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PART - I

ACTIVITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH AND TRAINING FOR THE YEAR 1993-94:-

The department was established to initiate planned activities to improve the quality of school education. It has got administrative control over the teacher education in the State. The department is responsible for the academic excellence in Elementary, Secondary and Teacher Education. It also undertakes and promotes, research in education. This department organises re-service and In-service Training Programme for teachers, evaluate Educational Programmes, undertakes Projects and Surveys relating to educational matters, alongwith the Centrally Sponsored Schemes.

Various academic Units are functioning in this ~~new~~ directorate. The academic Units of this directorate, taken-up, educational programmes every year under Plan and Non-Plan Schemes in the State Budget. These Units also serve as Co-ordinating Agencies at State Level for the implementation of N.C.T.P.T., C.C.R.T., UNICEF, World Bank and Government of India Aided Projects. The details of educational programmes taken-up by each Unit during 1993-94 are given below.

I. STATE INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION

The main objective of this Unit is to give training to the Teachers with the help of expertise and educationists. It gives value based educational training to the teachers to enrich their knowledge in the area of education.

1. Excellence in Primary, Secondary & Teacher Education:-

This Scheme was started in 1976-77. It is of innovative nature. It aims to increase the knowledge and competency of the Teachers by conducting essays on various educational aspects and they are of experimental nature, which will make teachers innovative and more efficient and these essays are valued by eminent educationists.

5 essays, each from Primary and Secondary School teachers and 3 essays from teacher training Institutes are selected during every year and forwarded to the higher authorities. The selected essays will be awarded with a Cash Prize of Rs.1,000/- each alongwith a merit Certificate. An amount of Rs.30,000/- has been spent for this programme during this year.

2. Programmes for English Language Teachers:-

English Language Teachers of Primary and Secondary Schools are given training in English Language Teaching through various agencies. Among them the Regional Institute of English is one which organises programmes twice in an academic year i.e. from June to September and from November to February. 113 teachers have been trained from this Institute during the year. In addition to the above, the English Language teaching Centres, Bangalore, Dharwad, and Mysore have conducted the English Language teaching programmes and covered 120 Primary Teachers in a course of one month duration. These programmes are much beneficial to the teacher community.

3. Preparation of Text-Books for Non-formal Education:-

Three Workshops were conducted during the year for the preparation of Text-Books for Non-formal education and 3 material workshops were also conducted in the month of September, October and November 1993. An amount of Rs.3000/- has been spent for the said programmes. Training was conducted at CII, Mysore on Non-formal Education in which Officers from DIET and DSERT are participated. Two Audio-Visual educational Programmes of 3 days have been arranged for the Secondary School Teachers. The teachers from P.V. College of Education Bangalore and Regional College of Education Mysore participated as Resource persons.

4. National Talent Search Examination:-

National Council of Educational Research and Training New Delhi has decentralised the Scheme of conducting the National Talent Search Examination and vested the responsibility of conducting I-Phase Examination to the D.S.E.R.T. Bangalore.

The main objective of this Scheme is to identify, encourage, and develop talent among the students. Those who emerge successful in the National Talent Search Examination in I and II Phases and then in the final interview, will be eligible for Scholarship, awarded by N.C.E.R.T., New Delhi. This scholarship will be given, till they complete their higher studies in the faculty of their choice. The amount of scholarship depends on the choice of study.

In addition to the monthly scholarships, books grants will also be given to the students.

The main feature of this scheme is given below. The National Talent Search Examination is conducted for X-Standard students who have secured minimum of 55% marks in the TX-Std. and in case of scheduled caste and scheduled Tribes, students with a minimum of 45% are eligible.

The I-Phase National Talent Search Examination comprises two papers viz., (1) General Mental Ability Test (2) Scholastic Aptitude Test. Each paper consists of 100 objective test items. The General Mental Ability Test is common for all the candidates. Whereas second paper (Scholastic Aptitude Test) is an optional one. The students can select any four subjects out of 8 subjects, i.e. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Civics, History, Economics, and Geography. The qualifying marks to be secured by the General groups and SC/ST groups are 40% and 32% respectively. The candidates who successfully pass the I-Phase examination will have to appear II-Phase examination conducted by the NCERT, New Delhi. Here the details of question papers are the same as in the I-Phase examination, but the candidates have to get minimum 40% to get scholarships. During 1992 examinations 170 students were eligible for National Talent Search Examination from Karnataka and they have been given 10 days training in the month of May 1993 by this department and also the State Government has given scholarship at the rate of 150 per month from the TWF and SWF to 94 students among them. Finally 133 students were selected for final interview. Out of them 76 students were selected in the interview conducted by the NCERT, New Delhi. An amount of Rs.3,70,000/- has been spent for the above programme.

#### 5. Integrated Education for the Disabled Children (IED):-

The I.E.D. Cell is striving hard to implement this Scheme in the State. It is being implemented in 16 Districts in the State with cent-per-cent aid from the Central Government. The theme of this scheme is to integrate the education of disabled children with the normal children in normal schools, with the help of specially trained resources personal. Salaries to the resources teachers and financial aid to the disabled children are released through this scheme. During the year

3225 disabled children were given Special Education in 550 schools with the help of 191 resources teachers.

### II. STATE INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE:-

The objective of this Unit is to improve Science education in schools, popularising Science and developing scientific attitude among the children. During the year the following programmes have been conducted through this Unit.

#### 1. Science Seminar Reading for High School Students:-

The objective of this programme is to help the students to acquire the habit of participating in Science Seminars and paper reading programmes. 210 teachers and 63 students were benefitted from this programme. An amount of Rs.21,000/= has been spent for this programme.

#### 2. Science Exhibition:-

Exhibition of models, Science equipments and exchange of Scientific ideas is the main objective of this scheme. These exhibitions were conducted for Secondary School teachers and students at district, State and Zonal levels. From this Scheme 580 teachers and 53 students were benefitted. An amount of Rs.1,56,000/= has been spent towards this programme.

#### 3. Science Quiz:-

The objective of this programme is to develop Scientific attitude and encourage the students to collect the information about scientific discoveries etc. The programmes were conducted at taluk level for higher primary school students and at District level & for Secondary School students. 570 students of higher primary schools and 66 students of Secondary schools were benefitted. An amount of Rs.84,000/= has been spent for this programme.

#### 4. School Complex and Survey:-

This programme is to improve teaching, learning process in Primary and Secondary School level utilising the available resources. Intensive survey has been done by the officials of the State Institute of Science during the year in order to establish the school Complex.

5. Orientation Training Programme for High School Teachers:-

Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme Science equipments were supplied. By utilising these equipments experiments were conducted for the High school teachers and they were oriented about the use of the equipments and an amount of Rs.1,00,000/= was utilised.

6. Programme for District Resource Centres:-

In the State each District has a P.D.R. Centre to improve the method of teaching Science and Mathematics. Training programmes were conducted to the primary and Secondary school teachers through these Centres, by using modern technology such as Video, Cassettes, T.V. and Computer to enrich the knowledge of the teachers and 450 teachers were trained. An amount of Rs.90,000/= has been spent for this programme.

7. Seminar Reading for High School Teachers:-

The objective of this programme is to develop scientific attitude and competitive spirit among teachers. The programmes were conducted at District level for the High School Teachers. An amount of Rs.32,760/= has been spent and 430 teachers were trained under this scheme.

8. Orientation Training Programmes for Subject Inspectors and Educational Officers:-

The theme of this Scheme is to clarify the difficulties in new Syllabus and Text Books totally 245 Subject Inspectors and Educational Officers have been trained through this scheme with an expenditure of Rs.1.12 lakhs.

9. Orientation Training for the Inspector of Schools:-

The objective of this programme is to enlighten the Inspector of Schools about the Teaching of science and also adopt new methods of working in inspection. The programmes are being arranged at the State level. During this year 100 school inspectors were trained with the expenditure of Rs.60,000/=.

10. Preparation of Video Casette:-

In order to improve the quality of teaching two Video Cassettes have been prepared in science teaching with an expenditure of Rs.50,000/=.

### III. State Educational Evaluation Unit:-

The Unit is functioning with the following objectives:-

1. To evaluate curricula of Primary and Secondary Schools.
2. To evaluate Text-Books.
3. To evaluate instructions in the Class-Rooms.
4. To suggest better methods of instructional materials.
5. To motivate students for better achievement.
6. To re-define teaching learning objectives.
7. To develop diagnostic and achievement tests.
8. To develop Question Bank.
9. To train teachers in development of improved Unit plan, Unit test and Question papers.
10. To re-orient teachers in preparation of instructional materials.
11. To evaluate question papers.
12. To evaluate results of S.S.L.C. and Annual Examination.
13. To suggest ways and means to improve performance at S.S.L.C. examination.
14. To organise Seminars, Workshops etc. on educational evaluation.
15. To take action on research in the Institutionalise programmes of the Educational Department.

During this year two programmes were conducted for the Heads of the Secondary Schools and Subject Inspectors of two Divisions of the State on the Topic raising achievement level of the Secondary School students 53 Head Masters and Subject - Inspectors were trained through this programme.

### IV. Educational and Vocational Guidance Unit:-

It is one of the importantUnit in the department .

It mainly focuses on giving training in guidance and counselling to the Secondary School teachers. The main objective ofthis programme is to enable the Secondary School Teachers to undertake guidance in schools to help the pupils to make right choice of course to study and vocation which is suited to their interest and abilities. This enables the students to adjust with the changing Society and the world of work.

The following programmes have been taken-up by the Unit during the year:- (1) Six days Career Teacher Training Programme were taken-up at Davanagere in Bangalore Division.

Srinivasaiah in Mysore Division, Jumta in Belgaum Division.

100 teachers participated in the programmes and a sum of Rs.28,155/= was spent for the programmes.

(2) With the expenditure of Rs.21751. Three Days Orientation Programmes in Educational guidance were conducted at Raichur and Chickmagalur and 75 teachers were trained.

(3) Two Workshops were conducted to revise the study habits and ~~+~~ in the Directorate in two sittings during the month of September 1993

(4) Four days Training Programme in guidance for the Secondary School Teachers was held in the Directorate in the month of December 1993. 14 teachers were trained with the expenditure of Rs.5415/=.

(5) 70 Career Teachers were trained in two days refresher Course which was held at Bijapur and Gulbarga and an amount of Rs.16750/= was spent.

(6) With an expenditure of Rs.16,322/= elocution competition in guidance was conducted to the Secondary school students at District and State Level.

#### V. EDUCATION TECHNOLOGY CELL:-

This Cell aims at modernisation of school and teacher Education. It does so by infusion of modern mass media and methodology in the educational system by way of hardware like Radio-Cum-Cassette players, 16 mm film projector, Slides, Overhead projectors etc. and softwares like Audio Cassettes, diskets, flappers, Video Cassettes Slides, Filmstrips etc.

To facilitate the instructions of technology in Education, the Cell conducts Orientation Training Courses in various aspects of Educational Technology like utilization of Educational broadcast, Mass Media, Multimedia approach, Radio Media and formats, Audio-Visual distance learning, programmed instructions etc.

The following programmes and activities were conducted during the year as follows:-

##### 1. Training Programme on the use of multimedia to teachers:-

With the expenditure of Rs.80,772/= Training programme were conducted by utilising multimedia in 10 taluks and 500 Primary

Teachers were benefitted from this programme.

2. Audio Visual Training Programme for Secondary School Teachers:-

The objective of this scheme is to train the teachers in utilization of Audio software for which the schools having facilities 45 teachers have been trained through this programme, with an expenditure of Rs.14437/-.

3. Radio Broadcast Programme:-

This Unit is Co-ordinating with the All India Radio to prepare the annual programme on Educational Radio Broadcast programme. The programmes were broadcasted in the 4 selected taluks viz., Devadurga, Yalandur, Gowribidanur and Athani. To get minimum utilization of the programme often visits are made and collect the opinions from the institutions and students.

4. Preparation of Audio Software Aids:-

Radio-Cum-Cassette Players have been supplied to all higher Primary Schools. It is expected to supply P.C.C.P.Sets to all Primary schools during 1993-94 and 1994-95.

Audio Software were prepared in 50 subjects for 1 to 4 Standards with the collaboration of the Regional College of Education Mysore. These Softwares were supplied to 80 schools in 8 districts and it is expected to supply the Softwares for the remaining schools in a phased manner.

5. Class Project Programme:-

Computers have been installed in 121 schools under the Central Government Computer Training Programme in Bangalore and Mysore Divisions. 30 teachers have been trained in 10 days Orientation Programme. 3 Computer Software were made and distributed to 30 schools at which the teachers were trained with the expenditure of Rs.30,000/-.

6. Gender Planning Training:-

In accordance with the National Policy on Education on "Women's Equality" through Education 42 Officers working in the newly established DGETs and CTTS. and Educational Officers were given training on "Gender Issue" so as to enable them to train Primary Teachers in eliminating the

Gender Bias prevailing in the system. During the course of Training "Pre-Service Training Manual" and Teachers Hand-Book were prepared for the lower primary schools.

7. Review of Text Books to eradicate Gender discrimination:-

In the interest of Women equality new Text Books were prepared and planned for 7th and 10th standards on the similar lines. Text books for 1 to 5th standards were reviewed and the report is given to Text Book Branch to rectify the errors and defects at the time of re-printing.

8. Environmental Education programme:-

Teachers Hand-book were printed with the co-operation of the Environmental Education Centre, Bangalore for the use of higher primary School teachers. About 100 teachers were enlightened with the collaboration of Indian Environment Institution about the Environment and they have given instructions to establish P.C.C.T in their schools.

It is expected to establish environmental educational programme in all secondary schools in the State. Maintenance grant received from the Central Government is given to 121 schools for conducting Centrally sponsored Educational Programme after visiting the schools.

DPT - II

TEACHER EDUCATION (DLEI & CTIs):-

The Directorate State Educational Research and Training is also looking after the academic guidance of Teachers Training Institutions and In-Service Teacher Training Centres and it has got administrative control over these institutions. The following Teacher Training Institutions comes under the control of the Department.

1. Pre-primary Teacher Training Institutions.
2. Primary Teachers Training Institutions.
3. College of Education.
4. English Language Teaching Centres.
5. Teachers Centres.
6. In-Service Training Centres.

### 1. Pre-Primary Teachers Training Institutions:

Now a days, the Pre-primary Education is very important to reduce wastage and stagnation. It attracts children for school environment and further help to attain the goal of universalisation of Primary Education. The children in the age group <sup>of</sup> 3 to 6 will be admitted to the Pre-primary Schools. Pre-primary Education requires female trained teachers to make the children attractive in their learning. This is one year course. The candidate who passed this course will be recruited as Pre-primary Teachers in Pre-primary Schools. There are 49 Pre-primary Teachers Training Institutions in the State, among them 5 are Government and the remaining are Private.

The total enrolment in these institutions was 1347. Government has proposed to attach these schools to Single Teacher Schools.

### 2. Primary Teacher Training Institutions:-

Teacher Training Certificates of Higher Course is of two years duration. The minimum qualification for this course is Pre-University Course pass with a fixed percentage of Marks.

There are 127 Primary Teacher Training Institutions in the State. Among them 34 are Government and 93 are Private. There are 12 men and <sup>8</sup> Women primary teachers training institutions and the rest are Co-Educational. During the year of report the total strength of students is 14012, among them 6884 were men and 7128 were Women.

### 3. College of Education (Secondary Teacher Education):-

The Objective of this course is to train the teachers for High Schools. There are 64 C.Ed. Colleges in the State, out of which ~~six~~ <sup>are</sup> government, another <sup>one run</sup> by Dharwar University and one more <sup>run</sup> by the NCERT. The remaining 56 are Private Institutions. The minimum qualification for this course is a Degree of recognised University and the duration of the course is one year. During the year the total enrolment was 6594 out of which 3791 were men and 2803 were women.

#### 4. ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING CENTRES:-

The objective of these Centres is to improve English Language at Primary and Secondary level. There are 6 English Language teaching Centres in the State. The Training will be given to the Primary School Teachers in the Centres of Bangalore North, Mysore, Dharwar and Gulbarga. Whereas other Centres of Mysore and Dharwad will give training to the High School Teachers.

In-service Teachers from Primary and High Schools are deputed to this course. The duration of the Course is 30 days for Primary Teachers and 40 days for High School teachers. During this year 614 teachers were trained. Among them 501 were men and 113 were Women.

#### 5. Teachers Centres:-

In-Service school teachers are admitted for this Course. There are two teachers Centres in the State. One at Dharwar and another at Vidyanagar Bangalore. The duration of the Course is 7 days. The teachers selected by the Assistant Educational Officers are admitted in these courses. Which are run in batches. The objective of this course is to improve the knowledge of the teachers in languages and also in core subjects. During the year "No" teachers were trained at the said centres.

#### 6. District Institute of Education & Training (DIET) and College of Teachers Education (CTEs):-

As per the National Policy of Education 1986 and on the recommendation of Government of India the State Government has upgraded 6 Government Colleges of Education as College of Teachers Education and 16 Government Teachers Training Institutes as District Institutes of Education & Training. The Colleges of Teacher Education will give training both for Pre-Service and In-service teachers of Secondary Schools similarly the DIET would take-up several pre-service and in-service training programmes for the primary school teachers in their respective Districts. There are several wings in CTs & DIETs for specific programmes and activities.

## PART

### JUVENILE PROJECTS

#### Early Childhood Care and Education

This project is implemented through the department with the assistance of DTEP. The main emphasis of this project is to link up activities to the Integrated Child Development Schemes through the Department of Women and Child development. The objectives of this project is -

1. To promote linkage between ECE and various programme with ECE as a component including ICDS voluntary Organisation with Government assistance.
2. To equip pre-school teachers and Anganawadi workers with variety of materials for strengthening Educational component.
3. Formation of Advisory Co-ordination and Technical Committees.
4. To create awareness for community participation.
5. To pool and co-ordinate various voluntary agencies working for the same Social causes.

During the year one programme was conducted for the DIET faculty and In-service Teacher Training Centres, Instructors with the expenditure of Rs.22,370/-.

### NATIONAL POPULATION EDUCATION PROJECT

The main approach is to integrate population education in the teaching learning process. Institutionalisation of population education through co-curricular activities and it is gaining mass support throughout the State during these years. The training strategy followed in training of teachers of primary, Secondary and +2 stage and also of teachers Education level, is the positive factor behind the success of co-curricular activities. In addition to this stress is also given an evaluation and research which is throwing light on the new avenues.

## PART - IV

### DIRECTORATE OF TEXT BOOKS

The Directorate of Text Books is now a part of the Directorate. After Nationalisation of Text Books, the responsibility of preparation and production of Text Books is completely taken-up by this directorate. The Directorate is also taken-up the responsibility of revision, review and evaluation of Text-

Books. It prepares manuscripts in advance for processing and Printing. Action is also taken to improve the quality of Text-Books by providing more attractive illustrations wherever necessary. As regards printing, the manuscripts are sent for printing to the Government Text Book Printing Press, Mysore for further action. In view of heavy printing work, the printing is also got done through private agencies whenever necessary as per time schedule.

During the year of report the following works have been taken by Directorate of Text Books.

1. The T.C.H. syllabus based on the National Policy of Education 1986 has been introduced from 1991-92 Text Books based on the new syllabus has been approved and introduced from 1993-94. These books have been brought out by the private publishers.
2. The syllabus for Special Examination in Music, Dance, Instruments etc. has been approved by the Government and has been printed and distributed throughout the State. Text Book Committees have been formed to prepare Text Books on various subjects in Music, Dance etc. These Text Books are proposed to be introduced in 1994-95 for IV, VI and IX Standards.
3. The School Text Books based on the revised syllabus were printed and distributed throughout the State. These Text Books were prepared keeping in view of the 10 core elements and 84 human values stressed in the N.C.T. 1986 sessions on "Environment and Dr.P.R.Ambedkar" are included in Text Books for all classes introduced from 1993-94.
4. In order to reduce the burden on children and as per direction from the Government of India and the High Court of Karnataka and in order to bring uniformity and standardisation in all school Text Books, limit on paper are being scrupulously maintained while preparing Text Books from this year.
5. The new school Text Books have been prepared by the Text-Books preparation Committees consisting of experienced teachers drawn from Universities, N.C.T.R.T. and reputed schools and Colleges in the State.
6. During the year the draft Text Books have been circulated among all the Teachers' Association and more than 1000 schools

in the State for field trials. Valuable suggestions received from them have been scrutinised and incorporated in the Text-Books. The Director of Text Books has also conducted hundred of workshops in which these Text Books have been scrutinised by Class Room Teachers and experts in the field. The Kannada Language Text Books have been got scrutinised by Literary organisations like Kannada Sahitya Parishat. The Hindi Books have been prepared in collaboration with experts from Central Institute of Hindi, Agra. The English Books have been prepared by experts from Regional Institute of English Bangalore.

7. The K.P.Surendranath Committee which went into all aspects of preparation, printing and production of Text Books has submitted in a report which has been accepted by the Govt.

8. In order to bring the preparation, printing, production and distribution of Text-Books under one umbrella, the Government proposed to form "The Karnataka Text Book Society". The draft rules and regulations are ready.

9. The advance programme have been finalised to publish Text Books 1994-95 intime as was done in 1993-94.

(a) 90 Titles (67.83 lakhs copies) will be brought out through Govt. Text Book Press at Mysore in order to utilise the full capacity of the Government Press.

(b) The remaining 250 titles (473 lakhs copies) will be brought out through private publishers. An amount of Rs.9.45 lakhs as already been realised during 1993-94 from these private publishers as a copy right fee by the Government.

10. The syllabus for Non-Examination subjects for V to X Stds. have been printed and distributed to all the schools of the State during the year of report. The preparation of teachers guides for these non-examination subjects is in full swing and these books will be brought-out in a few months time.
