SPECIAL COMPONENT PLAN FOR SCHEDULED CASTES

The Scheduled Castes population in Haryana State is nearly 13.96 lakhs (about four lakhs families) and the Scheduled Castes comprise 18.89% of the total population. The district-wise distribution of the Scheduled Castes is reflected in the table below:-

2. The above table would reveal that the Scheduled Castes population is distributed all over the State in varying proportions. The concentration of the Scheduled Castes population is the highest in Sirsa district (24.33%) followed by Ambala (22.39%) and Hissar (21.63%). The districts of Gurgaon, Mohindergarh, Sonepat, Karnal, Rohtak and Bhiwani have Scheduled Castes population lower than the State average of 18.89%.

3. The table below gives the distribution of Scheduled Castes population in rural and urban areas:-

The above table would reveal that the major part of the Scheduled Castes population (57.30%) is engaged as agricultural labour, followed by 18.23% as cultivators and 24.47% in other occupations.

5. A survey to determine the extent of population of Haryana living below the poverty line has already been initiated but the result of this survey have yet to become available. Although the major part of the Scheduled Castes population is below the poverty line, but in the absence of reliable data, it has not been possible to evaluate the actual

extent of their economic backwardness. Therefore, despite best efforts, it has not been possible to quantify in precise terms the flow of funds from identifiable and unidentifiable general programmes.

6. From the view point of the economic development of the Scheduled Castes, they can be grouped broadly into the following categories:-

- i) (a) Landless agricultural labourers;
(b) Marginal farmers;
- ii) Artisans and skilled workers
- iii) Those engaged in "unclean occupations" like - flaying, tanning and scavenging;
- iv) Those engaged in strenuous occupations like rickshaw pulling etc.

7. The programmes which aim to ameliorate the economic conditions of the Scheduled Castes can be grouped into the following categories:-

- i) Schemes/programmes which will directly affect the Welfare of Scheduled Castes;
- ii) General sector programmes under which Scheduled Castes will share the benefits alongwith others;
- iii) Schemes/programmes which will benefit Scheduled Castes indirectly in terms of employment etc.

8. An outlay of Rs 250.12 crores has been ~~proposed~~ for Haryana's Annual Plan 1980-81. The sectoral break up of the proposed outlay is given below:-

11. It is possible to identify programme for the 'Special Component Plan' only under the Agriculture & allied sectors, Industry and Minerals sector and Social & Community services sectors as detailed hereunder:-

It would be evident that out of total outlay of Rs 78.39 crores proposed for 1930-31 for these sectors, the outlay on identified schemes is Rs 22.26 crores i.e. 23.4%. The 'Special Component Plan for Scheduled Castes in the divisible plan is Rs 7.67 crores. This works out to 34.5% of the identifiable programmes of Rs 22.26 crores, 9.8% of the total outlay of Rs 78.39 crores for identifiable sectors, and 3.1% of the total proposed plan size of Rs 250.12 crores.

12. The divisible Schemes/Programmes has been formulated with a view to helping the weaker sections of the society, especially Scheduled Castes small and marginal farmers, Agricultural labour. The Scheduled Castes constitute 6.4% of the total cultivators in Haryana. The divisible schemes under crop husbandry are such where an element of subsidy has been provided. These schemes primarily are for the benefit of small and marginal farmers in which category the Scheduled Castes farmers fall.

13. In the Industry sector, specific programmes have been formulated with a view to benefiting exclusively the Scheduled Castes population engaged in leather work. It is proposed to increase the enrolment in Schools. Since the bulk of non-attending children consists of girls belonging to Scheduled Castes, specific schemes have been formulated for award of attendance scholarships and other incentives to the Scheduled Castes girls under Elementary Education. The programmes formulated under Nutrition and Urban Development will undoubtedly benefit the Scheduled Castes population of urban slums.

14. The outlay reflected in para 11 is, however, not truly reflective of the total magnitude of the financial investment under special component plan. Illustratively, during 1930-31, an outlay of Rs 40 lakhs (including Rs 15.00 lakhs on non-plan side) has been kept for providing share capital to the Haryana Harijan Kalyan Nigam. This would attract not only the matching contribution from Government of India but also institutional resources of considerable magnitude for funding the schemes of the Nigam for the welfare of Scheduled Castes.

15. Special programmes for rural development have been designed to help the weaker sections agricultural labour artisans and the rural poor. Under these programmes the

identified beneficiaries are provided subsidy/loan for land based and animal husbandry based programmes such as land levelling, sinking of shallow tube-wells, purchase of animals, poultry & pigery. It is proposed to assist 63,000 beneficiaries during 1980-81 of which 30,000 shall belong to Scheduled Castes. The financial provision indicated in the 'Special Component Plan' is only State share, which will attract not only matching contribution from Central Government but also considerable institutional resources.

16. Similarly under dairy development, 1800 mini-dairy units are expected to be set up during 1979-80 and 1980-81, of which 360 units will be set up by the members of Scheduled Castes. The provision reflected under Special Component Plan viz Rs 7.21 lakhs represents only an element of subsidy whereas the funds aggregating to Rs 32.86 lakhs (@ Rs 23000/- per unit for 360 units) for the purchase of animals & construction of sheds will become available from Commercial Banks.

17. The Rural Industrialization programme will also attract 4 times investment by the Banks/financial institutions.

18. Under cooperative credit plan, a total loaning programme of Rs 26.00 crores is envisaged. Of this, it is proposed to provide 50% to the weaker sections etc. In real financial terms, the benefit to Scheduled Castes will accrue to the extent of around Rs 13 crores whereas only Rs 1.01 crores is indicated under the divisible plan.

(c) Labour Intensive Capital Works:

19. Of the total proposed outlay of Rs 250.12 crores for 1980-81, an expenditure of Rs 193.84 crores is proposed on labour intensive capital works under Irrigation, Flood Control, Power, Water Supply, Administrative Buildings, Roads etc. It is estimated that an expenditure of around Rs 65.07 crores will be on the labour wages bill only. It will be a fair assumption that 45% of the labour force would be from the Scheduled Castes which would be directly benefited. Simple

arithmetical calculations would show that about Rs 26.00 crores i.e. 10.4% of the total proposed outlay will go directly for the employment benefits to the Scheduled Castes.

(ii) Programmes Yielding indirect benefits:

20. It is not possible to quantify the benefits that would flow to the Scheduled Castes under the programmes for the development of Irrigation and Power, Transport and Communication, Water Supply and General Services for which outlay aggregating to Rs 133.5 crores representing 73.4% of the total outlay is proposed. But it will be unrealistic to assume that the programmes under these sectors will not benefit the Scheduled Castes. Development of irrigation potential consumption of power both for tubewells as well as for domestic purpose, rural roads and transport facility will undoubtedly help in socio-economic betterment of the rural population where the percentage of Scheduled Castes population is 20.55% and the agricultural labour 57.30.

21. The State Government Departments have been advised to ensure that while implementing their programmes may it be construction of link road, providing of public tanks under the Water Supply Installation of tubewells or electric connections. priority is accorded to the Scheduled Castes beneficiaries.

22. The table below will sum up the benefits in financial terms which will accrue to the Scheduled Castes population directly or indirectly during Annual Plan 1970-71. This however does not include the funds which will become available from (i) Central Government by way of matching contribution and (ii) Financial Institutions/Commercial Bank etc:-

23. The above table would reveal that 'Special Component Plan' in respect of identifiable schemes for 1980-81 is Rs. 7.67 crores which is 34.5% of the total State Plan outlay for divisible schemes. In case the direct employment benefits under labour intensive programmes is to be reckoned as a part of special component plan, then its size will go up to 33.67 crores i.e. 38.6% of the divisible outlay, and 13.5% of the total proposed outlay for 1980-81.
