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PREFACE..

A reliable and comprehensive data base is the sine-quanon for a reliable information system which is the soul of scientific plan formulation at all levels. This is particularly so in the highly decentralised planning process that has been brought into being in the State of J&K in the year, 1976.

The disadvantage of adhoc planning that becomes inevitable in absence of comprehensive data at given level can hardly be over emphasised. District Statistical Hand Book with the minimum time lag will help the District Officers formulate their sectoral plans on more scientific basis.

In the last Annual issue of the District Statistical Hand Book of Leh district, I had made a mention that efforts would be made to bring out the 1981-82 issue of the series before March, 1983. I am glad that the Statistical and Planning section of this office has been able to come up to expectations. For this, the officials of the section merit appreciation. The idea of reducing the time lag to minimum is not to win a race in early publishing of the statistical hand book but to make the data thrown up by this more relevant for formulation of the Annual District Plans from year to year.

The Statistical section is now geared up to further reduce the time lag and it is hoped that the next issue, viz., for the year 1982 -83, will come out by the end of June, 1983.

In this annual issue, two more items have been added at the outset to facilitate quick retrieval of data and econometric calculations. One is a conversion table containing important analytical "dimensions" like length, volume, capacity, weight and area and the other is a list of macro-economic indicators of the district economy under the caption "The District at a glance viz-a-viz The State".

Besides some tables have been expanded to include more data relevant to plan formulation and evaluation.

For bringing this issue out as quickly as it has been done, I would like to place on record appreciation of the efforts put in by the Dy. Director, Planning Sh. M.S.Bachh, Sh. Rinchen Tondup, Statistician, Sh. Sajad Hussain, Statistical Asstt, S/Shri Tashi Tondup and Manjeet Singh Raina, Jr. Statistical Assistants and S/Shri Chewang Norboo and R.K.Koul, Steno.

Agriculture is the main stay of Economy in District, Leh. The total cropped area in the district is 0.10 Lakhs hectares out of the total reporting area of about 0.44 Lakh hectares. Livestock rearing is an important occupation in the district. The Livestock Census conducted in 1877 reveals that there has been significant increase in the Livestock population as compared to 1972 from 1.41 to 2.13 Lakh heads respectively. This chapter contains information about the number of Livestock by categories availability health cover extension facilities etc.

## IX - EDUCATION

Education is fast spreading and the level of literacy has risen from 11% in 1961 and 16% in 1971 to 24% in 1981, Educational institutions have been spread through-out the District. There are 113 villages in Leh having 143 Primary Schools and 46 other institutions of general Education. The enrolment in these schools is over 8000.
