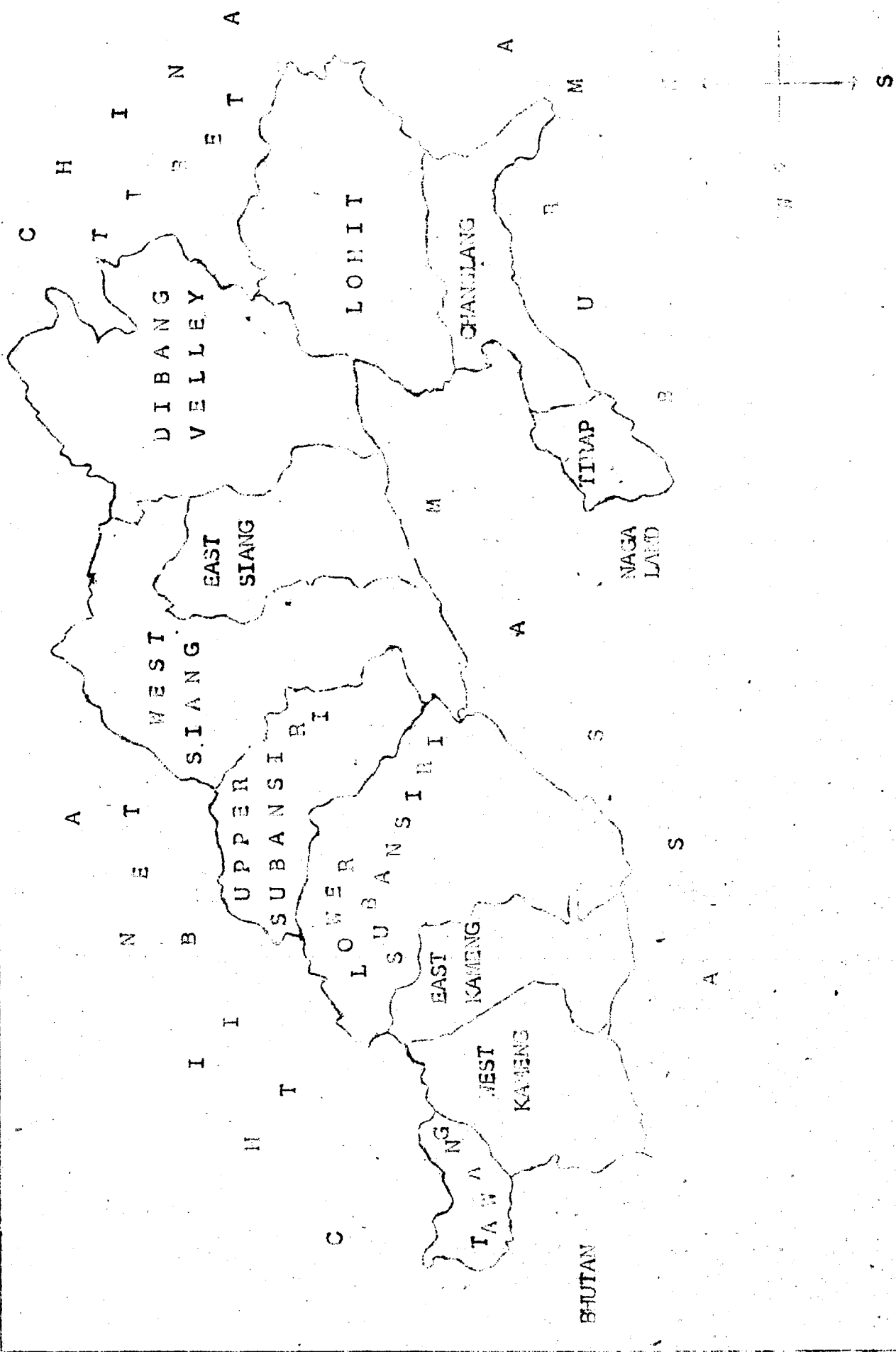

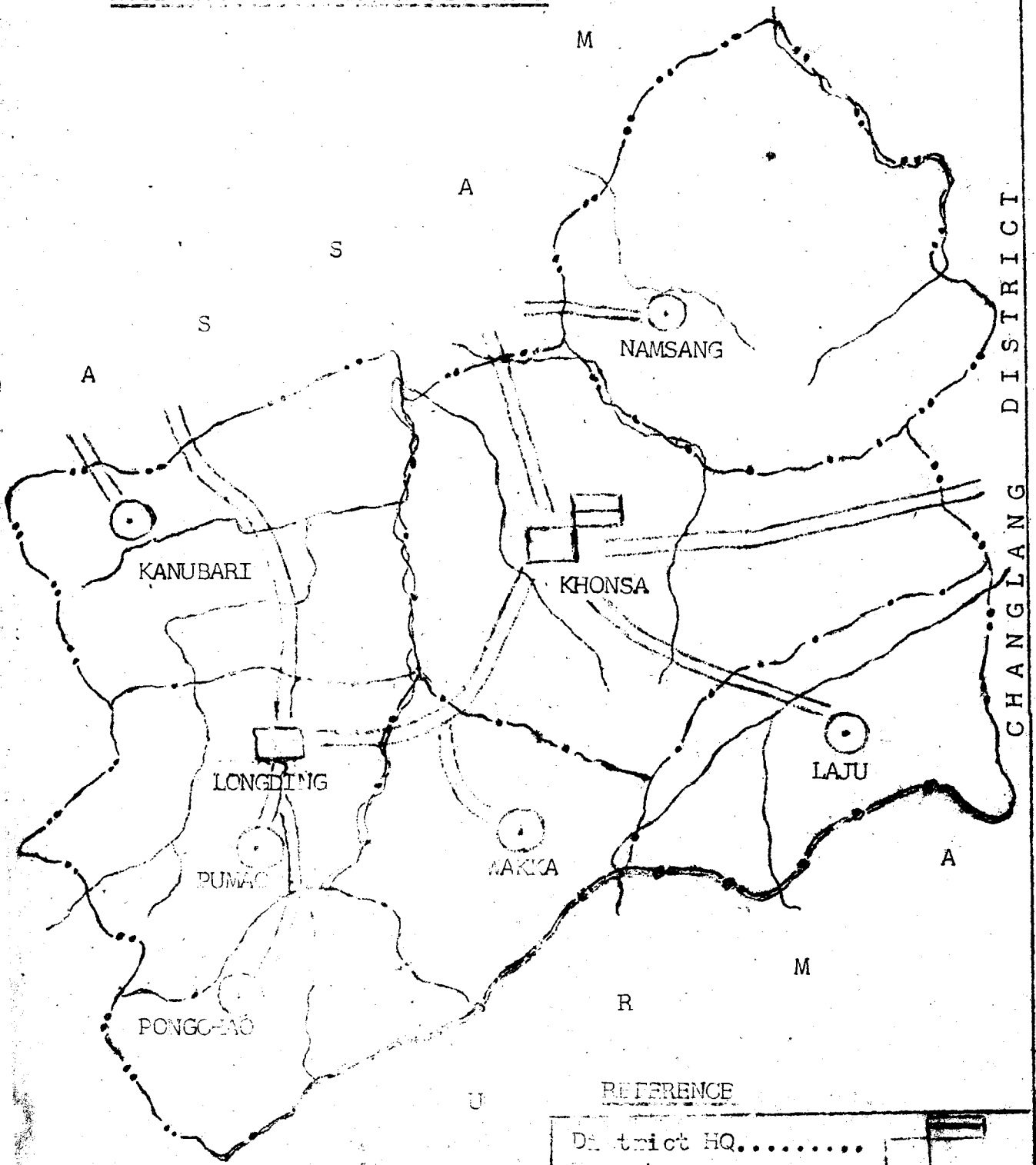

NOTIONAL MAP OF AUNACHAL PRADESH

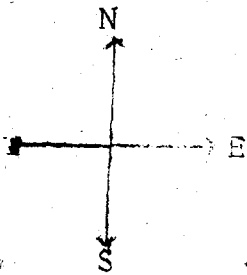


NOTIONAL MAP OF TITAP DISTRICT

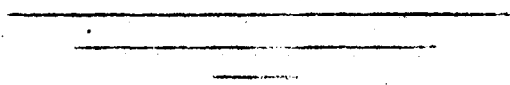

TIRAP DISTRICT

Tirap District of Arunachal Pradesh with an area of 3454 Sq.Km.(prov.) is situated in a unique geographical setting bounded in the East and South by Burma, The land has a picturesque beauty of its own.

Like other District of Arunachal Pradesh the District derives its name from its principal river, the Tirap, which flows through the main land starting from the South to the North until it falls into the Noa Dehing River.

The climatic condition ranges from hot and humid in the plains portion like Kanubari, Deomali to cold in places like Laju and Pongchau in the hills. The Climatic condition of Khonsa, the district Headquarter, is moderate and pleasant with an Annual rainfall of 8825.4 Cm.

The Population of the District as per 1981 Census is 66,439(prov.) out of which 34,995 are males and 31444 are females. The analysis shows an increase of population by 30,665 in ten years i.e. from 1971 to 1981. The Literacy rate of the District is 15.49%. The district has the thickest population with density of 19 persons per Sq. Km. (Against Arunachal figure of 8 persons per Sq.Km.). The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population of the District are 79 and 57,545 respectively. As per 1981 Census (prov.) there are 138 villages in the District .

The District is said to be the paradise of Anthropologists as it is the homeland of fascinating and interesting tribes such as the Wanchos and the Noctes. The ~~distinct~~ features of the two major tribes of the District are as follows:-

THE NOCTES :

Noctes occupy the North-Eastern part of the District. They are well-built and of medium stature with Mongoloid type of facial feature.

Nocte villages are situated on hill tops, generally thickly populated with cluster of houses huddle together. They are skill craftsmen so far as bamboo and cane work are concerned. Bamboo sticks decorated with dyed goat hair, decorated head-gear and various types baskets works reveal their fine and artistic workmanship.

Their dress consist of loin cloth for men and skirt hanging from waist to knees for women. Modern dresses are also popular now, they put on various ornaments which are part of their dresses. Tatting is common among women folk but in present days tatting is no longer in practice. The social life of the Noctes is divided into two distinct classes. The king and his kinsmen form one class while the rest form the other.

THE WANCHOS :

The Wanchos live in the western part of the District. Physically they are well built, tall and sturdy. Their facial feature represent Mongoloid character. They prefer to construct their villages on ridges or spurs from which the land drops sharply into the surrounding valleys (mainly Tissa and Tissing).

Division of labour exists visibly among them. In agricultural activities both men and women co-ordinate but no woman takes part in making basket, wood curving and metal works etc. and no man takes part in making pots, weaving or dyeing of yarn.

They are famous for wood curving works, hand woven bags of various designs, beads and basketry works.

Men's wearing consist of loin cloth and for women small skirts. They have various ornaments for personal decorations. Tatting by both men and women is very important feature in their society. Men tattoo when they reach manhood and girls when they reach maidenhood.

Like the Noctes, their social life is governed by the traditional chieftainship system assisted by the council of elders.

NATURE:

So far religion is concerned, each tribe has its own trend of religious beliefs and practices. Generally it is observed that their religion is around mother nature NATURE for its munificence of food, the well being of man and his live stock.

The land provides a panorama of colourful folk festivals varying from tribe to tribe. The main festivals are OZIALE of the Wanchos and the MALO LOKU of the Noctes. Agriculture being the primary means of their subsistence, most of their festivals are interwoven and regulated by different aspects of a agricultural operation.

PLACES OF INTEREST

The District, being closer to the industrial towns of Digboi, Tinsukia, Dibrugarh and Duliajan in Assam, towns has a fairly good means of communication (khonsa is 4 hours journey from Dibrugarh or Tinsukia) with the following interesting places :-
