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P R E F A C E

This volume on District Educational Statistics for the state of Andhra Pradesh is the twentieth in the series of such volumes which will be brought out for all the states and Union Territories. The main aim is to highlight the inter-district variations in a state by giving educational data at district levels with the help of some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure and teacher pupil ratio etc.

In order to ascertain whether the educational imbalances have widened or narrowed down with time the data for the year 1976-77 has been analysed and compared with that for the year 1970-71.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the cooperation received from the Director of Education, Andhra Pradesh and the project staff of the Planning, Monitoring and Statistics Division who have prepared this report.

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I N T R O D U C T I O N

Regional imbalances do exist in the field of Educational Development just as in urbanisation, industrialisation, distribution of Income and wealth etc. With a view to highlight the rational imbalances in the educational sector, the Ministry of Education and Culture brings out the publication "Educational Statistics - District-wise" quinquennially.

2. A volume of this nature was first published by National Council of Educational Research and Training in 1960-61. Thereafter it was decided that such reviews will be brought out in respect of each state every five year by the Ministry of Education and Culture. Accordingly, the reviews for the year 1965-66 were brought out by this Ministry in respect of some of the states.

3. For making inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentage of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education have been worked out. These indices show wide range of variations between districts and hence the need for formulating educational plans at the district level.

III. AREA AND POPULATION

4. Andhra Pradesh State consists of 22 districts. The number of districts remains the same in both the years under review. Total area of the State is 2.77 lakh Sq. Km. Among the districts Anantapur has the highest area of 19725 Sq. Kms. followed by Guntur 16739 Sq. Kms. and Mahabubnagar 12419 Sq. Kms. and Hyderabad has the lowest area of 7701 Sq. Kms.

5. In 1971, population of Andhra Pradesh was 4.35 crores (2.20 crores males and 2.15 crores females). Among the districts it varied from 30.67 lakhs in East Godavari to 12.88 lakhs in Adilabad. For 1977, the total population of the state is estimated to have increased to 4.83 crores (2.45 crores males and 2.38 crores females). Among the districts the highest estimated population was in East Godavari (34.28 lakhs) and the lowest in case of Adilabad (14.3 lakhs).

6. The overall density of population per Sq.Km. was 157 in 1971 at state level. Density of population was the highest (359) in case of Hyderabad City followed by West Godavari (305) and the lowest in Adilabad (80) in 1971. The population density for the state was estimated 175 for the year 1977. Statement 1 gives district-wise particulars of area, population and density of population. Table 1 below gives a general view of the extent of variation in area, population and density of population.

7. The total population of the state as well as of different age groups for the years 1971 and 1977 (as on 1st March) given in the report are based on the revised population projections received from the office of the Registrar General of India. District-wise population for the age groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 for both the years of the report has been calculated using the following formula.

$$\frac{P}{6-11}^i = \frac{P}{K}$$

Where K $\equiv \frac{P}{\frac{6-11}{P}}$

Our assumption being

P = Total Population of the state

P_{6-11} = Total 6-11 age group population of the state

8. To get sex-wise break-up of the total population of different age-groups for the districts, after calculating the total population the girls population is estimated from the above formula with the difference that total population is replaced by girls population. The boys population is obtained by subtracting girls population from the estimated total population for the concerned age groups.

9. The total population of the age group 6-11 of the whole state was estimated to be 64.9 lakhs (33.1 lakhs boys and 31.8 lakhs girls) forming 13.4% of the whole population of the state in 1977.

10. Similarly the estimated population of the age group 11-14 works out to 36.6 lakhs (18.5 lakhs boys and 18.1 lakhs girls) constituting 7.6% of the total population in 1977.

11. 14-17 age group population of the state was estimated to be 35.3 lakhs (16.8 lakhs boys and 15.5 lakhs girls) in 1977. The total 14-17 age group population of 1977 was 6.9% of population of the whole state.

12. Thus of the total population of 483.05 lakhs the school going population in age group 6-17 years was 134.8 lakhs (68.4 lakhs boys and 66.4 lakhs girls). In 1977 the population in the age-group 6-17 years constituted 27.9% of the total population. Among the males and females too the same percentage of 27.9% was reported. District-wise details of population for different age-groups have been given in the statement 2.

III - LITERACY

13. According to 1971 Census the effective literacy viz. the number of literates per one hundred of population excluding the 0-4 age-group was 28.5 for the whole state. It was 38.4 for males and 18.3 for females. Among the districts the highest literacy (46.9) was in Hyderabad City followed by 40.4 in Krishna and the lowest (16.7) in Adilabad. District wise details of number of literates and literacy rate are given in Statement No.3.

IV GENERAL VIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

14. There were 43955 Educational Institutions in Andhra Pradesh in 1970-71 which rose to 46,774 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 6.4% during the period under review. The number includes all recognised institutions from pre-primary to Higher Education. The district of Srikakulam had the largest share of institutions (7.0%) followed by East Godavari (6.3%) and Ch. Chittoor (6.3%). The smallest share of the institutions was reported by Hyderabad City (2.0%). The district-wise position of institutions is given in Statement 4.

(b) ENROLMENT

15. The total enrolment in all recognised Educational Institutions in the state increased from 51.32 lakhs in 1970-71 to 59.01 lakhs in 1976-77. The increased in enrolment is observed in all the districts. The enrolment increased with an average annual growth rate of 2.5%

during the period under consideration. Krishna (4.90 lakhs) had the highest enrolment followed by Guntur (4.79 lakhs) and Adilabad (1.09 lakh) in 1976-77.

16. The percentage of girls enrolment to total enrolment was 56.8 in 1970-71 which slightly increased to 57.5 in 1976-77. Among the districts West Godavari (44.9) had the highest percentage of girls followed by East Godavari (44.0) and the lowest in Medak district (28.07 in 1976-77).

17. The total enrolment in all the Educational Institutions as a percentage of total population increased from 4.8. The percentage enrolment to total population increased in 14 of the 22 districts during the period. In 8 districts this percentage was more than the state average. This percentage was the highest in Krishna district (17.7%) followed by Hyderabad City (17.5%) and the lowest in Medak (7.5%). District-wise details are given in Statement 5.

(c) EXTENT OF COVERAGE OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

18. In 1976-77 the percentage of Scheduled Caste students studying in all types of Educational Institutions to the total enrolment was 13.0. Percentage of Scheduled Castes population to total population was estimated at 13.3. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes worked out to 97.7%. The corresponding extent of coverage of Scheduled Tribes was 71.1% at state level in 1976-77. District-wise details of extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes are given in Statements 8 and 9 respectively.

(d) TEACHERS

19. The total number of teachers in the state in all educational institutions increased from 175582 in 1970-71 to 197194 in 1976-77 showing an annual rate of increase of 2.16. In 1976-77 the percentage of trained teachers in school education was 96.9 corresponding percentages for men and women teachers were 96.8 and 97.0 respectively. District-wise details are given in Statement 4 and 7.

(e) EXPENDITURE

20. The total expenditure of all recognised Educational Institutions in the state was Rs.63.19 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.149.05 crores in 1976-77. The expenditure increased with an average annual rate of growth of 22.6%. The expenditure increased in all the districts. The percentage share of expenditure in 1976-77 was the highest in case of Hyderabad city (16.7) and the lowest in case of Adilabad (1.6).

21. The expenditure on education per head of population in the state increased from Rs.14.5 in 1970-71 to Rs.30.9 in 1976-77. In 7 districts, the per capita expenditure was more than the state average in 1976-77. The lowest per capita expenditure in 1976-77 was observed in Adilabad (14.2) and the highest in Hyderabad City (Rs.90.5). The expenditure per institution also increased from Rs.14375 in 1970-71 to Rs.31,897 in 1976-77. The

maximum was in Warangal district (Rs.43,427) and the lowest in Adilabad (Rs.15612). The district-wise details are given in Statement 5.

V. PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

22. There were only 66 Pre-Primary schools in the state in 1970-71 which increased to 120 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 Medak district reported 26 the highest number of such schools in 11 of the 22 districts.

23. Enrolment in all the pre-primary schools also increased from 3535 in 1970-71 to 7097 in 1976-77. At the same time enrolment of pre-primary classes at state level was 18,622 which rose to 30,701 during the period under consideration.

24. Number of teachers working in pre-primary schools was 90 in 1970-71 which increased to 153 in 1976-77.

25. Total expenditure incurred on all the pre-primary schools was Rs.2.42 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.4.78 lakhs in 1976-77.

26. Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes students going to the pre-primary schools were 804 (310 boys and 494 girls) in 1970-71. In 1976-77 of the total students 2713 (8.8%) belonged to Scheduled Castes and 233 (0.8%) to Scheduled Tribes. District-wise particulars are given in Statement 10.

VI. PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS:

27. The total number of primary schools increased from 37,013 in 1970-71 to 37,720 in 1976-77. This shows an average annual increase of 3.2% during this period. The highest number of primary schools were reported by Srikakulam district having a percentage share of 7.7% followed by East Godavari (6.5%) and Chittoor (6.5%) in 1976-77.

28. In 1970-71 the average area served by a primary school was 7.5 Sq.Kms. at state level. The position slightly improved during the period as on average a primary school was available for every area of 7.3 Sq. Kms. in 1976-77.

29. Average population served by a primary school was 1175 in 1970-71 which increased to 1281 in 1976-77 showing that schooling facilities slightly decreased during the period of 6 years. Among the districts population served by a primary school varied from as low as 825 in Cuddapah to as high as 2556 in Hyderabad City.

30. The total number of teachers in primary schools of Andhra Pradesh increased from 79172 in 1970-71 to 79393 in 1976-77. The percentage share of teachers in Primary Schools was the highest (10.0%) in Guntur followed by East Godavari (7.7%) and the lowest (1.4%) in Nizamabad. In 1976-77 out of the total number of teachers, 1970 or 24.9% were women teachers. District-wise details of primary schools, teachers, area served by a primary school and population served by a Primary school are given in Statement No. 11.

(b) ENROLMENT

31. The total enrolment in primary schools of Andhra Pradesh increased from 30.88 lakhs in 1970-71 to 32.36 lakhs in 1976-77. In classes I-V the enrolment was 38.83 lakhs (23.45 lakhs boys and 15.58 lakhs girls) in 1970-71. This increased to 42.74 lakhs (25.48 lakhs boys and 17.26 lakhs girls) by 1976-77 at an average annual growth rate of 1.7% during the period of six years. The annual growth rate for boys was 1.6% and for girls 1.8% showing more improvement in girls education than in case of boys.

32. The enrolment ratio at the primary stage which is defined as the percentage of enrolment in classes I-V to the total population in the age-group 6-11 gives an index of the facilities created at the primary stage of education. This percentage was 66.1 in 1970-71 and the same slightly declined to 65.8 in 1976-77. In case of boys also enrolment ratio declined from 78.8 in 1970-71 to 77.0 in 1976-77 whereas for girls this ratio increased from 53.3 to 54.2 during the period. In 9 of the 22 districts i.e. enrolment ratio was more than state average in 1976-77. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement No. 12.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES

33. Out of total enrolment of 38.83 lakhs in classes I-V 5.48 lakhs (14.4%) were SC/ST students in 1970-71. In 1976-77, of the total enrolment of 42.74 lakhs, 6.25 lakhs

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(3.84 lakh boys and 2.41 lakh girls) belonged to Scheduled Castes forming 14.6% whereas the percentage of scheduled caste population was 13.3%. Thus the extent of coverage of S.C. students in 1976-77 works out to 109.8 corresponding extent of coverage of S.T. students was 86.5 in 1976-77.

4. District-wise details of S.C. and S.T. enrolment and their percentages are given in statement No. 13.

The coefficient of equality or extent of coverage is defined as:

(d) EXPENDITURE (Provisionally)

35. The total expenditure on primary schools increased from Rs. 18.95 crores in 1970-71 to Rs. 40.54 crores in 1976-77. This gives an average annual growth rate of 19.0% during the period under consideration. Expenditure incurred on primary schools as percentage to the total expenditure on education was 30.0% in 1970-71 at state level which increased to 27.2% in 1976-77 for the state as a whole. In fourteen of the twenty two districts the percentage was more than that of the state average in 1976-77. The expenditure on primary schools as percentage to the total expenditure on education was the highest (48.7%) in Srikakulam district and the lowest in Warangal (16.7%).

36. The average expenditure incurred on a primary school was Rs.5121 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.10747 by 1976-77 for the state as a whole.

37. The expenditure on primary schools as per head of population was 4.4 in 1970-71 which increased to 8.4 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 the expenditure per capita was the highest in Prakasam (Rs.13.5) and the lowest in Nizamabad (Rs.3.8).

38. The average cost per student was Rs.61.3 in 1970-71 at the state level. This increased to Rs.125.2 during the period of 5 years. Among the districts the cost per student varies from Rs.193.3 in Medak followed by Rs.184.3 in Mababubanagar to Rs.96.8 in Anantapur. There was negative correlation between the cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in primary schools among the districts.

39. In primary schools the teacher pupil ratio was 1:39 in 1970-71 at the state level which decreased to 1:41 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 teachers pupil ratio varied from 1:47 in Krishna to 1:29 in Medak. District wise details of the expenditure on primary schools, per capita expenditure, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio are given in Statement 14. Summary picture of expenditure 1976-77 is given in Table No.2 below.

VII. MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

40. The total number of middle schools in Andhra Pradesh was 3123 in 1970-71. This increased to 4044 in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth of 4.9%. Among the districts the highest number of middle schools was in Krishna (315) followed by Karimnagar (249) and the lowest in Adilabad (111) for the year 1976-77. The average area served by a middle school in the state was 83.6 Sq. Kms. in 1970-71. Position improved in 1976-77 as for every area of 68.4 Sq. Kms. a middle school was available.

41. In 1970-71 on an average a middle school was available for a population of 13,930. The situation improved slightly during the period of 6 years as on average a middle school was made available for every population of 11,944 persons in 1976-77. The population served by a middle school varied from 18,879 in Visakhapatnam to the lowest of 8758 in Karimnagar district.

42. The total number of teachers teaching in the middle schools of the state increased from 24,937 in 1970-71 to 31,854 in 1976-77 at an average annual growth rate of 4.6% in 1976-77. Of the total women teachers formed 28.2% District-wise details of middle schools and teachers are given in Statement No. 15.

(b) ENROLMENT

43. The total enrolment in middle schools of Andhra Pradesh was 775508 in 1970-71 which increased to 1006,716 in 1976-77. Among the districts the highest enrolment in middle schools was reported by Krishna (91,246) followed by Hyderabad City (75,783) and the lowest was in Medak (19834) during the year 1976-77. At the same time enrolment in classes VI-VIII was 5.90 lakhs (4.64 lakhs boys and 2.06 lakh girls) in 1970-71. This increased to 9.28 lakhs (6.35 lakhs boys and 2.95 lakhs girls) showing an average annual growth rate of 5.8%. The corresponding growth rate for boys was 5.1% and for girls 7.2%. This shows that the girls education is improving at the Middle stage.

44. The enrolment ratio at the Middle stage which is defined as the percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the total population in the age group 11-14 gives an index of facilities created at the middle stage education. For the state as a whole the enrolment ratio increased from 11.8 in 1970-71 to 25.4 in 1976-77. In case of boys the corresponding increase in enrolment ratio was from 16.4 to 34.3 and for girls from 7.1 to 16.3 during the period under consideration. In 1976-77 the percentage enrolment was the highest in Krishna (40.6%) followed by Guntur (31.1) and the lowest was in Adilabad (14.8). In 7 of the 22 districts the enrolment ratio was higher than of the state level. The enrolment ratio in case of girls was the highest in Krishna (30.2) and the lowest in Medak (7.0).

The sex-ratio of enrolment in classes VI-VIII viz enrolment of girls for every 100 boys was 43 in 1970-71 which slightly increased to 47 in 1976-77. District-wise details are given in Statement No. 16.

(a) ENROLMENT OF S.C. AND S.T.

45. In 1970-71 the total enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in classes VI-VIII was 72,226 which formed 10.5% of the total enrolment in these classes. Among the districts this percentage varied from 17.0% in East Godavari to 4.6 in Nizamabad. In 1976-77 scheduled Caste students studying in VI-VIII classes were 84,953 forming 9.2% of the total enrolment in these classes. Among the districts the percentage varied from 15.6 in East Godavari to 4.5 in Nizamabad. The extent of coverage of S.C. in 1976-77 in classes VI-VIII worked out to 69.3%.

46. S.T. students were reported only 11,807 studying in classes VI-VIII which formed only 1.3% of the total enrolment in these classes. Extent of coverage of the students of this community was estimated to be 54.1%. The district-wise particulars of S.C. and S.T enrolment and their percentages are given in Statement 17. The expenditure incurred on a middle school was Rs. 18,636 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs. 41021 in 1976-77. The expenditure on middle schools as perhead of population also increased from Rs. 1.3 in

1970-71 to Rs.3.4 in 1976-77. The highest expenditure per head of population was Rs.5.5 in Karimnagar followed by Warangal (Rs.5.0) and the lowest in Nizamabad (Rs.1.6).

47. In 1970-71 the expenditure on middle schools formed 9.2% of the total expenditure on education in the state which slightly increased to 11.1 in 1976-77. Among the districts the percentage of expenditure on Middle schools varies from 26.6 in Hyderabad City followed by 26.3 in Gulbarga, 16.5 in Hyderabad City.

48. The average cost per student in middle schools for the state as a whole was Rs.75 in 1970-71. This increased to Rs.165 in 1976-77. Among the districts the average cost per student varies from the highest Rs.292 in Medak to the lowest to Rs.99 in East Godavari.

49. It can be observed from the Statement 18 that cost per student has negative correlation with teacher:pupil ratio. This implies that the average cost per student is high when the teacher:pupil ratio is low.

50. Teacher:pupil ratio in the middle schools was 1:31 in 1970-71 and 1:32 in 1976-77. Looking at the district-wise position, the teacher:pupil ratio varies from 35 in Guntur to 19 in Medak.

51. District-wise details of expenditure are given in statement No. 18 whereas Table 3 below summarises position of expenditure in the districts in 1976-77.

VIII. HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL EDUCATION
INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

52. There were 294 higher secondary schools in 1970-71 in the state which increased to 3471 in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth rate of 2.8%. The highest number of higher secondary schools was in Hyderabad City (229).

53. In 1970-71, on an average a higher secondary school was available for every 95.0 Sq. Kms. Educational facilities improved during the period as for every area of School 81.1 Sq. Kms. a Higher Secondary could be made available in 1976-77.

54. At the state level a higher secondary school was available for every 14929 persons in 1970-71. The position improved during the period under review as a population of 14162 was being served by a higher secondary school in 1976-77 at the state level. Among the districts the population served by a higher secondary school varies from 25122 in Visakhapatnam to 9226 in Hyderabad City.

55. The number of teachers working in higher secondary schools in the state increased from 49862 to 56964 during the period under consideration showing an average annual growth rate of 2.4% of the total number of teachers, 13411 were women forming 23.5. District-wise details of institutions and teachers can be seen from statement 19.

(b) ENROLMENT

56. The total enrolment in higher secondary schools of the state was 10.17 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to 12.07 in 1976-77. Enrolment in classes IX-XI increased from 2.75 thousand (208 thousands boys and 71 thousands girls) to 3.5 thousand (250 thousands boys and 101 girls) in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth rate of 4.3% during the period. The corresponding growth rates for boys and girls were 3.4% and 7.0% respectively.

57. At the state level the enrolment ratio at the high/higher secondary stage i.e. enrolment in classes IX-XI as a percentage of population in 14-17 age group was 10.1 in 1970-71 which slightly increased to 10.5 in 1976-77. In case of boys it declined from 15.4 to 14.9 but for girls it increased slightly from 5.3 to 6.1 during the period under consideration. Among the districts the enrolment ratio varies from 21.5 in Hyderabad city to 5.9 in Medak and Adilabad. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement No.20.

(c) ENROLMENT OF S.C. AND S.T.

58. Of the total enrolment in classes IX-XI in 1970-71 8.4% boys and 8.9% girls belonged to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes jointly. Both boys and girls together formed 8.5%. The extent of coverage in enrolment of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students was 49.7 in 1970-71. Thus it is seen that higher secondary education of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes was lagging behind the general population in 1970-71.

59. In 1976-77 the S.C. boys and girls formed separately 8.6% and 9.1%. Taking boys and girls together the percentage was 8.7 in 1976-77. The extent of coverage of schedules caste enrolment in IX-XI classes was estimated to be 65.4. The estimated extent of coverage of scheduled tribe students worked out to be as 23.6 only. District-wise position of S.C. and S.T. enrolment and their enrolment percentages is given in Statement 21.

(d) EXPENDITURE

60. Total expenditure on higher secondary schools in the state was Rs.18.21 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.39.47 crores in 1976-77 at an annual increase of 19.5%. Percentage of expenditure on higher secondary schools to total expenditure on education was 28.8 in 1970-71 which declined to 26.5 in 1976-77 at state level. In 1976-77 among the districts the highest share of 40.8% of total expenditure on education was incurred on Secondary Schools in Nizamabad followed by 38.3% in Hyderabad district and the lowest in case of Visakhapatnam (30.1%).

61. Expenditure on higher secondary schools as per head of population was Rs.4.2 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.8.2 in 1976-77. From the district-wise breakup, it has been observed that the expenditure per head of population varies from Rs.22.9 in Hyderabad City followed by Rs.8.8 in Guntur to Rs.5.2 both in Srikakulam and Adilabad.

62. Average cost per student in high/higher secondary schools was Rs.199 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.326 in 1976-77. In 1970-71 among the districts, the cost per student varied widely from Rs.345 in Srikakulam to Rs.160 each in East Godavari and Krishna districts. In 1976-77 this variation was from Rs.443 in Srikakulam followed by Rs.428 in Nalgonda to 207 in Adilabad. It can also be seen from the Statement 22 that in 15 of the 22 districts the average cost per student is more than the state average. There exists negative correlation between the cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in High/Higher Secondary Schools in the districts viz. average cost per student is high whereas the teacher pupil ratio is low. Teacher pupil ratio was ^{1:18} in 1970-71 in higher secondary schools at state level which ^{1:18} slightly decreased to 1:21 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 among the districts the teachers pupil ratio varies from the highest of 1:15 in Nalgonda to the lowest of 1:28 in Hyderabad City district. The details of expenditure and teacher pupil ratio can be seen from the Statement No.22. Table No.4 Summarises district-wise percentage expenditure on higher secondary schools, expenditure per head of population and the average cost per student.

63. From the Table No.5 given below it can be seen that enrolment of girls was 40.1%, 29.9% and 25.4% in classes I-V, VI-VIII and IX-XI respectively at state level in 1976-77. In the districts in classes I-V it ranged from 48.1% in West Godavari to 25.3% in Karimnagar.

64. In classes VI-VIII the highest percentage of girls enrolment was in case of Krishna (43.1%) and the lowest in Medak (15.8%).

65. In classes IX-XI the highest percentage of enrolment of girls was in case of Hyderabad City (38.2%) followed by Krishna (37.2%) and the lowest in case of Medak (9.8%).

IX. PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL AND OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION

66. Total number of Vocational, Professional, Special and other educational institution of school level was 294 in 1970-71. The number of these institutions became more than double viz. 658 in 1976-77.

67. The total number of teachers in these institutions was 1580 in 1970-71. Number of teachers increased to 1906 (2193 men and 540 women) in 1976-77.

68. The total enrolment in professional and vocational (school) education increased from 25663 (17183 boys and 8483 girls) in 1970-71 to 50568 (33327 boys and 16941 girls) in 1976-77 showing an increase of 102% during the period under consideration.

69. In 1970-71 4572 (3523 boys and 749 girls) of all students enrolled in these institutions were of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled tribe community. In 1976-77 there were 4098 S.C. students and 754 S.T. students.

70. Total expenditure on all types of professional and vocational (school) institutions was Rs.61.23 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.1.61 crores in 1976-77. In 1976-77 among the districts the highest expenditure was reported by Hyderabad city (Rs.22.43) lakhs followed by West Godavari (Rs.21.67) lakhs and the lowest in Khammam (Rs.0.82 lakh). District-wise details of institutions enrolment, teachers and expenditure can be seen from Statement 23

X. HIGHER EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS:

71. In Andhra Pradesh there were 545 institutions of all types of Higher Education in 1970-71 which increased to 708 in 1976-77. These include 8 universities, 1 deemed to be university, 340 affiliated colleges, 12 institutions of below degree level, 306 Intermediate/Pre-degree Jr. Colleges (old pattern) and 2 boards. Affiliated institutions

Included 235 Arts, Science & Commerce Colleges, 3 Agriculture & Forestry Colleges, 15 Colleges of Education, 9 Engg. & Technology Colleges, 5 Law Colleges, 14 Medical Colleges and 59 of other disciplines.

72. The total number of teachers increased from 19951 in 1970-71 to 25932 in 1976-77 at the average annual increase of 3% during the period under review. District-wise details of institutions and teachers are given in Statement 24.

(b) ENROLMENT

73. Total enrolment in all types of institutions of higher education increased from 326210 in 1970-71 to 393467 in 1976-77 with average annual increase of 20.6% during the period under review. In 1976-77, of the total students 159864 (40.6%) were reported studying in Arts, Science and Commerce colleges, 14519 (3.7%) in Non-affiliated institutions imparting professional education courses of below degree level and 191613 (47.6%) in intermediate/pre-degree Jr. Colleges. District-wise details of enrolment of higher education are given in Statement 25. District-wise position of enrolment in general education and professional education has been given in statement 26.

(c) ENROLMENT OF S.C. AND S.T.

74. In 1970-71 of all the students studying in higher education in the state 15316 were scheduled Caste and Scheduled tribes whereas in 1976-77 enrolment of scheduled


castes and scheduled tribes in all institutions of higher education was 20615 (16230 boys and 4385 girls) and 1879 (1551 boys and 326 girls) respectively. Corresponding percentage of S.C. and S.T. students in higher education was respectively 75.2% and 0.5%. Coefficient of equality of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes therefore worked out to be 39.2 and 13.1 respectively in 1976-77. District-wise details of scheduled tribes in institutions of higher education can be seen from the Statement No.27.

(c) EXPENDITURE

75. Total expenditure incurred on institutions of higher education in the state increased from Rs.19.57 crores in 1976-77 to Rs.50.74 crores in 1976-77. The annual increase in the expenditure thus works out 26.6% during the period under review of total expenditure in 1976-77, Rs.8.38 crores (16.5%) meant for universities/Deemed to be universities, Rs.30.60 crores (60.3%) for affiliated institutions, Rs.2.43 crores (4.8%) on Institutions of Professional of below degree level and Rs.8.47 crores (16.7%) for intermediate/pre-degree institutions. Rs.19.70 crores was incurred on Arts, Science and Commerce Colleges, Rs.3.70 crores on institutions of Engineering and Technology and Rs.4.11 crores on Medical institutions. District-wise details of expenditure on institutions of higher education are given in Statement 28.
