REVIEW OF ACHIEVEMENT -UNA DISTRICT.

Before reorganisation of Himachal Pradesh, Una was a tehsil of Hoshiarpur District of Punjab State. In November, 1966, when hilly areas of Punjab got merged with Himachal Pradesh, Una became a tehsil of Kangra District. It again underwent a change on 1st September, 1972, when Una became a full-fledged district of Himachal Pradesh. It was a step in right direction, which fulfilled the long cherished desire of the people of this area and paved the way for speedy economic development of this district, bounded by Kangra district on the North, Hamirpur district on the East, Bilaspur district on the South-East Hoshiarpur district and Roop Nagar district in Punjab on West and South respectively. Geographically, it lies within North latitude $31^{\circ} 21'$ and $31^{\circ} 50'$ and East longitudes 76 and 28. The altitude varies from more than 350 metres to over 1200 metres.

Known as Jaswan Valley in the middle ages, Una comprise the area falling between the first two ranges of Shivalik valley spreading from Ropar in the East to Talwara in the West, Swan Nadi intersected it in almost two equal parts. Large number of streams, emanating from the Shivalik ranges on both the sides drained out their waters in the Swan Nadi and caused soil erosion on a very extensive scale. The problem of soil erosion acted as a great bottle-neck in the development of this area and was particularly responsible for the poverty of the peasantry of this area.

Historically also this area has witnessed so many ups and downs. In 1338, Taimur Lung passed through this valley while returning to middle Asia after carrying out his plundering spree in the North India. Hemun took refuge in this valley after his defeat in the second battle of Panipat. While chasing him, Beram Khan passed through Jaswan Valley and reached Jammu.

During the era of Guru Govind Singh, Baba Kaladhari migrated from Dera Baba Nanak for religious preachings and is said to have founded Una. It was further enlarged by his grandson, Baba Sahib Singh Bedi who was awarded 80 villages of Jaswan Valley in Jagir.

From administrative point of view, Una district has been divided into three tehsils viz. Una, Amb & Bangana, and one sub-tehsil Haroli. For rural uplift of the district, it has been divided into four community development blocks viz. Una, Amb, Gagret and Bangana. The total number of inhabited villages/towns are 557.

2. AREA AND POPULATION

According to village papers area of the district is 1,54,198 hectares and its total population as per census-1981 is 3,17,422 out of which 71,265 persons are Scheduled Castes constituted 22.4% of the total population. For the first time, 19 scheduled tribes have also been reported in the district during the 1981 census and they all fall in Amb Tehsil. As far as population is concerned the district ranks 5th in Himachal Pradesh after Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Hamirpur districts. Density of population per sq.km. comes to 206 giving 3rd place after Hamirpur and Bilaspur. Whereas decennial growth rate of population was 15.29 percent during 1961-71 decade, it increased to 21.45 percent during 1971-81, sex ratio (Female per thousand males also increased from 1003 in 1971 to 1028 in 1981, giving it second place after Hamirpur district. In the matter of literacy the district improved its position from 38.75 percent in 1971 to 50.0 percent in 1981 and netted the second position in Himachal Pradesh falling close to Hamirpur district (52.70%). Another important feature of 1981 census is the increase in urban population of the district from 10,338 in 1971 to 24,506 in 1981, showing decadal growth rate of 137%. Still major portion of the population (92.28%) is rural.

5. HORTICULTURE :-

Besides agriculture crops, there is a good scope for the development of horticulture in the district. Tropical and sub-tropical type of fruits are being grown in this district. Upto the year ending 1988-89, an area of 3245 hect. has been covered under fruit plants and during the year 3090 tonnes of fruits of various varieties were produced in the district. During the year under review, an amount of Rs. 99535 was provided as loans and subsidies for the development of horticulture.

6. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :-

The role of Animal Husbandry is very important in the way of providing motive power, fertilizers, supplementing subsidiary food and augmenting income of farmers.

The productive potential of livestock is being improved through scientific breeding, disease control and development of fodder resources. As per 1982 census total livestock and poultry in the district was 240166 and 12549 respectively.

During the year 11 Hospitals and 23 veterinary dispensaries functioned in the district and the 32 cattle dies from various contagious diseases.

7. FISHERIES :-

Some part of Govind Sagar falls in block Bangana of this district, which has great scope for the development of Pisciculture and to provide an attraction for the Tourists. Natural streams and ponds in the district are also being developed for popularising the fish cultivation. During the year about 24.54 quintals of fish valued at Rs. 228 lakhs were landed and 62 fishermen were registered in the district. 2 unauthorised persons were detected doing fishing from whom Rs. 60 were realised as fine.

8. FORESTS :-

Forests have a special significance as these provide valuable timber, medicinal herbs, raw material for small and large scale industries and several other major and minor produce. Besides generating employment, forests also play a vital role in soil conservation and ensures timely and adequate rains. Forest cover an area of 52036 hect. present Bangana Tehsil

3. AGRICULTURE :-

About 92 percent of the inhabitants reside in villages and agriculture is the most important occupation for them. The rural population mostly earn their livelihood directly or indirectly from agriculture. Food, being the basic necessity of life, self sufficiency in it is an acid test of a happy, prosperous and stable state. So efforts were continued to increase yield by intensive cultivation, better seeds, better implements, fertilizers pesticides and providing irrigation facilities. During the year 1987-88 total area under principal crops was 72289 hect. as against 71288 hect. during 1986-87. Net area sown was 42963 during the year 1987-88. Barren and unculturable land and land put to non-agriculture use also remained constant at 31058 hect. and 19882 hect. respectively during the year 1986-87 and 1987-88.

4. SOIL CONSERVATION :-

The problem of soil erosion exists on a colossal scale in the district due to the flowing of the Swan Nadi and its various tributaries through the district. Out of the total area of the district i.e. 1542 Sq.Km. The remaining area falls in the Lun Khad catchment. Swan Nadi, during rainy season, plays a great havoc in the district. A great chunk of cultivated productive land situated along the banks of Swan and its tributaries is washed away every year and rendered unfit for future cultivation. The only answer to check this havoc of Swan Nadi during the rainy season is to implement such works in catchment area which aim at conservation of water, reduction of run off and reduction in sediment production on construction of small reservoir up-stream and taking up anti flood/anti bank erosion engineering works in the down stream.

In order to tackle this problem on permanent basis a soil conservation sub-division under the administrative jurisdiction of Department of Agriculture, Himachal Pradesh was established in the year 1967 (When Unatensil was a part of Kangra District) with the responsibility of taking up soil conservation measures on the agricultural land/farmers holdings. The soil conservation works on the forest land and government lands are being taken care of by the Forest Deptt. and H.P.P.W.D. respectively.

In Una district the number of electrified villages/towns has gone to 554 by the end of March, 1989. Number of connections is also gradually increasing from 47506 as on 31st March, 1984 to 75442 as on 31st March, 1989, whereas consumption of electricity was 26988 thousand units in 1984-85 and 3432 thousand units in March, 1989.

11. INDUSTRIES :-

Una district is of paramount importance in the field of industrialisation in the state. Being situated on the border of Punjab and owing to various concessions/incentives given by the state Govt., there has been rapid development of industries in Una district. There are seven medium scale industries and 1426 small scale industries units functioning in the district.

Seating capacity of Industrial training institute Una stood at 158 during the year 1988-89. Training programme for fitter, turner, carpentry, tractor-cum-motor mechanic, welder, stenography and surveyor courses continued during the year.

12. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :-

During the year 1987-88, 609 vehicles were registered in the district and the total number registered vehicles stood at 7347.

A fleet of 98 buses of Himachal Road Transport Corp. Una depot continued plying in 103 routes covering 97.29 lakhs kms. route length. During the year under report 54.25 lakhs passengers were carried as against the figure of 55.00 lakhs during 1986-87. During the year 1988-89, 36 road accidents occurred which involved 37 vehicles. In these accidents 18 persons were killed and 55 persons were injured.

13. EDUCATION :-

Education plays a vital role in the socio-economic development of the people. As on 31st March, 1989, there were 403 primary schools, 68 middle schools, 67 high/sen. sec. schools and 4 degree colleges functioning in the district. In these institutions 2467 teachers were engaged in imparting education to 88,446 students.

There is one Forest Division in Una District, which has its jurisdiction and control over whole of the district except Bangana tehsil and part of Dehra tehsil which lies to the left of river Beas. The division has also its technical control over the Kutlehr forest extending over whole of Bangana tehsil and a part of Barsar tehsil of Hamirpur district, which are under the management of Raja Kutlehr. Forest Corporation is also operating in the district, which handles the resin tapping works.

During the year 1987-88, 6470 cum. timber worth Rs. 23.02 lakhs and fuel worth Rs. 29.54 lakhs was produced. Besides these, minor forest problems worth Rs. 3.9 lakhs were also produced in the district.

9. CO-OPERATION : -

It is a matter of pride for Una district revealing the fact that co-operation movement in the country took its birth in a village of Una district itself. In 1892 the movement started in Panjwar village of Una district, whereas the co-operative movement act came into force in the country in 1904 only. The total number of all type of societies during the year 1988-89 was 450 in the district which cover 100% of the district. The membership increased from 129473 to 134727 during the year under review. The share capital and working capital have also increased from Rs. 218.37 lakhs to Rs. 248.32 lakhs and from Rs. 1638 lakhs to Rs. 2063.13 lakhs respectively during the year under review. During 1988-89, loans amounting to Rs. 501.25 lakhs were advanced by agricultural and non-agricultural societies. Loans outstanding also increased from Rs. 674.21 lakhs to Rs. 834.37 lakhs during the year under review.

10. POWER :-

In the modern age, importance of electricity in the villages needs no emphasis. It has become a basic necessity in day to day life and is very important for running small scale cottage Industries and for providing motive power for the Agriculture sector, specially in the irrigation and threshing operations.

14. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :-

Providing adequate medical and public health facilities in a welfare state is perhaps the primary duty of government. In this district, one district hospital at Una and one rural hospital, Daulatpur Chowk, 9 primary health centres 12 allopathic dispensaries, 25 ayurvedic dispensaries were functioning to provide medical facilities to the people of Una district. In all 201 beds were available in these institutions to cater to the needs of indoor patients. During the year 6,47,334 outdoor and 31,308 indoor patients were treated in the district by the allopathic institutions.

Our population is continuously increasing at a very high speed, which has posed a serious threat to our economy. In order to keep a neck on rapidly growing population the family welfare programme is also being carried out in the district.

15. LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT :-

There is one employment exchange, which is keeping necessary link between the employees and the employment seekers. By the end of 1988-89, there were 24875 persons on live register of the employment exchange. Out of these 237 were post graduates, 1569 were graduates while 13246 were matriculate and above. Out of the remaining, 6437 were literates and 565 were illiterates.

16. IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY :-

Irrigation and water supply facilities constitute the basic needs of the rural agricultural economy. In order to achieve speedy progress in this field, Una district is being covered by two divisions headed by Supdt. Engineer, Irrigation and Public Health, Una. By the end of 1988-89 as many as 540 villages (97.83%) stood covered under the water supply schemes whereas at the time of creation of the district the number stood at 52 only.

17. ANTI POVERTY PROGRAMME :-

Since the inception of the Special Component Plan at the district level sufficient funds have been spent for the uplift of the scheduled castes families in the district. During 1981-82, against the allocation of Rs. 58,748 lakhs, an amount of Rs. 67,164 lakhs was spent in the district under SCP schemes. During 1982-83, the allocation increased to Rs. 82,646 lakhs and the expenditure went upto 98,631 lakhs. During 1983-84 the allocation further increased to Rs. 92,340 lakhs against which as much as Rs. 106,913 lakhs was spent for the welfare of the SCs in the district. During 1984-85, the SCP schemes received even higher priority. The allocation increased to Rs. 87,703 lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 108,640 lakhs. For the year 1985-86, a modest plan for Rs. 82,703 lakhs was prepared and implemented successfully incurring an expenditure of Rs. 108,670 lakhs during the year. During the Annual Plan 1986-87, as much as Rs. 139,260 lakhs were spent by all the concerned department against the financial outlay of Rs. 102,762 lakhs. During the year 1988-89 against an outlay of Rs. 111,538 lakhs both under State Plan and the Special Central Assistance Rs. 128,095 lakhs have been spent for the betterment of SCs in the district. The sector/schemes wise financial achievements under SCP schemes for the annual plan 1988-89 are given separately.
