C H A P T E R - 1

P O P U L A T I O N

District Srinagar over an area of 2228 sq.kms. comprises 175 villages. It has a total population of 703 lakhs as per census of 1981. The district has recorded population growth rate of 25.52% during the decade 1971-81. Population is mostly urban and only 12.5% of its resides in rural areas. The biggest ethnic group of Muslim accounting for 90.65% of population followed by Hindu 8.39% and Sikhs 0.89% as per 1981 census. Working force accounts for 30.12% of population. The main occupation engaging the working force are cultivators/agricultural labours mfg.processing house hold industry and trade and commerce engaging 62.51% of the working force. Details of population by tehsils, blocks, rural and urban areas religious groups, age groups, distribution of working force etc. are given in this chapter.

CHAPTER - II

Birth and Death Statistics

Birth and Deaths accounting in the state are recorded through the village chowkidars in rural areas and through sanitary supervisors in the urban areas. The police station and the local body office function as registration offices. The field staff and officers of Directorate of Health and Directorate of Economics and Statistics conduct inspection of field work. Data are mechanically tabulated in the central tabulation unit of Directorate of Economics and Statistics. However, as in rest of the country, registration is far from complete and would take some time to improve.

The data on Births and Deaths registered under the normal registration system in the district are given in this chapter.
