primary Schools;
- Toilets 436 in Primary Schools and 95 in Upper Primary Schools;
- > Construction of Building for each BRCs 4 and CRCs 42
- > Repair and Maintenance with provision of Rs.5000/- every year per school is proposed to be allocated under SSA;

A list of the schools where all above mentioned Construction work and facilities is being provided, is given in appendix.

It is considered as an essential restriction that not more than 33% of the total cost of the Project be spent on civil work. This construction work will invariably be carried out through VECs.

There is no continuing construction beyond 31st March, 2003, which was to be completed in the financial year 2002-2003. Hence, no expenditure of Civil construction is to be spilled over to year 2003-2004. No new schools were approved for the year 2002-2003. List of the new Schools which are proposed to be opened and constructed in the perspective plan 2003-2007 is attached in Appendix.

Hence, an amount of Rs. 568.97 Lacs is being proposed in perspective

plan of this District of SSA. Page - 107

DISTRICT PRIMARY INFORMATION UNIT

For the implementation of SSA in the District, an organization with a working system with following provisions is being proposed in the perspective plan of SSA of District Panchkula. It will function as a managerial body for all activities of elementary Education in the District with a precaution of respecting decentralized approaches. It will up keep all information about elementary education in the District with the help of EMIS unit and assimilate and disseminate the informations, directions helping in the achievement of objective of this project. The following activities and provisions are being proposed to strengthen this Institution:

- One DPC working DEO of the District
- Two APC's experienced and well acquainted with the strategies and inputs for qualitative elementary universal education. Salary of A.P.C. will be in the pay scale of Rs. 6500-10500. The qualification of the A.P.C. will be M.A./M.Sc./M.Ed. with 5 years teaching experience.
- One S.O. on deputation to maintain and regulate the financial accounts and expenditures;
- > One Accountant in the pay scale of Rs. 5000-7850.
- One clerk in the pay scale of Rs. 3050-4590, having knowledge of computer for keeping the record intact.
- Two class IV employees (Chowkidar and Peon) in the pay scale of Rs. 2550-2660;

- Provision of equipments like Photostat machine, typewriters, (both Hindi and English), Fax Machine, TV, VCR, Projector and Generator, to help in the proper functioning of the institution;
- Provision of furniture and its maintenance;
- Publication of monthly newsletter to disseminate the information in the field;
- > Meeting of DARG (Once in a month) and BRC;

In this way this managing body is being proposed on page No. <u>108</u> with a cost of Rs. 81.904 Lacs in the Perspective Plan of SSA.

EDUCATIONAL MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Modern age is the period of information technology. This technology requires to be incorporated in the system of education at District level along with District Primary Information unit so that all necessary informations related to enrolment, Drop outs, Retention Rate, Net Enrolment Ratio, Infrastructural facilities and other relevant data are kept intact and up dated. It requires the following provisions which are being proposed in the perspective plan of SSA of this District.

- One programmer as per government scale;
- One Date entry operator in the pay scale of Rs. 4000-6000, having the qualification 10+2 with one year diploma in computer applications to keep the system functioning;
- Provision of equipments including Computer, Laser Printer, CD writer, Modem, CDs and floppies etc.
- ➢ Installation of telephone and furnished Computer Room with A.C. and internet facilities.
- Provision of training to teachers, CRC's, BRC's for data collection.
- Provision of printing of reports
- > Provision for hired vehicle, Petrol and other lubricants.
- Provision of furniture like Tables and Chairs etc.

Hence a well equipped EMIS system is being proposed at the District level it

QUALITY ISSUES IN ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

No effort is spared by the government of India to improve the quality of education. Special emphasis is laid on improvement of elementary education. So, it is necessary to identify the cause of lack of quality in elementary education, so that appropriate measures can be taken to streamline the education at elementary level. So, to improve the educational system, following measures are suggested: -

 \sim One teacher for every 40 children in primary and upper primary school.

- To all girls/S.C. children free books are provided @ Rs. 150/- per child.
- Maintenance Grant of Rs. 5,000/- per year per school will be provided to have better school infrastructure.
- For providing better teaching learning equipment Rs. 10,000/- are provided at newly opened primary school and Rs. 50,000/- to all upper primary schools.
- → A School Grant of Rs. 2,000/- per year will be provided for every school.
- A Teacher Grant of Rs. 500/- per year per teacher will be provided to improve the teaching skill.
- A Teacher Training programme for 20 days @ Rs. 70/- per day per teacher will be provided.
- \sim Rs: 1,400/- per school will be provided for research and evaluation.

As no teacher was recruited in the year 2002-2003, so there is no continuing recurring expenditure of salary of teachers during 2003-2004. The teachers to be recruited in the coming year are proposed to have professional qualification as per government of Haryana norms.

During the year 2002-2003, Teacher Grant @ Rs. 500/- per head, School Grant @ Rs. 2000/- per school and Maintenance Grant @ Rs. 5000/- per School

was provided.

Hence, a financial provision of Rs. 659.318 lacs on page No. 111

is proposed to be incurred out of the prospective plan of S.S.A. 2003-2007.

INTEGRATED EDUCATION FOR DISABLED

The objective of universal elementary Education can not be achieved unless each Category of the prevailing children and their needs are catered to. There are 1350 children enrolled in our schools at present, who are physically disabled and who need a special care, attention and support.¹ Moreover no nation² can bear the under development of even a signal citizen. Hence for their whole some development and self respected life the following provisions in the plan of SSA for this District are being proposed:

- Identification of disables; This has been done through micro planning i.e. house hold survey done in rural as well as urban areas in distt. Panchkula.
- Printing of awareness material for parents and community
- Provision of special medical checkup through Medical experts;
- Preparation of need based teaching learning materials and their exhibition;
- Follow up service to these children;
- Training to teachers, CRC's, BRC's in provision of Aids and appliances of these children.
- Every such child will be provided with appliances and supporting material @ Rs. 1200/- in the project period.
- Sports and cultural competition at CRC level @ Rs. 1500 per center will be provided under which prize money refreshment and lunch will be provided to the participants;
- At BRC level, VIP will be invited to encourage the children and will be given awards to the best children. Arrangement of photographer, refreshment, lunch etc. for the participants will be done.

These provision may be considered as an open ended support, still a budgetary provision of Rs. $n \ge 1$ Lacs is being proposed in perspective Plan of SSA of this District at Page No. /12.

COMMUNITY TRAINING

No programme can be successful if the mass participation is not available. To make the educational programme more effective at elementary level, the participation of public is must. So, under S.S.A. a provision for two days training to 8 persons of every village is made. This will be done @ Rs. 30/- per day per head.

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Hence, a financial provision of Rs. 5.7888 lacs on page No. 1) \Im is proposed to be incurred out of the prospective plan of S.S.A. 2003-2007.

INNOVATIVE ACTIVITIES

PROJECT-1 : - INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

It is being proposed that in perspective plan of SSA Haryana has supposed to provide 5 computers with U.P.S., Computer Library, Educational Software, Essential furniture and furnishing with a non-recurring cost of Rs. 2,00,000/- per school and set a Computer Lab. to facilitate Computer Education and build up capacity of each upper primary school. AS the rooms in our U.P. schools are not sufficient in numbers so one room is being propsed with a unit cost of Rs. 1.50 lacs. This I.T. Lab will also consist of advance software for education of different subjects specifically in learning mathematics, science, language and environmental studies. It is also proposed that every village with a population of more than one thousand should have an upper primary school facility so that the constitutional commitment of compulsory elementary education to every child of 6-14 age group may be provided and structural facility of upper primary school is upgraded in such a manner that every child may enjoy the fundamental right qualitative elementary education within his reach. So, a total estimated amount on this activity will be 58.55 Lacs. Detail of this component is given on Page No.

PROJECT-2: - SCHOOL BASED ACTIVITIES

Co-curricular activities are integral part of education. For all around development of a child, there is a need of other supporting activities like:-

- There is a provision for Maa-Beti Sammelan.
- Sports at C.R.C./B.R.C. and district level are proposed.

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> Organization of Bal Mela at C.R.C. level

Hence a financial provision of Rs. 59.2 lacs is proposed in the perspective plan

2003-2007.


