## V ALL INDIA EDUCATIONAL SURVEY - ( A REPORT )

### I.I. DISTRICT BACKGROUND:

#### Salient Features of Ranga Reddy District:

Ranga Reddy District was formed on 15th August, 1978 by carving out and detaching the twin cities of Hyderabad and Secunderabad and a few surrounding Urban settlements of the erstwhile Hyderabad District which formed the urban core and renamed as Hyderabad District. This District is primarily the rural hinterland for Hyderabad city, feeding the powerful commercial centre with various raw materials, agricultural produce and finished products.

The District is located at the heart of Deccan plateau of the Indian subcontinent and lies between  $16^{\circ} 90'$  and  $18^{\circ} 20'$  North latitude and  $77^{\circ} 30'$  and  $79^{\circ} 30'$  East longitude bounded on the North by Medak District, on the East by Nalgonda District, on the South by Mahaboobnagar District and on the west by Gulbarga District of Karnataka State. It covers an area of 7493 sq.kms.

Ranga Reddy is at the cross roads of India geographically, Historically and has been the meeting ground for the fusion of various civilizations, religious races, cultures, languages and traditions with the twin cities of Hyderabad and Secunderabad as its core.

The District can be divided into three broad basins. A major part (about 65%) of the district is covered by the Musi River Basin. Use of water for irrigation purposes from Musi has been banned because of the rights created for Hyderabad city water supply in the shape of Osman Sagar and Himayatsagar for drinking water and irrigation rights to Musi projects in Nalgonda District. The next largest basin in the District is the Kogra Basin, a tributary of Bhima River and all new irrigation projects are proposed in this basin. There is good potential in this basin which can irrigate a large area. This potential is not however, fully exploited. The third basin, which is part of the Godavari basin where the area under irrigation is very limited.

This District including present Hyderabad urban District was formerly known as Atraf-e-Balda District and was a part of the Gulshanabad, Medak division(subah) A taluk called Baghat taluk consisting of 17 villages over an area of roughly 40 sq.kms, was included within the limits of the Atraf-e-Balda district. In 1931-34 Baghat taluk was made a separate Baghat District under the commissioner(subehdar) of Medak Division. After police action in 1948, Atraf-e-Balda and Bagat Districts merged to form the Hyderabad District was split into Hyderabad urban District and Hyderabad rural district or Ranga Reddy district.

The Ranga Reddy district comprises of plains, but is mostly criss-crossed with hilly terrain with some rivers seasonal rivulets and small streams. The Ananthagiri hill range straddles across the district from the Mahaboobnagar District border in the south to Dherur Mandal in Vikarabad Revenue Division in the North. The Ananthagiri hills range consists of high grade limestone in geological terms.

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**ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISIONS:**

Prior to 25.05.1985 the district there were 11 taluks viz Medchal, Hayathnagar, Ibrahimpatan, Maheswaram, Rajendra nagar, Vallabhanagar, Chevella, Pargi, Vikarabad, Marpally and Tandur.

From 25.5.85 onwards, in the recent administration setup 37 mandals 3 division have been formed as follows:

The District has 949 inhabited villages and 72 un inhabited villages. There are (3) Revenue divisions viz., Hyderabad(East), Chevella and Vikarabad. Two divisions are headed by Revenue Divisional Officers while the third division viz., Vikarabad is headed by a Sub- Collector.

Out of the above (16) towns (8) are Municipalities and the rest are Major Gram panchayats.

#### POPULATION:

According to the 1981 census, the population is 15.82 lakhs. About 23.8 percent of this population are living in Urban areas and thus the rural population accounts for 76.2%. The density of population 211 persons per square k.m. out of the total population 3.08 lakhs belong to S.C's and 0.73 lakhs to S.T's. The working population formed 42.76 percent of the population of the total working force 33.34 percent are cultivators, 29.37 percent are agricultural labourers and 33.05 percent belongs to others.

#### LITERACY:

According to 1981 census the literacy rate in R.R.District is 29.51. As a whole only Vallabhnagar, Rajenderahagar, Hayathnagar and Medchal Mandals have recorded literacy rates higher. While the other mandals have literacy rates lower than the regional average.

### RIVERS:

The Chief river is the Musi river which rises in Ananthagiri hills. It flows from west to East, passes Hyderabad city towards Nalgonda District within the limits of which, it joins the Krishna River near Wadeppalli (Wazirabad). A reservoir called Osmansagar across the Musi and another called Himayatsagar across the Eri river a tributary of the Musi are situated at the distances of 19.31 and 9.66 k.m.s from Hyderabad.

These Reservoirs are the main sources of water supply for the twin cities. Another river viz., the Kagna river rises in Vikarabad Mandal and drains the Vikarabad and Tandur area.

### Flora and Fauna:

Forests:- The District cannot boast of any important timber yielding forests because of the low rainfall and comparatively inferior soil conditions.

The inferior type of forests (from economic point of view) yield only thorn fuel and small timber which the soil can sustain. In the certain portion of the District the forests are mainly restricted to isolated hills while in the western portion they are confined to the slopes of the hillocks and plateau.

The forest area of the district forms about 10% of the total land area. The forests are broadly classified as southern tropical Dry Deciduous forests.

FAUNA: It is on record that in the 1900s the district with its low shrubby jungles was the home of Kapards, bears, Hyenas and occasionally tigers while in the more open plains the entelope was in plenty. The game reserves for the ruling family in the erstwhile Hyderabad state were stocked with them for the exclusive enjoyment of the nobles.

Now the forests have receded into narrow packets and so also the game. Blackbuck, chital or spotted deer and sambar can still be seen in Rasnem, Dharur (Gingurthy) Tettepalli, Nagulpalli and Thirumulpur (Timmapur, Gokafesalwar, Rangampally) Naskal, Forest blocks, because of this interior location far way from Hyderabad city, wild boar is found all over the forest. Jackal and fox are common even now in the open. So also peacock, our national bird and Jungle fowl are seen in Ananthagiri block. Partridges and wild pigeons are common. In the cold season wild duck geese teal and snipe can be seen in the small and large tanks of the District.

CLIMATE: The climate of the District is characterised by a hot summer and is generally dry except during the south west monsoon season. The year may be divided into four seasons. March to May is the summer season, June to September constitutes the south west monsoon season, October to December from the North East monsoon season January and February is the winter season.

### Rain fall:

The District has a normal Rainfall of 802.1 mm the bulk of which is received through the south west monsoon during the period from June to September.

TEMPERATURE:

The records at the metrological observatory in the district at Begumpet may be taken as representative of the meteorological conditions prevailing in the district in general. From about mid February both the day and night temperatures begin to increase steadily. May is the hottest month with the mean daily maximum temperature at 39.6°C (103.3°F) with the onset of the south-West monsoon into the district early in June, there is appreciable drop in temperatures and the weather becomes more pleasant. By the beginning of November, the decrease in both the day and night temperature is rapid. December is the coldest month with the mean daily maximum temperature at 28.6°C (83.8°F) and the mean daily minimum temperature at 13.6°C (56.5°F). In this season the night temperatures sometimes drop down to about 7°C (44.6°F).

The highest maximum temperature recorded at, Begumpet was 44.4°C (111.9°F) on 28th May 1985. The lowest minimum was 6.1°C (43.0°F) on the 8th January 1946.

HUMIDITY: During the South-west monsoon season the relative humidities are generally high ranging between 70 and 80 percent on the average. Humidity decreases from the Post-monsoon season onwards. The driest part of the year is the summer season when the humidity is generally between 30 and 35 percent in the afternoon.

WINDS: Winds are generally light to moderate with some increase in force during May and the south-west monsoon season. During the post-monsoon season winds are very light and variable in direction in the mornings and mostly North easterly to easterly in the afternoons. During the latter half of the cold season and in March, April the Morning winds continue to be light and variable in direction, while the afternoon winds are being mostly easterly to south-westerly, winds from west are mainly from westerly to North westerly direction.

SPECIAL WEATHER PHENOMENA:

Storms and depressions which originate in the Bay of Bengal during September and the Post-monsoon months move in westerly and North westerly direction across the peninsula. Some of these depressions affect the weather over the district causing widespread heavy rain and gusty winds. Thunder storms occur in the summer season and towards the end of the south-west monsoon and early part of the post-monsoon seasons.

SOILS: Red soils predominate in the district followed by Black colour soils. The Mandals where more than 50% of the villages have Red-Chalk soils as the predominant soils are Medchal, Chameerpet, Qutubullapur, Keesara, Hayathnagar, Saroornagar, Uppal, Ghatkeswar, Rajenderanagar, Pergi, Doma, Shamshabad, Srilingapally, Malkajgiri, Balanagar, Kulacherla and Gandeed. Dubba soils are largely found in Ibrahimpatan, Manchal, Yacharam, Maheswaram and Kandukur Mandals besides Red Chalk soils. The Mandals where the soils are predominantly black are Chevella, Shahabad, Shankarpally, Moinabad, Vikarabad, Nawabpet, Dharcor, pudur, Tandur, Pedemul, Yalal, Basheerabad, Marpally, Mominpet, Bantaram.

MINERALS: In this district, Quartz and Felspar are the Principal mineral. The extensively exploited Quartz veins are in the Mandals of Medchal, Maheswaram, Rajenderanagar, Malkajgiri and Pangi and the felspar and 2nd Principal Mineral is also available in the Mandals of Medchal, Hayathnagar, Maheswaram, Rajenderanagar and Malkajgiri Mandals around the district head quarters. Fuller earth is also available in chevella, Vikarabad and Tandur Mandals. Lime stone is available mostly in Tandur and Marpally Mandals. In Tandur Mandal quarries of lime stones are extensively developed and the lime is sold locally. Lime kankar is also available in the villages of Ibrahimpatanmandal and it is used as lime mortar for building purposes. ~~dry~~ Clays of different types also available in Tandur area and these are presently being used in the ceramic Industry.

#### TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

The position of R.R.District presents a comparatively better picture in road network. About 30% of the villages are connected by pucca roads and 50% of the total villages are connected by Kacha roads and 11% villages are not connected by roads. The National High ways passing through the District and other Major roads Maintained by different agencies about for 3800 k.m.s of road length.

The District Head quarter i.e. Hyderabad only is connected with ~~xxxx~~ all Mandals and Tandur, Marpally, Vikarabad shanshabad and Medchal Mandals are also connected by road and rail.

Apart from the District Head quarters of Hyderabad and three Urban areas of Tandur, Vikarabad and Shamshabad are connected by Rail. There are 18 broad-Gauge and 16 meter-gauge Railway stations in the district with 57.62 k.m.s of Broadgauge and 186.25 k.m.s of meter-gauge.

About 30% of the villages are having postal facilities as against Telengana Region's average of 48%.

#### Economic Factors:

1) Animal Husbandry:- A part from the production of Milk and Meat the cattle in the District are used as draught power in Agriculture and it is an allied activity to agriculture. As per the livestock census 1986-87, the District has live stock of 10.47 lakhs and poultry population of 60.97 lakhs. The poultry population is mostly concentrated in Hayathnagar and Rajendranagar Blocks, due to their proximity to the twin cities.

The total geographical area of the District is 18.69 lakhs acres. The net cultivated area consists 40-24% of the total area. The cultivable area being more in 4 Mandals namely Tandur, Vikarabad, Pergi and Chevella on account of the BC soils. The current fallows constitute 14.55% while the area not available for cultivation is reported to be about 26.32% of the total area. Forest area accounts for 10% of the total area.

#### PLACES OF INTEREST:

1) Keesara: This village has at a distance of about 32 k.m. from Hyderabad city in the North-East direction. Keesara is also known as Kee aragutta. The village derived its name trans the sanskrit word Kesari(Hanuman) and in course of time it became keesara an interesting and peculiar. Feature of the Temple is that it faces west having the deity of Ramalingeswara. Keesara gutta appears to have had a glorious past as is evident from the ruins of an old Fort and

some stone pillars below the hillocks. The Brahmotsavam of Ramalingeswara popularly known as the Keesara jatara held annually on the Mahasivarathy day is the main attraction of the place.

22. Rajendranagar: Rajendra nagar is situated at a distance of 220 k.m.s from Hyderabad. It is the seat of Andhra Pradesh Agricultural University.

23. Osman Sagar lake: This is one of the biggest dams in the state constructed across the Musi. The pleasant and Beautiful gardens, the comfortable rest houses & the placed expanse of water made this place a tourist centre.

24. HIMAYATH SAGAR: This Huge lake is situated at a Distance of 13 k.m. from Hyderabad. It is one of the three drinking water sources to the twin cities. The lake presents a pictures que scenery and a picnic centre.

25. KIDWAI GARDENS: The Biological gardens are at Rajendra nagar and they are under the Central and state agricultural Department, the place is a picnic spot and a Holiday Resort for many

26. Ananthagiri palli(Vikarabad): This village has at a distance of 4 km metres from Vikarabad. It was this named because it lies on the Ananthagiri range of Hills. The river Musi takes its birth near Sivreddy pet on either side of the road there are big Mangogroves and the village is sorrended by a thick Forest. Because of the bracking weather and sulubrious climate a T.B. sanitorium was constructed at the place.

27. VIKARABAD: Vikarabad has at a distance of 83 k.m. from Hyderabad, on a Railway junction on Secunderabad-Bombay Broadgauge line. The town is located at a height of 1,153 meters about the mean sea level, an account of the time weather, the place serves as a tourist centre and summer resort in the District.

All these places of interest give very good background to the educational survey of Ranga Reddy District.

## V ALL INDIA EDUCATIONAL SURVEY

The All India Educational Survey was conducted to identify the rural habitations and educational facilities at different stages and to collect information on physical facilities available in schools. This was clearly brought out and approved in "Programme of action of National Policy on Education 1986. As such the operation Black Board scheme was introduced for effective and qualitative improvement in primary schools, consequently the V All India Educational survey will provide the starting point for the planners who with the vision of the stipulated goals will determine the discrepancy gradient and provide for the needed inputs.

As per the schedule of the educational survey the state Government appointed @ one District survey officer for each District. An eight day orientation programme was organised at the office of the Director of School Education where SIF, UIF, and VIFs and the collection, compilation to consolidation of data at the block, district and state levels, and preparation of block maps were discussed.

The District survey officer in turn conducted orientation courses\*benefit of all the Mandal Educational Officers at the District Headquarter in the month of July 87 and they were explained the Collection, Campalation and tabulation of survey data. The Mandal Educational Officers in turn arranged the Head Masters meeting of all the schools in their respective Mandals.

The required number of VIF, SIF, and VIF were supplied to all institutions. The Dist. Survey Officer scrutinised all the filled in forms with the help of Mandal Educational Officers. Then the district level consolidation was taken up and consolidated tables were submitted to the Director of School Education.

## CHAPTER-II - PRIMARY EDUCATION:

1. Out of 1188 habitations in the district 1003 habitations with a population of 1303790 are having primary sections within them. There are '5' habitations with a population of 1770 have primary Education Facility at a distance beyond 2 k.m.

2. "19" new schools are proposed which cover '19' habitations and some of population of 7533.

3. In rural areas there are 1003 primary schools out of them 23 are Government schools 936 are Local Body schools and 44 Private Un-aided schools.

In urban areas there are 42 Primary schools out of them 2 are Govt. schools, 19 schools are management by Local body and 21 are Private un-aided schools.

4. Out of 1003 rural primary schools 760 schools are having pucca buildings 138 are functioning in partly pucca building, 52 schools are functioned in Katcha building and one(1) thatched but which 52 schools are running in open space.

5. In urban areas 31 schools are housed in pucca buildings 9 schools are functioning in partly pucca building and 2 schools are functioning in open space.

5. Out of 1945 primary schools 77 schools are not provided even with a single room for instructional purposes. 622 schools have a single room for instructional purpose.

6. "404" primary schools do not required additional room '206' primary schools required one additional rooms, '284' primary schools require two additional rooms, 33 primary schools required (3) additional rooms '63' primary schools require (4) additional rooms '55' schools require '5' and more additional rooms.

7. There are in all 3,436 sections in 1045 primary schools out of which 1800 sections have useble black boards, 1636 sections do not have any black board.

8. Drinking water facility is available in 451 schools.

Urinal are provided in 65 schools. 28 schools have separate urinals for girls. Lavetary facility is available in 62 schools. 25 schools have separate laveryary facilities for girls. Medical check-up and vaccination facilities are available in 584 and 502 schools respectively.

9. In 18 schools donot have teacher, 701 schools are single teacher schools. 124 schools are two teachers schools.

68 schools have more than '5' teachers.

10. 2534 trained teachers and 61 un-trained teachers are handly primary classes in rural area. The figure 2534 is including of 905 women teachers are trained and 16 women teachers are un-trained teachers.

In urban area 792 trained teachers and 34 un-trained teachers are teaching at primary stage of these 537 trained women teachers and 24 are un-trained women teachers.

11. In rural areas 97.78 percentage of Boys and 70.74% of girls enrolled in the schools.

In Urban areas 104.66 percentage of Boys and 44.35% of girls enrolled in the schools.

12. GROSS enrollment ratio of Rural boys is 129.40 and girls ratio is 95.56.

In urban areas boys gross enrolment ratio is 128.12 and Girls enrolment ratio is 114.07

13. In rural area teacher pupil ratio is 65.41 with in urban area it is 51.20

The percentage of girls enrolment in rural area is 42.12% and in urban area 29.88%

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### CHAPTER-III UPPER PRIMARY EDUCATION

1. Out of 1188 habitations in the district 269 habitations with a population of have Upper primary Education facility within the habitation with a population of 3,83,044 consisting of 645 habitations have the Upper Primary Education facility at a distance from 2.1 k.m. to more than 5 k.m.

2. As per the criteria proposed at the National level 24 primary schools are proposed for upgradation Upper primary stage.

3. In rural areas there are 210 Upper Primary schools of which 173 are managed by Local Body, 8 are private aided schools and 29 are private un-aided schools.

In urban area there are 388 Upper Primary schools of which one(1) is Govt. school, 7 are Local Body schools, 6 are private aided and 24 are private un-aided schools.

4. Out of 210 Upper Primary schools in rural areas 139 schools are owned pucca buildings and 71 schools are run in partly pucca buildings.

5. 226 schools have Library facilities of which 59 schools have more than 1000 Books.

6. 147 schools have drinking facility, 69 schools have Urinal facility, separate urinal facility for girls is available in 46 schools. Lavatory facility is available only in 70 schools 36 schools have separate lavatory facility for girls. Medical checkup and vaccination facilities are available in 133 and 111 schools.

7. Rural Area: 938 teachers are handling Upper primary stage of which 903 teachers are trained and 35 teachers are un-trained 239 teachers are women and 699 teachers are male teachers.

Out of the 35 un-trained teachers 19 are men and 16 are women.

URBAN AREA: 435 teachers are teaching at upper primary stage of which 161 teachers are men and 274 are women.

Out of 435 teachers there are 23 un-trained teachers consisting of 12 men and 11 women teachers.

9. In rural area 26940 (51.67%) of boys and (28.66% of) girls are enrolled in classes VI to VIII

In urban area 10555 (64.72%) boys and 6111 (37.44%) girls are enrolled in classes VI to VIII.

10. Gross enrolment ratio of boys in rural area is 51.67 girls is 28.66. Whereas in urban area the gross enrolment ratio of boys is 64.72 and 37.44 is for girls.

## CHAPTER.IV - SECONDARY AND HIGHER SECONDARY STAGE:

1. 95 habitations with a population of 3,74,655 have secondary education facility within the habitation.

Out of 1188 habitations in the district 198 habitations with a population of 45400 have secondary section facility at a distance of beyond 8 k.m.

2. Only 8 habitations with a population of 91833 have Higher Secondary section within the habitation. 548 habitations have Higher secondary stage facility at distance of beyond 8 k.m.

3. In rural area there are 127 secondary schools of which 2 are Government schools 96 are local body, 4 are managed by private aided and 25 schools are of private un-aided.

46 High schools are functioning in urban area. out of them 3 are Govt.Schools 24 schools are managed by local body 12 schools are private aided and 7 schools are private un-aided

4. Out of 16 Higher secondary schools 7 schools are functioning in rural area ( 6 Govt.school, 1 Pvt.un-aided school)

9 schools are functioning in urban area, 6 Govt.,1 Pvt. aided and 2 are Pvt.Un-aided school)

127 schools in rural area have library facility, Library in 10 schools have more than 5000 books.

All the 46 schools in urban area have library facilities out of 46 schools 39 schools are having more than 5000 books.

9. In rural area 59 secondary schools have combined lab while 2 schools have separate labs.

In urban area 33 secondary schools have combined laboratories and only (1) schools has separate laboratory.

10. In rural area all the 7 higher secondary schools have separate lab for physics, Chemistry, and Botany. In urban area also all the 9 Higher secondary schools have separate laboratories.

At secondary stage 314 trained 1 un-trained teachers are teaching science of them 46 teachers are M.Sc., 10 are B.Sc.,(Hons) 14 teachers are B.Sc., and the remaining 55 are Inter science.

At Higher secondary stage 56 teachers are teaching science subject out of which 49 teachers are M.Sc., and 7 teachers are B.Sc.,(Hons). 13738 boys and 6138 girls are studying in classes IX to X.

11. In Intermediate 365 boys and 1913 girls are studying.

12. All 127 high schools in rural areas have drinking facility, 85 rural high schools have urinal, while 15 schools have separate urinals for girls, 34 secondary schools have Lavatory facility of which 13 are excluding for girls Medical checkup and vaccination is available in 46 and 34 secondary schools respectively.

In urban areas 43 secondary schools have drinking facility. 33 schools have urinals of which 12 schools have separate urinals for girls. ~~24~~ schools have lavatory facility of which 8 are enclosing for girls, 17 schools have Medical checkup facility, 16 schools have vaccination facility.

All the 16 Higher secondary schools have drinking water and urinal facilities, 14 schools have separate urinals for girls, 14 schools have lavatory facility of which 4 schools have separate facility for girls. Medical check up facility is available in 13 Higher secondary schools. while 9 higher secondary schools have vaccination facility.

13. All the 16 higher secondary schools have arts, science, and commerce streams. No school is offering vocational courses.

## CHAPTER-V: OTHER EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

### 1. Non-Formal Education centres <sup>and</sup> at enrolment:

Out of 949 villages 446 have non-formal education centres. Where 468 centres are functioning.

45 centres are functioning in 7 urban areas in the district.

14028 boys and 7432 girls are studying in rural area centres.

1261 boys and 663 girls are studying in urban area centres.

2. Adult education: 146 villages have adult education centres, of which 54 centres are exclusively for men 17 exclusively for women and 94 centres are for both men and women.

The enrolment consists of 3967 men and 2098 women

There are no schools for the disabled

### 4. Facilities for the pre-primary education:

In Ranga Reddy district there are no Balwadi, Anganwadi or independent pre-primary schools. There is no school having recognised pre-primary sections.
