

I avail this opportunity to extend my thanks and gratitude to all the District Heads of Departments/Offices for whose co-operation and help made it possible to bring-out this present publication.

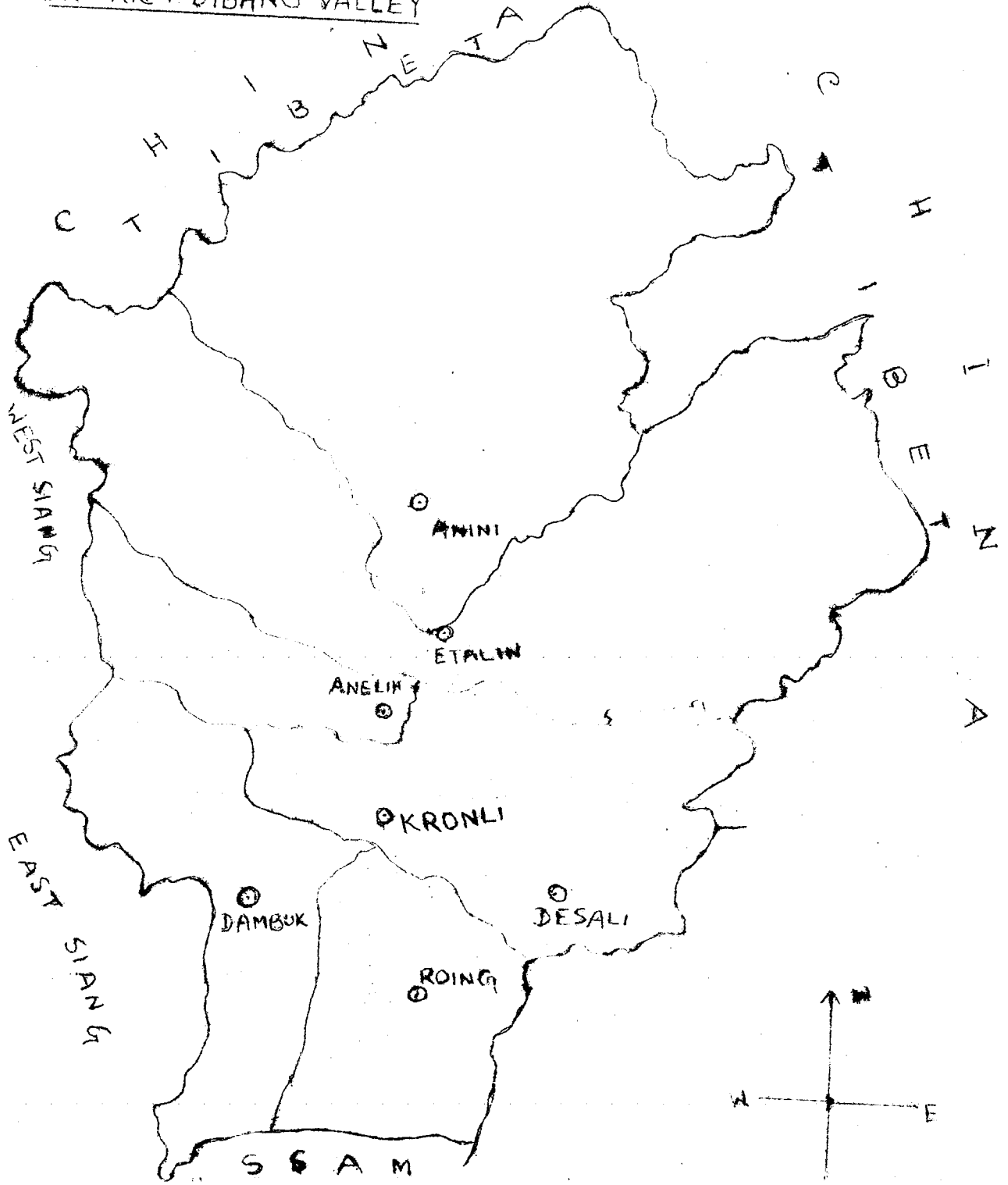

DIBANG VALLEY DISTRICT  
( A brief introduction)

Earlier the Dibang valley District was a part and parcel and separate sub-division under Lohit District. Now, it is new an Independent and full fledged district w.e.f. 1/8/1980 as per (Re-organisation of District Act, 1980, Act No. 5 of 1980) vide Notification Law/Legn-12/79 dated 13-5-1980. The dibang valley district has the largest area of 13,029 Sq.km with the lowest population of 30,978 persons (as per 1981 census) inhabiting at the rate of 2 persons per sq. km. The district consists of a number of sub-valleys formed by the tributories of Dibang River, Dri, Mathun, Ithun, Talen, Embra, Ahui and Sissiri rivers respectively.

The Dibang Valley District is bounded on the North by Tibet and snow fedded high mountains of Himalayas, on the South parts of Lohit District and Assam State on the East parts of Tibet and parts of Lohit District and on the West by East Siang District of Arunachal Pradesh.

ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP:-

The Dibang valley District with its H.Q. ANINI comprises with the following Administrative Centres.

- ANINI :- Established on 23/7/1957 and comprises Dri and Mathun Valley.
- ROING :- Established in 1951 and comprises foothills area up-to Shantipur.
- DAMBUK :- Established in 1955 and comprises area between Upper Sissiri and Dibang Rivers.
- DESALI :- Desali Circle (including Kronli area) comprises and Kronli Ithun valley. Kronli Circle was opened in 1959 but later shifted to HUNLI on 15/8/1959. Kronli was then flag-post till 1964 under an Area Superintendent. The flag-post was also abolished when the area Superintendent was promoted as the Base Superintendent and posted to the HUNLI in 1964 and subsequently to DESALI when HUNLI centre was shifted to DESALI. Now, with the posting of an Extra Assistant Commissioner at KRONLI (HQ) in April, 1980, 24 villages previously under DESALI circle are put under the administrative control of the Extra Assistant Commissioner, with the H.Q. at KRONLI.
- ETALIN :- Opened on 23/4/1962. It comprises Talon Valley and some parts of the Kronli area.
- ANELIH :- Opened in 1974. Initially the Circle H.Q. was at ADANE in Upper AHUI VALLEY, which was opened on 29/6/1964. The Circle H.Q. was shifted to ANELIH (HQ) in 1974 for administrative convenience. It comprises AHUI VALLEY.

Anini, Roing and Kronli circles are put under the administrative control of the Extra Assistant Commissioners and that of Etalin, Anelih, Desali and Dambuk circles are put under the administrative control of Circle Officers.

For better administrative convenience the whole Dibang Valley District is divided into two main sub-division, namely, (a) Anini Sadar Sub-Division and (b) Roing Sub-Division. Administrative control of the Anini Sadar Sub-Division rests upon the Extra Assistant Commissioner(HQ) and that of Roing Sub-Division rests upon the Additional Deputy Commissioner with Head Quarters at ROING under the overall administrative control of the Deputy Commissioner with the headquarter at ANINI.

TOPOGRAPHY:-

The Dibang valley District claims one of the most difficult terrains in Arunachal Pradesh. The worst parts in the entire district are the regions between Ithun, Ahui as well as also Embra and Talon Rivers. The area between KRONLI and hills had been badly affected by the great earthquake in 1950 and inevitable landslides changed the very topography of this badly affected area. The hills have not yet settle down and the landslides are common features. The Bamboos, Grasses and High Mountain ranges are covered with snow almost throughout the year. The Middle valley is covered with thick tropical and sub-tropical forests. There are innumerable precipitous ridges, gurgling rivers, deep and narrow gorges which inspire awe in minds of travellers. After this middle valley, rain changes into broad and wide valley drained by Dri and other rivers. Situated at the elevation of about 1,500 Metres, this region is one of the most beautiful area in Arunachal Pradesh.

TRIBES:-

Two main Tribes, namely, IDUS and PADAMS(ADIS) inhabit the Dibang valley area. The Idu-Mishmies to whom the valley belongs are the main dominant tribes of the district.

In the foothills areas of ROING and DAMBUK circles, (Adis) are predominant. They originally came from the DAMROH of the East Siang District but now constitute more than half population of the ROING and DAMBUK circles respectively.
