
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FOREWORD

REVIEW OF ACHIEVEMENTS-UNA DISTRICT, 1982-83.

INTRODUCTION

Before reorganisation of Himachal Pradesh, Una was a tehsil of Hoshiarpur District of Punjab State. In November, 1966, when hilly areas of Punjab got merged with Himachal Pradesh, Una became a tehsil of Kangra District. It again underwent a change on 1st September, 1972, when Una became a fullfledged district of Himachal Pradesh. It was a step in right direction, which fulfilled the long cherished desire of the people of this area and paved the way for the speedy economic development of this district, bounded by Kangra district on the North, Hamirpur district on the East, Bilaspur district on the South-East, Hoshiarpur district and Roop-Nagar district of Punjab on West and South respectively. Geographically it lies within North latitude $31^{\circ} 21'$ and $31^{\circ} 50'$ and East longitudes $71^{\circ} 55'$ and $76^{\circ} 28'$. The altitude varies from more 350 m to over 1200 m.

Known as Jaswan Valley in the middle ages, Una comprised the area falling between the first two ranges of Shiwalik valley spreading from Ropar in the East to Talwara in the West, Swan Nadi intereseected it in almost two equal parts. Large number of streams, emanating from the Shiwalik ranges on both the sides drained out their waters in the Swan Nadi and caused Soil erosion on a very extensive scale. The problem of Soil erosion acted as a great bottle-neck in the development of this area and was particularly responsible for the poverty of the peasantry of this area.

Historically also this area has witnessed so many ups and downs. In 1398, Taimur Lung passed through this valley while returning to middle Asia after carrying out his plundering spree in Northern India. Hemun took refuge in this valley after his defeat in the second battle of Panipat. While chasing him, Beram Khan passed through Jaswan Valley and reached Jammu.

From administrative point of view, Una district has been divided into three tehsils viz Una, Amb, and Banagana and one sub-tehsil Haroli. For Rural uplift of the district, it has been divided into four community development blocks viz Una, Amb, Banagana and Banagana. The district has 9 Kanungo Circles which constituted 124 Patwar Circles. These are further divided in 600 revenue estates. The total number of inhabited villages/Towns are 557.

The following areas have been declared as Urban areas in the district.

During the era of Guru Gobind Singh, Baba Kaladhari migrated from Dera Baba Nanak for religious preachings and is said to have founded Una. It was further enlarged by his grandson, Baba Sahib Singh Bedi who was awarded 80 villages of Jaswan Valley in Jagir.

2. AREA AND POPULATION

According to village papers area of the district is 1,54,198 hectares and its total population as per Census 1981, is 3,17,422 out of which 71,265 persons are scheduled castes constituting 22.4% of the total population. As far as population is concerned the district ranks 5th in Himachal Pradesh after Kangra, Mandi, Shimla and Hamirpur districts. Density of population per sq.km. comes to 206 giving it 3rd place after Hamirpur and Bilaspur. Whereas decennial growth rate of population was 15.29% during 1961-71 decade, it increased to 21.45% during 1971-81. Sex ratio (Females per thousand males) also increased from 1003 in 1971 to 1028 in 1981, giving it 2nd place after Hamirpur district. In the matter of literacy the district improved its position, from 38.75% in 1971 to 50.05% in 1981, and netted the 2nd position in H.P. falling close to Hamirpur district (52.69%). Another important feature of 1981 Census is the increase in Urban population of the district from 10,338 in 1971 to 24,506 in 1981, showing a decadal growth rate of 137%. Still major portion of the population (92.28%) is Rural.

3. AGRICULTURE

About 92 percent of the inhabitants reside in villages and agriculture is the most important occupation for them. The Rural population mostly earn their livelihood directly or indirectly from agriculture. Food being the basic necessity of life, self sufficiency in it is an acid test of a happy, prosperous and stable state. So efforts were continued to increase yield by intensive cultivation, better seeds, better implements, fertilisers, pesticides, and providing irrigation facilities. During the Agriculture year 1982-83, total area under crops was 75,886 hecta

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as against 72,734 hectares during 1981-82. Net area sown, increased from 42,464 hectares during 1981-82, to 43,022 hectares during the year 1982-83, barren and unculturable land and land put to Non-agriculture uses remained same as in previous year i.e. 33,213 hectares and 19,872 hectares respectively. Gross irrigated area to gross cropped area during the year 1982-83 has increased to 5.3% whereas it was 4.3% for the previous year. The percentage for net area irrigated to net area sown worked out as 6.22. Intensity of cultivation i.e. the ratio of gross area sown to net area sown stood at 1.76.

In order to have optimum gains of fertilisers used, right choice of fertilizers for particular field is very important, and for right choice one must know nature of the soil. Good emphasis is being laid by the Agriculture department on Soil Testing programme. A soil testing laboratory is functioning at Una since January, 1981. It is catering to the needs of all the four Blocks in the District.

The main programme of increasing agricultural production through the distribution of improved seeds and fertilizers continued during the year 1982-83. During 1982-83, 135.078 Tonnes of improved seeds of maize, Paddy and Wheat were distributed and 1693.190 tonnes of fertilizers were distributed amongst the farmers in Una District.

4. SOIL CONSERVATION

In the past the Soil conservation works on the Agriculture lands were being carried out by the Soil Conservation wing of Agriculture Department, on forest and Government lands by the Forest Department and Channelization/Stream Training Works by the Public Health Irrigation wing of the Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department. On 26th September, 1981, the Government of Himachal Pradesh created a new Agency namely the department of Soil Conservation in the State to carry out all the Soil Conservation Works of Agriculture Department, Forest Department and Flood Control wing of Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department.

The Soil Conservation Wing of the department of Agriculture came into existence in the district in the Year, 1967, with the responsibility of taking up various Soil Conservation measures to prevent/damage to the Agriculture lands.

The various Soil Conservation measures which were/are being carried out in the district are given below:-

- i) Bench terracing.
- ii) Levelling of field for irrigation.
- iii) Construction of field channels for the carriage of Irrigation water.
- iv) Laying of under ground irrigation distribution system.
- v) Land leveling and grading.
- vi) Reclamation of culturable waste land.
- vii) Construction of diversion drains for the safe disposal of unused water.
- viii) Construction of embankments and spurs against stream bank.
- ix) Drainage of water logged lands.
- x) Construction of Shallow Wells/Tubewells and installation of pumping sets.
- xi) Construction of Water harvesting structures and development of existing village ponds.

On the District/Sub-Division level the programme of Soil Conservation on the agriculture lands is being looked after Assistant Soil Conservation Officer while in the field various functionaries i.e. Agriculture Inspectors/Junior Engineers, Surveyors, Agriculture Sub-Inspectors and Beldars are on the ground. The new department of Soil Conservation in the State will take some time to decide the new set up at the District/Sub-Divisions/ Division level/Circle level and State level.

The pattern of assistance for various Soil Conservation works except works on community basis was revised from 50:50 basis i.e. 50% loan and 50% subsidy to 33- $\frac{1}{3}$ % subsidy to marginal farmers, 25% subsidy to Small farmers and 20% subsidy to all other farmers w.e.f. 1st April, 1979.

In addition to it 50% subsidy is applicable to Scheduled Caste farmers for under taking Soil Conservation Works under the Special Scheduled Caste Component Plan.

All the Soil Conservation schemes are being prepared, executed in accordance with the Himachal Pradesh Land Development Act, 1973. The Ceiling per acre for irrigation schemes has been revised from Rs. 1500/- to Rs. 2250/- per acre, while ceiling for other soil conservation measures varies from Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 1500/- per acre.

All scheme works are entrusted to the respective beneficiaries for execution, treating them as petty contractors for their schemes. The payment are made according to the quantum of work done. The community schemes are being executed either departmental or through contractors.

During the year 1982-83 an amount of Rs. 2.97 lakhs was given as loan and Rs. 1.22 lakhs as subsidy to beneficiaries, thereby covering an area of 89 hectares under Soil Conservation works. Under Special Component Plan, an amount of Rs. 0.20 lakhs was given as loan and subsidy to 60 beneficiaries, covering an area of 20.50 hectares.

5. HORTICULTURE:

Besides agricultural crops, there is a good scope for the development of horticulture crops. Tropical and Sub-Tropical type of fruits are being grown in this district. Upto the year ending 1982-83 an area of 1580 hectares has been covered under fruit plants and during the year 1878 tonnes of fruits of various varieties were produced in the district. During the year under review an amount of Rs. 2,77,032 was provided as loan and subsidies for the development of horticulture. Under special Component Plan an amount of Rs. 2.17 Lakhs was provided for the year 1982-83, under two schemes viz. (i) Development of fruit production (ii) Training of Farmers, against which the full amount was spent on these two schemes and an additional area of 145 hectares was brought under horticulture thereby benefitting 1417 scheduled caste families.

6. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

The role of Animal Husbandry is very important in the way of providing motive power, fertilizers, supplementing subsidiary food and augmenting income of farmers.

The productive potential of livestock is being improved through scientific breeding, disease control and development of fodder resources. As per Census 1982 total livestock in Una district is, 2,40,166 and Poultry is 12,549. During the year 1982-83 two new Veterinary Dispensaries were opened in the district One at Panjwar and the other at Jowar. In order to cater to the requirements of veterinary there are 10 Veterinary Hospitals, 13 Veterinary dispensaries and 20 Artificial insemination centres. Besides these, one mobile dispensary is also serving in this district.

Under Special Component Plan a sum of Rs. 3.47 Lakhs was spent during the year 1982-83. Besides other animals, 316 Milk Cattle were distributed to 486 Scheduled Caste families in the district by the department on 50% subsidy.

7. FISHERIES:

A part of Govind Sagar falls in Bangana Block of this district, which has great scope for the development of pisciculture and to provide an attraction for the Tourists. Natural streams and ponds in the district are also being developed for popularizing the Fish cultivation. During the year under review about 1810 quintals of fish valued at Rs. 9.32 lakhs were landed and 206 fishermen were registered in the district. 104 unauthorised persons were detected doing fishing from whom Rs. 3965 were realised as fine. Under special Component Plan 22 Scheduled Caste families were assisted during 1982-83 by spending an amount of Rs. 56 thousand.

8. FOREST:

Forest have a special significance as these provide valuable timber, medicinal herbs, raw material for small and large scale Industries and several other major and minor produce. Besides generating employment it also plays a vital role in Soil Conservation and ensures timely and adequate rains. Forests cover an area of 55,554 hectares in Una district, which is about 36% of the total area of the district.

There is one forest division in Una district, which has its jurisdiction and control over whole of the district except Bangana Tehsil and part of Deh-ra Tehsil which lies to the left of river Beas. The Division has also its technical control over Kutlehar Forest extending over whole of Bangana Tehsil and a part of Barsar Tehsil of Hamirpur District, which are under the management of Raja Kutlehar. Forest Corporation is also serving the District which handles the resin tapping work.

During the year 1982-83, 15,070 cum. timber worth Rs. 13.46 Lakhs and Fuel worth Rs. 7.01 Lakhs was produced. Besides, minor products worth Rs. 8.46 Lakhs were also produced in the district.

During the year under review, an amount of Rs. 1.098 Lakhs was spent under Special Component Plan. 13,308 mandays were generated by providing employment to Scheduled caste families and an area of 34 hectares was covered under plantation.

9. CO-OPERATION:

It is matter of pride for Una District revealing the fact that Co-operation movement in the country took its birth in a village of Una district itself, In 1892 the movement started in Panjavar village of Una District, where as the Co-Operative movement Act came into force in the country in 1904 only. The total number of all types of Societies during the year 1982-83, was 431 in the District which cover 100% villages of the district. It meets the needs of small farmers, workers and the consumers of the rural area. The number of Societies have increased by 11 over the previous year and the membership has increased from 1,11,189 to 1,15,714 during the year under review. The share Capital and working Capital have also increased from Rs. 145.05 lakhs to Rs. 163.07 lakhs and from Rs. 922.47 lakhs to 1029.0 lakhs respectively during the year under review. During 1982-83, loans amounting to Rs. 296.22 Lakhs were advanced by Agricultural and Non-Agricultural societies.

10. POWER:

In the modern age, importance of electricity in the villages needs no emphasis. It has become a basic necessity in day to day life and is very important for running small scale cottage Industries and for providing motive power for the Agricultural sector, especially in the irrigation and threshing operations.

In Una District, the programme of electrification is progressing steadily. Whereas the number of electrified villages/Towns stood at 384, upto 31st March, 1982, it has gone upto 405 by the end of March, 1983. So 72.7% of the villages/Towns stand electrified upto 31.3.1983.

No. of connections is also gradually increasing from 38,270 as on 31st March, 1982 to 41,315 as on 31st March, 1983, whereas consumption of electricity has decreased from 24,114 thousand units in 1981-82 to 20,799 thousand units in 1982-83. During 1982-83, maximum consumption of electricity i.e. 10,351 thousand units occurred under the Industrial Sector, followed by Domestic and Agricultural and Water Works 5,022 and 3,579 thousand units respectively.

11. INDUSTRIES:

Una District is of paramount importance in the field of Industrialisation in the State. Being situated on the border of Punjab and owing to various concessions/incentives given by the State Govt. there has been rapid development of Industries in Una District. There are two medium scale industries and 481 small scale Industrial unit functioning in the Distt. The medium scale Industries are Turpentine Industry Mehatpur and Rangar Brewery, Mehatpur. The Turpentine Industry is producing Terponel pines, distilled Turpentine and pinetar etc. and the second one is producing mall extract and wine.

During the year under review the loan was provided for 19 factories/parties to the tune of Rs. 1,11,905 whereas last year only a sum of Rs. 38,000/- was advanced to 3 factories/parties. Emphasis was laid on recovery of old loans and during the year under review an amount of Rs. 1.14 Lakhs were recovered.

Seating capacity of R.I.T.I. Una has been increase from 48 to 64 during the year 1982-83, by introducing one more trade viz, Tractor-cum- Motor Mechanic. Training programme for Fitter Turner and Carpentry continued from the previous year.

12. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

During the year under review 601 vehicles were registered in the District. A fleet of 96 buses of H.R.T.C. Una Depot continued plying on 83 Routes covering 19,738 Km. route length. During the year, 5,234 thousand passengers were carried and a distance of 6,791 thousand Km. was covered by the fleet.

By the end of 1982-83 total Road length in Una District was 853 Km. out of which 115 Km. was moterable double lane and 691 Km. was moterable single lane road.

During the year 1982, 37 Road accidents were registered which involved 55 vehicles, killed 14 persons and injured 214 persons.

13. EDUCATION:

Education plays a vital role in the Socio-Economic development of the people. As per Census 1981, there are, 1,58,875/ literacy percentage is 50.50 (59.75% male & 40.62% females) which records second position in the Pradesh. Literacy percentage of Urban area is 61.00% where as for Rural area it 49.14%.

As on 31.3.1983 there were 356 Primary Schools, 65 Middle Schools, 57 High/Higher Secondary Schools and 4 Degree Colleges functioning in the District. In these Institutions 2,271 teachers were serving and number of students were 81,219 (46,847 Boys and 34,372 Girls) only 2.4 percent of the total students were studying in Degree Colleges.

14. MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH:

Providing adequate medical and public health facilities in a welfare state is perhaps the Primary duty of the government. In this district one District Hospital at Una and One Rural Hospital at Daulatpur Chowk, 5 Primary Health Centres, 15 Allopathic Dispensaries and 25 Ayurvedic Dispensaries were functioning as on 31.3.1983, to provide medical facilities to the people. In all 117 beds were available in these Institutions to cater to the need of indoor patients.

Our population is continuously increasing at a very high speed which has posed a serious threat to our economy. Decennial growth rate for 1971-81, for the district is 21.45 as per census 1981 record, where as growth rate of the Pradesh is 23.7. In order to keep a check on rapidly growing population the family welfare programme is also being carried out in the district. During the year 1982-83, 1961 sterilization operations and 704 Loop insertion cases were done.

15. LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT:

There is one employment exchange, which is keeping necessary link between the employees and the employment seekers. The number of applicants is continuously increasing and the number has almost doubled since 1977. By the end of 1982 10,461 persons were on live register of the employment exchange. During 1982, 6,630 sub-missions were made and 281 vacancies were filled through the District Employment Exchange, Una.

16. IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY:

Irrigation and water supply facilities constitute the basic needs of the Rural Agricultural economy. In order to achieve speedy progress in this field, Una district is being covered by two divisions headed by Superintending Engineer, Irrigation and Public Health, Una. 519 villages were covered under the water supply schemes by the end of 1983-84, whereas at the time of creation of the district the number stood at 52 only.

ANTI POVERTY PROGRAMME:

As envisaged in the constitution, ultimate aim of our Government is to strengthen the socialistic pattern of Society and to achieve this end., concrete programmes to help the rural poor have been formulated and implemented in the district. As a part of Intergated Rural Development programme, Bangana Block was selected in the initial year 1978-69. Una and Amb blocks were added during the year 1979-80, while the remaining fourth block of Gagret was covered under the year 1980-81.

2. Since this programme was specifically aimed at removing the poverty amongst the scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other weaker sections of the society by providing subsidies and loans to the target group families, the first task was to identify the families living below the poverty line through surveys at the block level. As such total number of families identified in the district were 20,298 out of which 6,474 were scheduled caste and 13,824 were non scheduled castes.

3. The pattern of subsidy decided by the Government of India was 25% for small farmers and 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ % for other categories. But the Government of Himachal Pradesh from the year 1980-81, decided that the rate of subsidy to the scheduled castes belonging to all categories shall be 50% and the difference between the two rates of subsidy shall be met out of the Scheduled Castes Component Plan Funds as Special Central Assistance. The details are as follows:

Under the IRD programme, 5,366 families have been benefitted in the district upto 1982-83. Out of these 3,520 belong to the scheduled caste. An amount of Rs. 54.1 Lakhs has been distributed in the form of subsidy to these families.

So far 314 families have crossed the poverty line, out of which 142 families belong to the scheduled castes.

TRYSEM:

Since 1980-81 the programme of trysem is also picking up momentum. Under this programme, the candidates are paid stipend during the course of training, institutes are paid fees per trainee in addition to payment of lumpsum amount for material utilized by the trainees. So far 199 trainees have been trained in the district out of which 118 have been settled and 129 trainees are under training. An amount of Rs. 2.39 Lacs has been spent in the district upto the end of 1982-83.

N.R.E.P. :

This programme is very useful in providing casual wage employment to the labour community, especially during the slack agricultural season. During the year 1982-83, 138606 mandays were generated under this programme, out of which 60,057 man days were generated for the Scheduled Castes. Under this scheme, useful community assets are also being created in the rural areas.
