

INTRODUCTION


The Statistical Hand book of Changlang District 1989-90 is an annual Publication published by the Statistical Branch, Changlang. It is the 4th issue in its series.

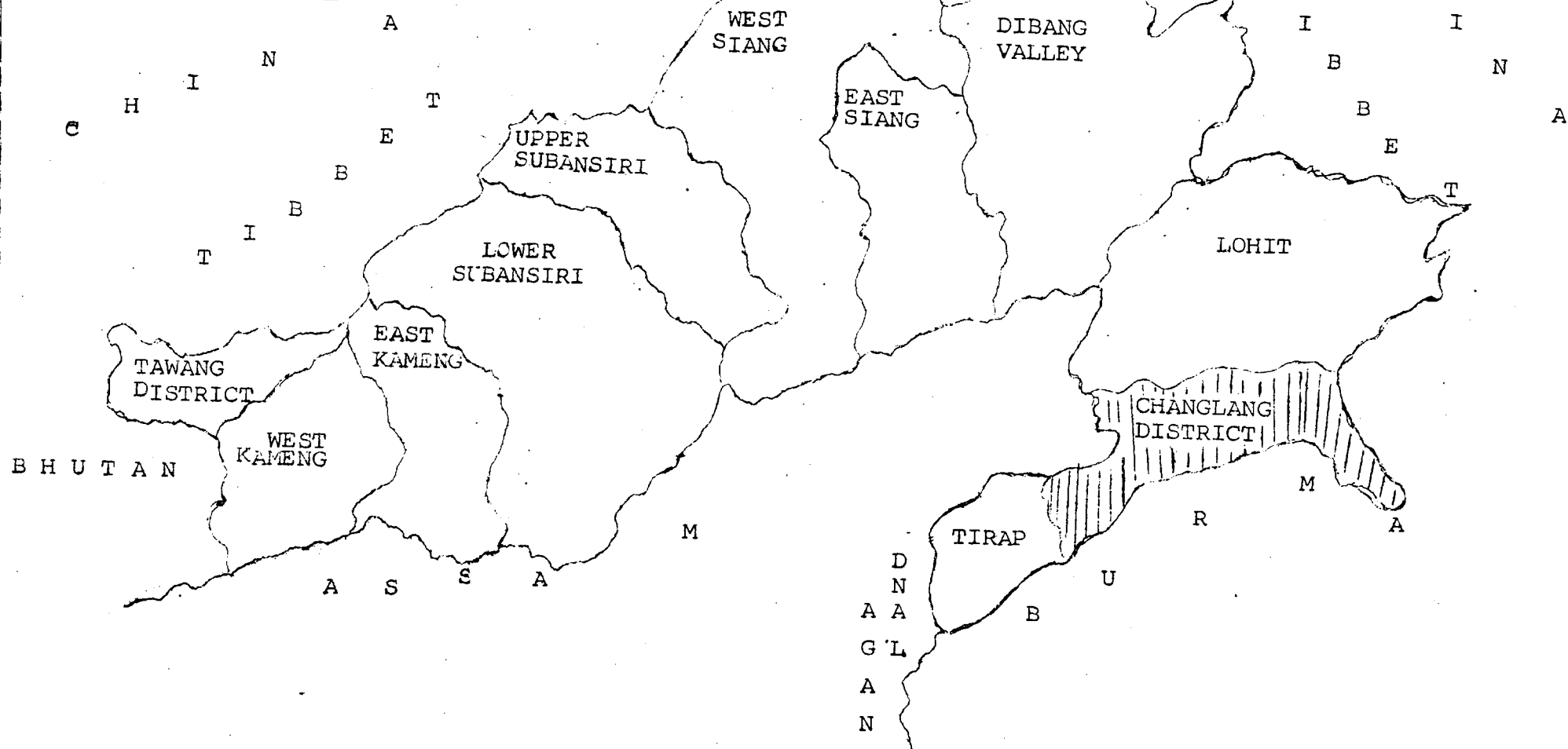

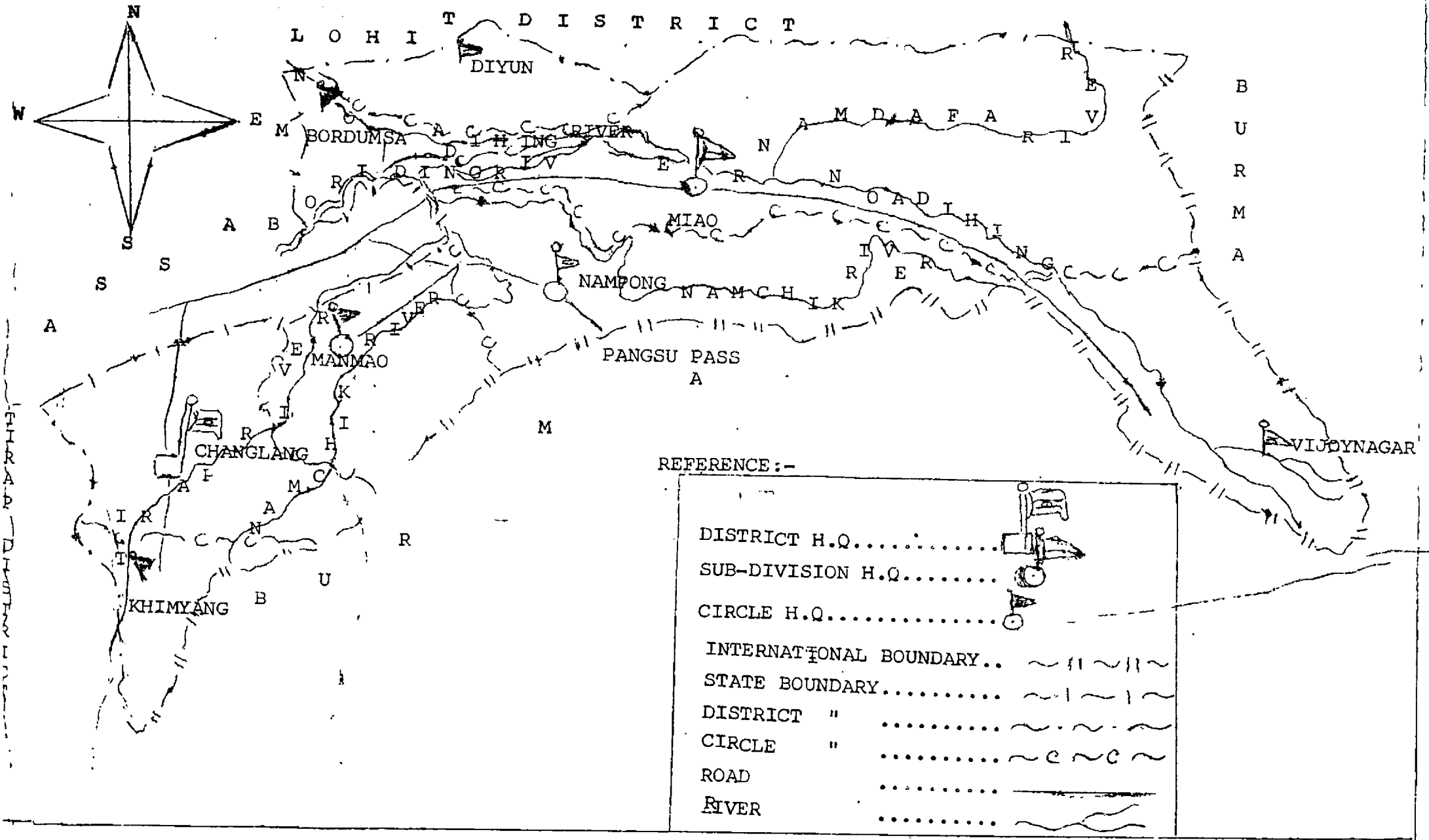

CHANGLANG DISTRICT
IN BREVE

The Changlang District of Arunachal Pradesh came into being on 14th November 1987, with an area of 3570 sq. Km.(prov.) as per 1981 Census. The district is situated in a unique geographical setting bounded in the East and South by Burma. The land has a picturesque beauty of its own. The principal river, Noa-Dehing rises in the Patkai Hills, flows Westerly and then a Northerly course and meets the river, Lohit.

The district derives its name from the local word " CHANGLANGKAN" which in common parlance is spoken and spelt as 'CHANGLANG'. The word 'CHANGLANGKAN' means a hill top where people discovered the poisonous herb which is used for poisoning fish in the river.

The climatic condition ranges from hot and humid in the plains portion like Jairampur, Miao Eordusmsa to cold in places like Vijoyanagar Pangsus-Pass in the hills. The climatic condition of Changlang the district Headquarter is moderate and pleasant with an average annual rainfall of 350 cm.

The district lies between the longitudes $26^{\circ} 40'$ North and $27^{\circ} 40'$ North and Longitudes $95^{\circ} 11'E$ and $97^{\circ} 10' E$.

The population of the district as per 1981 Census is 62211 out of which 33944 are males and 28269 are Females. The Literacy rate of the district is 23.33%. The population density of the district is 17 persons per sq. Km. The scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste population of the district are 22412 and 155 respectively. As per Census 1981 the total number of villages comes to 238(Prov.).

The district is the attraction for many anthropologists as it is the homeland fascinating and interesting tribes such as the Tangsas, Singphos, and Lichus. The distinct features of the major tribes of the district are given below:-

TANGSAS:

The Tangsas occupy the Eastern hills of the centre of the district along the Indo-Burma border and the Namchik basin. The Tangsas comprise of a number

of sub-tribes of which Lungchangs, Yuglis, Mossangs, Ronrangs, Kimsings, Morangs, Mokloms, Tikhaks, Pongthais, Longphis, Havis, Sanekes (Sakians) Longnes and Tyipis are important.

The tangsas are physically of medium stature and well-built ; their facial features are of mongoloid type with a fair complexion.

They generally live in steep hills where there is availability of water sources and suitable land for agriculture.

Men's wearing consists of a loin cloth or chequer patterned Lungi, sleeveless shirt and a turban. The dress of women folk consist of a skirt and a separate piece of cloth to cover the upper part of the body.

Like Noctes and Wanchos, the Tangsas are good craftsmen. Their textile designs are mostly of geometrical patterns. They also have special fascination for scarlet, red, black and dark-green colours and they are expert in cane and bamboo basketry works.

SINGPHOS:

The Singphos occupy the plain foot hill area of Northern part of the district under Miao, Sub-Division. The principal river of the area are Noa-Dehing, Buri-Dehing and Tangapani. Physically the Singphos represent most of the Mongoloid traits. The colour of the skin varies from light to medium brown.

Men wear 'Lungi' made with yarn of different colour combination, a jacket and a turban. Wear of women folk consist of a skirt with design on lower border a jacket and a designed scarlet, a waist band and a turban. The Singphos still make practically their own clothes. Weaving and dyeing are done by the women folk only.

They practise permanent rice cultivation. A few weeks before the monsoon, people get ready for ploughing. The Singphos employ buffaloes for ploughing although the use of buffaloes is uncommon. The rice is grown in wide stretches around the villages.

So far as religion is concerned, each tribe has its own trend of religious beliefs and practices. Generally it is believed that all religions of all tribes are around mother NATURE for its munificence, abundance of food well-being of man and his live-stock. In addition to this the Singphos are Buddhists.

The land provides a panorama of colourful festivals varying from tribe to tribe. Although folk festivals of Singphos varies from tribe to tribe, they celebrate 'SIPONG YONG' Paix as their main festivals.

Agriculture being the primary means of their subsistence, most of the festivals are interwoven and regulated by different aspects of agricultural operations.
